OFFENSE

Jared Goff, Jr., QB
California

Completed 26-of-37 passes for a season-high 453 yards and six TDs in 54-24 win over Oregon State. The six TDs equalled his record for most TD passes in regulation. Became the second player in Pac-12 history to record 3,000 yards or more passing in his first three seasons.

DEFENSE

Antonio Longino, Sr., LB
Arizona State

Game-high four tackles-for-loss for 20 yards, including two sacks for a loss of 17 yards in 27-17 win over Washington. Finished with seven tackles and was cornerstone of defense that held Washington scoreless in second half forcing four turnovers and three turnovers on downs.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Casey Skowron, Sr., PK,
Arizona

Was 3-of-3 on field goal attempts, converting from 47, 40 and 35-yards in the 37-30 double-overtime win against No. 10 Utah. The final attempt tied the game and forced a second overtime. Booted five of six kickoffs for touchbacks.

PAC-12 QUICK HITS

THE NORTH RACE: The North Division is down to STANFORD and OREGON. A Stanford win Saturday and the Cardinal represent the North in the FCG. For Oregon to reach the FCG, the Ducks need to win their last two, and for California to defeat the Cardinal.

THE SOUTH RACE: UCLA and USC control their own destinies, but UTAH still has its sights set on a South Division crown.

The Pac-12 posted has posted a winning record outside league for 30 consecutive seasons . . . The Pac-12 recorded a 37-9 record in non-conference action last season, posting the most wins ever outside of conference play. Since 1934, only one other season witnessed the Conference capture more than 29 wins in non-league play - 2002 (32-15) when the league played an eight game conference schedule, allowing an additional 10 non-conference games to be played.

AROUND THE PAC-12

BOWL ELIGIBLE: ARIZONA, CALIFORNIA, OREGON, STANFORD, UCLA, USC, UTAH and WASHINGTON STATE are bowl eligible. The Golden Bears are bowl eligible for the first time since 2011. The Cougars are bowl eligible for the first time since 2013 and just the second time since 2003.

DIVISION RACE: In the North Division, STANFORD continues to control its own destiny. A win on Saturday and it will be the North Division representative in the FCG. If California defeats Stanford, and OREGON wins its final two games, the Ducks would return to the FCG to defend its FCG crown ... In the South Division, UCLA, USC and UTAH are still in contention. UCLA and USC are in control of their own destinies. If both teams post victories this week (USC at Oregon, UCLA at Utah), then the winner of the UCLA-USC game on Sat., Nov. 28 will clinch the South title. Utah will need a little help... If the Utes win their final two games to finish 7-2, they'll need USC to drop one of its last two games. The Utes have a chance if they finish 6-3, but they must defeat UCLA, and USC must drop its last two games.

ROAD WARRIORS: In 43 Conference games played to date, the visiting team is 23-20.

PAC-12 CAREER SCORING RECORD SET: UCLA PK **Ka'imi Fairbairn** is now the owner of the Pac-12 career scoring record with 402 points. With his first field goal last Saturday against Washington State, he passed former Bruin John Lee's previous record of 390 points (1982-85).

POLL WATCHING: After a wild weekend of action in the Pac-12, OREGON, USC and WASHINGTON STATE capitalized on victories to catapult themselves into the Top 25, giving the Pac-12 five teams in the rankings. For the Cougars, it's their first appearance in the Top 25 since Oct. 29, 2006 when they were ranked No. 25 (coincidentally, following a Washington State win at UCLA) ... Five different Pac-12 team this season have been ranked in the AP Top 10 ... Over the last two seasons, 10 different Pac-12 teams have been ranked among the AP Top 25, while six different Conference teams have been ranked among the Top 10.

