**ON DECK - Tennessee:** UT owns a 21-16-2 edge over Georgia in the all-time series, but the Bulldogs won their last matchup in Athens in 2008 (26-14). Matthew Stafford passed for a career-high 310 yards in that game as Knowshon Moreno picked up 101 yards on the ground. **Blair Walsh** also drilled four field goals during Georgia's last win over UT. Last year, UT posted a 45-17 win in Knoxville. The Vols (2-2, 0-1 SEC) face LSU in Baton Rouge on Oct. 2.

### Georgia-Colorado Series

Georgia's one and only meeting with Colorado took place in Athens in 2006. The game attracted as much notoriety as did the mascots, as Ralphie the buffalo and Uga VI the bulldog - two of the country's most well-known mascots - shared the stage between the hedges.

Quarterback Joe Cox came off the bench to throw a pair of fourth-quarter touchdown passes to lift Georgia to a 14-13 win over Colorado in front of a sellout crowd of 92,746 at Sanford Stadium. Trailing 13-0, Cox got the Bulldogs on the scoreboard with a 23-yard pass to fullback Brannan Southerland with 9:11 left in the contest. Then with 46 seconds left, Cox lofted a 20-yard pass to tight end Matrez Milner to tie the game. Brandon Coutu added a PAT for the game-winning point. Cox had come in to relieve a struggling Matthew Stafford (8-of-16, 76 yds., fumble) and finished with 153 yards on 10-of-13 passing.

As a freshman in 2006, **Kris Durham** made his second career start in the Bulldogs' matchup against Colorado. While he was the only current Georgia player to take the field in that game, DE **Demarcus Dobbs**, DE **Kiante Tripp**, DE **Brandon Wood**, SS **Quintin Banks**, ILB **Akeem Dent**, ILB **Akeem Hebron**, OLB **Darryl Gamble**, CB **Chad Gloer**, FB **Shaun Chapas**, FB **Fred Munzenmaier**, OG **Chris Davis**, and OT **Josh Davis** were all redshirted for the 2006 season.

### Non-Conference Success

Under the direction of Mark Richt, Georgia owns a 39-4 record against teams from outside the Southeastern Conference. Two of the losses came in bowl games: (Boston College, 20-16, 2001 Music City; West Virginia, 38-35, 2006 Nokia Sugar). The other two came during the regular season: (Georgia Tech, 45-42, 2008; Oklahoma State, 24-10, 2009). Georgia routed Louisiana-Lafayette 55-7 in the 2010 opener and still has dates left with the Buffaloes, Idaho State and Georgia Tech this season.

### Durham Flourishes As Main Target

While junior flanker **A.J. Green** was sidelined for the first four games, senior flanker **Kris Durham** developed into Georgia's primary receiving threat. He is enjoying a career season. In the matchup with Mississippi State, Durham had four catches for 64 yards in the first half before having to leave the game in the second half with a stinger. A week before, he hauled in a career-high 101 yards on five catches, including a 46-yarder, against #12 Arkansas. Durham was the leading receiver in each of the first three games. He has 17 catches for 324 yards and one touchdown on the year. Durham missed the 2009 season with a shoulder injury.

## OFFENSE

### Murray Directing Bulldog Offensive Attack

Redshirt freshman QB **Aaron Murray** started his first game for the Bulldogs and led them to a 55-7 win over Louisiana in the 2010 opener. He finished with four TDs (3 passing, 1 rushing), going 17-for-26 for 160 yards with one INT. Murray completed passes to nine different receivers as UGA totaled their most points since 2004 (62-17, Kentucky).

Murray's efficiency has continued the last three games. On the road against Mississippi State, he completed 18 of 31 for a career-high 274 yards and a touchdown. Against South Carolina, Murray went 14-for-21 passing for 192 yards after hitting seven different receivers. Murray also exploded for 253 yards passing and a touchdown during the 31-24 home loss to #12 Arkansas. The 6-1, 209-pound Murray redshirted in 2009 after enrolling early at UGA in January of that year. Senior SS **Josh Murray** is his older brother who walked on last year following a five-year career in professional baseball and traveled and dressed out for the Bulldogs against MSU.

Freshman **Hutson Mason** serves as Murray's backup. On his first collegiate snap, Mason delivered a 26-yard TD strike to former QB **Logan Gray** and finished 2-for-5 with 33 yards.

