GAME STORYLINES

- ▶ The season opener for both programs, setting off a grueling 13 consecutive weeks of games with no BYE weeks.
- ▶ USC Transfer quarterback Max Wittek will make his much-anticipated debut for the Rainbow Warriors.
- ▶ First-year coordinators Don Bailey (offense) and Tom Mason (defense) will debut their scheme changes for the first time in live game action.
- ▶ UH assistant head coach and offensive line coach Chris Naeole was three-year starter and All-American at Colorado before a 11-year NFL career with the New Orleans Saints and Jacksonville Jaguars.
- ▶ UH is 29-58 (.333) all-time against current members of the Pac-12, including a 2-2 mark against Colorado. The Rainbow Warriors faced Pac-12 teams in 3-of-5 non-conference games in 2014, dropping all three by a combined score of only 18 points, including the one-point loss in the opener vs. #25 Washington at Aloha Stadium.
- ▶ UH won the teams' last meeting in Aloha Stadium (2011) hanging on for a 34-17 victory after going ahead 17-0 at the half.
- ▶ UH has played at least one Pac-12 opponent each year since 2005 with a 5-11 record during that span.

INTERVIEW POLICY

Contact the UH Sports Media Relations Office to arrange player or coach interviews at least 24 hours in advance. All players and coaches will be available for interviews after practice from Monday through Thursday. Every effort will be made to accommodate interview requests but players will not be asked to miss class, study hall, practices, or medical treatment. Players mobile or home numbers will not be released by the Sports Media Relations Office.

MEDICAL POLICY

The UH Sports Media Relations Office abides by federal law pertaining to the releasing of injury information. We will not disseminate any information about a student-athletes' injury without written consent. The only information given to the media will be if a student-athlete is "probable," "questionable," or "doubtful" to play. However, the student-athlete may release information about his/her injury.

WE ARE THE "RAINBOW WARRIORS"

When referring to the UH football team, please use the nickname "Rainbow Warriors." In an effort to standardize its nicknames, on July 1, 2013, the University of Hawai'i officially changed its men's team nickname to "Rainbow Warriors." The school's women's teams are still referred to as "Rainbow Wahine." The word "Wahine" (pronounced wah-HEE-nay) means woman in the Hawaiian language. The rainbow has been part of UH's nickname since 1923.

WHAT'S AN 'OKINA?

What's that punctuation mark in the word Hawai'i? A: In the Hawaiian language, it's called an 'okina, which translated literally in English means separator. Phonetically it is referred to as a glottal stop, similar to the sound that would be made in the English oh-oh. The 'okina is actually a letter in the Hawaiian language and typed out looks like a backwards, inverted apostrophe. The practice of the UH Sports Media Relations office is to use the 'okina in all Hawaiian words in which they occur.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCE

Head coach Norm Chow and selected players are available at the Aloha Stadium Hospitality Room approximately 15 minutes after each home game. The media will NOT be allowed to conduct interviews with players and coaches on the field. The locker room is open to the media after the 10-minute "cooling off" period for all games (home and away).

ALOHA STADIUM INFORMATION

PARKING GATES: Upper and Lower Halawa parking lot (Gates 3 & 4) opens 5 (five) hours prior to kickoff while all other gates (UH Reserved) will open 4 (four) hours prior. Parking is \$5. Alternate parking is available at Kam Drive In (\$5 per vehicle with FREE shuttle service) and Leeward Community College (FREE parking with \$2/person shuttle service). Shuttle service runs two and a half hours prior to kickoff until one hour after the game. Parking is also available at Radford High School beginning three and a half hours prior to kickoff to one hour after the game (\$5 parking with no shuttle service). No tailgating is allowed at alternate parking sites.

STADIUM GATES: Stadium turnstiles open one and a half hours prior to kickoff.

STADIUM SECURITY: Security measures are in effect. Only fanny packs, purses, backpacks and handbags will be allowed into the stadium, but are subject to inspection by stadium security.

Contraband items include: weapons, noise makers, illegal narcotics, outside food or beverages, cans or bottles, umbrellas, coolers, fireworks, inflatable objects, confetti, balloons, laser pointers, poles or sticks, skateboards, scooters, rollerblades, bicycles, and/or any item that may pose a health or safety issue to guests and/or employees.

