### **JASON BURSTYN**

6-0, 170, Sr., 3L, Miami, Fla. (Palmetto)

College—This Season (Sr.): He enjoyed quite a fall, leading the team in stroke average with a 71.65 figure, the fourth best fall average in school history. He owned a minus-.06 stroke count in relation to par, which was the 45th best figure in the nation. He won his first two tournaments of his collegiate career, claiming the individual Ballyneal Challenge (4-under 138) and then winning the Air Force Falcon Invitational (9-under 207, opening and closing with rounds of 68 with a 71 in-between). He also tied for seventh in the New Mexico Tucker (+1, 217) and led the team with nine subpar rounds, five in the 60s. All 17 of his rounds were between 68 and 76, and with 252 out of 306 holes played scoring par or better (four eagles, 50 birdies, 197 pars), that 82.4 percent figure was a team best. Nationally, his first round scoring average (69.5) was fourth, his greens-in-regulation percentage (73.9) was 18th, his par-4 scoring norm (4.02) was 39th, his five eagles tied for the second-most and his ham-and-egg ratio of 12/2 tied for 12th.

2011-12 (Jr.): He played in all 11 tournaments and enjoyed a breakout season, posting a career season best 73.79 stroke average, good for fourth on the team, as were his 82 birdies; his 383 pars out of 612 overall played and nine subpar rounds were both second most on the squad. He owned a 73.27 opening round average, second best on the Buffs, a number skewed by one bad round (82) at the New Mexico Tucker, otherwise it was 72.40 for the other 10 meets, which would have been the team high. He posted CU's top individual finish in the Pac-12 Championships, finishing 26th with a 77-72-71-72—292 (+4) scorecard. After opening with a 5-over 77 and bogeying his first two holes of the second round, he played his last 52 holes at 3-under par and went on to lead the team with 47 pars, 16th most in the field, and tied for the second most birdies (11) and fewest bogeys (13). The 292 score was the third best ever posted by a Buff in a 72-hole conference championship. His spring stroke norm was 73.82, third best by a Buffalo, as 21 of the 22 rounds for the semester fell between 67 and 78. He tied for 17th in the Wyoming Cowboy Classic, his top placing for the spring, with a 69-72-67—208 scorecard (-2). He played in all four fall events, averaging 73.75 strokes per the 12 rounds and topped by a ninth-place tie in CU's own Mark Simpson Invitational to open the year (70-73-70—213; -3). That was his best overall performance in the fall, though he did log two rounds in the 60s to open tournaments, a 3under 69 at the AFA Miranda and a 4-under 67 at the Alister Mackenzie. He dropped both matches in the Colorado Cup, a Ryder Cup-style dual against Colorado State. In the fall, he led the team in fairways hit (78.0 percent) with his 72.0 first round scoring average was the third best on the team.

2010-11 (Soph.): He finished third on the team in scoring average (74.77), with his 74.67 spring average second best. He played 30 total rounds, including eight as an individual as 18 of his other 22 counted toward team scoring. He had the best second round scoring average on the



team at 74.30, with all but two rounds between 71 and 75; he averaged 75.0 for the first and final round. His top finish was a runner-up effort in the Front Range Individual (71-71—142 at AFA's Eisenhower Blue), which was just prior to his best showing in a major tournament when he tied for 13th at the Bandon Dunes Championship (76-71-74—221). After playing in just two fall events, he appeared in eight of the nine in the spring, when he opened with his best round for the year, a 1-under 69 in the Battle at the Beach; his 218 total (+8) led the team. He ranked 45th nationally in fairways hit percentage for the season (75.7 percent), and was 79th in the nation in the fall with a par-5 scoring average of 4.67. His final *Golfweek* national individual ranking was No. 470, second best on the team.

