OFFENSE

Luke Falk, So., QB
Washington State

Threw for a season-high 514 yards, completing 47-of-62 passes (.758) with 5 TDs and no interceptions and a passer rating of 172.1 in WSU's 45-42 victory at Arizona. When Arizona cut the lead to 38-35 with 8:01 to play, Falk engineered an 11-play, 76-yard drive that lasted 5:58, culminating with a 9-yard TD pass to Gabe Marks. On the drive he was 6-o-f-6 for 63 yards, added 17 yards rushing.

DEFENSE

Cameron Smith, Fr., LB
USC

The true freshman linebacker had 3 interceptions for 122 return yards against then-No. 3 Utah, including a 54-yard scoring runback that broke the game open right before halftime. He also added a team-best 9 tackles in the 42-24 victory.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Ka'imi Fairbairn, SR., PK
UCLA

Perfect 4-of-4 on his field goal attempts and added four PATs to collect 16 points in UCLA's 40-24 win over California, including a school-record 60-yard field goal at the end of the first half. It's the second-longest in Pac-12 history, and the longest in a Conference game.

PAC-12 SCORING RECORD:

The Pac-12 posted has posted a winning record outside league for 30 consecutive seasons . . . The Pac-12 recorded a 37-9 record in non-conference action last season, posting the most wins ever outside of conference play. Since 1934, only one other season witnessed the Conference capture more than 29 wins in non-league play - 2002 (32-15) when the league played an eight game conference schedule, allowing an additional 10 non-conference games to be played.

AROUND THE PAC-12

POLL WATCHING: Moving up to No. 8 in this week's AP Poll is STANFORD. The Cardinal are the fifth different Pac-12 team this season to be ranked in the AP Top 10 ... UTAH drops 10 spots to No. 13 in this week's AP poll ... With its win over then-No. 20 CALIFORNIA last Thursday, UCLA's one-week hiatus from the AP Top 25 is over as the Bruins vault back into the poll, coming in at No. 24 ... Meanwhile, California falls out of the Top 25 after a four-week appearance ... Over the last two seasons, nine different Pac-12 teams have been ranked among the AP Top 25, while six different Conference teams have been ranked among the Top 10.

DOES HE DRIVE THE TEAM BUS TOO?: STANFORD sophomore RB **Christian McCaffrey** is currently leading the FBS with 259.7 all-purpose yards per game, more than 40 yards over the next player (Tyler Ervin, San Jose State, 219.50 ypg) ... Since 1978, only four other Conference players have averaged 200 or more all-purpose yards per game for an entire season - USC's Marcus Allen in 1981 (232.6 avg), Stanford's Glyn Milburn in 1990 (202.0 avg), USC's Reggie Bush in 2005 (222.3 avg) and USC's Marqise Lee in 2012 (206.4 avg). Coincidentally, Milburn's teammate in 1990 was Ed McCaffrey (father of Christian), who had 61 receptions for 917 yards and a Conference-leading 91.7 receiving yards per game that season ... In addition to McCaffrey, the Pac-12 boasts OREGON's **Royce Freeman** (8th, 168.0 ypg) and UTAH's **Devontae Booker** (11th, 157.4 ypg) among the FBS all-purpose yardage leaders. No other conference has more than two players among the top 14.

OFFENSIVE LINE DURABILITY: Tackle-to-tackle, three teams have started the same five offensive linemen in each game this season - OREGON STATE, STANFORD and WASHINGTON STATE. Unfortunately, Oregon State junior LT Sean Harlow, who had started 28 games in his career, suffered an ankle injury Saturday against Colorado and will miss the rest of the season.

GOLDEN TOE: Led by UCLA's **Ka'imi Fairbairn** and his school-record 60-yarder, five different Pac-12 kickers have knocked seven field goals through the uprights from 50 yards and beyond. Fairbairn (53, 60), UTAH's **Andy Phillips** (53), STANFORD's **Conrad Ukropina** (52), COLORADO's **Diego Gonzalez** (52, 52), and OREGON STATE's **Garrett Owens** (50). From 50 or more yards, Pac-12 kickers are 7-of-9 (.778).