Smoking is prohibited except within a posted designated smoking area. (this includes vapor and electronic cigarettes).

TRAFFIC ADVISORY: ESPN 1420 AM provides traffic advisories and updates.

UH FOOTBALL EXPRESS: Air-conditioned bus transportation to Aloha Stadium is available throughout O'ahu by Roberts Hawaii's "UH Football Express". Season passes can be purchased for \$84 for all seven games, \$72 for six games, or \$15 for one game. One-way rides can be purchased on-site for \$10 per person. Reservations for the UH Football Express are required for all round-trips and may be made online at www.UHFootballExpress.com, or by calling Roberts Hawaii at 808-954-8625.

Pick-up locations are: Hawai'i Kai (Hawai'i Kai Park n' Ride), Kahala (Kahala Mall curbside near Bank of Hawaii), Kailua (Kailua Recreation Center, Kainalu Drive), Kane'ohe (Alaloe Street above Sears at Windward Mall), and Mililani Mauka (Mililani Mauka Park n' Ride).

The Hawai'i lineup features a pair of Colorado locals in senior offensive linemen Ben Clarke and Brenden Urban—both hailing from Littleton, Colo., where they were teammates at Chatfield High School.

Neither lineman was recruited by CU and both took very different routes to UH. Clarke was recruited to O'ahu by the previous coaching staff and has played, and started, all four years under coach Norm Chow. Urban first played one season at Adams State before opting to transfer and join Clarke.

Both players started against CU last season in Boulder—Clarke at left tackle and Urban at center—both appear in the two-deep and are expected to play against the Buffaloes on Thursday night.

MEETING UP WITH OLD FRIENDS

Junior defensive lineman Corey Rasmussen spent his first year in college on CU's Boulder campus, transferring to UH before the 2013 season and redshirting under NCAA rules. Transitioning from offensive line, Rasmussen was a scout-teamer last season and didn't play against Colorado, but is penciled in as the backup at nose tackle in the opener.

A PIECE OF COLORADO LEGACY

Promoted in the spring to assistant head coach, third-year UH offensive line coach Chris Naeole is not only a Colorado alum (1997), but was also a consensus All-American as a senior in 1996 and a three-year starter for the Buffs, allowing only one sack through the course of his career. He was a two-time first-team all-Big 12 pick and played on four bowl teams, including a starting role on the Fiesta and Cotton Bowl-winning teams.

Following his career in Boulder, Naeole was the 10th overall pick in the 1997 NFL Draft—at the time making the Ka'a'awa, O'ahu native the highest-selected pick from the islands. Naeole went on to an 11-year professional career with the New Orleans Saints and later Jacksonville Jaguars.

NEW WARRIOR COORDINATORS LOOKING TO STEAL THE SHOW

The University of Hawai'i is working with a clean slate on all fronts in 2015, as one of only seven programs in NCAA DI FBS replacing both offensive and defensive coordinators—Idaho State's Don Bailey looks to boost the offense, while SMU's Tom Mason will bolster UH's defensive strength. With the addition of Montana's Jake Cookus, the Warriors are one of only two FBS program in the nation replacing coordinators in all three facets of the game.

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR DON BAILEY



Bailey arrived at UH after a four-year stint at Idaho State as the offensive coordinator and associate head coach—where he also earned 2014 FCS Coordinator of the Year honors from FootballScoop. Hardly a flash in the pan, Bailey has transformed every offense he's worked with.

Under Bailey's guidance, the ISU Bengals moved from one of the lowest-rated offensive teams to the offensive elite, and quickly. Before his arrival, they ranked 114th (of 117) in total offense and 108th in scoring offense. Fast forward four years and the Bengals finished the 2014 season with the nation's second-best total offense (562 YPG), sixth-best scoring offense (40.3 PPG) and were number one in passing with 348 yards-by-air per game.

All-American Quarterback Justin Arias led FCS in passing yards per game at 339.7 last season under Bailey's Tutelage, aiding the Bengals to a top 25 ranking in one of the toughest FCS conferences.

Bailey also engineered offensive revitalizations at South Dakota State and Montana State, using a coaching style learned under Portland State's Pokey Allen.

