- > Utah (4-7, 1-7 Pac-12) hosts Colorado (4-7, 1-7 Pac-12) in the season finale on Saturday, Nov. 30 at noon MST in Rice-Eccles Stadium. Tickets for the annual Senior Day are available at UtahUtes.com and 801-581-UTIX. The game will be televised on the Pac-12 Networks. Radio is ESPN700 AM. Satellite radio is Sirius 93/XM 193.
- > Saturday marks the final game for 19 seniors who will be recognized in a pregame ceremony. Ten of the seniors are starters. See Senior Sendoff for more.
- > In this week's NCAA rankings, Utah has the fifth-toughest schedule in the country (down from No. 2 a week ago). Utah's schedule has been rated among the nation's toughest all season. The combined FBS record of Utah's opponents is 64-30 and all of its first 11 FBS opponents are bowl eligible.
- > Utah ranks second in the nation in total sacks (36) and sacks per game (3.27).
- > Receiver Dres Anderson needs 92 yards against Colorado to become the seventh Ute to reach 1,000 receiving yards in a season. His 908 receiving yards currently stands ninth in school history.
- > Anderson has tied the school record for most 100-yard receiving games in a season with six. He shares the mark with Dennis Smith (1989) and Louis Thomas (1968).
- > Utah has dropped five straight games since beating Stanford on Oct. 12—the school's longest losing streak since a six-game skid in 2002.
- > Utah and Colorado are meeting for the 60th time (Utah's longest series against a Pac-12 opponent), but just the third time since 1962. The series is tied 14-14-2 in Salt Lake City and Colorado leads the overall series 31-25-3. See page 2 for complete series results.

# **UTAH-COLORADO SERIES**

#### Series Snapshot

Utah and Colorado will meet for the 60th time this fall—Utah's longest series against a Pac-12 team and the fifth-longest in school history. The series, which Colorado leads 31-25-3, is tied 14-14-2 in Salt Lake City. Played annually from 1903-1962 with four exceptions, the rivalry went dormant for 49 years before it resumed in 2011. Last season, Utah's 42-35 win in Boulder was its first over the Buffs since 1962.

Trevor Reilly intercepted the game's first pass and Utah took a 7-0 lead on the next play to jump start a 42-35 win. However, the Buffs would match Utah score-for-score until Reggie Dunn returned the fifth 100-yard kickoff return of his career (an NCAA record) for the winning TD with 8:12 left on the clock. John White rushed for 168 yards and Utah's four interceptions matched its season total entering the game.

#### TWO MINUTE DRILL

Senior cornerback Keith McGill has been invited to play in the Senior Bowl ... Adam Schulz's 347 yards against WSU last week was the most passing yards in a game by a Ute quarterback since Jordan Wynn threw for 362 yards against San Diego State in 2010 ... Dres Anderson leads the nation with seven receptions of 50 yards or longer and the Utes are tied for third nationally in plays of 50+ yards from scrimmage with 13 ... Last week against Washington State marked the first time since 2004 that Utah has had two 100-yard receivers in a game: Anderson (129 yards) and Jake Murphy (102 yards) ... Utah (4-7 this season and 5-7 a year ago) will have back-to-back losing seasons for the first time since 1989 (4-8) and 1990 (4-7) ... Utah has not played a home game on Nov. 30 since 1933 (a win over Colorado State) and its last Nov. 30 game was a 1974 loss at LSU ... Utah and Colorado are 1-1 as members of the Pac-12 Conference but Utah owns a 20-18-2 lead in all-time conference games. The two schools were members of the Rocky Mountain Conference from 1910-37 and the Big Seven Conference from 1938-1947 ... Utah is 0-4 against the Pac-12 South season and 3-11 overall. The Utes are 1-3 this season and 5-7 overall against the Pac-12 North.

