### WARRIOR STORYLINES

- ▶ UH is 2-12-1 all-time against current members of the Big 12 Conference although UH has not played a Big 12 opponent since the conference was established in 1996.
- ▶ The last time UH visited a Big 12 opponent was at Nebraska on Sept. 16, 1978.
- ▶ UH is 0-10-1 in its last 11 games against Big 12 teams.
- ▶ UH is 2-3 in non-conference road games under head coach Greg McMackin.
- ▶ Slot receiver Kealoha Pilares had eclipsed the 100-yard receiving mark in each game this season and leads the team with four touchdowns.
- ▶ Slot receiver Greg Salas has a streak of 29 consecutive games with a reception.
- ▶ UH has not won consecutive non-conference road games since 1994-95 (def. California, 21-7, Sept. 17, 1994 and def. UNLV, 58-30, Sept. 30, 1995).

This season, the UH Athletics Department is trumpeting senior slot receiver Greg Salas for the Fred Biletnikoff Award and All-America consideration with his very own webpage (CatchGregSalas.com). Salas, a 6-foot-2, 210-pound, Chino, Calif., native, is on the preseason "Watch List" of the Biletnikoff Award (nation's best receiver). The all-WAC honoree was also selected to several preseason All-America teams after ranking among the nation's best receivers in receptions per game (8.15) and yards per game (122.3).

### THIS WEEK'S GAME

The University of Hawai'i Warrior football team concludes its 13-day road trip with a non-conference game at Colorado, Saturday, Sept. 18 at Folsom Field. Kick-off is 1:30 p.m. MT (9:30 a.m. HT) and the game will be televised on Fox College Sports.

Hawai'i (1-1) rallied to defeat Army, 31-28, last Saturday in West Point, N.Y. The Warriors jumped out to a 21-0 first half lead before the Black Knights scored 28 unanswered points. UH tied it at 28 and its defense forced a late Army turnover. With 24 seconds left, quarterback Bryant Moniz connected with wide receiver Royce Pollard on consecutive plays setting up Scott Enos' 31-yard field goal with :07 remaining. For his efforts, Moniz was named the WAC's Offensive player of the week.

Colorado (1-1) dropped a 52-7 decision to California in Berkeley, Calif. The Buffaloes trailed 31-0 at the half. CU opened the season with a 24-3 win over in-state rival Colorado State in Denver.

The teams have met once with Hawai'i winning 13-0 on Jan. 1, 1925 in Honolulu. UH is 2-12-1 all-time against current members of the Big 12 Conference and have not played at a Big 12 school since playing at Nebraska in 1978.

UH is in the midst of a 13-day road trip which covers 11,184 air miles and takes the team to eight cities in five states and four time zones for non-conference games at Army and Colorado. Between games, the team will stay in Las Vegas before flying to Denver on Friday.

The Warriors are currently ranked second nationally in passing offense, averaging 401.0 yards per game. On the year, Moniz has thrown for 612 yards and four touchdowns while his starting receivers Greg Salas (15 rec., 187 yds), Kealoha Pilares (11 rec., 280 yds, 4 TD), Rodney Bradley (10 rec, 84 yds, 1 TD), and Pollard (12 rec. 200 yds, 1 TD) have shown big playmaking ability. Pilares ranks fourth nationally in receiving yards per game.

Defensively, linebacker Corey Paredes leads the group with 23 tackles, including a team-high 14 last week at Army. Safety Mana Silva has 13 tackles and two fumbles recovered. Fellow safety Spencer Smith will miss the Colorado game due to an arm injury suffered last week.

**NOTES FROM THE ARMY GAME:** UH improved to 10-11-1 all-time against the academies, including a 2-0 mark vs. Army...UH has won its last five games against the academies dating back to 1999 (def. Navy in 1999 & 2009, def. Air Force in 2001 and def. Army in 2003 & 2010)...Bryant Moniz finished with 343 yards passing, the fifth time in his career he has topped 300 yards...Keahola Pilares scored for second straight game on a 48-yard reception from Moniz in the second quarter. Pilares has a team-leading four touchdowns, with each one going for 30 yards or longer...Pilares went for 100+ yards (6 catches, 104 yards) for the second time this season and fourth time in his career...Royce Pollard scored his first career touchdown on a 26-yard reception on UH's opening drive...John Hardy-Tuliau blocked UH's first kick of the season when he denied Army's 37-yard attempt in the fourth quarter. It was UH's first blocked kick since the 2008 season.

