TWO MINUTE DRILL

> Utah (7-4, 4-4 Pac-12) hosts Colorado (2-10, 1-7 Pac-12) in the "Rumble in the Rockies" on Friday, Nov. 25 in Salt Lake City. Kickoff is 1:30 p.m. MT in Rice-Eccles Stadium. A few hundred tickets still remain and can be purchased at 801-581-UTIX, UtahUtes.com and at Rice-Eccles Stadium. The game will be televised on ROOT Sports. Radio is ESPN700 AM (espn700sports.com), SIRIUS 92 and XM 190.

> Utah, which has won four straight games and five of its last six, is still in the hunt for the Pac-12 South Division title and a berth in the inaugural Pac-12 Championship game on Dec. 2. For the Utes to play in the title game against either Oregon or Stanford they must beat Colorado this week, and Arizona State (vs. Cal) and UCLA (vs. USC) must both lose.

> New Pac-12 rivals Utah and Colorado have coined their rivalry game the "Rumble in the Rockies." The name was chosen with fan input from both schools.

> Friday marks the final home game for 18 Utah seniors who will be honored in a pre-game ceremony. See "Senior Moment" for more.

> Utah is bowl eligible for the ninth-consecutive season, including all seven years under head coach **Kyle Whittingham**. It will be the 10th bowl game in 11 years for the Utes.

> The Buffs lead the series 30-24-3 with Utah ahead 14-13-2 in Salt Lake City. Once heated rivals, these two teams played in football all but four seasons from 1903-1962 but have not played since. Utah's 57 games against CU is its most against a Pac-12 school and the fifth-longest series in school history. For complete series history, see page 2.

> The last time Utah played a team other than Brigham Young in its regular season finale was in 2001, when the Utes finished their season with a make-up game at Air Force on Dec. 1. Utah was scheduled to play Air Force on Sept. 15 that season, but the game was rescheduled due to the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks.

UTAH-COLORADO SERIES

Series Snapshot

From 1903-1962, these two teams met every year but four (1909, 1918, 1959, 1960) before the rivalry came to a halt. Still, Utah's 57 games against Colorado is its most against a Pac-12 school and ranks fifth in school history. Utah trails Colorado 30-24-3 overall but leads 14-13-2 in Salt Lake City. The last two games went to Utah (1961, 1962). In 1961, Utah pulled off the biggest upset in the series, beating No. 8 Colorado in Boulder, 21-12. It was the Buffs' only regular season loss and they went on to win the Big 8 title and play in the Orange Bowl.

SENIOR MOMENT

The 2011 senior class has a 40-10 record, which is tied for the second-most wins by a senior class (with the 2009 class) in school history. The school record is 41 set last year. The 2011 seniors will play in their fourth bowl game this season and their 2-1 bowl record includes a victory over No. 4-ranked Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl (2008 season). Honored in a pre-game ceremony Friday will be **James Aiono**, DT; **Shawn Asiata**, FB; **Tony Bergstrom**, OL; **Greg Bird**, DB; **Conroy Black**, DB; **John Cullen**, OL; **Tevita Finau**, DL; **Nai Fotu**, DE; **Kenny Golladay**, K; **Matt Martinez**, LB; **Dexter Ransom**, WR; **Mychal Robinson**, RB; **Derrick Shelby**, DE; **Ben Soliven**, DB; **Tauni Vakapuna**, RB; **Chaz Walker**, LB; **Tyler Whittingham**, DB and **J.J. Williams**, LB. Seniors who came as freshmen and have played their entire college careers at Utah are **Bergstrom**, **Bird**, **Fotu**, **Martinez**, **Robinson**, **Shelby**, **Walker** and **Williams**.

