2009 COLORADO CHAPTER NEWS & NOTES

ADAMS STATE COLLEGE (0-3, 0-1 RMAC)

Oscar Villa (Middle LB, Senior, 6-1, 225 Tucson, Ariz./Salpointe Catholic HS)

Villa turned in another fine day recording a game-high 12 tackles, including five solos, as the Grizzlies allowed just 224 yards of total offense at Chadron State. Villa, the RMAC's second leading tackler this season with 33, also added to his RMAC lead in tackles for a loss as he made 2.0 for 12 yards, including a sack for nine yards. Villa also forced a fumble and broke up a pass as the Grizzlies allowed just 45 yards of offense while shutting out the Eagles in the first half.

Team Notes: The Grizzlies used three different quarterbacks in Saturday's game at Chadron State as senior Stephen Baca (Denton, Texas) started before giving way to true freshman Trevor Eggleston (Tucson, Ariz.), who completed 9 of 13 passes before being relieved by sophomore Sean McDougal (Arvada, Colo.) late in the third quarter. Eggleston was one of three true freshman that had their red-shirts pulled on Saturday. Kicker David Van Voris (Elizabeth, Colo.) was another and hit both of his extra point attempts after missing a 28-yard field goal moments earlier in the fourth quarter. Running back Manny Trujillo (Santa Fe, N.M.) also played for the first time as a collegiate player and rushed one time for one yard. The Grizzly defense recorded 11 tackles for losses and four sacks while holding Chadron State to just 224 yards of total offense, including just 45 in the first half. Neither offense scored in that first half although the Grizzlies did lead 7-0 after sophomore Fabrice Nolen (Gilbert, Ariz.) returned a fumble 60 yards for a score in the second quarter. That touchdown gave the Grizzlies their first lead of the season. Three of the Grizzlies' four sacks came on three consecutive plays on the same drive in the second quarter. The Grizzlies have missed field goals of less than 30 yards in each of the three games this year. Redshirt freshman safety James Ackel (Riverside, Calif.) recorded his first career interception on Saturday and made a career-high nine tackles. Sophomore linebacker Rocco DeLorenzo (Arvada, Colo.) also made a career-high nine stops after recording a then career-high eight a week prior against Humboldt State (Calif.). The Grizzlies have now started each of the last three seasons with 0-3 records.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (1-2, 1-0 RMAC)

Jahre Cheeseman (Running Back, Senior, 5-9, 195, Vallejo, Calif.)

Cheeseman carried 26 times for 132 yards (5.1 yards per game) and two touchdowns as the Orediggers defeated Western N.M. by the score of 52-38 on Sept. 12 in Silver City. Cheeseman also caught two passes for 55 yards (27.5 yards per catch) and one touchdown to finish the contest with 187 total all-purpose yards. Cheeseman is currently ranked fourth in the RMAC in both rushing (78.3 ypg) and scoring (tied - 8.0 ppg) and seventh in both all-purpose yards per game (108.0) and receptions per game (tied - 4.7).

Team Notes: Mines will return home to host Fort Lewis on Sept. 19 at 12 p.m. (MST) at Brooks Field. The Orediggers' game against the Fort Lewis will be televised live as the RMAC Football Game of the Week. The game, which will be produced by KSPK-TV and carried by the Altitude Sports & Entertainment Network, will be available live on ALTITUDE 2, with a tape delay re-broadcast airing on ALTITUDE on Sunday, Sept. 20, at 1 p.m. (MST).

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (2-0, 0-0 MWC)

Rashaun Greer (Senior, Wide Receiver, 6-1, 202, North Las Vegas, Nevada)

Greer caught six passes for 162 yards in the Rams win against Weber State on Saturday, 24-23.

Team Notes: The Rams are on a two game winning streak.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (2-1, 1-0 RMAC)

Jesse Lewis (Tailback, Sophomore, 5-6, 168, Loveland, Colo.)

Lewis led the ThunderWolves in both receiving and rushing in the Pack's 38-0 win over Fort Lewis at home. He turned in his second score of 50 or more yards in as many weekends, running for a 54 yard touchdown in the second quarter. Lewis carried the ball 12 times for 93 yards and one score, and he caught three passes for 16 yards.

