SATURDAY'S GAME: The Washington State University football team opens Pac-12 Conference play when it travels to Colorado to face the Buffaloes at Folsom Field, Saturday, Oct. 1. Gametime is set for 12:30 p.m. (PT) and will be televised by Fox College Sports Pacific while also being heard across the IMG College Sports Radio Network. The Fox College Sports crew includes Steve Physioc (play-by-play), Yogi Roth (analyst) and Desmond Purnell (sidelines).

WSU vs. COLORADO - THE SERIES: The Cougars and Buffaloes have met six times previously, with Colorado owning a 4-2 advantage in the series. The last meeting came during the 2004 season, a 20-12 victory by Colorado in a game played at Qwest Field in Seattle. That game was originally scheduled for Sept. 15, 2001, in Pullman, however terrorist attacks on the east coast four days prior forced the game to be pushed back to 2004. The Cougars came away with a 47-26 win the last time the game was played in Boulder, as Matt Kegel threw for a career-high 310 yards against the Buffaloes. WSU won the first meeting, 14-10, in Boulder (1982), before Colorado captured the next three games.

FSN TO TELEVISION WSU-UCLA GAME: The Washington State-UCLA game scheduled for Oct. 8 will be televised by FSN. Gametime is set for 7:30 p.m. from the Rose Bowl.

COUGARS APPROACHING 500 WINS: With its victory over UNLV three weeks ago, Washington State University football earned win number 499 in program history. Entering the 2011 season there were 72 Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams with at least 500 wins, while in the Pac-12 Conference, the Cougars are tied with Oregon State in the race for win No. 500.

COUGAR OFFENSE CLICKING: Through the first three games this season the Cougar offense is averaging 539.7 yards per game in total offense, including 590 yards against Idaho State and 610 yards against UNLV. The 539.7 ypg ranks sixth in the nation while it has been since the 2005 season that WSU had recorded back-to-back games of 500-plus yards (534 at Nevada, 515 vs. Grambling).

Pac-12 Players of the Week

Running back LaMichael James of Oregon, linebacker Shelly Lyons of Arizona State and punt/kick returner Jordan Poyer of Oregon State have been named Bank of the West Pac-12 Players of the Week in football.

James, a junior from Texarkana, Texas, ran for an Oregon single-game record 288 yards and scored two touchdowns in the 56-31 win at Arizona. James also broke the school's one-game record for all-purpose yardage with 363. His two touchdown runs brought his career total to 43 rushing touchdowns and broke the Ducks' record of 42.

Lyons, a senior from Corona, Calif., led the Sun Devils' defensive effort in the 43-22 victory over No. 23 USC. He snagged the first interception of his career and returned it 41 yards for a touchdown. Lyons also added a tackle for loss for minus two yards and collected four tackles, including three solo stops.

Poyer, a junior from Astoria, Ore., recorded 156 returning yards in the Beavers' 27-19 loss to UCLA. He had over 100 yards in punt returns, including an 85-yard touchdown in the first half which was the second-longest in Oregon State history. Poyer also made a pair of tackles. He ranks second in the country for punt return average at 25.3 yards per attempt.

COUGARS EARN PRESEASON HONORS:

The Washington State University football team was represented by four student-athletes on the Phil Steele Preseason All-Pac-12 Conference Teams. Sophomore receiver Marquess Wilson, senior offensive guard B.J. Guerra and junior defensive end Travis Long garnered second-team honors. Sophomore offensive tackle John Fullington was a third-team selection while senior linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis and sophomore safety Deone Bucannon were named to the fourth-team. Long and Wilson were also named to the second team for both Lindy's and Athlon's magazines.

WILSON HAS HUGE GAME AT SAN DIEGO STATE: Sophomore wide receiver Marquess Wilson had the best game of his young career two weeks ago at San Diego State, catching six passes for 236 yards and two touchdowns. Wilson had an 80-yard touchdown reception on WSU's first play and added a 78-yard scoring reception later in the contest. His yardage total was fifth-best in school history and most since Jason Hill had 240 yards at California, Oct. 22, 2005. The total also marked the 19th-best effort in conference history and gives Wilson seven games of 100-plus receiving yards in his 15 career games. He was recognized as the National Wide Receiver of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards following the game. Wilson's average of 143.6 receiving yards per game this season leads all FBS schools.