INSIDE THE HUDDLE

Doubtful for this week is linebacker **Jacoby Hale** (concussion) ... True freshman defensive end **Nate Fakahafua** has moved into the two deep at stud linebacker, where there is a greater need for him this season than at end. Utah has lost two linebackers for the season to injuries: **J.J. Williams** (foot) and **Boo Andersen** (knee), while **Brian Blechen** moved from linebacker to safety when **Keith McGill** (shoulder) was lost for the year ... Utah has lost eight players to season-ending injuries: starting quarterback **Jordan Wynn** (shoulder surgery Oct. 20), co-starting fullback/tight end **Dallin Rogers** (knee surgery Oct. 24), co-starting safety **McGill** (shoulder surgery Oct. 20), co-starting offensive guard **Latu Heimuli** (foot surgery Nov. 4), starting punt returner **Charles Henderson** (knee surgery Oct. 10) and frequently-used backup linebackers **Andersen** (knee surgery Oct. 31) and **Williams** (foot surgery Nov. 4) ... Utah has played five true freshmen this season: safety **Eric Rowe**, defensive end/linebacker **Fakahafua**, running back **Harvey Langi**, receiver/punt returner **Henderson** and receiver **Quinton Pedroza**.

IN THE CROWD

Utah has sold out 11-consecutive games and is averaging 45,174 spectators a game in 45,017-seat Rice-Eccles Stadium this season. That figure (45,174) currently ranks third all-time at Utah. Although some tickets remain for Friday's game, Utah is assured of averaging at least a capacity crowd for the fourth-straight home season. Tickets may be purchased at 801-581-UTIX and UtahUtes.com.

OUTSIDE THE LINES

Utah has the longest **win streak** in the Pac-12 at four games ... Friday's game marks the start to the "**Rumble in the Rockies**." The slogan will be used for all the sports in which Utah and CU compete, which are football, volleyball, soccer, women's cross country, men's and women's basketball, women's tennis, women's indoor and outdoor track, men's and women's skiing and men's golf ... The **Ute Walk** for Friday's game will start at 11 a.m. ... **The MUSS** will be recognized at the game in honor of its 10th-year anniversary. Initially known as the Student Fan Club and the Utah Fan Club, the group adopted the name MUSS for the 2002 football season ... **Utah and CU** are best known for their rivalry in skiing, which is an NCAA co-ed sport. Utah has won 10 NCAA ski championships to CU's 17. Most recently, Utah finished as runner-up to Colorado at the 2011 NCAA Ski Championships.

Utah has two players on its roster from Colorado, but neither will play Friday. Senior linebacker **J.J. Williams** (Aurora/Grandview HS) is out with a season-ending foot injury. Redshirt freshman **Andy St. Pierre** (Highlands Ranch/Rock Canyon HS) is a redshirt freshman who has not played this season ... With last week's 30-27 overtime win over Washington State, **Kyle Whittingham** is now 8-7 all-time against Pac-12 schools.

IT'S ALL ACADEMIC

Five of the 25 first-team members of the 2011 Pac-12 All-Academic Football Team were from Utah. The Utes also placed one player on the second team and another eight earned honorable mention honors. Named to the first-team from Utah were junior wide receiver **Luke Matthews** (3.66/mass communication), junior offensive lineman **Tevita Stevens** (3.52/Spanish), senior defensive lineman **Derrick Shelby** (3.25/sociology), senior linebacker **J.J. Williams** (3.42/economics) and junior punter **Sean Sellwood** (3.78/exercise and sport science). Making the second team was senior linebacker **Matt Martinez** (3.09/sociology). Honorable mention selections were not limited to one per position. Honorable mention recipients from Utah included: receiver **Dres Anderson**, safety **Greg Bird**, safety **Brian Blechen**, defensive back **Mike Honeycutt**, kicker/punter **Nick Marsh**, running back **Thretton Palamo**, tight end **Dallin Rogers** and receiver **Kenneth Scott**.