ALL-PURPOSE: STANFORD sophomore RB **Christian McCaffrey** continues to lead the FBS with 241.8 all-purpose yards per game, more than 30 yards over the next player (Tyler Ervin, San Jose State, 209.80 ypg) ... McCaffrey has rushed for 100 or more yards in eight straight games. His 2,158 all-purpose yardage breakdown is as follows: 1,354 rushing, 367 receiving, 665 kick return, 32 punt return ... Since 1978, only four other Conference players have averaged 200 or more all-purpose yards per game for an entire season - USC's Marcus Allen in 1981 (232.6 avg), Stanford's Glyn Milburn in 1990 (202.0 avg), USC's Reggie Bush in 2005 (222.3 avg) and USC's Marqise Lee in 2012 (206.4 avg). Coincidentally, Milburn's teammate in 1990 was Ed McCaffrey (father of Christian), who had 61 receptions for 917 yards and a Conference-leading 91.7 receiving yards per game that season ... In addition to McCaffrey, the Pac-12 boasts OREGON's **Royce Freeman** (8th, 161.6 ypg) and UTAH's **Devontae Booker** (10th, 157.9 ypg) among the FBS all-purpose leaders.

PAC-12 NETWORK TO TAB ALL-CENTURY TEAM: The Pac-12 Network will honor the Conference's 100-year anniversary with the selection of an All-Century team. Each Tuesday on the Network's Inside Pac-12 Football show, the finalists/top 10 vote getters for each position as selected by a panel comprised of media, former players, coaches and administrators will be unveiled. THIS WEEK'S GAMES

USC at OREGON

Sat., Nov. 21 • 12:30 p.m. PT • ESPN

USC: This is the 10th straight USC-Oregon contest that both teams are ranked ... USC looking to win its fifth game in a row for the first time since 2013 when the Trojans accomplished the feat under interim head coach Ed Orgeron ... Freshman TB **Ronald Jones II** needs just 87 yards for the USC freshman season rushing record set by Heisman winner Charles White in 1976. He continues to lead USC in rushing and is seventh in the Pac-12 (77.1 yards, 77.1 ypg) ... Sophomore WR **JuJu Smith-Schuster** is sixth in the FBS, averaging 116.0 yards receiving per game.

OREGON: Sophomore RB **Royce Freeman** rushed for 105 yards on 16 carries (6.6 ypc) and a touchdown. He eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark for the sixth straight game and eighth time this season ... Senior QB **Vernon Adams** finished 10-of-12 for 205 yards and 2 TDs in the win over Stanford. Adams is the active leader in Division I with 12,201 career passing yards ... Adams' TD pass to sophomore WR **Darren Carrington** extended UO's NCAA record 78 straight games with a passing TD ... The Ducks are 14-0 when Carrington registers at least one reception ... Four Oregon defenders recorded double-digit tackles, with **Rodney Hardrick** (11), **DeForest Buckner** (10), **Reggie Daniels** (10) and **Joe Walker** (10).

Last Meeting (11/1/14): Kenyon Barner ran for a school-record 321 yards and five TDs, Marcus Mariota completed 20-of-23 for 304 yards and four TD passes, and Oregon produced another landmark offensive performance in a 62-51 victory over No. 18 USC. USC's Matt Barkley completed 35-of-54 for 484 yards and 5 TDs, connecting with Marqise Lee 12 times for 157 yards and two scores.

ARIZONA at ARIZONA STATE

Sat., Nov. 21 • 1:30 p.m. MT • FS1

ARIZONA: Junior QB **Anu Solomon** completed 17-of-27 for 277 yards and two TDs in the win over Utah. The two TD passes gives him 46 in his career, moving him into a tie for third on UA's all-time list (Tom Tunnicliffe, 1980-83). He now has 6,053 career passing yards, moving him up two spots into fourth on UA's all-time list ... Junior WR **Cayleb Jones** had five receptions for 126 yards and one TD against Utah, giving him his third 100-plus yard receiving performance this season, seventh of his career.

