## ROSE BOWL: THE 34th YEAR

The 2015 season marks the 34th year that the Rose Bowl, with a seating capacity of 80,616, will serve as home of the Bruins.

UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 140-63-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games.

UCLA, 34-13 overall under Coach Mora, is 16-7 in games played in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins are 21-8 in the last 29 home contests.

Buffaloes come calling for Homecoming



### Bruins Host CU for Homecoming

UCLA (5-2, 2-2, No. 24 AP, No. 25 in Amway Coaches Poll) hosts Colorado (4-4, 1-3) on Saturday, Oct. 31 at Noon in the Rose Bowl. The game will be televised by the Pac-12 Networks. Calling the game will be Roxy Bernstein, Glenn Parker and Jill Savage. The Bruin IMG Radio Network (Bill Roth, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest on am570 LA Sports. The game also will be aired on Sirius 137/XM 197, uclabruins.com and tunein.com and the TuneIn App. The 1965 UCLA football team, which earned the first Rose Bowl game victory in school history, is serving as the honorary captain for this week's game.

### Vs. the Buffaloes

UCLA leads the series with Colorado by an 8-2 count. The Bruins have won all four meetings since the Buffs joined the Pac-12 Conference in 2011.

Last season in Boulder, UCLA needed a Brett Hundley touchdown dash in the second overtime to hold off the Buffaloes, 40-37. The Bruins scored the first 17 points in the contest only to see CU tally the last 17 points in regulation to tie the score at 31-all. Paul Perkins' 92-yard run, tied for the second-longest run in school history, opened the game's scoring. UCLA led 31-14 to begin the fourth quarter before the Buffs battled back to even the score on a field goal in the final minute of regulation.

In the last meeting in the Rose Bowl, Nov. 2, 2013, UCLA spotted CU leads of 3-0 and 10-7 before grabbing a 21-13 lead at the break. The Bruins scored on their initial possession of the second half and then added another touchdown to head to the final quarter with a 35-13 lead, before posting a 45-23 victory. Devin Fuller accounted for three touchdowns on the day, two receptions for scores and one rushing touchdown.

**Tickets** -- Tickets for the remaining UCLA home games for 2015 are on sale at uclabruins.com/tickets. The Bruins have two more home games at the Rose Bowl -- Oct. 31 vs. Colorado (Noon-Homecoming) and Nov. 14 vs. Washington State.

- \*\*QB Josh Rosen has passed for 300 yards in the last two games v. Cal (399) and at Stanford (325) --- Brett Hundley set a school record in 2012 by throwing for at least 300 yards in three straight games...Rosen also has thrown for at least 350 yards in games v. - \*\*UCLA's record under Coach Mora from Oct. 12 on in a season is---18-8 (2012: 5-3; 2013: 6-3; 2014: 6-1; 2015: 1-1).
- \*\*PK Ka'imi Fairbairn has connected on 37 straight field goals from 35 yards and in and on 24 of his last 26 overall FG attempts.
- \*\*Josh Rosen's 407 yards of total offense against Cal was just the 11th 400-yard effort ever by a Bruin and the ninth-best total.
- \*\*RB Paul Perkins now has nine 100-yard rushing games in his career after his 104-yard effort (14 carries) at Stanford. Perkins matched his career-best with five receptions in the opening win over Uva and enters the Colorado game with 63 receptions; he is closing in on all-time UCLA running back leader, Chris Markey (2004-07) who had 67 career catches.