DEFENSIVE DIAMONDS

Utah, the Pac-12's scoring defense and pass efficiency defense leader, ranks among the Pac-12 and NCAA leaders in a number of defensive categories. Utah has held six of its 11 opponents to under 100 net rushing yards: BYU (11), Oregon State (32), Washington State (62), Pittsburgh (70), Arizona State (74) and Montana State (75). The defense has also scored 24 points this season, two on interception returns and two on fumble returns. LAST WEEK

In a driving snowstorm in Pullman, Wash., **John White** rushed for 186 yards and two touchdowns, **Mo Lee** intercepted two passes, including one in overtime, and **Coleman Petersen** kicked the game-winning field goal from 38 yards out to lead Utah past Washington State in overtime, 30-27. The Utes appeared to have the game in hand late in the fourth quarter when **White's** 56-yard touchdown run gave them a 27-17 lead. But WSU countered with a touchdown and a field goal in the last three minutes to send the game into overtime. Neither team scored until late in the first half, with Utah striking first when punter **Sean Sellwood** threw a 49-yard pass to **Luke Matthews** with 1:47 left in the second period. The Cougars tied the game at 7-7 on a touchdown just 33 seconds before the intermission.

UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 622-427-31. The Utes are 379-176-16 at home (61-19 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 225-236-13 in road games and 18-15-2 in games played at neutral sites.

Utah is 80-124-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools with the breakdown following: Arizona (20-15-2), Arizona State (6-17), California (3-5), Colorado (24-30-3), Oregon (8-18), Oregon State (6-9-1), USC (3-7), Stanford (2-3), UCLA (2-8), Washington (0-7), Washington State (6-5).

WHITTINGHAM FILE

Entering his seventh year as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** has a 65-24 overall record, a 17-9 mark against BCS schools and an 8-7 ledger against the Pac-12. Utah won 10 or more games and finished in the Associated Press and/or Coaches' Top 25 from 2008-2010. Whittingham was named the 2008 National Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and the Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards committee after leading Utah to a 13-0 season, a victory over Alabama in the Sugar Bowl and a No. 2 final A.P. ranking. He joined the Utah staff in 1994 as the defensive line coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator a year later. In his 17-year tenure, Utah has won 69-percent of its games (150-65) and 10 of 12 bowl games. He is 6-1 in bowl games, including a victory as co-head coach of the 2005 Fiesta Bowl team. Whittingham has coached seven All-Americans, including five first-team All-Americans (three consensus). A linebacker for Brigham Young from 1978-81, Whittingham earned first-team all-WAC and WAC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1981. He played in the first four Holiday Bowls and was named Defensive MVP of the 1981 game. In 2008, he was inducted into the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame. For more on Whittingham, see sidebar on page 2.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

> Junior **Jon Hays**, who planned to play at NCAA FCS Nebraska-Omaha this season, is instead 5-2 as Utah's starting quarterback. Hays signed with UNO out of Butte JC last spring but joined the Utes in the summer when UNO dropped football.

> **Hays** has won four straight games and five of the last six since replacing injured **Jordan Wynn** (a three-year starter) in the second half of Utah's Oct. 1 game against Washington. Hays has played in nine games total.

> **Hays** has completed 87-of-158 passes (55.1%) for 1,081 yards (120.1 yards per game) and eight touchdowns (7 interceptions).

> In his five wins, **Hays** has combined to throw for six touchdowns with no picks. In those wins, Utah is 15-of-16 in the red zone with seven touchdowns.

> **Hays** threw for a career-high 199 yards against both Arizona State (in his first start) and Arizona.

> The backup is sophomore **Griff Robles**, who was playing linebacker until Wynn's injury prompted a return to his old position.

> **Robles**, the third-string QB a year ago, has played in three games this season—all at quarterback (BYU, Cal and Arizona). He has nine rushes for 25 yards and is 0-for-1 passing.

> **Wynn** is out for the season following Oct. 20 surgery to his left (non-throwing) shoulder. Wynn started the first four games with a 2-2 record. He has a 13-6 career record as the starter, earning the job midway through his true freshman season in 2009. He has appeared in 20 games in three years.