2009-10 (Fr.-RS): He saw action in 10 tournaments, five in the spring and five fall, including three as an individual in the latter. He owned a 75.9 stroke average for the season, sixth-best on the team, with his 74.88 spring figure the fourth-best. He earned his way on to the travel squad for the season opener, where he tied for 90th in the New Mexico Tucker Invitational (235, +19). He tied for 81st without his rounds counting toward CU's team score in Air Force Falcon Invitational, highlighted by a second round 71, and tied for 86th in UCLA's Collegiate at CordeValle, where he did count for the team. His best fall finish was his best season effort, a tie for fourth in the Colorado State Individual (71-78—149). In the spring, he had three top 40 showings, topped by a tie for 30th in the Big 12 Championships (73-70-79-75—297, +9), where he had a team-high 11 birdies and finished sixth among the 15 freshmen competing. He also tied for 36th at the Oregon Duck Invitational (223, +7) and for 38th at the Texas A&M Aggie Invitational (221, +5), his best 54-hole tournament of the year in stroke count in relation to par.

**2008-09 (Fr.):** Redshirted; did not see any tournament competition but competed in all team practices.

High School—He prepped at the city's Palmetto High School, lettering three times under coach Mike Klekotka, and was selected to the 2005, 2006 and 2007 *Miami Herald* All-Dade County golf teams in the talent rich area. Owned an even par high school scoring average (36.0 for nine holes). He was the school's No. 1 golfer his sophomore through senior years. He was the district champion as a junior, the regional runner-up as a sophomore, and was inducted into the Palmetto Senior High Hall of Fame as a senior, when he was the Westminster champion.

Other—2012: He tied for 29th overall but was the second low amateur in the Colorado Open, turning in a 71-71-68-71—281 (-3) performance. He tied for 12th overall and was the low amateur in the MLGT Golf Tour's second "Major" of the season at PGA National in West Palm Beach, Fla. (71-68—139; -5). He won the qualifying round for the 2012 Florida Amateur with a career-best 63. 2011: Tied for 31st in the Florida Amateur (72-74-74-75—295, +11). 2010: Finished fourth in local U.S. Amateur Qualifying in Plantation, Fla. (66-75—141); he was the second alternate out of the region for the national event. 2008: Finished third in the FCWT (Future Collegians World Tour) Boys Invitational at TPC Sawgrass, recording a 78-71—149 scorecard. He tied for 11th in the FCWT Doral Classic (69-72-81-222, +9); he was one shot out of the lead after recording one of just two rounds in 60s the first day of the tournament. 2007: He had four top 20 finishes in FWCT competition, the top one a runner-up effort at the Innisbrook Open (74-70-72-216). He also tied for ninth in the Inverrary Classic (74-75—149), tied for 16th in the TPC Sawgrass as well as in the Boys' National Championship at the PGA National Colf Club (Champions course). He also had a fourth place finish at the 2007 AJGA Midwest Players Championship (-4 at Hawthorne Woods). Other Years: He posted an eighth place finish at the 2006 AJGA Fidelity Investments Junior at Trump National, and tied for 43rd in the Boys' National Championship (72 made the cut out of the 156-man field), one of higher finishes by a high school sophomore. He had a fifth-place performance (-3) at the 2005 Press Thornton Future Masters and a seventh place showing (70-



71-75—216; E) at the 2005 FCWT Boys' 13-15 National Championship. The latter was one of three top 10 and five top 20 efforts the 2004-05 FCWT season; his top finish was fifth in the Doral Silver.

5-11, 160, Fr., RS, Castle Pines, Colo. (Regis)


**College—This Season (Fr.-RS):** He played in three fall tournaments, placing fourth in the Ballyneal Challenge, an individual tournament where he turned in a 72-74—146 effort (+2), and then in two others where his rounds did not count toward CU's team scoring. He tied for 31st in the Air Force Miranda Invitational (221, +5) and then placed 74th in CU's Mark Simpson Invitational, where he recorded a 3-under 69 in the second round as his first round in the 60s as a collegian.

**2011-12 (Fr.):** The coaching staff decided to redshirt him in his true freshman season, though he still competed in all team practices and tournament qualifiers.

