"Alexander Hamilton," Solder said.

Bingo.

"Bro, you're going to win the Super Bowl. You're very patriotic," Mendiburu said.

Later, for the Giants' session, Mendiburu turned into a salsa instructor. He was inspired by salsa-dancing Giants WR Victor Cruz.

Giants C **Jim Cordle** was willing to give it a try. To loud salsa music, he danced with Vanessa McClure of Fox 59 News in Indianapolis.

"I'm feeling it," Cordle said as he got his hips moving.

Mendiburu said Cordle, too, passed the test: "That was awesome."
