# **GAME STORYLINES**

- ▶ The game will feature two starting quarterbacks of Polynesian decent UH's Ikaika Woolsey (Hawaiian) and CU's Sefo Liufau (Samoan).
- ▶ UH offensive line coach Chris Naeole was an All-American at Colorado before a 11-year NFL career with the New Orleans Saints and Jacksonville Jaguars.
- ▶ UH is 4-5 all-time versus Pac-12 teams on the road. This year marks the fourth straight year and six of the last seven seasons UH has played a road game against a Pac-12 opponent.
- ▶ UH has winning records against only two Pac-12 teams Colorado (2-1) and Washington State (3-2).
- ▶ UH holds a 1-10 road record against Power 5 conference teams since 1998.
- ▶ In the teams' lone meeting in Boulder in 2010, CU overcame a 10-0 halftime deficit and out-scored UH 31-3 in the second half en route to a 31-13 victory. The teams last met in 2011, with UH prevailing 34-17 in Honolulu.
- ▶ Since 2002 when UH began scheduling non-conference road games on a regular basis, the Rainbow Warriors own a 3-14 record with its only wins at UNLV (2007), Washington State (2009), and Army (2010).

#### **NORTHERN IOWA POST-GAME NOTES:**

- ▶ UH has won its last nine games and 12 of its last 13 versus Football Championship Subdivision teams.
- ▶ UH surrendered fourth-quarter points for the first time this year when it gave up two touchdowns in the final period.
- ▶ Ikaika Woolsey tossed his first career touchdown when he connected with Harold Moleni on a 15-yard strike in the second quarter.
- ▶ Steven Lakalaka, who earned his first start of the season, eclipsed 100 yards for the second time in his career when he rushed for a career-high 124 yards on 32 carries.
- ▶ Lakalaka burst for a 30-yard touchdown in the third quarter was the longest run of his career.
- ▶ Tyler Hadden improved to 6-of-7 on field goals this year after connecting on kicks of 36 and 37 yards. All six of his makes have been within 40 yards.
- ▶ Senior defensive end Beau Yap scored his first career touchdown when he recovered n UNI fumble in the end zone in the first quarter. It was UH's first defensive touchdown since a Julian Gener interception return at Oregon State in 2013 and the first fumble recovery for a touchdown since Jerrol Garcia Williams scored at Colorado State in 2012.

**WEEKLY HONORS FOR HARDING**: Multipurpose star Scott Harding was selected as the Mountain West's Special Teams Player of the Week and to the Paul Hornung Award's Weekly Honor Roll following his performance against Northern Iowa. Among his highlights during the game included...

- ▶ Averaged 38.7 yards on a career-high 11 punts. Seven of his punts landed inside the UNI 20-yard line, including two inside the 10
- ▶ A fourth-quarter punt deflected off a UNI returner and was recovered by UH, setting up a field goal which put Hawai'i ahead 27-17 with 5:53 remaining in the game.
- ▶ Averaged 10.9 yards on a career-best seven punt returns. Five of his seven returns went for 10-plus yards.
- ▶ Recovered UNI's on-side kick attempt late in the fourth quarter after the Panthers closed

to within 27-24 late in the fourth quarter.

- ▶ His seven punt returns tied a UH and MW single-game record, while his 11 punts tied for the fourth-most in a game in league history.
- ▶ His 52-yard reception from quarterback Ikaika Woolsey was UH's longest play from scrimmage so far this season. It was also a career-long catch for Harding.
- ▶ A third quarter punt sailed into the end zone for a touchback, ending Harding's streak of 80 straight punts without a touchback dating back to the 2012 season. He did not have a touchback in 56 punts in 2013.

**ON NATIONAL TV**: UH has made 76 all-time appearances on national television and owns a 18-56-2 record. UH has lost its last 17 games on national television, including this season's games against Washington and Oregon State. UH's last win on national television was against Colorado on ESPN2 to open the 2011 season.

**HAWAI'I VS. THE PAC-12**: UH is 29-57 (.337) all-time against current members of the Pac-12. This season, three Pac-12 opponents are on UH's regular season schedule, the most in a single-season in school history. The last time UH played three Pac-12 teams in the same season was in 1999, which included regular season games against USC and Washington State and a Jeep Oahu Bowl appearance vs. Oregon State. UH's team-by-team record vs. Pac-12 teams is: 0-4 vs. Arizona; 2-5 vs. Arizona State; 2-2 vs. California; 2-1 vs. Colorado; 3-4 vs. Oregon; 3-7 vs. Oregon State; 0-3 vs. Stanford; 0-2 vs. UCLA; 0-9 vs. USC; 12-15 vs. Utah; 2-3 vs. Washington; and 3-2 vs. Washington State.

