Leftovers from the Nate Solder feature (part two): He'll be a left tackle for 12-15 <u>years</u>

It's time for round two. I've spent the day emptying my notebook from my Nate Solder feature, which ran in yesterday's Herald. Earlier today, I highlighted some leftovers from Bob Marken, who was Solder's high school coach.


For this edition, here are some unused notes and quotes from Dan Hawkins, who was the head coach at Colorado during Solder's collegiate career. Let's start with the notes:

- -Hawkins said Solder wanted to be a veterinarian in college, and he believes Solder is still interested in the field.
- -Hawkins said Solder used to apologize to the coaches after losses.
- -Hawkins said the players were responsible for two hours of community service in the fall and two hours in the spring, but Solder would do 30 hours. "And you never even knew about it," Hawkins said.

Now, for the quotes:

Hawkins, on Solder's personality: "His guietness, I think (fools) some people. He's got a tremendous competitive fire. He really does. But just a great allaround person. You talk about being smart. You talk about being tough. You talk about being a hard worker. You talk about being a team guy. I was very

fired up when the Patriots drafted him just because I thought it was a great fit with their culture and who he is. He's all about it when it comes to competing to win but being a professional, a team guy that's going to show up every day. He was just a tremendous athlete."



Hawkins, on Solder's physical tools: "Genetically, he's off the charts. Athletically, it's very hard to beat him. He's as good athletically as anybody. Then, you combine that with he's very, very smart, and he's going to work at it. He's going to watch film. He's going to be coachable. He's going to soak it all up. He's going to get better. I told (NFL) scouts the same thing. This guy is going to get to left tackle, and he's going to be somebody's left tackle for 12-15 years in the NFL if that's what he wants to do because he's just the consummate professional."

Hawkins, on his message to the Patriots: "I told the Patriots, 'This guy is only going to get better.' He's not one of those guys who has played left tackle since the fifth grade. He's going to get better.'

Hawkins, on Solder's workout routine: "Our strength coach loved him, and our strength coach was a grinder. You know how those guys are. Nate was the first one in, last one out, always did extra reps, always demanded other guys do it. That impression sticks in my mind."


