CU Buffs return to scene of last Big 12 road win

CU won at Okla. St. on Jan. 21, 2006

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STILLWATER, Okla. -- Jeff Bzdelik was coaching at the Air Force Academy. Dwight Thorne was a senior in high school. Alec Burks was 14.

Richard Roby scored 27 points, including the decisive basket in overtime, to lead the Buffs to a thrilling 80-78 victory over Oklahoma State right here in Stillwater.

The date was Jan. 21, 2006.

It's hard to believe, but that was the last time the Colorado men's basketball program celebrated a Big 12 road victory.

CU has since lost 30 consecutive conference road games entering tonight's tilt against Oklahoma State at Gallagher-Iba Arena (7:05 p.m., ESPNU).

The Buffs (10-7, 1-2) -- who have also dropped their last 22 true road games against Division I opponents since a win at Colorado State during Bzdelik's first season at CU -- believe they are prepared for anything after opening up Big 12 play against three ranked opponents (No. 1 Texas, No. 25 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State).

"I've never really looked at the road as a place where you can't win," said Marcus Relphorde, the Big 12 rookie of the week, who has averaged 19.7 points and five rebounds for the Buffs over the last three games. "I knowwe've had trouble on the road this year and in the past. Hopefully we can keep working hard and pull out some victories."

Last season the Cowboys (13-4, 1-2) cruised to a 76-55 win in Boulder. James Anderson scored 30 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in that game as Oklahoma State out-rebounded CU 38-23.

"We just have to play him solid. He's one of those players who is going to try and get his points," Austin Dufault said of Anderson, who leads the Big 12 in scoring this season. "We can't let any other players have an all-star night on us. We have to make sure we don't over-focus on him and let somebody else get loose on us."

CU's leading scorers against the 'Pokes last season were Levi Knutson (19 points) and Casey Crawford (14 points). Those are career-high numbers in the Big 12 for both role players.

Bzdelik`s star, Cory Higgins, only had nine points in 33 minutes. The junior guard will likely have to match Anderson and receive some help from Relphorde and Burks in order for the visitors to prevail tonight.

"Our players from last year know that we've got some great newcomers. That gives everyone a lot more confidence. It's all about talent," Bzdelik said. "You always need to get reinforced by winning to boost that confidence level. Having success against Baylor was a big boost, but one game doesn't make a season."

The Buffs were still trying to figure out a game plan for Oklahoma State during practices on Monday and Tuesday.

CU has started 6-11 freshman Shane Harris-Tunks in Big 12 play to add some size to the lineup. Bzdelik's team is still getting out-rebounded 40.3 to 25.0 in conference play.

The Cowboys (37.4 rpg) are ninth in the Big 12 in rebounding for the entire season while the Buffs are last (29.1 rpg).

"How do we solve that problem?" Bzdelik said after the 87-81 loss to Kansas State on Saturday. "It falls on me to recruit."

Finding a way for Dufault to return to his freshman form would also help. Since the sophomore forward started coming off the bench in conference play he has averaged 2.0 points and 1.0 rebounds.

"I need to just stay after it, remain confident, and keep working hard in practice every day trying to get better," Dufault said. "Whatever needs to be done on the court, I have to step up and do it. Everybody has peaks and valleys throughout a season. One of these days, I'll get it going again."

CU is third in the Big 12 in field goal percentage (.492) and first in free throw percentage (.762) while Oklahoma State is last in field goal percentage (.434) and sixth in free throw percentage (.696).

"There's no question they're making that natural progression. Jeff has done a great job putting this team together with some good talent," Cowboys coach Travis Ford said. "They're opening it up more offensively and they have new players who have added depth.

"I've watched them on tape. They're just not the same team they were last year."

Television clarification

The Big 12's investigation into why Saturday's CU-Kansas State game was not available to Comcast customers in Boulder is over. A conference official was told that Comcast had made the decision this fall to show a girls high school basketball game on Channel 5, which serves as Altitude 2 on occasion, and informed Altitude of the decision.

Altitude failed to inform ESPN Regional that the game would not be available on Altitude2 (Channel 5) in Boulder, otherwise ESPN Regional would have worked to find another outlet to broadcast the game.

CU sports information director Dave Plati said all remaining games this winter have been doubled-checked by all three entities and a Buffs blackout in Boulder should not happen again.