**ON THE ROAD VS. THE POWER 5**: UH holds a 1-10 road record against Power 5 conference teams since 1998 (first year of the BCS) with its only win against Washington State in 2009 in a game played in Seattle, Wash.

NON-CONFERENCE ROAD GAMES: Since 2002 when UH began scheduling non-conference road games on a regular basis, the Rainbow Warriors own a 3-14 record. UH has played a non-conference road game in 11 of the past 12 seasons and will play two non-conference road games this season (Colorado and Rice). Hawai'i's three road wins were at UNLV (2007), Washington State (2009), and Army (2010).

#### **HAWAI'I-CU SERIES HISTORY:**

- ▶ The Warriors and Buffaloes have met three times with UH holding a 2-1 advantage.
- ▶ The teams played a home-and-home series in 2010 & '11.
- ▶ In the teams' lone meeting in Boulder in 2010, CU overcame a 10-0 halftime deficit and out-scored UH 31-3 in the second half en route to a 31-13 victory.
- ▶ In 2011 at Aloha Stadium, UH led 17-0 at the half and hung on for a 34-17 victory.
- ▶ The series began on New Year's Day 1925 in Honolulu, a 13-0 UH victory. The win capped a perfect 8-0 season for the Rainbows. The "Wonder Teams" of 1924 and '25, went 18-0 during those two seasons and out-scored their opponents 606-29.

HOMECOMING FOR NAEOLE: Second-year UH offensive line coach Chris Naeole is a Colorado alum (1997). He was a consensus All-American as a senior in 1996 and was a three-year starter for the Buffs, allowing only one sack over his career. He was a two-time first-team all-Big 12 pick and played on four bowl teams, including as a starter on the Fiesta and Cotton bowl-winning teams.

**TOO CLOSE FOR COMFORT**: All three games this season have been decided by one score, including losses to Washington (1) and Oregon State (8). Last season, five of UH's 11 defeats were decided by a touchdown or less, including two in overtime (San Diego State and Wyoming). Over the last two years, seven of the team's 13 losses were decided by eight points or less with an average margin of defeat of 4.7 points during those games.

**THIRD QUARTER POSSESSIONS**: Last season, the Rainbow Warriors scored only 49 points in the third quarter while being outscored 132-49. Through three games this season UH has scored only 10 points but have managed to hold its opposition to only seven points.

In 2013, UH was held scoreless in the third quarter seven times in 12 games. Overall, the Rainbow Warriors produced only nine scoring drives in 41 possessions (21.9%).

This season, the team has scored on three of 13 possessions that began in the third quarter with two touchdowns (1 scored on first play of the 4th quarter) and one field

goal. Nine possessions ended in punts and UH turned the ball over once (interception).

**SECOND HALF SHUTDOWN**: UH's defense has played big in the second half this season, holding its opponents to 21 total points and an average of 137 yards of total offense per game. Overall, UH has out-scored its opponents 39-21 after halftime, compared to a 58-34 deficit in the first half. In its 38-30 loss to Oregon State, UH out-scored the Beavers 23-0 in the fourth quarter, nearly making up a 31-point deficit.

**ATTACK OF THE CLUNES**: New defensive coordinator Kevin Clune's attacking 3-4 defense has brought back memories of past Hawai'i teams who were known for their aggressive, hard-hitting style of play.

In the season-opener, UH held Washington to 17 points and 336 yards of total offense, its fewest totals allowed since a win over South Alabama in the 2012 finale (7 points, 166 yards allowed). The defense forced UW to punt eight consecutive times in the second half, including five 3-and-outs.

After allowing Oregon State to score 31 points and generate 348 yards of total offense in the first half, the UH defense shut down the Beavers in the second half, allowing only 116

yards and one opening-drive touchdown. The remainder of the half, UH forced five punts, including three 3-and-outs.

