THE SERIES

- •Oregon leads the all-time series 9-8 and has won three straight against the Buffaloes.
- •The two teams have split the eight games played in Boulder.
- •UO is 2-0 vs. CU as Pac-12 opponents, winning 70-14 in Eugene last year and 45-2 at Folsom Field in 2011.

QUICK HITS

- •SO QB **Marcus Mariota** has thrown at least one touchdown pass in every game of his career (17) and has a streak of six straight games with TDs rushing and passing.
- •Mariota has a 16-1 record as a starter, including a 7-0 mark away from Autzen Stadium. Due in part to large leads, he has only played four complete games (Fresno State, USC, Stanford and Kansas State all in 2012).
- •Oregon is tied for the national lead with two punt returns for touchdowns both by SO WR **Bralon Addison** and has more such scores (10) than any other team since the start of 2010.
- •The Ducks have had six 100-yard rushing performances through four games this season: Two apiece by Mariota, SO RB **Byron Marshall** and JR RB **De'Anthony Thomas**.
- •Mariota leads the nation in rushing average at 14.1 yards per attempt.
- •FR RB **Thomas Tyner** has run for at least one touchdown in all three games he's played.
- •The UO offense is tied for the national lead in plays of 20+ yards (39) while the Ducks' defense has allowed the fewest (4).
- •JR DE **Tony Washington** is tied for third in the nation with three forced fumbles.
- •UO's 33 touchdowns in four games is as many or more than 28 FBS teams had all of last season.
- •Oregon, Clemson and New Mexico are the only teams yet to throw an interception this season..
- •26 of Oregon's 31 offensive touchdown drives (83.9%) have lasted less than two minutes.
- •The Ducks have scored 50 or more points in four straight games for the first time in history.

HEAD COACH MARK HELFRICH

Mark Helfrich is in his first season as Oregon's head coach after serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2009-12. During that span, he was directly involved in the success of a program that constructed a 46-7 record and appeared in four consecutive BCS bowl games, including the 2011 BCS National Championship game. Helfrich began his coaching career as a graduate assistant with the Ducks in 1997 and has since accumulated seven seasons as an offensive coordinator at two BCS schools and 15 years coaching quarterbacks. He was named Oregon's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach on April 30, 2009 following three seasons in the same capacity at the University of Colorado (2006-08), five years as quarterbacks coach at Arizona State (2001-05) which included his final three campaigns in Tempe, Ariz., as passing game coordinator, and three seasons as quarterbacks coach at Boise State (1998-2000). Along the way, Helfrich was named National Quarterbacks Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2012 by FootballScoop, in addition to being one of three finalists as its national offensive coordinator of the year honor. Over the course of his last 13 seasons, Helfrich has played a role with offenses that have ranked among the nation's top-eight teams in scoring offense six times, the top six in rushing on four occasions, the top five in total offense four times as well as the top five in passing twice. As Oregon's OC he helped orchestrate attacks that were responsible for the top three total offense outputs in school history (2010-12) - including a school-record 7,319 yards in 2011 - as well as the only teams to account for more than 600 points in each of the last three seasons. Helfrich is the first native Oregonian to head the university's football program since John Warren in 1942.

RETURN MEN

The 2013 Oregon Ducks return 56 letterwinners, including 16 starters - nine on offense and seven on defense - from last season. By contrast, the 2012 squad, which finished the season ranked No. 2 nationally, had 52 returning lettermen and 12 starters, including only five on offense.

FIRST TIMERS

Four true freshmen saw action in the season-opener vs. Nicholls: OL Cameron Hunt, TE Johnny Mundt, DE Torrodney Prevot and K Matt Wogan. Joining that quartet in Week 2 was LB Tyrell Robinson and RB Thomas Tyner.

SUPER MARIOTA

As the Ducks continue their quest for a fifth straight BCS bowl game appearance, all eyes are on second-year starting quarterback **Marcus Mariota**. The redshirt sophomore from Honolulu has the challenge of following up a campaign that saw him set the Pac-12 freshman record for touchdown passes (32) and lead the conference in passing efficiency (seventh nationally) en route to Pac-12 Offensive Freshman of the Year and All-Pac-12 first team QB honors. Through the first four games of the season, he has totalled 1,003 yards passing and 295 rushing with 14 total touchdowns (9 pass, 5 rush) and sans an interception. Considered by many national outlets as a Heisman Trophy candidate, Mariota is on four prestigious watch lists: Davey O'Brien Award (national quarterback award), Maxwell Award (most outstanding player), Walter Camp Award (most outstanding player) and Manning Award (top quarterback honor, including bowl game).