**UH VS. COLORADO:** In the teams' only meeting on Jan. 1, 1925, UH defeated Colorado 13-0 in Honolulu. The win capped a perfect 8-0 season for the Rainbows, who allowed only 12 points all season. The "Wonder Teams" of 1924 and '25, went 18-0 during those two seasons and out-scored their opponents 606-29.

**HAWAII VS. THE BIG 12:** Although Hawaii has not played a Big 12 opponent since the conference was established in 1996, UH holds a 2-12-1 all-time record against its current members. The last time UH played a Big 12 team was in 1995 when the Warriors opened the season against Texas (L, 17-38) and closed the season against Oklahoma State (L, 20-24). UH is 0-10-1 in its last 11 games against Big 12 teams. Team-by-team breakdown: 1-0 vs. Colorado, 0-1 vs. Kansas, 0-0-1 vs. Missouri, 1-5 vs. Nebraska, 0-2 vs. Oklahoma, 0-2 vs. Oklahoma State, 0-1 vs. Texas, and 0-1 vs. Texas A&M.

**LIFE ON THE ROAD:** For the fourth straight year, the Warriors will stay on the continent for consecutive road games. Following the Army game, UH travelled to Las Vegas and will stay there before flying to Denver on Friday for the Colorado game. The trip will last 13 days and cover 11,184 air miles on five plane rides (3 commercial flights, 2 charter flights), approximately 200 miles by bus, three different hotel accommodations, four time zones (Hawaii-Eastern-Pacific-Mountain), eight cities (Honolulu-Newark, N.J.-Park Ridge, N.J.-West Point, N.Y.-Las Vegas, Nev.-Denver, Colo.-Westminster, Colo.-Boulder, Colo.), and five states (Hawaii-New Jersey-New York-Nevada-Colorado). Last year, UH stayed on the continent for consecutive non-conference road games against Washington State and UNLV.

**OH CAPTAIN:** In a team vote, slot receiver Greg Salas, defensive tackle Vaughn Meatoga, and linebacker Corey Paredes were named the team's captains this season. In addition, a fourth captain will be named each game.

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** UH will travel approximately 35,000 air miles this season...the schedule includes five bowl teams from last season: Boise State (Fiesta), Fresno State (New Mexico), Idaho (Humanitarian), Nevada (Hawaii) and USC (Emerald)...for the third-straight year UH will play six road games, including two of its first three contests (Army and Colorado)...the Warriors will play their first four games against non-conference opponents before opening Western Athletic Conference play on Oct. 2...UH will not enjoy an early-season off-week, playing 10-straight games before receiving a bye in mid-November...UH is 24-5 in home games during the month of November, including an 13-1 WAC mark since 1999.

**WE MUST PROTECT THIS HOUSE:** The 2010 season marks Aloha Stadium's 35th anniversary as home to the Warrior football team. The stadium opened Sept. 12, 1975 and UH boasts an all-time mark of 170-111-4 for a 60.4 winning percentage in the Halawa venue. The Warriors, who posted a 4-3 record at home last season, have had two losing home records in the last 10 years.

**PRESEASON POLLS:** Hawaii was picked fifth in the preseason WAC Coaches' poll and seventh in the Media poll. The Warriors received 39 votes in the coaches' poll and 166 votes in the media poll. Defending champion Boise State was the preseason favorite in both polls. Last season, UH was picked fifth in both preseason polls and finished in a three-way tie for fifth.

**WARRIORS IN THE NFL:** A total of 12 former Warriors are currently on NFL rosters this sea-

son, which ranks second among WAC schools behind Fresno State. Among the former Warriors are Ikaika Alama-Francis (Miami, 4th), Davone Bess (Miami, 3rd), John Estes (Jacksonville, 1st), Wayne Hunter (New York Jets, 7th), Jake Ingram (New England, 2nd), Travis LaBoy (San Francisco, 6th), Vince Manuwai (Jacksonville, 8th), Mat McBriar (Dallas, 7th), Ryan Mouton (Tennessee, 2nd), Samson Satele (Oakland, 4th), Isaac Sopoaga (San Francisco, 7th), and Pisa Tinoisamoa (Chicago, 8th).

