A Preview of This Week's Game

•Wyoming and Colorado will be meeting for the first time since 1997 when the two teams played in Boulder, Colo. The Cowboys held a 19-10 lead with 4:29 remaining in that '97 matchup. •The Cowboys are facing their second consecutive Big 12 Conference opponent this season in the Colorado Buffaloes. Last week, the Cowboys hosted the No. 2 ranked Texas Longhorns in Laramie. Texas won that game by a score of 41-10, but only led the Cowboys by a score of 13-10 at halftime. The last time Wyoming played two Big 12 teams in the same season was 2003 when they traveled to Oklahoma State and hosted Kansas. •This week's game is the first road game of the season for the Cowboys. Wyoming lost its last road game at UNLV on Nov. 13, 2008, by a score of 14-22. UW won the previous week on Nov. 8, 2008, at Tennessee by a score of 13-7.

Wyoming Senior Defensive Tackle John Fletcher Named to the 2009 Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List:

The Rotary Lombardi Award released its 2009 preseason watch list on Tuesday, Aug. 19, and University of Wyoming senior defensive tackle **John Fletcher** was one of the individuals named to that preseason list. Fletcher also was selected to the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List in 2008.

Earlier this summer, Fletcher was voted to the 2009 All-Mountain West Conference Preseason First Team in voting by conference media members. He earned that same preseason honor in '08. Fletcher is a two-time Second Team All-MWC selection, earning that honor at the conclusion of both the 2007 and 2008 seasons.

The senior from Erie, Colo., enters his senior season ranked No. 10 in school history in career sacks, with 17.0 total sacks. He was voted one of four team captains by his teammates for the 2009 season, and has started 23 of 33 career games.

The Rotary Lombardi Award is presented each year to the top college football lineman - either offensive or defensive -- by the Houston Rotary Club. In addition to outstanding performance and ability, the other criteria that the Houston Rotary Club uses to select the winner is to select the lineman who best exemplifies the discipline of Vince Lombardi.

In 2009, 12 semifinalists for the Rotary Lombardi Award will be announced on Oct. 14. Four finalists will be selected and announced on Nov. 11. The four finalists will then be invited to a ceremony to be held in Houston on Dec. 9 at the Hilton Americas where the winner will be named.

A year ago, defensive end Brian Orakpo from the University of Texas was the recipient of the Rotary Lombardi Award.

The Last Time Wyoming and Colorado Played Saw a Wild Finish: The last time the Wyoming Cowboys and Colorado Buffaloes played saw a wild finish in which Wyoming lost a heartbreaker on Sept. 27, 1997, in CU's Folsom Field.

With 4:29 remaining in the game, Wyoming scored a touchdown on an 18-yard TD run by running back and Denver native **Marques Brigham** to put the Cowboys up 19-10.

But on the ensuing kickoff, Colorado cornerback/return specialist **Ben Kelly** ran the kickoff back 99 yards for a touchdown to pull CU to within two at 19-17 at the 4:06 mark. Wyoming still looked as if it would seal the victory as the onside kick attempt went out of bounds to the Cowboys on the Wyoming 44-yard line. The Pokes gained a first down and were on the CU 44 when Brigham carried right, but the ball was knocked loose and picked up on the bounce by the Buffs who returned it 33 yards to the Wyoming 25-yard line, with 1:06 remaining. Following a three-yard rush and a 21-yard pass, CU had the ball on Wyoming one-yard line. UW stuffed the Buffs on back-to-back running plays, but Colorado then kicked an 18-yard field goal to capture a 20-19 victory.

Cowboy Defenders Ranked Among Nation's Best: A total of nine different Cowboy defenders are ranked among the nation's leaders after the first two weeks of the college football season.

True freshman strong safety **Shamiel Gary** ranks No. 3 in the nation in interceptions and No. 4 in passes defended. Senior linebacker **Weston Johnson** ranks No. 9 in the nation in interceptions. Senior defensive tackle **John Fletcher** is 18th in both sacks and tackles for losses, and junior free safety **Chris Prosinski** ranks No. 18 in the NCAA in tackles.

Senior Wide Receiver Greg Bolling Returns From Suspension This Week:

Senior wide receiver **Greg Bolling** returns to the starting lineup this week after serving a two-game suspension for violation of team rules. His suspension was announced during the summer and prior to fall football practice beginning.

Last season, Bolling was the Cowboys' leading receiver, catching 26 passes for 271 yards. For his career, Bolling has 62 pass receptions for 646 yards.

Bolling's return marks the second consecutive week that Wyoming has had a senior receiver return to the team from a suspension. A week ago, senior **Donate Morgan** returned after serving a one-game suspension for a violation of team rules. Morgan caught two passes for 13 yards versus Texas a week ago.

