THE SERIES

- Colorado leads the all-time series, 8-7, with the past three meetings occurring in bowl games, the last of which saw UO defeat the Buffaloes, 38-16, in the 2002 Fiesta Bowl.
- The Ducks are making their first visit to Boulder since 1987, when they beat the Buffs, 10-7.
- The most points ever scored by UO in Boulder came in a 35-0 shutout in 1956.
- The game marks the first for Oregon against one of the two new Pac-12 teams.

QUICK HITS

- Oregon has won 15 straight Pac-10/12 games, including the last seven played on the road.
- The Ducks rank fifth in the nation in rushing at 315.0 yards per game and have eclipsed the 300-yard mark four times in six games.
- Oregon has out-gained all six opponents in total offense this season and averages 539.0 yards per game, which ranks fifth nationally.
- JR QB **Darron Thomas** has thrown a touchdown pass in 19 consecutive games, which is tied for the second-longest streak in the nation behind former North Carolina State and current Wisconsin QB **Russell Wilson** (30).
- Darron Thomas currently has the longest streak of consecutive starts among UO's offensive players at 19.
- In the two games JR RB **Kenjon Barner** has started in place of JR RB **LaMichael James**, he has 48 carries for 318 yds (6.6 ypc) and five touchdowns.
- FR RB **De'Anthony Thomas** ranks second nationally among freshmen in scoring average (non-kickers) at 8.3 pts per game behind Virginia's **Kevin Parks** (8.4).
- The Ducks are ranked No. 10 in the initial BCS rankings released Sunday. Oregon debuted at No. 2 last season and finished at No. 2 at the end of the regular season.

HEAD COACH CHIP KELLY

Oregon's 30th head coach, who in 2009 became the first in Pac-10 history to win an outright conference title in his first season at the helm, followed that feat with a second conference crown while securing the program's first trip to the BCS Championship Game following the 2010 season. The Manchester, N.H., native guided his team to more wins (22) in his first two years in the Pac-8/10/12 than any coach in conference history. Recognized as Pac-10 coach of the year for the second time in as many seasons, Kelly was named the recipient of five national coach of the year awards last year: AFCA, AP, Eddie Robinson, Sporting News and Walter Camp. He's overseen the team's first 12-win season and led the Ducks to a school-record 12-game winning streak. In his first head coaching job at any level, Kelly has a mark of 27-5, 20-1 in Pac-12 play. His .844 overall winning percentage is the highest in school history and his .952 percentage in conference play is the best in Pac-12 history.

RETURN MEN

The 2011 Oregon Ducks return 39 letterwinners, including 13 starters - seven on offense and six on defense. UO also welcomes back every specialist with the exception of holder **Nate Costa**.

OREGON 5-1

At 5-1 to start the year, the Ducks have now posted a 5-1 or better record through their first six games in six out of the past seven seasons. UO is 3-0 to begin conference play for the third consecutive season and fifth time in 12 years. The last four times the Ducks have started 3-0 in league they have earned at least a share of the conference title.

LIGHTNING STRIKES

Of Oregon's 38 offensive drives resulting in touchdowns, half (19) have lasted 1:39 or less and nine have lasted under a minute. UO's longest drive of the season, in terms of yards, lasted 37 seconds as the Ducks drove 93 yards in three plays on consecutive pass completions of 46, 40 and 7 yards against Missouri State.

ONE FOR THE BOOKS

JR RB **LaMichael James** set Oregon single-game records for rushing and all-purpose yards in the Ducks' 56-31 win at Arizona Sept. 24. His 288 yards on the ground eclipsed **Onterrio Smith's** 285 at Washington State Oct. 27, 2001, and his 363 all-purpose yards broke Smith's mark of 342 - also in the game vs. the Cougars. James' rushing effort tied former Arizona RB **Trung Canidate** (288 vs. ASU in 1998) for 10th in conference history.

RECORD RUN

JR RB **LaMichael James** ripped off the longest run in Autzen Stadium history and second-longest scamper in UO history with a 90-yard touchdown vs. Missouri State Sept. 17. It was the longest run by an Oregon player since **Bob Smith** went 92 yards for a score vs. Idaho in 1938. **Jonathan Stewart** held the previous stadium record with an 88-yarder vs. Fresno State in 2007. James also had a 50-yard touchdown run vs. the Bears, becoming the first UO player known to have two TDs of 50-plus in the same game.