**YOUNGEST COORDINATORS:** The Warriors enter the 2010 season with a pair of first-year coordinators. Offensive coordinator Nick Rolovich (31) and defensive coordinator Dave Aranda (33) are among the youngest in the country and only Toledo's Paul Nichols (29) and Matt Campbell (30) have the youngest combined age (59) than UH's coordinators (64).

**MOUSE IS ON THE LOOSE:** Darrel "Mouse" Davis, one of the originators of the run-and-shoot offense has rejoined the coaching staff as receivers coach. From 2004-06, Davis coached the special teams and running backs during former head coach June Jones' tenure. In 2006, the Warriors averaged 559.2 yards of total offense, 46.9 points per game and finished with an 11-3 record. UH also led the nation in passing offense (441.3), total offense, scoring offense, and pass efficiency (185.95). He left UH to join Jerry Glanville's staff at Portland State in 2007 and resigned after two seasons.

**WALK-ON U.:** UH's walk-on program, monitored by associate head coach and secondary coach Rich Miano, has produced many standout players for the Warriors over the years, namely 2007 Heisman Trophy finalist and record-setting quarterback Colt Brennan. Miano was a walk-on himself who later spent 11 seasons in the NFL. Former walk-ons currently on NFL rosters include defensive end Ikaika Alama-Francis (Miami), long snapper Jake Ingram (New England), linebacker Travis LaBoy (San Francisco), fullback Reagan Maui'a (Arizona), and punter Mat McBriar (Dallas). In addition, wide receiver Ashley Lelie, a student assistant on this year's team, joined the team as a walk-on and later became UH's only first round draft pick, spending nine years in the NFL. Walk-on running back James Fenderson played three years in the league while receiver Chad Owens currently stars for the Toronto Argonauts of the CFL. Prominent walk-ons on this year's squad include quarterback Bryant Moniz, center Bronson Tiwanak, defensive linemen Liko Satele and Kamalu Umu, linebacker Corey Paredes, and safety Richard Torres.

**SENIOR CLASS:** In a survey conducted by the University of Texas El Paso, the Warriors are tied with Louisville and TCU for the most seniors in Football Bowl Subdivision with 27, followed by Iowa and UTEP (26), and Ohio State (25).

## OFFENSIVE STORYLINES

**BIG PLAYS:** After the first two games of the season, the Warriors have had 13 plays of over 25-yards, including four touchdown receptions of 56, 65, 30, and 48 by slot receiver Kealoha Pilaes, the first three against USC. Against Army, quarterback Bryant Moniz threw four passes of over 25 yards, two of which resulted in touchdowns. Moniz's 31-yard hitch-and-go pass to Royce Pollard in the closing seconds of the Army game set up the game-winning field goal. On the flip side, UH surrendered seven big plays of 30 or more yards, three of which resulted in touchdowns.

**"MO" BETTER:** Quarterback Bryant Moniz is off to a great start in 2010. The former walk-on, has completed 59.7 percent of his passes for an average of 306.0 yards per game with four touchdowns and zero interceptions. Last season after becoming the team's starter just four games into the season, Moniz finished with 2,396 yards passing and 14 touchdowns while completing 57.1 percent of his passes. He passed for 300-yards or more five times in his career, including a career-high 374 in a loss at Nevada last season. He also threw for 360 yards and one TD at Idaho and 366 yards and three touchdowns against Navy while also throwing for 343 yards and three scores against Army last week. Moniz began his collegiate career at Fresno City College in 2007 before transferring to UH and sitting out the 2008 season. He earned a scholarship during the off-season.

### GREG MCMACKIN

**3rd Season**

**Overall Record:** 14-15

Greg McMackin's tenure as head coach of the Warrior football team has been a roller-coaster ride to say the least, with its ups (Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl appearance in 2008) and downs

(four starters lost due to season-ending injuries in 2009). Last season, McMackin's Warriors nearly overcame a flurry of injuries by finishing one win shy of bowl berth. McMackin regrouped his unit and salvaged the season with a late four-game win streak before falling in the regular season finale.