> **Wynn**, who has a redshirt year available, completed 66-of-116 passes this season for 727 yards (181.8 yards per game). He had six touchdowns and two interceptions.

> **Wynn** has 10 career 200-yard passing games and four career 300-yard games.

> **Wynn** ranks ninth all-time in career passing yards at Utah with 4,390 and is the 11th quarterback in school history to throw for 4,000 yards.

> **Wynn** has 31 career touchdown passes, which is tied for the sixth-best total at Utah.

> **Wynn** led Utah to scores on 9-of-13 trips to the red zone this season (7 touchdowns, 2 field goals). In his career, Utah is 61-of-69 (88.4%) in the red zone when Wynn is on the field.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

> **John White**, a junior college transfer in his first season, ranks second in the Pac-12 and eighth in the nation in rushing (125.18 yards per game).

> Just 5'8", 186 pounds, **White** is approaching the school single-season rushing record of 1,507 set by Carl Monroe in 1982.

> **White**, currently third all-time at Utah in single-season rushing yards with 1,377, needs 131 yards to pass Monroe for first (he needs just 20 yards to move into second ahead of Damion Hunter, who had 1,396 yards in 2001). White is averaging 4.9 yards per rush.

> **White** is the 11th Utah player to rush for 1,000 yards in season (Eddie Johnson did it twice). He is the fourth first-year Ute to reach the milestone, joining Johnson (1984), Keith Williams (1991) and Mike Anderson (1998).

> **White** ranks second in the Pac-12 in 100-yard games with seven and has four of the top 12 rushing performances in the Pac-12 this season.

> **White's** seven 100-yard rushing games is tied for the third-most in a season at Utah. The school record is nine. Utah is 7-0 when White reaches the century mark.

> **White's** 100-yard rushing games came against Oregon State (205), Washington State (186), BYU (174), Pittsburgh (171), UCLA (167), Montana State (150) and Arizona (109). His 150 net yards vs. MSU marked the best Ute debut since 1998.

> **White** has 14 rushing touchdowns, which ties the school record set by Marty Johnson in 2004.

> **White** has 16 total touchdowns (14 rushing, 2 receiving), which is tied for first in the Pac-12, as is his 96 total points. He is tied for second in the league in points per game (8.73).

> **White's** 280 carries ranks second in a season at Utah and is currently second in the nation. He averages 25.4 carries per game—going over 30 four times—and needs 30 more carries to overtake Carl Monroe (309 in 1982) for the top spot.

> **White's** 42 carries against Washington State is the most by an NCAA FBS player this season. He is the only player with more than two 35-carry games: 42 vs. Washington State (1st), 36 vs. Pitt (T-11th), 35 vs. OSU (T-14th).

> **White** accounts for 88% of the team's net rushing yards (1,377 of 1,557), 68% of Utah's total rushes (280 of 407) and 40% of its total offense (1,377 of 3,431).

> **White**, who also has 11 receptions for 51 yards and two touchdowns, leads Utah in all-purpose yards with 1,428 (129.8 yards per game).

> No. 2 on the depth chart is true freshman **Harvey Langi**. In nine games, he has 13 rushes for 70 yards (5.4 average) and two receptions for six yards.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

> Junior **DeVonte Christopher** leads Utah in receptions (34), receiving yards (533) and touchdown catches (4), and is first in yards per catch (15.7) among players with at least 20 receptions. Christopher missed two games (Pitt and Cal) with an ankle injury.

> **Christopher**, a third-team Phil Steele Midseason all-Pac-12 selection, is averaging 59.22 receiving yards a game to rank 11th in the Pac-12.

> **Christopher** has two 100-yard games this season (vs. USC and Washington) and five in his career: 155 vs. Pittsburgh (2010), 136 vs. USC (2011), 125 vs. Washington (2011), 124 vs. Iowa State (2010) and 111 vs. Colorado State (2010).

