WASHINGTON at COLORADO Dawgs And Buffs Set For Morning Game In Boulder

THE GAME: A week after playing in a game that ended after 11:00 p.m., the Washington football team (5-3 overall, 1-3 Pac-12) travels to Boulder to face Colorado (2-6 overall, 0-5 Pac-12) in an 11:00 a.m. MT (10:00 a.m. PT) game Saturday at Folsom Field. The game will air live on the Pac-12 Networks. Washington is trying to break a brief, two-game losing streak (both to teams ranked in the top 15 in the nation) while the Buffaloes have lost four in a row, including two in overtime and another by just five points. After the trip to Boulder, the Huskies are back at home the following Saturday, Nov. 8, as UCLA makes a visit to Husky Stadium.

QUICK SLANTS: Washington leads the nation with six defensive touchdowns (four by Shag Thompson, and two from John Timu) ... Temple has scored five and eight other teams have four ... Washington ranks second in the nation with 34 sacks, one short of the national leader, Utah (35) ... senior Hau'oli Kikaha, who broke the UW career sacks record and tied the single-season record last Saturday vs. ASU, leads the nation with 14.5 sacks ... no one else has more than 11.0 ... Kikaha also leads the nation in tackles for loss (19.5), 5.5 more than the next-most ... linemate Danny Shelton is tied for ninth in sacks (7.5) for fifth and in tackles for loss (12.5) ... with 16 takeaways and six turnovers, the Huskies' turnover margin of plus-10 is tied for seventh in the nation ... UW opponents have just eight punt returns yards on six returns, a 1.33-yard average, third-best in the nation ... Washington is 25-for-27 (.926) in the red zone, seventh-best in the country ... Thompson and Shelton are both tied for second in the nation in fumble recoveries (3 in 8 games) while Thompson and Andrew Hudson are both tied for 11th in forced fumbles (also 3 in 8) ... Thompson has scored four defensive touchdowns this season (plus another on offense) ... Thompson's 100-yard fumble return at Cal is one of just four 100-yard plays in UW history ... Washington has had eight true freshmen play this year: DB Budda Baker, DL Will Dissly, DB Darren Gardenhire, DB Naijiel Hale, DB Sidney Jones, WR Brayden Lenius, WR Dante Pettis and PK Tristan Vizcaino ... Baker, Jones and Hale (all defensive backs) and Lenius have all started ... vs. Hawai'i, John Ross caught a 91yard TD pass from Jeff Lindquist, the second-longest pass play in Husky history (Jake Locker to Marcel Reece, 98 yards, 2007, is the record).

TELEVISION: The Washington-Colorado game will air live to a national audience on the Pac-12 Networks with Roxy Bernstein (play-by-play), Yogi Roth (color) and Lewis Johnson (sidelines) providing the commentary. The Pac-12 Networks will also show 60-minute replays next week.

RADIO: The Washington IMG College Network, with its flagship station KOMO AM-1000 and FM-97.7, will carry the live broadcast of every football game on 18 Northwest radio stations. Longtime play-by-play man Bob Rondeau and color analyst Damon Huard are joined by sideline reporter Elise Woodward. The CU broadcast of the game will also air on Sirius (139) and XM (197) satellite radio.

