Colorado Head Coach Mike MacIntyre

General

"Our kids played extremely hard, fought, fought, fought. I was really pleased with every phase of our game. Offense got it going, defense played well, and we did what we've been working on. And thank goodness it kind of came to fruition; we kind of made them kick field goals. I think the turning point in the game is when we had a pick - we had a guy wide open and then [QB Sefo Liufau] got hit and they got the pick - we had a guy run him down, no one laid around we got up and got him down and then we made them kick a field goal (on the preceding series). That was a huge play in the football game and I was pleased with our effort, and our intensity. Offensively, we were moving the ball really well. Second half - it was a bunch of little things, and I always say little things are big things. Give credit to Hawai'i, they did some good things defensively, but we were getting pretty good first down plays we just kind of shot ourselves in the foot and we'll fix that and move on."

On Defense Continuing To Show Improvement

"Yeah, since the second half at UMass. You know, ASU got us in that third quarter (of last week's game) there is no doubt about it. But, if you really go back and watch it they hit us on a screen pass and another one. We have to do a better job of coaching that as coaches, and we have. They tried two of those [plays] today and we tackled them for losses. So, that's a good job of our guys (coaches). But our kids, are playing harder and tackling better, pursuing the ball better, their eyes are in the right place. There were two plays out there today that Hawai'i put in because ASU had hurt us a little bit with them. Our kids played them both just like that. We do a correction period every week, and they are just learning to play. They are tackling well and playing the ball well. We just have to keep fighting. Thank goodness [DT Justin] Solis is not hurt, that's good."

On Defense Making Adjustments

"That's exactly what happened. On two exact plays that ASU made a 30 yard run on one, and another big run. Our guys made those plays, corrected it and worked with it. A couple screens that [ASU] did that hurt us, we tackled them for losses (today)."

On Punting Game Today

"Both punters I think punted nine times and had one yard off their average. One had 413 and one had 414, I think that's correct. But [P] Darragh [O'Neill] stuck the dagger in them when he downed it on the 9-yard line. Great play by [DB] Marques Mosley and those guys getting down there. We didn't let them go score, but they had to go [91] yards with two minutes and they had to score twice to beat us and that was huge. Our team did a really good job protecting. We had some good kickoff returns, and some good kickoff coverage. So, I think we are getting better in those phases, too."

On Play Of QB Sefo Liufau

"I thought Sefo made some good plays, and he missed a couple just like I'm sure he told you the same thing. He just keeps battling, keeps battling. We'll just have to keep working with him and keep improving. In doubt, throw it to [WR Nelson] Spruce."

On Playing Four Complete Quarters

"I think we are real close, it's just the way football goes. You just have to find a way to win. Last week we had some opportunities to come back, and this week we kept battling we got up and that was kind of more of an exhausting win if that makes sense, because we had them but you're all thinking, 'they're (Hawai'i) hanging around and one screw up and it could be right here.' But our kids just kept battling and battling, and battling, and battling, and didn't play like that (with a negative mindset) at all, which was great to see. Because I was wondering if they were going to and they just kept fighting. Dog-gonnit, we did the fake punt and we didn't score and that was a shame. I thought for sure we would at least get a field goal there, but we didn't – credit to [Hawai'i] they did a good job."

On Holding Hawai'i To Four Field Goals In Red Zone

"Yeah, I think that's a big deal. That's the way college football is, to me, you have to make teams kick field goals in the red zone. If we do that on defense, if we're making teams 50 percent scoring when they get inside the 20, and half of those are field goals, then we are going to be OK. We would like to be like how we were today, I consider that 100 percent stops in today's football, I really do. And [Hawai'i K Tyler Hadden] made 4-of-4 field goals, I was hoping he would miss one. Usually a kid will miss one and he'll be 3-of-4, typically with college kickers. We don't want to let them get down there, but a couple times they're going to get down there, and we have turnovers. But, that was the first time we've done that where a team gets a turnover and gets the ball inside the five or inside the 10 and we stop them. That's the first time we've done that and that was exciting to see."