LOBBESTAEL OFF TO FAST START: Senior quarterback Marshall Lobbestael was thrust into the starting lineup in the season-opener against Idaho State when starter Jeff Tuel woke up that morning with a stomach virus, and later suffered a fractured clavicle in the same game. Lobbestael has taken advantage of the each opportunity in his three starts since, throwing for a combined 959 yards and 10 touchdowns. Lobbestael has completed 62.4 percent of his passes this season with a passing efficiency rating of 180.2, tops in the conference. Lobbestael entered this season having played in 19 career games, six as a starter, and threw for seven total touchdowns.

300-YARD PASSING PERFORMANCES: Marshall Lobbestael's 361 passing yards against UNLV and 368 at San Diego State were the first consecutive 300-yard passing yard performances since Alex Brink threw for more than 300 yards in each of the final four games of the 2007 season. Brink and Ryan Leaf sit tied atop the Cougar record book with 12 career 300-passing yard performances. Leaf recorded nine 300-yard games during the 1997 season while Brink reached the mark eight times in 2007.

COUGARS SCORING AT PROLIFIC RATE: Through the first three games of the season the Cougar offense ranks fifth in the nation in scoring at 49.0 points per game. WSU's point total in each of its first two games (64 vs. Idaho State, 59 vs. UNLV) are the second-most points scored in a two-game span since the first two games of the 1907 season, 132 points, beating Eastern Washington 46-0 (10/5/07) and Blair Business College 86-0 (10/12/07). More recent, the scoring outburst marks the first time scoring 50-plus points in back-to-back games since beating Oregon 55-44 (9/21/96) and San Jose State 52-16 (9/28/96).

Colorado blocked a punt for a touchdown and returned an interception for another score to defeat WSU at Qwest Field. The Cougars lost despite holding a 402-125 advantage in total yards. WSU had a chance to tie late, but backup quarterback Alex Brink fumbled at the Colorado 2-yard line with two seconds left in the game. Brink replaced ineffective starter Josh Swogger and finished the game 12-for-23 for 251 yards with one interception and a one touchdown. The redshirt freshman's scoring toss went 60 yards to Jason Hill to cut the Buffaloes lead to 17-12 with 8:04 remaining.

PICK A TARGET: The Cougar passing attack has not only been efficient to start the season, it has been equitable. In each of the first two games, 11 different receivers caught passes, with no receiver grabbing more than five in a game. Including the San Diego State game, sophomore Marquess Wilson leads the team with 15 receptions for 429 yards and also leads the team with four touchdown receptions.

KARSTETTER CLOSING IN: Senior wide receiver Jared Karstetter enters this weekend's game at Colorado on the brink of WSU's top-10 career lists for receptions and touchdown catches. The Spokane native owns 119 career catches and needs three more to surpass former Cougar and current WSU wide receivers coach Mike Levenseller for 10th place. Karstetter's two touchdown catches against UNLV was his fourth career multi-touchdown performance, upping his career touchdown receptions total to 15 and moving him one away from entering the top-10.

TUEL SUFFERS INJURY, MONROE AND SMITH LOST FOR YEAR: Junior quarterback Jeff Tuel suffered a fractured left clavicle in Saturday's victory over Idaho State. Tuel played only one series before suffering the injury late in the first quarter. Freshman linebacker Darryl Monroe suffered a torn Achilles tendon and Travion Smith suffered a torn ACL injury. Both Monroe and Smith are season-ending injuries while Tuel is expected to be sidelined 6-8 weeks.

COUGAR GROUND ATTACK BEST IN FIVE YEARS: The Cougars rushed for 289 yards in the season-opener against Idaho State, their highest output on the ground since going for 344 yards against Idaho, Sept. 9, 2006. Freshman Marcus Mason led the way with 88 yards on six carries, including a 65-yard touchdown run. Freshman Rickey Galvin had 64 yards and two scores while senior Logwone Mitz had 58 yards and a score. WSU averaged 8.0 yards per game and did not have a play go for a loss all afternoon.

COLLEGE GAMEDAY RECORD: In addition to Chris Fowler, Kirk Herbstreit and Lee Corso, ESPN's College Gameday has had another constant – the WSU flag, which this weekend will be making its 109th consecutive appearance on the weekly show, dating back to the beginning of the 2004 season. Two flags – Ol' Crimson and Whitey – have been flown in the background of the Gameday set by dozens of friends and alumni. WSU recognized the Gameday flag wavers in a pregame ceremony prior to the Montana State game last season. In addition to the flags that fly, there is a traveling flag signed by the holders after each episode. The traveling flag is retired after each season, the first of which is hanging in WSU's Alumni Center.

