

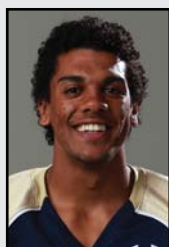

2012 NFFCC News & Notes

ADAMS STATE UNIVERSITY (8-3, 6-3 RMAC)

Team Notes: Adams State's season is complete.

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (4-7, 4-5 RMAC)

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (6-5, 4-5 RMAC)

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (3-8, 2-5 MWC)

Team Notes: Colorado State Rams lost to the 22nd-ranked Boise State Broncos (9-2, 6-1 MW), 42-14 on Saturday afternoon. Senior running back D.J. Harper scored an 80-yard touchdown run on the first offensive play from Boise State. With the early 7-0 lead, the Broncos never looked back. After forcing another quick punt from the Rams, Boise State moved the ball 54 yards in just seven plays to extend their lead to 14-0. Harper again ran it in, this time from two yards out. Harper finished the game with 111 yards and two touchdowns. Senior quarterback M.J. McPeck started for Colorado State, but with the Rams struggling in the first half and down 35-0 at the break, redshirt-freshman Conner Smith replaced McPeck at quarterback in the second half. The Broncos started the second half much like they did the first half, scoring early. Taking the opening drive 75 yards in just 3:41, Boise State extended its lead to 42-0 with a 1-yard touchdown run from Grant Hedrick. After forcing a couple of punts from Boise State, Colorado State's offense began to find its rhythm late in the third quarter. The Rams went 80 yards in just three plays on a touchdown drive that was capped off by a 72-yard touchdown run up the right side from junior running back Chris Nwoke. The touchdown run was the longest of Nwoke's career, and was the eighth-longest scoring run in school history. Nwoke finished the game with a season-high 119 yards and a touchdown on just 10 carries, while freshman running back Donnell Alexander chipped in with 59 yards on the ground. The Rams would score once more with just over four minutes left in the game. Facing a 4th-and-13, Smith found senior wide receiver Marquise Law in the corner of the end zone for a 30-yard touchdown. The 30-yard reception was the longest of Law's career. Max Morgan led Colorado State's defense with 12 tackles, tying his career high, while Jordan Gragert and Shaq Bell each recovered a fumble. Bell was second on the team with nine tackles.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (11-0, 9-0 RMAC)

Team Notes: CSU-Pueblo, ranked No. 1 in the final AFCA regular season poll, is the top seed in the NCAA Division II Football Super Region Four. The ThunderWolves, who received a bye in the first round, will play host to Indianapolis this Saturday at 12 p.m. in the second round.

UNITED STATE AIR FORCE ACADEMY (5-5, 4-2 MWC)

Alex Hansen (Freshman, Defensive Line, 6-2, 240, Oak Forest, Ill./Oak Forest)

Hansen recorded five total tackles, including four unassisted, in a 21-7 home win over Hawaii. His five tackles are the second most of his career. Hansen recorded a career-high two quarterback sacks for 13 yards which is the most by a Falcon this season. He also recorded a career-high four tackles for loss for 18 yards which is the most by a Falcon this season and most in the Troy Calhoun-era. His four tackles for loss ties as the seventh-most in school history, just two behind the school record of six. The four tackles for loss are the most since Monty Coleman had four vs. North Texas in 2003, and they are also the most by a freshman in school history.

Team Notes: Air Force extended its school record consecutive games scoring streak to 244 which is the fourth longest active streak in the nation. The streak is the 10th longest in NCAA history. Air Force was last shutout in the 1992 Liberty Bowl vs. Mississippi, 13-0. Air Force extended its streak of consecutive games with at least one rushing touchdown to 45 straight games dating back to Navy Oct. 3, 2009. The streak is the longest current active streak in the nation. Air Force did not attempt a pass for the first time since 1992 vs. Wyoming (42-28 win). It marked the fifth time in school history the Falcons did not attempt a pass: George Washington, 1960; UCLA, 1964; UTEP, 1984, Wyoming, 1992. Air Force now leads the series with Hawai'i, 12-6-1. The win is the first over Hawai'i since 1997. With the win, Air Force closes out the home schedule with a 5-1 record which ties as the fourth-best mark in school history. Air Force was also 5-1 at home in 2009 and 2010. Air Force accepted a bid to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl, marking the sixth straight year the Falcons have gone to a bowl, a new school record. Air Force has been to a bowl game every season under coach Troy Calhoun. This season marks the fourth time in the last six years that the Falcons have played in the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl. AFA lost to California (36-42) in 2007, lost to Houston (28-34) in 2008 and beat Houston (47-20) in 2009.

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (1-10, 1-7 PAC12)

Team Notes: Washington now leads the series 7-5-1, winning for the fourth time in a row and the second consecutive time in Boulder. The Buffaloes are now 51-13 in November against unranked teams dating back to 1989. At 1-10, this is the fifth 10-loss season in school history (1-10 in 1980 and 1984; 2-10 in 2006 and 3-10 in 2011). The 121 combined plays (67 UW, 54 CU) were the second fewest in a CU game this season (118 in Stanford game). This marked the first time this season the opponent was held scoreless in the first quarter by the Colorado defense (only other scoreless quarter by both teams was the fourth at Oregon); the latest an opponent had scored on CU was the 1:54 mark of the first quarter by Sacramento State. It was the third scoreless opening stanza by the opponent in the last 24 games. The seven points Washington scored in the first half was an opponent low for the first half in 2012 (fewest since Utah was held scoreless last November); fewest in a half was 6 by Sacramento State in the second. PK Will Oliver's third quarter field goal snapped a string of eight straight scoreless quarters at home by the Buffs. CU's five turnovers led to 14 Washington points. UW ran plays in plus territory 10 out of 14 drives (42 plays); CU just two of 12 (8 plays; the first time in plus territory was after Marques Mosley's 59-yard kickoff return to the UW 40). UW had four offensive plays called back, costing it 64 yards and four first downs (CU one for 9, but it eliminated a touchdown). UW was 0-of-3 on 3rd-&-20 or more; opponents are now 0-of-9 in 2012 in such situations (and 5-of-111 dating back to 1993). The Buffs were held under 100 yards both rushing and passing for the second time in three games, both at home.
