QUICK HITS

- > Utah (4-7, 2-6 Pac-12) concludes its 2012 season at Colorado (1-10, 1-7 Pac-12) on Friday, Nov. 23 in Boulder, Colo. Kickoff is 1:00 p.m. MST at Folsom Field. The game will be televised on FX. In Utah, FX can be found on these channels: Comcast 43, Dish 136, DirecTV 248. Radio is ESPN700 AM (espn700sports.com) and SIRIUS/XM (123/190).
- > In this game a year ago, Colorado cost Utah a berth in the first Pac-12 Championship game by upsetting the Utes 17-14 in Salt Lake City.
- > For the first time in a decade, the Utes will not be bowl eligible. Utah is 8-1 in bowl games since 2003, including the first seven years of **Kyle Whittingham's** tenure as head coach.
- > The Utes are 0-5 on the road this season. Utah's last road win was at Washington State on Nov. 19, 2011.
- > Utah's 58 games against Colorado is its most against a Pac-12 school and the fifth-most against any opponent. Colorado leads the series 31-24-3 overall and 15-10-1 in Boulder. Played annually from 1903-1962 with four exceptions, the rivalry went dormant for 49 years before it resumed last season. See page 2 for complete series history.
- > John White will attempt to become the first player in Utah history to rush for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons. White needs 127 yards this week against Colorado to reach 1,000 yards. He rushed for a school-record 1,519 yards last year.
- > The Utes played before sellout crowds in every home game this season—the third-straight season they have done so—and extended their sellout streak to 18 games in Rice-Eccles Stadium. See 'Selling Out' for more.

UTAH-COLORADO SERIES

Series Snapshot

Utah's 58 games against Colorado is its most against a Pac-12 school and ranks fifth in school history. Colorado leads the series 31-24-3 overall and 15-10-1 in Boulder. Played annually from 1903-1962 with four exceptions, the rivalry went dormant for 49 years before it resumed last season. Colorado beat the favored Utes last year in Salt Lake City, 17-14, costing Utah a berth in the first Pac-12 Championship game. In 1961, Utah pulled off the biggest upset in the series, beating No. 8 Colorado in Boulder, 21-12. It was the Buffs' only regular season loss and they went on to win the Big 8 title and play in the Orange Bowl.

Coleman Petersen missed all three of his field goal attempts, including a 48-yarder to tie the game with two seconds left, and last place Colorado upset Utah 17-14. Utah fell behind 10-0 in the first half after recording just one first down and 39 total yards. In the fourth quarter, trailing 17-14, the Utes stalled on first and goal on the 6-yard line and Petersen missed a 26-yard field goal. Tauni Vakapuna rushed for a career-high 77 yards and a touchdown after starter John White left with an ankle injury.

TWO-MINUTE DRILL

This Friday's game is only the third day game of the season for Utah, which is 1-1 in afternoon kickoffs ... Utah does not have any Colorado natives on its roster, but two former Utes play for the Denver Broncos: Zane Beadles, a third-year starting offensive guard, and Sealver Siliga, a first-year defensive tackle ... The Utes are 3-0 in games they have led at halftime and 1-0 when they are tied at the half. They are 0-7 in games when they've trailed at the half ... The Utes are 0-2 on natural grass ... Quarters in which the Utes are outscoring their opponents are the second (90-72) and third (73-30). Utah has scored 278 total points (25.3 per game) to its foes' 266 points (24.2 average).

IN THE HUDDLE

Twenty-five seniors will suit up for their last game as Utes this Friday ... Sean Sellwood has broken the school record for 50+ punts in a career, booting his 51st last week against Arizona. Forty-two percent (15-of-36) of his punts have sailed 50 yards or longer ... Four true freshmen have played in and started at least one game for Utah this season: quarterback Travis Wilson, linebacker Reshawn Hooker, offensive lineman Jeremiah Poutasi and punter Tom Hackett ... 19 players have caught passes for Utah this season and six players have completed passes (Wilson, Jordan Wynn, Jon Hays, Adam Schulz, DeVonte Christopher and Sean Sellwood).