SAN DIEGO STATE HIGHLIGHTS:

- The Cougars scored on their first offensive play for the first time since Jerome Harrison had an 80-yard rushing TD against Idaho (9/1/05) on the game's first play.
- On field goal attempts of 40-yards or more, Andrew Furney is 3-for-3 this season (51, 46, 48) and has hit his last four attempts (48, Cal, 2010).
- Deone Bucannon's interception was his first of the season and third of his career.
- Barton's 23-yard TD catch was his third of the season, third of his career and third straight game with a TD catch.
- Marquess Wilson's 80-yard touchdown catch was the longest of his career, second longest career catch (83 yards from Tuel at Stanford last season) and fifth consecutive game with a TD catch.
- Wilson's 78-yard TD catch was the second longest TD catch of the his career, third longest career reception, 10th career touchdown catch and fourth of the season.
- Marquess Wilson's 236 receiving yards was his seventh career 100-yard receiving game and second of the season.
- Wilson set a career high with 236 receiving yards and two touchdowns. The 236 yards are the fifth most in WSU single-game history and the most since Jason Hill had 240 yards at Cal (10/22/05).
- Marshall Lobbestael's 368 passing yards are a career-high.

UNLV HIGHLIGHTS:

- First time scoring 50-plus points in back-to-back games since beating Oregon 55-44 (9/21/96) and San Jose State 52-16 (9/28/96).
- WSU's 123 total points in the first two games is the second-most points scored in a two-game span since the first two games of 1907 season, 132 points, beating Eastern Washington 46-0 (10/5/07) and Blair Business College 86-0 (10/12/07).
- For the second consecutive game, 11 players caught passes for WSU. Six players caught TD passes.
- The Cougars held UNLV to 158 totals yards of offense, the fewest since holding Colorado to 125 total yards (9/11/04).
- Jared Karstetter had a pair of receiving touchdowns, his fourth career multi-TD game and now has 15 career TD catches, needing just one TD catch to break into all-time top-10 list.
- Marshall Lobbestael's five touchdown passes are a career high, he now has seven TD



passes in 2011, he came into the season with seven career TD passes.

- Lobbestael's career-high 361 passing yards was the first 300-yard passing game since Jeff Tuel threw for 311 at UCLA last season and the most since Alex Brink's 399 at Washington (11/24/07).
- Marquess Wilson had five catches for 102 yards and one touchdown, his sixth career 100-yard receiving performance.

IDAHO STATE HIGHLIGHTS:

- WSU scored 60 points for the first time since beating Southwestern Louisiana 77-7 (11/8/97).
- Rickey Galvin, Isiah Barton, Kristoff Williams and Marcus Mason each scored their first career touchdowns. Galvin had an 11-yard rushing TD and later added a seven-yard scoring run, Barton caught a 27-yard TD pass, Williams had a 20-yard TD catch and Mason scored on a 65-yard TD run.
- Alex-Hoffman Ellis recorded his second career interception return for a touchdown (52 yards against SMU last season), 6th career Cougar to have two INT returns for TD.
- WSU's 40 first half points are the most in any half since scoring 56 in the first half of a 77-7 win over Southwestern Louisiana (11/8/97).
- Andrew Furney's 51-yard field goal matches his career long (California, 2010)
- Marshall Lobbestael's 61-yard touchdown pass was the second longest of his career (64-yard TD pass at Arizona, 2009).
- WSU had four rushing touchdowns for the first time since rushing for six in the win over Southwestern Louisiana (11/8/97).
- WSU's 590 yards in total offense is its highest total since putting up 638 in the win over Portland State (9/20/08).
- WSU's 289 rushing yards are the most since recording 344 against Idaho (9/9/06).

Additionally, Cougar gamedays include a two-hour pregame and one hour postgame football show, along with a 30-minute pre and postgame show for men's basketball. Bonneville Seattle Media Group is the home of NewsTalk 97.3 KIRO FM, 710 ESPN Seattle, 770 KTTH AM. It is home to the Seattle Seahawks, Seattle Mariners, Sounders FC, Seattle University men's basketball, the Seattle Thunderbirds and now Washington State University football and men's basketball.

With three full recruiting classes under his belt heading into the 2011 campaign, Wulff has the Cougars on the rise following three years of rebuilding a program from the ground up. The end of 2010 saw a glimpse of what is coming as WSU earned its first Pacific-10 Conference road win under Wulff, a 31-14 victory at Oregon State. The following week WSU dropped a heartbreaker in the Apple Cup, falling to Washington 35-28. The back-to-back games with 28-plus points showed the offense has come miles from even the 2009 season.