**Did You Know?** According to the NCAA record book, Mason is only the second QB in NCAA Division I FBS history to throw a TD on his first collegiate snap (The other is Taylor Bennett-Ga. Tech). Also, Mason is just the sixth QB in NCAA history to throw a scoring strike on the first pass of his career. Mason is the first Bulldog to throw a TD pass on his first career attempt since RB Thomas Brown connected with QB Joe Tereshinski on a 9-yard trick play against Florida in 2005.

### Bulldogs March Down For 90-Yard TD

Trailing 24-6 against Mississippi State last Saturday, Georgia put together a 90-yard drive on seven plays in only 25 seconds. **Aaron Murray** connected with **Tavarres King** on a 40-yard touchdown to cap the drive. This marked the Bulldogs' first touchdown in an SEC road game this season. This drive also marked Georgia's longest scoring drive since the 2009 Capital One Bowl. Against Michigan State, Georgia had a 96-yard drive that took 10 plays and lasted 5:51. Matthew Stafford completed a 35-yard scoring strike to Mike Moore to give the Bulldogs a 10-6 lead en route to a 24-12 victory.

The Bulldogs had poor field position throughout the game with Mississippi State. The average starting point against MSU was the GA19.

### Deep At TE

The Bulldogs feature one of the deepest and most versatile groups of tight ends in the country. **Orson Charles** started the first two games and caught a pair of catches in each game. He has 57 receiving yards on five catches this year. Charles earned Freshman All-America honors after appearing in all 13 games, including three starts. He ranked third on the team with 23 catches for 374 yards and three scores in 2009.

**Aron White** got the start versus #12 Arkansas. He was named to this year's Mackey Award Watch List after starting 12 games as a redshirt sophomore last season. White was named the Offensive MVP of the Independence Bowl after hauling in two touchdown passes to conclude 2009. White finished with 13 catches for 198 yards and four TDs on the year.



### Durham Leading By Example

During A.J. Green's absence, senior SE **Kris Durham** has been **Aaron Murray**'s primary target. Durham has started the first four games this year and is the team's leading receiver with 324 yards on 17 catches and a touchdown. Although forced to leave the game in the fourth period against Mississippi State with a stinger, Durham still managed four catches for 64 yards in the opening half. He posted a career-best performance against #12 Arkansas after grabbing five catches for 101 yards. In the season opener against the Ragin' Cajuns, he led the team with five catches for 83 yards (*both were career highs*) and one touchdown. Durham hauled in three more balls for 76 yards at USC.

The top three most catches by a Bulldog senior are: Terrence Edwards, 59, 2002; Mohammed Massaquoi, 58, 2008; Hines Ward, 55, 1997. Edwards finished the '02 season with a school record 1,004 yards.

Durham redshirted in 2009 with a shoulder injury and sat out a portions of the 2008 season with ankle and hand injuries.

Sophomore SE **Tavarres King** returned to the lineup against South Carolina and then hauled in four catches for a season-high 91 yards and a touchdown against Arkansas. He followed that performance with 79 yards, including a 40-yard score against MSU.

Along with Durham and King, sophomore SE **Marlon Brown** and FLK **Logan Gray** provide additional depth. The 6-5 Brown is the Bulldogs' third-leading receiver with six catches for 84 yards. He tallied a career-high 40 against the Gamecocks. Gray joined with Brown to have one of the better preseasons after Gray chose to convert to FLK after playing QB and returning punts his first two seasons. Against UL, Gray snagged his first career TD, a 26-yard TD from freshman **Hutson Mason**. Gray filled in as a punt returner versus the Razorbacks and had two returns for 25 yards.



### Tailbacks Share The Load

The Bulldogs had four different leading rushers in 2009, but finished the year by employing a combination of **Caleb King** and **Washaun Ealey**. Sophomore **Carlton Thomas** is getting a chance for an increased role with the above duo this season. King returned to the lineup against Mississippi State after missing the past two games with an ankle injury and finished with nine carries for 23 yards. The Bulldogs gained 113 yards on 34 carries against MSU. Ealey led Georgia with 36 yards while redshirt freshman QB **Aaron Murray** had 32 yards on seven carries.

With King sidelined with an injury against the Gamecocks and Razorbacks, Ealey rushed 19 times for 75 yards versus South Carolina. However, he had Georgia's sole turnover after fumbling on the South Carolina 1-yard line. In the Arkansas game, Ealey scampered for 87 yards and a touchdown. Ealey suffered a second fumble near the goal line during the MSU game.