Clune joined the UH staff in January, after spending the past five seasons as linebackers coach at Utah State. At USU, Clune helped the Aggie defense rank among the nation's best, including seventh in scoring defense in 2012 (15.4 ppg) and 2013 (17.1). USU also ranked 15th in total defense in 2012 (322.1 ypg) and 12th in 2013 (330.9). The Aggies were No. 1 in the Mountain West in eight defensive categories last season while three of his linebackers earned all-conference honors.

**GROUND GAME**: UH's rushing average of 155.0 yards per game is the highest since 1995, when that squad finished the season with a 224.0 per game average. Important to note is that from 1999-2011, UH ran the pass-oriented run-and-shoot offense and averaged more than 300 passing yards per game in 12 of 13 seasons.

UH rushed for a season-high 217 yards on 54 carries in its season-opener against Washington. The 54 carries was its most since 1998, when the team ran the ball 60 times against San Jose State (Nov. 7, 1998).

**HEAVY LOAD**: UH has relied heavily on the run game this season and backs Joey losefa and Steven Lakalaka have benefited with most of the carries. losefa rushed 30 times for 143 yards (4.8 avg.) in UH's season-opening loss to Washington. Dating back to 2013, he carried the ball 30 times or more

three times in six games, including a UH single-game record 37 times against San Diego State and 35 times vs. Navy in his return to the lineup last season after missing the majority of the first eight games.

With losefa out of the lineup due to an ankle injury which he suffered against Oregon State, Lakalaka took the bulk of the carries against Northern lowa, rushing 32 times for a career-high 124 yards (3.9 avg.).

**QB SHUFFLE**: Quarterback Ikaika Woolsey has started the first three games of the season but in his last outing against Northern lowa, the sophomore was replaced in the line-up by senior Jeremy Higgins, who directed UH to a pair of second half scoring drives.

Through three games, Woolsey has passed for 631 yards on 57-of-122 attempts with one touchdown and one interception. His 15-yard touchdown throw to tight end Harold Moleni in the second quarter against UNI, was the first of his career.

Higgins has one career start against Air Force in 2012. He finished the UNI game completing 3-of-6 attempts for 37 yards.

BIG PIECES TO FILL: The receiving corps have performed well this season considering two players are starting for the first time at the FBS level. Junior wideout Quinton Pedroza has led the team in each of the past three games with nine catches for 90 yards against Washington; six receptions for 62 yards against Oregon State; and five catches for 35 yards against Northern Iowa. Sophomore

Marcus Kemp posted career-highs against the Beavers with five catches for 102 yards, including a 41-yard catch-and-run. He has a team-leading 202 receiving yards.

Just before the start of fall camp, the receiving unit saw the departures of three potential starters, returning starter Keith Kirkwood, who decided to transfer, and part-time starter Vasquez Haynes, who underwent season-ending surgery. In addition, true freshman Devan Stubblefield, a heralded recruit out of Saint Louis School in Honolulu, suffered a season-ending injury on the first day of camp.

**MAN OF ALL TRADES**: For the second consecutive year, the Paul Hornung Award has listed Harding on its preseason watch list. The Hornung Award is given to the nation's most versatile player. The Brisbane, Australia native, is averaging 40.7 yards per punt and 10.6 yards per punt return, and has nine receptions for 130 yards.

Last season, Harding was second on the team with 56 receptions for 631 yards and one touchdown. He ranked fifth in the MW and 35th nationally with an 8.3 punt-return average and averaged 40.2 yards per punt (56 punts), eighth-best in the MW.

His unique punting style has created four turnovers in which the ball hit a defender, including once against Northern Iowa.

**BACK TO FORM**: Last season, linebacker Julian Gener was on his way to a breakout rookie season totaling 11 tackles, one sack, one forced fumble, and returned an intercep-

tion for a touchdown against Oregon State before a serious knee injury the following week at Nevada derailed his season.

Through three games this season, Gener has made an impact on the defense. In the season-opener against Washington, the West Covina, Calif., native recorded eight tackles (7 solo), including one for loss, and two quarterback hurries. Last week against Northern lowa, he totaled nine tackles (8 solo), including one for loss and one pass breakup.

**BOOTIN' IT:** Fourth-year placekicker Tyler Hadden is off to his best season of his career. The Whittier, Calif., has converted 6-of-7 field goals (all under 40 yards), including a careerbest three field goals in the season-opener versus Washington. Over his career, Hadden has converted 31-of-51 field goals and 90-of-95 PATs. Hadden also handles the team's kickoffs and has five touchbacks this season.

