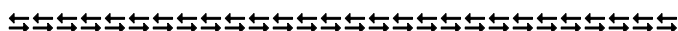

QUICKLY Oregon now leads the series by a 9-8 count (2-3 in Eugene) ... CU has lost **10** in row against ranked teams (last win: 34-30 over Kansas in 2009) and have lost **20** straight road games against ranked opponents (last win coming in the Los Angeles area, a 31-17 over UCLA at the Rose Bowl in 2002) ... The Buffs are **4-16** all-time against teams ranked No. 2 (**2-16** versus AP's second banana and another **2-0** versus the UPI/coach's second best) ... Colorado is now **2-6** all-time in the Beaver State, both wins at Autzen, 13-6 in 1955 and 17-13 in 1967, the first game ever played in Autzen ... This was the second of back-to-back Pac-12 games on the road, the third time the Buffs have that task in its second year in the league (**0-2-1** to date: last year, CU lost at Stanford and a week later at Washington, and later in the year lost at UCLA and bounced back with a win at Utah) ... The **56-0** deficit at halftime matched the worst known one in CU history (56-0 at UCLA on Sept. 13, 1980) ... The fourth quarter was scoreless, ending the opponents run of scoring in a record **24** straight quarters against the Buffs (old mark was 21 in 1980) ... This is the first time CU has allowed **50** or more points in three consecutive games; the last time the Buffs allowed **70** was on Dec. 3, 2005, in a 70-3 loss to Texas in the Big 12 Championship game in Houston ...

The last punt return touchdown against Colorado prior to today (De'Anthony Thomas, 73 yards) was by Nebraska's **Niles Paul** in Boulder on Nov. 27, 2009 (59 yards) ... CU had **65** players dress for today's game; **60** played... At 3 hours, 1 minute, this was CU's fastest game of the season (previous was 3:11 vs. UCLA).

Today's game featured the 2012 Pac-12 Cross Country champions, as earlier in the day in Santa Clarita, Calif., **Colorado** (men) and **Oregon** (women) were crowned the league first champions for the 2012-13 school year. CU had won both in 2011.



TB CHRISTIAN POWELL (20-121, 2 TD) He had the second 100 100-yard season/career rushing game, and in the process vaulted into __ place at CU for all time frosh rushing. It was the 23rd 100-yard game by a CU freshman (14th most yards).

INDIVIDUAL LINER NOTES

► **DE Will Pericak** started his 45th straight game today (every game of his career, dating back to his first in the '09 opener). That breaks the old mark of consecutive starts on offense or defense (44, **C Bryan Stoltenberg**, 1992-95). He has now tied **ILB Jordon Dizon** (2004-07) for the most starts by a defensive player in CU history; the most starts overall is 47 (**OL Ryan Miller**, 2007-11).

—He forced two fumbles today, giving him four on the season; that's the most since 2000, when **SS Michael Lewis** also had four and the most by defensive lineman since 1990, when **NT Garry Howe** had four.

► **OL Ryan Dannewitz** made his first start of the season. Subbing at left tackle for OT David Bakhtiari, who tweaked a knee in practice this week (Tues.); he tried to go but couldn't.

► **DB Tommy Papilion** (junior) saw his first action as a Buffalo, appearing on the punt return unit on special teams.