ARIZONA STATE: ASU is now one game away from becoming bowl eligible for the fourth straight season under Graham, a feat no other Sun Devil head coach has accomplished in his first four seasons ... Sophomore RB **Kalen Ballage** finished had 102 total yards (92 rushing, 10 receiving) and two rushing TDs in the win over Washington. Ballage has carried the ball 36 times for 301 yards (8.4 ypc) in the last three games after having just 183 yards on 53 carries (3.5 ypc) in his first four games ... Senior WR **D.J. Foster** set a Pac-12 record of 50 consecutive games with a reception. It's the longest active streak in the FBS.

Last Meeting (11/28/14): Arizona secured the Pac-12 South title with a 42-35 win over Arizona State as freshman Nick Wilson rushed for 178 yards on 24 carries and 3 TDs. Scooby Wright II led the Arizona defense with 13 tackles, including five tackles for loss and a pair of sacks. Arizona State's Taylor Kelly and Mike Bercovici combined to complete 27-of-44 for 267 yards and 4 TDs, but were sacked seven times.

UCLA at UTAH

Sat., Nov. 21 • 1:30 p.m. MT • FOX

UCLA: Senior C **Jake Brendel** started his 49th game to set the UCLA record for career starts ... Senior WR **Jordan Payton** tied a UCLA single-game record with 14 receptions vs. WSU, equalling J.J. Stokes' mark in the 1994 Rose Bowl vs. Wisconsin. He's second on UCLA's career reception list with 197 and six shy of tying Craig Bragg's school record of 203 (2001-04) ... Junior RB **Paul Perkins** rushed for 121 yards. It was his 11th career 100-yard game. He now has 1,082 rushing yards this season, and is the first Bruin to post back-to-back 1,000 yard seasons since DeShaun Foster (2000-01) ... Freshman QB **Josh Rosen** set a school mark with 57 pass attempts. He's 98 yards shy of reaching 3,000 passing yards for the season.

UTAH: Senior RB **Devontae Booker** rushed for 145 yards 34 carries (4.3 avg) in the loss at Arizona. It was his seventh 100-yard rushing game this season and 14th of his career, tying the school career mark. He has now rushed for 1,261 yards this season, the 15th 1,000 yard-rushing season by a Ute ... Senior QB **Travis Wilson** threw for two TDs in the loss at Arizona to bring his career total to 53. Wilson broke the Utah career record for total touchdowns with 73 (53 passing, 20 rushing), breaking the record of 72 set by Scott Mitchell (1987-89) ... Junior PK **Andy Phillips** made three field goals at Arizona and broke the Utah school record for career field goals made with 58 (Louie Sakoda had 57 from 2005-08).

Last Meeting (10/4/14): Andy Phillips hit a 29-yard field goal, his third of the night, with 0:34 remaining and Utah stunned No. 8 UCLA 30-28 in the Rose Bowl. Utah's Devontae Booker rushed for 156 yards and a TD. UCLA's Brett Hundley completed 16-of-21 for 269 yards and two touchdowns, but was sacked 10 times, including four by Nate Orchard.

WASHINGTON at OREGON STATE

Sat., Nov. 21 • 3 p.m. PT • PAC12

WASHINGTON: Freshman QB **Jake Browning** completed 28-of-52 for a season-high 405 yards and a TD, but the Huskies couldn't overcome three fourth-quarter interceptions in the 27-17 loss to the Sun Devils ... Senior WR **Jaydon Mickens** had five receptions for 100 yards, moving into second place in program history with 183 career receptions behind Reggie Williams (243, 2001-03) ... Freshman RB **Myles Gaskin** needs 144 yards to reach 1,000 rushing yards for the season. Former Husky Chris Polk owns the school freshman rushing mark with 1,113 yards.

OREGON STATE: Freshman WR **Paul Lucas** caught action as a running back, rushing for 70 yards on 13 carries in OSU's 54-24 loss to Cal. Primarily a WR, Lucas had just five carries for 19 yards for the season prior to heading into the Cal game ... Through the air, junior WR **Jordan Villamin** hauled seven catches for 83 yards and a TD. He leads the Beavers with 38 receptions for 569 yards (56.9 ypg). Villamin now has 73 career receptions for 1,147 yards.

