6-0, 195, Soph., 1L, Denver, Colo. (Kent Denver)



College—This Season (Soph.)—He played in all six fall tournaments, finishing with a 74.94 stroke average as 12 of his 17 rounds counted toward team scoring. His best finish was right out the gate, tying for 16th in the Air Force Falcon Invitational (215; -1); it included his best single round of the fall (a 2-under 70). His other top fall efforts came in CU's own Mark Simpson Invitational (147, +3 to tie for 29th in the shortened event), and a tie for 30th in the Illinois Olympia Fields Invitational (224, +14; his second round 1-over 71 was one of the best scores for the middle round). Usually a steady performer, he led the team in pars (194) and in percentage of holes scoring par (63.4).

2013-14 (Fr.): He saw action in six tournaments as a true freshman, three each in the fall and spring. He was pressed into service late in the spring semester when two other fellow freshmen decided to leave the program, and he responded and then some: he has posted two top 20 finishes, first tying for 10th in the Wyoming Cowboy Classic which included a first round 65 (5-under), and then tying for 16th in the Pac-12 Championships. In the latter, he posted the highest finish in a league meet by a CU freshman since 2009 and the ninth-best ever in addition to tying for third among the 14 freshmen in the meet. He came back down to Earth a little bit at the NCAA Southeast Regional, posting three straight 79s for a 21-over 237, which tied him for 66th, though 16 of those strokes over par were traced to just seven holes. He played in three fall tournaments, starting his career in style by tying for 10th in the Air Force Miranda Invitational. He led all seven Buffaloes in the meet, though he competed as an individual; thanks to a 3-under par 69 in the final round which saw him score seven birdies, his 1-under 215 (73-73-69) total tied for the third-lowest score by a CU player in his first major tournament in school history (trailing only Jonathan Kaye, who recorded a 213 (+3) in the 1990 Wyoming Invitational, and Sebastian Heisele, who had a 2-under 214 in the 2008 Denver-Ron Moore Invitational). It was also the first time that a freshman posted the best score to lead the Buffaloes in a season opening tournament since 2005 (Derek Tolan, 2-under 214 in the Mexico Tucker Invitational;

Tolan was a redshirt frosh: the last true freshman to accomplish the feat was Rick Cramer, 1-over 217 in the 1979 AFA Falcon invite). He followed that up with a tie for 27th in CU's own Mark Simpson Invitational when he was designated as one of the team's scorers (+9, 77-71-77—225).

High School— He was considered one of the top junior players in Colorado throughout his high school career. He lettered four time under coach Bob Austin at Kent Denver, where he was a two-time 3A state champion (2010, 2011, his sophomore and junior years), and just missed the "hat trick" with a runner-up finish as a senior. Counting his freshman year when he tied for fifth, he's one of a just a handful of players in Colorado history to post four top five finishes in state championship play. In doing so, he led Kent Denver to four consecutive state titles. He was a four-time, first-team All-Metro League performer and a three-time member of the All-Colorado team. His stroke average improved every season from his freshman through senior years: 75.0, 73.9, 71.5 and 70.0.

Other—2014: He tied for medalist honors in U.S. Amateur Local Qualifying (144 at Columbine Country Club); he missed the cut at the event at the Atlanta Athletic Club (74-81—155, +12). He turned in a 77-74—151 (+11) at the Southwestern Amateur in Scottsdale, Ariz. (Desert Mountain Club), but missed the cut by six strokes. **2013**: He finished second in the Colorado Golf Association's Junior Stroke Play Championship, turning in a 75-70-66—211 (-2) effort at Common Ground GC in Aurora. He tied for 13th in the CGA State Stroke Play with a 78-71-69-70—288 (+8) scorecard at Pinehurst CC in Denver, but his 210 score over the last three rounds was fifth best in the field. He

He helped the Colorado team to fourth place finish in the Junior America's Cup at BanBury Golf Club in Eagle, Idaho (77-71-71—219, which was 29th overall, though he had the 11th best score over the last two rounds). He also tied for sixth in a pair of American Junior Golf Association (AJGA) events (Aspen, Fox Hill). **Other Years:** He recorded multiple Future Collegians World Tour (FCWT) wins and top three finishes.