AMONG THE PAC-12 GREATS

With 4,129 career rushing yards, JR RB **LaMichael James** ranks fifth in Pac-12 history. He is just the second back in conference history to surpass the 4,000-mark as a junior, joining USC's **Charles White**. White holds the Pac-12's all-time rushing mark with 6,245 yards.

200-YARD CLUB

Only ten Oregon backs have ever eclipsed 200 rushing yards in a single game, but JR RB **LaMichael James** has taken the accomplishment to an entirely new level by doing it six times in his career, including the last three times he's taken the field - both UO records. James is the first Pac-12 player with three straight 200-yard efforts since USC's **Marcus Allen** in 1981, and the first FBS player since Tulane's **Matt Forte** in 2007.

100-YARD GAMES

It took until the third game before the Ducks had a 100-yard rushing performance, but JR RB **LaMichael James** did that and then some when he ran for 204 yards vs. Missouri State.

With 288 the next week at Arizona and 239 vs. California, James has 21 games of 100 yards or more in his career (in 30 appearances), extending his own Oregon record. JR RB **Kenjon Barner** recorded his first 100-yard game of the season and third of his career with 171 vs. Arizona State.

THREE FOR THREE

FR TE **Colt Lyster** has three receptions on the season - all resulting in touchdowns. After scoring on a 20-yard catch vs. Nevada Sept. 10, the Oregon native had TD grabs of 7 and 26 yards the following week vs. Missouri State. He is the first true freshman at Oregon to score a touchdown on his first career reception. **Bobby Nero** vs. Michigan State in 1998 (as a red-shirt freshman) and **Len Read** vs. Cal in 1956 (as a sophomore) are the only other Ducks to make their first collegiate catch a TD.

NO DOUBTING THOMAS

With two more touchdown passes vs. Arizona State Oct. 15, JR QB **Darron Thomas** now has 50 for his career to rank fifth on UO's all-time list and needs 12 to tie **Danny O'Neil** (1991-94) for the school record. Despite playing less than three quarters vs. the Sun Devils, he managed 203 yards of total offense (187 passing, 16 rushing) to move into 10th on Oregon's career list for total offense with 5,005 yards and 10th on the all-time passing list with 4,376.

THOMAS TIES TOUCHDOWN MARK

JR QB **Darron Thomas**' six touchdown passes vs. Nevada Sept. 10 matched the school record previously achieved by **Joey Harrington** (vs. Arizona State in both 2000 and '01) and **Danny O'Neil** (vs. Stanford in 1994). Thomas became the first Oregon player with five touchdowns in one half, connecting with five different receivers over the first two quarters.

RATING A RARITY

JR QB **Darron Thomas** had a passing efficiency rating of 303.05 against Nevada, completing 13 of 19 attempts for 295 yards and six scores. That rating was the fourth highest in college football since 2005 among QBs with at least 15 attempts against FBS competition and highest since Notre Dame's **Jimmy Clausen** - also against Nevada - had a 303.66 in '09. No Pac-10/12 quarterback has had a more efficient day passing the ball in at least seven seasons.

START ME UP

Eight Ducks made their starting debuts in the season opener vs. LSU. On offense, JR WR **Justin Hoffman**, FR C **Hroniss Grasu** and SR RG **Ramsen Golpashin** got the nod, and on defense, SO DT **Taylor Hart**, JR DT **Isaac Remington**, SR LB **Dewitt Stuckey**, JR LB **Michael Clay** and FR CB **Terrance Mitchell**. In Week 2, JR WR **Rahsaan Vaughn** made his first career start, and in Week 3 it was SO FS **Avery Pat-**

terson and JR LB **Kiko Alonso** getting their first-ever starts, bringing the total number of first-time starters this season to 11.

ALL-PURPOSE BACK

JR RB **LaMichael James**' versatility has been on display through his first five games of the season as he's racked up yardage rushing (853), receiving (159), punt returning (116) and kick returning (21). James' 1,148 all-purpose yards to date give him 4,842 for his career - good for fourth in school history.