### Paving The Way For The Tailbacks

Seniors **Shaun Chapas** and **Fred Munzenmaier** split time as the featured fullback for the Bulldogs. Munzenmaier shouldered the load against South Carolina after Chapas was forced to leave the game in the first half with an ankle injury. Chapas was sidelined for the Arkansas game due to the injury but returned for limited action against Mississippi State. Munzenmaier started versus the Razorbacks and had one catch for seven yards. They both enjoyed a productive game in the season opener against UL. They each had a receiving touchdown. It was the third TD reception for Chapas and the first for Munzenmaier.

In his first three seasons, Munzenmaier had a total of three catches for 21 yards. Against Mississippi State this year, he collected five catches for 36 yards to give him eight on the year for a total of 55 yards.

## DEFENSE

### Three New Defensive Coaches, 3-4 Scheme Leads Bulldogs

**Mark Richt** retooled his defensive staff following the 2009 season. Georgia's defensive staff in 2010 is led by defensive coordinator/outside linebackers coach **Todd Grantham**, assistant head coach/defensive line/recruiting coordinator **Rodney Garner** (12th year at UGA), defensive backs coach **Scott Lakatos** and inside linebackers coach **Warren Belin**.

With Grantham running the defense, Georgia made the switch to a 3-4 alignment this spring. New terminology includes two ends, a nose with two inside linebackers and two outside linebackers. With this switch, the Bulldogs had six first-time starters versus UL. Of the 55 points surrendered by the Bulldogs this season, they held their opponents to just 17 in the second half through the first three games. UL was shutout, USC managed a field goal and #12 Arkansas scored 14 points.

Then, the Bulldog defense allowed an opening-drive touchdown against Mississippi State. They held MSU scoreless for the second and third quarters until MSU exploded for 17 points in the fourth, including a 10-play, 93-yard scoring drive. The Bulldog offense did turn over the ball to MSU on downs on the GA21 in the final period, giving MSU a short field for one of their final scores.

Grantham came to Georgia from the Dallas Cowboys where he was the defensive line coach from 2008 to 2009. Before arriving in Athens, Grantham spent 11 seasons in the NFL but also has had assistant coaching experience at Virginia Tech and Michigan State.

### Tyson Anchoring D-Line

Junior **DeAngelo Tyson** started at nose for Georgia in the first three games. Redshirt freshman **Kwame Geathers** and sophomore **Abry Jones**, who got the start against MSU, help Tyson fill this role. Geathers notched a career-high three tackles against UL. Tyson played in all 13 games last season and finished with 12 tackles. Senior **DE Brandon Wood** got the first start of his career in the UL game and came away with three tackles, including one for a loss. Senior **Demarcus Dobbs** emerged as the leader to fill one of end spots on the line. He started all 13 games of 2009 at one of the defensive end spots and finished with 30 tackles and 4.5 sacks as a junior. Junior **Justin Anderson**, who only played in the season opener, suffered a toe injury and now is out for the season.

### Houston Among The SEC's Elite Pass Rushers

Junior OLB **Justin Houston**'s progression as one the SEC's dominant pass rushers has continued in 2010. Houston is tied for third in the conference in both tackles for loss (6.5) and sacks (3.0). He exploded for a career-high 10 tackles, including two sacks, and forced a fumble against South Carolina.

Despite playing in only 10 games as a sophomore at DE, Houston finished second in the SEC in 2009 with a team-leading 7.5 sacks and 15 tackles for loss. For his efforts, he was named to the AP All-SEC second team. The Bulldogs registered 30 sacks in 2009 compared to 12 by their foes.

### Bulldog Linebacker Corps Features A Variety Of Weapons

In Georgia's new 3-4 scheme, the linebackers play an important role in slowing the opposition's offensive attack. Senior ILB **Akeem Dent** had the third game of his career with 10 or more tackles after finishing with 10 against Mississippi State. Also against MSU, senior OLB **Darryl Gamble** picked off his first pass since snagging a pair at LSU in 2008. Versus #24 South Carolina, both OLBs - Houston and sophomore **Cornelius Washington** - posted career highs in tackles. Houston's 10 tackles and two sacks were complemented by Washington's seven tackles (six solo) and one tackle for loss. Sophomore ILB **Christian Robinson** has started the first three games and had a breakout day against USC. Robinson equaled his career high with five tackles and added a sack and a fumble recovery before adding another five against the Razorbacks.