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR TOM MASON



Hired in February to take the reins of the Rainbow Warrior defense, Mason has worked a storied career of nearly 40 years on the defensive side of the ball, coming most recently from a seven-year stint at SMU under former Hawai'i coach June Jones,

splitting duties the vast majority of his final season as not only the DC, but the interim head coach.

SMU hit a high point in its push to return to former glory in 2012 with the Mustangs' defense under Mason's guidance, posting two shutouts and tying an NCAA interception record, while ranking 15th in rush defense, tied for third in takeaways and second in fumble recoveries.

Mason's defenses aided SMU to three consecutive bowl seasons and a narrow loss in the 2010 Conference-USA Championship Game, helping to resurrect a program stagnant since its fall in the 1980s.

Mason also brings a unique understanding of not only the league, but Hawai'i as well to his post, with a previous seven-year turn as linebackers coach at Fresno State, along with runs at Nevada and Boise State. He has positioned several defenses to be among the nation's best

SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR JAKE COOKUS



Cookus arrived in Honolulu from Missoula, Montana, where his post had been co-special teams coordinator and safeties coach for the Montana Grizzlies over the previous two seasons.

Finishing the season ranked No. 13 in NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), the Griz have advanced to the semifinal of the NCAA FCS Playoffs each of the last two years. Montana also earned 6-2 records each of the last two years in arguably one of the most powerful conferences in the FCS—the Big Sky—a league that sends a minimum of three teams to the 24-team playoff each year, four in 2014.

That kind of success is hard to come by without a quality special teams effort. During his time in Missoula, Cookus had his squad topping out at 17th in the FCS in net punting, 33rd in punt returns and 45th in kickoff returns.

It was a carry-over from the success he engineered in seven seasons at Weber State as special teams coordinator (last three as co-defensive coordinator as well), where his unit ranked sixth in net punting and 16th in kickoff returns during his final season there.

GETTING THE SHOW STARTED

Both the University of Hawai'i Rainbow Warriors and Colorado Buffaloes open their 2015 campaigns on Thursday night during the opening night of the college football season. The Warriors and Buffs will be final matchup of 18 scheduled for the day.

A BAKERS DOZEN

With Thursday's meeting, both UH and CU kick off a grueling 13 consecutive weeks of games, with no BYEs, and are the only two NCAA DI FBS teams with the full schedule.

TAKING THE SCENIC ROUTE

Through the course of the 13-game slate, the Warriors will take to the road, rather the air, for six games. UH is the only program in DI FBS to play games in five separate time zones, traveling to contests at defending College Football Playoff Champion Ohio State, as well as Wisconsin, Boise State, New Mexico, Nevada and UNLV.

Through the course of the six road contests, UH will cross time zone borders a combined 26 times.

MIXING THINGS UP

In addition to a variety of travel locations and environments, UH is also scheduled to kick off at eight unique game times, beginning with a 7:04 p.m. HT kickoff against Colorado—the latest since Sept. 4, 2009 against Central Arkansas.

The latest scheduled contest for UH since 1997 was a 7:35 p.m. HT start against Fresno State.

The schedule could allow for a ninth unique game time, as UH's Oct. 3 meeting at Boise State will have a game time determined by ESPN at a later date.

HAWAI'I-CU SERIES HISTORY

▶ The Warriors and Buffaloes have met four times and are locked in a 2-2 series tie.

▶ The teams played a home-and-home series in 2010 & 2011, with CU evening the series on a 21-12 win last season in Boulder.

▶ The home team has claimed victory in each of the four meetings.

▶ In 2011 at Aloha Stadium, UH led 17-0 at the half and hung on for a 34-17 victory.

▶ The series began on New Year's Day 1925 in Honolulu, a 13-0 UH victory. The win capped a perfect 8-0 season for the Rainbows. The "Wonder Teams" of 1924 and '25, went 18-0 during those two seasons and out-scored their opponents 606-29.

HAWAI'I VS. THE POWER 5

Since 2003, UH has nine wins versus teams from the Power 5 conferences—ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC—in 30 opportunities. Below is the list of UH's wins during that span.

▶ UH has opened the season with a Pac-12 opponent in each of the past five consecutive seasons.

READY TO TURN THE CORNER

Last season, five of UH's nine losses were decided by eight points or less, including losses to the Pac-12's Washington (1) and Oregon State (8). Including a nine-point loss to Colorado, UH dropped three games to Pac-12 teams by a combined 18 points. Over the past two seasons, half of the team's 20 losses were decided by eight points or less.