ACHIEVEMENT UNLOCKED

Already the school's all-time rusher with 4,129 yards, JR RB **LaMichael James** added the Oregon record for touchdowns - both rushing and overall - after his two-TD effort at Arizona Sept. 24. James now has 43 TDs running the football and 48 overall, eclipsing **Derek Loville's** (1986-89) former marks of 42 and 45, respectively. He sits ninth on the Pac-12 career list for rushing touchdowns.

THE OTHER DT

FR RB **De'Anthony Thomas** piled up a game-high 204 all-purpose yards in his Autzen Stadium debut vs. Nevada, including team-highs of 81 rushing and 93 receiving. Both of his catches went for touchdowns (24 and 69 yards). It was the most all-purpose yards by an Oregon freshman since **LaMichael James** totaled 214 at Stanford in 2009.

QUACK MAMBA

With two touchdowns in UO's Oct. 15 win vs. Arizona State, FR RB **De'Anthony Thomas** now has eight through his first six games to rank second on the team behind JR RB **LaMichael James**. Nicknamed "Black Mamba" during his standout prep career at Crenshaw High School in Los Angeles, Thomas is rapidly approaching Oregon's school record of 10 TDs by a true freshman, set by Derek Loville (7 rush, 3 rec) in 1986. Thomas, averaging 8.3 points per game, currently ranks second nationally to Virginia's **Kevin Parks** (8.4) among freshmen (non-kicker).

EXPLOSION PLAYS

After not recording a single play from scrimmage of 25 or more yards in the season opener vs. LSU, the Ducks are back to their big play ways with 33 over the past five games. Last season, the Ducks had 57 such plays - an average of nearly 4.5 per contest.

CLIFF NOTES

After serving a one-game suspension in the season opener and struggling to reclaim his starting position after the fact, consensus All-America JR CB **Cliff Harris** appears to be back to his play-making ways, if the past two games are any indication. Harris had a game-high three pass breakups vs. Cal Oct. 6, and made a key interception at the end of the first-half against Arizona State Oct. 15, returning the ball 50 yards to set up a go-ahead score. He leads the Ducks and ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in passes defended (1.20 per game).

BO KNOWS TOUCHDOWNS

SO LB **Boseko Lokombo** made the most of his first career interception, capping the Ducks' 69-20 win over Nevada with a 67-yard "pick 6". It was the second career touchdown for the Canadian, who recovered and returned a fumble for a 32-yard score last season at Arizona State.

YOUNG FOLKS

Five true freshmen got the call to play in the season opener vs. LSU. In order of appearance: RB **Tra Carson**, RB **De'Anthony Thomas**, OL **Jake Fisher**, TE **Colt Lyerla** and DB **Ifo Ekpre-Olomu**. LB **Rodney Hardrick** became the sixth first-year frosh to play, when he saw the field vs. Missouri State. Last season, five Ducks played as true freshman, but the only non-specialists were DT **Ricky Heimuli** and WR **Josh Huff**. Through three games, 15 redshirt freshmen and three transfers have also made their UO debuts.

AUTZEN ADVANTAGE

The Ducks have won 20 straight games at Autzen Stadium, dating to 2008, which is the second longest streak in stadium history. UO won a record 23 straight between 1997 and 2001. Oregon has won its last 15 Pac-10/12 contests at home since falling in overtime against Oregon State in the 2007 Civil War.

VS. THE TOP 25

The Ducks are 1-1 against top 25 teams this season and 8-4 against ranked opposition in the **Chip Kelly** era. At home, Kelly's troops are 7-0 vs. the top 25. UO's only loss to a non-ranked team during Kelly's tenure came at Stanford on Nov. 7, 2009. The Cardinal became ranked the following week as a result of their victory.

HOUSE OF LOUD

With standing room only crowds in all four home games thus far, including a stadium and State of Oregon record 60,055 Oct. 15 vs. Arizona State, the Ducks have run their sellout streak at Autzen Stadium (cap. 54,000) to 78 consecutive games, dating to 1999.

KELLY AT AUTZEN

Head coach **Chip Kelly** made his sideline debut at Autzen Stadium Sept. 12, 2009 (W 38-36 vs. Purdue) after spending the prior two seasons calling plays from a booth high above the field as the team's offensive coordinator. Since Kelly's arrival in 2007, the Ducks are 27-3 at Autzen, averaging 46.2 points per home game.

ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY IN EUGENE

ESPN College GameDay produced its weekly college football preview show from the University of Oregon prior to the Ducks' matchup with No. 18 Arizona State, marking the sixth appearance in Eugene by the immensely popular show which features **Chris Fowler, Lee Corso, Kirk Herbstreit, Desmond Howard, Erin Andrews** and **David Pollack**. For the first time, the production originated from campus, taking place on the memorial quad with the Lillis Business Complex as a backdrop. With the win vs. the Sun Devils, UO now owns a 5-1 record when hosting GameDay with the lone defeat coming vs. No. 6 Cal, 31-24, in 2007. Last season, the No. 4 Ducks beat No. 9 Stanford, 52-31. Other home wins in front of GameDay were a 47-20 Halloween upset of fourth-ranked USC in '09 (UO was No. 10), a 35-23 win vs. No. 6 Arizona State in '07 (UO was No. 4) and a 29-10 upset of No. 6 UCLA in 2000 (UO was unranked).

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Since 2000, Oregon is 31-6 in regular season, out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Oklahoma, Wisconsin and Michigan (x2). During that stretch, the Ducks are 3-1 against the SEC, 5-2 vs. the

Big Ten, 1-1 vs. the Big 12, 3-0 against the Mountain West, 12-2 vs. the WAC, 2-0 against Conference USA and 5-0 vs. FCS sides.

VS. THE TOP 10

Oregon is 3-3 against the top 10 under **Chip Kelly**, with two defeats coming in BCS bowl games: vs. No. 8 Ohio State in the 2010 Rose Bowl and No. 1 Auburn in the 2011 BCS Championship, and the other vs. No. 4 LSU in the 2011 Cowboys Classic in Arlington, Texas.

DOUBLE-DIGIT VICTORIES

Oregon recorded its third straight and sixth overall season of double-digit wins last season - all since 2000. The Ducks set a new record for victories in a season at 12, as well as wins over two-year (22), three-year (32), four-year (41) and five-year (48) spans.

BACK TO BACK CHAMPS

With another Pac-10 crown in 2010, Oregon became the first team to win consecutive outright conference championships since USC won three in a row from 2003 to '05. Last year's team became the first to go undefeated in Pac-10 play since the start of round robin play in 2006 and the first to ever win nine league games. Four of UO's nine conference titles have come since the start of the 21st century.

COACHING CONTINUITY

An often overlooked facet of Oregon's success has been the continuity of its coaching staff. Third-year head coach Chip Kelly, now in his fifth season on staff, is a relative newcomer in Eugene compared to his core group of assistants, who have remained intact over the course of three different head coaches. Running backs coach Gary Campbell is in his 29th year on the Oregon staff, which equals the longest tenure of any Oregon assistant football coach in school history. In addition, offensive line coach and running game coordinator Steve Greatwood enters his 25th season at UO, linebackers coach Don Pellum is in his 22nd campaign, while defensive coordinator Nick Aliotti has spent 19 full seasons at Oregon over three separate stints. Of the dozen schools in the Pac-12, only Oregon and Washington saw no turnover on their respective staffs from 2010 to '11.

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — LaMichael James became Oregon's career rushing leader but Michael Ford ran for two touchdowns and Jarrett Lee admirably directed LSU's offense in place of suspended quarterback Jordan Jefferson in the fourth-ranked Tigers' season-opening 40-27 victory over No. 3 Oregon on Saturday night.

Ford and Spencer Ware had touchdown runs in a span of 3:20 late in the third quarter after third-string Oregon running back De'Anthony Thomas fumbled on consecutive touches, one on a rushing attempt and then on the ensuing kickoff.

Oregon, which lost to Auburn in the BCS national championship game last season, has consecutive losses for the first time since losing its last three regular-season games in 2007.

LSU took a 16-13 lead just before halftime, going ahead to stay, on Rueben Randle's 10-yard TD catch from Jarrett Lee.

Randle caught the ball in the front corner of the end zone over freshman cornerback Terrance Mitchell.

The other LSU touchdown before halftime came when fill-in punt returner Kenjon Barner fielded a punt inside the 5, took a couple of steps backs. That's when Tyrann Mathieu stripped the ball away, scooped it up after it bounced on the turf and took a couple of steps into the end zone.

LSU has won 34 consecutive nonconference games, the longest such streak in the nation, including all 23 in the regular season under seventh-year coach Les Miles. The overall streak dates back to the Tigers' 26-8 loss to Virginia Tech in the 2002 season opener.