OUTSIDE THE LINES

Jordan Wynn, who was only a junior in eligibility (due to an NCAA medical hardship extension) when he retired after the second game this season, has been named the new quarterbacks coach at Hawai'i. Wynn began the season as Utah's starting quarterback—his fourth season as the starter—before suffering his second-straight seasonending shoulder injury against Utah State ... Utah has never played in a game televised on FX ... Utah and CU are best known for their rivalry in skiing, which is an NCAA co-ed sport. Utah has won 10 NCAA ski championships to CU's 17. Utah finished second and Colorado was third at the 2012 NCAA Ski Championships.

LOOKING AHEAD

Utah will play seven home football games next season for the first time since 1995. The Utes open their 2013 season at home against Utah State on Thursday, Aug. 29 and host Weber State on Saturday, Sept. 7. Utah will wrap up its 2013 non-conference schedule at BYU on Saturday, Sept. 21. The Utes won't learn the dates of their Pac-12 Conference games until mid-January, but their home schedule will include Oregon State, UCLA, Stanford, Arizona State and Colorado. Conference road games will be at Oregon, USC, Arizona and Washington State. Off the schedule in 2013 are Washington and California.

NOTABLE NUMBERS

Utah is tied for first in the country in fumbles returned for touchdowns (4) ... Utah is third in the country in forced fumbles (19) ... The Utes are third in the Pac-12 in both rushing defense (129.64) and passing defense (228.8) ... Utah ranks 26th in the country in rushing defense and 35th in total defense (358.45) ... Utah leads the Pac-12 in time of possession (32:28), which stands 11th among FBS teams ... The Utes lead the Pac-12 and are tied for ninth in the NCAA in opponent fourth-down conversions (30.0%, 3-of-10).

Travis Wilson passed for a career-high 311 yards and two touch-downs and John White rushed for 112 yards, but Utah came up short against Arizona 34-24. After falling behind 17-7 (their only score coming on a fake field goal rush by kicker Coleman Petersen), the Utes reeled off 17 unanswered points to take a 24-17 lead heading into the fourth quarter. But the Wildcats went on a 17-0 run of their own to finish the scoring. Senior receiver DeVonte Christopher had his best game of the year, with three catches for 84 yards and a touchdown. Eric Rowe's 16 tackles and two pass breakups led a Ute defense that held the Wildcats to 160 passing yards—150 below their season average.

UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 627-435-31. The Utes are 383-179-16 at home (65-22 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 225-239-12 in road games and 19-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

WHITTINGHAM FILE

Kyle Whittingham, the 2008 National Coach of the Year, is 70-32 in eight seasons as Utah's head coach, winning almost 70-percent of his games. Utah's 49-6 win over Washington State on Nov. 3, 2012 came in his 100th game as Utah's head coach and made him the third 100-game coach in Utah history, joining Ike Armstrong (72-23-5 in his first 100 games in a career that spanned from 1925-37) and Ron McBride (59-41 in his first 100 games in a career that ran from 1990-1998). Whittingham's teams qualified for a bowl game in his first seven years as head coach. Overall, Whittingham is 7-1 in bowl games, including a win as co-head coach of Utah's 2005 Fiesta Bowl team. Utah's win over No. 4 Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl improved his BCS bowl record to 2-0. Whittingham averaged nine victories a year in his first seven seasons and he has half of the 10-win seasons in the school's 118-year football history. Utah won 10 or more games each season from 2008-10, while finishing in the top 25. His 2008 team set the school win mark (13-0) and earned a berth in the Sugar Bowl, where Utah routed an Alabama team that had spent five weeks at No. 1. The Utes finished with a No. 2 national ranking that season and Whittingham was recognized as the National Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award committee. Last year, Whittingham guided Utah to a third-place tie in the Pac-12 South Division. The Utes won four-straight league games down the stretch and were in contention for a berth in the Pac-12 Championship game until the last week of the regular season. They finished with an 8-5 record (4-5 Pac-12) and beat Georgia Tech in the Sun Bowl. For more on Whittingham, see sidebar on page 2.