PAC-12 NETWORK TO TAB ALL-CENTURY TEAM: The Pac-12 Network will honor the Conference's 100-year anniversary with the selection of an All-Century team. Each Tuesday on the Network's Inside Pac-12 Football show, the finalists/top 10 vote getters for each position as selected by a panel comprised of media, former players, coaches and administrators will be unveiled. PAC-12 CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

#100Pac12: The Pac-12 Conference is set to celebrate 100 years of excellence. The yearlong celebration of the Conference centennial, including marking the date of the official formation 100 years ago on December 2, will kick off with the start of the football season and continue throughout the 2015-16 academic year.

The Conference's storied history dates back 100 years to Dec. 2, 1915 when four schools - the University of California, Oregon Agricultural College (now Oregon State University), the University of Oregon and the University of Washington - gathered at the historic Imperial Hotel in Portland, Ore., to form the Pacific Coast Conference.

Since that day, the Conference has been known for its widespread excellence - on the field, in the classroom, and with the contributions its graduates make in the world. No other Conference can match the collective achievements and distinctions accomplished over the last century.

#COMPLETE12

COMPLETE CAMPAIGN: Pac-12 students are known for their success on the field, but they are also impressive, complete people with outside interests, diverse backgrounds, extracurricular activities, interesting families, busy schedules, and full lives. Here's a look at some of the off-field accomplishments:



BEST-IN-CLASS: Starting RG **Johnny Caspers**, an Earth Systems major, spent part of the summer studying earth worms. The Earth Systems Program is an interdisciplinary environmental science major. Students learn about and independently investigate complex environmental problems caused by human activities in interaction with natural changes in the Earth system. Earth Systems majors become skilled in those areas of science, economics, and policy needed to tackle the globe's most pressing environmental problems, becoming part of a generation of scientists, professionals, and citizens who approach and solve problems in a new way: a systematic, interdisciplinary way. Earth Systems students take courses in the fundamentals of biology, calculus, chemistry, geology, and physics, as well as economics and policy and statistics.

THIS WEEK'S GAMES

OREGON at ARIZONA STATE

Thurs., Oct. 29 • 7:30 p.m. PT • ESPN

OREGON: Sophomore RB **Royce Freeman** is averaging 142.4 rushing yards per game, ranking fourth nationally in the FBS. With 997 rushing yards this season, Freeman needs three yards to post his second straight 1,000-yard season. He'd become the fourth Oregon running back to rush for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons ... Oregon has an NCAA-record streak of 73 consecutive games with a TD through the air ... Sophomore WR **Charles Nelson** has seen action at cornerback this season and joins USC's Adoree' Jackson as the only two players in the Pac-12 this season to earn a start on both sides of the ball.

ARIZONA STATE: Senior **D.J. Foster** has caught a pass in an FBS-leading 47 consecutive games. He is now one game shy of the Pac-12 record of 48 held by Kareem Kelly of USC (1999-2002). Foster has 195 receptions, second-most in school history ... The Sun Devil defense ranks second in the Pac-12 against the rush (129.3 ypg), but faces an Oregon offense that averages a league-leading 297.4 rushing yards per game ... Junior WR **Tim White** is third in the FBS with a league-leading 31.9 kick return yards.

Last Meeting (10/18/12): Kenjon Barner ran for 143 yards and 3 TDs, Marcus Mariota added 135 yards and a score, as No. 2 Oregon built a 43-7 halftime lead en route to a 43-21 win at Arizona State. The Ducks rushed for 406 yards in the game.

USC at CALIFORNIA

Sat., Oct. 31 • 12 noon PT • FOX and FOX Deportes

USC: In the 42-24 win over Utah, senior QB **Cody Kessler** passed for 264 yards and a touchdown and rushed for another score. Sophomore WR **JuJu Smith-Schuster** had eight catches for 143 yards and a TD ... Smith-Schuster has 100 or more receiving yards in five of the last six games. He leads the Pac-12 and is fifth in the FBS with 128.7 yards per game ... This is the first time an AP unranked USC team beat an AP top-3 ranked team since the Trojans defeated No. 2 Texas A&M, 20-0, in the 1975 Liberty Bowl on Dec. 22, 1975. The last time any USC team beat an opponent ranked AP No. 3 or higher, the No. 8 Trojans defeated No. 3 Michigan in the 2007 Rose Bowl (following 2006 season), 32-18 ... Freshman LB **Cameron Smith** is the first Trojan with 3 interceptions in a game since Jason Oliver vs. Penn State in 1991.