Lee's 10th career start was his first since a win over Louisiana Tech in 2009. Even though the senior completed only 10 of 22 passes for 98 yards, he didn't have an interception and appeared steady throughout the game.

Ware had 26 carries for 99 yards while Fort had 14 runs for 98 yards and two TDs, his second on a 16-yard run in the fourth quarter.

James had one of his tougher career games, even though he scored a touchdown for the 12th time his last 13 games. James had 18 carries for 54 yards, only five more than he had against Auburn in the national title game.

The junior finished the game with 3,331 career rushing yards to break the Oregon career mark previously held by Derel Loville who tallied 3,296 yards from 1986-89.

D'Anthony Thomas scored on a 4-yard run in the final minute of the first opening game of top-five teams on a neutral field since 1984, when Jimmy Johnson won his debut as coach of Miami against an Auburn squad featuring Bo Jackson a year before he won the Heisman Trophy.

Ducks quarterback Darron Thomas was 31-of-54 passing for 240 yards with a touchdown and an interception.

Rob Beard had field goals of 29 and 30 yards that put Oregon up 6-3 in the first quarter. Drew Alleman had kicks of 44 and 32 for LSU.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- Darron Thomas matched a school record with six touchdown passes and No. 13 Oregon bounced back from its season-

opening loss to beat Nevada 69-20 on Saturday.

LaMichael James ran for 67 yards and a touchdown, caught a scoring pass from Thomas and returned a punt for a score to help the Ducks (1-1) to their 17th straight victory at Autzen Stadium.

True freshman running back De'Anthony Thomas caught two passes - both for touchdowns - for 93 yards.

Tyler Lantrip, a fifth-year senior making his first career start, completed 21 of 35 passes for 219 yards and a touchdown for Nevada, which was playing its season opener.

The loss snapped Nevada's seven-game winning streak, which dated to last season when the Wolf Pack went 13-1 and were ranked No. 11 to end the season.

After facing unrelenting pressure in a 40-27 loss to then-No. 4 LSU last week, Darron Thomas was controlled and confident, completing 13 of 19 passes for 295 yards. He was replaced late in the third quarter by backup Bryan Bennett.

The six TD tosses matched the single-game school record set twice by Joey Harrington and once by Danny O'Neil.

The Ducks have not dropped a home opener since 2004.

Oregon built a 13-0 lead in the first quarter. Darron Thomas immediately answered the critics who questioned why he didn't run more against LSU by sprinting for a 26-yard gain on Oregon's first drive. James punched it in 4 yards for the score, but the two-point try didn't work.

Nevada got within field-goal range in the quarter, but Anthony Martinez's 38-yard attempt was blocked by John Boyett. Oregon's ensuing series was highlighted by De'Anthony Thomas' 62-yard dash and capped by Darron Thomas' 3-yard scoring pass to Lavasier Tuinei.

Troy Hill intercepted Lantrip's pass on the Oregon 11 and ran it back 45 yards, before Darron Thomas hit James with a 44-yard pass to make it 20-0.

Darron Thomas also found Rahsaan Vaughn with a 25-yard scoring pass and freshman tight end Colt Lyerla with a 20-yard TD strike.

Nevada scored with 1:52 left in the half on Lantrip's 5-yard pass to Mike Ball, but the Ducks quickly answered with Darron Thomas' 24-yard scoring pass to De'Anthony Thomas to make it 41-7 at the break.

Oregon opened the second half with James' 58-yard punt return to make it 48-7.

James, a Heisman finalist who averaged more than 144 yards rushing last season, was held to 54 yards by LSU last weekend. Against Nevada he showed his versatility, helping out on punt returns in the absence of fellow running back Kenjon Barner, who did not play because of an ankle injury sustained against LSU.

Nevada's Stephon Jefferson had a 1-yard run midway through the fourth quarter to make it 48-13.

On the next series, Darron Thomas hit De'Anthony Thomas with another touchdown pass, this time a 69-yarder.

Nevada's Cody Fajardo ran 7 yards for a score to make it 55-20 midway through the fourth quarter, but Oregon redshirt freshman Ayele Forde added a 26-yard scoring run with 2:24 left and Boseko Lokombo's 67-yard interception return with 20 seconds left provided the final margin.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) — Oregon's LaMichael James was waiting to bust out with a big run. He got his chance against Missouri State.