### Retooled Secondary Adjusting To 3-4

Sporting three new starters in the secondary, the Bulldog cornerbacks and safeties recorded three INTs and allowed just eight completions versus UL. It was the first three-INT game for the Bulldogs since a 2008 win at LSU.

Junior **Brandon Boykin**, who had one of the INTs against UL, is the leader in the secondary. He was fourth on the team in 2009 with 54 tackles and three interceptions while starting 12 of 13 games. Junior **Jakar Hamilton** has filled one of the vacancies at safety. He returned an INT for a TD, Georgia's first pick-six since **Bacarri Rambo** did it against Tennessee last year. Hamilton got to work in the tackle category versus USC, finishing with a career-high eight. CB **Shawn Williams** tallied a career-high seven tackles (five solo) off the bench against #12 Arkansas. Georgia's third INT came from sophomore **Sanders Commings**, who now has two career picks. Commings started his first career game against the Razorbacks and answered with a career-high five stops, including half a tackle for a loss. **Branden Smith** and **Vance Cuff** round out the main contributors.

## SPECIAL TEAMS

### Georgia Returns Nation's Best Kicking Tandem In Butler, Walsh

Georgia junior punter **Drew Butler** and junior place-kicker **Blair Walsh** rank among the nation's best at their respective positions. In 2009, Butler was a consensus All-American and the Ray Guy Award winner, which is given to the nation's top punter. Walsh was one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award, which is given to the nation's top place-kicker. Both are again on the preseason Watch Lists for their respective awards in 2010.

Butler became only the third Bulldog in school history to lead the NCAA in punting, joining Zeke Bratkowski and Bobby Walden. In 2009, Butler averaged 48.1 yards on 56 punts. So far in 2010, Butler has averaged 44.3 yards on 19 punts, five that went for 50+.

In 2009, Walsh ranked among the best in school history in Field Goal Percentage for a single season and that's impressive considering his range. He drilled 20-of-22 FGs (90.9%) in 2009, including 4-of-5 from 50 or more yards.

Walsh connected on two FGs, one from 52 yards and the other from 48 yards, in the 2010 season opener. The 52 yarder tied for the second-longest of his career. Walsh was also 7-for-7 in PATs versus UL and is now 102-for-102 in his career. Against Arkansas, Walsh drilled 43 yarder and is now 7-for-7 on the year.

### KOR Record Watch For Boykin

In 2009, junior defensive back **Brandon Boykin** set the school record for kickoff return yardage in a season with 988 yards on 38 returns. It was also the most kickoff returns in a season, breaking the old mark of 28 shared by Gene Washington (1974) and Asher Allen (2007). So far in 2010, Boykin has 10 returns totaling 229 yards.

**Did You Know?** In 2009, Boykin became the first player in SEC history with two 100-yard kickoff returns for touchdowns in the same season. He had one versus South Carolina and one at Tennessee. Boykin, Vanderbilt's Warren Norman (2009) and Tennessee's Willie Gault (1980) share the SEC record for KOR TDs in a season with three. Boykin's 100-yard KOR against USC was the longest scoring play for Georgia in Sanford Stadium history.

Frix's father, Dr. Mitch Frix, was the starting snapper for Georgia in 1981 and '82 and was member of three SEC championship teams, one national title team and three Sugar Bowl teams. He snapped to Bulldog/NFL great and eventual Hall of Famer Kevin Butler during his Georgia days. Now Dr. Frix's son, Ty, snaps to Kevin's son, All-America punter **Drew Butler**!

### Seven Bulldogs Scored A TD Against Louisiana

For the first time since 1994, Georgia had seven different players score a TD in a game. In the 55-7 win over the Ragin' Cajuns to start the 2010 season, Caleb King (TB), Kris Durham (FLK), Shaun Chapas (FB), Aaron Murray (QB), Fred Munzenmaier (FB), Logan Gray (FLK) and Jakar Hamilton (FS) notched a TD.

In 1994, Georgia posted a 70-6 win over Northeast Louisiana that last featured seven Bulldogs scoring a TD. One of those that day was a freshman running back who had his first 100-yard game: Hines Ward.

## A Closer Look At Butler & Walsh

In 2009, **Drew Butler** was in his first season as a starter, and all he did was lead the NCAA with an average of 48.1 yards on 56 punts. His 57.0 average against #9 Oklahoma State was the second-best average for a game since 1958 (Bobby Walden, 63.0). Butler's 75 yarder against the Cowboys was the longest since Brian Mimbs booted a 77 yarder in 2008 versus USC. Butler also serves as the holder for **Blair Walsh**.

