Buffs go bust in Las Vegas

CU falls to 0-4 away from Coors, next faces Indiana tonight

LAS VEGAS -- Kansas lost a tough game at a holiday tournament in New York City 30 years ago when Tad Boyle was a freshman.

But that disappointment isn't what the first-year Colorado head coach thinks about now. The Jayhawks' victory over Indiana in the consolation bracket at Madison Square Garden is still the vivid memory from the experience.

"It was one of the most memorable times of my playing career because we beat Indiana," Boyle said. "Our guys have that same opportunity."

Boyle's first Colorado team fell to 0-4 outside the friendly confines of the Coors Events Center after an 89-76 loss to New Mexico on Wednesday night in the Las Vegas Classic at Orleans Arena.

The Buffs (7-4) will try to bounce back against the Hoosiers (9-3) tonight in the tournament's third-place game (5:36 p.m., CBS College Sports).

Indiana, after suffering a 67-61 loss to Northern Iowa, is 9-0 at home and 0-3 outside Assembly Hall. CU is perfect in Boulder (7-0) and very flawed everywhere else.

"Tom Crean has been there for three years and he's trying to instill a lot of the same things we're trying to instill in terms of their pride and their toughness," Boyle said of his IU counterpart. "They're in a growth phase and we're in a growth phase.

"It's a great opportunity for us to play a storied program like Indiana."The Buffs` usual suspects played pretty well offensively -- Alec Burks scored 25 points, Marcus Relphorde had 13 points and Cory Higgins added 10 -- but the Lobos had four players score in double figures and shot 61.2 percent from the field.

"We gave up too many easy buckets and definitely got beat on the boards, which hurt us a lot," said Levi Knutson, who added 10 points off the bench for the Buffs. "We have to guard the ball better and be there to help each other out if somebody does get beat."

New Mexico (10-1) out-rebounded CU 31-19. Andre Roberson had eight of the Buffs` boards.

Scouting the game from press row was Steve McClain, a finalist for the CU job who is now Crean's top assistant.

"I love those guys," is all McClain wanted to say on the record about his former players.

The feeling is mutual.

"It's a lot of emotion for me. He helped me out a lot my freshman year," said Burks, who lobbied the CU administration to give McClain the head coaching position after Jeff Bzdelik left for Wake Forest. "He took care of me. If I needed something he was there for me."

New Mexico's terrific guard trio of Dairese Gary (18 points), Kendall Williams (18 points) and Phillip McDonald (14 points) had their way with CU from start to finish.

Williams opened the game with a 3-pointer and the Lobos got off to a quick 7-2 lead and made a layup with 13:37 to make the score 18-6.

The Buffs were able to cut the deficit to six several times down the stretch but were unable to get the necessary defensive

stops.

"Our guys know what we have to do. It's not rocket science," Boyle said. "We have to guard and we have to rebound at a high level if we want to play and win at a high level.

"Until we do that, it will be nights like this."

The Buffs will have one more chance tonight to pull off a quality non-conference win against a name program.

Or completely crap out in Las Vegas.

Lobos in control from tip to finish

LAS VEGAS — Dairese Gary and Kendall Williams scored 18 points apiece as New Mexico defeated Colorado 89-76 on Wednesday night to advance to the championship game of the Las Vegas Classic.

Williams also had 11 assists for the Lobos (10-1), who won their eighth consecutive game and will play Northern Iowa tonight in the tournament final. Phillip McDonald added 14 points, Drew Gordon had 10 and Alex Kirk pulled down 10 rebounds.

Alec Burks had 25 points to lead the Buffaloes (7-4), who will play Indiana in a consolation game tonight. Marcus Relphorde added 13 points, and Levi Knutson and Cory Higgins each had 10.

New Mexico, which never trailed in the game, led 41-33 at halftime and by as many as the 13point final margin. The Lobos shot 61 percent (30-for-49) from the field and 42 percent (5-for-12) on 3-point attempts. Colorado shot at a 47 percent field-goal clip (27-for-58), but hit just

5-of-22 3-point shots.

Colorado (7-4) vs. Indiana (9-3)

GAME NOTES: It is the consolation round for the Colorado Buffaloes and Indiana Hoosiers this evening, as the two teams will meet up at the Orleans Arena in final round action of the Las Vegas Classic.

The Hoosiers rally fell short in their semifinal matchup against Northern Iowa, as they fell to the Panthers on Wednesday, 67-61. The loss was just the third on the season for Indiana, which had won three of its last four games coming into Wednesday's action. The team made light work of both SIU- Edwarsville (88-54) and South Carolina State (102-60) in regional action of this event.

The Buffaloes are sitting at 7-4 overall following Wednesday's 89-76 shootout loss to New Mexico in semfinal round action. The loss snapped a five-game win streak for Colorado, which hadn't lost since a November 28th setback at Harvard.

This series is tied at one game apiece. The Buffs defeated the Hoosiers in the last meeting, 80-62 in first-round action of the 1997 NCAA Tournament.

The Buffaloes gave it their best effort, but came up short in an offensive slupfest against New Mexico on Wednesday night in a game the Lobos led the entire way. An early run by the Lobos left the Buffs in a whole they would never get out of. Colorado hung tough throughout though, shooting .466 from the field overall and placing four players in double figures. Alex Burks led the way with a game-high 25 points. Marcus Relphorde chipped in 13, followed by Cory Higgins and Levi Knutson, who added 10 points apiece. Averaging a hefty 84.0 ppg this season. Colorado certainly has the offensive arsenal to hang with any team. The Buffs aare shooting a healthy .492 from the floor this year, led by Burks' play. The 6-6 sophomore is converting just over half of his shots (50.3 percent) and paces the team with 20.3 ppg. Higgins (16.5 ppg) can fill up the basket as well, with Knutson (12.0 ppg) and Relphorde (11.7 ppg) providing adequate scoring depth.

The Hoosiers started off sluggish and were never able to recover, falling to Northern Iowa by six-points on Wednesday. The loss spoiled a terrific outing by Christian Watford, who was unstoppable up front, finishing with a double-double consisting of 23 points and 10 rebounds. The Hoosiers overall dominated the low post, outscoring Northern Iowa 26-10 in the paint. Derek Elston poured in 19 points in support, but UNI hit nine three-pointers in the game, compared to a 2-of-13 showing for Indiana. The Hoosiers have been a dangerous offensive team for the most part this season, averaging 77.8 ppg on .506 shooting. Watford has been a big reason for the offensive success, converting .486 from the field overall and pacing the team with 18.7 ppg. Verdell Jones is next in line at 12.6 ppg, followed by Maurice Creek's 9.8 ppg.

Both these teams like to fill up the basket, but it is Colorado that has the better depth at that end of the floor. Expect Burks to have another good game, leading his team to a soldi win here.