Last Meeting (11/22/14): Washington used a balanced attack to put up 481 yards total offense (226 rushing, 255 passing) in a 37-13 win over Oregon State. Cyler Miles completed 18-of-23 for 253 yards and 2 TDs. Jaydon Mickens had 5 receptions for 84 yards and one TD, and added 41 yards rushing with a 34-yard score. OSU's Sean Mannion threw for 314 yards on 30-for-46 passing as Victor Bolden pulled in 10 passes for 145 yards.

CALIFORNIA at STANFORD

Sat., Nov. 21 • 7:30 p.m. PT • ESPN

CALIFORNIA: Cal is now bowl eligible for the first time since 2011 and now looks to defeat Stanford for the first time since 2009 ... The Bears recorded 760 yards of offense in the 54-24 win over Oregon State for their season high ... Junior QB **Jared Goff** went 26-of-37 for 453 yards and six TD passes. Goff has passed for more than 3,000 yards for the third-consecutive season, the sixth player in Conference history to achieve the feat ... His school record for career passing yards now stands at 10,800, which is eighth on the Pac-12 career list. Goff's Cal record 83 career TD passes ties him for 7th on the Pac-12 career list with Sean Mannion.

STANFORD: A win Saturday and the Cardinal would sweep the state California for the first time since 2012 and in doing so would clinch the North Division title ... Sophomore RB **Christian McCaffrey** rushed for 147 yards, running for over 100 yards for a school-record eighth-straight game. McCaffrey, the national leader in all-purpose yards, posted 244 all-purpose yards against Oregon to set the Stanford record for all-purpose yards in a single-season, now at 2,418.

Last Meeting (11/22/14): Remound Wright ran for 92 yards on 23 attempts and added 4 TDs as Stanford won its fifth straight Big Game by defeating Cal 38-17. Blake Martinez intercepted two passes and forced a fumble as the Cardinal created five turnovers.

COLORADO at WASHINGTON STATE

Sat., Nov. 21 • 7:45 p.m. PT • ESP2

COLORADO: Senior WR **Nelson Spruce** had 7 receptions for 94 yards and one TD in the loss to USC. He continued to add to his school and Pac-12 marks in career receptions (279) and has 3,116 career receiving yards (CU record, 15th on the Pac-12 all-time list). He has caught at least one pass in 36 straight games (multiple in 31 straight, the latter also a CU record) ... Junior QB **Sefo Liufau** became CU's all-time career leader in total offense (7,842 yards) and is second in career passing yards (7,397), and is just 13 yards shy of besting the top mark (7,409 by Cody Hawkins) ... Liufau, who wears No. 13, was injured on Friday the 13th, just 13 yards shy of becoming the school's all-time passing yards leader.

WASHINGTON STATE: Junior WR **Gabe Marks** had 12 catches for 92 yards, including a 21-yard TD catch with three seconds to play to give WSU a 31-27 victory over then-No. 18 UCLA. He leads the Pac-12 with 8.1 receptions per game and 13 receiving touchdowns ... Sophomore QB **Luke Falk** threw 38-of-53 for 331 yards and 2 TDs. He set the WSU single-season record with 35 TD passes, breaking the record (34) held by Ryan Leaf and Connor Halliday. The Cougars have totaled seven wins for the first time since 2003 ... In Falk's last six games, he's 245-of-355 (.685) for 2,608 yards and 25 TDs ... WSU leads the FBS with 414.4 yards passing per game.

Last Meeting (9/22/12): Colorado rallied from a 17-point fourth-quarter deficit with three touchdowns in the final 7:06 to stun Washington State 35-34. With 9 seconds remaining, CU quarterback Jordan Webb scampered 4 yards on a designed draw to tie the score at 34-34, with Will Oliver's extra point providing the final score. Webb completed 29-of-42 for 345 yards and a pair of TDs, connecting with Nelson Spruce eight times of 103 yards and a score. WSU's Connor Halliday completed 32-of-60 for 401 yards and 4 TDs.