On WR Nelson Spruce

"Nelson is a great competitor, he does a phenomenal job, he's a great leader and one of our team captains. I look forward to watching him break every record there ever was at the University of Colorado over the next two years." 7

On 'Matching Wits' With Hawai'i Coach Norm Chow "I had met Norm when he was coaching with the Tennessee Titans when I went over there to visit when I was coaching with Dallas [Cowboys]. He's got a great mind, has great history. I remember when I was in my early coaching career and he was offensive coordinator at BYU, and just watching the BYU offenses and all that type of thing and I was just really impressed with all the things that he did. He's doing a good job [at Hawai'i] with the quarterbacks. His quarterback is more of a guy that has to run and move, so he has adapted to that and found a way to use the abilities the best he can with the people he has. He does a good job. They were missing their big running back today (Joey Iosefa) - that's Sefo [Liufau's] cousin, I don't know if you guys knew that - but he's a good player also for them. [Chow] does a really good job, though, he's a heck of a coach."

On The Way Nelson Spruce Runs His Routes

"Nelson does a great job – I've said it so many times, he's so strong – if a guy is leaning on him, he'll lean forward and when he comes back the guy bounces off of him and there's always room. If you watch, he always catches the ball out here where guys can't get it and then he puts it away and he's excellent at that. Everyone says he's not fast, but he runs 'bomb two', so he's got deceptive speed. The thing he is able to do on the deep ball is again, he's so strong, he's able to run and stack the guy and hold him until the last second and then just go (makes motion of reaching his hands out to catch it), and that's a talent, most guys drop those and he doesn't drop those."

On Greg Henderson vs. Nelson Spruce In Practice

"It's 50-50. They really compete well. Greg did a heck of a job today, there was one play that got called back and that was a big play, but you have to let them keep playing, and keep playing, and keep playing. We are contesting so many more balls and that's how you play good defense because if you play off him too much this world and time, they get in a rhythm and it's over. We just have to keep working at it, keep playing and keep pushing, and we'll keep improving."

On ILB Brady Daigh Filling In For Addison Gillam

"I'm glad you mentioned that, because I should have mentioned Brady. We talk all the time about our young men playing roles and you never know when your role is ready. I even brought it up in front of the whole team, I said, 'Brady could hang his head, he has a freshman All-American playing in front of him and he's a senior.' The guy in front of him is a really good player and Brady is our special teams captain, he won an award last year for special teams, and he plays on every special teams unit. He comes to practice every day and he comes to work every day and I said it was going to happen and he got his chance. I went up to him and said, 'Here you go!' And he took it and ran with it and did some really good things. I'm excited for Brady getting to do that and that was a big key in the football game for us."

On If He Saw Enough Improvement From Last Game

"W'. That's getting a 'W.' Finding a way to win. Every game is different, just find a way. Defensively, it probably gave our defensive kids some more confidence and gave our offensive guys some more confidence knowing that we could stop people. So we will just keep fighting and keep pushing. But yes, just keep moving down the road and finding a way to get it done. When you are a head coach all you care about is getting one more point than the other [team]. Coordinators, they worry about all the other stuff. We just keep fighting. Like I said, since the second half of UMass, I've seen a whole different fight, a whole different mentality, a whole different stage to handle everything that is thrown at them. Now will we win every game, I hope so, but I definitely feel like they feel like they can, for sure, for the first time that they can win every game."

"We obviously have to get better. We needed to win some more one-on-one routes outside and they took care of that. Once you can't win that, we struggled to run the ball because they loaded the box."

On How the Offense Faltered

"I wish I knew, if I knew we wouldn't be bogged down. We'll get better at it. We thought we had some things down, we missed an early throw that we thought we had on that first drive, but we overthrew it. We knew the coverage's that they were doing, but we just have to get better."

On QB Jeremy Higgins Providing a Spark

"He looked good, yeah."

On the Hawaii Defense

"We played well. We got on them at halftime, but we need to put more pressure on their quarterback. If you give any quarterback time he'll get you."