 \*\*Paul Perkins' 219-yard rushing effort vs. BYU was the 12th-best in school history and the most since Maurice Jones-Drew set the school record with 322 yards in a game vs. Washington in 2004.. "Perk" was first Bruin to lead conference in rushing since DeShaun Foster-2001. His total of 1,575 yards (15th NCAA) was second-highest single-season total in school history. Perkins also became first Bruin to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing mark in his first two seasons of action.  
 \*\*With the win at Arizona, UCLA opened a season with four straight victories for the third straight year. It is the second time in school history that a UCLA team has opened up with four straight season-opening wins over a three season stretch. The first was in the 1952, 1953 and 1954 seasons under head coach Red Sanders.  
 \*\*The Bruins were down 20-10 in the fourth quarter v. BYU before coming back to win...UCLA's last rally from a double-digit deficit in the fourth quarter came in 2005 when it did so four times in five weeks --- Oct. 1 down 7-17 - won 21-17 v. Washington; Oct. 8 down 28-40 - won 47-40 v. Cal; Oct. 15 down 21-38 - won 44-41 in ot at Wash. State; Oct. 29 down 3-24 at Stanford - won 30-27 in ot  
 \*\*Kenny Young's 23-yard interception return at UNLV was UCLA's 10th defensive touchdown scored since 2012.  
 \*\*UCLA has won 29 of its last 34 games when winning the turnover battle (85%) and owns a 24-39 record in its last 63 games (38%) when losing or tying the turnover ratio  
 \*\*Primarily defensive players have scored 17 touchdowns while playing on offense since 2012.  
 \*\*UCLA's six wins in the 2014 regular season games away from home were the most in school history.  
 \*\*UCLA has won 26 straight overall games and 45 straight regular season games in which it has held the opponent to less than 20 points (last loss 17-16 to BYU in 2007 Las Vegas Bowl /last regular season loss 16-14 at Colorado 2003).

 \*\*With the loss at Stanford, UCLA saw its school record win streak in games played away from the Rose Bowl end at 12.  
 \*\*UCLA has totaled at least 9 wins in three straight seasons for the first time ever (2012-9, 2013-10, 2014-10)  
 \*\*UCLA is 15-5 in true road games under coach Mora - '15: 2-1, '14: 5-0, '13: 4-2, '12: 4-2.  
 \*\*With the win at Arizona, UCLA has posted a 12-1 record in September games under Coach Mora and won its last 10 in a row  
 \*\*With the win over BYU, UCLA has now won 14 of its last 15 non-conference matchups, including 11 straight since a loss to Baylor in the 2012 Holiday Bowl. UCLA has won all 12 regular season non-conference games under Coach Mora.

**UCLA COACHES' RADIO SHOW**

UCLA head football coach Jim Mora will be a guest on the show during football season, and UCLA men's basketball head coach Steve Alford will be featured during basketball season. Also appearing throughout the year will be UCLA Athletic Director Dan Guerrero and various coaches and student-athletes from UCLA's storied athletics program that has won a national-best 2NCAA Championships. New Voice of the Bruins Bill Roth and local broadcaster John Ramey will serve as the hosts of the show.*

**UCLA HEAD COACH JIM MORA**

On December 10, 2011, former Atlanta Falcons and Seattle Seahawks head coach Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history.

In 2014, Coach Mora guided the Bruins to the ninth 10-win season in school history, matching the school record for wins in a season. It marked the third straight year in which Mora's Bruins had produced at least nine wins, a first in program history. His 29 total wins are the most-ever by a UCLA coach in his initial three seasons on the job.

Following the victory in the 2015 Alamo Bowl, UCLA had captured wins in 10 straight games away from the Rose Bowl to tie that school record, including a school-best 7-0 slate in 2014. That win was also the team's third over teams ranked among the Associated Press' Top 15 at the time of the contest, which was the most by the program since it defeated four such teams in 1952. The Bruins capped off the season ranked No. 10 in the final AP poll which was the highest for the program since 1998.

Linebacker Eric Kendricks, who became the school's all-time leading tackler during the 2014 season, went on to be UCLA's first recipient of the Butkus Award and the second-straight winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy. Quarterback Brett Hundley set numerous school career records, including bests for most touchdown passes and total offense. Running back Paul Perkins led the Pac-12 in rushing and produced the second-highest rushing yardage total in school history.

In 2013, Mora led the Bruins to the eighth 10-win season in school history, tying the school mark for most wins in a season. UCLA remained in the AP rankings throughout the full 2013 season for the first time since 1998. Linebacker Anthony Barr was selected as a first-team All-America and as the school's first winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy. A school record 18 true freshmen saw action during the season and seven true freshmen position players started in a game to match that school record. Five Bruins, the most by the program since 2002, were selected in the 2014 NFL Draft, headed by Barr's pick at No. 9 overall by the Minnesota Vikings.