After two WAC championship seasons as its defensive coordinator, McMackin was named the head coach of the Warrior football program in January 2008. McMackin became the program's 21st head coach.

McMackin served two stints as the Warriors' defensive coordinator in 1999 and 2007, the latter of which UH improved from 93rd nationally in total defense to 34th. The Warriors captured the WAC Championship both years, including last year's perfect 12-0 regular season and trip to the Allstate Sugar Bowl, McMackin's 12th bowl appearance. Under his tutelage, the UH defense ranked fifth nationally in tackles-for-loss, ninth in sacks, and 11th in interceptions, while recording five defensive touchdowns. In McMackin's first stint, the Warriors finished 9-4, won the Jeep O'ahu Bowl and became the NCAA's all-time turnaround team after a winless 0-12 season the year prior. His defense, which improved from 109th to 35th nationally, accounted for five touchdowns, 17 interceptions, 33 sacks and 17 fumble recoveries.

Prior to joining the Warrior staff during his second go-around, McMackin spent three years with the National Football League's San Francisco 49ers as associate head coach and linebackers coach under Dennis Erickson from 2003-05.

In 2000, McMackin left UH to take the defensive coordinator position at Texas Tech, where he spent three years as one of the nation's top coaches by American Football Magazine. Prior to joining UH in 1999, McMackin was the defensive coordinator for the Seattle Seahawks for four seasons under Erickson, where he coached 10 All-Pro selections. McMackin spent the 1993 and '94 seasons at Miami (Fla.), also coached by Erickson. The team won two Big East Championships and ranked first in the nation in total defense, scoring defense and pass defense.

McMackin's first head coaching stint was at Oregon Tech from 1986-89, where he also served as assistant athletics director. The team enjoyed four winning seasons and established 48 school and 18 national records. Oregon Tech advanced to the national championship playoffs and semifinals and was ranked third nationally during his tenure.

### "COACH MACK SHOW"

HawaiiNewsNow will televise "The Coach Mack Show," every Sunday during the 2010 season. The half-hour show, hosted by sports director Liz Chun, will feature comprehensive coverage of the 2010 Warrior football team. The show will air every Sunday at 10:30 p.m. and replayed every Monday at 6:30 p.m.

### "CALL THE COACH SHOW"

Warrior head coach Greg McMackin is scheduled to participate in the "Call The Coach" show on ESPN 1420 AM every Tuesday during the football season. Bobby Curran hosts the one-hour show which begins at 6:00 p.m.

**THE "1" TO WATCH:** Senior slot receiver Greg Salas crept up the UH record books with his solid play last season. Salas ranked fourth nationally in receiving yards per game (122.3) and sixth in receptions per game (8.2). Wearing uniform No. 1, the 6-foot-2, 210-pounder, led the team with 1,590 yards receiving, which is the second highest single-season total in school history. He is also just the fourth receiver in school history with 100 receptions in a single season and his 106 catches was two shy of Davone Bess's season record of 108 set in 2007. In the season-opener against USC, Salas had a team-high eight catches for 124 yards.

**MORE ON SALAS:** Slot receiver Greg Salas enters the 2010 season with national hype, having already been selected to several preseason All-America teams and to the watch list of the Fred Biletnikoff Award as the nation's best receiver. Against New Mexico State last season, Salas set a school single-game record with 16 catches for a career-high 196 yards and one touchdown. He has surpassed the 100-yard mark nine times in his career. The Chino, Calif., native currently has a streak of 29 consecutive games with a reception dating back to the first game of his sophomore season.

**THE RUN-AND-SHOOT:** The Warriors returned as one of the elite offenses in the country last season. UH finished in the top three nationally in passing offense for the 10th time in the last 11 years after averaging 337.0 ypg in 2009. UH also finished 14th in total offense (437.5), ranking in the Top 20 for the ninth time in the last 11 years. In 2006 and '07, the run-and-shoot powered the highest-scoring offense in the NCAA at 46.9 and 43.4 ppg, respectively. Over the last five years, UH's offense averaged 465.6 yards of total offense per game, which ranks fourth nationally behind Houston (503.6), Texas Tech (495.0), and Tulsa (466.6).

