### MBB OPENS SEASON WITH HOME VICTORY

BOULDER – Freshman forward Josh Scott scored a team-high 14 points, while sophomore guards Askia Booker and Spencer Dinwiddie each chipped-in 13 points leading Colorado to a 74-59 season-opening victory over Wofford.

Prior to the game, the Buffs celebrated the team's 2011-12 Pac-12 Conference Championship, with the unveiling of an engraved sandstone edifice, hanging in the south end of the Coors Events Center.

The Buffaloes were never threatened in the game, opening their largest lead of 12 points the first half with 10:05 remaining.

"There are some things we can build on from a positive standpoint; there is obviously a lot of room for improvement as well," said CU head coach Tad Boyle.

"Overall, I thought our guys really tried to execute; there were times where the team played hard even though we had some break downs and Wofford again was one of those teams that when we broke down they made us pay; they had some really good players."

In the second half, CU started on a 13-5 run gaining a 47-28 lead. The Buffs reached their largest lead of the game 71-48 with 3:21 remaining.

CU shot 44.7 percent from the field for the game, while making 28-of-36 free throws (77.8%). Wofford only went to free line twice (2-of-2) and made 36.1 percent of its shots.

Four Colorado freshmen - Xavier Johnson, Josh Scott, Eli Stalzer, and Xavier Talton - played in their first career game as Buffaloes, all contributing valued efforts. Scott, the 6-10 forward from Monument, Colo., also grabbed six rebounds, as he started his first career game in a CU uniform. Of Scott's 14 points, 10 of them came from the free throw line as the freshman was nearly perfect at the foul stripe making 10-of-11.

### STRONG SECOND HALF PUSHES BUFFS PAST FLYERS

CHARLESTON, S.C. – Colorado's youthful Buffaloes used a 16-2 second-half run to take control against Dayton and breeze into the second round of the Charleston Classic with a 67-57 win.

CU (2-0) got double-figure scoring from Askia Booker (16), Xavier Johnson (15), Josh Scott (13) and Spencer Dinwiddie (12). Andre Roberson collected a game-best 14 rebounds.

CU hit only 14 of 24 free throws for the afternoon, but Dinwiddie still sealed the win by making five of six in the final 37.1 seconds.

The Buffs trailed 27-23 at intermission, giving up a pair of three-pointers to the Flyers. Khari Price and Matt Derenbecker that highlighted a 7-0 Flyers run in the half's final 2:15. That Dayton spurted off five consecutive points by Johnson that pushed the Buffs in front 23-20 at the 2:39 mark.

Neither team led by more than four points in the first 20 minutes, with CU jumping to a 4-0 lead on baskets by Booker and Josh Scott and Dayton enjoying a four-point advantage at the break.

A free throw from senior center Josh Benson in the first 13 seconds of the second half opened a 28-23 Flyers lead, but baskets by Scott and Dinwiddie on a fast break after a steal pulled the Buffs to within 28-27.

Colorado shot 34.5 percent (10-of-29) from the field and committed nine turnovers against four assists, compared to the Flyers' 32.4 shooting percent (11-of-34) and seven turnovers.

A three-point play by Scott with 2:55 left sent CU ahead 59-52. Dayton's Dillard two free throws at 1:59 cut Dayton's deficit to 59-54, but the unflappable Booker drained a trey from the left wing for a 62-54 lead that thwarted the Flyers' comeback. After the Buffs final push, the Flyers came no closer than five points the rest of the way and the Buffs were moving on with a 67-57 victory.

## YOUNG BUFFS BRING HOME CHAMPIONSHIP

CHARLESTON, S.C. – The young Buffs capped a rugged three-game run with an 81-74 win against Murray State to win the Charleston Classic, giving CU its first in-season tournament title since the 2002-03 team won the Pepsi Classic in Charlotte, N.C.

Sophomore Askia Booker compiled 58 points in three games - a 19.3 average and a career-high 23 in the championship game - and was named the tournament's MVP.

Dinwiddie finished the championship game with 13 points. Junior Andre Roberson scored in double figures (16) and finished one rebound short (nine) of his first double-double this year.

After clanking and clunking free throws in the first two games - including missing 14 of 18 against Baylor - CU sank 27 of 36 Sunday night. In the game's final 7:58, CU hit 18 of 20. Dinwiddie stuck 11 of 12.

Booker called winning the tournament "a confidence booster for everybody. We played three good teams . . . we can play with anybody. There's nobody in the country we can't compete against and win. We play team ball and it comes down to defense and rebounding at the end of the day. Coach tells that to us every day."

CU outrebounded Murray State 35-30 and won the board battle in two of the three games here. A back-and-forth second half appeared to be underway until CU unleashed a 6-0 run highlighted by back-to-back stuffs by Scott on a baseline move and Booker on a breakaway. That surge opened a 48-45 Buffs lead with just under 12 minutes remaining.