The Heisman Trophy finalist last season ran 90 yards for a score in the No. 12 Ducks' 56-7 victory over the lower division Bears on Saturday. He ran for a total of 204 yards and two additional scores.

The breakout came after two games that fell below his rushing average last season.

"I haven't been frustrated," he said. "It's going to happen, you know? Eventually it's going to happen."

James' 90-yard dash was Oregon's longest run since 1938. He added a 1-yard TD run in the first quarter and a 50-yarder in the third.

The long one was really the result of the Ducks' offensive line, James insisted, and the path that was cleared by wide receiver Justin Hoffman - who dramatically pushed aside two defenders.

When asked when he knew he was going to score, the speedy running back responded: "When I got into the end zone. Seriously."

James has 45 career touchdowns, matching the school record set by Derek Loville (1986-89).

Darron Thomas threw for 206 yards and three touchdowns for the Ducks (2-1). Lavasier Tuinei caught scoring passes of 8 and 34 yards, and Oregon sat most of its starters early in the second half.

Missouri State (0-3) scored on its first possession. The Bears were efficient in a nine-play, 84-yard drive that was capped by Chris Douglas' 3-yard touchdown run to make it 7-0. By halftime, though, the Ducks were ahead 35-7.

Trevor Wooden completed six of 13 passes for 91 yards, and ran for 67 yards. He said the issue was keeping up with the bigger, stronger and faster Ducks.

"We showed what we could do at the beginning," he said.

It was the Ducks' 18th straight victory at Autzen Stadium.

Saturday's opponent was supposed to be Utah, but that game was changed because of the Pac-12 realignment. Oregon was left scrambling for an opponent, and the Bears stepped in.

Oregon scored twice in the first quarter on James' 1-yard run and Thomas' 8-yard scoring pass to Tuinei.

Oregon freshman De'Anthony Thomas topped 100 all-purpose yards in the first quarter on one punt return, one kickoff return, one run and a reception.

Oregon made it 21-7 on Thomas's 7-yard touchdown pass to freshman Colt Lyerla, on a drive that spanned 93 yards on three plays in 37 seconds.

While that was fast, it couldn't compare to James' 90-yard scoring run a short time later. That drive took all of 13 seconds. The longest run in school history was Bob Smith's 92-yarder against Idaho in 1938.

Thomas' second scoring pass to Tuinei came with 5:33 to go before the half. Thomas matched a school record with six touchdown passes the week before in a 69-20 victory over Nevada.

James opened the second half with a 50-yard scoring run.

The running back had been held to 54 yards in Oregon's season-opening 40-27 loss to then-No. 4 LSU. Then last week against the Wolf Pack he ran for 67 yards, but scored on a run, a reception and a punt return.

James averaged more than 144 yards rushing a game last season. Af-

ter Saturday's performance, he upped his average this season to 108.3 yards.

Oregon backup Bryan Bennett hit Lyerla with a 26-yard TD pass, and Eric Dungy with a 22-yard scoring strike to make it 56-7 in the third quarter after the starters left.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) -- LaMichael James rushed for a school record 288 yards and broke the Oregon mark for career rushing touchdowns with two scores to lead the No. 10 Ducks to a 56-31 victory over Arizona in their Pac-12 opener on Saturday night.

Oregon (3-1), the two-time defending Pac-10 champion, won its 13th consecutive conference game, blowing open a 35-3 lead then holding off a Wildcats' rally before pulling away again with its lightning-quick offense.

All but the last of the Ducks' seven touchdown drives lasted less than three minutes. Darron Thomas passed for two scores and ran for two more.

Nick Foles completed 33 of 55 passes for 391 yards and three touchdowns for the Wildcats (1-3).

Arizona, playing its third consecutive top-10 team, has lost eight of nine dating last year with the lone victory this season's opener against Northern Arizona.

Oregon has the top-ranked offense in the Pac-12. Arizona's defense statistically is the worst. So the results from the opening kickoff were predictable.

James, who also had a 51-yard punt return, averaged 12.2 yards per carry in his second consecutive and fifth career 200-yard rushing game. He broke Oregon's single-game rushing record of 257 yards by Ontario Smith against Washington State in 2001.

With his touchdown runs of 12 and 19 yards, the speedy back has 43 scoring runs, breaking Derek Loville's school record of 42.