5-8, 150, Jr., 2L, Vedbaek, Denmark (HHX Knord Lyngby)



College—This Season (Jr.)—He enters the spring of his junior season having played in all 32 tournaments CU has scheduled during his career. In six fall meets, he averaged 75.29, uncharacteristically high for him, but largely inflated due to four rounds in the 80s (he had just five his freshman and sophomore years combined). On the other hand, he never scored higher than a double bogey on any hole, he owned the third-best middle round average for the Buffs (72.20) and tied for the team high with two eagles. His best fall finishes were a pair of ties for 29th place, at the Air Force Falcon Invitational (219, +3) and in CU's own Mark Simpson Invitational (147, +3).

2013-14 (Soph.)—He played in all 12 tournaments, and finished second on the team in stroke average, both overall (73.00) and for the spring (72.67), thus no "sophomore slump" for him. He tied for the team lead in par or better rounds (19, 12 subpar, seven even), with 33 of his 36 rounds counting toward CU's team score and 23 of those rounds scored between 69 and 73. He had four top 20 finishes, including a career best fourth in CU's Mark Simpson Invitational, which was also his first top five finish in a major tournament (he had an even par scorecard 73-71-72—216). He matched that score at the Alister Mackenzie invite, tying for 27th, and then closed the fall with his first under-par effort in a major tourney, finishing 3-under par (72-69-72—213) for a 13th place tie at the UTEP Give 'Em Five Invitational. He then opened the spring with two more subpar efforts (both 212, -4) in the Amer Ari Invitational and the Wyoming Desert Intercollegiate (where he tied for 10th). At the Pac-12 Championships, he had to withdraw after the first round with flu-like symptoms; but he rallied to go out again in the afternoon and gut things out to shoot a 4-over 76, and then bounced back to finish with two even par rounds (72s) to help the Buffs finish fourth. He tied for 34th at the NCAA Southeast Regional at Auburn, turning in a 77-71-76—224 (+8) effort. For the year, he ranked eighth nationally in greens-in-regulation (72.4 percent), 42nd in sand saves (45.7 percent), 57th in par-5 scoring (4.68), 77th in fairways hit (69.2 percent).

2012-13 (Fr.): He enjoyed one of the most outstanding seasons by a true freshman in CU history. He played in all 14 tournaments, his 41 rounds tying for the most by a freshman ever at Colorado, while his

stroke average of 73.95 was the third best ever by a frosh (his 74.25 average in the spring ranked as the third best and his 73.53 fall average the fifth best). He led the team in even-par rounds with 11, and tied for the team lead in even-par or better rounds with 18 (he was fourth with seven subpar efforts). He had three top 10 finishes and four top 20 finishes on the year, which saw 33 of 39 rounds count toward team scoring (tying for second; two rounds were played as an individual). He was steady in his round-by-round averages, as he was third on the team in first round scoring (73.71), third in the middle round scoring (74.08) and fourth in the final round (74.07). Nationally, he tied for 21st in rounds played (41, the third freshman), 32nd in eagles (5, the 10th frosh), 35th in fairways hit (74.0 percent, the fifth freshman) and 37th in greens-in-regulation (68.0; sixth of all frosh ... he hit 65.5 percent of par-3 greens, 26th nationally). His 738 holes played broke down into five eagles, 110 birdies, 435 pars, 158 bogeys, 25 doubles, three triples, one quadruple and one quintuple. He became the eighth freshman in school history to post the best team score in a conference championship with a 70-70-77-75—292 scorecard (12-over par) in the Pac-12 Championships; that tied him for 24th and matched the best score by a Buffalo in a 72-hole league title meet. He led the entire field with 50 pars, while also posting five birdies and 17 bogeys. Of the 16 freshmen in the field (including three redshirts), Juel-Berg finished fifth. He was CU's second best performer at the NCAA Central Regional in Fayetteville, tying for 30th with a 73-77-76—226 score (+10), and was the top Buff in the UCI Anteater (72-78-73—223, +7), tying for 10th. His top finish of the spring was a ninth-place tie at the Bandon Dunes Championship (73-72-71—216, E), helping the Buffaloes to the team win. He competed in all six fall tournaments, opening with an outstanding debut in the Ballyneal Challenge, where he finished second with a 70-69—139 (3-under) scorecard. The second round 69, the only one in the 60s, was quite a feat since the average score was a

77 and it was the first time he ever played the course. Other top performances included tying for 14th in the Air Force Invitational (217, +1) and for 27th in CU's Mark Simpson Invitational (216, E). The last signee of the 2012 recruiting class (signing in July), he came to CU after amassing an impressive European amateur resume.