Roberson fouled out with 13.4 seconds left, sending Daniel to the free throw line for a potential three-point play. But he missed and the Buffs' lead was 77-72. Dinwiddie hit another four free throws in the final 10 seconds and this one was done.

## BUFFS ICE DOWN FALCONS, REMAIN UNBEATEN

BOULDER – The No. 23 Buffs remained unbeaten by zooming past the previously unbeaten Falcons 89-74 for their first 5-0 start since the 1989-90 season.

AFA (5-1) shot 57.1 percent (8-of-14) from beyond the arc in the first half, but still trailed 41-39.

The Falcons finished the game at 40.6 percent (13-of-32) from long range, with the Buffs at 7-of-13 (53.8 percent) for the night. But CU had more of everything: the Buffs made the board battle a joke, winning it 46-19; they dominated in the paint, 40-18; they had 18 second-chance points to the Falcons' four; and they sank 22-of-28 free throws.

Freshman post Josh Scott posted his first 20-point night at CU, junior forward Andre Roberson got back in his double-double groove (18 points, 13 rebounds) and the sophomore backcourt of Spencer Dinwiddie and Askia Booker contributed 15 points each.

"This team, when we're balanced, we have lot of different weapons," Boyle said. Boyle used 10 players in the first 20 minutes, and nine of them scored.

Addressing the Falcon's hot shooting, Scott said: "I thought they were definitely going to get tired and were not going to make those shots in the second half. We were contesting them."

Added Roberson: "They came out hot . . . but they wouldn't be able to do it for all 40 minutes."

At the 7:47 mark, CU had gone ahead by 10 (71-61) on a pair of Dinwiddie free throws. Another pair from Scott and a nifty layup by Booker with 5:19 to play opened a 14-point CU advantage (75-61) from which they never looked back.

## BUFFS GRIND OUT 50-43 ROAD WIN AT FRESNO STATE

FRESNO, Calif. – Junior forward Andre Roberson tallied his 30th career double-double with 17 points and a career-high 20 rebounds leading Colorado to a 50-43 road win at Fresno State.

Roberson is the first CU player to grab 20 rebounds in a game since Stephane Pelle grabbed 21 boards on Nov. 21, 2002 against Stetson.

Sophomore Askia Booker and freshman Josh Scott added 14 and 11 points, respectively.

"You have to find a way to win when you don't play your best, and we obviously ran into that in the second half," CU head coach Tad Boyle said. "We didn't play our best, obviously, but we found a way."

After a close first half, in which Colorado led 18-17 with 6:22 remaining, Colorado appeared to finally take control of the game with a 9-0 run led by a Booker 3-pointer, four points by Josh Scott, and a Roberson layup to give the Buffaloes a 27-17 halftime lead.

The Bulldogs would take the lead for the second, and last time after a Robert Upshaw layup giving Fresno a 30-29 lead with 12:15 remaining.

Colorado had an answer though, Booker drilled a 3-pointer and then Roberson followed with an impressive alley-oop dunk assisted by Sabatino Chen, who would then score the next four points of the game making the score 41-32, completing a 9-0 run for the visiting team.

Sophomore Spencer Dinwiddie, who sprained his ankle in a road loss at Kansas, did not score a point until a made free throw with 18 seconds remaining in the game to give the Buffaloes a three point lead.

This was the sixth time a Colorado opponent has been held to under 50 points in a game during the Tad Boyle era in Buffaloes basketball.

"It was our best defensive performance all year," said Boyle. "So, that's progress."

## BUFFS GET IN THE SPIRIT OF GIVING, WIN BIG

BOULDER – Coach Tad Boyle was more impressed by his team's willingness to share than its point total, despite Colorado registering 98 points to Northern Arizona's 51.

Sharing the ball more effectively has been on Boyle's mind for a couple of months, and Friday night his team responded with 24 assists.

"We played unselfish . . . we made the extra pass and it was contagious on our team," a beaming Boyle said. "It's a great way to go into Christmas break . . . a great team victory."

He used all 12 of his players and 11 of them scored - five reaching double figures. Askia Booker and Xavier Johnson each had 17, with Spencer Dinwiddie adding 15, Josh Scott 11 and Andre Roberson 10. Reserves Ben Mills and Beau Gamble got in the game late and scored their first points of the season.

"We really need to get those (bench) guys going," Boyle said. "Those guys are going to be important to us throughout the season. We know pretty much what we're going to get from our starters."

The Buffs' 98 points were the second most in the Boyle era, as was their 47-point margin of victory. Their 57 first-half points were the third highest for a first half since the 1954-55 season.

