- > Nineteen seniors will suit up for their final home game Saturday. They will be honored in a pre-game ceremony. For more on the seniors, see Senior Sendoff.
- > With an 8-3 record, Utah will finish its season in a bowl game for the 10th time under **Kyle Whittingham** (nine as head coach, one as co-head coach of the 2005 Fiesta Bowl team). Whittingham is tied for the best bowl win percentage in NCAA history with an 8-1 record (88.9%).
- > Utah, tied for first in the Pac-12 South Division with a 5-3 league mark, will finish above .500 in conference play for the second-straight season.
- > Utah ranks in the top 10 nationally in four statistical categories, including No. 1 in net punting (43.44). See Utah Statchat (page 2) for more.
- > Utah has the Pac-12's leading punter (**Tom Hackett**) and kicker (**Andy Phillips**). Both are semifinalists for the two major awards at their position—the Ray Guy Award and the Lou Groza Award.

In the Rankings

- > The Utes are ranked No. 25 in this week's Coaches' poll.
- > After 11 weeks in the AP Top 25, the Utes slipped out of the rankings with last Saturday's 17-9 loss to UCLA. Utah is the leading vote getter among the others receiving votes in the latest AP rankings.
- > The new College Football Playoff rankings will be released on Tuesday. Utah has appeared in every CFP weekly ranking since the system was installed last season and was No. 13 last week.

Utah-Colorado Series (27-31-3)

Series Snapshot: At 61 games, this is Utah's longest rivalry against a Pac-12 team and the fifth-longest rivalry in school history. Although Colorado leads 31-27-3 overall, Utah has a 15-14-2 advantage in Salt Lake City. The Utes have won three straight and are 3-1 against the Buffs as members of the Pac-12. Played annually from 1903-1962 with four exceptions, the rivalry went dormant for 49 years before it resumed in 2011.

With Utah trailing Colorado 34-31 in the fourth quarter, Dominique Hatfield intercepted a pass and returned it 20 yards for the go-ahead touchdown in a 38-34 Utah win. Travis Wilson passed for 311 yards and three touchdowns (two to Kaelin Clay). Andy Phillips made both of his field goal attempts and Tom Hackett's 70-yard punt from the Utah 10-yard line gave CU too much ground to cover on its last offensive series. Jason Fanaika had eight tackles, including three of Utah's seven total tackles for loss.

Two-Minute Drill

Utah has played Colorado 61 times (trailing the series 31-27-3)—its most games against a Pac-12 opponent and the fifth-longest rivalry in school history ... The Utes are 3-1 against the Buffs as members of the Pac-12 and have won the last three games. In the four Pac-12 meetings, the two teams are separated by just 3.75 points a game (Utah holds a 118-103 advantage in total points scored) ... **Kyle Whittingham** is assured of his ninth winning season in 11 seasons as Utah's head coach ... Utah is on pace to break its season attendance record for home games. Utah is averaging 46,652 fans in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which seats 45,807—ahead of the school mark set last year of 46,436. In the Huddle

After a 6-0 start to the season, Utah has since lost 10 starters for one or more games, including leading running back **Devontae Booker** for the season and leading receiver **Britain Covey** (return TBD). Other starters who have missed games are tight end **Evan Moeai** (season), tight end **Siale Fakailoatonga** (season), safety **Chase Hansen** (season), linebacker **Jared Norris**, defensive end **Hunter Dimick**, center **Siaosi Aiono**, cornerback **Reginald Porter** and defensive tackle **Filipo Mokofisi** ... Senior **Bubba Poole** replaces Covey as the starting slot back and is also the No. 2 running back ... Filling in for Covey on special teams are **Boobie Hobbs** (punt returns) and **Corey Butler-Byrd** (kickoff returns) ... Starting stud linebacker **Jason Whittingham** will also back up **Kylie Fitts** at left end ... Six true freshmen have played—**Covey**, **Tyrone Smith**, **Cody Barton**, **Austin Lee**, **Caleb Repp** and **Taylor Loomis**—and three (Covey, Smith and Repp) have started.

Standing Ovation

Utah has sold out 37 consecutive games in Rice-Eccles stadium, dating back to the 2010 season opener. Of the sellouts, 34 were played before standing-room only crowds, including all six home games this season. The top-two crowds in school history have come this season (47,825 vs. Michigan and 47,798 vs. Cal).

