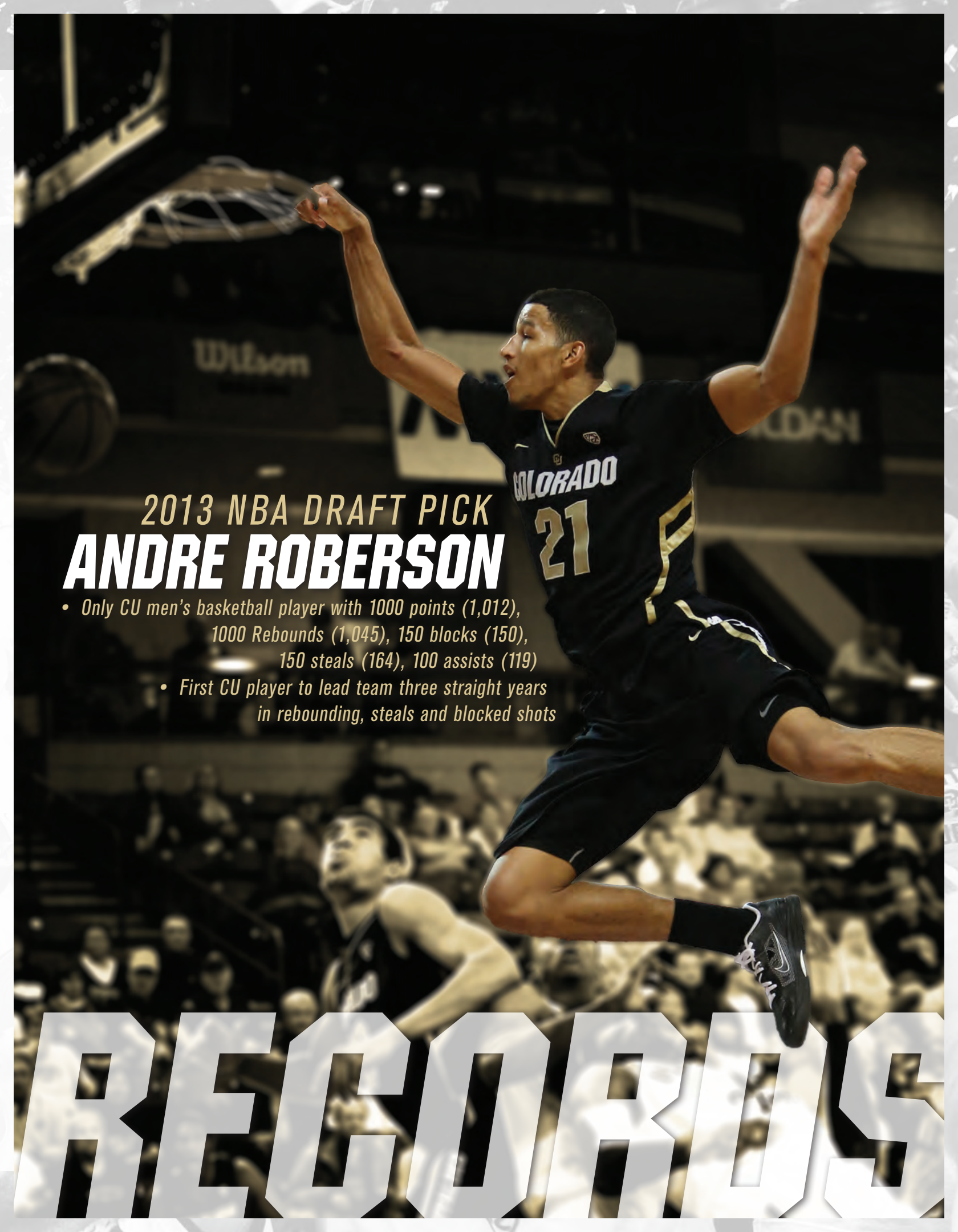

- First CU player to lead team three straight years in rebounding, steals and blocked shots