CU finished the first half with an eye-popping 71.4 percent from the field (25-for-35) and 60 percent from three-point range (6-for-10). The Buffs shot 66.7 percent (40-for-60) for the game - the best shooting percentage by a CU team in 23 seasons - and were at 55 percent (11-for-20) from beyond the arc.

## BUFFS FALL IN OT AFTER CONTROVERSIAL CALL

TUCSON, Ariz. – No. 3 Arizona finally caught Colorado in the final 9 seconds of regulation play, then benefitted from a controversial waived-off basket in the final second and defeated the Buffaloes 92-83 in overtime.

The Buffs believed they had won when senior Sabatino Chen banked in a three-pointer at the final buzzer in regulation of their Pac-12 Conference opener. But after conferring with the timekeepers and watching the replay monitor at the McKale Center, officials disallowed Chen's shot and the game went into OT.

Shown a replay of Chen's trey before his postgame interview with KOA Radio, CU coach Tad Boyle said, "That just makes me sick to my stomach . . . I'm sick to my stomach because I think our team deserved to win that game. But we didn't and we have to move on from it."

In the overtime, it was all Wildcats, who trailed by as many as 17 points in the first half and 16 in the second. Less than a minute into overtime, they took their first lead since 5-4 on a three-point play by Kevin Parrom to make it 83-82.

The Buffs tied it at 83-83 on one of two free throws by Xavier Johnson, who made his first career start in place of Chen. But CU didn't score again.

Five CU players scored in double figures, topped by Askia Booker's 18. Freshman Josh Scott and Chen scored 15 each - a career-high for Chen - while Johnson had 13 and Spencer Dinwiddie 11.

"You have to look at the free throws," Boyle said. "We shot 58 percent for the game; we got away with that earlier in the year at times but tonight we didn't get away with it, it cost us the game. ## BUFFS' RALLY COMES UP SHORT AGAINST BRUINS

BOULDER (Jan. 12) – Deep and talented UCLA led by a point at halftime, revved it up in the second half, then had to desperately hold on to beat CU 78-75 and deal the Buffs their first loss of the season at the Coors Events Center.

CU closed to within a point (76-75) on Spencer Dinwiddie's layup, but UCLA's Jordan Adams sank a pair of free throws with 7.9 seconds to play to give the Bruins their final lead. A three-point attempt from the left corner by Askia Booker bounced off the rim at the buzzer.

CU coach Tad Boyle said his team got the shot it wanted: "We drew that play up and got 'Ski' a wide-open three in the corner . . . we got the shots we wanted offensively, we really did what we set out to do in the last two or three minutes. But we didn't get a stop when we needed to."

Giving up its first home loss of the season, CU fell to 11-5 overall and 1-3 in the Pac-12 Conference.

Dinwiddie led CU with 23 points - 15 in the second half - while Booker and Josh Scott added 18 each. Scott also had nine rebounds. UCLA's Travis Wear matched Dinwiddie's point total and stepped up with clutch baskets when the Buffs were making their comeback. Adams added 18 points, with Shabazz Muhammad contributing 14 and Kyle Anderson 12 for UCLA.

The Buffs, said Boyle, "played hard and competed, but we have to be more consistent from start to finish against good teams." He drew on a quote from his former college coach at Kansas, Larry Brown: "Coming back is easy; coming back and winning is hard."

## HUSKIES PUT THE BITE ON FRIGID BUFFS

SEATTLE (Jan. 16) – The Colorado Buffaloes dug themselves a hole with frigid shooting and left Alaska Airlines Arena in a deeper Pac-12 Conference hole, losing 64-54 to Washington.

Boyle said his team's defense "was good enough to win . . . our guys played great (defense). We played with pride and some toughness. We lost to a good basketball team."

The Buffs shot a season-low 29.2 percent in the first half and finished at 36.2 percent (21-for-58) for the game - the team's second-lowest mark this season. CU also tied a season low in assists with six and made only one of 10 three-point attempts.

But the Buffs held the Huskies to 33.9 percent (20-for-59) from the field and outrebounded them by one (38-37).

Boyle said the Huskies' 15 offensive rebounds "really killed us in the second half. We had some stops and couldn't finish the possession with getting the rebound."

Sophomore Spencer Dinwiddie, who led CU with 15 points, said the Buffs played with more overall intensity than in previous conference losses to Arizona, Arizona State and UCLA.

The only other CU player in double figures was junior Andre Roberson with 10 points, marking the first time this season only two Buffs reached double digits. Roberson also had 11 rebounds for his seventh double-double of the season and the 32nd of his career.

Sophomore guard Askia Booker fouled out with 34.4 seconds to play after scoring nine points, while freshman forwards Xavier Johnson and Josh Scott had nine and eight, respectively.