HISTORY REPEATING ITSELF

One of the most exciting staff acquisitions in the offseason was first-year offensive coordinator Don Bailey, who arrived on Mānoa after yet another turnaround—at Idaho State—putting the 22-year veteran in position to earn FootballScoops FCS Coordinator of the Year.

While many look at the numbers and expected a full-swing shift away from the Pro-Style schemes employed by head coach Norm Chow at UH, USC, Utah and BYU, a more balanced approach is what the Warriors have demonstrated on the practice field with the new hybrid spread scheme.

Bailey's run at Idaho State took the Bengals from the lowest tier in the FCS offensively—ranking 116th in rushing offense, 81st in passing offense, 114th in total offense and 108th in scoring offense the season before his arrival (2010). In 2014, the Bengals ranked 23rd in rushing, first in passing, second in total offense and sixth in scoring. A similar rise was seen in his stint at South Dakota State.

SEASON & HOME OPENERS

Hawai'i is 58-35-5 (.617) all-time in season openers and 63-30-5 (.668) all-time in home openers. The 2015 season marks UH's 41st season at Aloha Stadium, having played in the facility immediately after opening, and the Rainbow Warriors are 21-19 (.525) in home openers at the facility.

OPENERS VS. THE PAC-12

This season marks the sixth consecutive year and 10th all-time that UH will open its season against a Pac-12 opponent. The Warriors are 3-7 in season openers vs. the Pac-12.

40 YEARS OF ALOHA

Aloha Stadium celebrates its 40th season in 2015 and will serve as home to the Rainbow Warriors for the 41st season. The stadium opened Sept. 12, 1975, the day before UH's 1975 home opener with Texas A&I. The Warriors boast an all-time mark of 187-127-4 for a 59.4 winning percentage in the Halawa venue.



BOWL-BOUND COMPETITION

Seven of UH's 13 opponents in 2015 made appearances last year in postseason play. All seven participated in FBS bowl games, with Ohio State earning two opportunities and the first-ever College Football Playoff title — Ohio State (Sugar, CFP National Championship), Wisconsin (Outback), Boise State (Vizio Fiesta), San Diego State (San Diego County CU Poinsettia), Nevada (R+L Carriers New Orleans), Air Force (Famous Idaho Potato) and Fresno State (Hawai'i).

BREAKING THE STRING

In 2014, UH posted its fourth consecutive non-winning season and fifth in the last six seasons, a streak the Warriors hope to break in 2015 with Max Wittek under center and OC Don Bailey's new offense at work. Hawai'i's last winning season occurred in 2010 (10-4) and the last time UH has posted four straight non-winning seasons was from 1994-98.

UH ON NATIONAL TELEVISION

UH has made 79 all-time appearances on national television and owns a 18-59-2 record. UH has lost its last 19 games on national television, its last win came against Colorado on ESPN2 to open the 2011 season.

WITTEK TAKES THE KEYS

Thursday's game against Colorado will feature the much-anticipated UH debut of starting quarterback Max Wittek.

A transfer from USC, Wittek sat out the 2014 season as required by the NCAA, after playing two seasons and redshirting as a freshman for the Trojans. While at USC, he played in 14 games and passed for 600 yards with three touchdowns.

Wittek battled it out for the starting role with 2014 starter Ikaika Woolsey in the spring, but ultimately was announced by coach Norm Chow as the No. 1 directly following the completion of spring practices.

In addition, despite a short tenure on campus, and no playing time for the Warriors, Wittek was voted almost unanimously as a team captain by his teammates.

CIRQUE DU MARCUS

Junior wide receiver Marcus Kemp proved to be the team's playmaker in 2014, with several highlight reel catches, including two in the final moments of a thrilling win over UNLV, hauling in the game-winning touchdown on the final play, in addition to a spectacular one-handed catch while spiraling on his back to set up UH's go-ahead touchdown with 2:00 left.

He finished the game with a then-career-best 114 yards on six catches, which he bettered the following week against Fresno State (117 yards on seven catches).

