WARRIOR STORYLINES

- ▶ UH is 19-16 in home openers at Aloha Stadium.
- ▶ Hawaiʻi is 57-32-5 (.633) all-time in season openers and 61-28-5 (.676) all-time in home openers.
- ▶ UH is 28-51 all-time vs. current members of the Pac-12 conference, including a 1-1 mark against Colorado.
- ▶ UH has played at least one Pac-12 opponent each year since 2005, with a 3-3 record in home games.
- ▶ Colorado has a current streak of 17 consecutive road games dating back to 2007 while Hawai'i has a current streak of six straight season-opening losses to BCS conference teams dating back to 1998.
- ▶ The Warriors return 11 starters (3 offense, 6 defense, 2 special teams) from last year's squad that went 10-4 overall and captured a share of the WAC title.
- ▶ Among the returnees is senior quarterback Bryant Moniz, a second-team all-WAC pick, who led the nation in passing (360.0 ypg), total offense (367.3 ypg), and touchdowns (39).
- ▶ On defense, UH returns three of its top four returning tacklers, including linebacker Corey Paredes, who led the Warriors with 151 tackles and ranked 14th nationally with 10.8 tackles per game.
- ▶ UH enters its 33rd and final season in the Western Athletic Conference. UH is the longest standing member of the league and will join the Mountain West Conference beginning in 2012.

THIS WEEK'S MATCH-UP

The University of Hawai'i Warrior football team opens its 2011 season by hosting one of the Pac-12's newest members, Colorado, Saturday, Sept. 3 in a nationally televised game on ESPN2. Kickoff is 4:15 p.m. at Aloha Stadium.

The teams will play for the second straight season after the Buffaloes won 31-13 in Boulder, Colo., last season. In that game, the Warriors led 10-0 at the half, before Colorado ran off 17 unanswered points and out-scored UH, 31-3 after halftime. The teams had previously met only once prior, with Hawai'i winning, 13-0 in 1925.

Under fourth-year head coach Greg McMackin, Hawai'i finished 10-4 in 2010; captured a share of the Western Athletic Conference title; and appeared in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl for the sixth time in nine years. The Warriors are the preseason favorite to win the WAC, as they prepare to leave the league at the end of the this season before moving to the Mountain West Conference in 2012. Quarterback Bryant Moniz is the consensus preseason WAC player of the year and is mentioned on the watch list of nearly every major award as the nation's top player and quarterback

Colorado finished 5-7 and 2-6 in the Big 12 last season. The Buffaloes will be led by first-year head coach Jon Embree, who inherits a team which returns 17 starters from a year ago.

SEASON/HOME OPENERS: Hawai'i is 57-32-5 (.633) all-time in season openers and 61-28-5 (.676) all-time in home openers. The 2011 season marks UH's 36th season at Aloha Stadium and UH is 19-16 (.543) in home openers at the facility. Under head coach Greg McMackin, UH is 1-2 in season-openers and 2-1 in home openers.

HAWAI'I VS. THE BCS: Since 2003, UH has eight wins versus teams from Bowl Championship Series conference schools, which is fifth most in the country among non-BCS conference teams. Hawai'i's wins during that span have come against Alabama (2003), Northwestern (2004), Michigan State (2004), Purdue (2006), Arizona State (2006), Washington (2007), and Washington State (2008 and 2009).

HAWAI'I VS. THE PAC-12: UH is 28-51 (.354) all-time against current members of the Pac-12 Conference. UH's team-by-team record is: 0-4 vs. Arizona; 2-5 vs. Arizona State; 2-2 vs. California; 1-1 vs. Colorado; 3-4 vs. Oregon; 3-4 vs. Oregon State; 0-3 vs. Stanford; 0-2 vs. UCLA; 0-7 vs. USC; 12-15 vs. Utah; 2-1 vs. Washington; and 3-2 vs. Washington State.

UH VS. COLORADO: In the teams' first meeting on Jan. 1, 1925, UH defeated Colorado 13-0 in Honolulu. The win capped a perfect 8-0 season for the Rainbows, who allowed only 12 points all season. The "Wonder Teams" of 1924 and '25, went 18-0 during those two seasons and outscored their opponents 606-29. Last season, the Buffaloes evened the series with a 31-13 victory, Sept. 18 in Boulder, Colo. UH led 10-0 at the half

before being out-scored 31-3 after intermission.