**High School**—He became the first Regis golfer to play in four state high school championship meets (with two top seven finishes), and he also was a four-time, first-team All-League performer and led the team in stroke average four times,. That included a 71.2 average his senior year, when he was the team captain and helped Regis win the Colorado



5A State team title. He earned first-team All-State honors as a sophomore and junior on the golf course, and was Academic All-State his sophomore through senior years. Those accomplishments earned him Wall of Fame honors at Regis. Under coach Craig Rogers, Regis also was the



Other—2011: Finished 134th in the Trans-Miss at Kansas City Country Club (84-76—160). He played in the Western Junior (Beverly CC, Chicago) but missed the cut. 2010: He placed second in the AJGA (American Junior Golf Association) Aspen Golf Classic with a 72-68-74—214 (-2) score, trailing only future teammate David Oraee in the event. 2009: He placed 32nd in the Junior World Championship (78-74-77-76—305) and finishing second in the tournament's qualifier (70-74—144). Other Years: His background includes several top 10 finishes on the AJGA, FCWT and IJGT junior summer circuits since the age of 13.


6-0, 160, Sr., 3L, Castle Rock, Colo. (Douglas County)

College—This Season (Sr.): He played in all six four tournaments and finished second on the team in stroke average with a 72.64 figure. After tying for fifth in the Ballyneal Challenge (a match between CU and Air Force players), he was on fire in the first two major tournaments, tying for third in the Air Force Miranda Invitational (211, -5) and placing third outright in CU's Mark Simpson Invitational (207, -9); he had five subpar rounds between the two meets, including four in a row, one shy of the school record. Both efforts represented his best 54-hole scores in relation to par to date entering the spring season. All 17 of his fall rounds fell between 67 and 77, and his 72.17 average for the final round was a team best. He led the team in birdies (80, the eighth most in the nation), and along with four eagles, that have him 64 subpar holes out of 306, or 20.9 percent, another team best (and 31st nationally).

**2011-12 (Jr.):** His 73.71 stroke average was third best on the team, and he owned the second best mid-round average of 73.25; his 100 birdies led the team as did his 10 subpar rounds. Though the team did not qualify (controversial in its own right), he played as an individual in the NCAA Championships, tying for 64th in the Bowling Green (Ky.) Regional with a 75-79-81—235 scorecard; he was a last minute replacement for an injured golfer and left for Kentucky the day after U.S. Open qualifying. He had three solid top 25 performances in the spring, opening with three consecutive 71s for 213 (-3) at Hawai'i-Hilo's Amer Ari Invitational, tying him for 23rd; he tied for 15th at the Bandon Dunes Championship (220, +7, which included a second round 68) and tied for 17th in the Wyoming Cowboy Classic (208, -2, featuring a final round 66). He saw action in three fall tournaments, recording a 73.89 stroke average for nine rounds; that was bloated by rough performance (+22) in the New Mexico Tucker, as he was under par in his first tournaments. He opened the year tying for 15th in CU's Mark Simpson Invitational (215, -1), which included his collegiate career best score of 65 in the second round, also matching his personal competitive best. He followed that up with his best 54-hole score in relation to par at the time, turning in a 73-69-70—212 (-4) scorecard in tying for eighth in the Air Force-Miranda Invitational. For the fall, he tied for 14th in the nation in average putts per round (28.7) and was eighth in putts on greens in regulation (1.73). In the individual Golfweek rankings, he finished 383rd, the highest of any of the team's non-seniors.

**2010-11 (Soph.):** He finished fourth on the team in stroke average with a 74.91 mark in playing the third most rounds (35), also tying for the team lead in par rounds or better (11, five subpar and six even rounds). His 73.83 final round average was a team best, with five rounds of par or better, including one of two 68s he recorded on the

season. He posted the team's best score in four tournaments, including a win in the Front Range Individual where he turned in a 68-72—140 (-4) effort combined at Air Force's Eisenhower Blue and Colorado National GC. That was his lone top 20 finish for the year, but he



had four tournaments where he finished between 21st and 27th, three of which came out of the chute at the start of the season. In fact, his fall stroke average of 73.33 for 12 rounds was second best on the team, with all dozen of the rounds between 68 and 76. He opened the spring with his best tournament in relation to par for the year (and for his career up to that point), turning in an even-par 216 at the Hawai'i-Hilo Invitational. His other top score in the spring came at the Wyoming Cowboy Classic in Scottsdale, where he turned in a 1-over 217. He ranked 38th nationally in fairways hit percentage for the season (76.3 percent; he was 24th in the fall after landing in the 138 in 168 drives, or 82.1 percent of the time).