In his first year, Mora guided the Bruins to the 2012 South Division Championship of the Pac-12 Conference and matched the school-record for wins by a first-year coach, with nine. The Bruins, who played in the Holiday Bowl, set numerous offensive records during the course of the 2012 season, including establishing a new school rushing leader, in Johnathan Franklin, and several passing marks achieved by Hundley. On defense, Barr emerged as one of the most dynamic performers in the country in his first season as a linebacker and led the nation in sacks for a good portion of the year. Kendricks led the conference in tackles, ranking 11th in the country. Four players were selected in the 2013 NFL Draft, including defensive lineman Datone Jones in the first round by the Green Bay Packers.

Mora came to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brought 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in 2007 and 2008. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year.

The Falcon's defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

True senior **JORDAN PAYTON (#9-Political Science major)** has moved into the **top 5** on the all-time school reception list and moved into the **top 10** in receiving yards in the game at Stanford. He has caught a pass in **23** straight games.

Payton started all 13 games in 2014 and his 67 catches led the team and ranked as the sixth-highest total in single-season school history. He had 100-yard games versus Memphis (104) and Arizona (119). Payton made at least five receptions in nine games. True junior **THOMAS DUARTE (#18-Sociology major)** appeared in 12 games with seven starts while earning honorable mention all-conference honors. He caught 28 passes for four touchdowns (2 v. **RUNNING BACKS** — **PAUL PERKINS (#24-Sociology major)** rushed for 219 yards against BYU, the 12th-highest total in school history and the most since 2004 when Maurice Jones-Drew racked up a school record 322 yards vs. Washington.

In 2014, Perkins became the first Bruin to lead the Pac-12 in rushing since DeShaun Foster in 2001. His total of 1,575 yards rushing was the second-highest total in a season ever by a UCLA back. He ranked 15th in the NCAA in rushing yards (1,575), 16th in rushing yards per game (121.2) and 29th in the nation in all-purpose rushing (136.6).

Perkins had six 100-rushing games, topped by a 194-yard performance in the bowl win over Kansas State. He also ran for 190 yards on 22 carries against Oregon and went for 180 yards at Colorado, including a 92-yard scoring run which tied for the second-longest in school history. Perkins recorded his first two scoring receptions in the win at Cal. He was an honorable mention all-conference selection by the coaches. Named Offensive MVP of the Valero Alamo Bowl, Perkins became the first Bruin to rush for more than 2,000 yards in his initial two seasons in the program during the bowl game win.

Perkins saw his first game action in 2013 and made four starts. He ran for scores in games vs. Nevada, at Nebraska, Cal, ASU, USC and Virginia Tech. He caught three balls at USC for 79 yards and four balls vs. NMSU for 36 yards. Perkins ran for 92 yards on 16 carries at Utah and 93 yards on 22 carries at Oregon. He was named honorable mention academic all-conference.

## OFFENSIVE LINE —

Redshirt senior **JAKE BRENDEL (#54-Economics major)**, a team co-captain, was named to the 2015 Outland Trophy and Rimington Award Watch Lists and has started **46** games at center. He was a second-team all-conference performer in 2014 and a first-team Academic All-Pac-12 selection the past three seasons.

Junior guard **ALEX REDMOND (#51-History major)** matched the school mark with 13 starts as a freshman. He joined tackle **CALEB BENENOCH (#74-Political Science major)** to become the first pair of Bruin true freshmen to ever start together on the offensive line in the 2013 game against Cal. **SCOTT QUESSENBERRY (#52-Political Science major)** joined the group to make it the first trio of true freshmen to ever start together on the offensive line at Oregon in 2013. Benenoch has started the last **29** games at right tackle.

Redshirt junior **CONOR McDERMOTT (#68-Political Science major)** made his first start as a

blocking tight end against Oregon in 2014. He then went on to start the last seven games of that season at left tackle. Played on special teams and as a reserve along the offensive line in 2013. McDermott redshirted in 2012.

Redshirt sophomore **KENNY LACY (#76-Political Science major)** saw his first game action last season at Arizona State. He went on to make two starts at guard in home games against Utah and Oregon.