High School—There are no high school sports per se in Denmark, as students compete on club teams in their preferred sports. He was a member of the Sollerod Golf Club, competing against other area club teams for three weeks out of the year, with the rest of the year set aside for individual competition.

Other—2012: He finished third in the Maage Trophy in Holbaek, Denmark (72-66-65—203, or 7-under); fifth in the Denmark Match Play National Championship; and sixth in the Team Rudersdal Open (70-70-72—212). **2011:** He was fourth in the Maage Trophy (68-69-71—209) and placed eighth in the Danish International Amateur Championship (76-77-73-74—300). **2010:** he was third in the Denmark Match Play and ninth in two major events: the Sir Henry Cooper (one of the largest under-18 European tournaments), where was two-under par with a 72-70-74-70—286 (-2) and in the Saab/Belgium International, where his final round 5-under 67 was the lowest in the field and propelled him to the top 10 finish with a 4-over 292 score.

Academics—He is majoring in Economics at Colorado. He earned honorable mention Pac-12 All-Academic Team honors as a sophomore.

Personal—He was born February 18, 1992 in Copenhagen. His hobbies include most sports, particularly soccer; he played throughout primary school (equivalent to elementary school in America) and until he was 15. He also enjoys listening to music and action movies in general. Vedbaek is a suburb of Copenhagen, the capital of Denmark, the nation's largest city which is located on the eastern shore of the island of Zealand, separated from Sweden by the strait of Oresund. When he enrolled at Colorado, it was just the second time he had ever come to America; the first was on a family vacation when he was a child.

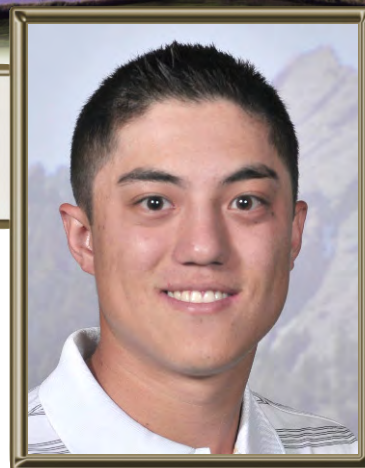

Career Notes: He has been a participant for six CU wins in major tournaments; the most previous to him doing so was four by Bobby Kalinowski (1991-94). He has played in every major tournament that CU has scheduled during his career (43 total), and has not recorded a triple bogey (or worse) since his sophomore season.

College—This Season (Sr.)— He recorded a 72.35 stroke average for the fall season, second-best on the team (and the 11th-best for a fall season at CU), as he broke into the win column for the first time in his career by claiming medalist honors in CU's own Mark Simpson Invitational. He opened with a collegiate career-best 8-under 64 and followed it with a 67 for a 13-under 131 score – the lowest 36-hole effort in school history – en route to a five-stroke win. He had three top 20 finishes in the fall, as he also tied for seventh in the Air Force Invitational (212, -2) and tied for 20th in the Alister Mackenzie Invitational (214, +1). He scored 73 or better in 12 of his 17 fall rounds (with four in the 60s), and 16 of those rounds counted toward the team score. He led the team in the coaches "jumbo" stat, which is a formula to measure large numbers or lack thereof (he had just six holes worse than bogey—all doubles, and he scored par or better on 77.5 percent of his holes.

2013-14 (Jr.)—He finished third on the team in stroke average, both overall (73.22) and for the spring (72.77); he was CU's top performer three times, including at the Pac-12 Championships where he tied for 12th (293, +5). That followed his career best collegiate finish, a tie for second in Wyoming's Desert Intercollegiate (205, -5), which included his best single round, a 4-under 66 in the first round. He was second on the team with 79.0 percent of his holes played (666) scored at par or better, and he was one of 49 players in the nation who did not post a score worse than double bogey; he led the team in the fewest holes worse than bogey (18, all doubles). He tied for the team lead in rounds counting toward team scoring (91.9 percent, or 34 of 37). He played in all five fall events with his 73.87 stroke average fourth on the team; all five of his 54-hole scores fell between 219 and 225 with 14 of his 15

rounds falling between 70 and 76. His best result was a tie for eighth in CU's Mark Simpson Invitational (219, +3), the exact same score tying him for 30th in UTEP's Give 'Em Five invite; he tied for 20th in the UNM Tucker Invitational when he finished with a 224 (+8). At the NCAA

Southeast Regional, he started out fairly strong and was poised for a top 20 finish until he struggled in the final round, eventually finishing in a tie for 39th (74-73-79—226, +10). For the year, he ranked 21st in "ham-and-egg," 22nd in greens-in-regulation (70.2 percent), 87th in par-4 scoring (4.08) and 93rd in pars per round (11.43).