2009-10 (Fr.): He enjoyed a solid freshman season, finishing fourth on the team in stroke average with a 75.19 mark for 36 rounds, the fifthmost by a freshman in school history; 31 of those counted toward team scoring. He earned his way on to the travel squad for all eight spring events and participated in 12 of CU's 13 for the year. His top finish was a tie for 28th at the Oregon Duck Invitational (223, +5), where he also had his season-best score in relation to par. At the Big 12 Championships, he tied for 36th with a 73-74-77-76—300 scorecard, but within that third round 77, he set what is believed to be a school record for the most improvement between nines: he turned at 45 but mounted an impressive comeback, scoring five birdies on the front nine in posting a 32, the low nine hole score of the day and tied for the fourth lowest nine in the tournament at Whispering Pines GC (Trinity, Texas). He participated in four of CU's five major fall tournaments, as well as in the inaugural State of Colorado Cup. He was fifth on the team in stroke average for the fall (75.27). He had one top 50 finish (tied for 50th at Air Force), but had at least one par or subpar round in three of the four meets. In the Cup matches against CSU, he was 0-2, dropping a decision in the two-man Four Ball matches and fell 1 up to Riley Arp in single play.

**High School**—He was selected as the 2008 Colorado Player of the Year by both the *Rocky Mountain News* and *Denver Post*, garnering All-



Colorado honors from each following an outstanding senior season. He owned a 71.2 stroke average as a senior, with the crown jewel of 15 high school tournament victories coming his last time out when he won the state's 5A championship. In recording a 73-69—142 in the state meet on the Air Force Academy's Eisenhower Blue Course, he won the title by six strokes and also led Douglas Country to the state championship. He had several scores in the 60s for the year, including a 64 and a 65. He owned a 72.3 stroke average as a junior, 74.8 as a sophomore and a 75.6 as a freshman, as he earned four letters. He tied for second in the state meet as a sophomore (73-71—144 at Pinehurst CC in Denver), three strokes out of the lead, and tied for 18th as a junior at Collindale GC in Fort Collins. DCHS's most valuable player as a senior, he was a three-time, first-team All-League selection (sophomore through senior seasons; second-team as a freshman), and was also first-team All-State as a sophomore.

Other—2012: He tied for seventh in the Colorado Golf Association Stroke Play Championship at Fort Collins Country Club (77-68-69-73—287, +7), four strokes back of the top spot. He finished third in U.S. Open Local Qualifying (36-33—69) at Collindale Golf Club in Fort Collins, advancing to Sectionals, where he tied for 32nd (73-75—148, +4) at the Village Links of Glen Ellyn (Ill.). He tied for 30th in the CGA Public Links Championship at Highland Meadows GC (214, +1), though his final round 68 was the 10th best round of the day. He tied for 42nd overall but was the sixth low amateur in the Colorado Open, turning in an even-par (71-72-70-71—284) performance. 2011: He was the runner-up in the CGA's Public Links Championship at Buffalo Run GC (69-66-76—211, -5); he would have been in a playoff but his group was controversially cited for slow play at the end of the final round



and all were assessed a 1-stroke penalty, costing him a chance to win. He reached the semifinals of the CGA Match Play Championships, defeating future teammate John Ahern in the guarters (2 and 1) before falling 2-up to Michael Lee. He tied for fifth in the U.S. Open Qualifier at The Heritage at Westmoor (Westminster) with an even-par 72; after playoff tiebreakers, he was the second alternate to advance to Sectionals. He also won the Hyland Hills Invitational and tied for ninth in Colorado Open Qualifier No. 4, with a 1-under 70 at Legacy Ridge to make it in the tournament. 2010: Tied for seventh in the CGA Two-Man Team Championship, partnering with Ryan Boshoven for a 69-71—140 score, six out of the lead. He tied for 15th in the CGA Stroke Play Championships with a 72-76-68-69—285 (+5) scorecard at Boulder Country Club; after making the cut at the cutline, his 137 total over the last 36 holes was fourth best in the field. He tied for 31st in the Trans-Mississippi Championship at Denver Country Club (71-74-72— 217; +7). 2009: He won the CGA Junior Match Play title, winning all six matches including the championship match over David Oraee, 2 and 1, at Spring Valley Golf Club in Elizabeth; he was seeded 42nd in the field after the stroke play competition and played just three of 35 holes over par in the title pairing. He had reached the quarterfinals in the CGA State Match Play Championship (before bowing out on the 17th hole). He tied for 19th in the CGA Stroke Play Championships at Lakewood CC (73-73-70-73—289, +5). He tied for eighth with his dad (Mark) in the CGA Father-Son at Cougar Canyon in Trinidad (145, +1). 2008: Reached the round of 16 in the junior state match play, and qualified for the match play portion of the CGA Match Play Championship in being named a CGA Junior All-Star. 2007: Won the AJGA Medicus Preseason Junior at Albuquerque by two shots (66-74—140) and finished in the top 20 in all four he participated in.