ANOTHER GAME, ANOTHER TOUCHDOWN

Marcus Mariota continued his streak of touchdown passes in a game with two TD tosses in Oregon's 55-16 win over California on Sept. 28. The sophomore has thrown at least one touchdown pass in all 17 games of his career with a total of 41 touchdowns. Mariota, who has nine touchdown passes this season, has thrown for two or more TDs in a game 11 times with a career-high six touchdown passes at California as a freshman. He also has thrown four touchdowns in a game four times. Mariota's 17-game touchdown pass streak is tied for third in the nation behind Fresno State's **Derek Carr** and Marshall's **Rakeem Cato**.

BRALON BREAKS OUT

SO WR Bralon Addison, who took over as the Ducks' primary punt returner at the end of last season, tied the Oregon and Pac-12 records for punt return touchdowns in a game, bringing back two (75 and 67 yards) in the Sept. 28 win vs. Cal. He joins Cliff Harris as the only other player in school history to duplicate that feat (vs. New Mexico in 2010), while they join USC's Mike Garrett (1965 vs. California) and UCLA's **Sam Brown** (1954 vs. Stanford) as co-holders of the league record. Addison's punt return total of 142 vards was the most by any Oregon player in one game since Keenon Howry's school-record 186 yards vs. Stanford in 2001. The Missouri City, Texas standout currently leads the country in punt returns, averaging 36.5 yards on six returns

MARSHALL PLAN

With top rusher JR RB **De'Anthony Thomas** sidelined after the opening kickoff vs. Cal, SO RB **Byron Marshall** took over as Oregon's backfield workhorse and put up career highs of 130 yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries. The playing time was hardly new to Marshall, who has started three of four games this season and amassed 326 yards and four scores on a team-high 48 attempts.

HERE'S JOHNNY

Tight end **Johnny Mundt** made quite a debut catching passes in Oregon's win vs. Tennessee Sept. 14. With JR TE **Colt Lyerla** out of action, the true freshman made his first start, recorded the first five receptions of his career, including a pair of touchdowns, while amassing 121 yards. That yardage total ranks as the ninthmost in a single game by a tight end at UO and is the highest total since **Ed Dickson** had 148 yards on 11 catches vs. Cal in 2009. Mundt was named the John Mackey Award's national tight end of the week.

OREGON 5-0

The Ducks have eclipsed 50 points in all four games this season, ranking second nationally in scoring average at 59.8 points per game. UO's streak of four straight games with at least 50 points is the first in school history.

MATHIS MAKES THE RECORD BOOK

JR CB **Dior Mathis**, also a member of the UO track & field team, put that track speed on display at Virginia Sept. 7, when he intercepted a pass deep in the end zone and ran more than 100 yards before getting knocked out at the UVa 3-yard-line. Officially, the third pick of his career went in the books as a 97-yard return, tying **Kenny Wheaton** (vs. UW in 1994) and **Kenny Bryant** (at TCU in 1977) for the secondlongest in school history. It was the longest non-touchdown interception return by a Duck.

PLAYMAKING DEFENSE

The Oregon blur offense may generate the most buzz among college football fans and media, but the UO defense has made more game-changing plays than any other defensive unit in the country since the start of 2012. The Ducks led the nation with 40 takeaways (25 interceptions, 15 fumble recoveries) a year ago - 32 by current players - and already have 12 (4 INT/8 FR) in 2013.

COACHING CONTINUITY

An often overlooked facet of Oregon's run of success has been the continuity of its coaching staff. First-year head coach Mark Helfrich is in his fifth season on staff, but he is supported by several assistants who have served the last three UO head coaches. Running backs coach Gary Campbell is in his 31st year on the Oregon staff, which is the longest tenure of any Oregon assistant football coach in school history. In addition, offensive line coach and running game coordinator Steve Greatwood enters his 27th season at UO, linebackers coach Don Pellum is in his 21st campaign, while defensive coordinator Nick Aliotti has spent 21 full seasons at Oregon over three separate stints.

HOUSE OF LOUD

With a standing room only crowd of 56,987 at Autzen Stadium on Sept. 28 vs. California, the Ducks ran the nation's third-longest sellout streak to 92 consecutive games (cap. 54,000), dating to 1999.