## BALANCED, PHYSICAL BUFFS POUND CARDINAL BY 21

BOULDER – After being manhandled twice by Stanford in their first Pac-12 Conference season, the Colorado Buffaloes finally struck back, leading from opening tip to final buzzer, bashing the Cardinal 75-54 at the Coors Events Center.

The feat did not go unnoticed as the Buffs played before 11,212 fans-the fourth largest crowd in school history.

Said Boyle: "It was a bloodbath out there . . . it was one of those games where you had to put the ball in the basket. We told our guys at timeouts not to look for fouls."

Instead, they relied on balanced scoring - all five starters were in double figures - tenacious rebounding by junior Andre Roberson and steely defense. Roberson tied a career high with 20 of the Buffs' 48 rebounds (the Cardinal collected 30) and added 12 points.

"We fed off Andre tonight . . . (he) was a beast and played like the Andre we know and love. He was after it from the get-go" Boyle said.

Roberson's energy seemed unlimited and spilled over to the entire starting lineup. Sophomore Askia Booker scored a team-high 13, including eight consecutive points midway through the second half when Stanford closed to within eight. Freshman Josh Scott and sophomore Spencer Dinwiddie also scored 12 points each, while freshman Xavier Johnson contributed 11.

## BUFFS BEAT BEARS, REACH .500 IN PAC-12

BOULDER – Opening with another stellar defensive performance then staying above ground with a season-best effort from the free throw line, CU beat California 81-71 to even its Pac-12 Conference record at 4-4.

Said Boyle: "The game was one of those deals where our shooting (59.6 percent) overcame a lot of other ills and some deficiencies we know we have to get better at."

Topping his list were the 20 CU turnovers that led to 22 Cal points. There also were the Bears' 53 second-half points - 33 of them attributable to guards Allen Crabbe and Justin Cobbs, who finally got untracked after nearly silent first halves and helped whittle an 18-point Buffs lead to eight in the final minute.

CU led 34-18 at halftime and shot 50 percent from the field (13-for-26). But that percentage at times belied their offensive efficiency. After taking a nine-point lead (14-5) on consecutive treys by Booker, CU went nearly 7 minutes without scoring again.

But in the final 60 seconds, Spencer Dinwiddie hit eight consecutive free throws to keep the Buffs afloat. He hit 9-of-10, leading CU to its best foul-shooting performance of the season - 18-of-22 (81.8 percent).

Finishing with 16 points, Dinwiddie was one of four CU players in double figures. Askia Booker scored 20, Xavier Johnson (18) and Andre Roberson (15). Johnson also collected 12 rebounds for his first career double.

Cal (11-8, 3-4) was led by Cobbs with 22 points - 16 in the second half, and Crabbe added 21 - 17 of those in the second half.

Roberson played only 2 first-half minutes due to foul problems and was limited to five rebounds after his 20-board performance against Stanford on Thursday. He led the nation in rebounding (11.9) entering the game.

## ROBERSON, BUFFS STAY WITH IT, EDGE DUCKS

EUGENE, Ore. – Andre Roberson's lay-in with 29.5 seconds to play, coupled with intense defense on Oregon over the final 4 1/2 minutes earned the Colorado a dramatic 48-47 win at Matt Knight Arena over the No. 19 team in the country.

CU's offense was hard to find; the Buffs' winning total was their lowest in the modern shot clock era.

On Thursday night, the Buffs shot only 36.5 percent from the field, but they held the Ducks to 36.2 percent. CU's defense was particularly unforgiving in the final 4:26, holding the Ducks scoreless after they had taken a 47-40 lead.

CU had only one player in double figures - Roberson, who collected his 35th career double-double with 10 points and 13 rebounds.

Said Roberson: "I didn't want us to lose, and it starts with me . . . I just took it on myself to go out and play defense and continue to fight. We were still right there; we just weren't getting over that hump to get the lead. I tip my hat to each and every one of our guys."

The first tip of his hat might go to Spencer Dinwiddie finishing with eight points, four assists, and whose late defense was as critical as Roberson's, according to Boyle. Dinwiddie pressured E.J. Singler on Oregon's final full possession into a difficult shot, appearing to get a piece of the ball.

## DINWIDDIE, BUFFS RALLY TO DEFEAT OREGON STATE

CORVALLIS, Ore. – On a night highlighted by Spencer Dinwiddie's perfection and another show of grit by his teammates, CU rallied to beat Oregon State 72-68.

Dinwiddie, the stellar sophomore guard was perfect from the field - six-for-six, including four-of-four from beyond the arc - and hit all eight of his free throw attempts, six of them in the final 1:41. His accuracy brought the Buffs back from a seven-point second-half deficit.

CU's difference against Oregon State, said Boyle: "We had Spencer Dinwiddie and they didn't." He scored 17 of his game-high 24 points in the second half, helping CU to go above .500 (6-5, 16-7 overall) for the first time this season in Pac-12 play.