A 1990 graduate of WSU and a four-year letterwinner, Wulff's first season leading the Cougars proved difficult as the transition to a new head coach combined with numerous injuries resulted in a 2-11 record. WSU's lone conference win came in dramatic fashion as the Cougars needed a last-second field goal in regulation, and again in double overtime, to defeat Washington 16-13 in the Apple Cup.

Wulff's second season was once again marred by injuries, yet progress was being made as 13 freshmen and 23 players overall made their first-collegiate starts. The bright spot of the year came in week three as WSU fought back from a 13-point fourth-quarter deficit to defeat SMU in overtime, 30-27.

Prior to Washington State, Wulff spent the previous 15 seasons at Eastern Washington University, the final eight as head coach. There he amassed a record of 53-40 while his current 11-year head coaching record stands at 58-72. During his eight-year head coaching tenure Wulff was named Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year three times (2001, 2004, 2005) and led the Eagles into the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs three times in his final four seasons.

In 2007 he guided the Eagles to a 9-4 mark, including a quarterfinal appearance at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs, falling to two-time defending champion Appalachian State. It marked the seventh time in his eight years at Eastern that his teams posted winning records.

Wulff began his coaching career at EWU in 1993 as a volunteer assistant working with the offensive line. He was named offensive line/strength coach the following season and spent four years in the position before being promoted to offensive coordinator/offensive line/strength coach in 1998. Following two seasons as the team's offensive coordinator, Wulff was named head coach prior to the 2000 season. He guided the Eagles to six-straight winning seasons and seven overall during his eight-year tenure.

Wulff's 2005 team was loaded with experience, talent and leadership, featuring a group of seniors that included the Big Sky's Offensive and Defensive MVP's (Erik Meyer and Joey Cwik), and featured a trio of All-Americans (Meyer, Eric Kimble and Matt Alfred). Meyer would go on to win the Walter Payton Award as the best football player in the Football Championship Subdivision. The Eagles finished 7-5 and won the Big Sky title with a 5-2 record before losing to eventual national runner-up Northern Iowa in the first round of the playoffs.

In 2004, Wulff's squad finished 9-4 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the playoffs. The crowning glory came when the Eagles knocked off No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Southern Illinois in the first round.

Statistically, the 2004 and 2005 teams were nearly identical with each finishing the year ranked fourth in FCS in total offense. In 2005 the Eagles averaged 477.8 yards per game, and were 14th in scoring (35.0). A year earlier the Eagles averaged 475.5 yards and 37.5 points per game to rank sixth.

Wulff coached 21 players to 54 Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Division I-AA) All-America honors in his first seven years at the helm of the EWU program, and two more of his players were named to the Sports Network's 2007 FCS All-America team at the conclusion of last year. Of the 21 players to earn All-America recognition, 15 have been offensive lineman. Additionally, Wulff mentored 15 players who have earned 18 total CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII honors and a total of 131 All-Big Sky Conference Academic team members.

As a student-athlete and four-year starter at center for the Cougars from 1986-89, Wulff was an All-America honoree himself as a senior, earning honorable mention accolades from The Sporting News. Wulff started at center under three different coaches after redshirting in 1985. He played for Jim Walden in 1986, Dennis Erickson from 1987-88 and Mike Price in 1989. He was also the starting center on WSU's 1988 Aloha Bowl championship team.

After a successful collegiate career Wulff had a brief pro career as a center after graduating from WSU in 1990. He signed a free agent contract with the New York Jets, but was released after injuring an ankle and a rib in the preseason. He played in spring 1991 with Raleigh-Durham of the World League, then played in spring 1992 with New York-New Jersey.

A 1985 graduate of Davis High School in Davis, Calif., Wulff played for three different coaches while he was at WSU. He redshirted in 1985 and started four games at guard in 1986 under Jim Walden.

Dennis Erickson directed the program in 1987 and 1988 with Wulff as his starting center both years. In 1988, the Cougars were victorious in the Aloha Bowl as Wulff earned honorable mention All-Pacific-10 Conference honors.

Under Mike Price in 1989, Wulff earned second-team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention selection on The Sporting News All-America squad. He was also WSU's long snapper during his stay there.

Wulff was born Feb. 25, 1967, in Woodland, Calif. He and his wife Sherry have a daughter, Katie, and two sons, Max and Sam.

