Young Buffs look to show their talent

Men's golf heads to Air Force this weekend

After losing 6-4 to CSU in the inaugural State of Colorado Cup last month, the team is, in sophomore Sebastian Heisele's words, ready to "get back at CSU."

Justin Bardgett, the lone senior on the team, agrees. Bardgett said his aim is squared at CSU.

Coming off a 12th-place finish in the team's first tournament competition last weekend in New Mexico, Edwards said he has some other goals in mind as well.

Edwards said he expects the team to fight for every shot this weekend because "there are no secrets to being good at golf."