**KICKER** — True senior kicker **KA'IMI FAIRBAIRN (#15)** has made 37 straight field goals from 35 yards and in. He connected from 60-yards out against Cal which was the longest field goal in school history and the longest ever in a conference game. It is the tied for the second-longest ever by a conference player. His 53-yard field goal against Arizona State earlier this season had tied for the fourth-longest boot in school history. Last season he became the first Bruin to record three 100-point seasons. Fairbairn has handled all of the Bruin placekicking chores in his first three seasons in the program. He began the 2015 season sixth on the all-time school field goal list and fifth in career scoring.

In 2014, Fairbairn ranked 19th in the nation and third in the Pac-12 with his .818 field goal percentage after connecting on 18 of 22 field goal attempts. He finished the season by converting 13 of his last 14 attempts. His total of 18 made field goals tied for 10th-best on the school season list. Fifty of his 80 kickoffs went for touchbacks.

His 33-yard kick in 2012 at Arizona State, with no time left, provided the winning points in a 45-43 victory. His 104 points scored, rank tied for 11th on the school list and as the most ever scored by a Bruin true freshman.

### HONORARY CAPTAIN - 1965 Bruin Football Team

Coached by Tommy Prothro, the 1965 Bruin football team posted an 8-2-1 record, knocked off top-ranked Michigan State in the Rose Bowl, and finished the year ranked fourth by the Associated Press and fifth by United Press International.

The Bruins lost their season opening game that season, 13-3 at Michigan State, but then embarked on a seven-game unbeaten streak, notching wins at Penn State and over Syracuse along the way. UCLA took a 6-1-1 record into the Coliseum to play sixth-ranked USC with a trip to the Rose Bowl on the line. The Trojans took a 16-6 lead in the fourth quarter before quarterback Gary Beban connected with Dick Witcher on a scor-

ing pass with four minutes to play. UCLA converted a two-point play to trail 16-14 and then recovered an onside kick. Beban then hit Kurt Altenberg on a 50-yard scoring pass and UCLA took home a 20-16 victory to win the AAWU Championship with a perfect 4-0-0 record and clinch a spot in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins went to the 1966 Rose Bowl as a 14½ point underdog in a rematch with undefeated and #1 ranked powerhouse Michigan State (10-0). UCLA, now dubbed "The Miracle Bruins" by Sports Illustrated, vanquished the heavily favored Spartans 14-12. That victory gave UCLA an 8-2-1 mark, prevented the Spartans from winning the AP title, and resulted in Prothro earning Coach of the Year accolades from his coaching colleagues. UCLA finished #4 that season, and due to their small size, earned the moniker "Gutty little Bruins."

In the words of the LA Times of that day, "Coach Tommy Prothro's Bruins out-fought, out-

scrambled and out-scored the highly vaunted Spartans, 14-12, before 100,087 startled spectators in the Rose Bowl on a beautiful New Year's Day." Jim Colletto, Bob Stiles and Dallas Grider combined to stop Michigan State's two-point conversion attempt with 31 seconds left and give UCLA its first Rose Bowl victory in school history.

Bruins named to the 1965 AAWU All-Conference team that season included end Kurt Altenberg, tackle Russ Banducci, quarterback Gary Beban, halfback Mel Farr, defensive end Jim Colletto, defensive tackle John Richardson, deep back Bob Stiles. Earning honorable mention were end Byron Nelson, guard Tim Deakers, guard Barry Leventhal, halfback Dick Witcher, fullback Paul Horgan, end Erwin Dutcher, guard Steve Butler, linebacker Jim Miller, linebacker Dallas Grider, deep back Tim McAteer. Richardson was a second-team AP All-America selection that season, while Beban, Altenberg, Banducci, Farr and Stiles earned honorable mention acclaim.

Beban led the AAWU in total offense that season with 576 yards rushing and 1336 yards passing. Farr ranked fourth in the league in rushing with 785 yards and eight touchdowns. Altenberg was sixth in receiving with 29 catches for 544 yards and three touchdowns.