PAC-12 BOWL ARRANGEMENTS

The Pac-12 is in the second year of a six-year agreement with seven bowl partners that should provide the Conference with a competitive postseason bowl experience. The lineup is led by the Rose Bowl Game presented by Northwestern Mutual, which is the destination for the Pac-12 champion. In 2015-16, the Cotton Bowl and Orange Bowl are slotted as the College Football Playoff semifinal games. If the Pac-12 champion is ranked among the top four of the College Football Playoff poll following the 2015 season and play in either the Cotton or Orange Bowl, the Pac-12 would back-fill the Rose Bowl game. At its option, the CFP may select another Pac-12 team to participate in one of its games. After the Rose Bowl and/or CFP participants from the Conference have been identified, the Conference has bowl agreements with six additional bowl games which have selection preference in the following order: Alamo Bowl, Holiday Bowl, Foster Farms Bowl, Sun Bowl, Las Vegas Bowl, Cactus Bowl. Based on Conference records, the Alamo, Holiday and Foster Farms Bowls will select from teams with no more than a one-game differential. The Sun, Las Vegas and Cactus will then select teams based on Conference order of finish.

PAC-12 FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The Pac-12 Football Championship Game will take place Saturday, December 5 at 4:45 p.m. or 5 p.m. PT and telecast to a national audience on ABC or ESPN. The Championship game will match the winner of the North Division vs. the winner of the South Division. The game will be played at Levi's® Stadium in Santa Clara, Calif. The champion will eye a spot opposite the Big Ten champion in the Rose Bowl Game. If the Pac-12 champion is in the top four of the College Football Playoff poll following the 2015 season it would vacate its spot in the Rose Bowl to participate in CFP semi-finals in either the Cotton or Sugar Bowl. The Rose Bowl would then fill the vacated spot with another Pac-12 team.

The winner of each Division will be determined by the record in all games played (both divisional and cross-divisional) within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game representatives

Two-Team Tie.

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
 - a. If no game is played between the two tied teams or that game ends in a tie, the following tie-breaking procedures would be applied:
2. Record in games played within the division
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (Based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest ranking in the College Football Playoff poll entering the last weekend of regular-season games.
6. Total number of wins in a 12-game season. The following conditions will apply to the calculation of the total number of wins:
 - a. Only one win against a team from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision or lower division will be counted annually.
 - b. Any games that are exempted from counting against the annual maximum number of football contests per NCAA rules (current Bylaw 17.9.5.2) shall not be included.
7. Coin toss.

Multiple-Team Ties.

The following procedures will only be used to eliminate all but two teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure will be applied.

1. Head-to-head (Best record in games among the tied teams).
2. Record in games played within the division.
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest ranking in the College Football Playoff poll entering the last weekend of regular-season games.

Determination of Home Team in Pac-12 Championship

The home team in the Pac-12 Championship Game will be determined by the record in all games played within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the home team.

Tie-breaking Procedure.

1. Head-to-head, if applicable.
2. Record against the next highest-placed common opponent in the conference (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the conference.
3. Record in common conference games.
4. Highest ranking in the College Football Playoff poll following the last weekend of Pac-12 regular-season games.
5. Coin toss.

PAC-12 CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

#100Pac12: The Pac-12 Conference is set to celebrate 100 years of excellence. The yearlong celebration of the Conference centennial, including marking the date of the official formation 100 years ago on December 2, will kick off with the start of the football season and continue throughout the 2015-16 academic year.

The Conference's storied history dates back 100 years to Dec. 2, 1915 when four schools - the University of California, Oregon Agricultural College (now Oregon State University), the University of Oregon and the University of Washington - gathered at the historic Imperial Hotel in Portland, Ore., to form the Pacific Coast Conference.

Since that day, the Conference has been known for its widespread excellence – on the field, in the classroom, and with the contributions its graduates make in the world. No other Conference can match the collective achievements and distinctions accomplished over the last century.