**CELEBRATING 40 YEARS**: The 2014 season marks Aloha Stadium's 40th season as home to the Rainbow Warrior football team. The stadium opened Sept. 12, 1975 and UH boasts an all-time mark of 185-125-4 for a 59.6 winning percentage in the Halawa venue.

**CAPTAINS PICKED FOR 2014**: The captains for the 2014 season, as voted by their teammates, are OL Kody Afusia, OL Ben Clarke, WR/P Scott Harding, RB Joey Iosefa, DB Ne'Quan Phillips, DL Moses Samia, LB Lance Williams, and DL Beau Yap.

#### **NORM CHOW**

Head Coach



With nearly 40 years of experience as an assistant coach at both the collegiate and professional ranks, Norm Chow has spent the past two seasons as head coach of the Hawai'i Rainbow Warriors.

Statistics aside. Chow has spent his two seasons instilling discipline and a new offense to a program which at one time appeared in eight bowls during a

12-year span. UH switched from the Run-and-Shoot offense to a more conventional Pro-Set offense, which Chow has mastered and become known as one of the top offensive minds in the country.

Chow, a Punahou School alum and Palolo Valley native, was named the program's 22nd head coach, Dec. 22, 2011, succeeding Greg McMackin who retired after four seasons as head coach of the Warriors. Chow also became the first Asian-American head coach of a major college football program. His long coaching resume includes more than 40 years of experience collegiately and in the National Football League. Among his 36 years as a collegiate coach, Chow spent 27 years at BYU, one year at North Carolina State, four years at USC, three years at UCLA and one year at his alma mater, Utah. Chow also spent three years as offensive coordinator for the NFL's Tennessee Titans.

Prior to arrival in Mānoa, Chow was the offensive coordinator at Utah, where he led the Utes to a runner-up finish in the Pac-12 South Division in 2011 and a 30-27 victory over Georgia Tech in the Sun Bowl.

Known as an offensive mastermind, success has followed Chow where ever he's been. A three-time national Assistant Coach of the Year, Chow has served as offensive coordinator for three national championship teams (Brigham Young-1984 and USC-2003 and '04) and has tutored three Heisman Trophy winners (Ty Detmer-BYU, Carson Palmer-USC and Matt Leinart-USC) and six NFL first-round draft picks (Palmer, Leinart, Philip Rivers-N.C. State, Steve Young-BYU, Jim McMahon-BYU and Marc Wilson-BYU).

We will not disseminate any information about a student-athletes' injury without written consent. The only information given to the media will be if a student-athlete is "probable," "questionable," or "doubtful" to play. However, the student-athlete may release information about his/her injury.

#### **WE ARE THE "RAINBOW WARRIORS"**

When referring to the UH football team, please use the nickname "Rainbow Warriors." In an effort to standardize its nicknames, on July 1, 2013, the University of Hawai'i officially changed its men's team nickname to "Rainbow Warriors." The school's women's teams are still referred to as "Rainbow Wahine." The word "Wahine" (pronounced wah-HEE-nay) means woman in the Hawaiian language. The rainbow has been part of UH's nickname since 1923.

#### WHAT'S AN 'OKINA?

What's that punctuation mark in the word Hawai'i? In the Hawaiian language, it's called an 'okina, which translates literally means separator. Phonetically it is referred to as a glottal stop, similar to the sound that would be made in the English oh-oh. The 'okina is actually a letter in the Hawaiian language.

Contraband items include weapons, noise makers, illegal drugs, cans and bottles, umbrellas, coolers, fireworks, balloons, sticks, outside food & beverage, confetti, lasers, inflatable objects, poles, skateboards, rollerblades, bicycles, pets (except service animals) and any item which may pose a health or safety issue. Smoking is prohibited except within a posted designated smoking area. (this includes vapor and electronic cigarettes)

HONOLULU – Hawai'i fought valiantly against No. 25 Washington but came up short, 17-16, Saturday in a nationally-televised game at Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium.

The Rainbow Warriors stymied the UW offense for most the game, even shutting out the Huskies in the second half. But UH could not punch in the goahead score, settling for a pair of second half field goals.

UH out-gained Washington 424-to-336 in total offense and did not turn the ball over. Quarterback Ikaika Woolsey finished 23-of-42 for 207 yards while running back Joey losefa rushed for 143 yards on 30 carries.