Cowboys Enjoy a Postive Turnaround in Turnover Margin in '09:

It has been a positive turnaround in turnover margin for the Wyoming Cowboys thus far in the 2009 season. UW is currently tied for No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference and tied for No. 6 in the NCAA in turnover margin this season with a per-game average of +2.00 in TO margin.

Wyoming has forced six turnovers opponent turnovers this season, while committing only two. All six turnovers that Wyoming has forced are via interception. The two turnovers committed by the Pokes have both been fumbles.

A year ago, the Pokes couldn't seem to stop a rash of turnovers, ranking No. 9 in the MWC and No. 118 out of 119 NCAA FBS schools in turnover margin.

Nation by N.Y. Times Conference Rankings: The New York Times recently ranked the nation's college football conferences, and in each of those rankings they also singled out a player in each conference as a "Player to Watch".

After accepting the head-coaching position at the University of Wyoming, Dave Christensen quickly assembled a coaching staff with a history of success in their individual careers.

Dave Christensen

- Seven bowl appearances and six conference championships as a coach at Missouri, Toledo and Washington.
- He was the offensive coordinator for the most successful team in Missouri history as the Tigers concluded the 2007 season ranked No. 4 in the nation -- the highest ranking in school history.

Marty English

- Helped coach Northern Colorado to two NCAA Division II National Championships in 1996 and 1997 and nine postseason bids.

Marcus Arroyo

- Helped guide San Jose State to the 2006 New Mexico Bowl Championship.
- As a player, he was the starting quarterback for San Jose State in 1998 and from 2000-02.

Dan Hammerschmidt

- As a coach at Colorado State, Rice and Duke, he helped lead teams to nine bowl berths and five conference championships.

Mike Fanoga

- Was an assistant coach on two bowl teams at the University of Kentucky in 1998 and 1999, and also helped lead Western Kentucky to the 2002 NCAA Division I-AA National Championship.

Alex Grinch

- Five postseason appearances as a coach at Missouri and New Hampshire.
- As a player, he played on three NCAA Division III National Championship teams at Mount Union College (Ohio).

Wyoming Special Teams Looking to Make it Three Straight Weeks With a

Blocked Kick: The Wyoming Cowboys have blocked a kick in each of the first two weeks of the 2009 college football season.

Last week against Texas, Wyoming true freshman cornerback **Luke Ruff** blocked a Longhorn punt in the second quarter that was picked up by fellow true freshman and outside linebacker **Ghaali Muhammad**, who returned it six yards to give Wyoming a 10-6 lead.

In week one, senior defensive tackle **John Fletcher** blocked a Weber State field goal early in the fourth quarter to preserve a 23-7 Wyoming lead on way to a 29-22 victory.

Wyoming-Texas Game Was a Sellout -- Sixth Largest Crowd in School

History: Last Saturday's game between the Wyoming Cowboys and Texas Longhorns attracted the sixth largest crowd in school history -- 31,017. With Wyoming's stadium currently is approximately at a capacity of 30,154, last Saturday's crowd was also a sellout. Due to construction on the Wildcatter Stadium Club & Suites, approximately 3,000 seats were lost for this season, but 2,640 seats were added in the endzones for the Texas game for an approximate capacity for the Texas game of 30,154.

Greatest Schedule in University of Wyoming History to Feature Three BCS

Ranked Teams in Laramie, Headlined by University of Texas Longhorns:

The 2009 University of Wyoming home football schedule will feature three teams that were ranked among the Top 25 teams in the nation in the final Bowl Championship Series (BCS) standings of 2008. Those three teams were the Texas Longhorns (ranked No. 3), the TCU Horned Frogs (ranked No. 11) and the BYU Cougars (ranked No. 16). Having those three teams playing in Laramie in 2009 makes the '09 Cowboy schedule the greatest in University of Wyoming history.

"It is very exciting to offer this outstanding home schedule to our fans," said Tom Burman, University of Wyoming Athletics Director. "We hope our fans are equally excited about the opportunity to see three of the nation's Top 25 programs in Laramie in the same season."

Wyoming will kick off the 2009 season at home against Weber State on Saturday, Sept. 5 at 1 p.m., Mountain Time. The next week on Saturday, Sept. 12 at 1:30 p.m., the Texas Longhorns will make their first-ever appearance in Laramie, Wyo., in what is expected to be the biggest game in War Memorial Stadium history. The following Saturday, the Cowboys will face their second consecutive Big 12 opponent when they travel to Boulder, Colo., to take on the Colorado Buffaloes on Sept. 19 in the first meeting between the two Front Range schools since 1997.

UW lost a one-point game, 19-20, in Boulder. That game later had to be forfeited by the Buffaloes due to playing an ineligible player.