# **LEADERS OF THE PAC**

Utah leads the Pac-12 in net punting (40.04), sacks (36), sacks per game (3.27), PAT percentage (1.000/38-38) and onside kicks recovered (2-2) ... Senior cornerback **Keith McGill** is tied for the Pac-12 lead in pass breakups (10) ... Sophomore punter **Tom Hackett** leads the Pac-12 in punt average (43.7) and punts of 50+ yards (17). He is tied for the longest punt (70 yards) and ranks second in punts inside the 20-yard line (24) ... Freshman kicker **Andy Phillips** is tied for first in PAT percentage (1.000/38-38) and second in field goals per game (1.45) ... Junior receiver **Dres Anderson** leads the Pac-12 and is ninth in the nation in yards per catch (19.7) ... Senior defensive end **Trevor Reilly** ranks second in the league in sacks (8.5), sack average (0.77), fumble recoveries (3) and fumble recoveries per game (0.27). ## **QUARTERBACK WOES**

For the fourth-straight season, Utah has lost its starting quarterback to injury. Starting sophomore quarterback **Travis Wilson** is out for the season and perhaps longer after suffering a concussion against Arizona State on Nov. 9. The Utes have not had the same quarterback start and complete a season since 2008, when **Brian Johnson** (now Utah's co-offensive coordinator) quarterbacked all of Utah's games in a 13-0 season. Bubba Poole, Kelvin York and Lucky Radley are listed as the "co" starters at running back this week ... If starting linebacker Jared Norris is unable to play again this week (he has missed the last two games with injury), Quade Chappuis will be the backup to Jacoby Hale at rover linebacker ... Starting cornerback Davion Orphey missed last week's game at WSU with an injury ... Offensive linemen Jeremiah Poutasi, Jeremiah Tofaeono and Vyncent Jones have played every offensive snap for the past eight games ... Eight true freshmen have played: DT Sam Tevi, DB Hipolito Corporan, TE Siale Fakailoatonga, LB Uaea Masina, WR Dominque Hatfield, DE/LB Pita Taumoepenu, SN Chase Dominguez and RB Marcus Sanders-Williams. Dominguez has started in every game and Fakailoatonga has one start.

## **LAST WEEK**

Utah clawed back from a 21-0 first-quarter deficit to get within six points of Washington State in the fourth quarter, only to fall in the end, 49-37. **Adam Schulz**, making his second career start, threw back-to-back pick-sixes in the opening minutes before recovering to pass for a career-high 347 yards and three touchdowns. For the first time since 2004, Utah had two 100-yard receivers in a game in **Dres Anderson** (129 yards) and **Jake Murphy** (102 yards), while **Kelvin York** rushed for a career-high 94 yards. **Michael Walker** and **Justin Thomas** each had seven tackles to lead the defense.

#### **UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD**

Utah's all-time football record is 632-442-31. The Utes are 386-182-16 at home (68-25 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 227-243-12 in road games and 19-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

## WHITTINGHAM FILE

Ninth-year Utah head coach **Kyle Whittingham**, the 2008 National Coach of the Year, has a 75-39 career record that includes seven bowl victories—among them a 2009 Sugar Bowl win over No. 4 Alabama. His teams have played in eight bowl games and won seven. For more on Whittingham, see sidebar on page 2.

#### **QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK**

- > 6'7", 240-pound sophomore **Travis Wilson** is out for the year and possibly longer after tests for a concussion suffered against ASU on Nov. 9 uncovered a previous injury to an intracranial artery. For more, see "Wilson Lost for Season" later in this release.
- > Sophomore **Adam Schulz** (pronounced Schultz) has started the last two games in place of Wilson and is 0-2 as the starter this season and in his career.
- > **Schulz** has played in five games this season and six games in his career. He also relieved **Wilson** earlier this season in the second half against both Arizona and USC as Wilson dealt with a hand injury.
- > **Schulz** (Muskego, Wis./Muskego HS) walked on to the team in 2011 and was awarded a scholarship last spring.
- > **Schulz** has completed 56-of-121 passes (46.3%) for 775 yards and five touchdowns (4 interceptions) in games against Weber State, Arizona, USC, Oregon and Washington State.
- > **Schulz** has also rushed 20 times for 58 yards and a touchdown.
- > **Schulz** threw for a career-high 347 yards and three touchdowns (2 interceptions) last week against Washington State.
- > Schulz's 347-yard effort vs. WSU was the best by a Ute quarter-back since Jordan Wynn threw for 362 yards against San Diego State in 2010. Schultz had completions of 64, 57 and 47 yards to contribute to his total.
- > Number two on the depth chart is true freshman **Conner Manning** (Lake Forest Calif./El Toro HS).
- > In high school, **Manning** broke Matt Barkley's Orange County record for single-season passing yards, throwing for 4,219 yards and 41 touchdowns in his junior season in 2011. His 9,449 career passing yards ranks second in Orange County history behind Barkley's 9,471 yards.