- > True freshman **Travis Wilson** has started the last six games with a 2-4 record, getting wins over Cal and Washington State. Wilson is Utah's third starter this season and the only Ute QB to play in all 11 games.
- > Fourth-year starter **Jordan Wynn** went 1-1 in the first two games before retiring after his second-straight season-ending shoulder injury. Senior **Jon Hays** is 1-2 as the starter and has played in six games total.
- > The 6'6", 230-pound **Wilson** has completed 64.2% of his passes (115-for-179) for 1,183 yards and six touchdowns (6 interceptions). He has three rushing touchdowns to rank second on the team.
- > Last week against Arizona, **Wilson** threw for a career-high 311 yards, completing 28-of-40 passes with two touchdowns and no interceptions. It was the second time he went over the 200-yard mark.
- > Wilson is the fourth Ute true freshman to start at quarterback since the NCAA restored freshman eligibility in 1972, joining Wynn (2009), Scott Cate (1982) and Ken Vierra (1981).
- > **Hays** has played in 17 games in his two years at Utah and his career record as the starter is 7-5.
- > As the replacement for Wynn in the season's second game, **Hays** rallied Utah from a 13-0 deficit against Utah State to a 20-20 tie in regulation before losing in overtime. He also led the Utes to a 24-21 win over BYU before back-to-back losses to ASU and USC.
- > **Hays** has completed 60.6% of his passes (63-for-104) for 653 yards and seven touchdowns (2 interceptions) in six games.
- > **Hays** threw for a season-high 196 yards and two TDs (no interceptions) against BYU.
- > Redshirt freshman **Adam Schulz** played in Utah's win over Washington State and was 2-of-2 passing for 52 yards.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

- > Senior **John White** leads the Utes in rushing, netting 873 yards on 198 attempts (4.4 average). Of his team-best seven rushing touchdowns, six have come in the last four games. He has played in 10 games, sitting out against BYU with an ankle injury.
- > White averages 87.30 yards per game rushing to rank sixth in the Pac-12. He is sixth in the league in both carries per game (19.8) and total carries (198).
- > White has set the school record for career 100-yard games with 13. He has five 100-yard games this season, including the last four games against California (105), Washington State (101), Washington (142) and Arizona (112). His career-best rushing game was 205 yards vs. Oregon State in 2011.
- > White's 13 career 100-yard games ties him for eighth among active players in the FBS.
- > Utah is 11-2 when **White** rushes for 100 yards, with its losses coming the last two weeks against UW and UA.
- > White needs 127 yards this week against Colorado to record the 13th 1,000-yard rushing season in school history. White would become just the second Utah running back with two 1,000-yard seasons (joining Eddie Johnson, 1984 and '86), and he would be the first to accomplish the feat in back-to-back seasons.
- > White ranks sixth in career rushing yards at Utah (2,392). He needs 209 yards to move into fifth place and 224 yards for fourth place.
- > White set the school record for rushing yards in a season last year (1,519), finishing second in the Pac-12 and 11th in the nation in rushing yards per game (116.8).
- > White's 22 career rushing touchdowns is tied for fifth all-time and

- > White, who also has 15 receptions for 123 yards and one touchdown, leads Utah in all-purpose yards with 996 (99.6 yards per game). He also leads the Utes in points off touchdowns with 48 points on eight touchdowns (7 rushing, 1 receiving).
- > Junior college transfer **Kelvin York** ranks second on the team with 248 yards on 50 carries (5.0 average) in seven games played. York, who has missed the last three games with an injury, has two rushing touchdowns.
- > York had a career-high 86 yards on 13 carries (6.6 average) against Arizona State.
- > In York's absence, walk-on **Karl Williams** has rushed seven times for 37 yards (5.3 average).
- > Williams, an H-back who is also now getting reps at running back, has played in 11 games. He started at H-back vs. Washington State. He has nine receptions for 83 yards and one touchdown.
- > Jarrell Oliver (23 carries, 52 yards) and Lucky Radley (15 rushes, 50 yards, 1 TD) have played in four games at running back. Radley also plays on special teams.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