CALIFORNIA: Junior QB **Jared Goff** went 32-of-53 for 295 yards and 3 TDs in Cal's 24-40 loss to UCLA. It was his 22nd career multi-passing touchdown performance. He also recorded his 23rd 250-yard passing performance, a school record. Goff now owns the Cal career pass attempts mark with 1,318, besting the record previously held by Kyle Boller (1,301) ... Junior WR **Kenny Lawler** has 9 TD receptions this season, eight shy of the school single-season record. He is tied for fifth for Cal's single-season record and third at 23 TDs on the career list ... The Bears did not commit a turnover for the first time since playing at Oregon State in 2014.

Last Meeting (11/13/14): USC, behind a career-best 16 receptions by WR Nelson Agholor, built a 31-9 halftime lead, but had to hang on to defeat California, 38-30. Agholor had 13 catches for 177 in the first half and finished with 216 yards and 2 TDs. USC's Cody Kessler was 31-of-42 for 371 yards and 4 TDs. Cal's Jared Goff was 29-of-46 for 279 yards and 3 TDs.

COLORADO at UCLA

Sat., Oct. 31 • 12 noon PT • PAC12

COLORADO: With the 17-13 win at Oregon State, the Buffs snapped a 14-game Pac-12 losing streak and a 13-game road losing streak ... Junior QB **Sefo Liufau** was 16-of-23 for 140 yards and 1 TD, while rushing for 44 yards and another score ... Liufau extended his streak without an interception to 98, the second longest of his career and tied for the eighth longest at CU. He has just three this season in 261 attempts ... Senior WR **Nelson Spruce** had six receptions for 60 yards and one TD. Spruce is third on the Pac-12 career receiving chart with 256 receptions. He trails Arizona's Mike Thomas (259 receptions, 2005-08) and Arizona State's Derek Hagen (258 receptions, 2002-05).

UCLA: Freshman QB **Josh Rosen** completed a UCLA record 34 passes for 399 yards and 3 TDs in the win over Cal. It was the third 300-plus yard game of the season, and second in a row. Over the last two games, he's completed 56-of-89 (.629) for 724 yards and 6 TDs. In the last four games, he's completed 97-of-157 (.618) for 1,288 yards and 10 TDs ... Over the last four games, senior WR **Jordan Payton** and junior WR **Thomas Duarte** have combined for 50 receptions for 744 yards and 7 TDs ... Payton is third on UCLA's career reception list with 160 catches.

Last Meeting (10/25/14): UCLA's Brett Hundley scored on an 8-yard run in the second overtime to lift No. 25 to a 40-37 win at Colorado after the Buffaloes had tied the game by scoring the final 17 points of the regulation contest. UCLA's Paul Perkins rushed for 180 yards, including a 92-yard TD run for the game's first score. Hundley was 24-of-39 for 200 yards and rushed for another 110 yards. Colorado's Sefo Liufau was 27-of-45 for 246 yards and 2 TDs.

OREGON STATE at UTAH

Sat., Oct. 31 • 5 p.m. PT • PAC12

OREGON STATE: RS freshman TB **Ryan Nall** ran for a career-best 122 yards on 22 carries (5.5 avg) and one TD as the Beavers fell 17-13 to Colorado. The Beavers rushed for 202 yards, surpassing the 200-yard mark for the third time this season ... Defensively, junior LB **Rommel Mageo** and sophomore LB **Manase Hungalu** led the team with eight and seven respective tackles. Mageo leads the Beavers, and is ninth in the league, averaging 7.9 tackles per game.

UTAH: In Utah's loss at USC, freshman WR **Britain Covey** had a career-high 129 yards receiving on seven catches and two TDs (66 and 30 yards), his first career 100-yard receiving game. He added two punt returns (43 yards) and two kick returns (45 yards) for 217 all-purpose yards ... Senior LB **Gionni Paul** had a career-high 17 tackles, which included 5.5 tackles for loss (1.0 sack). His 5.5 tackles for loss is second all-time in a game at Utah ... Junior PK **Andy Phillips** booted a career-long 53-yard field goal. He is 4-for-4 on attempts from 50 or more yards in his career.