Team Notes: CSU-Pueblo scored its first shutout since 1982 when it took down Fort Lewis 38-0 at the Neta and Eddie DeRose Thunder-Bowl. The ThunderWolves logged 278 rushing yards, their highest single-game team rushing total since the program was resurrected in 2008, while holding the Skyhawks to just 38 yards on the ground. The Pack defense picked off two passes to raise its team interception total in 2009 to an RMAC-best eight, and its giveaway-takeaway ratio to an RMAC-best +10, also in the top 10 nationally.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (1-2, 0-1 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Skyhawks opened their 2009 league schedule with a 38-0 loss at CSU-Pueblo. They will travel to Colorado Mines Saturday for a noon kickoff.

2009 COLORADO CHAPTER NEWS & NOTES

MESA STATE COLLEGE (1-2, 1-0 RMAC)

Joey Applehans (Running Back, Sophomore, 6-0, 210 Broomfield, Colo.)

Applehans rushed for a game and career high 179 yards on a season high 17 carries at NMHU in the Mavericks first win this season (10.5 yards per carry). He scored his first touchdown of the year on a 59-yard run in the second half. He also caught one pass for 23 yards. He had a team high 202 all-purpose yards. It is the first time he has rushed for more than 100 yards in a game. He leads the team in rushing with 251 yards on 39 carries. He is averaging a team high 83.7 yards per game and is second on the team in all-purpose yards (293) and averaging 97.7 yards per game.

Team Notes: MSC held the Cowboys to a minus 26 yards rushing, recorded four interceptions and seven quarterback sacks. They also held NMHU to 148 total yards. Highlands lone score came in the fourth quarter.

UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY (1-1, 0-0 MWC)

Team Notes: Air Force extended its school-record consecutive games scoring streak to 196 games dating back to 1992. The streak is the fourth longest active streak in the country. The 195-game streak is the 14th longest in NCAA history. The six-point combined first half is the lowest Air Force has been involved in since a 3-3 tie at Wyoming last season. Air Force went on to win that game, 23-3. Air Force's turnover (fumble) in the fourth quarter is its first (and only) one of the season.

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (0-2, 0-0 BIG 12)

Scotty McKnight (Wide Receiver, Junior, 5-11, 185, Coto de Caza, Calif./Tesoro)

In posting career bests for receptions and yards less than a week after suffering a concussion, he tied the CU record for most receptions in a game, previously set by Michael Westbrook vs. Baylor at Waco, Sept. 12, 1992; Charles E. Johnson vs. Missouri at Columbia, Oct. 8, 1992; Derek McCoy vs. Washington State in Boulder, Sept. 13, 2003). McKnight has now caught a pass in 26 consecutive games, one shy of the school regular season record of 27, set by Charles E. Johnson between 1991 and 1993 (including the 2007 Independence Bowl, McKnight has caught a pass in every collegiate game he has played; Johnson's streak including bowls was 29; CU is one of a handful of schools that does not include bowl stats for such records). He is also 21st all-time in receiving yards at CU (1,157); he vaulted five players into 16th against Toledo, and also jumped four players and is tied for ninth in all-time receptions with 104.

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO (1-1, 0-0 BIG SKY)

Andre Harris (Junior, Running Back, 6-0, 215, Woodland Hills, Calif./El Camino CC/Taft HS)

National Football Foundation - Colorado Chapter Player of the Week

Team Notes: Northern Colorado won their first home season opening game since 2005 when they defeated Colorado Mines, 52-31. For the second straight season, the Bears first touchdown at home has come on an 80-yard play. On Saturday, senior quarterback Bryan Waggener connected with senior receiver Alex Thompson for the team's first touchdown of the day.

WESTERN STATE COLLEGE (0-3, 0-1 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Mountaineers travelled to Nebraska-Kearney for their first league game of the season. WSC lost 45-13. They will host New Mexico Highlands on Saturday at 1 p.m.