Saturday Sept. 26, Wyoming will begin Mountain West Conference play at home against the UNLV Rebels. The remainder of the 2009 home schedule will feature the New Mexico Lobos on Oct. 10, the BYU Cougars on Nov. 7 and the final home game of '09 will pit the TCU Horned Frogs versus the Cowboys on Jonah Field at War Memorial Stadium on Nov. 21.

"I'm extremely excited about this schedule," said Wyoming head football coach Dave Christensen. "I like the fact that we start the season at home the first two weeks, and we are fortunate to have four of our first six games of the season at home."

"I like having the open date in the middle of the season. I think it is a plus having two home games in November, and we are really excited about playing at Colorado State the Friday after Thanksgiving -- with the limited number of games being played that day it should give our program a lot of national exposure."

"From a recruiting standpoint, it is a real positive to have at least eight of our games and possibly nine being televised nationally."

In addition to their Sept. 19 road trip to face Colorado, Wyoming will travel to Boca Raton, Fla., to play Florida Atlantic on Oct. 3. The Florida Atlantic game replaces a previously scheduled road game at Bowling Green on the same date. The game versus Florida Atlantic will be the first game in a two-game home-and-home series with the Owls.

Roster Updates: In addition to senior **Greg Bolling** returning to the starting lineup this week at wide receiver, a couple of position updates include the move of sophomore wide receiver **Brandon Stewart** to running back where he is listed No. 3 on the depth chart this week.

Senior **Jesson Salyards**, who had been listed as a wide receiver entering the season, is once again being listed as a tight end, however in Wyoming's spread offense the tight ends are most often lined up as wide receivers -- either in the slot or sometimes split wide.

Sophomore **Eric Mitchell** is now being listed as a free safety rather than a strong safety, where he is listed No. 2 behind junior **Chris Prosinski**.

Junior place-kicker **Nick Landess** is no longer on the Cowboy roster.

Cowboy Defense Returns Eight Starters From One of the Best Defenses in the Nation in 2008: The 2008 college football season saw the Wyoming Cowboy defense continue to distinguish itself as one of the best defenses in the NCAA. It marked the third consecutive season that UW ranked among the nation's top defensive teams. The Cowboy defenders ranked in the Top 40 teams in the country (out of 119 teams) in four major categories in 2008.

Wyoming will return eight defensive starters and 21 defensive lettermen in 2009 from its nationally-ranked defense.

He recorded one sack against UNLV on Nov. 13, 2008, to move into sole possession of 10th place on the Wyoming career list, passing former Cowboy greats Tyrone Williams (1991-94), Kurt Whitehead (1990-93) and Rick Farnsworth (1979-82) who each had 16.0 sacks during their careers.

Fletcher's best season in terms of sacks was his sophomore season of 2007 when he sacked opposing quarterbacks 10.5 times. He added 4.5 sacks as a junior in 2008, and had 2.0 as a redshirt freshman in 2006.

Cowboys return in 2009 after earning All-Mountain West Conference honors in 2009. All three of those individuals are members of the Cowboy defense.

John Fletcher earned Second Team All-MWC honors for the second consecutive season in 2008. Fellow senior defensive lineman **Mitch Unrein** achieved Honorable Mention All-MWC for the second time in his career as a junior in '08, and junior **Chris Prosinski** received Honorable Mention honors for the first time as a sophomore in '08.

Shamiel Gary and John Fletcher Opening Week Performances Recognized by CollegeFootballPerformance.com: Two Wyoming Cowboys were recognized by

CollegePerformancePerformance.com on Monday for their performances in the 2009 season opener versus Weber State.

Freshman strong safety **Shamiel Gary** shared the award for the **National Defensive Back Performer of the Week** with UCLA defensive back Rahim Moore. Both players intercepted three passes in their opening games.

Senior defensive tackle **John Fletcher** was one of five defensive linemen nationally to receive **Honorable Mention** in the **National Defensive Lineman Performer of the Week**, which was won by Gerald McCoy of Oklahoma. Fletcher was credited with 2.0 sacks versus Weber state, and had 4.0 tackles for losses, one forced fumble, one blocked field goal and one pass breakup to go with five total tackles. He ranks No. 2 in the nation in TFLs and No. 4 in sacks this season.

Shamiel Gary Ties Wyoming School Record With Three Interceptions in a Single Game: True freshman strong safety **Shamiel Gary** had quite a first game as a collegian in Wyoming's 2009 season opener. All the freshman did was intercept three passes to tie the Wyoming single-game record for interceptions. He enters this week tied for the nation's No. 1 spot in interceptions.

The feat had only been accomplished three other times in school history by two other great Cowboys.

Back in 1950, **Selmer Pederson** intercepted three passes versus Denver. In 1996 and 1997, former Wyoming All-America free safety **Brian Lee** picked off three passes versus SMU, in '96, and Montana, in '97.