The Ducks amassed 516 yards, 415 on the ground.

With his team down 35-3, Foles led the Wildcats to three consecutive touchdowns. His 7-yard pass to David Roberts, and 2-point conversion toss to David Douglas, cut Oregon's lead to 35-24 with 3:14 to go in the third quarter.

But the Ducks simply zipped to another score. James had a 31-yard run and Thomas went the final 5 yards for the touchdown.

Foles got Arizona to the Oregon 6 on the subsequent kickoff, but the drive stalled and on fourth down he was sacked.

The Ducks reeled off five of their trademark lightning-fast touchdown drives, in six possessions, to open a 35-9 lead at the half.

James led the way, rushing for 133 yards in 11 carries in the first two quarters.

Oregon's first-half TD drives went 2:42 (8 plays, 80 yards), 2:19 (10 plays, 72 yards), 2:06 (8 plays, 80 yards), 2:02 (6 plays, 55 yards) and 1:37 (4 plays, 28 yards).

The Ducks amassed 300 yards in the first two quarters, 214 on the ground in 27 attempts.

Thomas had touchdown passes 10 yards to tight end David Paulson, his first scoring catch of the season, and 6 yards to Kenjon Barner, who also ran for a pair of scores.

Of the Ducks' 28 touchdown drives this season, 22 have taken less than three minutes. Another went 3:01.

Foles completed 14 of 29 passes for 189 yards in the first half, with several passes dropped. His 34-yard touchdown pass to Richard Morrison cut the lead to 35-9 with 1:04 to play. But Arizona's kicking woes continued when Alex Zendejas' conversion attempt was blocked.

The Wildcats recovered the subsequent onside kick but the half

ended when Foles was sacked twice and Arizona tackle Shane Zink was called for a personal foul on the final play, the last of eight first-half penalties against the home team.

The stadium was almost full, and the student section was packed at kickoff, but about half of the students and a good share of the rest of the crowd was gone by halftime.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- LaMichael James ran for 239 yards and a touchdown before he was carted off the field after injuring his right arm, dampening

No. 9 Oregon's 43-15 victory over California on Thursday night.

The nation's leading rusher went down early in the fourth quarter and trainers stabilized his arm in a sleeve as fans chanted his name. The Ducks (4-1, 2-0 Pac-12) were driving for their fourth straight touchdown in the second half against the Golden Bears (3-2, 0-2) when he was injured.

True freshman De'Anthony Thomas caught a pair of touchdown passes and ran for another score for the Ducks, who have won four straight since a season-opening loss to LSU.

Giorgio Tavecchio made three field goals - including a career-best 54-yarder - for Cal, which led 15-14 at the half but couldn't sustain its momentum against the country's top scoring offense.

James, a Heisman Trophy finalist last season, has run for at least 200 yards in his last three games, something no Ducks player had done before.

He went into the game with an average of 153 yards rushing per game, best in the nation. He had 166 by halftime against Cal.

The crowd at Autzen Stadium fell silent when James did not get up on the fourth-quarter scoring drive, but he waved to the crowd as he was driven off the field. A short time later, an ambulance with lights flashing pulled up to the stadium.

Cal took a 3-0 lead on Tavecchio's 27-yard field goal on the first series of the game, but James answered with a 53-yard dash for a score and the Ducks looked to be taking off. It was James' third touchdown run of 50 or more yards this season.

Tavecchio added another field goal, this time a 38-yarder, to make it 7-6. A rain storm moved in over Autzen and slowed play a bit, but Oregon extended its lead on Thomas' 17-yard touchdown run late in the first quarter.

Tavecchio's career-long 54-yard field goal cut it to 14-9.

Although it looked as though James might have been injured early in the second quarter when he was slow to get up from a hit and went to the sideline holding the back of his right thigh, he returned and had a 39-yard run, which put him over 4,000 for his career. He's the sixth player in conference history to reach that milestone.

But on the same drive, the Bears stopped Oregon on a fourth down on their own 41. Maynard led an efficient march that was capped by his 12-yard touchdown pass to Kennan Allen that gave the Bears a 15-14 lead.

After the touchdown, fans at Autzen Stadium chanted "We want Cliff!" for All-America cornerback Cliff Harris, who had only played on returns. Harris has been used only selectively by coach Chip Kelly since his return from a suspension for a speeding violation on a suspended license this summer.