- > Sophomore **Dres Anderson** has a team-high 35 catches and his 349 receiving yards ranks second overall and is tops among the receivers. He has two touchdown catches.
- > **Anderson**, who has played in all 11 games with 10 starts, had his best game of the season last week against Arizona, catching seven balls for 73 yards. His career-best game was 81 yards against BYU in 2011.
- > **Anderson** has also rushed 14 times for 87 yards (5.9 average).
- > Sophomore **Kenneth Scott** is third on the team in both receptions (28) and receiving yards (324).
- > Scott has played in all 11 games with nine starts and ranks second on the team in touchdown catches (3).
- > Scott had a career-high 82 yards and two touchdowns against Utah State. His best game in Pac-12 play was against California (59 yards).
- > Senior **DeVonte Christopher** leads Utah (among those with double-figure catches) with an average of 13.7 yards per catch. He ranks fourth on the team in receptions (22) and receiving yards (301) and has two touchdowns.

- > Senior defensive tackle **Star Lotulelei** (pronounced lo-TOO-leh-LAY), considered by many as the best defensive tackle in college football, was named a midseason first-team All-American by *Sporting News*, CBSsports.com and *Phil Steele*.
- > **Lotulelei** was one of 16 semifinalists for the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented annually to the nation's Defensive Player of the Year.
- > **Lotulelei**, who won the 2011 Morris Award as the Pac-12's top defensive lineman, is double or triple-team on virtually every play and rarely leaves the game.
- > **Lotulelei's** 36 total tackles includes a team-leading 9.0 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks. He also has three pass breakups.
- > **Lotulelei** leads the Pac-12 and is tied for second in the NCAA in fumble recoveries (4) and fumble recoveries per game (0.36).
- > **Lotulelei** is tied for third in the conference in total forced fumbles (3) and tied for sixth in the Pac-12 in forced fumbles per game (0.27).
- > Senior four-year starting tackle **Dave Kruger** has played in 49 games in his career with 37 starts—most of any player on the defense.
- > Dave Kruger has 30 tackles (0.5 sacks) and a fumble recovery.
- > Sophomore left end **Nate Fakahafua** is fourth on the team with 41 tackles and is tied for fourth in tackles for loss (5.5). He has two sacks.
- > **Fakahafua** has three fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles, one which he returned for a touchdown vs. USC. He is tied for second in the Pac-12 and sixth in the NCAA in total fumble recoveries (3), and is tied for second in the conference and eighth in the nation in fumble recoveries per game (0.27).
- > Fakahafua is tied for third on the team in pass breakups (4).
- > Junior right end **Joe Kruge**r has 27 tackles and a team-leading 6.0 sacks. He second on the team in tackles for loss (7.0).
- > **Joe Kruger**, who missed the ASU game with an injury and played only briefly the next week against USC, also has two forced fumbles, an interception for a touchdown and a pass breakup.
- > **Tenny Palepoi** (11 games, 2 starts) has 20 tackles with three tackles for loss and two sacks. He plays both tackle and end.
- > Palepoi had a career-high five tackles against Washington.

- > **Hale** and **Hooker**, starters before they were injured, have both missed the last four games.
- > **Hale** has 27 tackles (3 TFL) and two breakups in seven games (3 starts), while **Hooker** has 14 tackles, (0.5 TFL) in three games (2 starts).
- > Other contributors at linebacker are **Fagergren** (11 games, 2 starts, 29 tackles, 1 TFL) and **Nick Brown** (11 games, 9 tackles, 1 pass breakup).