Senior Weston Johnson Excels On and Off the Field for the Cowboys: One of Wyoming's key leaders on and off the field in 2009 will be senior outside linebacker **Weston Johnson**.

Not only is Johnson perhaps the most talented linebacker for the Cowboys, but he was elected one of two defensive team captains by his teammates for the '09 season after an outstanding '08 campaign. (John Fletcher is the other defensive team captain.) Johnson ranked fourth in tackles for the Cowboy as a junior last season, starting all 12 games.

Off the field, he earned Academic All-Conference honors for the third consecutive season and was named the UW College of Business top Senior Marketing Student in the spring of 2009.

Outstanding Cowboy Secondary Returns Three Starters in '09: The Wyoming defense ranked 31st in the nation and No. 2 in the Mountain West Conference in 2008, and the Pokes return three of their starting defensive backs this season. Junior free safety **Chris Prosinski**, junior cornerback **Marcell Gipson** and his younger brother **Tashaun Gipson** all return after starting all 12 games in '08.

University of Wyoming Looking to Return to a Wide-Open Offense, Dave Christensen's No-Huddle, Spread Offense Reminiscent of Cowboy Passing Attacks of the Past:

New Wyoming head coach **Dave Christensen** brings to Wyoming a reputation for high-powered offensive teams.

With the hiring of Christensen, Wyoming fans can't help envisioning the return of a wide-open offense to Cowboy Football. An offense that would resemble those that successful Cowboy teams in the 1980s and 90s were built upon.

Christensen brings to Wyoming his no-huddle, spread offensive attack that made the University of Missouri one of the highest-scoring and most productive offenses in the country the past four seasons. In 2007, Missouri ended the season ranked No. 4 in the final Associated Press poll -- the school's highest year-end ranking in history.

Wyoming fans can remember some high-powered offenses of their own under Paul Roach and Joe Tiller. Those Cowboy offenses of the late 1980s and 1990s were not only among the most explosive and exciting in school history, but they fueled a period of success that resulted in four conference championships, four bowl berths and numerous national rankings for the Pokes.

Wyoming Running Attack Looks Strong With Two New Backs in Darius Terry and Alvester Alexander:

When a team enters a season having lost the school's all-time leading rusher and No. 3 all-time rusher both to graduation, questions are obviously going to be asked about a team's running game.

But junior **Darius Terry** and true freshman **Alvester Alexander** both enjoyed productive days in the Cowboys' 2009 season opener. Terry rushed for 99 yards on 23 carries and scored two rushing touchdowns. Alexander rushed for 81 yards on eight carries, including a 44-yard TD run the first time he touched the ball in a college game.

Terry and Alexander succeed Wyoming's all-time leading rusher, **Devin Moore**, and fellow 2008 senior **Wynel Seldon**. Moore is UW's career rushing leader with 2,963 yards during his career. Seldon ranks third all-time, with 2,672.

Junior Wideout David Leonard Shines for Pokes: Wyoming has a rich tradition of great receivers. Perhaps the next great one is current junior **David Leonard**, who caught seven passes for 87 yards against Weber State. He followed that up with another consistent performance versus Texas -- six receptions for 41 yards. Leonard enters this week ranked No. 23 in the nation and No. 3 in the MWC in receptions, and is No. 92 in the NCAA and No. 8 in the conference in receiving yards.

Austin McCoy Named Mountain West Conference Special Teams Player of the Week:

For the first time in his career, sophomore place-kicker/punter **Austin McCoy** earned Mountain West Conference Special Teams Player of the Week honors. McCoy was a perfect 3 of 3 in field goals and scored 11 of Wyoming's 29 points on way to a 29-22 UW victory over Weber State. McCoy also averaged 44.2 yards per punt, and placed three of his six punts on the day inside the opponent 20-yard line.

"Receiver U" -- Three Former Cowboys Rank Among the Top 20 Receivers in

NCAA History: Three former Wyoming wide receivers rank among the Top 20 receivers in NCAA history. Two-time All-American (1992 and '93) **Ryan Yarborough**, two-time All-American (1995 and '96) and 1996 Biletnikoff Award winner **Marcus Harris** and 2005 Honorable Mention All-American **Jovon Bouknight** all rank among NCAA leaders in career receiving yards.

In terms of the most career receiving yards in NCAA history, **Harris ranks No. 2 (4,518 receiving yards)**, **Yarborough ranks No. 4 (4,357)** and **Bouknight ranks No. 23 (3,626)**.

Wyoming Football to Wear Nike Uniforms For the First Time in 2009:

The Wyoming Cowboy Football team will be wearing Nike uniforms for the first time in school history when the 2009 season kicks off. The Nike brand is the most recognizable equipment brand in sports.