## **RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK**

- > Sophomore **Bubba Poole** leads Utah in carries (146), net yards (606) and rushing yards per game (55.1). He also has two touchdowns.
- > **Poole** ranks eighth in the Pac-12 in both rushing yards (606) and rushing yards per game (55.1).
- > **Poole** has two 100-yard games: 117 yards vs. Oregon State and 111 yards vs. Stanford. He had 96 yards against BYU.
- > **Poole** is third on the team in receptions (29) and fifth in receiving yards (229). He had a career-high 75 receiving yards against Stanford.
- > **Poole** is second on the team in all-purpose yards (955), which includes 606 rushing yards, 229 receiving yards, 82 yards in punt returns and 38 yards in kickoff returns.
- > In eight games (he missed three with injury), senior **Kelvin York** ranks second on the team in carries (87) and third in net yards (331). He has four touchdowns.
- > **York** had a career-high 94 yards on 25 carries with two touchdowns last week against Washington State, after missing the Oregon game the week prior.

- > Radley netted a career-high 111 yards against Weber State.
- > Radley also has 11 receptions for 80 yards and a touchdown.
- > When Utah goes with a two-back set, senior **Karl Williams** (15 rushes, 51 yards, 1 TD) is the primary addition.

#### RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

- > Junior **Dres Anderson** leads the Pac-12 and is ninth in the nation in yards per reception (19.74). He is fourth in the conference in receiving yards per game (82.5).
- > **Anderson** leads Utah in receptions (46), receiving yards (908), yards per game (82.5) and touchdown catches (7).
- > **Anderson** needs 92 yards to become the seventh Ute to reach 1,000 receiving yards in a season. His 908 receiving yards currently stands ninth in school history.
- > **Anderson's** 908 receiving yards is almost three times more than his team-leading 365 yards last year.
- > Anderson has six 100-yard receiving games this season, which ties him for the school record with **Dennis Smith** (1989) and **Louis Thomas** (1968).
- > All six of **Anderson's** career 100-yard games have come this season: 141 vs. BYU, 129 vs. Washington State, 106 vs. UCLA, 103 vs. Weber State, 101 vs. Oregon State and 100 vs. Arizona State.
- > **Anderson** is tied for first in the nation in receptions of 50 yards or longer with seven.
- > Anderson's seven TD catches is tied for eighth-most in a season at Utah.
- > **Anderson** has 13 career touchdown catches, which is tied for the ninth-best mark at Utah (with five others).
- > **Anderson** leads Utah in all-purpose yards per game (104.6), including 908 receiving yards, 213 yards in kick returns and 30 rushing yards. He also has a team-best eight touchdowns (7 receiving, 1 rushing).
- > **Sean Fitzgerald** ranks second on the team in receptions (31), receiving yards (455) and touchdown catches (5).
- > **Anthony Denham** ranks fourth in catches (24) and third in receiving yards (291). He had a career-high 113 yards vs. Utah State.
- > Backups are **Geoffrey Norwood** (2 starts, 12 catches, 148 yards) and **Dominique Hatfield** (4 catches, 84 yards).

- > Murphy had his first career 100-yard receiving game (102 yards) last week against Washington State. He also scored two touchdowns, including one on a career-long 64-yard reception.
- > True freshman **Siale Fakailoatonga** (2 catches for 18 yards) has appeared in nine games, including the last eight.
- > Fakailoatonga made his first career start against Arizona State.
- > Senior **Westlee Tonga** will redshirt. Tonga was injured in game four.