### JOHNNY HAYES

5-10, 165, Jr., TR, Cape Elizabeth, Maine (Cape Elizabeth/Towson)

College—This Season (Jr.): He played in two fall tournaments as an individual, making a solid debut with a ninth place finish in the CU-Mark Simpson Invitational. He was tied for second after the first two rounds (67-71—138), scoring two eagles on the day in his first competitive collegiate rounds in two years; he shot a final round 73 to finish at 5-under 211 on a course on which he had practiced only a couple of times. He tied for 53rd in the New Mexico Tucker Invitational (230, +14) in his other fall action. He joined the team the second week of school after playing well in walk-on qualifying. He transferred to CU in the fall of 2011, but had the desire to once again play college golf after playing a season-and-a-half at Towson University.

At Towson (2009-10/2010-11; Fr./Soph.)—He lettered as a freshman at Towson (Md.) University under coach Brian Yaniger, playing in 11 of the team's 13 events; he played four of six fall events as a sophomore before transferring closer to home to attend the University of Southern Maine for the spring semester. He was a candidate for the Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Year honor as a freshman, when he averaged 75.3 strokes per round (fourth-best on the team including a 73.9 mark for the fall). He had four top 30 and eight top 40 finishes on the year, with his best a tie for 22nd at both the George Washington Invitational and the Princeton Invitational; of his 31 rounds as a frosh, 25 of them were 77s or better. He played in the Southeast Regional as a freshman, finishing 53rd (80-69-73-222), the second best team effort with his second round 69 his best individual score for the year. As a sophomore, he had his best performance at TU, tying for sixth in Austin Peay State's F&M Bank Intercollegiate with a 10-under 206 effort (68-68-70).

High School—He lettered four times in golf, winning the Maine Class B state title his senior year. He led Cape Elizabeth to the 2006 and 2008 state championships and earned All-State honors his sophomore through senior seasons, being named the state's MVP for the latter. He also was a three-time letterman in lacrosse (attack), earning All-State honors as a junior and senior.



# PHILIP JUEL-BERG

5-8, 150, Fr., HS, Vedbaek, Denmark (HHX Knord Lyngby)

College—This Season (Fr.): He competed in all six fall tournaments as a true freshman, opening with an outstanding debut in the Ballyneal Challenge, where he finished second with a 70-69—139 (3-under) scorecard. The second round 69, the only one in the 60s, was quite a feat since the average score was a 77 and it was the first time he ever played the course. Other top performances included tying for 14th in the Air Force Invitational (217, +1) and for 27th in CU's Mark Simpson Invitational (216, E). His 73.53 stroke average for the fall was the fifth best by a freshman in school history, with his four eagles and 51 birdies tied for sixth and 45th, respectively, in the nation. The last signee of the 2012 recruiting class (signing in July), he came to CU after amassing an impressive European amateur resume.



High School—There are no high school sports per se in Denmark, as students compete on club teams in their preferred sports. He was a member of the Sollerod Golf Club, competing against other area club teams for three weeks out of the year, with the rest of the year set aside for individual competition.



Other—2012: He finished third in the Maage Trophy in Holbaek, Denmark (72-66-65—203, or 7-under); fifth in the Denmark Match Play National Championship; and sixth in the Team Rudersdal Open (70-70-72—212). 2011: He was fourth in the Maage Trophy (68-69-71—209) and placed eighth in the Danish International Amateur Championship (76-77-73-74—300). 2010: he was third in the Denmark Match Play and ninth in two major events: the Sir Henry Cooper (one of the largest under-18 European tournaments), where was two-under par with a 72-70-74-70—286 (-2) and in the Saab/Belgium International, where his final round 5-under 67 was the lowest in the field and propelled him to the top 10 finish with a 4-over 292 score.

