## Women's basketball: CU Buffs have eyes on No. 4 spot in Pac-12

Although the Colorado women's basketball team has another weekend ahead before completing the regular season, Sunday's home finale against Washington is as big of a game as the Buffaloes have played in a long time.

"It's very important," sophomore Jen Reese said.

When the No. 20 Buffs (21-5, 10-5 Pac-12) and Washington Huskies (19-7, 11-4) tip off on Sunday afternoon at Coors Events Center, there will be plenty at stake.

CU, at this point, has control over its path to a top-four finish in the Pac-12. Win their last three games -- including Sunday against the Huskies -- and the Buffs will clinch the No. 4 seed and a first-round bye for the conference tournament.

Washington has a much tougher schedule the rest of the way, with their final three games against CU, No. 4 Stanford and No. 6 California. Should Washington win Sunday, however, the Huskies would clinch a top-four spot. At that point, CU's hopes for a top-four finish would all but vanish. The Buffs would need No. 17 UCLA to go 0-3 down the stretch, which isn't likely.

"It would be very important," CU head coach Linda Lappe said of getting a first-round bye for the conference tournament in two weeks. "Having that first-round bye is huge. It's something that we thought we could do at the beginning of the year."

CU has not had a first-round bye for a conference tournament since taking the No. 3 seed into the 2004 Big 12 Tournament. The Buffs have been a higher seed -- which means wearing home jerseys -- just once since then, when they were the No. 8 seed in 2007.

With their best team since 2004, the Buffs know they've got a great opportunity in front of them. That makes Sunday a huge game.

"At this point, everything is a really big game," freshman Arielle Roberson said. "Knowing that they are just coming off of a loss (on Friday at Utah), they're going to try to bring it at us that much harder. We have to be prepared for that, and I think we will be. It is really important for us to be focused and come out strong and just stay strong throughout the game."

Washington hasn't played as difficult of a schedule as CU has, but the Huskies are still a dangerous squad. The Huskies have the second-highest scoring offense in Pac-12 play (69.5 points per game). Their 35-percent shooting from 3-point range leads the Pac-12.

"Washington has a lot of respect from people in the league and from a national level they've been getting (top-25) votes," Lappe said.

Washington's Jazmine Davis is the Pac-12's second-leading scorer (19.6 points per game), while Talia Walton (14.0) and Kristi Kingma (14.0) also rank in the top 10. They are the only team in the Pac-12 with three

players in the top 10.

That's where the CU defense becomes especially important. The Buffs have the Pac-12's No. 1 defense, allowing just 52.3 points per game in conference play. CU has held 11 opponents below 50 points.

"You can't let 3-point shooters become comfortable and they can't think they can score," Lappe said of the key to beating Washington. "You do that in a number of different ways. I feel like we've done a pretty good job all year of making teams uncomfortable offensively and it's going to be important we do the same (against Washington)."

## Notable

Sunday's game will be the final regular season home game for three CU seniors: point guard Chucky Jeffery, and forwards Brenna and Meagan Malcolm-Peck. CU will honor those three players on Sunday. ... On Sunday, CU will celebrate National Girls and Women in Sports Day. There will be a free fitness and skills clinic for kids ages 13 and under from noon-1 p.m. at the Coors Events Center. Anyone who participates in the clinic, and adults who brings kids to the clinic, get free admission to the Buffs' game against Washington, which starts at 2 p.m.

## CU women's hoops preview

SUNDAY: The No. 20 Colorado Buffaloes (21-5, 10-5 Pac-12) host the Washington Huskies (19-7, 11-4) in a 2 p.m. game at Coors Events Center in Boulder.

STORYLINES: CU has won six in a row, its longest conference win streak since 2004. ... With a win, Washington would clinch a top-four finish in the Pac-12 and a first-round bye for the conference tournament. ... If the Buffs lose, they would need a UCLA loss against Southern Cal on Sunday to stay alive for a top-four spot. ... With a win, the Buffs would jump ahead of Washington in the standings and be in line for a top-four finish. ... Colorado is 20-0 against unranked opponents this season. ... Washington is 0-2 against ranked teams, with both losses coming against UCLA. ... During conference play, Washington has had the No. 2 scoring offense in the Pac-12 (69.4 points per game), while Colorado has the No. 1 scoring defense (allowing 52.3 per game). ... Washington's Kristi Kingma leads the Pac-12 in free throw percentage (.857) and 3-pointers made (3.4 per game). She was 11-for-17 from 3-point range against Oregon on Feb. 15. ... CU's Arielle Roberson recorded her first double-double (17 points, 13 rebounds) on Friday against Washington State.

KEY STAT: Washington can be deadly from beyond the arc. In conference play, the Huskies have attempted 25.9 3s per game, making 9.1. Their .350 shooting percentage from 3-point range leads the Pac-12.

COACHES: Linda Lappe is 60-35 in her third season at CU and 110-71 overall. Kevin McGuff is 37-22 in his second season at Washington and 251-95 in his career.