**O-LINE EXPERIENCE:** Despite the loss of four primary starters on the offensive line, including four-year starter and Rimington Trophy finalist John Estes, UH returns a number of players with starting experience. Left tackle Austin Hansen started eight games at right tackle last season. Right tackle Laupepa Letuli started the first three games of last season before suffering a season-ending injury and had nine previous starts over his career. Left guard Brysen Ginlack sat out all of last season but made five starts in 2008. Right guard Adrian Thomas started two games at tackle last season.

**ALL-AROUND ATHLETE:** In three seasons with the Warriors, slot receiver Kealoha Pilares has played three different positions on offense. The Damien High School product started his career at running back in 2007 and led the team in rushing with 388 yards and three touchdowns. The next year, he made four starts at running back before switching to slot receiver and led the team with seven touchdowns (5 rushing and two receiving). Last season he started the year in the slot, starting six game at "Y" receiver before switching to the outside at "X" in place of injured Rodney Bradley. Pilares finished the year with 66 receptions for 690 yards and four scores. He ranked third in the WAC and 50th nationally with a 5.1 receptions per catch average. Against UNLV last season, he had 13 receptions and in the process became one of just five UH players to reach that mark in a game. He has topped the 100-yard mark in each of the first two games this season and ranks fourth nationally with 140.0 receiving yards per game.

**HE'S BACK:** After suffering a gruesome leg injury during the team's sixth game of the season, forcing him to miss the remainder of the year, wide receiver Rodney Bradley is back in the starting rotation to start the 2010 season. In his first game in a Hawai'i uniform last year, Bradley caught the game-winning touchdown pass with 1:22 remaining in UH's 25-20 victory over Central Arkansas. A week later against Washington State, Bradley hauled in seven passes for 150 yards and two scores. The Navarro Junior College transfer finished the year with 31 receptions for 575 yards and five touchdowns and prior to his injury, ranked second in the WAC and 13th nationally in receiving yards per game and 41st in receptions per game. This season, Bradley has 10 catches for 84 yards and one touchdown.

## DEFENSIVE STORYLINES

**WELCOME HOME:** UH's defensive line is bolstered by a pair of first-year transfers, who are penciled in at starting positions. Kaniela Tuipulotu attended Arizona for two years after a standout career at Kahuku High School on O'ahu. Tuipulotu, whose cousin is L.A. Laker Luke Walton (both mothers are sisters), was considered one of the state's top recruits in 2006. He started seven games at Arizona during his sophomore season in 2008. Kamalu Umu, a transfer from Charleston Southern, walked-on to the Warriors and earned a scholarship and starting spot in fall camp. The Saint Louis School (Honolulu) graduate played one season at CSU after attending Arizona Western for two years. In addition, left end Liko Satele started six games last season for UH after transferring from Lambuth University in Jackson, Tenn.

**ALL IN THE FAMILY:** Liko Satele, a World of Life Academy (Honolulu) graduate, comes from a long line of Satele's who've played for the Warriors. His father, Alvis, played for UH from 1981-84 and brother Brashton (2006-08) was a former Warrior linebacker who is currently a rookie free agent with the New York Jets. His cousins are former Warriors Samson Satele (2003-06), Hercules Satele (2004-07), and Melila Purcell (2003-06). Samson is currently the starting center for the Oakland Raiders. His mother LeeAnn (Pestana) was a member of the Rainbow Wahine volleyball teams that won NCAA Championships in 1982 and '83 while his sister Chanteal is a junior on the current UH volleyball team.

**BRAND NEW GROUP:** After losing all three starters from last season, the Warriors started redshirt freshman George Daily-Lyles (middle), Paipai Falemalu (strong-side) and Corey Paredes (weak-side) against USC. Daily-Lyles was highly recruited out of Long Beach Poly High School (Calif.) and redshirted in 2009 while Falemalu was one of the top recruits in the state of Hawai'i out of Kahuku High School and played in 12 games as a true freshman last season. Paredes started four games as a sophomore in 2009 and led the team with four sacks. In addition, reserves Mana Lolotai has four career starts and Jake Heun has three starts.