THREE-YEAR WIN TOTAL: With 23 wins in his first three seasons as head coach, Greg McMackin is tied for the second-most by a coach in his first three seasons during the school's modern era. In 2008, McMackin became just the second coach to lead his team to a bowl game in his first season.

ON THE NATIONAL STAGE: UH will be making its 54th all-time appearance on national television and owns a 16-35-2 record. The Warriors made five appearances on national TV last season, including the Colorado game which was shown on Fox College Sports.

ENCORE PERFORMANCE: Last season marked UH's fourth WAC title. Following the previous three championship seasons, Hawai'i failed to repeat as champions. In 1993, UH finished 6-6 overall and eighth in the WAC. In 2000, Hawai'i was 3-9 overall and tied for sixth in league play. Most recently in 2008, UH tied for second in the WAC standings and was 7-7 overall.

WELCOME BACK: Former UH head coach Dick Tomey has returned to Manoa to join Greg McMackin's staff as special teams coach. Tomey previously served as head coach from 1977-86 and is a member of the school's Sports Circle

BOWL BOUND: UH made its 10th appearance in a major bowl with its appearance in last year's Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. UH secured a spot into the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl after its win over Idaho on Oct. 30, which was the earliest bowl invitation in school history. The Warriors appeared in their seventh bowl in the last nine years and sixth to the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. UH owns a 5-5 all-time bowl record.

of Honor. Tomey also was head coach at the University of Arizona from 1987-2000 and San Jose State from 2005-09. He compiled a 183-145-7 all-time record in 29 seasons as a Division I head coach, including a 63-46-3 mark in 10 seasons with Hawai'i. Tomey led the Rainbow Warriors to a pair of runner-up finishes in the Western Athletic Conference and four seven-win seasons. Tomey was hired following the departure of Chris Tormey, who left for a similar position at Washington State.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE: UH's non-conference schedule consists of traditional big-names Colorado of the Big 12, Washington of the Pac-10, and Brigham Young. The Warriors open the season at Aloha Stadium against CU and closes the regular season at home against nemesis BYU. For the third straight season, Hawai'i will play consecutive non-conference road games. This year, UH will play at Washington and UNLV in back-to-back weeks. The Warriors also host UC Davis (Sept. 24) and Tulane (Nov. 26).

PRESEASON POLLS: Hawai'i was picked to defend its WAC title in the preseason WAC Coaches' and Media polls. The Warriors received 47 votes and five first place votes in the coaches' poll and 292 votes and 18 first place votes in the media poll. Last season, UH was picked fifth in the coaches poll and seventh in the media poll and finished the season tying for the WAC title with Boise State and Nevada.

OH CAPTAIN: As voted by the players, the captains for this year are quarterback Bryant Moniz, wide receiver Royce Pollard, linebacker Corey Paredes, and safety Richard Torres.

10-WIN SEASONS: UH finished the regular season with 10 wins in the process became the sixth team in school history to post a 10-win season. The first occurred in 1925 as the "Wonder Team" completed a perfect 10-0 season. In the modern era, all five UH teams that won 10 or more games, including last year's squad, played in bowl games.

WAC CHAMPS: UH clinched a share of the WAC championship for the fourth time in school history in 2010. Hawai'i, Boise State, and Nevada completed WAC play with identical 7-1 records. Hawai'i won its first title in 1992, sharing it with Fresno State and Brigham Young. In 1999, the Warriors shared the title with TCU and Fresno State. In 2007, UH completed its first undefeated conference season (8-0) with an outright title.

NATIONALLY RANKED: UH returned to the national polls last season for the first time since 2007. The Warriors were ranked as high as No. 24 in the Associated Press poll and No. 25 in the USA Today Coaches poll during the week of Dec. 5. In 2007, the Warriors were nationally

ranked the entire year and finished the season No. 19 (A.P.) and No. 17 (Coaches). UH was also ranked in the final poll in 2006 (No. 24) and 1992 (No. 20).