Kemp topped the team with 797 receiving yards (61.3 avg.) on a team second-best 56 catches, along with three TDs, including a spectacular grab on a Hail Mary to end the first half against San Diego State. Kemp

paced the team with 12 catches of 20-plus yards, including seven over 35 yards.

Last year's efforts drew enough notice to receive a spot on the 2015 Biletnikoff Award watch list for the nation's most outstanding WR.

PEDROZA A DANGEROUS TARGET OUTSIDE

Although senior wide receiver Quinton Pedroza spent some time in the slot in 2014, he's set to go full time on the outside opposite Marcus Kemp, creating a serious tandem threat for opposing secondaries.

Pedroza started only eight games last season, but registered 674 yards and led the team with 59 receptions. He is expected to be a top target in the new spread scheme.

CONFIRMING THE PEDIGREE

Freshman receiver Dylan Collie is projected to start on the inside against Colorado, and should quickly prove he's up to the familiar football name.

Collie is the younger brother of former BYU receiver and long-time Colts receiver Austin Collie. He's a slot receiver raised in a family of slot receivers. Another brother, Zac, and father, Scott, also played for BYU.

A 2012 graduate of Oak Ridge HS in Calif., he originally attended BYU after catching 47 passes for 660 yards as a senior.

BACKS RUNNING DEEP

At running back, UH not only returns junior Steven Lakalaka, who paced the squad with 646 yards on 159 carries, but the Warriors also get back classmate Diocemy Saint Juste, who had 73 carries for 495 yards and took the top spot out of spring and through the fall. Add in junior college transfer Paul Harris (499 yds, 8.5 YPC) and the 'Bows have a three-pronged attack.

REDZONE WARRIORS

The Rainbow Warriors showed a knack for getting opponents off the field when it was important in 2014, topping the Mountain West in red zone defense with a 78.4 percent success rate.

In the red zone, UH shut down 11 attempts, including three on downs, one by fumble and another by interception. In addition, the Warriors held 11 attempts to a field goal try, with just six successful kicks.

BACK 8 STRONG AND EXPERIENCED

The Rainbow Warriors return five starters across the linebacking corps and secondary, topped by Ne'Quan Phillips' 37 games of experience. After starting for 25 consecutive games at cornerback, Phillips will fill the primary nickelback role to open the 2015 season, after a solid spring and fall competition placed Jamal Mayo and Nick Nelson atop the depth charts. 143 career tackles with five interceptions by no means a bad set of experience to have in your nickel.

With 22 games and 12 starts, junior Trayvon Henderson is the top returning tackler for UH, registering 63 stops last year, including 54 solo shots and three for loss.

Linebackers Simon Poti and Lance Williams, both seniors, were starters a year ago and continue to battle for position in a deep and talented linebacking group that will see lots of rotation in the second year of the 3-4 scheme.

MAYO ON THE (OUTSIDE)

Conventional wisdom would not expect to see a player fresh off of redshirting surmount a 25-game starter, but that is exactly what Jamal Mayo has done with his second season at UH. Pulling ahead of incumbent Ne'Quan

Phillips. The Oakland, Calif. native made huge improvements in the offseason and fits well in new defensive coordinator Tom Mason's style of aggressive defense. When the Warriors first scrimmaged in the fall, Mayo made his presence known with three tough breakups.

He proved adept at getting to the ball at Laney College, where he registered 10 interceptions and 13 breakups in 18 games.

FRONT LINE GROWING STRONGER

Met with the challenge of replacing three talented down linemen, all starters, the 'Bows prepared their options in the spring and have built a strong core and notable depth to help UH succeed in the 3-4 set.

Graduates Moses Samia, Beau Yap and Marcus Malepeai, combined for 102 tackles, including 15 for loss and 7.5 sacks a year ago, leaving Kennedy Tulimasealii as the only returner with starting experience, opening up eight of his 13 appearances as a starter, registering 40 tackles and a team-best 9.5 TFL. He is penciled in to start at defensive end.

Opposite Tulimasealii, former Navy SEAL Luke Shawley has been thriving on the eve of his senior season, after playing all 13 contests with 35 tackles despite no starts. He also led the Warriors with nine hurries.

In the middle, the young Samoan, Penitito Faalologo has secured his position after a very productive spring, playing 11 games as a reserve last season.