2012-13 (Soph.): He played in all 13 major tournaments and finished fourth on the team in stroke average at 74.10, as he was more consistent in the fall than the spring. He did have his best major tournament finish after the break, when he tied for sixth in the Bandon Dunes Championship (-1, 215); his 72-73-70 scorecard helped the Buffaloes win the tournament and become the first team to do so with an under par team score. After an opening round 75, he bounced back with rounds of 69 and 67 for a 211 (+1) to tie for 22nd at the Stanford U.S. Intercollegiate. He tied for 42nd at the Pac-12 Championship (299, +19) and tied for 39th at the NCAA Central/Fayetteville Regional (229, +13). In the fall, he posted the first three top 10 finishes of his career, topped by a third place effort right out of the chute in the Ballyneal Challenge (72-73—145, +3). He tied for seventh in both Simpson Invitational (210, -6) and the New Mexico Tucker Invitational (217, +1), two meets that were held three days apart. He was also tied for seventh after two rounds of the fall finale, the Alister Mackenzie Invitational, after carding his back-to-back best rounds in college (67, 69) before tying for 26th after a final round 78 (214, +1). His 72.76 stroke average for the fall was third best on the team, bolstered by 53

birdies, second-most on the Buffs and tied for 31st in the country. Nationally for the season, he was 20th in greens-in-regulation (69.5 percent, which included a 68.4 percent number on par-3 holes, which was 15th in the NCAA), 47th in "Ham-N-Egg" (11/2) and 59th in fairways hit (71.3 percent). A model of consistency, he tied for the team low in holes worse than double bogey with just three (out of 738). **2011-12 (Fr.):** As a true freshman, he played in all 11 regular season tournaments (the 34 rounds being the seventh most played by a freshman at CU), with his 74.50 stroke average the fourth freshman best in school history. He led the team in eagles (5), with 79 birdies and 365 pars, meaning he shot par or better on 73.4 percent of his holes. He recorded a 74-70-76-73—293 (+5) scorecard in the Pac-12 Championships, tying him for 27th overall and for sixth among the 20-plus freshmen competing; it was CU's second best score in the event and his best effort of the spring. The 293 was the best 72-hole score ever recorded by a CU freshman in any tournament and tied for the fourth best by a golfer in any class for a conference championship. For a true frosh playing under pressure in his first collegiate championship, he had a solid tournament with 11 birdies and 46 pars, the 57 holes of par or better the second most by a Buff, with just 14 bogeys and one double to round out his effort. He also had a solid effort in the Oregon Duck Invitational, tying for 38th (225, +9) and at the Bandon Dunes Championship, where he tied for 44th (226, +13). In the first round of the Alister Mackenzie Invitational to close the fall, he shot a 4-under 67, tying the school record for the low gross score by a freshman previously set by three others – and then matched it again in the spring with a 3-under 67 in the first round of the Wyoming Cowboy Classic in Scottsdale. He played in all four tournaments (one as an individual) and in the State of Colorado Cup. After an auspicious start with an 81 in CU's Mark Simpson Invitational, he came back with five straight par rounds or better, eventually tying for 47th in the Simpson (81-70-72—223, +7); he then had a strong performance in the Air Force-Miranda Invitational, as his 71-71-72—214 scorecard tied him for 12th. He was 1-1 in the Colorado Cup, winning his single match (4 and 3 versus Steve Sorenson), but lost the four ball match (2 and 1). In the final fall tournament, he recorded his collegiate best round of 67 in the Alister Mackenzie in Fairfax, Calif., eventually tying for 52nd.