UW quarterback Jeff Lindquist passed for 162 yards on 10-of-26 passing and hooked up with Jason Ross – for the second of his two touchdowns – on a 91-yard touchdown in the second quarter, giving the Huskies a 14-10 lead.

Hawai'i's Taz Stevenson, a UW transfer, finished with a team-high 10 tack-les against his former teammates.

UH took the opening game kickoff and marched downfield capped by a 1-yard losefa touchdown. Woolsey completed all four of his attempts on the drive, including two key third-down conversions.

After UH forced the Huskies to punt, the Warriors then mounted an 18-play drive culminating in a 28-yard Tyler Hadden field goal for a 10-0 lead.

UW closed to 10-7 after Ross' first touchdown but Woolsey directed another long UH drive that ended in a failed fourth-down attempt. After the Huskies took over on downs – on the very next play –Lindquist found Ross on the 91-yard bomb.

UH's next possession stalled and the Huskies took advantage with a 36-yard Cameron Van Winkle field for a 17-10 lead. The 'Bows took over and drove to the UW 22-yard line but Hadden's 40-yard field goal hit the left upright just before the end of the first half.

In the second half, UH's defense forced the Huskies to punt eight times and held the Huskies to only 119 yards of total offense. However the Warriors could not hold UW on its final possession and the Huskies ran out the clock.

HONOLULU – Hawai'i fell behind by three touchdowns early on, then saw a furious fourth quarter rally fall just short in a 38-30 loss to Oregon State in a non-conference game at Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium.

The Rainbow Warriors (0-2) struggled on both sides of the ball until a late fourth quarter rally, which saw UH out-score OSU 23-0. UH generated only 111 yards of total offense at the half in falling behind 31-7 and saw the deficit grow to 38-7 at the end of the third quarter.

UH's special teams unit helped trigger the comeback. After losefa's second touchdown closed the deficit to 38-14, Lance Williams blocked an OSU punt setting up losefa's third score of the game. On the ensuing kickoff, Dee Maggitt forced a fumble and a Tyler Hadden field goal trimmed the OSU lead to 38-23.

A late Ikaika Woolsey keeper brought UH back to within 38-30 with 1:35 remaining but the Warriors could not recover the onside kick.

Woolsey finished 20-of-50 for 236 yards while losefa rushed for 54 yards on 19 carries and set a new career-high with three scores. Sophomore wide receiver Marcus Kemp posted career-highs with five catches for 102 yards.

OSU quarterback Sean Mannion threw for 300 yards and three touchdowns to the lead the Beaver offense, which amassed 464 yards of total offense, but only 116 in the second half. His favorite target was Victor Bolden, who hauled in 11 catches for 119 yards and one score. Running back Terron Ward rushed for 124 yards on 15 carries with two touchdowns.

HONOLULU – After two agonizing losses to Pac-12 teams to open the season, Hawai'i notched its first win of 2014 with a 27-24 victory over Northern Iowa.

The Rainbow Warriors' (1-2) were led offensively by running back Steven Lakalaka, who rushed for a career-high 124 yards on 32 carries and one touch-down. The sophomore from Honolulu got the start in place of injured starter Joey Iosefa. Quarterback Ikaika Woolsey passed for 188 yards and one touch-down before being replaced by back-up Jeremy Higgins midway through the third quarter. Higgins finished 3-of-6 for 37 yards and directed two second half scoring drives.

Multi-purpose player Scott Harding made his presence felt on all three phases. His rugby-style punting pinned the Panthers inside their own 20 seven times and averaged 10.9 yards on seven punt returns. He also caught a careerlong 52-yard reception in the second quarter.

Defensively, the Warriors held UNI to 320 yards of total offense, including only 55 yards on the ground. The defense also scored the game's first points as lineman Beau Yap recovered an errant snap in the end zone to give UH an early 7-0 lead.

The teams combined to punt 24 times – 13 by UNI and 11 by UH. UH held a 17-10 lead at the half and took a tw-touchdown cushion into the fourth quarter after Lakalaka busted up the gut for a 30-yard touchdown run in the third quarter.

With UH leading 24-17, Harding's 11 punt of the game hit UNI returner Darrien Miller as he attempted to scoop up the bouncing ball and was recovered by UH's Ne'Quan Phillips. Four plays later Hadden booted a 37-yard field goal to make it 27-17 with 3:19 to play.

The Panthers again closed to within one touchdown after Kollmorgen's second touchdown but the Warriors recovered the onside kick attempt and ran out the clock