Former walk-on transfer from Colorado Corey Rasmussen has shored up the backup NT position, while Meffy Koloamatangi, David Manoa and Defensive Scout Team Award-winner Ka'auomoana Gifford are all increasing the pass rush with their size on the outside.

FALL BATTLEGROUND FOR SPECIAL TEAMS

The Warriors faced two seemingly Herculean adjustments in preparing for 2015's special teams unit, replacing both fourth-year placekicker Tyler Hadden and the quintessential utility man in punter/returner/receiver Scott Harding.

Hadden capped his career with his best season, converting 18-of-23 field goals, falling just shy of a single-season record.

Harding on the other hand earned nearly every possible award, as an FWA All-America (UH first since 2007), finalist for Polynesian Player of the Year, first team all-MW and was a semifinalist for the Ray Guy award (ranking first in the MW and 12th in the NCAA in punting)—not to mention he was named *"The Most Interesting Man in College Football"* by Grantland.

With only junior Aaron Novoa remaining after spring practices, first-year special teams coordinator Jake Cookus hit the recruiting trail hard.

The Warriors had already secured a signing day commitment from local punter Alex Trifonovich, a Chris Sailer All-American with a 48.8 YPP average at Mid-Pacific Institute.

"After spring ball, we knew we wanted to bring in some new specialist kickers," Cookus said. "We've got a pretty good competition for punting the ball, kickoff and field goal jobs."

That competition is built on the addition of two summer steals, Rigoberto Sanchez and Mauro Bondi.

- ▶ A Butte College transfer, whose arrival was anticipated throughout the summer, Sanchez ranked second in the CCCAA in scoring in 2013, with 22 field goals and 119-of-121 PATs in two years at BC, also punting with a 38.5 average on 50 punts, dropping 13 inside the 20.
- ▶ A late roster addition, graduate transfer Bondi

comes to Mānoa after three seasons as a kickoff specialist at Nebraska, collecting touchbacks on 63-of-111 kickoffs.

SOLID RETURNS

A year ago, a freshman from Wailuku, Maui, Keelan Ewaliko, shouldered the load for UH in kick returns, ranking sixth in the Mountain West with a 20.3 yard average of 589 yards on 29 returns. Junior Diocemy Saint Juste also chipped in 108 yards on six returns, after putting up 25.1 YPR (12 Ret. For 352 yds.) as a rookie in 2013.

MAKING A HOUSE CALL

The latest addition to the UH special teams arsenal has been the most potent throughout fall camp. Ventura College transfer Paul Harris quickly settled into the top kick returning role, despite very capable return men still aboard.

A Junior College All-American kick returner, Harris averaged 35.1 yards on 20 returns, tallying three touchdowns on last year's campaign.

"He can go from zero to full speed in about one step," Cookus noted. "You've got to keep an eye on him with the ball in his hand, because he can go the distance."

ROUTE RUNNERS FINDING SEAMS

Replacing Harding will be no simple task on punt returns, but the Warriors look to put their two most effective route runners in his place.

Senior Quinton Pedroza is penciled in atop the chart and will take over the role for the first time since high school, when he averaged 15.4 yards per punt return and 31.9 yards on kick returns at Chino High School.

Joining in the action will also be freshman Dylan Collie, who is credited by QB Max Wittek as the cleanest route runner he's seen in his career. As a senior in high school, Collie registered an 18.2 yard average fielding punts and 19.3 on kickoffs.

NORM CHOW

Head Coach
4th Season
Overall Record: 8-29
MW Record: 4-20

Entering his fourth season at the helm of the University of Hawai'i football team, Norm Chow has brought name recognition to the Rainbow Warriors and, with it, an influx of nationally ranked prospects and transfers to the Mānoa campus.

During his tenure, Chow has managed to lure a number of top-level talents to play for the Green and White, including ESPN 300 recruits and Power 5 conference transfers, among them former Southern California quarterback Max Wittek, who is slated to start the 2015 season under center; highly recruited defensive lineman Kennedy Tulimasealii out of Wai'anae High School; and former Elite 11 quarterback Aaron Zwahlen, who returns from a two-year church mission.

Considered one of the top offensive minds in football, Chow has instilled discipline and a pro-style offensive scheme to the Rainbow Warrior program, who in 2015, will be seeking their first winning season and bowl appearance in five years. The Punahou School alum and Palolo Valley native has undoubtedly his most talented squad since being named the program's 22nd head coach on Dec. 22, 2011, succeeding Greg McMackin, who retired after four seasons.