High School—As a senior, he was both the All-Colorado and the 5A Front Range Player of the Year, when he owned a 70.0 stroke average. He won the Colorado 5A high school individual title at Aurora's Valley Country Club, with his 70-72—142 (-2) scorecard good for a one-shot win; he was the only player under par in the first round and was 3-over at the turn in the second before blistering the back nine with a 33 score to clinch the win. He was the first four-year All-State selection from Weld County, the Class 4A Northern Region Player of the Year twice, and Greeley West's first 5A state champion in any sport. In lettering four times at Greeley West, his stroke average was 71.72 as a freshman (with a low round 65 that included a hole-in-one) and then 71 or lower the next

three years. A four-year letterman in golf for coach Larry Brinz, he captained the team his sophomore through senior seasons. He also lettered twice in basketball.

Other—2014: He reached the semifinals of the Colorado Golf Association Match Play Championship in his defense of his 2013 title; he won four matches but lost 3 and 2 in the semis. In the Colorado Open, he was the eighth low amateur and tied for 46th overall (70-74-74-71—289, +5). He tied for 64th in the inaugural Saguaro Amateur, held in Arizona over winter break (78-75-73—226). **2013:** He became the 15th Buffalo to win the CGA Match Play Championship, cruising to the title with a 6 & 5 verdict over CSU's Parker Edens; he was dominant the entire week in winning six matches, leading after 80 of 113 holes (tied after another 24), and winning 46 holes outright and matching his partner another 44 times. He tied for 27th in the CGA State Stroke Play at Pinehurst CC (73-71-75-76—295). He tied for 39th and was the seventh low amateur in the Colorado Open (71-72-71-70—284, E). He tied for 44th in the Southwestern Amateur, turning in a 74-75-74-75—298 scorecard (+18) on the par-70 Desert Mountain Course in Scottsdale, Ariz. **2012:** He was the co-medalist in the stroke play qualifying for the CGA's Match Play (69, -3) and became the No. 2 seed, though lost in the second round. He tied for 15th in the CGA Stroke Play Championship at Fort Collins Country Club (76-67-77-70—290, +10). He finished fourth in U.S. Open Local Qualifying (38-32—70) at Collindale Golf Club in Fort Collins, advancing to Sectionals, where he tied for 44th (78-74—152, +8) at Lakeside Country Club in Houston. He tied for eighth in the Colorado Golf Association's Public Links Championship at Highland Meadows GC (206, -7). In CU's Casotti Classic, a legitimate play-your-own ball event for media and guests, he shot the lowest score in the 18 years of the tournament, an 8-under 64 (32-32) at Pelican Lakes Golf Club in Windsor. **2011:** Reached the round of 32 in his first CGA Match Play Championship (at Bear Creek GC). **2010:** He won the AJGA (American Junior Golf Association) Aspen Golf Classic with a 74-69-69—212 (-4) score. **2009:** He set the national record for the largest margin of victory in an AJGA event when he won by 18 strokes in the AJGA Junior All-Star in Aspen (he posted a



66-64-70—200 scorecard, the 8-under 64 being a tournament record; the old mark had been 15 strokes. He tied for second in the U.S. Junior Amateur Qualifier at Boomerang Links in Greeley (69-70—139). **Other Years:** He was a six-time CJGA All-Star and a two-time Junior America's Cup team member.

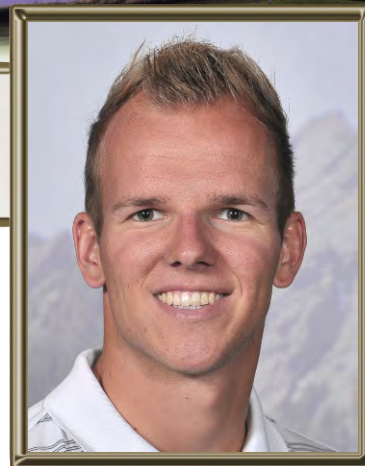

6-1, 175, Soph., 1L, Viernheim, Germany (Albertus-Magnus Schule)



College—This Season (Soph.)—In leading the team in the six fall tournaments with a 71.47 stroke average, he recorded the fourth-best number in school history for the fall portion of the season. He also had team bests with four top 10 finishes, with all six of his efforts placing in the top 20; seven of his 17 fall rounds were under par and all counted toward team scoring. A fast-starter, his top finish came following his highest opening round score of the fall (74): he posted a fifth-place effort in the first tournament of the season – the Air Force Falcon Invitational – where he matched his collegiate career-best 65 in the final round to zoom into a top five finish. He still owned a team-best 70.33 first round average (71.5 over his CU career), starting the last three fall tournaments with rounds in the 60s. He also had a team-high 61 birdies and a 20.6 subpar percentage, along with the fewest holes worse than par (61, with just seven double bogeys). He finished as the 11th ranked player on the European list for the fall for next June's Palmer Cup (the top six collegiate golfers from the final rankings from both the United States and Europe automatically make each team's 10-member squad to compete in the event, a college version of the Ryder Cup).