On the Play of Nelson Spruce

"He's a good player. I tried to recruit him when I was coaching elsewhere"

On the Hawaii Fan Support

"We have tremendous fans, but they want to see a winner. It's difficult, but we have good fans and we need to win some ball games to make them feel better about us."

On How the Altitude Affected the Game

"There are no excuses."

On Quarterback Situation

"We'll find out about Jeremy [Higgins] and what his hand situation is. We'll have to go with what we have, we have another backup in Taylor [Graham]. So we'll make that decision, we have a good idea, we'll just look at the tapes."

On Whether Higgins Hand was Broken

"You said it, I didn't."

On Taking a Look at Beau Reilly

"We haven't thought about that yet. We're trying to get to the next level that we need to get to. See what Ikaika [Woolsey] likes, see about Jeremy's [Wiggins] hand and see what we can get from Taylor [Graham]."

On Colorado's No-Huddle Offense

"We expected it, we knew they would go no-huddle. Just like they knew that we would. That's what we always try to do and we just have to get it done."

On the Play of Ikaika Woolsey

"He didn't score many points when we had him in there, that's why we made the change. Jeremy [Higgins] gives you a good spike once in a while, but he bogged down a little bit as well."

On the Play of Steven Lakalaka

"He has a shoulder problem, but he hung with it and performed well today."

ON HAWAI'I PLAYING AT ALTITUDE – "Coming from an eight hour flight and coming from sea level and going up 5,000 feet, it takes a toll on the body. It affected me somewhat when I first came here so I definitely think it affected them."

ON HIS AND NELSON SPRUCE'S RELATIONSHIP - "We have a good bond. He's a safety blanket and he's a really big time receiver so you need to get him the ball and you don't want to take credit away from anyone else but Spruce is a special player. The progressions are whatever the defense gives me. Spruce just happens to be in those spots and that's not by design or 'hey we need to get Spruce the ball every time.' That's just what happens. After going through 1, 2, 3, sometimes it's the fourth route, sometimes it's the first route, it depends on the play. But it's not 'get Spruce the play.' We have amazing receivers in Shay Fields and D.D Goodson and all of those guys but, congrats to Spruce for getting that record. I think he does a really good job of getting off of whoever's guarding him. We've played four different games now and whatever DB they tried to put on him, he's gotten off of their coverage and that's just a testament to his hard work during the off season."

ON NELSON SPRUCE'S FIRST TOUCHDOWN - "That's just him, trying to get free and trying to get open and that's just him. I just have to get the ball to the playmakers."

ON HIS PHYSICAL HEALTH - "Sometimes, it's a little stinger, hurts a little bit afterward, but it's nothing. We'll be ready to play Cal next week and that's it."

ON HIS PERFORMANCE TODAY - "I'd say it was an up and down game on the two picks, you get (pass interference) on the first one and on the second one, you get hit. I had Nelson Spruce open 20 yards down the field but it's just a matter of being consistent. Like I said, it's little things and I wouldn't say it was the best performance but by no means was my performance today terrible."

ON HAWAII'S INABILITY TO SCORE A TOUCHDOWN - "That's a testament to our defense and all they did and all of the preparation they did this week. That game could have easily been 28-21 but the defense rose to the occasion and helped us out a lot."

ON HAWAI'I'S DEFENSIVE PERFORMANCE - "They didn't do anything crazy. You know, we were ready for everything that we did. We just didn't execute. But, you can't put that on a single person. That's just the offense as a whole."

ON HIS STRUGGLES THROUGHOUT THE GAME -"Just the little things. A block here, a pass there. You can't put it on one thing. It's just a matter of being consistent during the entire game. I have to give a shout out to the defense for holding them."

ON THE INTERCEPTION THAT HE THREW - "I thought we had a pass interference on Shay Fields so I thought we had a free play. I'm not going to just throw the ball up there if there's no foul. I thought we had a PI but that's it, that's the end of that. We're moving on."

ON HAWAI'I'S QUARTERBACK CHANGES - "It really didn't make any difference. They let us know. Some of them liked to run more and the other ones liked to throw. We were just seeing who was out there and whoever came out there, we're going to play our hardest against them"

ON BRADY DAIGH - "Brady is a great player too. It would be nice to have all of the linebackers on the field but he stepped up. He does that in practice too and he's a great, great, player. I'm proud of him."