SECONDARY NOTEBOOK

- > Utah has two former Freshman All-Americans at safety. Both were true freshmen when they were honored: **Brian Blechen** in 2010 and **Eric Rowe** in 2011.
- > **Blechen** has played in and started the last eight games (7 at strong safety, 1 at rover linebacker). He leads Utah in tackles per game (6.6).
- > Blechen has 53 total tackles (3.5 TFL) and was Utah's tackle leader in two games.
- > **Blechen** is tied for third on the team in pass breakups (4). He has seven career interceptions but none this season.
- > **Rowe** has played in and started nine games at free safety, missing the BYU and ASU games with a hamstring injury.
- > **Rowe** has 59 tackles (6.5 average) and is tied for third on the team with four pass breakups.
- > **Rowe** had a career-high 16 tackles against Arizona, the highest single-game total by any Ute since Matt Martinez made 17 tackles vs. BYU on Nov. 27, 2010. Rowe also had two pass breakups against the Wildcats.
- > **Ryan Lacy** has started and played in 10 games at corner, missing the WSU game due to injury.
- > Lacy leads Utah in interceptions with two and has five picks in his career. He is second on the team in pass breakups (5).
- > Lacy has 17 tackles (3 TFL), a forced fumble and a fumble recovery for a touchdown vs. UCLA.
- > **Reggie Topps** has played in the last 10 games with eight starts (5 at corner, 3 at nickel).
- > **Topps** has 40 tackles, is tied for third in sacks (4.0) and tied for fourth on the team in tackles for loss (5.5). He also has three pass breakups and two forced fumbles
- > **Topps** has two touchdowns this season, scoring on a 17-yard fumble return against Cal and a 21-yard interception return against Washington State.
- > Senior **Moe Lee** (11 games, 5 starts) has 33 tackles, leads Utah in pass breakups (6) and returned a fumble 47 yards for a touchdown against BYU.
- > **Lewis Walker** has played in nine games with two starts (WSU, Arizona). He has 13 total tackles, two pass breakups and a forced fumble.
- > Backing up Blechen and Rowe at safety are **Michael Walker** (9 games, 1 start, 7 tackles), **Terrell Reese** (8 games, 6 tackles) and **Tyron Morris-Edwards** (9 games, 2 starts, 16 tackles, 1 TFL, 2 pass breakups).
- > Out for the season with injuries are safety **Quade Chappuis** (5 games, 4 starts, 23 tackles, 1 forced fumble), and corner **Wykie Freeman** (4 games, 5 tackles).

RETURN GAME NOTEBOOK

- > Utah ranks 25th in the nation and second in the Pac-12 in kickoff return average (24.22) and is tied for the national lead in kickoff returns for touchdowns (3).
- > Utah's last two opponents (Washington and Arizona) have used short-field kick-offs to keep the ball away from NCAA record-setter **Reggie Dunn**.
- > **Dunn** is averaging 45.9 yards per kickoff return (9 for 413 yards), which would lead the nation if he had enough attempts to qualify for the rankings. The minimum to qualify is 1.2 returns per game.
- > **Dunn** owns or is tied for five NCAA kickoff return records. He ranks first in kickoff returns for a touchdown in a season (3), 100-yard kickoff returns for touchdowns in a career (4), 100-yard kickoff returns in a game (2 vs. California on Oct. 27) and kick return average in a game (74.0 vs. Cal). He is tied for the

NCAA record for kick return touchdowns in a game from any distance (2 vs. Cal).

- > **Dunn** has had three 100-yard kickoff returns this season (2 vs. Cal, 1 vs. WSU). His first career 100-yard kick return came against Iowa State in 2010.
- > **Dunn** is one of two players in the NCAA this season with more than one 100-yard kick return.
- > **Dunn** has the school record for kickoff returns for touchdowns from any distance in a season with three. The previous record of two was accomplished by Erroll Tucker in 1985 and Daniel Jones in 1998.
- > **Dunn** also has the school record for kickoff returns from any distance for touchdowns in a career (4).
- > **Dunn** was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week against Cal and WSU and was also the College Football Performance Awards National Kickoff Returner of the Week for those two games.
- > Charles Henderson leads Utah with 24 punt returns for 139 yards (5.8 average). He has also returned five kicks (68 yards).