Last Meeting (10/16/14): Devontae Booker brought Utah back from a 13-9 fourth quarter deficit by scoring three touchdowns, including the game-winner on a 19-yard run in the second overtime for a 29-23 win at Oregon State. Booker rushed for 229 yards and 3 TDs. A defensive battle most of the game, the game's first five scores were all by way of the field goal. Utah's Gionni Paul led the Utes with 14 tackles and an interception, while Nate Orchard added two sacks. Sean Mannion completed 21-of-37 for 272 yards and 2 TDs for the Beavers.

STANFORD at WASHINGTON STATE

Sat., Oct. 31 • 7:30 p.m. PT • ESPN

STANFORD: Sophomore RB **Christian McCaffrey** totaled 300 all-purpose yards with 2 TDs in the Cardinal's 31-14 win over the Huskies. McCaffrey rushed for 109 yards (fifth straight 100-yard game), caught five passes for 112 yards, and added 79 return yards. He's the fourth Cardinal ever and first with 100+ rushing and 100+ receiving yards in same game since 1991 ... Senior QB **Kevin Hogan** is seventh in the FBS in passing efficiency (174.0) ... Senior ILB **Blake Martinez** is tied for fourth in the nation averaging 11.4 tackles per game ... Stanford is the national leader in time of possession at 35:36 ... While the Cardinal are the league's top defense, allowing 339.3 yards per game, they now match up against the nation's No. 2 team in passing offense (415.0 avg) at Washington State.

WASHINGTON STATE: Redshirt junior WR **Gabe Marks** caught four of sophomore QB **Luke Falk's** five TD passes as Washington State beat Arizona, 45-42. Marks is the first Cougar to catch 4 TDs in a single game. Falk completed 47-of-62 passes (.758) for 514 yards for his third-career 500+ yard contest. His performance named him the Walter Camp National FBS Player of the Week, the first Cougar to do so since 2004 ... In Falk's last three games, he's 136-of-186 (.731) for 1,426 yards and 16 TDs ... The Cougars recorded their third-straight Conference win for the first time since it they opened 2003 league play with four straight wins.

Last Meeting (10/10/14): Kevin Hogan threw for 284 yards and 3 TDs, and No. 25 Stanford slowed down Connor Halliday and the Cougars' Air Raid offense in a 34-17 victory over Washington State. A week after Halliday threw for an NCAA-record 734 yards in a 60-59 loss to California, Stanford held him to 42-for-69 passing for 292 yards and 2 TDs. The Stanford defense held WSU to -26 yards rushing.

ARIZONA at WASHINGTON

Sat., Oct. 31 • 8 p.m. PT • FS1

ARIZONA: Senior RB **Jared Baker** recorded his second straight three touchdown game. He now has six TDs (5 rushing, 1 receiving) over the last two games ... Senior QB **Jerrard Randall** ran for 105 yards on 10 carries in loss to WSU. He now has a total of 639 rushing yards on just 58 carries in just seven games played this season. The 639 total rushing yards this season already is the second most ever by a UA quarterback for a single season, trailing B.J. Denker (949 yards in 2013) ... Junior WR **Cayleb Jones** recorded a season-high 131 receiving yards on eight receptions. It was his second 100-plus yard receiving game of the year and his fifth of his career.

WASHINGTON: Freshman TB **Myles Gaskin** ran for 108 yards on 18 carries (6.0 avg) and a TD, becoming the only true freshman in school history to rush for 100+ yards in three-straight games ... The Huskies gave up more than 30 points for the first time on the season, as the Stanford offense took the field for more than 40 minutes ... Washington, the league's second-ranked team in total defense at 364.3 yards allowed per game, hosts Arizona and the Pac-12's top offense (535.0) on Saturday.

Last Meeting (11/15/14): Kicker Casey Skowron accounted for 15 of Arizona's 27 points, and booted a game-winning 47-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Wildcats to a 27-26 victory over Washington. Skowron added a touchdown on an 18-yard run off a fake field goal to get the Wildcats within in three at halftime. The Huskies rolled up 504 yards in total offense, but the Wildcats forced six fumbles, recovering three, none bigger than the one with 1:23 remaining to set up the game-winner.