THE HEAD COACH: Chris Petersen, who has built a reputation as an offensive innovator who carried the Boise State football program to its highest highs, was finally swayed to take on a new challenge when he agreed to become head coach of the Huskies in December of 2013. Petersen, 49, the only two-time winner of the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award (2006 and 2009), compiled an exceptional 92-12 record in his eight seasons as Boise State head coach (2006-2013), including two unbeaten seasons (13-0 in 2006 and 14-0 in 2009) and two BCS bowl berths. He won five conference titles and posted a 57-6 record in conference play (WAC from 2006-10 and Mountain West from 2011-13). Petersen, who also won the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award in 2010, led the Broncos to 10 or more wins in seven of his eight seasons and to 12 or more in four straight (2008-11). In 2006, Petersen's first season in charge in Boise, he led the Broncos to their first undefeated season since 1958, when the school was a junior college. The 2006 season was capped by a 43-42 overtime win over Oklahoma in the Fiesta Bowl, a game remembered by many as one of the greatest in bowl-game history. That Boise team ended the year ranked No. 5 in the final Associated Press top 25 poll. The following season, the Broncos went 10-3 and finished out of the polls for what would be the only time in Petersen's first seven seasons. The 2008 squad went 12-1 and ranked No. 11 in the final top 25, finishing the regular season undefeated. In 2009, Petersen led the Broncos to their second undefeated campaign and another Fiesta Bowl berth. Boise State beat TCU, 17-10, in Arizona, becoming the first team from a non-BCS conference ever to win two BCS bowl games. The '09 Broncos checked in at No. 4 in the final AP poll. The 2010 season ended with a 12-1 record, a No. 9 final ranking and a win in the Las Vegas Bowl, the first of three straight trips to Vegas for Boise State. In 2011, BSU once again went 12-1, finishing with a No. 8 final ranking. Last season, Petersen's team went 11-2 and beat Washington in the Las Vegas Bowl, good for a No. 18 final ranking. In 2013, Boise State, which faced Washington in the first game at the newly renovated Husky Stadium, finished the regular season with an 8-4 record (Petersen came to the UW prior to the Broncos' bowl game). Throughout his teams' unmatched on-field success, Petersen also saw his Broncos succeed in the classroom. In 2011, Boise State was the only school to finish in the top 10 in both major polls and also receive a Public Recognition Award from the NCAA for finishing in the top 10 percent of the Academic Progress Rate (APR), the second of three straight such awards for the program. Boise State's APR was second in the nation in 2011 and 2012 and Petersen was recognized in 2012 for having the best APR for the two previous years among all FBS coaches. Known for his work with quarterbacks, Petersen tutored Ryan Dinwiddie, Jared Zabransky and Kellen Moore at Boise State. Moore set an NCAA record with 50 career wins as a starting QB while winning three conference player of the year awards. Moore was the only player ever to record four 3,000-yard seasons in both passing and total offense. His 142 passing touchdowns were second-most in NCAA history while his 14,667 career passing yards were fifth-most. He twice led the nation in passing efficiency and set an NCAA record for season interception percentage, throwing just three in 431 attempts in 2009. During his eight seasons seasons, 51 Broncos earned all-conference honors. Before taking over as head coach at Boise State, Petersen served as the Broncos' offensive coordinator from 2001-05, during which his teams averaged 41.3 points per game, leading the nation in scoring in both 2002 and 2003. Petersen began his coaching career in 1987 as freshman coach at his alma mater, UC Davis. In 1989, he became the Aggies' varsity wide receivers coach. In 1992, Petersen moved to Pittsburgh, where he was quarterbacks coach. That season, Alex Van Pelt passes for more than 3,100 yards and 20 touchdowns. In 1993, Petersen moved back west to take over a QBs coach at Portland State, helping the Vikings to Division II playoff berths in each of his two seasons. In 1995, he took a job at Oregon as the receivers coach under Mike Bellotti, a position he held before moving to Boise as offensive coordinator in 2001. Born in Yuba City, Calif., on Oct. 13, 1964, Petersen graduated from Yuba City High in 1983 and went on to play quarterback at Sacramento City College. From there, he transferred to UC Davis, earning a bachelor's degree in psychology in 1988. He

later earned a master's in educational psychology from Davis. At Davis, he set numerous school records, including the single-season standards for passing efficiency, completions, completion percentage, touchdown passes and total offense as well as the career mark for completion percentage. He still remains in the top 10 in Aggies history in numerous season and career categories and his season and career completion percentage records still stand. In 1986, Petersen was named the Northern California Athletic Conference Player of the Year and earned UC Davis' Colby E. Slater Award as the school's Male Athlete of the Year. He was also a captain and won the team's Jerry Norris Award (Most Valuable and Inspirational). He was inducted into the Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997. Petersen and his wife, Barbara, are parents of two sons, Jack and Sam.

PETERSEN TOPS LIST: The 2014 NCAA record book lists the top active FBS coaches in terms of winning percentage (minimum five years at FBS) and the Huskies' own Chris Petersen tops this list. Peteren's .885 career winning percentage entering the season was No. 3 in the country for all NCAA levels behind only Lance Leipold of Wisconsin-Whitewater (.940) and Chuck Martin (.914), who is in his first season at Miami (Ohio) having compiled his entire previous W-L record at Grand Valley State. Here are the top 10 FBS coaches by career winning percentage, at the start of the 2014 season:

PETERSEN'S FIRST FIVE: The NCAA Record Book also notes that Petersen won more games in his first season as a head coach (13-0 in 2006) than any coach in history and that his record over his first five seasons as a head coach (61-5) was fifth-best in history, ahead of the likes of Knute Rockne and Bud Wilkinson and behind coaching legends like Gil Dobie and Walter Camp. Here are the 10-best coaching performances over the first five years of a career:

COACHING STAFF: With a new head coach on board for 2014, the Husky coaching staff obviously includes mostly new faces. In fact, of the nine full-time coaches on the 2014 staff, six worked for Chris Petersen last year at Boise State. Defensive coordinator Pete Kwiatkowski was on Petersen's staff in Boise in all eight seasons as head coach, including the last four as coordinator. Kwiakowksi, a BSU Hall-of-Fame defensive lineman, also worked at his alma mater from 1988 to 1996. Associate head coach and offensive line coach Chris Strausser spent 12 of the last 13 season coaching in Boise (he coached at Colorado in 2006), meaning he was with Petersen seven of eight seasons. Running backs coach and recruiting coordinator Keith Bhonapha was also on Petersen's Broncos staff during Petersen's entire eight seasons, though he started as director of operations. He's coached running backs the last five years at BSU. Assistant head coach and linebackers coach Bob Gregory comes to Washington

having spent the last four seasons at Boise State. He was the defensive coordinator at California from 2002 to 2009 and, along with also having coached at Boise State in 2001, has also worked in the conference at Oregon. Former Oregon State quarterback Jonathan Smith, who turned in several top-class performances vs. the Huskies during his playing days, was quarterbacks coach at Boise State the last two seasons. Previously an offensive coordinator at Montana, he takes that role (along with QBs) at Washington. Defensive backs coach Jimmy Lake, who spent the 2004 season in the same position at Washington under head coach Keith Gilbertson, was Petersen's DBs coach in Boise the last two years, having spent five seasons in the NFL before that. Wide receivers coach Brent Pease worked at BSU under Petersen for his first six seasons as head coach. The former standout quarterback at Montana, Pease returned to the Northwest after having coached at Florida the last two seasons. Defensive line coach and special teams coordinator Jeff Choate has a similar recent history as he worked under Petersen from 2006 through 2011 before going to Washington State in 2012 and Florida in 2013. Among the nine full-time assistants, the only returner from the 2013 season is tight ends coach Jordan Paopao, who served in that same role in 2013 after having worked as a UW grad assistant in 2011 and 2012, when he was also in charge of tight ends. The UW staff for four grad assistants in 2014 includes one returner and three newcomers. The returner is former UW and NFL wideout D'Andre Goodwin, who's back for his second year. He's joined by Ben Thienes, Joshua Taufalele and Gerald Alexander. Thienes was a GA at Boise State last season while Alexander was a standout DB at Boise State before playing in the NFL for five years. Taufalele is new to both UW and Petersen. The former offensive lineman at New Mexico most recently coached at Foothill College in California.

HUSKIES vs. BUFFALOES HISTORY: Washington and Colorado have squared off 14 times in their history and the Huskies hold the edge with eight wins, five losses and one tie. Washington has won five straight games vs. the Buffaloes. The series began way back in 1915 when a Gil Dobie-coached UW team wrapped up a 7-0 season with a 46-0 win over the Buffs at Washington's Denny Field. Nearly 40 years later, the Huskies opened the 1953 season with a narrow 21-20 loss at Husky Stadium. Jim Owens' first game as Husky head coach, on Sept. 21, 1957, came against Colorado and that game ended in a 6-6 tie in Seattle. Two seasons later, the Huskies made their first trip to Boulder for yet another season-opener and beat the Buffaloes, 21-12. The next meeting didn't come until 1976 in Seattle when Colorado beat Don James' second Husky squad, 21-7. The two teams next met in the 1985 Freedom Bowl in Anaheim. Jon Embree (who would eventually become the CU head coach) scored the game's final TD on a 31-yard reception, but the Huskies won, 20-17, behind sophomore QB Chris Chandler. In 1989, shortly after the death of their former quarterback Sal Aunese, Colorado handed the Huskies a 45-28 win at Husky Stadium. The Buffs rushed for 420 yards despite not having a single back over 100 yards. Colorado made it two wins in as many seasons the following year at Folsom Field, handing a 12th-ranked UW team a 20-14 loss. Eric Bieniemy ran for 143 yards and Darian Hagan scored a pair of TDs in the win. Colorado picked up a third straight win over the Huskies in the 1996 Holiday Bowl, winning 33-21. Corey Dillon rushed for 140 yards and two TDs, but CU guarterback Koy Detmer passed for 371 yards and three TDs in the win. In 1999, first-year UW head coach Rick Neuheisel, who'd left Colorado for Seattle during the offseason, got his first win at Washington in week three of the season. Marques Tuiasosopo hit Chris Juergens with