His second-half shooting, Dinwiddie said, "was a product of the zone. You're going to have to knock down threes to beat a team like that when they play a zone. That's the whole idea of a zone, you know? They pack it in and force you to shoot uncontested jump shots. Fortunately they were going in."

CU also got double-figure production from freshman Josh Scott (17) and senior Sabatino Chen (10). Oregon State (2-9, 12-12) was led by Roberto Nelson with 21 points - 17 of those in the second half. Junior Andre Roberson finished with a career-best five steals to compliment his 10 rebounds and seven points.

CU started with a feverish pace, hitting its first six shots before finally missing and going up by 13 points (19-6) on a pair of free throws by Booker.

"We did what we had to do but it wasn't our best performance," Boyle said. "We beat an Oregon State team that is talented and better than their record indicates. I've got a lot of respect for their players and coach."

## BUFFS THROW A BLANKET OF 'D' OVER WILDCATS

BOULDER – The Buffaloes draped themselves over No. 9 Arizona, smothering the Pac-12 Conference's highest-scoring team and leaving a delirious Coors Events Center with a resume-enhancing, think-Big Danc-ing 71-58 win.

As nasty as CU's defense was in limiting Arizona to its lowest point total of the season, the offense provided by sophomore Spencer Dinwiddie and freshman Xavier Johnson was equally potent. Dinwiddie finished with a game-high 21, Johnson with a career-high 19.

Sophomore guard Askia Booker added 10 points, two assists and three steals, and junior Andre Roberson contributed seven points and a game-best 13 rebounds to move past Cliff Meely into second place (978) on the school's board list.

"It was a great atmosphere for college basketball," CU coach Tad Boyle said. "The whole state of Colorado can be proud . . . this had nothing to do with revenge, but everything to do with respect for Arizona. They'll win a lot of games as the season unfolds, but we will, too."

Arizona came into the game averaging 76.2 points and featured two of the league's top nine scorers in Mark Lyons (17.5) and Solomon Hill (15.4). Lyons got 11 points, Hill 12 as the Wildcats were limited to 42.3 percent from the field.

The Buffs checked out at 50 percent from the field, including 59.1 percent in the second half when the Wildcats cut a 15-point deficit to six with 10:35 to play. Dinwiddie, who also had a career-best seven assists, scored 19 of his total in the final 20 minutes.

The Buffs finished nine of 17 from behind the three-point arc, with Johnson going four-for-five and Dinwiddie two-for-five.

The Buffs had watched a 17-point lead evaporate in Tucson, but no way it would happen in the rematch. All that remained was for the CU student body to rush court - and this time no one questioned whether it was justified.

## BUFFS FALL IN OT ON BUZZER-BEATING LAYUP

BOULDER (Feb. 16) – Arizona State's Evan Gordon split CU's defense down the right lane, driving for the game-winning basket in overtime as the Sun Devils stunned the Buffs 63-62 at the nearly sold-out Coors Events Center.

"Welcome to college football . . . I thought the season was over in December," said disgruntled CU coach Tad Boyle. "It was an unbelievably physical game, the most physical game I've ever been a part of - college, high school, YMCA."

CU freshman Josh Scott took the brunt of the night's physicality. Matched against Jordan Bachynski, the 6-10, 215-pound Scott and the 7-2, 250-pound ASU center became entangled and spun to the floor with 16:02 remaining in the second half. The incident sent Scott to the locker room and prevented him from returning.

On ASU's winning possession, which started with 8.3 seconds left after Spencer Dinwiddie's layup gave CU a 62-61 lead, Buffs sophomore Askia Booker and his teammates were aware of Sun Devils point guard Jahi Carson.

Dinwiddie led CU with 24 points, with Booker adding 17 and Xavier Johnson 10. Carson's 18 topped ASU, with Gordon scoring 14 and Bachynski 12.

CU trailed for the final 6:38 of regulation and had only one field goal from the 5:33 mark until a pair in the final 46.6 seconds by Booker and Johnson. It was Johnson's dunk on a dish from Dinwiddie that tied the score at 54-54 and sent the game into overtime.

## BUFFS STEP UP, PUT DOWN UTES WITHOUT SCOTT

BOULDER (Feb. 21) – Getting stand-up performances from players in stand-in roles and a typical night's work from Andre Roberson, the Buffs put away the Utes 60-50 at the Coors Events Center.

"It was a must win," CU coach Tad Boyle said. "It wasn't pretty but we found a way to get it done."

In the rematch, CU took control with a 17-5 run to open the second half. The Buffs got 13 points from Spencer Dinwiddie, 12 from Sabatino Chen, 10 from Roberson and season-high nine from Jeremy Adams off the bench. Roberson added 11 rebounds, 4 blocks and two steals.