## **OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK**

- > Left tackle **Jeremiah Poutasi** (also referred to as Cedrick or C.J.), left guard **Jeremiah Tofaeono**, center **Vyncent Jones** and right guard **Junior Salt** have started in every game. At right tackle, **Siaosi Aiono** has played in nine games with eight starts and **Isaac Asiata** has played in five games with two starts.
- > Sophomore left tackle **Poutasi** is second on the line in total plays with 784.
- > **Poutasi** is second on the team in cuts (6) and tied for second in pancake blocks (8). He has 14 knockdowns.
- > **Poutasi** has Utah's best 2013 single-game totals for pancake blocks (4) and knockdowns (5, tied). Both game highs came against BYU.
- > **Aiono**, a sophomore, and **Asiata**, a freshman, are co-starters at right tackle. Both also took reps at right guard against WSU.
- > **Aiono** has participated in 611 plays with two cuts and seven knockdowns.
- > In just 197 plays, **Asiata** leads the Utes in cuts with eight and has one pancake block and two knockdowns. He has not allowed a sack.
- > **Asiata's** four cuts against WSU is a single-game best this season for Utah.
- > **Jones**, a senior in his first year starting at center after playing guard his first three years (where he started in 2012), has played 783 snaps.
- > **Jones** is tied for the team lead in knockdowns (18) and is tied for second in pancake blocks (8).
- > **Jones'** eight knockdowns vs. BYU is the best single-game total by a Ute this season. He had three pancake blocks and three knockdowns against Stanford.
- > Senior left guard **Tofaeono** leads the line in total plays (786) and leads the team lead in pancake blocks (9). He has 17 knockdowns and a cut.
- > **Tofaeono** has not allowed a sack this season.
- > Junior right guard **Salt** has been on the field for 775 plays. He is tied for first on the team in knockdowns (18) and has five pancake blocks.
- > **Salt** had five knockdowns against Stanford.

## **DEFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK**

- > Of Utah's 36 sacks (second in the NCAA), 25 have been credited to the defensive line.
- > All-conference candidates in the front four include senior end **Trevor Reilly**, senior tackle **Tenny Palepoi** and junior end **Nate Orchard**.
- > Reilly primarily plays defensive end, although he also plays linebacker depending on Utah's defensive alignment. He has eight starts at defensive end (Weber State, BYU, UCLA, Stanford, USC, ASU, Oregon and WSU) and three starts at linebacker (USU, OSU and Arizona).
- > **Reilly's** 86 total tackles ranks fifth in the Pac-12 and leads Utah. He is sixth in the conference and second on the team in tackles per game (7.8).
- > **Reilly**, who also led Utah in tackles a year with 69 when he primarily played linebacker, is poised to become the first defensive lineman to lead the Utes in tackles since All-American Luther Elliss in 1992.
- > **Reilly** also leads Utah in solo tackles with 52.
- > **Reilly** has been in double-digit tackles three times this season, with a career-high 14 tackles against Arizona, and has led Utah in tackles in three games (Stanford, Arizona, USC).
- > **Reilly** is third in the Pac-12 and 18th in the nation in tackles for loss per game (1.4), while ranking second in the league (20th in the nation) in sacks per game (0.8).
- > **Reilly's** 15.0 tackles for loss (third in the Pac-12) and 8.5 sacks (second in the league) both lead the Utes.
- > **Reilly** has 36 career tackles for loss—third in school history—for 198 yards (fourth).
- > **Reilly** has 20 career sacks—tied for fifth in school history—for 144 yards (fourth).
- > **Reilly's** three fumble recoveries is tied for sixth in the country and second in the Pac-12. He is tied for second in the Pac-12 and is tied for 19th in the nation in fumble recoveries per game (0.27).
- > **Reilly's** six career fumble recoveries ties him for fourth in school history.
- > **Reilly** ranks second all-time at Utah in career forced fumbles with eight (1 this year).
- > **Reilly** also has two pass breakups.
- > **Orchard** is tied for 15th in the country and is fourth in the Pac-12 in forced fumbles (3). He is tied for 25th nationally and fifth in the league in forced fumbles per game (0.27). He also has a fumble recovery.
- > **Orchard** has five career forced fumbles, which is tied for the fifth most in school history.
- > **Orchard** is tied for third on the team in sacks (3.5) and is third on the team in tackles for loss (9.0).
- > Orchard has 46 tackles and a pass breakup.
- > **Orchard** was the *Athlon Sports* National Defensive Player of the Week for his part in Utah's upset win over No. 5 Stanford on Oct. 12, when he recorded two sacks, forced two fumbles and had five total tackles. > **Palepoi** is tied for third on the team in sacks (3.5) and has 8.5 tackles for loss (fourth on the team).
- > **Palepoi** has 45 total tackles. He led Utah in tackles against Weber State, collecting eight in one half of play.
- > Senior tackle **LT Tuipulotu** has played in all 11 games with 10 starts. He has 40 tackles, 3.0 TFL and 1.5 sacks, four pass breakups (fourth on the team), and a fumble recovery.
- > **Tuipulotu** had a career-high seven tackles with a pass breakup against Oregon. He followed that with five tackles and two pass breakups against Washington State.
- > Redshirt freshman end **Hunter Dimick**, who has played in all 11 games with three starts (USU, OSU, Arizona), has 26 tackles with 1.5 TFL (1 sack).
- > Sophomore tackle **Viliseni Fauonuku** (1 start, 11 tackles, 1.0 sack) has played in the last three games after missing six games with an injury.