But, at the last second, I was able to run under it, go up for it, and run for the end zone."

ON HIS PERFORMANCE SO FAR THIS SEASON - "It's been nice on an individual level to execute at this level. I put in a lot of work in the offseason and all of the production that I've been able to have with the rest of our receivers is a product of our whole offense working well. ON LEADING THE COUNTRY IN TOUCHDOWNS - "Someone told me that. I guess it is, you know weird, shocking to hear. I don't pay attention to it when I'm on the field."

ON THE SLOW SECOND HALF - "Something we talk about a lot, either we've been struggling from the start which wasn't the case today. We got off to a good start but weren't able to carry it for all four quarters. So, if we want to win some of these Pac-12 games, we're going to have to execute at a high level for all four quarters. I think as an offense, our defense played lights out in the second half, but our offense had such a good first half that we wanted to carry it in for all four quarters but we couldn't. ON HIS ABILITY TO CONSISTENTLY BE OPEN - "I fight to get routes, that's something I pride myself on; sharp routes, getting separation from the DB and even if there is tight separation, I feel confident that I can make the tough catch. That's kind of an advantage I have."

ON THE PHYSICALITY HAWAI'I'S D-LINE - "[Hawai'i's Ne'Quan Phillips] was playing pretty physical at the line and he's more of a bigger guy that they tried to press at the line. [Dee Maggitt] is more of a quick guy. He was off floating around back there. They were good DB's. I think they were the best we faced this year."

QUICKLY Colorado evened the all-time series at **2-2** (both wins in Boulder, by a combined score 52-25) ... Colorado won the coin toss and then elected to receive for the fourth straight game in 2014 ... The Buffs are now **5-1** in non-league games over the last two years, their best two-year mark since going 5-1 over the 2004-05 seasons ... Hawai'i lost its 14th straight road game... CU did not allow a touchdown for the first time in **51** games (the 2010 opener, a 24-3 win over CSU in Denver on Sept. 4) ... George Frazier started his first career game (at **FB**, and he also appeared again for several plays at **DE**) ... The **12** points by Hawai'i were the fewest scored by an FBS team against CU since that same game ... The **286** yards by Hawai'i were the fewest by an FBS team against CU since the 2011 finale (Utah in Salt Lake, 274 yards); the **3.7** yards per play is the lowest by an FBS team against the Buffs since Nov. 13, 2010 (lowa State, **3.4**, 68 plays for 229 yards) ... Colorado has allowed just **490** yards in the last seven quarters ...

Hawaii gained two yards or less on **24** of **33** first down plays (CU did so on **18** of **32**) ... The Rainbow Warriors ran **11** plays in the red zone for a net **9** yards, and had **33** plays in plus territory for **91** (and 57 of those came on four plays) ... Over the last two games, the opponent has run 19 red zone plays for 37 yards ... The Buffs had a season-high

four QB sacks and matched their high in pass deflections with **nine** (also at UMass) ...

WR NELSON SPRUCE (13-172, 1 TD) He set several school records today, including snapping the single-game reception record previously set nine times (by six different players). He now has at least one receiving touchdown in six straight games, dating back to 2013, setting a school record (old mark as 5 set by Rae Carruth during the 1996 season); he did it with the longest reception of his career (71 yards, one more than one he scored on at UMass). He also set school marks for the most consecutive games with seven receptions (four) and six catches (five).

Spruce has 37 catches for 518 yards and 7 TDs in 2014; he now has **136** career catches, moving from ninth to a tie for fifth with Javon Green (1997-2000); he passed Charles E. Johnson (127), Derek McCoy (134) and Rae Carruth (135). With **1,614** receiving yards, he moved past Daniel Graham (1,543) into ninth; the first eight all have over 2,000.

WR SHAY FIELDS (6-26 RECEIVING, 2-14-1 TD RUSHING) He has caught at least six passes in his first four career games (that tied the old mark for the most consecutive games with six or more receptions that Spruce broke in this game). He also scored a touchdown on his first career rushing attempt (13 yards).