RECORD RUNNERS

The Ducks' current roster features three players who have etched their names on a prestigious rushing list. SO QB **Marcus Mariota**, JR RB **De'Anthony Thomas** and SR WR **Josh Huff** own three of the longest runs in school history. Thomas' 91-yard touchdown run in the 2012 Rose Bowl Game is the second-longest at Oregon, Mariota ranks fifth with his 86-yard score at ASU - the longest rush in the Pac-12 during the 2012 season - and Huff is tied for sixth with an 85-yard TD vs. Arizona in 2010.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Since 2000, Oregon is 37-6 (.860) in regular season, out-of-conference games, earning notable victories against the likes of Oklahoma, Wisconsin and Michigan (x2). During that stretch, the Ducks are 4-1 against the SEC, 1-0 vs. the ACC, 5-2 vs. the Big Ten, 1-1 vs. the Big 12, 4-0 against the Mountain West, 12-2 vs. the WAC, 2-0 against Conference USA and 7-0 vs. FCS sides.

RUNNING WILD

After 100-yard rushing performances the first two weeks of the season, SO QB **Marcus Mariota** became the first Oregon signal caller to accomplish the feat in back-to-back games. Mariota leads the nation in average yards per rush (14.05), while ranking 70 th in average yards per game (73.75).

SCOREGON

The Ducks have scored a program-best 645 points in each of the past two seasons, finishing second nationally in 2012 (49.6 points per game) and third in 2011 (46.1). Last year's team set the UO bar for touchdowns with 89, despite playing one less game than the 2011 team, which found the end zone 88 times. This season, Oregon has 33 TDs and 239 points, which is the most by any team that has played four games. UO has at least eight TDs in every game this season (9-8-8-8).

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- Marcus Mariota threw for two touchdowns and ran for another and No. 2 Oregon defeated California 55-16 on Saturday night in

the rain-drenched Pac-12 opener for both teams.

Bralon Addison returned two punts for touchdowns and Byron Marshall ran for 130 yards and two more scores for the Ducks (4-0, 1-0).

The game was played as a strong storm swept across the Pacific Northwest, cutting power to more than 26,500 customers in Oregon. It was a sloppy mess on the field, with eight fumbles - four for each team - in the first half alone. The Ducks handled the soggy conditions better, building a 41-3 halftime lead.

The driving wind and rain all but shut down the `Bear Raid" offense that new head coach Sonny Dykes has installed at Cal (1-3, 0-1).

Cal freshman quarterback Jared Goff went into the game as the national leader with an average of 435.3 yards passing a game. He completed just 3 of 6 passes for 11 yards in the first quarter before he was replaced with backup Zach Kline. It was unclear if Goff, who was making his first start on the road, was hurt.

Mariota, whose name is mentioned as an early Heisman Trophy candidate, completed 11 of 24 passes for 114 yards and ran for another 33 yards before coach Mark Helfrich sat him during the third quarter.

Oregon opened the game with Marshall's 14-yard scoring run. Mariota threw two touchdown passes, a 19-yarder to Josh Huff and a 14-yarder to Daryle Hawkins before Marshall ran for a 25-yard score to make it

But the start of the game was also costly for Oregon. Running back De'Anthony Thomas was hurt while returning the opening kickoff. He grasped his lower right leg and had to be helped off the field. He reappeared after the half on crutches, but because Oregon does not discuss injuries as a policy it is unclear how serious it is.

The speedy junior leads the Ducks with 338 yards rushing and six touchdowns. He has 485 all-purpose yards through Oregon's first three games.

Mariota ran 2 yards to score in the second quarter before Addison's 75-yard punt return for a touchdown. Cal finally got on the board as time ran out with Vincenzo D'Amato's 46-yard field goal.

Addison's 67-yard punt return for a score early in the second quarter made is 48-3. The only other Duck with two punt returns for touchdowns in a game was Cliff Harris against New Mexico in 2010.

Thomas Tyner ran for a 21-yard touchdown for the Ducks before Jeffrey Coprich pushed in a yard for a TD for Cal to make it 55-10. Kline hit James Grisom with a 7-yard scoring pass for the final margin.

Both teams were coming of bye weeks.

The Bears' last outing was a 52-34 loss to No. 4 Ohio State on Sept 14. The Ducks are the third ranked opponent that Cal has faced; the team also lost to then-No. 22 Northwestern in the season opener. All three teams are undefeated.

Oregon put up easy nonconference victories over Nicholls State, Virginia and Tennessee. The Ducks have averaged 61.3 points per game, ranked second nationally, while allowing opponents just 9 points a game.

Cal hung close with Oregon for a good part of their last meeting, trailing just 24-17 midway through the 3rd quarter last year. But Mariota led the then-No. 3 Ducks on a 35-0 run for a 59-17 victory in Straw-

berry Canyon. He matched a school record with six touchdown passes in that game.

TENNESSEE 14 #2 OREGON 59

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- Marcus Mariota threw for a career-high 456 yards and four touchdowns and No. 2 Oregon handed Tennessee its first loss of the

season, 59-14 on Saturday.