**BRUINS IN THE POLLS** — The Bruins finished ranked in the final polls in 2013 for the first time since the 2005 season. It was most recently in the top five of the Associated Press poll in the 2001 season, when it spent two weeks at No. 4 after winning its first six games.

**NON-SATURDAY GAMES** — The 2015 schedule featured a pair of Thursday night affairs, in back-to-back weeks, at Stanford (L) and in the Rose Bowl versus California (W). Last season on Thursday night at Arizona State, the Bruins bested the Sun Devils and on Friday of Thanksgiving week, at home, in the Rose Bowl against Stanford, the Cardinal dropped the Bruins.

In 2013, the Bruins won at Utah on a Thursday night and at home versus Washington on a Friday night. The last time UCLA had played a Friday game during the regular season was in 2011 at Arizona State. The most recent previous home game to have been played on Friday was against Arizona on Oct. 27, 1978.

In 2012, UCLA opened the season with a win at Rice on a Thursday evening. In 2011, it played at Arizona on a Thursday evening. In the 2010 season, the Bruins played three non-Saturday games - Oct. 21 at Oregon, Nov. 18 at Washington and Nov. 26 at Arizona State.

Prior to 2010, the last time the Bruins played a regular-season non-Saturday game was Friday, Nov. 28, 2008 at Arizona State, dropping a 34-9 decision. The Bruins also played a Monday night game that year, defeating Tennessee, 27-24 in overtime on Labor Day night (Aug. 30). Before 2008, UCLA had not played on a week night since Thurs., Sept. 30, 1993, a 52-13 victory at San Diego State. The Bruins also played at San Diego State on Thurs., Sept. 26, 1991 (won, 37-12).

**BRUIN FRESHMEN OVER THE YEARS** — Five true freshmen saw action in the 2015 season-opener against Virginia --- QB Josh Rosen, RB SoSo Jamabo, RB Bolu Olorunfemi, DB Octavius Spencer and TE Chris Clark. Three more played at UNLV --- REC Stephen Johnson III, OL Tevita Halalilo, DL Fred Ulu-Perry. DB Nate Meadors made his debut at Arizona.

Seven true freshmen saw action in the 2014 opener at Uva --- OL Najee Toran, DB Jaleel Wadood, WR Mossi Johnson, LB Zach Whitley, LB Kenny Young, DL Jacob Tuioti-Mariner, DL Matt Dickerson. RB Nate Starks took the field v. Memphis and a ninth frosh, WR Alex VanDyke, saw his first action at ASU.

The Bruins established a new school mark in 2013 when guard Scott Quessenberry took the field at Oregon as the 18th true freshman to see action that season. Fifteen true frosh saw action in the 2013 opener against Nevada. UCLA played 12 true freshmen in 2012. One first-year player saw action in 2011. In both 2009 and 2010, UCLA played 10 true freshmen.

The last true freshman defender to start an opener was safety Rahim Moore, in 2008 vs. Tennessee.

The Los Angeles all-sports station's broadcast includes a two-hour pre-game show (one hour local, one hour network) and a post-game show. Hall of Fame broadcaster Bill Roth will be the new voice of the Bruins. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens ('83-'86) is set to begin his 19th year on the broadcast team and his 15th as the analyst in the booth. Former Bruin quarterback Wayne Cook ('91-'94) is in his 14th season as sideline reporter.

AM 570 LA Sports also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Radio Partner of UCLA Athletics.

## DID YOU KNOW...

Three Bruin coaches and 12 players, including 2014 inductee John Sciarra, 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

Five Bruins have been voted in to the NFL Hall of Fame-OL Johnathan Ogden-2013; QB Troy Aikman-2006; DB Jimmy Johnson-1994; WR/coach Tom Fears-1970; QB/P/PK/DB Bob Waterfield-1965.

