NORMAN, Okla. -- University of Colorado sophomore Emily Talley finished tied for fifth at the Big 12 Championships on Sunday.

The effort marked the second time in as many years that Talley finished in the top-10 at the conference tournament.

As a team, the Buffs finished sixth (915 total score). Texas A&M (896) rallied from an 11-stroke deficit to beat Oklahoma State (897) for the team title. Texas was third at 905.

Oklahoma State's Caroline Hedwall claimed the individual title with a three-round total of 210 on the OU Golf Course. Baylor's Hannah Burke (218) was second, OSU's Victoria Park (219) third and Missouri's Julia Potter (221) was fourth.

Talley and Texas A&M's Sarah Zwartynski shared fifth place with 222 totals.

Talley was sixth at the Big 12 Championships as a freshman last year. She is the only Buff to finish in the top 10 at the tournament twice.

Talley carded 44 pars, two birdie and eight bogeys during her three rounds.

Talley and the Buffs are hoping for an NCAA regionals spot and will find out today if they make the cut.

Men ninth at Big 12s

TRINITY, Texas -- The Colorado men's golf team finished ninth at the Big 12 Championships.

Oklahoma State won the event with a team score of 1,133 (19-under par). Texas A&M was second at 1,146 and Texas was third at 1,148.

The Buffs' team score was 1,188 after a 12-over par 300 in the final round at Whispering Pines Golf Club.

Sophomore Sebastian Heisele led the Buffs, tying for 19th after closing with a 2-over 74. He finished at 293.

Texas Tech's Chris Ward claimed medalist honors with a 279 total.

CU tennis team falls to Texas

Colorado senior Monica Milewski upsetting Texas' Aerial Ellis 6-1, 6-4, but the Longhorns won the match 5-2 at the South Campus Tennis Courts. Ellis is the nation's 23rd-ranked player.

Milewski improved to 8-1 in the Big 12 this season and has won 13 of 15 singles matches. Her 25 wins this season ties the 2006-07 season when she also earned an NCAA singles bid.

CU also won the doubles point by winning two of three matches.

Texas won its eighth straight match to improve to 15-4 overall and 10-1 in the conference, while the Buffs (10-12, 3-8) dropped their fourth straight.

The Big 12 Championships start Thursday in Austin, Texas. The Buffs' opponent is yet to be determined.

Kubiak to try out with 'skins

Colorado State safety Klint Kubiak decided not to sign a free-agent deal with his father's NFL team, the Houston Texans, and will have a tryout with the Washington Redskins instead.

Washington coach Mike Shanahan watched Klint Kubiak grow up when Shanahan coached the Broncos and his offensive coordinator was current Texans coach Gary Kubiak.

Four other Rams signed free-agent contracts. Offensive tackle Cole Pemberton will join ex-teammate Shelley Smith, a sixth-round pick, in Houston. Offensive guard Adrian Martinez signed with the Seattle Seahawks, and center Tim Walter is headed to the Chicago Bears. Wide receiver Rashaun Greer was signed by the Dallas Cowboys. *Natalie Meisler, The Denver Post*

CU women place sixth in Big 12.

The University of Colorado women's golf team finished sixth in the Big 12 Championships at the Jimmy Austin OU Golf Course in Norman, Okla.

The Buffs were led by sophomore Emily Talley, who earned her second career top-five finish as she tied for fifth at 6-over-par 222. She matched the second-best performance ever by a CU golfer at the Big 12 Championships.

Talley holds two of the six top-10 finishes at the Big 12 Championships in school history and is the only player in program history to finish in the top 10 twice.

The Buffs shot 915 over three rounds, nine strokes behind tournament winner Texas A&M. Colorado will learn its fate for the NCAA regionals today after the selection show, which begins at 2 p.m.

- The CU men's team shot a final-round 300 and fell from seventh to ninth place at the Big 12 Conference Championships at Whispering Pines Golf Club in Trinity, Texas. The Buffs finished the tournament with a 36-over 1,188. Oklahoma State took the title with a 19-under 1,133. Colorado's top finisher was Sebastian Heisele, who tied for 19th place with a 293.

Bears sweep doubleheader.

The Northern Colorado baseball team swept a doubleheader against Houston Baptist in Greeley. The Bears defeated the Huskies 9-5 in the first game and 5-2 in the second. The wins move Northern Colorado into sole possession of second place in the Great West Conference.

The sophomore Talley tied for fifth overall individually. This helped the Colorado Buffaloes women's golf team finish in sixth place at the Big 12 Championships at the Jimmy Austin OU Golf Course in Norman, Oklahoma. She tied with Sara Zwartynski of Texas A&M.

Texas A&M won the overall team title, beating out Oklahoma State by one stroke. Texas, Iowa State and Texas Tech rounded out the top five.

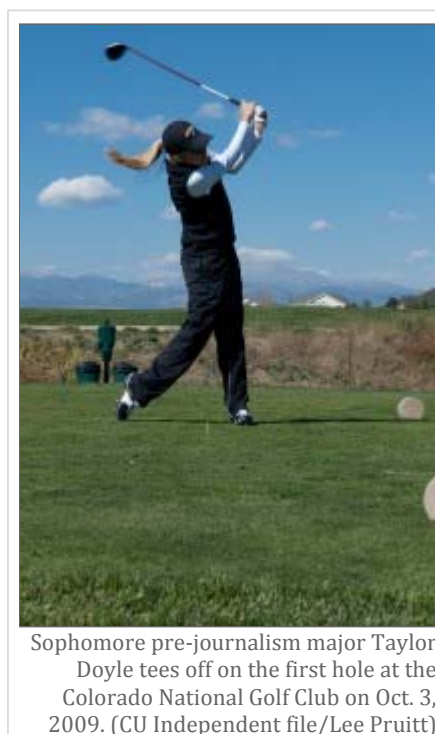
Behind Talley, the other top Buffs included senior Christine Kim who finished tied for 24th, freshman Taylor Doyle who tied for 28th, junior Stephanie Simich who tied for 30th and senior Dominique Pytlewski who tied for 49th.

Caroline Hedwall of Oklahoma State won the overall individual title.

Colorado will find out if they qualify for the NCAA tournament on Monday when the field is announced at 2 p.m.

Milewski dominates, but Buffs still lose

Tennis falls 5-2 to Texas in final regular season match

If only the rest of the Colorado Buffaloes tennis team could have had as good of a day as senior Monica Milewski.

Milewski tied a personal best 25th singles victory of the season after defeating No. 23 nationally ranked Aerial Ellis 6-1, 6-4 in No. 1 singles. The Buffs still lost the overall match, however, 5-2 to the Texas Longhorns on Sunday at the South Campus Courts in Boulder. It was CU's final match of the regular season.

The victory for Milewski, who is ranked 93rd nationally, was the 90th of her career. She is the second women's tennis player in school history to win that many matches. Emily Smith owns the record with 95 wins from 1995 to 99.

Colorado's only other point on the day came in doubles, winning 2-1 over the Longhorns in the doubles matches.

Even though the Buffs couldn't come out with the win, CU head coach Nicole Kenneally said she was proud of her squad.

"I'm very proud of how the team came out and competed today," Kenneally said. "It was a solid doubles point. Obviously it was a loss, but I think it was the most solid performance we have played against Texas in four or five years. We'll take that momentum into the Big 12 Tennis Championships next week."

The Big 12 Championships will begin on Thursday for the Buffs in Austin, Texas. CU's first round opponent has yet to be decided.