> Freshman **Dres Anderson** is second on the team in receiving yards (341), tied for second in receptions (22), and second in yards per catch (15.5) among players with at least 20 receptions.

> **Anderson** is second on the team in touchdown catches (3).

> **Anderson's** best games were against BYU (81 yards) and USC (77 yards).

> Junior **Reggie Dunn**, a dual threat with 14 receptions for 204 yards (14.6 average) and 13 rushes for 136 yards (10.5 average), is second on the team in rushing yards and third in receiving yards.

> Redshirt freshman **Kenneth Scott** has played in the last eight games and started against Arizona State.

> **Scott** has seven catches for 133 yards and a 19.0 average.

TIGHT ENDS/F-BACKS

> Junior tight end **Kendrick Moeai** has 10 receptions for 55 yards. Moeai has played in nine games (missing the Washington and ASU games with an ankle injury) and started six.

> In his fourth game since moving to tight end, **David Rolf** started last week against WSU. Rolf, a defensive end who switched sides after the season-ending injury to **Dallin Rogers**, will likely remain on the offense for the remainder of the season.

> Freshman tight end **Jake Murphy** has five grabs for 64 yards and a touchdown. He has played in nine games (missed the UW game with a knee injury) with two starts.

> Utah's F-back is a combination position of fullbacks, tight ends and receivers.

> Junior F-back (receiver) **Luke Matthews** has 12 receptions for 187 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He has played in 10 games with six starts, missing the BYU game (shoulder).

> **Matthews** had a career-high 70 yards on two catches, including a 49-yard TD, against Washington State.

> Sophomore F-back (fullback) **Shawn Asiata**, a bruising blocker at 6'0, 253 pounds, also has five catches for 28 yards. Asiata has played in 10 games with six starts.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

> All-America candidate **Tony Bergstrom**, a three-year starting right tackle, leads Utah with an 85% overall grade, winning 491 of 579 assignments.

> **Bergstrom** has earned the highest grade on the OL in five games: Montana State (88%, tie), OSU (91%), Pitt (85%), UCLA (90%, tie) and WSU (89%, tie).

> **Bergstrom** has the best single-game grade this season (91% vs. OSU).

> **Bergstrom** missed most of the BYU game and all of the Washington game with a knee injury. It snapped a string of 29-straight starts for the three-year starter. He has started in 36 games in his career.

> Junior **Tevita Stevens**, a three-year starter in his first year at center, leads Utah in total plays (699) and "wins" (572). He is tied for second in overall grade (82%).

> **Stevens** had the best overall grade against ASU (76%) and WSU (89%, tie).

> Junior right guard **Sam Brenner**, a third-team Phil Steele Midseason all-Pac-12 selection, ranks second on the line in plays (696) and "wins" (567). He has an 81% overall grade.

> **Brenner** has started all 11 games (10 at right guard, 1 at right tackle) and played every snap in eight games.

> **Brenner** has received the team's best grade in five games: Montana State (88%, tie) USC (89%), BYU (86%), Washington (84%) and Cal (79%, tie).

> **Brenner** has allowed only one sack this season, the fewest on the line.

> Senior left tackle **John Cullen** has played and started in 10 games, missing the opener against Montana State with a concussion.

> **Cullen** is tied for second on the team in average grade (82%), winning 519 of 635 assignments.

> **Cullen** has led the OL in three games: Arizona (90%), Cal (79%, tie) and UCLA (90%, tie).

> Junior **Miles Mason**, who didn't join the team until Aug. 18, is a first-year starting left guard.

> **Mason** has played in all 11 games and started in 10 (9 at left guard, 1 at left tackle).