The selection of linebacker Anthony Barr by the Minnesota Vikings in the first round of the 2014 NFL draft marked the 31st time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 31 of the last 34 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

Since 2000, UCLA has had 19 finalists / winners of National player awards --- 2014 Eric Kendricks - Lott IMPACT Award winner; Butkus Award winner; Brett Hundley - Manning Award finalist, Unita Award finalist; 2013 Anthony Barr - Lott IMPACT Trophy winner, Lombardi Award finalist, Bednarik Award finalist; Myles Jack - Hornung Award finalist; 2012 Johnathan Franklin - Doak Walker Award finalist; 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluge-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. PASADENA (AP) — Freshman Josh Rosen passed for 351 yards and three touchdowns in a stellar debut for UCLA, leading the No. 13 Bruins to a victory over Virginia on Saturday. Thomas Duarte, Devin Fuller and defensive tackle Kenny Clark caught scoring passes from the 18-year-old Rosen, who went 28 for 35 with several

stunning throws and no turnovers in his first game at the Rose Bowl.

Rosen stepped in for three-year starter Brett Hundley with remarkable poise, and the Bruins racked up 503 total yards to beat Virginia.

Linebacker Myles Jack rushed for a touchdown, and the 310-pound Clark hauled in a TD pass late in the third quarter to cap the Bruins' strong offensive performance.

UCLA's first drive fizzled, but Rosen completed seven straight throws to close the first quarter, including a short TD pass to Fuller. Rosen then hit Duarte for a gorgeous 30-yard TD pass midway through the second quarter.

UCLA took control with an 85-yard drive in the third quarter capped by the first two runs from Jack, the linebacker in his third season of moonlighting as a short-yardage running back. Rosen, who completed his final nine passes, marched the Bruins 67 yards moments later, rolling out and hitting Clark in stride for the junior defensive lineman's first score.

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Paul Perkins ran for 151 yards and two touchdowns, Josh Rosen threw for another score and No. 13 UCLA rolled to a 37-3 victory over UNLV on Saturday night.

Rosen completed 22 of 42 passes for 223 yards as the Bruins (2-0) piled up 526 yards in all, the second consecutive week UNLV's defense allowed more than 500.

After the first two games of his college career, Rosen is 50 of 77 for 574 yards and four touchdowns. His performance against Virginia last week earned him the Walter Camp National Player of the Week award on offense.

Kenny Young's interception return for a score was the 10th defensive touchdown scored since 2012. Ka'imi Fairbairn tied his career-best with a total of three made field goals in the game. The blocked punt by Takkarist McKinley was the 14th kick blocked by the Bruins under fourth-year coach Jim Mora.

The win marked the first time since a 2008 game against Washington State that the Bruins had held a team without a touchdown.

UCLA has won 13 of its last 14 non-conference games — and 10 straight since losing to Baylor in the 2012 Holiday Bowl. The Bruins have won all 11 regular-season non-conference games under Mora.

It was the first game in which UCLA did not surrendered a touchdown since a 2008 28-3 win against Washington State. The Bruins ran 98 plays from scrimmage in the contest.

PASADENA (AP) — Nate Starks scored on a 3-yard run with 3:25 remaining, Paul Perkins rushed for 219 yards and a touchdown, and No. 10 UCLA rallied to beat No. 19 BYU.

With freshman quarterback Josh Rosen struggling, the Bruins' ground game picked up the slack to maintain coach Jim Mora's perfect regular-season record against

non-conference opponents. After Rosen's 9-yard pass to Jordan Payton to open the drive, the next six plays were all runs by Perkins and Starks to set up the decisive score. Starks ripped off runs of 31 and 22 yards on consecutive carries before scoring two plays later.

Tanner Mangum drove the Cougars to the Bruins 42-yard line, but his fourth-down pass was intercepted by Myles Jack, allowing the Rose Bowl crowd to finally celebrate. Rosen was 11 of 23 for 106 yards with a 19-yard touchdown to Payton early in the fourth quarter, and three interceptions.

The Cougars frequently pressured Rosen and he threw all three picks in the first half. Paul Langi picked off Rosen at the 5-yard line to end a promising drive, and Kai Nacua came up with an interception in the end zone in the final minute of the second quarter.

That prompted UCLA to rely on Perkins to save the day. The Pac-12's leading rusher last season set a career high, and had runs of 44 and 33 yards to set up touchdown drives before Starks delivered the final blow.

The rally from the fourth quarter double digit deficit was UCLA's first since 2005.