Butler is the son of former NFL standout and Bulldog All-American Kevin Butler. Butler is on Georgia's post-game radio show.

Meanwhile, Walsh's 2009 campaign was equally impressive as he ended up in the No. 2 spot in school history for FG accuracy in a single season. He hit 20-of-22 (90.9%). The record is 13-of-14 (92.86%) by Billy Bennett in 2000. Walsh's consistency made him one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award. Walsh connected on a 37-yard FG to beat Arizona State as time expired in 2009. This was the first game-winning FG for the Bulldogs since Coutu drilled one from the same distance to beat Vanderbilt in 2007 (*also a 20-17 win*). Walsh also hit a career-long 53-yard field goal at #9 Oklahoma State in 2009. Walsh's FG was the longest on the road since Hap Hines hit a 54 yarder vs. Kentucky in 1996.

# 2010 Game Summaries

## LOUISIANA-LAFAYETTE

Sept. 4, 2010 • Sanford Stadium - Athens, Ga.

The University of Georgia Bulldogs opened the 2010 season in impressive fashion at Sanford Stadium on Saturday, toppling the visiting Louisiana-Lafayette Ragin' Cajuns by a score of 55-7. The win gives Georgia a 1-0 mark on the season while dropping Louisiana to an 0-1 record. Redshirt freshman QB Aaron Murray made his first appearance as a Bulldog, and certainly didn't disappoint the 92,746 raucous Sanford Stadium patrons with 17 completions in 26 attempts for 160 yards and three touchdowns, while only throwing one interception.

Georgia got off to an early start and never relinquished the lead, scoring on a Caleb King 20-yard touchdown run with 3:00 remaining in the first quarter. They struck again on the first play of the second quarter as Murray found senior SE Kris Durham for a three yard score, and junior PK Blair Walsh soon thereafter successfully converted a 52-yard field goal attempt, bringing the Bulldog margin to 17-0. Murray found senior FB Shaun Chapas for an 11-yard score with 3:31 remaining in the second quarter, but Louisiana junior TE Ladarius Green soon found himself open for a 60-yard touchdown to give the Ragin' Cajun's their only points on the day with 1:13 remaining in the half. Murray ended the half on a high note, however, with a 16-yard touchdown scramble as time expired to send Georgia into the locker room with a 31-7 halftime lead.

The second half was more of the same as Walsh converted a 48-yard field goal early in the third quarter, and Murray found senior FB Fred Munzenmaier for a one yard TD pass with 4:25 remaining in the period, Munzenmaier's first career TD reception. Freshman QB Hutson Mason entered the game and connected with junior FLK Logan Gray for a 26-yard score on Mason's first career play, and the catch served as Gray's first career touchdown as well. Junior FS Jakar Hamilton put the final Georgia points on the scoreboard with a 17-yard interception return early in the fourth quarter. Leading the way for the Dogs' defense today were senior ILB Akeem Dent and sophomore FS Baccari Rambo, who each had six tackles. Junior ILB Marcus Dowtin had four tackles, and sophomore CB Sanders Commings, who, in addition to four tackles, joined Hamilton and junior CB Brandon Boykin as Dog defenders with interceptions in the opening contest.

## # 24 SOUTH CAROLINA

Sept. 11, 2010 • Williams-Brice Stadium – Columbia, S.C.

The Georgia Bulldogs fell in their first Southeastern Conference contest of the 2010 season at the hands of the South Carolina Gamecocks, a 17-6 defeat in Columbia, S.C. The loss drops the Dogs to 1-1 on the season, with an 0-1 mark in the SEC. The Gamecocks' win lifts their record to 2-0, with a 1-0 tally in conference play. 80,794 South Carolina patrons were on hand to witness the contest, and all bore witness to Gamecock freshman running back Marcus Lattimore, who had 37 carries for 182 yards.

The low scoring affair, in which Georgia's six points stand as its lowest output against South Carolina since 1904, started out fast as the Gamecocks got on the scoreboard early with a two-yard touchdown run to cap an 8:02 opening drive. Georgia answered with a 27-yard field goal by junior Blair Walsh with 0:38 left in the first quarter, and the score would remain 7-3 until Lattimore got South Carolina back on the board with a two-yard touchdown with 1:34 left in the first half.