Tavecchio attempted a 40-yard field goal before the end of the first half, but it was blocked.

After the half, Oregon quickly regained the lead with Darron Thomas' 23-yard pass to De'Anthony Thomas. The Ducks extended it on Kenjon Barner's 68-yard touchdown run and Darron Thomas completed pass to De'Anthony Thomas for the 2-point conversion.

Darron Thomas hit De'Anthony Thomas again with a 21-yard touch-

down before James was injured on the fourth-quarter drive that was capped by Darron Thomas' 3-yard scoring pass to Lavasier Tuinei.

Darron Thomas completed 13 of 25 passes for 198 yards and three touchdowns.

Maynard finished 20 of 41 for 218 yards and a score.

Cal cornerback Marc Anthony was in street clothes after he appeared to injure his arm in the first half. The Bears would not confirm the injury.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- Darron Thomas threw for 187 yards and two touchdowns before he left with left leg injury and ninth-ranked Oregon

survived his absence with a 41-27 victory over No. 18 Arizona State on Saturday night.

It was the second straight game that the Ducks have lost a key player to injury. Running back LaMichael James dislocated his elbow in Oregon's last outing, a 43-15 win over California.

Kenjon Barner, who started in place of James, ran for 171 yards and a touchdown, while freshman De'Anthony Thomas ran for 73 yards and two scores for Oregon (5-1, 3-0 Pac-12).

Brock Osweiler threw for 291 yards and two scores for the Sun Devils (5-2, 3-1), who have lost seven straight to the Ducks.

It was Oregon's 20th straight victory at Autzen Stadium, as well as the Ducks' 15th straight victory over a conference foe.

There was speculation that James might try to play, but he took the field in sweats. The nation's leading rusher hurt his right elbow against Cal on Oct. 6, but this week wouldn't rule himself out against the Sun Devils.

Without James, Oregon had a tough time getting its vaunted running game going against the Sun Devils in the first half, but the Ducks would end up with 327 rushing yards - 269 in the second half.

On the first series of the game, Barner's fumble was recovered to by the Sun Devils, who went on to take the early lead with Osweiler's 20-yard touchdown pass to Gerell Robinson.

Oregon tied it midway through the first quarter when De'Anthony Thomas ran a pitch from Darron Thomas 16 yards for a touchdown.

The Sun Devils went up 14-7 on Osweiler's 26-yard pass to Mike Willie. It looked like Oregon had evened it again when Barner broke away with a 59-yard scoring run, but the TD was called back because of an illegal blocking call.

The Ducks did pull even on Darron Thomas' 28-yard touchdown pass to Lavasier Tuinei. The junior quarterback, who had just connected with Josh Huff on a 45-yard pass, was on the run and looked almost as if he were throwing the ball away - but he caught Tuinei streaking across the back of the end zone.

Linebacker Shelly Lyons intercepted Thomas on the 41-yard line and ran it back to the Oregon 20, putting the Sun Devils in position to score again - but they settled Alex Garoutte's 47-yard field goal to pull back in front 17-14.

It was the 11th interception for Arizona State this season, surpassing last season's total.

Oregon answered when Cliff Harris, who was suspended to start the season after he was cited for speeding on a suspended license this summer, intercepted Osweiler and ran back 50 yards. The Ducks went on to score on Darron Thomas' 16-yard pass to David Paulson and take a 21-17 lead into halftime.

Arizona State retook the lead early in the second half on Cameron Marshall's 4-yard scoring run. But just a few plays later, Sun Devils linebacker Colin Parker fell on Thomas' legs, and the Oregon QB did not get up.

Darron Thomas grimaced as he was attended to by team trainers, but he got up and jogged off the field. He received further treatment on the sidelines before limping off to the locker room.

He was replaced by backup Bryan Bennett, who led the Ducks on a scoring drive that ended with De'Anthony Thomas' 3-yard touchdown run.

The Ducks extended their lead to 35-24 on Barner's 7-yard scoring run. Alejandro Maldonado had a 37-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter.

After Garoutte added a 30-yard field goal for the Sun Devils, Maldonado came back with a 24-yarder for the Ducks to make it 41-27.

The announced crowd was 60,055, the largest ever at Autzen Stadium.