And among Roberson's 11 boards was his 1,000th career rebound. He is in second place (1,006) at CU, trailing only Stephane Pelle (1,054).

"It means a lot," Roberson said, mainly because of Boyle's emphasis on defense and rebounding. Roberson said he took that emphasis "to heart. . . it's a great accomplishment for me and I'm not done working."

The Buffs limited the Utes to 31.9 percent from the field and out-rebounded them 22-14 in the second half.

Dinwiddie, who had averaged 23 points in his last three games, entered Thursday night having made 32 consecutive free throws. He went two-for-four in the first half but was the catalyst in the Buffs closing with a 9-2 run to take a 30-28 lead at intermission. He also hit four-of-four in the final 46 seconds, enabling CU to close out the win.

## STREAKING BEARS CAPITALIZE ON BUFFS' FRIGID OFFENSE

BERKELEY, Calif. (Mar. 2) – Plagued by frigid shooting against California, Colorado missed out on a chance to sweep its Bay Area road trip by losing 62-46 to California here Saturday afternoon.

Colorado struggled offensively Saturday with a season low in points, field goals made (15) and field goal shooting percentage (23.1). Freshman forward Xavier Johnson was the only CU player in double figures with 14 total points. Freshman Josh Scott also returned to the lineup after missing two games with a concussion, managing four points and 11 rebounds.

Cal's Justin Cobbs and Tyrone Wallace scored 16 points each, while David Kravish added 14 points and 11 rebounds. Wallace also hauled down 11 boards.

"We didn't have one guy offensively make a shot tonight, but you have to credit Cal, they man-handled us," CU coach Tad Boyle said. "Our first shot defense was pretty good but those second-chance shots were tough."

While the Buffs recorded a season-low six turnovers on the afternoon and a season-high 20 offensive rebounds, Boyle said his players didn't take advantage of those opportunities like the Bears did. Moreover, Cal outscored CU 44-12 in the paint.

An improving Cal team executed offensively with its star scorer, Allen Crabbe, on the bench in foul trouble. The Golden Bears went on an 8-0 run over the next four minutes to go up 22-15, and while senior guard Sabatino Chen hit a three to end the half on an energetic note, the Buffs were still down four (24-20) at intermission.

Cal had widened its second half gap to nine by the 5:32 mark - and with a final shooting percentage of 23.1 from the field, the Buffs' comeback attempt came nowhere close. By the final buzzer, CU was down 16 and went back to Boulder with its 62-46 loss.

## MINUS ROBERSON, BUFFS BREEZE PAST DUCKS

BOULDER (Mar. 7) – With the nation's leading rebounder watching from the Colorado bench in street clothes, the Buffaloes went ahead and did the unimaginable, downing No. 19 Oregon 76- 53.

It was an out-of-sight blowout Thursday night at the sold-out (11,013) Coors Events Center, as CU savored a sweep of Oregon and its fourth win in six games this season against a Top 25 opponent.

"I told the team in the locker room I have been coaching division one basketball for 18 years now and I am not sure I have been more proud of a group of guys with what they did and how they stepped up," Boyle said. "Our starters, bench, whoever we put in there played their hearts out and we beat a good solid basketball team."

In the absence of the 6-7 Roberson, who was day-to-day with a viral illness, the Buffs took up the slack by committee. Their headliner was freshman Xavier Johnson, who responded with a career-high 22 points. He was perfect from the field, hitting seven-of-seven, including three-of-three from beyond the arc, and was five-of-six from the free throw line.

Sophomore guards Spencer Dinwiddie and Askia Booker added 17 and 11, respectively. Dinwiddie contributed seven rebounds and Booker six. Junior Jeremy Adams left the bench for seven points, and senior Sabatino Chen - opening in Roberson's place - got six.

CU's first-half defense was stifling, limiting Oregon to 18 percent shooting (3-for-16) in the first 10 minutes. By intermission the Ducks' shooting had improved, but not by much - 7-for-26 (27 percent). The Buffs, meanwhile, went 13-of-27 (48 percent), hitting half of their eight three-point attempts.

## DINWIDDIE, CU WIN UGLY, CATCH ARIZONA NEXT

LAS VEGAS (Mar. 13) – Beaten and embarrassed the previous weekend on their home court by last-place Oregon State, the Buffs regrouped and eliminated the Beavers 74-68 on Wednesday in the first round of the Pac-12 Conference Tournament.

CU sophomore guard Spencer Dinwiddie, who led the Buffs with 20 points on Wednesday, including eight straight after the Beavers had pulled to within a point in the second half.

"Sometimes in tournament games you've got to win ugly," Boyle said, adding he couldn't remember when his team shot better from beyond the three-point arc (43.8 percent) than in front of it (39.3).