# KRAIG McLEOD

5-11, 165, Fr., HS, Pebble Beach, Calif. (Carmel)

**College—This Season (Fr.):** One of three true freshmen on the team, plans call for him to redshirt this season. He will practice and participate in all qualifying events for the team. He comes to CU following an impressive high school and junior amateur career.

High School—He was a four-time, first-team All-Mission Trail League performer who was also selected as the league's most valuable player his freshman and senior seasons (and was a three-time team MVP). As a senior, he tied for first in the Northern California Boys' Championship (state qualifier), carding a 4-under 68 (five birdies, one bogey) and then tied for 12th in the California state meet at San Gabriel Country Club (2-over 73). He averaged just over 35 strokes per nine holes as a senior (after averaging 36 as a junior, 37 as a sophomore and 35 as a freshman). He was 32nd in the Northern California Boys' Championship as freshman (4-over 76) but then improved to a 20th place showing in the state meet (5-over 77), helping Carmel to a sixth place finish.

**Other—2011:** He posted a pair of top 10 finishes on the California state amateur circuit: he claimed fifth in the Palo Alto City Amateur (72-69—141) and seventh in the Salinas Valley Amateur (73-69—142). **2010:** He was the runner-up in the FCWT Coyote Creek Open in San Jose (73-68—141), and in his final AJGA event, the Midwest Junior Players Championship, he took fourth with a 71-69-72—212 scorecard.

2009: He won two amateur meets, the NGGA Pajaro Valley Classic Fall Championship (69-73—142) and the AJGA Mexican Golf Federation Junior Open (73-72-71—216). 2008: One of his first top amateur results came as a 15-year old when he recorded three straight 70s (210; -6) to

win the AJGA Junior All-Star in Lubbock, Texas.


### DAVID ORAEE

5-11, 165, Soph., 1L, Greeley, Colo. (Greeley West)

College—This Season (Soph.): He played in all six fall tournaments, posting the first three top 10 finishes of his career, topped by a third place effort right out of the chute in the Ballyneal Challenge (72-73—145, +3). He tied for seventh in both the CU-Mark Simpson Invitational (210, -6) and the New Mexico Tucker Invitational (217, +1), two meets that were held three days apart. He was also tied for seventh after two rounds of the fall finale, the Alister Mackenzie Invitational, after carding his back-to-back best rounds in college (67, 69) before tying for 26th after a final round 78 (214, +1). His 72.76 stroke average for the fall was third best on the team, bolstered by 53 birdies, second-most on the Buffs and tied for 31st in the country. Nationally, he tied for 28th in fairways hit (77.0 percent) and was 22nd in greens in regulation (73.5).

2011-12 (Fr.): As a true freshman, he played in all 11 regular season tournaments (the 34 rounds being the seventh most played by a freshman at CU), with his 74.50 stroke average the fourth freshman best in school history. He led the team in eagles (5), with 79 birdies and 365 pars, meaning he shot par or better on 73.4 percent of his holes. He recorded a 74-70-76-73—293 (+5) scorecard in the Pac-12 Championships, tying him for 27th overall and for sixth among the 20plus freshmen competing; it was CU's second best score in the event and his best effort of the spring. The 293 was the best 72-hole score ever recorded by a CU freshman in any tournament and tied for the fourth best by a golfer in any class for a conference championship. For a true frosh playing under pressure in his first collegiate championship, he had a solid tournament with 11 birdies and 46 pars, the 57 holes of par or better the second most by a Buff, with just 14 bogeys and one double to round out his effort. He also had a solid effort in the Oregon Duck Invitational, tying for 38th (225, +9) and at the Bandon Dunes Championship, where he tied for 44th (226, +13). In the first round of the Alister Mackenzie Invitational to close the fall, he shot a 4-under 67, tying the school record for the low gross score by a freshman previously set by three others - and then matched it again in the spring with a 3-under 67 in the first round of the Wyoming Cowboy Classic in Scottsdale. He played in all four tournaments (one as an individual) and in the State of Colorado Cup. After an auspicious start with an 81 in CU's Mark Simpson Invitational, he came back with five straight par rounds or better, eventually tying for 47th in the Simpson (81-70-72— 223, +7); he then had a strong performance in the Air Force-Miranda Invitational, as his 71-71-72—214 scorecard tied him for 12th. He was 1-1 in the Colorado Cup, winning his single match (4 and 3 versus Steve Sorenson), but lost the four ball match (2 and 1). In the final fall tournament, he recorded his collegiate best round of 67 in the Alister Mackenzie in Fairfax, Calif., eventually tying for 52nd.