## LINEBACKER NOTEBOOK

- > Hybrid defender **Trevor Reilly**, who starts at either defensive end or linebacker, depending on Utah's defensive alignment, is one of 12 semifinalists for the Butkus Award, which honors the nation's best college linebacker. See Defensive Line Notebook for more on Reilly.
- > Jason Whittingham is averaging 7.9 tackles per game to lead Utah and rank fifth in the Pac-12. Even missing the first two games with an injury, Whittingham stands second on the team in tackles (71) and has 5.0 TFL (1.0 sack) and three pass breakups.
- > Whittingham had a career-high 14 tackles against Arizona State, his third double-digit tackle game of the season and his second game as Utah's tackle leader. He had 2.5 TFL and a sack against the Sun Devils.
- > Whittingham forced a fumble, recovered a fumble and had two pass breakups while totaling six tackles against Washington State
- > Despite missing three games with injury, **Jacoby Hale** is second on the team in sacks with 6.5 (0.8 per game).
- > **Hale's** 35 total tackles includes 10.0 tackles for loss (second on the team). He also has three pass breakups.
- > Sophomore **Jared Norris**, who has not played in the last two games due to injury, is fifth on the team in tackles (64) and has 4.5 TFL, two sacks, two pass breakups and two forced fumbles.
- > **Norris** is averaging 7.1 tackles per game.
- > **Norris** has two double-digit tackle performances this season, including a career-high 14 tackles against Arizona. His 12 tackles against UCLA included 2.5 TFL and two sacks.
- > **Norris** has led Utah in tackles in three games (BYU, UCLA and Arizona).
- > **Quade Chappuis** (8 tackles) and **V.J. Fehoko** (1 start, 19 tackles) are the primary subs.

## **SECONDARY NOTEBOOK**

- > Junior free safety **Eric Rowe** has played in and started 34 games since his true freshman season, when he was named a Freshman All-American.
- > **Rowe** is tied for seventh in the Pac-12 in pass breakups with seven. He has 21 career pass breakups (tied for seventh all-time at Utah).
- > **Rowe** is Utah's third-leading tackler with 68 stops.
- > Rowe has reached double-digit tackles twice, making 10 tackles against both Utah State and Arizona. He has five career double-digit tackle games.
- > Senior strong safety **Michael Walker** has started all 11 games and his 66 tackles is fourth on the team.
- > Walker has 4.0 TFL (1 sack), an interception and five pass breakups.
- > Senior corner **Keith McGill** is tied for the Pac-12 lead in pass breakups (10) and is tied for fourth in the league in passes defended (11) and passes defended per game (1.0).
- > McGill has one interception, which he returned 19 yards for a touchdown against UCLA. He has 31 tackles.
- > JC transfer **Davion Orphey** has played in 10 games with seven starts (missed the WSU game with an injury). He has 28 tackles and three pass breakups.
- > Orphey shares the starting job with redshirt freshman Justin

**Thomas** (23 tackles, 2.5 TFL, 2 pass breakups). **Thomas** has also played at nickel.

- > Thomas had a career-high seven tackles against Washington State.
- > Senior nickel back **Mike Honeycutt** has 26 total tackles with 3.0 TFL (1 sack) and one pass breakup. He has a forced fumble and a fumble recovery on special teams.
- > Honeycutt had a career-high six tackles against WSU.
- > Freshman **Reginald Porter** has played in all 11 games with two starts at corner. He has 10 tackles and a pass breakup.
- > **Porter** intercepted a two-point conversion in the fourth quarter against Washington State. He also recovered a fumble.

