Burks, Alabama star freshman share K.C. roots

BOULDER — Alabama-Colorado is a storied football bowl rivalry dating back to the 1969 Liberty Bowl.

But basketball? Tuesday's NIT semifinal foes have never played each other on the hardwood.

CU's Alec Burks and Alabama's Trevor Releford, however, do not need an introduction. They have known each other since grade school in the Kansas City area.

"He's like my little brother. I grew up playing with him," Burks said Friday. "I've know him for a long time, probably fourth, fifth or sixth grade."

Burks, a sophomore, played for Grandview High School in Missouri, where he was the Kansas City metro player of the year in 2009. He immediately moved into the CU starting lineup as a freshman. The younger brother of Kansas' Travis Releford followed Burks as Kansas City's metro player of the year last season.

Although they went their separate ways in high school, they met a few times in open gyms.

Alabama went 24-11 and was undefeated at home.

"It's not going to be anything we haven't seen," Higgins said of Bama. "That's the benefit of the Big 12."