Junior forward Andre Roberson, who returned after missing two games with a viral illness, scored 12 points, added seven rebounds and, according to OSU coach Craig Robinson, was Wednesday's difference-maker.

Roberson was enough of an inside presence on the defensive end to help limit the Beavers to 39.7 percent from the field. He also contributed to CU having an 18-12 advantage in second-chance points.

In addition to Dinwiddie's 20 and Roberson's 12, CU got 16 points from Johnson and eight first-half points off the bench from Jeremy Adams, who continues to be a late-season force.

Roberson, the Pac-12's Defensive Player of The Year, knocked down a three-pointer followed by a pair of free throws that gave the Buffs a 12-point lead (61-49) with 2:43 remaining. It was CU's largest advantage of the afternoon, one that the Beavers could not overcome. Added Roberson: "They're a great program. They play just like us - same philosophies. It's like the cat going to get the mice; we've got to come hungry . . . and be ready to play."

## BUFFS' LATE RALLY FAILS TO OVERTAKE WILDCATS

LAS VEGAS – The Buffs believe their NCAA case has been stated - even in Thursday's 79-69 quarterfinal loss to No. 18 Arizona in the Pac-12 Conference Tournament.

No. 5 seed CU rallied dramatically, cutting a 14-point lead by No. 4 seed Arizona to two in the final 63 seconds. But the Wildcats held on and left the Buffs holding their collective breath for one of 37 NCAA at-large bids.

"We're one of the top 37 teams in my mind," said CU coach Tad Boyle. "But it's not for me to say."

The Buffs trailed 39-28 after a first half that saw them commit 10 of their 13 turnovers (leading to 15 first-half Arizona points) and hit only five of 12 free throw attempts.

With 12:24 left in the game, CU fell behind by 14 before tightening up its defense, rebounding more tenaciously and eventually closing to within 71-69 on a pair of Andre Roberson free throws with 1:03 remaining. But Arizona's Nick Johnson scored a layup between two CU defenders at the other end to push the Wildcats up four. The Wildcats added four more free throws in the final 14.2 seconds to win by double digits.

CU outrebounded Arizona 33-31 with the help of another Andre Roberson double-double (15 points, 11 rebounds). CU also received help from Spencer Dinwiddie (18 points), Askia Booker (12) and Xavier Johnson (11).

Arizona coach Sean Miller said the Wildcats "beat an excellent basketball team . . . we needed to play extremely hard to beat a team like Colorado. You think about Colorado being seeded fifth, it really shows the depth and quality of our conference from top to bottom."

## BUFFS RALLY BUT CAN'T HOLD ON AGAINST ILLINI

AUSTIN, Texas (Mar. 22) – Colorado caught Illinois with a furious second-half comeback, but the Buffaloes couldn't make their inspired run – or their stay in the NCAA Tournament last.

The seventh-seeded Illini withstood the Buffs' rally then staged one of their own, eliminating No. 10 seed CU 57-49.

"I told our team I'm proud of what they've done this year, with a young group," said CU coach Tad Boyle. "We've put Colorado basketball on the map, but we've got a lot of work we need to do . . . I'm proud of what Colorado basketball is in the process of becoming."

CU trailed by 16 points (37-21) at halftime, but opened the second half with a 23-2 run and went up 44-39 with just under 10 minutes to play. The Buffs held the Illini without a second-half field goal until 8:33 remained in the game and limited them to only three field goals in the final 20 minutes.

The Buffs' defensive effort in final 20 minutes wasn't enough. Boyle said his players showed "extreme heart" in coming back, but "we just didn't have enough of what it took in key possessions of the game, some offensive and some defensive, to finish this thing off. Illinois made more plays down the stretch than we did."

## 2012-2013 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

**PAC-12 AWARDS:** In a vote of the Pac-12 Conference coaches, Andre Roberson was named Defensive Player of the Year, conference first team and to the All-Defensive team; Spencer Dinwiddie was named to the conference first team; and Josh Scott was named to the Pac-12 Conference All-Freshman team.

**NEUTRAL COURT:** The Buffs were 4-2 (.667) on a neutral court winning the Charleston Classic in November (3-0), then going 1-1 (.500) at the Pac-12 Tournament, and 0-1 at the NCAA Tournament • Since the 2011-12 Pac-12 Tournament in Los Angeles (4-0) and the NCAA Tournament in Albuquerque (1-1), the Buffs are 9-3 (.750) • Head Coach Tad Boyle teams are 13-8 (.619) on neutral courts during his three years. **FRESHMEN/SOPHOMORE DUO RECORDS:** Askia Booker and Spencer Dinwiddie already hold the CU freshmen record for combined points (677), now they own the sophomore record as well with 915 points. Dinwiddie (505) & Booker (410) are the first sophomore tandem in 45 years (1968-69) to lead the team in scoring. They broke the Cliff Meely (23.8, 667 pts.) and Ron Smith (12.6, 214 pts.) as sophomores, who had 881 points. Meely/Smith led CU to the Big 8 title, finished in third place at the NCAA Midwest Tourney, and a 21-7 record (first 20-win season in school history). As freshmen, Dinwiddie (360 pts.) and Booker (317 pts.) combined for a school-record 677 points.