UA got off to a great start against UCLA's depleted defense, quick-hitting its way to a 34-yard touchdown pass from Solomon to Nate Phillips. However, Arizona's second series ended quickly when a snap sailed over Solomon's hand and the Bruins recovered. Perkins scored on a 16-yard run the next play.

Arizona gained a little momentum to open the second half after Randall scrambled and found David Richards for a 16-yard touchdown. The Wildcats reached UCLA's 3 on the next drive, but went backward and settled for Casey Skowron's 44-yard field goal.

ASU built a 29-10 lead heading into the fourth quarter before the Bruins rallied. Thomas Duarte caught his second touchdown pass from Josh Rosen with 9:19 left, trimming the Sun Devils' lead to 29-23. But after Matt Haack's exceptional punt and a defensive stand forced the Bruins to take a safety with 4:16 left, ASU wrapped it up with a late TD run.

The Sun Devils shut down UCLA's running game and tormented Rosen, who completed 22-for-40 for 280 yards with an interception. UCLA tailback Paul Perkins was held to 63 yards rushing and a fourth-quarter touchdown.

Arizona State took the lead in the first quarter when Rosen was called for intentional grounding in the end zone on the Bruins' fourth possession. Tim White followed up the Sun Devils' safety by returning the kickoff 65 yards and then rumbling in with a 14-yard TD catch. Bercovici ran up the middle for a 34-yard score early in the third quarter, and Foster caught a TD pass shortly afterward.

UCLA's offense got rolling in the fourth quarter, with Perkins making a gutsy 29-yard run before a 1-yard TD plunge. Linebacker Isaako Savaiinaea made a midfield interception moments later, and Duarte caught a 17-yard TD pass.

Arizona State's next drive stalled at midfield, but Haack rolled his punt out of bounds right in front of the goal-line pylon, and UCLA snapped its own punt attempt high out of the end zone on purpose but could not stop ASU's next drive.

An early interception returned for a touchdown, a long kickoff return allowed that set up another score and 10 penalties for 93 yards were far too much for the Bruins to overcome.

Francis Owusu pinned the ball on the back of a Bruin defender in the end zone for a touchdown catch and Christian McCaffrey did most of the rest with a school-record 243 yards rushing and four touchdowns.

"It was a tough loss against a good team," coach Jim Mora said. "The pick 6, the kickoff return for a touchdown, the nine offensive penalties, those are tough things to overcome. We hurt ourselves with missed tackles."

McCaffrey, who finished with 369 all-purpose yards, scored on a 70-yard run out of the wildcat, returned a kick 96 yards to set up another score and ran for three more touchdowns in a performance that set a new school rushing record.

Josh Rosen threw for 325 yards and three touchdowns. Paul Perkins ran for 104 and a score, but the Bruins dropped their second straight Pac-12 contest.

"Every loss hurts. We have to execute a lot better than we did tonight," safety Randall Goforth said. "Their quarterback did everything right and they outplayed us. I just have to make sure everybody is staying together and we'll come back and be ready to fight."

Thomas Duarte had career highs of 10 catches for 141 yards for the Bruins (5-2, 2-2 Pac-12). UCLA rebounded from consecutive losses to Arizona State and

Stanford, with a 573-yard offensive performance and a stellar effort by its defense, which sacked Cal's Jared Goff five times.

"Every time you win, it's a step forward," said Rosen, who broke the completions record set by Richard Brehaut and Brett Hundley. "Especially with our bye week, that was three weeks without a win, so it felt great to come out here and put it to them."

Soso Jamabo rushed for a score after star UCLA tailback Paul Perkins left with an injury, and the Bruins' injury-plagued defense limited Jared Goff and Cal's potent offense to 170 yards in the first half.

Debuting their black-and-gold "City" uniforms, UCLA appeared revitalized. Ka'imi Fairbairn made four field goals, including a school-record 60-yarder at the halftime gun, and the UCLA defense caused trouble for Goff throughout.

"The key was getting that quarterback on the ground," UCLA coach Jim Mora said. "We struggle with that, and we got it done against a really good player."

"Things that we haven't done all year, we did tonight," Cal coach Sonny Dykes said. "That's not indicative of this football team, and we didn't play well tonight."