P OB SEFO LIUFAU (45-29-2, 287, 2 TD) He keeps zooming up the charts: passing yards (2,903, 12th), total offense (2,997, 19th) and TD passes (22, 10th). He now has thrown 2 or more TD passes for seven consecutive games (adding to his own CU record and two shy of the mark of nine straight games with at least one, held by Koy Detmer and Cody Hawkins).

Liufau-to-Spruce: they have connected for 7 touchdown plays this season (record: 8, on two occasions), and for 10 in their careers (record: 15, Cody Hawkins-to-Scotty McKnight).

INDIVIDUAL LINER NOTES

- ▶ CB Greg Henderson (7 TT, 4 PBU) How about earning four stats on one play: in the first quarter, he had a sack, a forced fumble, a recovery and a third down stop all on the same play. He moved into a tie for ninth at CU in all-time pass deflections with 28 (up from 13th and tying Dalton Simmons, 1992-96).
- ▶ PK Will Oliver (3-3 PAT) He has now made 73 consecutive extra points (adding to his school record), and moved into fourth place on CU's all-time scoring list with 214 career points (passing Bobby Anderson, who had 212, 1967-69).
- ▶ P Darragh O'Neill (9-46.2, 4 In20) He now has 23 punts on the year, with 12 landing inside-the-20; seven of those have been inside-the-15 (three today). He also had his second career rush, galloping 19 yards on a fourth-quarter fake to earn CU a first down.
- **COLORADO INJURIES** ILB Addison Gillam (concussion), day-to-day for California (which would be his first game as a Buff in Northern California where he grew up).

Post-Game Notes Hawai'l at Colorado Sept. 20, 2014

- UH has dropped 18 straight nationally televised games dating back to 2011 and are 18-57-2 in 77 all-time appearances.
- UH dropped to 29-58 all-time vs. current members of the Pac-12 conference. UH has dropped its last seven games vs. the Pac-12. It's last win game at home versus Colorado (34-17) in the 2011 season opener.
- UH has lost 14 straight road games dating back to 2011. It's last road win game at Idaho (16-14) on Oct. 29, 2011
- UH has lost eight straight non-conference road games with its last win at Army (31-28) on Sept. 11, 2010.
- UH dropped 4-6 all-time against Pac-12 teams on the road. This marked the fourth straight year—and sixth in the last seven years—UH has played a road game against a Pac-12 opponent.
- UH is now just 3-15 in non-conference road games since 2002 with its only wins at UNLV (2007), Washington State (2009) and Army (2010).
- UH dropped to 1-11 record against the Power 5 conference teams since 1998 (inception of BCS) with its only win at Washington State in 2009 in a game played in Seattle.
- The UH defense has allowed just seven combined points in the second half against its three Pac-12 opponents this year, including shutouts of Washington and Colorado.
- Tyler Hadden improved to 10-of-11 on field goals this year after connecting on 35-, 25-, 41-yards and 24 yards. The 41-yarder was a season long.
- Hadden's four field goals was a career high and one shy of the UH single-game record.
- Steven Lakalaka rushed for better than 100 yards for the second straight game and third time in his career with 123 yards on 19 carries.
- Lakalaka tied his career-long with a 30-yard rush in the 1st quarter.
- Ne'Quan Phillips recorded his first interception of the season and fifth of his career with a pick Sefo Liufau on the game's first play from scrimmage.
- TJ Taimatuia intercepted his second pass of the year and returned it 34 yards in the third quarter to set up a 24-yard Hadden field goal.
- UH's 155 yards passing was its lowest output since a gaining 125 yards in a loss at Air Force in 2012.

- Senior Kody Afusia returned to the field for the first time since suffering an injured hand in the season opener vs. Washington (Aug. 30). Afusia started at left guard.
- Juniors Lance Williams and Julian Gener each made their first start of the season and second of their career at outside and inside linebacker, respectively. Gener tied his career high with 11 tackles. Senior Michael Martin made his first career start at safety.
