## CU finishes second at Missouri women's golf tourney

Buffs` Wallace ties for third

COLUMBIA, Mo. -- The Colorado women's golf team placed three players in the top 10 to earn a tie for second place at the University of Missouri Johnie Imes Invitational.

The Buffs finished with a team total of 878 strokes, which tied them with Oklahoma for the runners-up spot at the three-round event that ended Tuesday.

Oklahoma State earned the victory with a 1-under, 863 total.

"We played pretty well, we just didn't make many putts," CU coach Anne Kelly said. "Oklahoma State had a great day. You have to give it to them. We had a lot of good quality shots but just didn't convert them into many birdies."

Junior Jessica Wallace was CU's top finisher, finishing tied for third at 3-under 213. She shot par in the final round at the 6,204-yard, par-72 The Club at Old Hawthorne course.

"I had a bit of an up and down type of round," Wallace said. "I was never under par so I was just clawing through the day and trying to grind out a number. I missed a couple putts I thought I rolled well and they didn't carry like I thought they would."

The Buffs` other top-10 finishers were junior Emily Talley, who was seventh at 217, and freshman Kristin Coleman, who tied for ninth at 220.

Colorado hosts the Heather Farr Memorial Invitational on Friday and Saturday at Colorado National Golf Club in Erie. The tournament starts at 8 a.m. both days and is open to the public.

# Buff women golfers in second at Mizzou Invite

COLUMBIA, Mo. -- Colorado junior Jessica Wallace shot a 3-under par 141 Monday, leading the Buffs into second place after the first two rounds of the Missouri Invitational.

Wallace opened with a 72, then followed with a 69 to finish the day tied for second, just one stroke off the lead.

The Buffs finished the day with a 587 team score, eight strokes behind leading Oklahoma State. Oklahoma (588), Florida International (593) and Kansas State (599) rounded out the top five.

"Oklahoma State is historically a top team, but we're by no means out of it," CU coach Anne Kelly said. "We all have to play good golf (today) to catch them. It's fun to be in the mix, that's what it's all about; it's what we play for. We'll go out and do our best and see what happens."

Buff junior Emily Talley joined Wallace in the top 10, finishing with a 146, good for a tie for ninth. Kristin Coleman (147) was right behind in a tie for 11th.

"We won't have a problem making up strokes," Talley said. "Everybody can find strokes. We're playing well, but we all know we can play better and get our strokes lower."

Wallace carded nine birdies with two bogeys and two double bogeys in the 36 holes. She turned in a 4-under par 32 on the front nine in the second round, matching the best known mark in CU history. She recorded her first round in the 60s at CU, and she and Talley both recorded their fifth round under par this season.

"Princeton's Kelly Shon led the field by shooting a pair of 70s to finish the day at 140.

Today's final round gets underway with a shotgun start at 8 a.m.

## Buffs take second at Johnie Imes Invitational

0 tweets Colorado's women's golf team continued their blistering start to the season today, taking 2nd place in the 15-team Johnie Imes Invitational in Colombia, Mo.

CU junior Jessica Wallace's 3-under par 213 (72-69-72) led the way for the Buffaloes and was good for third-place individually. Colorado also received top-10 individual finishes from junior Emily Talley at 7th (75-71-71-217) and freshman Kristin Coleman (73-74-73-220), who took 9th.

Rounding out the Buffs' scorers were sophomore Taylor Doyle (78-75-75—228) and freshman Jenny Coleman (80-75-78—233).

Oklahoma State won the 54-hole event with a 1-under par score of 863. The 15-team invitational featured eight schools from the Big 12.

Three events into the season, Talley and Wallace are beginning to establish themselves as one of the premier one-two punches in the nation. Through nine rounds, Talley leads Wallace by only one total shot. Their scoring averages of 71.7 and 71.8 puts them among the nation's elite.

Through three events, the Buffs are off to a fast start to the 2010 season. After winning the Ptarmigan/Ram Fall Classic, the Buffs finished third in last week's Branch Law Firm Dick McGuire Invitational.

Colorado's strong play has not gone unnoticed by the national voters. As of Tuesday, the Buffs were ranked as high as 13th in the nation.

CU hopes to carry their momentum home to Colorado this weekend when they host the 13th annual Heather Farr/CU Memorial Invitational at Colorado National Golf Club in Erie. The two-day event tees off Friday morning with an 8 a.m. shotgun.