Georgia opened the second half with a 12 play, 64-yard, 6:43 scoring drive that was capped by a 26-yard Blair Walsh field goal to bring Georgia within eight of the Gamecocks. The 14-6 tally would stand until the final moments of the game, when South Carolina kicker Spencer Lanning hit a 24-yard field goal with 1:12 remaining to lift the Gamecocks to their final 17-6 score. Junior linebacker Justin Houston paced the Bulldogs' defense with a career high 10 tackles, three sacks, and a forced fumble, and redshirt sophomore safety Baccari Rambo led all players with 12 total tackles.

# 2010 Game Summaries

## #12 ARKANSAS

Sept. 18, 2010 • Sanford Stadium – Athens, Ga.

The Georgia Bulldogs dropped their home opener in conference play Saturday to the Arkansas Razorbacks by a score of 31-24. The loss dropped Georgia to 1-2 on the year, with an 0-2 record in the South-eastern Conference. Arkansas elevated its standing to 3-0, with a 1-0 conference tally. A sold out Sanford Stadium crowd of 92, 746 fans were on hand to witness the loss, which marks the first time that Mark Richt has gone 0-2 in SEC play.

The game started out fast as Arkansas quarterback Ryan Mallett connected with receiver Chris Gragg on a 57-yard scoring play with 12:27 left in the first quarter. Georgia responded in kind, however, as Aaron Murray led the Bulldogs down the field and ran in for a one-yard score to tie the game at 7. Arkansas notched a Knile Davis one-yard touchdown run and a 48-yard Zack Hocker field goal to take a 17-7 lead into halftime.

Blair Walsh got the Bulldogs back on the offensive with a 43-yard field goal with 2:44 remaining in the third quarter, but Arkansas answered once again with a 22-yard Ronnie Wingo touchdown pass from Mallett as the Razorbacks took a 24-10 lead into the fourth quarter. Georgia equaled Arkansas at 24 points apiece in the final period with a 10-yard Tavarres King touchdown reception and a three-yard Washaun Ealey touchdown run with 3:55 remaining in regulation. However, Georgia could not manufacture enough on their final series and Arkansas made the most of their last possession, as Mallett found Greg Childs for a 40-yard touchdown pass with 15 seconds remaining. Georgia had time for one final play and Murray's hail mary was almost caught by Georgia receiver Marlon Brown, but Georgia ultimately fell 31-24. Georgia safeties Shawn Williams and Baccari Rambo led the team in tackles on the day with seven apiece, and linebacker Cornelius Washington registered Georgia's only sack, a four-yard loss.

## MISSISSIPPI STATE

Sept. 25, 2010 • Davis Wade Stadium – Starkville, Miss.

The Georgia Bulldogs suffered their third consecutive defeat of the 2010 season on Saturday, falling in Starkville, Miss., to the Mississippi State Bulldogs by a score of 24-12. The loss drops Georgia to a 1-3 record on the season, with an 0-3 SEC mark. Mississippi State elevated its standing to 2-2 on the year, with a 1-2 conference tally. A sellout crowd of 56,271 was on hand to witness Mississippi State's win, their first win over Georgia since 1974.

Mississippi State made it into the scoring column first, as Vick Ballard found the end zone on a 13-yard scamper. Georgia answered back in the second quarter with a pair of field goals, as junior kicker Blair Walsh connected from 25 and 35-yards. A 7-6 Mississippi State halftime lead became a 10-6 lead early in the fourth quarter, as Sean Brauchle hit a 44-yard field goal with 13:59 remaining in the third quarter. Arceto Clark caught a 33-yard touchdown from quarterback Chris Relf and Vick Ballard ran in from the one-yard line for his second score of the day as MSU took a 24-6 fourth quarter lead over the Bulldogs. Georgia quarterback Aaron Murray found sophomore wide receiver Tavarres King on a 40-yard touchdown pass with 1:27 remaining to bring Georgia within 12 points, but the 24-12 score would remain final and the Bulldogs suffered their third consecutive SEC defeat, the first time their conference record has stood at 0-3 since 1993. Georgia was led defensively by senior linebacker Akeem Dent, who registered ten tackles, and junior linebacker Justin Houston, who had four tackles, including a team-high two tackles for loss.



### Coach Mark Richt said...

"We're definitely in a position that I've never been in as a player or a coach. It's certainly not a good place to be, but we are where we are. We must do a good job of sticking together. I've seen no signs of change in that; we're a very close-knit family. We have to look at what's keeping us from having the success we want, and that's what we're going to do."
