



CU spikers to hold intra-squad scrimmage

BOULDER, Colo. — First-year coach Liz Kritza will give the public its first glimpse of any changes she made to the Colorado volleyball team when the Buffs hold an intra-squad scrimmage at 9 a.m. today in the Coors Events Center.

Colorado's season opener is less than a week away. The Buffs begin the 2009 campaign against Valparaiso on Friday at the University of Florida.

"With our first match quickly approaching, it's important that we keep progressing through our preseason training," Kritza said. "I'm pleased with what I have seen so far. Obviously with a brand new team and coaching staff, it takes some time to put our system together."

The Buffs' home opener will be against San Diego on Sept. 11 as part of the Colorado Invitational.