## SPECIAL TEAMS STORYLINES

**AUSIE, AUSIE, AUSIE:** Behind punter Alex Dunnachie, the Warriors ranked second in the country in punt return defense last season, allowing only nine returns for 15 yards. Dunnachie, who averaged 39.2 yards per punt, had 13 punts inside the 20 with only five touchbacks. He also has 10 punts of over 50 yards with a long of 66 yards. In the regular season finale against Wisconsin, Dunnachie had four punts of 50-yards or more including two over 60 (66 and 61) and for his efforts, was selected as the WAC's Special Teams Player of the Week. Last year also marked Dunnachie's first year of organized football. He played Australian Rules Football in his native country.

**FOLLOWING IN HIS FOOTSTEPS:** Sophomore Luke Ingram continues the family tradition of long snapping for the Warriors. Luke's brother Jake, was a three-year starter from 2006-08 and was the first UH long snapper to be drafted in the NFL, taken in the sixth round of the 2008 Draft by the New England Patriots. Luke started all 13 games as a true freshman and did not record one bad snap all year long.

HONOLULU – Hawai'i hung tough with nationally ranked USC before the 14th-ranked Trojans ultimately pulled away, 49-36. USC quarterback Matt Barkley completed 18-of-23 for 257 yards and tied a school record with five touchdown passes to lead the Trojans. Three of those touchdowns went to senior wide receiver Ronald Johnson, who also returned a punt for a touchdown.

Despite the score, the Warriors found success against the Trojans. The Warriors accumulated 588 yards of total offense and had three different receivers crack 100 yards to stay within striking distance for a good portion of the game.

UH, however, couldn't keep up with the big-play ability of the Trojans and failed to punch into the end zone at opportune times. UH settled for three field goals in the first half, including two after getting inside the Trojan 5-yard line. UH trailed just 27-16 at halftime but the Trojans opened up an 18-point lead after Johnson's punt return in the third quarter and never looked back.

UH starting quarterback Bryant Moniz went 18-of-36 for 269 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed for 38 yards before being knocked out of the game in the third quarter.

Senior wide receiver and All-American candidate Greg Salas was impressive in his 2010 debut with eight catches for 124 yards. It was the 10th time Salas passed the 100-yard plateau in his career. Kealoha Pilaes meanwhile exploded for three long touchdowns and finished with 176 yards receiving. The senior scored on touchdown passes of 30, 56 and 65 yards. Royce Pollard went over 100 yards with seven catches for 107 yards.

Mana Silva led the UH defense with 10 tackles and a fumble recovery.

WEST POINT, N.Y. – In a roller coaster of a game, Hawai'i pulled off a dramatic 31-28 road win over Army. Scott Enos' 31-yard field goal with seven seconds remaining proved the game winner as UH moved to 1-1 on the season.

UH secured the win only after a wild turn of events. The Warriors took a 21-0 lead to start the game, surrendered four straight Army touchdowns to fall behind, but eventually snatched the victory away from the Black Knights (1-1) with the final 10 points of the game.

With the score tied, 28-28 and less than a minute remaining, the Black Knights (1-1) looked poised to take the lead as they moved the ball into UH territory. But Kamalu Umu forced an Army fumble, preventing an Army field goal attempt and giving UH the ball at their own 27-yard line.

UH had just 24 seconds to work with and moved the ball all the way to the Army 14-yard line in less than 15 seconds thanks to an Army penalty and a pair of Royce Pollard catches, including a 31-yard grab that set up the game-winning score.

That sequences of events came after an exciting first 59 minutes of action. The Warriors came out strong, scoring on three of its first four possessions and showed no ill effects in traveling the longest distance ever for a road football game.

UH out-gained Army 240-99 in the first half to take a 21-7 lead into the locker room, but things Army scored three touchdowns in the pivotal third quarter, including two off of Warrior turnovers. After recovering a UH's second fumble of the half, Army took its first lead of the game, 28-21, when Max Jenkins gave scored on a 1-yard run with 5:35 left in the third quarter. The Warriors responded on their next possession with a 65-yard drive. Alex Green scored on a 3-yard rush to make it, 28-28, and set up an exciting finish in the fourth quarter.