"We are excited to be with the No. 1 apparel company in sports," said UW head football coach Dave Christensen. "The design and quality of the uniforms is the best available, and from a recruiting standpoint it gives us one more advantage in being able to tell the young men we are recruiting that we are wearing the very best."

The Cowboys will have four different color combinations they will wear during the season -- two color combinations for home games and two for road games. At home, the regular combination the Pokes will wear will be a brown jersey with gold pants. For special home games, the Cowboys will also have the option of wearing a brown jersey with white pants. On the road, when UW plays on artificial turf it will wear white jerseys and white pants. When playing on natural grass on the road, the combination will be white jerseys and gold pants.

Wyoming Football will also wear Nike shoes and use Nike footballs beginning in the 2009 season.

The University of Wyoming's Football Facilities Have Become Among the Best in the Nation:

Beginning in 2001, the University of Wyoming's Football facilities have gone through an amazing transformation, making them among the best in the nation. That transformation is thanks to the generous donations of Cowboy fans and the establishment of state matching funds by the Wyoming State Legislature.

In 2001, the Rochelle Athletics Center (RAC) was completed at a cost of \$9.4 million. The RAC houses a strength and conditioning center, athletic training area and academic support center that serves all of Wyoming's student-athletes. In addition, the football coaches' office

complex is housed in the RAC as is a 5,697 square-foot locker room for Cowboy Football.

The summer of 2005 saw the installation of a \$1 million artificial playing surface on Jonah Field at War Memorial Stadium. The newest technology in synthetic turf -- Desso Challenge Pro 60 -- was installed at UW prior to the start of the '05 season.

The most recent addition to Wyoming's Football facilities is the \$11 million, 80,000-square foot Indoor Practice Facility that was completed in the winter of 2007. This newest addition is located directly east of the Rochelle Athletics Center and on the northeast corner of War Memorial Stadium. The full-size indoor football field is covered with the same Desso Challenge Pro 60 artificial surface that was installed on Jonah Field at War Memorial Stadium prior to the 2005 season.



Construction Begins on Wildcatter Stadium Club & Suites at War Memorial Stadium, Completion Set for the Fall of 2010 :

An exciting new facility project, offering University of Wyoming Football fans the advantages of indoor, luxury seating, began construction in the spring of 2009 and will be named the **Wildcatter Stadium Club & Suites at War Memorial Stadium**.

A total of 12 individual suites along with a stadium-club area that will contain 250 indoor seats will be added to the upper east side of War Memorial Stadium and will be named after the many successful "Wildcatters" of Wyoming. A Wildcatter is a person who displays the strength and courage to risk drilling oil or gas wells in areas where there is no guarantee that oil or gas will be found.

The new facility project is scheduled to be completed for the start of the 2010 football season. The project is funded with private donations and matching funds appropriated by the Wyoming State Legislature.

World-renown HOK Sport Venue Event is serving as the architecture firm for the design of the Wildcatter Stadium Club & Suites at War Memorial Stadium. HOK Sport has designed athletic facilities around the world for the past 25 years. Included in its recent projects are: the University of Phoenix Stadium, home of the Arizona Cardinals of the NFL; Heinz Field, home of the Pittsburgh Steelers; a renovation of the University of Oklahoma Stadium; an expansion of Penn State University's Beaver Stadium; the new Busch Stadium, home of the St. Louis Cardinals; AT&T Park, home of the San Francisco Giants; the new Yankee Stadium; and the London 2012 Olympic Stadium.

In connection with the Wildcatter Stadium Club & Suites at War Memorial Stadium, the new **War Memorial Stadium east side renovation** will be under construction at the same time. The renovation of the east side of War Memorial will include enhanced concession areas and improved and expanded restroom facilities for fans. The east side lower concourse will also be expanded, and will include improved lighting with easier accessibility for fans to enter and exit War Memorial Stadium on game days. Americans with Disabilities ACT (ADA) accessibility enhancements are also scheduled to be completed by the beginning of the 2010 football season. Finally, significant maintenance work is planned on the east side seating that will help extend the life of the stadium.

Jay Novacek Enshrined in the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame on July 18,

2009: It has been a year-long celebration for the inductees into this year's College Football Hall of Fame class. Among those who were inducted into the highest honor of college football was former Wyoming All-America tight end **Jay Novacek**. The final event of the year's festivities was the Enshrinement Festival in South Bend, Ind.,

the site of the College Football Hall of Fame, on Friday and Saturday, July 17 and 18, 2009.

The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame announced on Thursday, May 1 its 2008 College Football Hall of Fame Football Bowl Subdivision Class.