Weekly Winners

Utah has earned eight Pac-12 Player of the Week awards, including two by **Gionni Paul** (defense vs. Utah State and Washington) and **Tom Hackett** (special teams vs. Oregon and California). Other winners are **Justin Thomas** (defense vs. Michigan), **Cory Butler-Byrd** (special teams vs. Fresno State), **Travis Wilson** (offense vs. Oregon) and **Devontae Booker** (offense vs. California). **Paul** was named the Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week against Washington, while **Wilson** (Maxwell Award Player of the Week) and **Hackett** (Ray Guy Award Player of the Week) earned national recognition for their work against Oregon. After Utah's win over Cal, **Kyle Whittingham** was named the Dodd Trophy Coach of the Week and **Andy Phillips** was named a Lou Groza National Place-Kicker Award "Star of the Week." Last Game

The Utes held UCLA to a season scoring low but failed to score a touchdown of their own in a 17-9 loss at Rice-Eccles Stadium. **Andy Phillips** scored all of Utah's points, making field goal attempts of 39, 39 and 21 yards. **Joe Williams** rushed for 121 yards in his first career start and also had 31 receiving yards for an offense hampered by the loss of leading rusher **Devontae Booker** and leading receiver **Britain Covey**. After UCLA got off to a 10-0 first-quarter start, Phillips scored nine unanswered points over the next two quarters to cut the gap to one (10-9). UCLA scored the go-ahead touchdown in the third quarter and neither team scored in the fourth. **Jared Norris** (11 tackles), **Gionni Paul** (10 tackles) and **Kylie Fitts** (7 tackles, 3 pass breakups) led the defense.

Utah's All-Time Record

Utah's all-time football record is 650-449-31. The Utes are 395-186-16 at home (77-29 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 235-246-12 in road games and 20-17-3 in games played at neutral sites.

Utah vs. the Pac-12

Utah is 19-25 in league games as a conference member and 95-144-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools. The series breakdown follows: Arizona (1-4/20-19-2), Arizona State (1-4/7-20), California (2-1/5-5), Colorado (3-1/27-31-3), Oregon (1-2/9-20), Oregon State (3-2/8-11-1), Stanford (2-0/4-3), UCLA (2-3/3-11), USC (1-4/4-10), Washington (1-2/1-8), Washington State (2-2/7-7).

Whittingham File

In his 11th season as Utah's head coach **Kyle Whittingham**—the 2008 National Coach of the Year—has the second-most wins in school history and a 93-46 career record. Earlier this season, he was named the CBSSports.com Midseason Coach of the Year and he is currently a semifinalist for the George Munger Coach of the Year Award. He was the Dodd Trophy Coach of the Week for Utah's win over California. Whittingham boasts an 8-1 bowl record that includes a 2009 Sugar Bowl win over No. 4 Alabama. He is tied for the best bowl win percentage in NCAA FBS history (88.9%) with former USC coach John Robinson. See the sidebar on page 2 for more on Whittingham.

> Junior **Andy Phillips**, a Lou Groza Award semifinalist and leading candidate to repeat as the All-Pac-12 first-team field goal kicker, leads the Pac-12 in field goals made (21).

> **Phillips**, who is 21-of-25 overall (84.0%), has made 20-of-22 field goal attempts in the last nine games, including his last eight tries.

> **Phillips** is a perfect 13-of-13 inside 40 yards and 8-of-12 from 40+ (1-of-1 from 50+). His misses were all from 45 yards and out with an average miss of 47 yards.

> **Phillips** leads the Pac-12 (tied for fifth in the nation) with 1.91 made field goals per game. Utah is tied for fourth in the nation with 21 total field goals (2.3 per game).

> **Phillips** is second in the Pac-12 in scoring (9.4 ppg).

> A three-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist, **Phillips** has won the Lou Groza Award "Star of the Week" three times this season (California, Washington and Arizona) and four times in his career.

> **Phillips** is the school record holder in field goals made (61) and attempted (73) in a career. He currently ranks third in career field goal percentage (83.6).

> **Phillips** is 29-of-38 (76.3%) in his career from 40+ yards and 4-of-4 from 50+ yards (career long of 53).

SALT LAKE CITY—A smothering defensive effort and a 20-point offensive outburst in the fourth quarter led No. 4 Utah to its first victory over Arizona State since 1976, 34-18. The Sun Devils did not score an offensive touchdown, instead getting their points on a kickoff return, safety and three field goals. Taking advantage of Utah miscues on special teams, the Sun Devils took an 18-14 lead into the fourth quarter only to see the Utes explode for 20 straight points. Devontae Booker scored two touchdowns during the decisive fourth quarter, when he piled up 101 of his 118 rushing yards. Travis Wilson passed for a season-high 297 yards—completing 26-of-36 passes—and Kenneth Scott had his first career 100-yard receiving game with 116 yards and a touchdown. Andy Phillips made field goals of 44 and 35 yards to give Utah a nine-point cushion (27-18) with 4:20 remaining. The ferocious Utah defense, which held ASU to just 15 yards rushing, was paced by linebackers Gionni Paul (11 tackles, 1.0 TFL) and Jared Norris (9 tackles, 2.0 TFL).