> **Mason** has an overall grade of 77% (469-613) with a season-best 83% score against Arizona and UCLA.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

- > Nine players regularly share time on the defensive line (**Derrick Shelby**, **Star Lotulelei**, **Dave Kruger**, **Joe Kruger**, **Tevita Finau**, **Nai Fotu**, **James Aiono**, **Nate Fakahafua** and LT **Tui-polotu**), while linebacker **Trevor Reilly** and tight end/defensive end **David Rolf** have also contributed.
- > **Shelby** (right end) and **Lotulelei** (nose tackle) have started all 11 games.
- > **Shelby** leads the line (and ranks sixth on the team) with 40 tackles. He is second on the team in tackles for loss (7.0, tie) and sacks (4.0).
- > **Shelby** is tied for 14th in the Pac-12 in sacks per game (0.36).
- > **Shelby's** five pass breakups is tied for second among the Pac-12's defensive linemen.
- > **Shelby** has scored two touchdowns this season on an interception return vs. Pitt and a fumble recovery vs. BYU.
- > **Shelby** was the Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week after leading Utah to victory against Pitt on Oct. 15.
- > **Lotulelei**, perhaps the best nose tackle in the Pac-12, has 34 tackles with seven tackles for loss (tied for second on the team) and a half sack despite being double teamed on most plays. He also has a pass breakup and a forced fumble.
- > **Lotulelei** had a career-high seven tackles against UCLA.
- > **Lotulelei** caught a 17-yard pass for a first down on a fake punt play against Cal.
- > The **Kruger** brothers have played in all 11 games, with tackle **Dave Kruger** (18 tackles, 1.5 TFL, 1.0 sack) making nine starts while left end **Joe Kruger** (33 tackles, 5.0 TFL, 3.0 sacks, 1 forced fumble, 1 pass breakup) has started in eight games.
- > **Finau**, who plays both tackle and end, is the co-starter at both positions now. He has 25 total tackles (4.0 TFL, 3.0 sacks) and two pass breakups.
- > **Finau** has started at left end in the last two games, when he has recorded a third of his total tackles (8-of-25), including a career-best six stops against UCLA.
- > **Finau's** three sacks against Oregon State is tied for the 10th-best single-game total in the country this season.
- > **Nai Fotu**, who began the season at linebacker, has seen his playing time increase since he moved to defensive end. Fotu's four tackles includes two sacks. He also has a fumble recovery.
- > **Reilly**, a stud linebacker, starts at defensive end when Utah is in its nickel package. Six of his team-leading nine TFL and three of his five sacks have come when he is at end. For more on Reilly, please see linebacker notes.
- > The line has batted down 13 passes: **Shelby** (5), **Fakahafua** (2), **Aiono** (2), **Finau** (2), **Joe Kruger** (1) and **Lotulelei** (1).

LINEBACKER NOTEBOOK

- > Senior middle linebacker **Chaz Walker**, a Phil Steele Midseason all-Pac-12 first-team linebacker, ranks third in the conference in both total tackles (87) and tackle average (7.9).
- > **Walker**, who also led Utah in tackles in 2010 with 113, has led Utah in tackles in six games this season, reaching double figures in four. He had a season-high 12 tackles against Washington.
- > **Walker** is tied for seventh in the Pac-12 in total forced fumbles (2) and is tied for 10th in forced fumbles per game (0.18).
- > **Walker** also has 2.5 TFL and a pass breakup.