WAC'S BEST: A total of 10 Warriors were selected to the All-WAC first and second teams. Three Warriors were named to the first team; slot receiver Greg Salas, linebacker Corey Paredes, and safety Mana Silva. Another seven Warriors were selected to the second team; quarterback Bryant Moniz, running back Alex Green, slot receiver Kealoha Pilares, offensive linemen Adrian Thomas and Laupepa Letuli, defensive tackle Kaniela Tuipulotu, and placekicker Scott Enos. The 10 all-WAC honorees represent the most UH players selected to the all-WAC teams since 2007, when 12 Warriors were named. In 2006, a record 13 Warriors were picked to the first and second teams.

WE MUST PROTECT THIS HOUSE: The 2011 season marks Aloha Stadium's 36th anniversary as home to the Warrior football team. The stadium opened Sept. 12, 1975 and UH boasts an all-time mark of 176-112-4 for a 61.0 winning percentage in the Halawa venue. The Warriors were 6-2 at Aloha Stadium last season, its fifth straight winning mark at the facility.

DEAN OF THE WAC: The Warriors enter their 33rd and final season in the Western Athletic Conference, the longest streak of any current WAC member. UH owns a 128-119-3 all-time record in league play dating back to 1979.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE: UH's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 959 not only is the WAC's highest but it ranks among nation's best and schools in the Western United States. Below is a breakdown of the top APR scores among western schools in the Pac-12, WAC, and Mountain West Conferences:

GREG MCMACKIN 4th Season Overall Record: 23-18 WAC Record: 15-9

After short three seasons as head coach of the University of Hawai'i football program, Greg McMackin has returned

the Warriors back to national prominence. During last season's 10-4 campaign, UH was nationally ranked in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls, while leading the Warriors to a share of their fourth Western Athletic Conference title.

UH also secured a berth to the Sheraton Hawaiʻi Bowl in 2010, its second bowl appearance in three years under McMackin, while becoming just the sixth team in the school's history to post double-digit wins. With 23 victories in three seasons, McMackin is tied with Bob Wagner for the most wins by a UH coach in his first three seasons during the school's modern era.

During McMackin's illustrious coaching career, his teams have participated in 14 bowl games.

McMackin served two stints as the Warriors' defensive coordinator in 1999 and 2007, the latter of which UH improved from 93rd nationally in total defense to 34th. The Warriors captured the WAC Championship both years, including the perfect 12-0 regular season and trip to the Allstate Sugar Bowl in 2007. Under his tutelage, the UH defense ranked fifth nationally in tacklesfor-loss, ninth in sacks, and 11th in interceptions, while recording five defensive touchdowns.

In McMackin's first stint, the Warriors finished 9-4, won the Jeep Oʻahu Bowl and became the NCAA's all-time turnaround team after a winless 0-12 season the year prior. His defense, which improved from 109th to 35th nationally, accounted for five touchdowns, 17 interceptions, 33 sacks and 17 fumble recoveries.

Prior to joining the Warrior staff during his second go-around, McMackin spent three years with the National Football League's San Francisco 49ers as associate head coach and linebackers coach under Dennis Erickson from 2003-05.

Former walk-ons currently on NFL rosters include defensive end Ikaika Alama-Francis (Miami), linebacker Travis LaBoy (San Diego), fullback Reagan Maui'a (Arizona), and punter Mat McBriar (Dallas). Prominent walk-ons on this year's squad include quarterback Bryant Moniz, wide receiver Royce Pollard, linebacker Corey Paredes, and safety Richard Torres.