Novacek, who played at Wyoming from 1982-84, was named a Consensus All-American in '84. He still holds the NCAA record for highest average gain per reception by a tight end in a single season (22.6 yards per reception in 1984). He was not only a First Team All-American in football, but also earned All-America honors in track and field in '84, placing fourth at the NCAA Track and Field Championships in the decathlon. Novacek caught 83 career passes for 1,536 yards and 10 touchdowns during his three-year college career at Wyoming.

He went on to win three Super Bowls with the Dallas Cowboys at the conclusion of the 1992, '93 and '95 seasons. Novacek was twice named All-Pro (1991 and '92), earned All-NFC honors three times (1991, '92 and '95) and played in five Pro Bowls (1991-95).

He joins one other former Cowboy player and three former Wyoming coaches as members of the College Football Hall of Fame.

Eddie "Boom Boom" Talboom was inducted posthumously as a tailback in 2000.

Former Cowboy head coach **Bowden Wyatt** was inducted posthumously as a player (Tennessee) in 1972 and then was inducted as a coach (Wyoming, Arkansas, Tennessee) in 1997, becoming only the third individual at that time to be inducted as both a player and coach -- the other two being Amos Alonzo Stagg and Bobby Dodd.

The other College Football Hall of Famers inducted from the University of Wyoming include: former head coaches **Bob Devaney** (Wyoming, Nebraska), who was inducted in 1981; and **Pat Dye** (East Carolina, Wyoming, Auburn), who was inducted in 2005.

The 2008 College Football Hall of Fame Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Class were inducted at the NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 9, 2008, at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York City. The class will be officially enshrined at the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Ind., on July 18, 2009.

University of Wyoming Football

About Colorado: The opening stretch of the 2009 season hasn't been what the Colorado Buffaloes had hoped for. The Buffs are currently 0-2, after falling at home to Colorado State and on the road to Toledo. They had just five short days off between their first two games, as they played CSU on Sunday, Sept. 6 and then traveled to Toledo for a Friday night game with the Rockets last weekend.

In the Buffs' season opener against CSU, the Rams jumped ahead early as they scored 20 points in the first half. The Buffs rallied in the second half, but fell short by a final score of 23-17.

On the road at Toledo, the Buffs were once again slow out of the gates. Toledo jumped out to a 23-3 lead at halftime. The second half of the game featured a great deal of offense for both teams, but the Buffs could not catch the Rockets. Toledo held on for a 54-38 win.

Thus far this season, Colorado has been led offensively by quarterback **Cody Hawkins**. Hawkins, the son of head coach Dan Hawkins, has completed 54 of 104 passes (51.9) for 578 yards. He has thrown five touchdown passes and four interceptions.

CU's ground game has been led by sophomore tailback **Darrell Scott**. Scott has rushed for 86 yards on 13 carries.

The Buffs' leading receiver is junior **Scotty McKinight**, who has caught 15 balls for 150 yards. He has also caught a pair of touchdown passes. Sophomore wide receiver **Jason Espinoza** has also gone over 100 yards receiving by catching 10 passes for 118 yards, with one touchdown.

The CU defense has been led by senior linebacker **Jeff Smart**. Smart, who was a 2008 Second Team All-Big 12 selection by the Associated Press, has made 22 tackles, has one sack and one interception. The Buffs' secondary has been led by junior cornerback **Jimmy Smith**. Smith has made 19 tackles and has broken up a pair of passes.

Colorado returns 51 letterwinners and 13 starters from the 2008 season. That 2008 season saw Colorado jump out to a 3-0 record. That third win came on a field goal in overtime at home against No. 21 West Virginia. However, the Buffs won just two more games and ended the season just out of bowl eligibility and 5-7.

Head Coach Dan Hawkins: Dan Hawkins is in his fourth season as head coach of the Colorado Buffaloes. He has posted a record of 13-26 (.333) during his time in Boulder. During his first season of 2006, the Buffaloes finished 2-10. In 2007, they were 6-7 and in 2008 they finished 5-7.

Prior to moving to Boulder, Hawkins was the head coach at Boise State where he compiled a 53-11 (.828) record between 2001-05. He led Boise State to three outright WAC Championships (2002, '03 and '04) and one co-title (2005). Hawkins first joined the Bronco coaching staff in 1998 and served as an assistant until being named the head coach prior to the 2001 season.

Hawkins' first head coach position was at Willamette University, a NAIA school in Salem, Ore. He coached there for five seasons, compiling an overall record of 39-12-1. His best season at Willamette was the 1997 campaign when they finished 13-1 and advanced to the NAIA National Championship game.

Pokes' Overtime History: The Wyoming Cowboys have played seven overtime games in their history. The most recent overtime game the Cowboys played was in 2006. UW lost in double overtime at Syracuse on Sept. 30, 2006, by a final score of 34-40.