**5TH PLACE OR BETTER:** It was the third straight year CU finished the conference season in fifth place among the final standings (twice: Pac-12, once: Big 12). The three conference placings of fifth place or better is the first time since the 1968-71 seasons (Cliff Meely years), CU finished that consistent among the top-five in three-consecutive seasons (1968-69: 1st; 1969-70: 1-3rd; 1970-71: 1-5th).

**VERSUS RANKED TEAMS:** The Buffs were 4-3 against ranked teams in 2012-13. Since 1961-62, the Buffs have not had a winning record against ranked teams in the same season. The 2002-03 Buffs were 4-4 (.500) against ranked teams. Also, in 1960-61, CU was 2-0 and in 1961-62, the Buffs won their only match up against a ranked team. Finally, the 1963-64 Buffs were 1-1 against ranked teams.

**UNDER 70, AND WE'RE NOT TALKING GOLF:** Prior to its loss Pac-12 Quarterfinal loss to Arizona, 79-69, CU held 11-straight conference opponents under 70 points (tied for 5th among conference schools since 2004-05 at CU • Overall, the 11 is the most since 16 were held under 70 over the course of the entire 1962 Big 8 season.

**ROAD LOSS = HOME WIN:** In three years as CU's head coach, Tad Boyle and the Buffs are 10-2 in games with a road loss then following the next game with a home victory. CU was 5-2 in 2010-11; 3-0 (2011-12), and 3-0 this year.

**CONFERENCE ROAD WARRIORS:** Colorado won three straight conference games on the road, a first since 2000-01; while not the loftiest of achievements, it hasn't been common at CU. Tad Boyle's teams have won two straight Pac-12 road games twice, something the Buffaloes managed only four times in the 15 years as a member of the Big 12. And in the 49 seasons Colorado was in the Big 7/Big 8 (1948-96), it won two straight league road games a grand total of 13 times.

**Three Straight:** Colorado last won three straight conference road games (Feb. 7-27, 2013 (at Oregon, at Oregon State, at Stanford); and from Jan. 20-Feb. 10 2001 (at Texas Tech, Nebraska and Kansas State). The Buffs won three straight twice in the Big 12 and six times in the Big 7/Big 8.

**Three of Four:** CU has won three of its last four Pac-12 road games, the fourth time it has done that under Boyle. It did it twice in the Big 12.

**Four Straight:** CU last won four straight conference road games in 1996-97 (at Missouri, Texas Tech, Baylor and Kansas State). It won four straight twice in the Big 7/Big 8 (1961-62, the last time it won as many as five in a row, and in 1963-64).

**Four of Five:** CU has won as many as four of five league road games just four times: 1996-97, 1963-64, 1961-62 (five in a row with a loss on either end) and 1954-55.

**Five of Six:** CU has done this just twice: 1954-55 and 1961-62.

## AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

- The Buffs defeated two or more ranked teams eight times in the history of the AP poll, and three of those eight streaks have come under Tad Boyle. The longest streak is three games, accomplished twice, first spanning two seasons from December 12, 1960 to January 6, 1962; and then again in the 1991-92 season from February 5-19.
- Only four times have the Buffs defeated three or more ranked teams in the same season, with two of those four seasons coming under Tad Boyle in the last three years. The Buffs defeated four ranked teams in 2012-13, 2010-11, and 2002-03, and have three such wins in 1991-92.
- The Buffs have defeated 53 ranked teams (AP poll) in its history dating back to 1949-50. Tad Boyle now has nine wins over ranked teams.
- In the history of the Coors Events Center (1979-80), the Buffs have now defeated nine top 10 ranked teams (AP poll) in the building's history. With the Buffs 71-58 win over No. 9 Arizona, three of those nine wins have been come under Tad Boyle. The Buffs defeated No. 5 Texas and No. 8 Missouri in 2010-11.

**10+ PPG.:** In each season under Coach Boyle, the Buffs have had four players average in double figures. In 2012-13, Spencer Dinwiddie (15.3), Askia Booker (12.4), Andre Roberson (10.9), and Josh Scott (10.2) In 2011-12 Carlton Brown, Andre Roberson, Austin Dufault, and Nate Tomlinson ended the season averaging 10 or more a game; and in 2010-11, Alec Burks, Cory Higgins, Levi Knutson and Marcus Relphorde averaged over 10 a game.