a nine-yard TD pass with 3:17 remaining to break a tie and forge a 31-24 win. The following year in Boulder, a Rose Bowl-bound Husky team won, 17-14. Washington scored 14 in the final quarter on a TD run from Willie Hurst and a pass from Tuiasosopo to Wilbur Hooks. In 2011, in the two teams' first meeting as Pac-12 rivals, the Huskies won 52-24 in Seattle. Keith Price led the way for the UW, completing 21-of-28 passes for 257 yards and four touchdowns. In 2012, Price had another big game in a 38-3 win in Boulder, throwing for a school-record-tying five TDs. Price was 22for-29 for 248 yards and the five scores while Bishop Sankey rushed for 139 yards in a game the UW led just 7-0 at half. The UW held Colorado to just 141 yards in total offense. Last season in Seattle, the Huskies won their fifth in a row in the series as the Dawgs, coming off of a bye, rolled up 628 yards of total offense in a 59-7 victory. Price completed 22-of-29 for 312 and two scores while rushing for two more. Sankey gained 143 yards and scored once on 23 carries while defensive backs Marcus Peters and Tre Watson each scored defensive TDs in the fourth guarter.

WASHINGTON-COLORADO TIES: Buffs defensive coordinator, Kent Baer held that same position at the UW from 2005 to 2007. Additionally, CU RBs/TEs coach Klayton Adams worked briefly as a grad assistant at the UW and began his career as a GA in 2006 on UW head coach Chris Petersen's first staff as a GA. Husky offensive line coach Chris Strausser was on Dan Hawkins' staff at Colorado in 2006. Former CU QB Darian Hagan, now the director of player development for the Buffs, was the running backs coach on that staff. As for players, there's just one Washingtonian on the Colorado roster: QB Sefo Liufau, from Bellarmine Prep in Tacoma. Washington's roster includes Denver Mullen grad Cyler Miles. The CU roster includes three other Mullen products: Timothy Coleman, Brady Daigh and Tyler Henington. Other UW and CU players who attended the same high school: UW's Mike Criste and CU's Josh Kaiser and Michael Mathewes (Mission Viejo); UW's Joe Mathis and CU's Christian Powell and Margues Mosley (Upland); UW's Kevin King and CU's Brandan Brisco (Bishop O'Dowd); UW's Azeem Victor and CU's Gerrad Kough (Pomona); UW's Naijiel Hale and CU's Shay Fields (St. John Bosco).

THE PAC-12: Prior to the 2011 season, the Pac-10 Conference added Utah and Colorado to expand to the Pac-12. Washington, which along with California is one of two schools who have been in the conference since its founding in 1915, plays in the Pac-12 North, along with the other three Northwest schools (Oregon, OSU, WSU) and Stanford and California. Under current plans, each school will play all five division rivals, plus four of six teams in the other division each season. The first two seasons, the Huskies did not face UCLA or Arizona State. Last year and in 2013, the Huskies don't face Utah or USC.

CAPTAINS: Washington will utilize game-by-game captains this season. Here is the game-by-game list:

THE 100-YARD FACTOR: Since the 1947 season, Washington is 192-60-3 (.758) when a Husky player rushes for 100 yards in a game. The Huskies are 1-0 in such games this season (EWU).

HISTORY LESSON: Successfully rushing the football and winning go hand-in-hand for the Huskies. Since 1990, UW has rushed for 200 yards in a game 91 times. The Huskies' record stands at 76-14-1 (.841) in those contests. Since 1995, UW is 51-11-1 (.817) when rushing for 200 yards.

HUSKY STADIUM RENOVATION: Husky Stadium underwent a major renovation over from Nov., 2011, through Aug., 2013, as the entire lower bowl and south upper deck were demolished and replaced. The new facility features a new, state-of-the-art football operations center (weight room, training room, locker room, meeting rooms, coaches' offices) in the west end, much more premium seating options and a new playing surface. Husky Stadium had featured a track up until 2011, so seats that were once far from the field, particularly in the west end, are much closer to the action. HISTORIC HUSKY STADIUM: The Oregon game on Nov. 5, 2011, marked the final game in Husky Stadium prior to major renovations that have now been completed. The Huskies re-opened their home field with a 38-6 win over then-No. 19 Boise State on Aug. 31, 2013. The 2014 season marks the 94th season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium stands at 366-172-21 (.674).
