

## Bufs' Seabrook to represent Canada again

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Colorado Buffaloes basketball player Julie Seabrook will be adding to her list of international playing experiences this month when she represents Canada at the World University Games in Shenzhen, China.

The 6-foot-3 forward from North Vancouver, B.C., was named to the national team on Thursday after a three-day training camp in Abbotsford, B.C. She'll train with the squad today and Saturday before leaving for China on Sunday.

The WUG basketball tournament will be played Aug. 13-22, with 16 countries sending women's teams. Canada plays in Pool C with Russia, Poland and South Africa.

This is Seabrook's fifth time playing on a national-level team for her country. Since spending her senior year of high school with the National Elite Development Academy, she's represented Canada at the 2007 U19 World Championships in Slovakia, the 2008 U18 FIBA Americas Championship in Argentina and helped her homeland place fourth at the 2009 U19 FIBA World Championships in Thailand.

The Buffaloes' only senior is coming off of a junior season in which she averaged 5.3 points and 5.4 rebounds per game while starting in all 34 contests during CU's 18-16 run to the WNIT quarterfinals.

"Our coaching staff and team are so excited that Julie will have the opportunity to play and represent her country at the World University Games," CU head coach Linda Lappe said. "She has worked hard this summer to prepare for the upcoming season, and making this team is an added bonus."

Seabrook won't be the only Buff at the WUG. CU senior golfer Emily Talley will be competing for Team USA, whose golf roster was announced last winter.

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
