CU Buffs' Mike MacIntyre to highlight Colorado Coaches Caravan

University of Colorado football fans have been waiting to see what new coach Mike MacIntyre will deliver ever since his hiring last December. They will get to hear his delivery in person Monday through Friday, from Fort Collins to Pueblo and from Denver to Grand Junction.

MacIntyre will highlight the Colorado Coaches Caravan, which begins at noon Monday at Fort Collins' Ptarmigan Country Club. With CU in the throes of a school-record seven consecutive losing seasons, MacIntyre's message could go toward repairing some disconnect between Buffaloes football and fans.

"(It'll be) the same thing I've been saying all along," Mac- Intyre said. "Our four F's (foundation, family, future and football), and tell them a little bit more about our program, the discipline and conditioning factors we're instilling in these young men, not only football-wise but daily in life.

"I'll tell them what I believe and what I want to do."

This type of caravan is new for MacIntyre. While coaching at San Jose State, he did a much smaller road show. He went to Palm Desert and a couple of locations around Los Angeles and northern California. He has already made an impression in and around Boulder and Denver with his openness and congeniality with fans.

"I'm really looking forward to it," he said. "I enjoy meeting people. I enjoy sharing the vision I have for the program. It's always fun to meet people who are truly invested in the university and program and care about it."

This won't be MacIntyre's first trip across the state. He saw much of it watching his son play high school basketball. Also, the coach and his wife took a skiing trip after national signing day in February.

Where did a Tennessee boy learn to ski? At Purgatory outside Durango, where MacIntyre and some friends went while on college spring break. No, he never told his football coaches.

"You know how you are in college," he said. "You think you're invincible."

CU basketball coaches Tad Boyle and Linda Lappe also will be on the caravan.
