CU IN THE BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIPS

Colorado has had both individual and team successes in the Big 12 Championships since the old Big 8 Conference absorbed four members of the now defunct Southwest Conference in 1996. Though the Buffs have yet to win an individual or team title, Colorado has seven first division finishes (top six), topped by second place in 2009 and third place efforts in 1998 and 2000. CU flirted with the title in 2001 (undone by one collective bad hole, No. 16 at Prairie Dunes in Hutchinson, Kan.) and again in 2009 (Oklahoma State and the Buffs dueled and traded the lead for the first 63 holes until the Cowboys finally pulled away for a 14-stroke win). In 2003, CU finished a surprising sixth playing with three freshmen in the lineup. CU's last conference championship came in 1968 (Big 8) while **Bob Kalinowski** was the last Buff to claim league medalist honors, doing so in both the 1993 and 1994 Big Eight title meets.

CU THE FIRST In the 2001 Big 12 Championships, **Colorado** became the first school to have all five of its participating golfers finish in the top 20. In CU's case, all five were in the top 16: **Kane Webber** (t-7th), **Ben Portie** and **Matt Zions** (t-13th) and **Matt Call** and **Joe Liley** (t-16th). Oklahoma placed all five in the top 18 in the 2003 meet, and Oklahoma State did the same in 2008, joining CU as the only three schools to place all five in the top 20; the Buffs still have the mark for the fewest places (16). Four players from the same school have finished in the top 20 on 10 occasions, in 1998 (Oklahoma State), 2000 (Kansas), 2001 (Oklahoma), 2003 (Texas), 2004 (CU, OU and OSU), 2005 (OSU), 2008 (OSU) and 2009 (OSU).

In 1989, the University of Colorado inaugurated a "Golf Hall of Fame," inducting four former players at a ceremony prior to start of The International at Castle Pines Golf Club. Periodically, those who have made a significant contribution to the University of Colorado golf program will be inducted into this select group.

THE INAUGURAL INDUCTEES



DALE DOUGLASS, Fort Morgan, Colo.

Dale lettered three seasons at CU (1956 through 1959), graduating in 1959. Following a successful collegiate career in the days of dual matches rather than tournaments, he went on to blossom as a professional golfer on the PGA Tour, winning three tournaments. Since he turned 50, he has taken the PGA Senior Tour by storm, with 12 victories as well as several runnerup finishes. Dale is known by his peers as one of the finest gentlemen of the game and by his friends as an all around nice guy.



LES FOWLER, Boulder, Colo.

Les is truly one of the state of Colorado's golf legends. He was first a player at CU as an undergraduate starting in 1946, then a player-coach and then the head coach, all the while building solid political and real estate careers. He was CU's golf coach for 30 years—the second longest coaching stint in CU history—and on a volunteer basis without compensation. Les was personally rewarded in that he coached many golfers on to great careers in the sport, most notably Dale Douglass and Hale Irwin. He remained one of the state's top senior golfers for over two decades, and won dozens of state tournaments in his career.



HALE IRWIN, Boulder, Colo.

Hale enjoyed two great careers at the University of Colorado. He was a three-year letterman at defensive back in football (an all-Big Eight selection in 1966 and 1967), and spent three seasons as the number one golfer for Coach Les Fowler (1965 through 1967). In his junior year, he set the school's season stroke average record (72.04), which stood for 38 years. He won three tournaments as a senior, ending with a bang: he ended his collegiate career by claiming medalist honors in both the Big Eight and NCAA Championships. He went on to become one of the most respected players and fiercest competitors on the PGA Tour, in addition to having a fabulous career which has seen Hale win 20 Tour events, including the U.S. Open on three occasions (1974, 1979, 1990). He has won 41 events on the Champions Tour, was the Rookie-of-the Year in 1995, is the only player on any PGA Tour to have won the same event five straight years (Turtle Bay) and has surpassed \$30 million in overall career earnings (\$24 million-plus on the Champions Tour).



STEVE JONES, Yuma, Colo.

Steve lettered four years at CU (1978 through 1981), and during that time he rewrote the Buff record book. As Coach Mark Simpson's first recruit, he won two college tournaments and posted nine top-five finishes to go with a school record 21 top-10 placings. He broke Hale Irwin's career stroke average mark with a 73.7 norm for 141 rounds, with his 73.3 average his senior year remaining a school best. Since graduating from CU, he has become one of the bright young stars of the PGA Tour, winning eight tournaments, including the 1996 U.S. Open, and became golf's 99th millionaire. He also won the 1988 Colorado Open. He is now eligible to join the Champions Tour and desires to do so, but is still nursing an elbow injury that has kept him from playing competitively for two years.