- > Sophomore stud linebacker **Trevor Reilly** is tied for second in the Pac-12 in total forced fumbles (4) and forced fumbles per game (0.36). He is tied for 11th and 14th in the nation, respectively, in those categories.
- > **Reilly**, who leads Utah in both tackles for loss and sacks, is tied for 11th in the Pac-12 in tackles for loss (9) and in tackles for loss per game (0.82).
- > **Reilly** is 10th in the nation in tackle-for-loss yards (76), which is tied for the eighth-best single-season total at Utah.
- > **Reilly's** five sacks and 0.45 sacks per game average are both tied for eighth in the conference.
- > **Reilly** was named Pac-12 player of the week on Sept. 19 for his efforts in a 54-10 win over BYU. He was also named National Defensive Player of the Week by College Football Performance Awards.
- > Senior rover linebacker **Matt Martinez** is third on the team in tackles with 65 (6.5 TFL, 2.5 sacks).
- > **Martinez** has two interceptions, a fumble recovery and a blocked kick.
- > Backing up Martinez at rover is true freshman defensive end **Nate Fakahafua** (4 tackles, 2 PBU), who can find more playing time at linebacker right now. Fakahafua joins backups **Jacoby Hale** (7 tackles, 1.0 TFL), **V.J. Fehoko** (3 tackles, 1 fumble recovery for a TD) and **Dave Fagergren** (3 tackles, 1.0 TFL, 1.0 sack, 2 pass breakups, 1 forced fumble).
- > **Hale** is doubtful this week with a concussion.

SECONDARY NOTEBOOK

- > Sophomore **Brian Blechen**, a Freshman All-America safety last year, has put up numbers deserving of further awards this year. Blechen has started at strong safety in the last seven games after playing linebacker in the first four games (when he made the Phil Steele Midseason all-Pac-12 third-team as a linebacker).
- > **Blechen** ranks second on the team in tackles with 66. He has 6.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks.
- > **Blechen** has led Utah's tacklers in three games (Washington, Cal and UCLA).
- > In last week's win over WSU, **Blechen** made his third interception of the season, along with four tackles and a pass breakup.
- > **Blechen** has seven career interceptions in his two seasons.
- > **Blechen** is tied for sixth in the league in interceptions (3) and tied for eighth in interceptions per game (.27).
- > **Blechen** is tied for seventh in the Pac-12 in total forced fumbles (2) and tied for 10th in forced fumbles per game (0.18).
- > **Blechen** also has two pass breakups and a blocked field goal.
- > True freshman **Eric Rowe**, a candidate for freshman All-America honors, has started all 11 games—the last eight at free safety.
- > **Rowe** is tied for eighth in the Pac-12 and is second on the team in pass breakups with eight.
- > **Rowe**, fourth on the team in tackles (58), tied for the team lead against WSU with five. He also intercepted his first pass against WSU.
- > **Ryan Lacy** and **Mo Lee** are the co-starters at left corner. Lacy, also the first-string nickel back, has started in 10 games—eight at corner and two at nickel.

- > **Lacy** ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in passes defended with 11 (9 pass breakups, 2 interceptions).
- > **Lacy's** nine pass breakups is tied for sixth in the conference.
- > **Lacy** has 45 tackles with one sack.
- > **Lee** has 27 tackles, three interceptions, and five pass breakups.
- > **Lee** had two interceptions against Washington State, the second coming in overtime to set up Utah's game-winning field goal.
- > **Lee** is tied for sixth in the league in interceptions (3) and tied for eighth in interceptions per game (.27).
- > Senior corner **Conroy Black** is tied for the league lead in interceptions (4) and is tied for third in interceptions per game (.36). He is tied for 13th in the NCAA in total picks and is tied for 18th nationally in interceptions per game.
- > **Black** was National Defensive Player of the Week by College Football Performance Awards for his game against UCLA, when he had two interceptions, one which he returned 67 yards for a touchdown.
- > **Black** has started all 11 games at right corner and has 32 tackles, four pass breakups and a fumble recovery.
- > Backup nickel back **Reggie Topps** has 28 total tackles (3.5 TFL, two sacks), three pass breakups and a forced fumble.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