KICKING GAME NOTEBOOK

- > Utah is third in the Pac-12 and 21st in the nation in net punting (39.3).
- > Four-year starter **Sean Sellwood** was selected as the CBSs-ports.com Midseason All-America punter.
- > **Sellwood** ranks first in the Pac-12 in punting average (46.9) and would rank third in the nation if he had enough punts to qualify. He has 36 punts for 1,690 yards.
- > **Sellwood** was ranked either first, second or third in the nation in punt average for the first nine weeks of the season.
- > **Sellwood** has a school-record 51 career punts of 50+ yards (15 this season). The previous record of 50 was held by former Ute All-American Louie Sakoda (2005-08).
- > **Sellwood** is tied the school single-game record for punts over 50 yards (6 against Utah State).
- > 15-of-36 of **Sellwood's** punts this season have been 50 yards or longer and he has placed eight punts inside the 20.
- > With 8,252 career punt yards, **Sellwood** ranks fourth all-time at Utah in punt yardage. He ranks fifth all-time in career punts (188), and needs two more to tie Hank Mondaca for fourth (190 from 1982-85).
- > Freshman punter **Tom Hackett** shares time with Sellwood and has played in eight games. Hackett has 20 punts, a 40.7 average and one punt over 50 yards.
- > A rugby-style punter, **Hackett's** specialty is planting his punts deep in opponent territory. He has placed 11 of his 20 punts inside the 20-yard line, including six inside the 10-yard line and four inside the 5-yard line.
- > **Hackett**, a walk-on from Australia, was named Pac-12 Player of the Week on Sept. 17 after all three of his punts against BYU were downed inside the 10-yard line. It was Hackett's first American football game.
- > Senior kicker **Coleman Petersen** is 6-for-11 (54.5%) in field goals and 3-for-5 from 40-49 yards.
- > **Petersen** is 3-of-5 in field goals in the last nine games.
- > In his career, **Petersen** has made 24-of-36 (66.7%) of his field goal attempts and is 7-of-15 from 40 yards and out.
- > **Petersen** has made 34-of-35 PATs this season and is 71-of-73 in his career.
- > Petersen scored his first career touchdown on a fake field goal

play (a 3-yard rush) against Arizona.

- > Utah is second in the Pac-12 in kickoff coverage (43.8).
- > Junior **Nick Marsh** is in his third season handling kickoffs. He has booted 52 of Utah's 53 kickoffs this season with 21 touchbacks and a 62.5-yard average. The team average is 61.6.

WHITTINGHAM SAYS

"Obviously, we are all very disappointed that we won't be heading to a bowl game this year. That being said, the entire focus this week is to regroup and send our seniors out on a high note. Our players and coaches have worked hard all season long and have not wavered in their commitment to this program. We have a competitive group of players and they will give their best effort this week against Colorado."

SELLING OUT

The Utes sold out every home game for the third-straight season and now have 18 straight sellouts in Rice-Eccles Stadium. Of the sellouts, 16 were played before standing-room crowds. The Utes averaged 45,347 fans to their six home games this season—the third-best total in school history behind 2008 (45,585) and 2010 (45,459)—and the fifth-straight season that their average exceeded Rice-Eccles Stadium's 45,017 seating capacity.

At age 25, Ute offensive coordinator **Brian Johnson** is the youngest coordinator in the country ... Utah has the second-youngest coaching staff in the nation (average age 37 years) behind Toledo (34.7 average) ... First-year cornerbacks coach **Sharrieff Shah** left a career as a trial attorney to coach at his alma mater. A certified agent through the NFL's Players Association and a former sideline reporter for Utah's flagship radio station ESPN700, Shah was a practicing attorney in Salt Lake City from 2001 until his hiring last spring ... Utah has five alumni coaches: **Johnson**, offensive coordinator/quarterbacks; **Shah**, cornerbacks; **Jay Hill**, running backs/special teams coordinator; **Chad Kauha'aha'a**, defensive line; and **Morgan Scalley**, safeties.