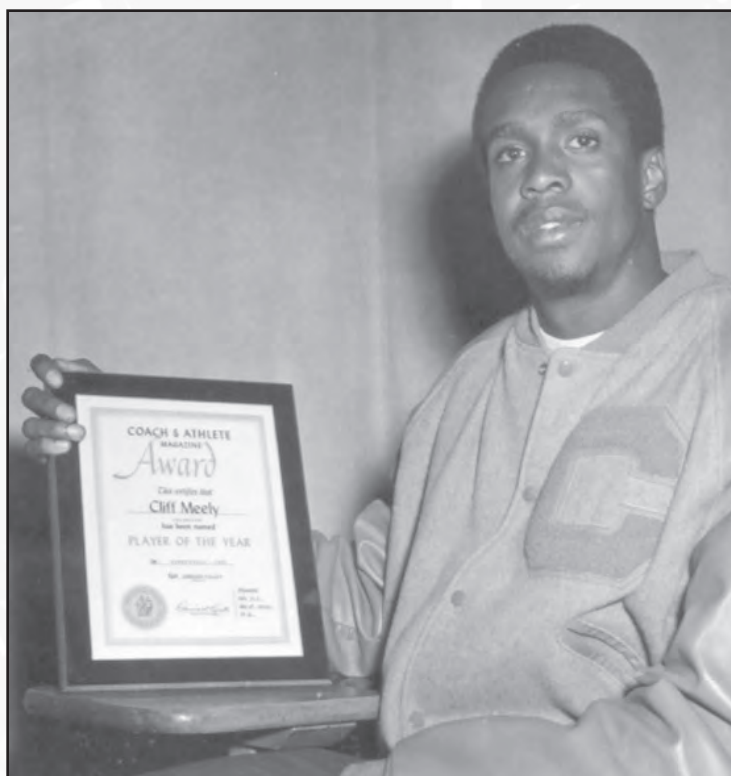

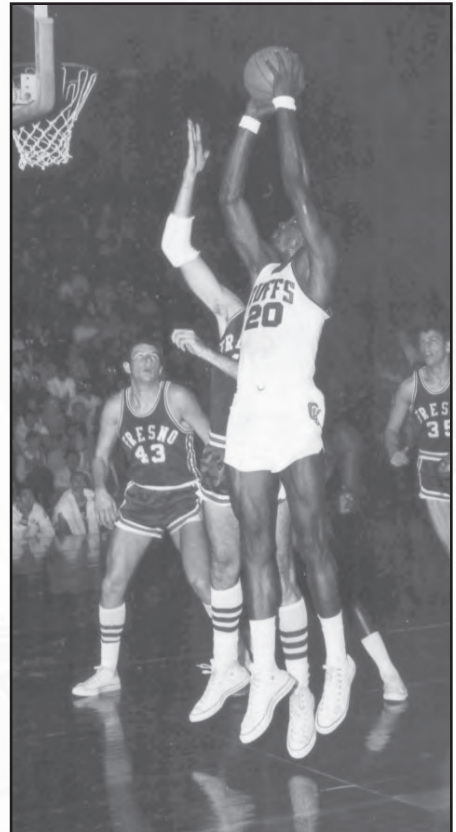

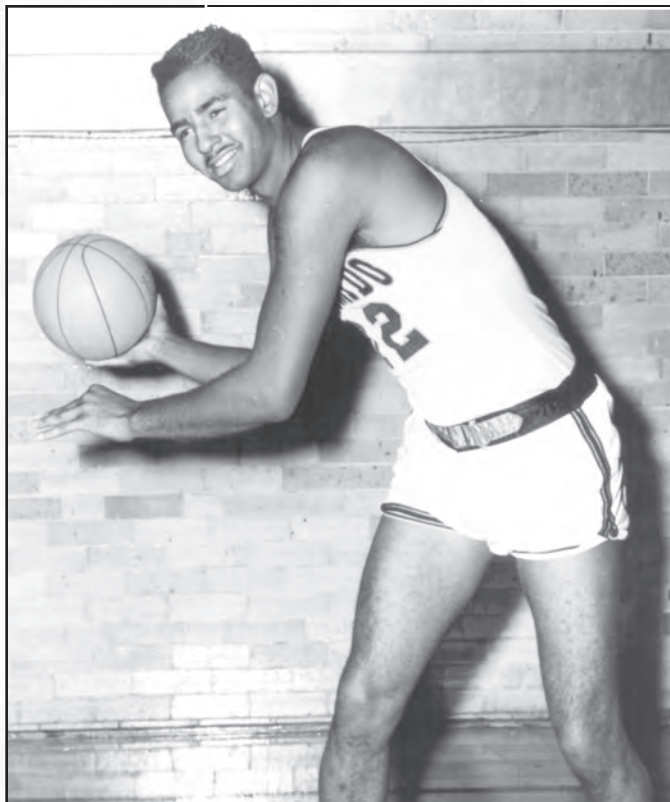