Freshman Johnny Mundt, who replaced ailing tight end Colt Lyerla, had five catches for 121 yards and two TDs for the Ducks (3-0). Josh Huff added six catches for 125 yards and a score.

Mariota, who completed 23 of 33 passes, was the first Oregon quarterback to throw for more than 400 yards in a game since Kellen Clemens in 2005. The sophomore quarterback's yardage ties for the third-most in a game in school history.

Oregon's sloppy play at the start - four penalties for 35 yards in the first quarter - helped Tennessee (2-1) take an early lead, but it was fleeting and the Ducks led 38-7 at halftime.

Justin Worley completed 13 of 25 passes for 127 yards and a touch-down for the Volunteers, who opened the season with easy home wins over Austin Peay and Western Kentucky. But Tennessee could not keep up with the speedy Ducks, who had 687 yards in total offense compared to 316 for the Vols.

Oregon was the first of a tough stretch for the Volunteers and firstyear coach Butch Jones: No. 18 Florida, No. 9 Georgia, No. 13 South Carolina and No. 1 Alabama are among Tennessee's next five opponents.

Oregon's first chance to score was Alejandro Maldonado's 37-yard field goal attempt, which went wide left. On the next series Tennessee drove 80 yards in six plays and scored on Worley's 4-yard touchdown pass to Jason Croom.

After Mariota's 19-yard run got the Ducks to the Tennessee 9-yard line, a fumble and a sack pushed Oregon back to the 15. De'Anthony Thomas appeared to have a 4-yard touchdown catch on fourth down, but it was called back because of pass interference on Oregon and the Ducks settled for a 38-yard field goal by Matt Wogan.

Oregon pulled in front 10-7 before the first quarter ended with Mariota's 16-yard pass to Mundt. Lyerla was a surprise absence, apparently because of a stomach virus.

Mariota's 9-yard touchdown run extended the lead. During the game, the sophomore became just the fourth quarterback in Oregon history to rush for more 1,000 yards in his career.

Huff was on the run when Mariota hit him and he ran untouched for a 54-yard scoring reception. Oregon went up 31-7 on Mariota's 45-yard touchdown pass to Daryle Hawkins.

Jones pursed his lips on Tennessee's sideline while the Ducks' student section taunted with chants of ``S-E-C, S-E-C!" and ``We want `Bama!"

Thomas added a 28-yard scoring run for the Ducks before halftime. Tennessee defensive lineman Trevarris Saulsberry was helped from the field following the TD, but it was unclear how he was hurt.

Mariota had collected 350 passing yards by the break. He easily extended his string of at least one touchdown in all of his 16 games for Oregon. The streak is third among active quarterbacks.

Mariota found Mundt with a 17-yard scoring pass early in the second half. Mundt was the first Oregon tight end with at least 100 yards receiving since Ed Dickson in 2009.

Byron Marshall ran 11 yards for a touchdown to make it 52-7 and Oregon pulled most of its starters on the next series. Freshman Thomas Tyner ran for a 2-yard score to close out the third quarter.

Alden Hill's 8-yard touchdown run for Tennessee provided the final margin.

#2 OREGON 59 VIRGINIA 10

Charlottesville, VA (58,502) Scott Stadium 79 degrees, mostly sunny

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. (AP) -- Marcus Mariota and No. 2 Oregon wasted no time showing Virginia all that speed the Ducks bring is more than just talk.

Mariota ran 71 yards for a touchdown on the Ducks' sixth play from scrimmage, turning a third-and-5 that had the crowd jacked up for a defensive stop into a demoralizing introduction into what Oregon football is all about.

"They came out in a man-free look and they all kind of ran with their guy and I just kind of hit it up the middle," Mariota said of the play, on which he flared five receivers out, then ran a draw. He was virtually untouched on the play.

"The guys did a good job blocking and the receivers did a good job blocking downfield," he said.

Mariota finished with 122 yards on four carries, and threw two touchdown passes. De'Anthony Thomas added three touchdown runs, and the Ducks piled up 557 yards of offense in their first trip to Charlottes-ville on the way to a 59-10 victory that looked frighteningly easy.

Thomas ran for 124 yards on just 11 carries, and the Ducks (2-0), who gained a school-record 772 yards last week in beating Nicholls State, looked capable of doing it again against a Virginia defense that hoped to keep the Cavaliers in the game. Oregon's up-tempo offense did all its damage while possessing the ball for just 21:25.

As always, Thomas said, their opponents faces' told the story.