That overtime game at Syracuse was the second OT game Wyoming played during the 2006 season. On Sept. 9, 2006, the Pokes lost a 12-13 single-overtime game at Virginia. Wyoming is 3-4 all-time in overtime games dating back to the 1996 season when overtime was first introduced in college football.

The Cowboys have **never played an overtime game at home**.

Other than the 2000 season, Wyoming has played at least one overtime game in each even-numbered year since the beginning of college overtimes in 1996.

The Pokes have **never played an overtime game in an odd-numbered year**.

Mountain West Conference Has Five Automatic Bowl Bids for the 2008 College Football Season:

As a member of the Mountain West Conference, Wyoming has several opportunities for football postseason play. Now entering its 11th year of existence, the MWC currently has five bowl agreements, giving the conference five automatic bowl berths and one additional potential bowl slot.

The MWC will send a team to the Maaco Las Vegas Bowl for the 11th consecutive year in 2009. The Las Vegas Bowl will feature teams from the Mountain West and Pacific-10 conferences. This year's contest will be played on Tuesday, Dec. 22, 2009, and will be televised by ESPN. Since entering into its original agreement in 1999, teams from the MWC have posted a 6-4 record in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Wyoming Cowboys won the 2004 Vegas Bowl by a score of 24-21 over UCLA. Again this year, the host venue for the game will be Sam Boyd Stadium in Las Vegas.

The 2009 season will mark the fifth year that the Mountain West will have a team play in the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego's Qualcomm Stadium. This year, a team from the Mountain West will face a Pacific-10 team on Wednesday, Dec. 23 in a game to be televised on ESPN.

The third automatic bowl bid available for a Mountain West Conference team will be in the New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque. The fourth annual New Mexico Bowl will be played on Saturday, Dec. 19, with the MWC facing off against the Western Athletic Conference, with ESPN televising.

For the seventh straight year, the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl will be played in Fort Worth, Texas. The 2009 contest will pit the Mountain West against Conference USA. New Year's Eve, Thursday, Dec. 31, will be the date for this year's game, and ESPN will also be the televising network.

The fifth bowl game, which the MWC has a brand new relationship with in 2009, is the Roady's Humanitarian Bowl in Boise, Idaho. The Mountain West will face a WAC team on Wednesday, Dec. 30. ESPN will televise the Humanitarian Bowl, as well.

I am confident that he will put an outstanding coaching staff together, and that they will hit the ground running. With Dave leading Cowboy Football, I believe our program will make dramatic progress in the coming years and return to a position of prominence in the Mountain West Conference."

Christensen was named the 2007 National Offensive Coordinator of the Year by Rivals.com and was also runner-up for the 2007 Frank Broyles Award, which honors the top assistant coach in the nation each season.

"I can't tell you how excited I am to be given the opportunity to lead the Wyoming Cowboy Football program," said Christensen. "The opportunity to become a head coach is something I've been preparing for my entire career.

"This is a great job at an outstanding university. Wyoming has a rich football tradition, and combined with the new, state-of-the-art facilities, I know we can win here."

He helped lead the Missouri Tigers to the Big 12 Championship game in both the 2007 and 2008 seasons as

champions of the Big 12 North.

In 2008, Mizzou ranked No. 4 in the NCAA in passing offense (330.4 yards per game), No. 6 in scoring offense (42.2 points per game) and No. 8 in total offense (484.1 yards per game). The Tigers concluded the 2008 season ranked No. 16 in the final USA Today Coaches' Poll, No. 19 in the final Associated Press Media Poll and were No. 21 in the final BCS Rankings entering the college bowl season. Missouri defeated Northwestern, 30-23, in the 2008 Valero Alamo Bowl.

The 2007 season saw Missouri conclude the season ranked No. 4 in the final Associated Press ranking. That was the highest season-ending ranking in school history for the Tigers. Mizzou finished the season by defeating Arkansas, 38-7, in the Cotton Bowl, giving the Tigers a school record 12th win on the season. His 2007 offense ranked No. 5 in the nation in total offense (490.3 yards per game), No. 8 in scoring offense (39.9 points per game) and No. 9 in passing offense (314.1 yards per game).

Christensen served as an assistant coach under Gary Pinkel from 1992 to 2008 -- first at the University of Toledo from 1992-2000 and then at Missouri from 2001-2008. Christensen was Pinkel's offensive coordinator from 1997-2008, and coached the offensive line each of the past 16 seasons.

Beginning in 2005, Christensen devised and implemented one of college football's most exciting, no-huddle, spread offenses.

In 2007, Missouri quarterback Chase Daniel finished fourth in the Heisman Trophy balloting, while Christensen's offense scored a school record 558 points, far surpassing the previous Missouri record of 399 points in a single season.