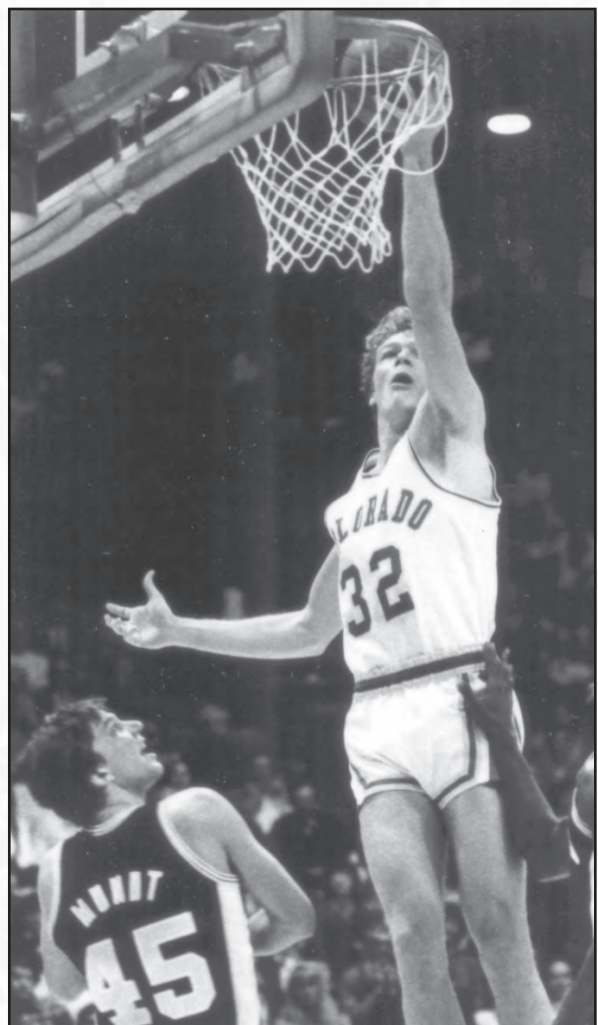

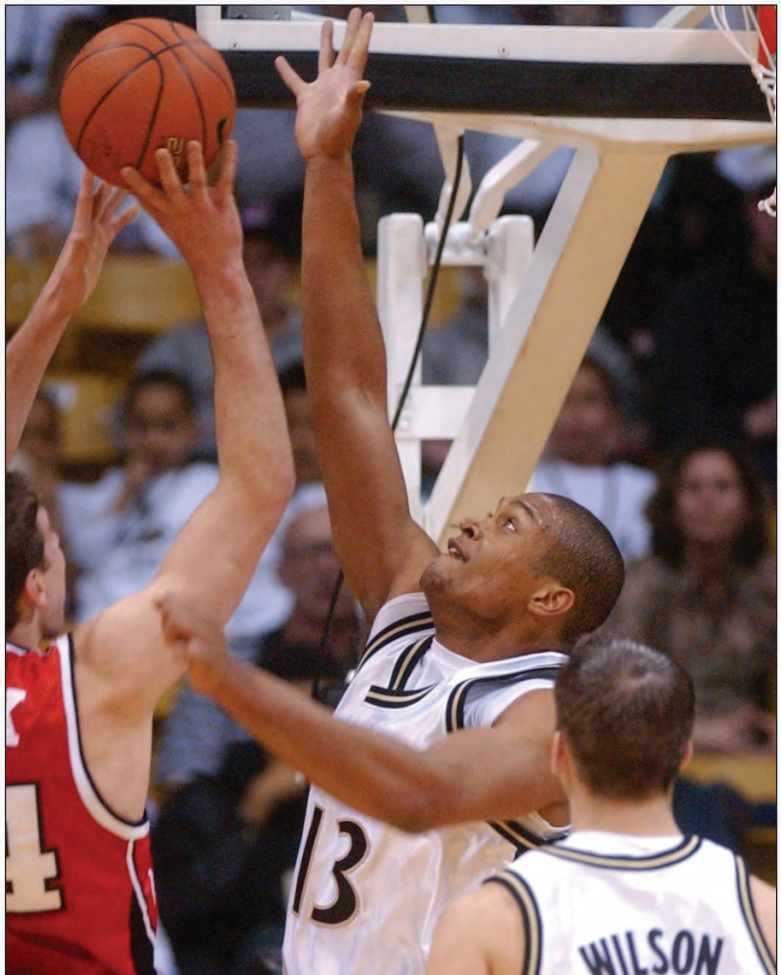

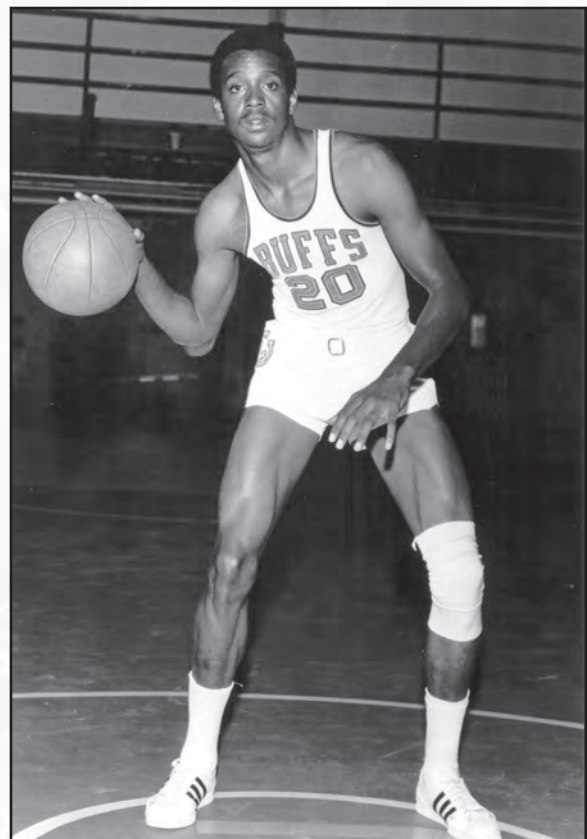