"That's the funny part. For the first couple plays, they're out there talking, and as the game goes by, guys are just slowing down and you can see by their body language and stuff, and that's when we know we got'em," the fleet junior said.

Virginia (1-1) came into the game riding a high after a comeback victory last week against BYU, the first since coach Mike London hired new offensive, defensive and special teams coordinators. Defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta's unit, especially, seemed confident it would be able to slow the Ducks down, but Mariota provided a very early look at what it was up against.

"We knew they are fast and athletic," London said. "We tried to practice the pace, but it's hard to practice for that type of athleticism that they have. It is always a challenge when you face an offense like that."

The victory was the Ducks' 16th in a row on their opponent's field, the longest streak in the country.

Mariota finished 14 of 28 for 199 yards with touchdowns of 30 yards to Bralon Addison and 11 to Keanon Lowe.

The Cavaliers trailed 21-0 after 10:32 and never were able to sustain anything on offense. David Watford was 29 for 41 for 161 yards, but threw three interceptions and fumbled once, and all four turnovers led to Oregon touchdowns.

Virginia's lone touchdown came on a 45-yard run by Khalek Shepherd.

After Mariota's long run, the teams exchanged punts, and when the Cavaliers Alec Vozenilek punted again from his 14, Josh Huff deflected the ball out of bounds at the Cavaliers' 14. Three plays later, Thomas went through the line from a yard out for the touchdown, and it was 14-0 after 7:45.

The Cavaliers got their first two first downs of the game on the next series before Watford rolled right, threw downfield on the run and the ball glanced off Dominique Terrell's hands into the arms of Terrance Mitchell, who returned the interception 16 yards to the Virginia 40. On the next play, Thomas went around the right side and down the sideline, tight-roping the line for a touchdown, and it was 21-0.

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) - Marcus Mariota threw a touchdown pass and ran for two additional scores and the No. 3 Oregon Ducks made easy work of lower-

tier Nicholls with a 66-3 victory in the season opener on Saturday.

Mariota, who set an Oregon record with 38 touchdowns last season as a redshirt freshman, completed 12 of 21 passes for 234 yards before sitting after the third quarter when the Ducks had built a 45-3 lead.

Mariota also ran for 113 yards for his second career game with more than 100 yards rushing.

De'Anthony Thomas ran for 128 yards and two more touchdowns for Oregon in the debut of new head coach Mark Helfrich.

Nicholls' score came on Andrew Dolan's 35-yard field goal in the second quarter.

Quarterback Beaux Hebert made his first start for the Colonels, but was hit hard by Oregon cornerback Terrance Mitchell late in the first quarter and left the game. Mitchell was flagged for targeting and ejected.

The Ducks were only barely challenged by Nicholls, a Southland Conference program from Louisiana which has won just one game in each of the past two seasons. The Colonels had never played a team ranked in the top five.

On its first drive Oregon scored on a 4-yard run by Thomas. On its next, Mariota found Bralon Addison with a 27-yard scoring pass to make it 14-0.

Thomas added a 22-yard scoring run with 6:28 left in the first quarter and Alejandro Maldonado kicked a 29-yard field goal to make it 24-0.

Mitchell was ejected when he hit Hebert, who was sliding on the turf, and the replay showed helmet-to-helmet contact.

Under a new NCAA rule this season, players who ``target" and contact defenseless players will receive a 15-yard penalty and be ejected.

Hebert, the son of former New Orleans Saints quarterback Bobby Hebert, did not return after the hit and was replaced by junior Kalen Henderson, a transfer from Tulsa.

Hebert, making his first career start, completed four of 10 passes for 42 yards before he left the game.

Mariota ran for a pair of touchdowns, the first from 12 yards and the second from 46, to put the Ducks up 38-3 at the half.

The sophomore quarterback, who was on several Heisman watch lists going into the season, was selected to the Pac-12 first team last season and earned conference Freshman of the Year honors.

Byron Marshall ran for a 49-yard touchdown for the only third-quarter score, and Oregon blocked Dolan's 42-yard field-goal attempt early in the fourth

Colt Lyerla scored on a 3-yard run and quarterback Jeff Lockie - who took over for Mariota in the fourth quarter - added an 8-yard TD run before he was subbed out for quarterback Jake Rodrigues, who found Chance Allen in the end zone with a 23-yard pass for the final margin.

Thomas also sat out the final quarter. Last season, he ran for 701 yards and 11 touchdowns and caught 45 passes for 445 yards and five more scores. He also scored on a kickoff return and a punt return, becoming the first Oregon player in 47 years with a touchdown four different ways.

Marshall finished with 124 yards rushing, giving Oregon its first game to feature three players with more than 100 yards rushing.