#### **KICKING NOTEBOOK**

- > 24-year-old redshirt freshman kicker **Andy Phillips** is a former five-year member of the U.S. Ski Team (2007-11) and had never played in a football game at any level prior to this season. He played soccer for one season in high school as a freshman.
- > **Phillips** was named to the ESPN.com and SI.com Midseason All-America teams and is one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Placekicker Award.
- > **Phillips** is 16-of-19 (84.2%) in field goals this season and 38-of-38 in PATs. He is tied for third in the Pac-12 in field goals made and fourth in field goal percentage, and is tied for first in PAT percentage (1.000).
- > **Phillips'** 16 made field goals is the sixth most in school history for a season.
- > **Phillips** made a career-long 51-yard field goal in the second quarter against Arizona State, Utah's longest field goal since 2008.
- > **Phillips** is 8-for-10 in field goals from 40 yards and out with makes of 51, 48, 45, 44 (twice), 43, 42 and 41 yards. His misses were from 40, 42 and 32 yards.
- > **Phillips** is fourth in the Pac-12 in kick-scoring points with 86. He leads the Utes in scoring.
- > **Phillips** made every field goal attempt in the first six games of his football career, starting the season 11-of-11, which tied the fourth-longest streak in school history.
- > **Phillips** has successfully executed 2-of-2 onside kicks that were recovered by his teammates (vs. Utah State and UCLA).
- > **Phillips** set a school record for PATs against Weber State, making 10-of-10.
- > **Phillips** was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week against Stanford.
- > **Phillips** has 53 kickoffs with 11 touchbacks and is averaging 60.1 yards per kickoff.
- > As a team, Utah has kicked off 64 times with 15 touchbacks.
- > **Jon Halliday** kicked off twice against WSU in his first career appearance.

## **PUNTING NOTEBOOK**

- > Utah leads the Pac-12 and ranks 12th in the nation in net punting (40.04).
- > Sophomore punter **Tom Hackett** leads the Pac-12 and ranks 20th in the nation, averaging 43.3 yards on 69 punts (2,991 yards).
- > **Hackett's** 69 punts are fifth-most in a season at Utah while his 2,991 yards is fourth all-time in a season.
- > **Hackett** leads the Pac-12 in punts of 50 yards and longer with 17 (fourth-most in a season at Utah). He booted a career-long 70-yard punt against Arizona State, the 15th-longest punt in school history.
- > **Hackett** is second in the Pac-12 in punts inside the 20-yard line with 24. He has placed 34.7% of his punts inside the 20-yard line (24-of-69), including nine inside the 10.
- > **Hackett** has placed 41.5% of his career punts (39-of-94) inside the 20-yard line. He has 16 punts inside the 10- and eight inside the 5-yard line.
- > Hackett has just six touchbacks in his career (5 this season).
- > **Hackett's** 11 punts vs. BYU tied for the second-most in school single-game history.
- > **Hackett** owns two of the top-five punting yard games at Utah. His 486 punting yards against BYU ranks second all-time while his 455 yards punting against ASU ranks fifth.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK**

- > True freshman long snapper **Chase Dominguez** has performed all 126 snaps without a mistake. He also recovered a fumble on a kickoff return by Arizona.
- > **Geoffrey Norwood** is third in the Pac-12 and 30th in the nation in punt return average (9.2) with 25 returns for 231 yards.
- > **Norwood** had a career-long 40-yard punt return against USC as part of a career-high 67 yards in punt returns (three returns).
- > Utah varies its kick returners and four players have at least six kickoff returns: **Dres Anderson** (10 returns, 213 yards,
- 21.3 average), **Delshawn McClellon** (9 returns, 19 yards,
- 21.7 average), **Dominique Hatfield** led Utah in kick returns against Washington State with seven returns for 116 yards (16.6 average) and **Charles Henderson** (6 returns, 88 yards, 14.7 average).
- > All seven of **Hatfield's** returns came last week against WSU.
- > **Anderson** (4 returns, 89 yards) and **Henderson** (4 returns, 55 yards) both set career highs for kick return yards against Oregon.

## WILSON LOST FOR SEASON

Two-year starting sophomore quarterback **Travis Wilson** was lost for the season and possibly longer after suffering a concussion against ASU on Nov. 9. A subsequent angiogram revealed what appears to be a previous injury to an intracranial artery. Doctors do not believe it is life threatening and there is a possibility Wilson could play football in the future if it remains stable. His condition will be further evaluated with follow-up testing in the next few months. Prior to the concussion, the 6'7", 240-pound native of San Clemente, Calif., had played in all 21 games as true freshman and sophomore. In 2012, he became just the fourth true freshman quarterback to start a game for Utah since the NCAA restored freshman eligibility in 1972. His first start came against UCLA on Oct. 13, 2012 in the Rose

Bowl (a 21-14 UCLA win). Season and career notes on Wilson follow.