WSU Game-By-Game Summaries

Idaho State at Washington State

Sept. 3, 2011 • Martin Stadium • Att.: 22,034 • TV: Webcast

PULLMAN, Wash. -- Backup quarterback Marshall Lobbestael threw for 230 yards and two touchdowns as Washington State overwhelmed Idaho State 64-21 in the season opener for both teams in front of 22,034 fans. Washington State scored on its first four possessions against the Bengals, jumping to a 23-0 lead after the first quarter and 40-0 at halftime. Lobbestael completed his first nine passes and finished 14 of 19 in WSU's most dominant win since beating Portland State 48-9 in 2008. The Cougars piled up 590 yards against Idaho State. Marquess Wilson caught four passes for 91 yards for WSU. Freshman Marcus Mason rushed six times for 88 yards as the Cougars produced 289 rushing yards. Washington State took the opening kickoff and went 58 yards in five plays, with Rickey Galvin scoring on an 11-yard run. Lobbestael hit Isiah Barton on a 27-yard touchdown pass on WSU's second possession. Tavoy Moore fumbled the ensuing kickoff and Bennett Bontemps recovered for WSU at ISU's 30. WSU quarterback Jeff Tuel did not start the game because of a stomach virus, and only played one series before injuring his left clavicle. Idaho State drove to WSU's 36 on the next possession, but Yost was intercepted by linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis, who returned the ball 67 yards for a touchdown and a 23-0 WSU lead. Wilson caught a 61-yard touchdown pass for a 40-0 halftime lead. Idaho State scored when Jahmel Rover ran in from 3 yards to cap a 73-yard drive with 8:53 left in the third. PULLMAN, Wash. -- Marshall Lobbestael threw for career highs of 361 yards and five touchdowns as Washington State defeated UNLV 59-7. WSU scored touchdowns on its first five possessions and held a 35-0 lead at halftime to win its first two games of the season for the first time since 2005. Lobbestael completed 24 of 32 passes in little more than a half of action. UNLV was scoreless until Tim Cornett's 95-yard kickoff return for a touchdown late in the fourth quarter. The Rebels gained just 158 yards and could not stop the WSU offense, which produced 610 yards. Backup quarterback Connor Halliday threw a pair of late touchdown passes for WSU, giving them seven for the game. Marquess Wilson caught five passes for 102 yards and a touchdown for WSU. Jared Karstetter had six receptions for 66 yards and two touchdowns. Freshman Rickey Galvin ran 48 yards for a touchdown on WSU's opening drive and finished with 80 yards on five carries. Lobbestael had two touchdown passes to senior Jared Karstetter, along with scores to Isiah Barton and Andrei Lintz in the first half as WSU took a 35-0 lead into halftime. caught a 5-yard touchdown pass from Lobbestael to cap a 74-yard drive for a 14-0 Cougars' lead. Lobbestael completed 18 of 21 passes for 274 yards in the first half, and WSU had 372 total yards in the first half while holding UNLV to 95 yards. This was the first meeting between the two programs since 1991, and WSU has won all five times they have played.

SAN DIEGO, Calif. – Ronnie Hillman ran for 191 yards and four touchdowns to lead San Diego State to a 42-24 win over Washington State. Marshall Lobbestael threw touchdown passes of 80 and 78 yards to Marquess Wilson for Washington State (2-1). Lobbestael completed 20 of 42 passes for a career-high 368 yards with three TDs and two interceptions. Hillman, a sophomore, ran 32 times as he scored four rushing touchdowns for the second time in his career. Hillman contributed to 500 yards of total offense for the Aztecs on the day. SDSU quarterback Ryan Lindley threw for 273 yards, but also committed the first two San Diego State turnovers this season with an interception and later fumbling a snap out of the shotgun formation at the Cougars 16-yard line. The Cougars, the nation's highest-scoring team at 61.5 points per game, scored on its first play from scrimmage, an 80-yard pass to Wilson. Lobbestael later hit Wilson on a 78-yard scoring pass to give Washington State a 24-14 lead early in the third quarter. Lindley passed the 10,000-yard career passing mark with a second-quarter completion. Lindley is second in school history to Todd Santos, who threw for 11,425 yards. Lindley has thrown touchdown passes in 13 straight games, but his lone interception broke a string of 112 pass attempts without one. After the Cougars scored on their first play from scrimmage, San Diego State responded with a score on a 13-yard run by Hillman. Washington State took a 10-7 lead on Andrew Furney's 48-yard field goal. The Aztecs then went 76 yards in 13 plays with Hillman scoring on a 12-yard run at the end of the first quarter. Lobbestael gave Washington State a 17-14 half-time lead after a 23-yard TD pass to Isiah Barton.