In addition to Daniel's fourth-place finish in the 2007 Heisman Trophy voting, Christensen's offensive unit had three other Tigers earn national honors that year. Senior tight end Martin Rucker and freshman wide receiver Jeremy Maclin were both Consensus First Team All-America selections, marking the first time in Missouri school history that it had two Consensus First Team All-Americans in the same season. Senior center Adam Spieker was named a finalist for the Rimington Award, which honors the nation's top offensive center each season. Spieker also earned Third Team All-America honors from Associated Press.

His final season at Missouri, the Tigers once again had two Consensus First Team All-Americans in Maclin and tight end Chase Coffman. Coffman also was selected as the winner of the 2008 John Mackey Award as the nation's top tight end, while Maclin was a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, which honors the nation's top wide receiver.

The Tigers finished the 2006 season with the nation's No. 8 ranked offense, averaging 425.6 yards per game, and that included the nation's No. 10 ranked passing attack, at 276.2 yards an outing.

Christensen's offense underwent a major transformation to a spread, no-huddle attack in 2005, and was very successful in the first year running the new system. His attack, executed by record-setting quarterback Brad Smith, ended the 2005 season ranked in the top four in the Big 12, and in the Top 40 nationally in three major categories - rushing (205.3 yards per game - No. 3 in the Big 12 and No. 17 in the NCAA), total offense (429.8 ypg - No. 4 in the Big 12 and No. 24 in the nation) and scoring offense (30.8 points per game - No. 4 in the Big 12 and No. 34 in the country).

In his final seven seasons at the University of Toledo, the Rockets' offense set or reset some 75 school records. During that period, the Rockets posted an undefeated and Mid-American Conference (MAC) championship season in 1995 and won three MAC West titles (1997, 1998 and 2000). They concluded the '95 campaign with a 40-37 overtime win over Nevada to capture the Las Vegas Bowl Championship. In 1999, Toledo was 10th in the country in rushing (239.2) and led the nation in yards per attempt (5.35).

Christensen coached center Andy McCollum while at Toledo. McCollum was a First Team All-MAC selection in 1992, and would later become the starting center for the St. Louis Rams of the NFL. Another Toledo lineman, Colin Westrich, was named Third Team All-American by the Sporting News in 1999.

Christensen went to Toledo from Idaho State University where he coached the offensive line, tight ends and running backs for two seasons (1990-91). Prior to his stint at Idaho State, he served two seasons as a graduate assistant offensive line coach under Don James at the University of Washington in 1988 and '89. Christensen also played football for the Huskies for three seasons from 1980-82.

He earned a bachelor of arts degree in sociology from Western Washington in 1985 and a master of science degree in college instruction and sports science from Eastern Washington in 1988.

Christensen is 48 years old, born Jan. 17, 1961. He and his wife Susie have three children, Katie, D.J. and Emily.

The Dave Christensen era of Wyoming Cowboy football began on a high note on Saturday, as the Pokes beat Weber State 29-22. Weber State entered the game as the ninth ranked team in the preseason FCS Coaches' Poll.

Wyoming's new no-huddle, spread offense gained 434 yards on the day (246 on the ground and 188 through the air). The Cowboys put 29 points on the scoreboard, which matched their second most over the last 21 games. UW's ground attack was led by running back Darius Terry, who scored two touchdowns and gained 99 yards on 23 carries. Wide receiver David Leonard was the Pokes' leading target, as he set career highs with seven receptions and 87 yards.

After struggling with a poor turnover margin a season ago, the Cowboys won the turnover battle in a big way against Weber State. The Pokes forced five Wildcat turnovers, while only giving up the ball once themselves. Five forced turnovers is the most by a UW team since the 2004 season.

All five UW forced turnovers were interceptions and three of them were grabbed by true freshman strong safety Shamiel Gary in his first college game. Defensive tackle John Fletcher also had a great day and recorded 2.0 sacks, 4.0 tackles for loss, forced a fumble, broke up a pass and blocked a field goal.

The Wyoming Cowboys gave Texas, the No. 2 team in the nation, all they could handle for two quarters, before eventually falling to the Longhorns 41-10.

With 1:32 remaining in the first half, and Texas clinging to a 6-3 lead, UW freshman Luke Ruff blocked a Texas punt and fellow freshman Ghaali Muhammad returned it six yards for a touchdown. That score gave the Pokes a 10-6 lead.

Texas' offense then rebounded and went on a 70-yard drive over the next 1:08, which brought the first half to a close with Texas leading 13-10. Texas built on that momentum in the second half and scored 28 unanswered points to hand the Cowboys their first loss of the season. Wyoming fell to 1-1 overall, while Texas improved to 2-0.

With their No. 2 national ranking, Texas became the highest ranked team to ever play in Laramie. A total of 31,017 fans were in attendance, which marked the sixth largest crowd in UW history. It also marked the 10th sellout crowd in War Memorial Stadium history.