- > In the first six games of the season, he led Utah to a 4-2 record, including an upset win over undefeated and No. 5-ranked Stanford.
- > An injury to Wilson's throwing hand caused him to sit out the second half of the two games following the Stanford win losses to Arizona and USC. His final game was against Arizona State on Nov. 9.
- > Wilson finished the season with a 4-5 record, completing 56.1 percent of his passes (133-of-237) for 1,827 yards and 16 touchdowns (16 INT).
- > In his career, he is 7-9 as the starter, completing 261-of-441 (59.1%) for 3,138 yards and 23 touchdowns (22 interceptions). > Wilson averaged 203.0 yards passing and 42.9 yards rushing per game this season.
- > Wilson had six 200 yards passing games this season, including one 300-yard game (302 vs. Utah State), and eight in his career. His career high was 311 yards against Arizona in 2012. > Utah's second-leading rusher when his season came to a premature close, Wilson rushed 81 times for 386 yards (4.8 average) and five TDs. His 142 rushing yards vs. Oregon State was the second-most in a game by a Utah quarterback and the most since 1979. He also passed for 279 yards in the overtime loss to the Beavers and totaled three rushing touchdowns and two passing TDs.
- > Wilson was named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week and the *Athlon Sports* National Offensive Player of the Week for his role in Utah's victory over BYU on Sept. 21. He completed 24-of-35 passes for 273 yards and two touchdowns with no interceptions against the Cougars in a 20-13 win in Provo.

## **HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS**

"Although this has been an extremely difficult season for our team and our fans, we couldn't have asked for anything more out of our players from an effort standpoint. They have fought in every game right down to the bitter end and they have worked hard every day in practice. Our objective now is to send this senior class out with a win against Colorado in Rice-Eccles Stadium. College football is all about the players and we're hoping our fans will give them all of their support on Saturday."

## **CAPACITY CROWDS**

Utah has 24 straight sellouts in Rice-Eccles Stadium extending back to the season-opener against Pittsburgh in 2010. Of the sellouts, 21 were played before standing-room only crowds that exceeded Rice-Eccles Stadium's 45,017-seat capacity. For the sixth-consecutive season, all 32,000 allotted season tickets were sold to Utah's home football games.

## **COACHES' CORNER**

Utah is the only school in the country with two National Coach of the Year recipients on its staff: Whittingham in 2008 and **Dennis Erickson** in 2000 ... Second-year cornerbacks coach **Sharrieff Shah** was a trial attorney in Salt Lake City from 2001 until 2012, when he joined the Ute football staff ... Utah has four alumni coaches: **Brian Johnson**, co-offensive coordinator/quarterbacks; **Shah**, cornerbacks; **Jay Hill**, tight ends/special teams coordinator; and **Morgan Scalley**, safeties.

#### **STORY LINES**

Senior DE/LB **Trevor Reilly** played all last season with a torn ACL suffered the spring prior. Reilly's baby daughter Shayn is undergoing treatment for kidney cancer ... Freshman kicker Andy Phillips had never played in a football game at any level prior to this season. He is a former five-year member of the U.S. Ski Team (2007-11) ... Jared Norris attended a pro skateboarding camp (Camp Woodward), and at 6-1, 230 pounds, was the biggest skateboarder ever to attend ... SALT LAKE CITY— Travis Wilson passed for 264 yards and three touchdowns, and rushed for 93 yards and two scores to lead Utah to a 70-7 romp over Weber State. Utah's 628 yards of total offense was tied for the eighthmost in school history, even with Wilson and all of Utah's starters watching the entire second half from the sideline after rolling up a 49-0 halftime lead. Among Wilson's big plays were an 80-yard touchdown pass to Sean Fitzgerald and a 51-yard touchdown run. Dres Anderson had a career-high 103 receiving yards and a score in the first half and running back Lucky Radley paced the offense in the second half, running for a career-high 111 yards and two touchdowns.