MIGHTY "MO": Bryant Moniz was arguably one of the top quarterbacks in the country despite not being mentioned as a semifinalist for either of the national quarterback awards nor being selected to any All-America teams. The former walk-on, led the nation in both passing (360.0) and total offense (367.3) and completed 65.30 percent of his passes with 39 touchdowns and 15 interceptions. The junior also ranks third in points responsible for (18.43) and eighth in passing efficiency (159.1). In UH's win over San Jose State, Moniz set the single-game school record with 560 yards passing on 32-of-44 attempts. In that game, eight of his passes went for 25-yards or more including all three TD passes. With 5,040 passing yards, Moniz was also just the second quarterback in school history to surpass 5,000 passing yards in a season behind Colt Brennan's 5,549 yards in 2006. Moniz, who was selected second-team all-WAC, passed for 300-plus yards in 11 games, including three 400-plus yard

BALL HOGS: While UH's offense gained national attention for its high-powered attack, the Warrior defense was quietly setting records of their own. Led by linebacker Corey Paredes,

UH led the nation in turnovers forced (38) and tied a school single-season record with five defensive touchdowns. The Warriors also ranked second nationally in interceptions (23) and ninth in fumbles recovered (15). Paredes ranked 14th nationally in tackles, averaging 10.8 per game and his 151 tackles were the second-highest total in school history. The first-team all-WAC pick had his first two interceptions of his career in UH's 45-7 win at Utah State and had two forced fumbles in the team's upset of then-No. 19 Nevada.

DEFENSIVELY SPEAKING: With nine wins in its last 10 regular season games, UH's defense came up big. Not counting the Boise State game, the defense allowed 16.1 points and 272.7 yards per game during that stretch and forced 28 turnovers while allowing only 2.4 yards per rush and 4.0 yards of total offense per play. The defense limited Utah State to 181 yards of total offense, UH's best defensive performance since 2005 until holding San Jose State to 164 yards of total offense three weeks later. UH also held Nevada's high-powered offense to 293 yards of total offense, while limiting Colin Kaepernick to only 30 yards rushing and 159 yards passing.

AUSIE, AUSIE, AUSIE: Punter Alex Dunnachie, one of two Australians on last year's team, displayed a powerful leg. His average of 43.0 yards per punt ranked 31st nationally. He had 19 punts of over 50 yards including a long of 61 at Colorado and pinned 15 punts inside the 20 yard line.

KICKING DUEL: The most sought-after starting spot of fall camp is at the place-kicking position where redshirt freshman Tyler Hadden and transfer Kenton Chun have been neck-andneck. Hadden, of Whittier, Calif., was rated as the 10th-best kicker in the country by Chris Sailer Kicking out of high school while Chun, of Honolulu, is a transfer from Southern Oregon. Whomever wins the kicking job, Hadden will still handle the team's kickoffs.

THE RUN-AND-SHOOT: The Warriors led the country in passing, averaging 394.3 yards per game and ranked in the top three nationally for the 11th time in the last 12 years. UH also finished sixth in total offense (500.6), ranking in the Top 20 for the 10th time in the last 12 years.

BOULDER, Colo. -Hawai'i fell victim to a second-half rally in a 31-13 loss to Colorado. In a tale of two halves, the Warriors (1-2) owned the first half only to see the Buffaloes (2-1) seize control of the second half. Colorado out-scored UH, 31-3 after the break, including 17 unanswered points in the pivotal third quarter.

UH took a 10-0 lead into the locker room and pitched a first half shutout on the road for the first time since 2005. But playing their second straight road game, the Warriors ran out of the gas in the second half.

Colorado out-gained UH, 452-337, including 328-100 in the decisive second half. The Buffs were led by the running back duo of Brian Lockridge (109 yards) and Rodney Stewart (106 yards, two touchdowns).

Bryant Moniz led UH with 330 yards passing and one touchdown on 27-of-41 attempts. Kealoha Pilares had six catches for 117 yards and scored his team-leading fifth touchdown, UH's only trip into the end zone on the day. Corey Paredes tallied a career-high 16 tackles to lead the defense.

It was a case of missed opportunities for UH in the first quarter. The Warriors got the ball within the Buff's 5-yard line on its first two possessions of the game but failed to put up any points after a fumble and

It was all Colorado after the break. The Buffaloes took their opening drive for a touchdown on a 14-play, 80 yard drive. The Buffs defense caused a safety on UH's first possession, then Colorado scored again on their ensuing possession to suddenly take a 17-10 lead just midway through the third quarter. A Scott Enos field goal cut the Colorado lead to 17-13 late in the third quarter, but the back breaker came five minutes into the fourth quarter when quarterback Hansen connected with Toney Clemons on a 73-yard pass to push the CU lead to 24-13.