When Chow took over the Hawai'i program, he was the first Asian-American head coach of a major college football school. His coaching resume includes some 40 years of experience collegiately and in the National Football League. As a collegiate coach, Chow spent 27 years at BYU, one year at North Carolina State, four years at USC, three years at UCLA and one year at his alma mater, Utah, before spending the past three seasons at Hawai'i. Chow also coached three years with the NFL's Tennessee Titans as offensive coordinator.

Prior to his arrival in Mānoa, Chow was the offensive coordinator at Utah, where he led the Utes to a runner-up finish in the Pac-12 South Division in 2011 and a 30-27 victory over Georgia Tech in the Sun Bowl.

Known as an offensive mastermind, success has followed Chow where ever he's been. A three-time national Assistant Coach of the Year, Chow has served as offensive coordinator for three national championship teams (Brigham Young-1984 and USC-2003 and '04) and has tutored three Heisman Trophy winners (Ty Detmer-BYU, Carson Palmer-USC and Matt Leinart-USC) and six NFL first-round draft picks (Palmer, Leinart, Philip Rivers-N.C. State, Steve Young-BYU, Jim McMahon-BYU and Marc Wilson-BYU).

Chow began his coaching career as head coach at Waialua High School on the North Shore of O'ahu from 1970-72. He then began a 27-year stint at BYU, where he served in a variety of positions, including assistant head coach, offensive coordinator, co-offensive coordinator, quarterbacks coach, receivers coach and recruiting coordinator. Working under legendary head coach LaVell Edwards, Chow called the offensive plays at BYU from 1982-99.

During his tenure at BYU, the Cougars posted a 244-91-3 record and appeared in 23 bowl games, and he coached 21 offensive players who earned All-America honors. Brigham Young ranked in the nation's Top 10 in total offense in 12 of Chow's 18 years as offensive coordinator.

Chow then spent one year as offensive coordinator at North Carolina State in 2000, where he coached NFL first-round draft pick Philip Rivers to Freshman All-America honors before moving to USC, where he was part of two national championship teams in four seasons and coached Heisman Trophy winners Carson Palmer and Matt Leinart. Palmer, the first overall pick of the 2003 NFL Draft, left the school as the Pac-10's career leader in passing yards and total offense. Leinart was a two-time first team All-American who was also named Walter Camp Player of the Year in 2004.

After a successful stint at USC, Chow then took his talents to the NFL as the offensive coordinator at Tennessee where he tutored quarterback Vince Young and helped the Titans earn a spot in the NFL playoffs and finish the regular season with a record of 10-6. In 2006, Young, a rookie quarterback from Texas, took over the offense during the fourth week of the season. He led the team to an 8-5 record, earned Rookie of the Year honors (only the second quarterback to win AP Offensive Rookie of the Year) and became the first rookie quarterback to play in the Pro Bowl.

In 2005, Chow adapted to the pro game with ease despite an offense that relied on a youthful cast of players and encountered numerous injuries. Tennessee ranked ninth in the NFL in passing and 17th overall in offense. The group of rookie receivers (WR Brandon Jones, WR Roydell Williams, WR Courtney Roby and TE Bo Scaife) became the first quartet of rookie receivers since the 1968 Buffalo Bills to each record at least 20 receptions in a season. Scaife would also establish a new rookie tight-end franchise mark with 37 receptions.

Chow moved back to the collegiate ranks as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at UCLA for three seasons before becoming offensive coordinator and tight-ends coach at Utah at the start of the 2011 season.

At UCLA, Kevin Prince enjoyed one of the top seasons ever by a Bruin freshman quarterback, ranking second in pass completions, passing yards and total offense. In 2008, quarterback Kevin Craft completed 232 passes, the second-highest total in school history.

Chow, the recipient of the 2002 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach, has coached eight of the top 14 NCAA career passing efficiency leaders and 13 of the top 30 single-season passing yardage leaders. Chow has also received National Assistant Coach of the Year honors by the American Football Foundation in 1999 and Athlon in 1993, and was named NCAA Division I-A Offensive Coordinator of the Year by American Football Monthly in 1996 and 2002.
