AIR FORCE

SENIOR, RUNNING BACK, 5-8, 190

LAWRENCEVILLE, GA./PEACHTREE RIDGE

Clark rushed for a career-high 169 yards on just 15 carries and scored a touchdown on a career-long 67-yard run in a home win against UNLV. He averaged 11.3 yards per carry. Clark's 67-yard run came in the final three minutes of the first half and extended Air Force's lead to 21-10. Seven of his carries went for a first down or a touchdown in the game. Clark moved into second place on the Air Force career rushing list and now has 3,469 career yards. His 100-yard game was his third this season and 10th of his career.

2011-2012 NFFCC News & Notes

ADAMS STATE COLLEGE (6-5, 4-5 RMAC)

Team Notes: Adams State concluded their season Nov. 12 with a 6-5 overall record and a 4-5 mark in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (4-7, 3-6 RMAC)

Team Notes: Colorado Mesa concluded their season Nov. 12 with a 4-7 overall record and a 3-6 mark in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (8-3, 6-3 RMAC)

Team Notes: Colorado Mines concluded their season Nov. 12 with an 8-3 overall record and a 6-3 mark in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (3-7, 1-4 MWC)

Team Notes: Colorado State fell to TCU, 34-10. They will Saturday at home against Air Force before wrapping up their regular season Dec. 3 at home against Wyoming.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY-PUEBLO (11-0, 9-0 RMAC)

Team Notes: CSU-Pueblo finished the regular season with a perfect 11-0 record (9-0 Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference). They are ranked No. 1 in the country according to the AFCA poll, and will host Minnesota-Duluth Saturday at 12 p.m. in the NCAA Second Round.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (3-8, 2-7 RMAC)

Team Notes: Fort Lewis concluded their season Nov. 12 with a 3-8 overall record and a 2-7 mark in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY (6-5, 2-4 MWC)

Asher Clark (Senior, Running Back, 5-8, 190, Lawrenceville, Ga./Peachtree Ridge)

Clark rushed for a career-high 169 yards on just 15 carries and scored a touchdown on a career-long 67-yard run in a home win against UNLV. He averaged 11.3 yards per carry. Clark's 67-yard run came in the final three minutes of the first half and extended Air Force's lead to 21-10. Seven of his carries went for a first down or a touchdown in the game. Clark moved into second place on the Air Force career rushing list and now has 3,469 career yards. His 100-yard game was his third this season and 10th of his career.

Team Notes: AFA scored on its opening drive on Saturday, the sixth time this season AFA has scored on the opening drive. It is the first time in three games AFA has scored on its first drive. Air Force has scored in a school-record 231 consecutive games dating back to 1992. The streak is the fourth longest active streak in the nation and the 13th longest in NCAA history. Air Force has scored a rushing touchdown in 32 consecutive games dating back to Navy on Oct. 3, 2009. In 11 games this season, the opponent has not scored a point on the opening drive of the second half this season. The Falcons have forced nine punts and two interceptions. Air Force improves to 13-4 all-time vs. UNLV and has won four straight and eight of the last nine in the series. The Falcons are now 7-1 at home vs. UNLV. The Air Force senior class improves to 31-19 overall and 17-13 in conference play. Air Force head coach Troy Calhoun improves to 40-23 overall and 23-15 in Mountain West Conference games. Calhoun is 23-8 in Falcon Stadium, including a 4-3 mark this season. Air Force improves to 21-10 under head coach Troy Calhoun during the second half of the season (last six games) dating back to 2007, including a 3-2 mark this season. The Falcons improved to 12-4 overall under Calhoun in the month of November, including a 2-1 mark this season.

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (2-10, 1-7 Pac 12)

Team Notes: UCLA now lead the series 4-3 (2-2 in Los Angeles/Pasadena), snapping a two-game CU win streak. The Buffs are now 2-13-1 all-time in the state of California, dropping both two appearances this year (lost 48-7 at Stanford on Oct. 8), the first time CU played in the state twice in the same season; Colorado will travel here twice in 2012, with games at Fresno State and USC. It was CU's 23rd straight road loss (17 in league games), dating back to its last win in 2007 (at Texas Tech). The Buffs drop to 50-11 dating back to 1985 against unranked opponents in November. Colorado wore black helmets for just the third time in its history, the first time on the road, thus the inaugural black-white-black look from head-to-toe (these particular black helmets debuted for the USC game back on Nov. 4). The last time CU played in a game with the Goodyear (or any) blimp overhead was in 2002 (against UCLA at the Rose Bowl). UCLA gained 160 of its 260 first half yards on second down, when it converted 7-of-11 times for first downs (including 6-of-9 times on 2nd-&-5 or longer). Colorado now has at least one quarterback sack in 42 of the last 44 games. UCLA's 339 rushing yards marked the second time the opponent topped 300 this season (Oregon, 371). CU will close a regular season with two road games for the first time since 1989 next week at Utah.

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO (0-11, 0-8 BSC)

Team Notes: The Golden Bears concluded their season Nov. 12 with an 0-11 overall record and a 0-8 mark in the Big Sky Conference.

WESTERN STATE COLLEGE (1-10, 1-8 RMAC)

Team Notes: Western State concluded their season Nov. 12 with a 1-10 overall record and a 1-8 mark in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.