- > Utah leads the Pac-12 in kickoff coverage (47.2 net average).
- > Utah leads the Pac-12 and ranks ninth nationally in kick return yardage defense (18.04).
- > Utah has blocked four kicks (3 punts, 1 field goal).
- > First-year junior kicker **Coleman Petersen** leads the Pac-12 in field goals made (17) and field goals made per game (1.55). He is third in the league in field goal percentage (81.0% on 17-of-21 kicking).
- > **Petersen** is tied for second in the league in kick scoring (7.5), which ties him for seventh in the league in overall scoring.
- > **Petersen's** 17 made field goals is tied for fifth in a season at Utah.
- > **Petersen** made the first game-winning field goal of his career with a 38-yarder against Washington State in overtime. He was 3-for-3 in the game, which included field goals of 33 and 45 yards.
- > **Petersen** has made four straight field goals since he missed on a 46-yard attempt against Arizona three games ago. His longest string of made field goals is 10 in a row.
- > **Petersen** is 13-of-14 inside the 40 and 4-of-7 from 40 and out.
- > **Petersen** was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 17 for his work against Pitt. He was also one of three Lou Groza "Stars of the Week" and the national place-kicker of the week by College Football Performance Awards.
- > **Petersen** is 32-of-33 in PATs.
- > **Sean Sellwood** has 38 punts for a 43.3-yard average (long of 67 yards). He has placed 10 punts inside the 20, all in the last five games.
- > **Sellwood** has eight punts of 50 yards or longer this season and his 29 career punts of 50 yards or longer ranks fourth in school history.
- > **Sellwood** has done all of the punting in the last four games, after sharing the job in six games with **Nick Marsh**. Marsh handled all the punts against Pittsburgh.
- > **Sellwood** is also 3-for-3 in fake punt plays this season, including 2-for-2 passing. Against Washington State, he threw a

49-yard touchdown pass to Luke Matthews. He also completed a 17-yard pass for a first down against Cal.

> **Marsh** has 20 punts with a 40.5-yard average (long of 62 yards) and eight punts downed inside the 20. He has two punts of 50-plus yard punts. Marsh also rushed for a first down on a fake punt.

> In his second year handling kickoffs, **Marsh** has 60 kickoffs (8 touchbacks) and is averaging 65.5 yards a kickoff. Those are also the team totals and he is responsible for Utah's third-place Pac-12 ranking in kickoff average (65.5).

> In his career, **Marsh** has kicked off 125 times with 25 touchbacks and a 65.6-yard average.

> **Marsh** was named the College Performance Awards Kickoff Specialist of the Week on Oct. 2 for his performance against Washington.

> **Griff McNabb** (17 punt returns for 90 yards, long of 19) ranks third in the Pac-12 in punt return average (5.3).

> **McNabb** replaced true freshman **Charles Henderson**, who is out for the season with a knee injury suffered against ASU. In four games, Henderson had nine returns for 113 yards (12.6 average, long of 30 yards vs. ASU).

> Kick returner **Reggie Dunn** leads Utah with a 23.8 kick return average (25 returns, 595 yards).

> **Dunn's** 25 kick returns is tied for the eighth-most in a season at Utah.

> **Dunn** has 950 career kick return yards, which ranks eighth all-time at Utah.

KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS

"It was a hard fought game vs. Washington State but our guys hung in there and found a way to win in overtime. John White turned in another great performance and our special teams were outstanding. Our entire focus now shifts to the Colorado Buffaloes and a possible shot at the South Division title. Our seniors will be making their last appearance in Rice-Eccles Stadium and sending them out the right way is our top priority."

Head coach **Kyle Whittingham's** son **Tyler Whittingham** and nephew **Jason Whittingham** are both on the Ute squad. Tyler is a senior walk-on safety and Jason is a freshman defensive lineman who served a church mission after signing with the Utes in 2009. Running back **Tauni Vakapuna** is the younger brother of former Cincinnati Bengal running back Fui Vakapuna. Utah, which became bowl eligible with the victory, got two clutch interceptions from Conroy Black—one which he returned 67 yards for a touchdown. After falling behind 3-0, White scored three touchdowns to give Utah a 21-3 lead before UCLA scored again on a fourth-quarter field goal. Brian Blechen led Utah with eight tackles (1 TFL) and a forced fumble, while Eric Rowe had a sack and two pass breakups to go with his four tackles.