High School—As a senior, he was both the All-Colorado and the 5A Front Range Player of the Year, when he owned a 70.0 stroke average. He won the Colorado 5A high school individual title at Aurora's Valley Country Club, with his 70-72—



142 (-2) scorecard good for a one-shot win; he was the only player under par in the first round and was 3-over at the turn in the second before blistering the back nine with a 33 score to clinch the win. He was the first four-year All-State selection from Weld County, the Class 4A Northern Region Player of the Year twice, and Greeley West's first 5A state champion in any sport. In lettering four times at Greeley West, his stroke average was 71.72 as a freshman (with a low round 65 that included a hole-in-one) and then 71 or lower the next three years. A four-year letterman in golf for coach Larry Brinz, he captained the team his sophomore through senior seasons. He also lettered twice in basketball.

Other—2012: He was the co-medalist in the stroke play qualifying for the Colorado Golf Association Match Play Championship (69, -3) and became the No. 2 seed, though lost in the second round. He tied for 15th in the CGA Stroke Play Championship at Fort Collins Country Club (76-67-77-70-290, +10). He finished fourth in U.S. Open Local Qualifying (38-32—70) at Collindale Golf Club in Fort Collins, advancing to Sectionals, where he tied for 44th (78-74-152, +8) at Lakeside Country Club in Houston. He tied for eighth in the Colorado Golf Association's Public Links Championship at Highland Meadows GC (206, -7). In CU's Casotti Classic, a legitimate play-your-own ball event for media and guests, he shot the lowest score in the 18 years of the tournament, an 8-under 64 (32-32) at Pelican Lakes Golf Club in Windsor. 2011: Reached the round of 32 in his first CGA Match Play Championship (at Bear Creek GC). 2010: He won the AJGA (American Junior Golf Association) Aspen Golf Classic with a 74-69-69—212 (-4) score. 2009: He set the national record for the largest margin of victory in an AJGA event when he won by 18 strokes in the AJGA Junior All-Star in Aspen (he posted a 66-64-70-200 scorecard, the 8-under 64 being a tournament record; the old mark had been 15 strokes. He tied for second in the U.S. Junior Amateur Qualifier at Boomerang Links in Greeley (69-70-139). Other Years: He was a six-time CJGA All-Star and a two-time Junior America's Cup team member.

# **BEAU SCHOOLCRAFT**

5-9, 170, Sr., 1L, Englewood, Colo. (Kent Denver/UCLA)

College—This Season (Sr.): He played in all six fall tournaments, logging a 73.88 stroke average which was fifth best on the team, while his 72.83 final round average was Colorado's second best. He had three top 20 performances, headed by a tie for 13th in the New Mexico Tucker Invitational, where after an opening 77 he bounced back with rounds of 72 and 71 for a 220 total (+4). He tied for 20th in CU's Mark Simpson Invitational, turning in a 72-73-69—214 (-2) effort in defending the title he had won as a junior. He was also fifth in the Ballyneal Challenge, an individual tournament that saw CU compete with Air Force. For the fall national rankings, he tied for 28th in fairways hit (77.0 percent) and 45th in greens hit in regulation (70.6 percent).

2011-12 (Jr.): He played in all 11 tournaments in finishing with a 73.47 stroke average, second on the team. He had the best middle round scoring figure of 72.25, with his fall 68.75 also the team's high mark. He led CU with five rounds in the 60s, was second on the team in birdies with 97 (his 43 in the fall were a team best) and his 11 holes worse than a bogey (out of 612) were a team low. He owned a 72.67 stroke average for the fall, with that number the 15th best average for a fall season in school history (though third on the team). He entered the season without competing in a college tournament for nearly two years, but made a statement in his return by winning CU's Mark Simpson Invitational. Playing as an individual, he recorded a 66-66-73-205 scorecard, tying for medalist honors; his 36-hole total of 132 as well as his 11-under par 205 effort both tied school records for a par-72 course. His top spring effort was a tie for third in the Wyoming Cowboy Classic, in which he stood at 131 after two rounds (-9; 64-67) before he closed with an even-par 70 for a 201 score, a CU all-time best on a par-70 track. His other top effort came at the Bandon Dunes Championship, where he recorded a 75-73-72—220 scorecard (+7) which tied him for 15th. He played in his second league tournament, now the Pac-12 Championships as opposed to the Pacific-10 when he was a freshman; he shaved 27 strokes off that score with a 301 (+13) total that tied him for 47th. Also in the fall, he was 1-1 in Colorado Cup matches against Colorado State.

**2010-11:** He redshirted after transferring to CU from UCLA during the summer; he actively participated in team qualifying events throughout the year.

At UCLA (2008-09/2009-10; Fr./Soph)—He saw action in just two fall tournaments as a sophomore, with a 78.0 stroke average; but was a near regular as a true freshman when he made eight starts and played 24 rounds. That year, his top efforts were 23rd place ties at the Bill Cullum



Invitational (73-75-76—224; +8) and at the CordeValle Classic (72-73-75—220; +6). He had two rounds under par as a frosh, a 70 (-1) at the USC Invitational and a 71 (-1) at the Match Play Championship.

High School—A two-sport, seven-time letterwinner at Kent Denver, earning three varsity letters as a center in hockey for Coach Dave Labette and four letters in golf for Coach Bob Austin. In golf, he led the Sun Devils to a pair of state championships and won the individual state title as a senior. He posted a 69-68—137 (-5) scorecard in winning the state championship at the Broadlands Golf Club. A four-time All-Metro League and two-time All-State selection as well as the 2008 Colorado Player of the Year his senior year. As a senior, he averaged a school-record 69.3 strokes per round. In hockey, he scored 13 goals with 12 assists in 13 games as a senior when he earned All-State honors. He also played lacrosse in high school.

Other—2011: He tied for 31st in the Southwestern Amateur (El Paso, Texas), with a 73-70-70-78—291 (+3) scorecard. Tied for 49th in the Rice Planters Amateur (Mt. Pleasant, S.C.) with a 79-70-71-73—293 (+5) effort. 2010: He cruised to medalist honors in the U.S. Amateur Sectional Qualifying at the Broadmoor Golf Club's West Course, turning in a 73-65—138 (-2) scorecard to win by seven shots. In the stroke play qualifier for the event at Chambers Bay/University Place, Wash., he shot 80-75—155 (+13), tying for 155th in the 312-man field (he missed the cut by six strokes). He played in the Colorado Open, but was 4-over after 36 and missed the cut by four strokes. He tied for 83rd in the Trans-Mississippi Championship at Denver Country Club (73-79-78—230; +20). 2007: He recorded three top 15 results in major junior events: he tied for sixth at the Fidelity Investments Junior Championship (66-73-76—215); he tied for 10th at the OSSO Junior at

6-3, 180, Fr., HS, Leawood, Kan. (Blue Valley North)

College—This Season (Fr.): He is competing as a true freshman, as he played in two fall tournaments as an individual (his rounds did not count toward CU's team scoring). He tied for 80th in his first collegiate meet, the Air Force-Gene Miranda Invitational (236, +20); he bounced right back with his best round of the fall, a 2-over 74 in the first round of CU's Mark Simpson Invitational, but his second round effort was disqualified when he signed an incorrect scorecard.

**High School**—A four-time letterman under coach Susan O'Dell, he posted four top 12 finishes in the Kansas 6A state tournament: third as a senior, 12th as a junior, seventh as a sophomore and sixth as a freshman. He led Blue Valley North to the 6A state championship his senior season when he owned a 72 stroke average; BVN was the state runner-up both his freshman and sophomore seasons. He earned firstteam All-Eastern Kansas League (EKL) honors as junior and senior, when he also garnered honorable mention All-Metro accolades. He earned honorable mention All-Sun honors as freshman and junior (an all-area team), with first-team honors as a junior. 