2013-14 (Fr.): He earned second-team All-Pac-12 Conference honors and All-Pac-12 Freshman Team honors in rewriting most of CU's freshman records, starting with his 72.51 stroke average. He became the just the sixth freshman to lead the Buffaloes in stroke average and the first since Kane Webber in 1999-2000 (when he set the previous frosh best of 73.03); the others were Dale Douglass (1955-56), Blake Stirling (1970-71), Steve Jones (1977-78) and Knut Ekjord (1994-95). His 72.22 spring average was a freshman best and the fifth lowest all-time at Colorado, while his 72.93 fall stroke average, the second best on the team, was the fourth-best by a freshman (true or redshirt) for the fall in school history. His overall 72.51 was also the seventh best average in school history and the lowest in five years. He had 17 subpar rounds on the year, one shy of the school mark, and led (15) or was tied for the team lead in 20 categories. He set a CU freshman record for the best score in a 54-hole tournament with an 8-under (71-67-70—208) effort at Cal's Alister Mackenzie Invitational, tying for seventh and

breaking the old Buff frosh mark by three shots; however, it would last just one tournament as his brother Yannik broke it by a shot in UTEP's Give 'Em Five Invitational – but in that meet, Jeremy turned in a 65-73-71—209 scorecard to tie for sixth,

thus he recorded two of the top three freshman performances in school history in back-to-back events. He then opened the spring with a 9-under 207 at the Amer Ari Invitational in Waikoloa, Hawai'i, becoming the first player in CU history to have three straight 7-under par or better efforts in tournament play and then tie his brother again for the record, and his next time out, he turned in a 4-under 212 at the Wyoming Desert Intercollegiate, setting a school record with four straight under par performances. In the fall, he did not have a score worse than a double bogey on a hole, and had just three in 666 holes on the year; he owned a team-best 19.2 percent figure for subpar holes (team-highs of 122 birdies and six eagles). For the year, he ranked in the nation's top 100 in 10 categories: greens-in-regulation (7th, 72.4 percent), "ham-&egg" (12th, 12/3), eagles (20th, 6), par-4 scoring (55th, 4.06), putting par (71st, 0.96), last round average (71st, 71.58), fairways hit (74th, 69.7 percent), subpar strokes per round (75th, 3.62), birdies (86th, 122), and stroke average to par (98th, +0.76). His 10 subpar holes when recorded his 65 were tied for the second most in any round in the NCAA. He was one of four finalists for CU's Freshman Athlete of the Year at the CUSPY Awards (CU Sports Performers of the Year).

High School—He was considered one of the top international recruits, along with his twin brother Yannik, in college golf's 2012-13 recruiting class. Along with his brother, he helped his prep school, Albertus-Magnus Schule, to second-place finishes in Germany's National School Team Championships in both 2011 and 2012. He had a 72.3 stroke average as a senior and a 72.6 mark as a junior. He also played soccer.

College—This Season (Soph.)—He played in all six fall tournaments, recording a 72.59 stroke average, the 15th-best ever for the fall portion of a season at Colorado. He opened up the year matching his career-best tournament finish with a tie for second in the Air Force Falcon Invitational, turning in a 69-71-67—207 (-9) effort that was one shot back of medalist honors. He had two other tournaments where he was under par, both minus-3 and tying for sixth: CU's own Mark Simpson Invitational (141) and Cal's Alister Mackenzie Invitational (210); he led the latter through two rounds after a 66-67 start, the 133 total the fifth-best 36 hole score in school history. He had the fewest bogeys (51) of the five players who appeared in all six tournaments and owned the second-best percentage of holes at par or better (79.1); 16 of his 17 rounds counted toward team scoring.

2013-14 (Fr.): He finished fourth on the team in stroke average with a 73.53 figure, the third lowest number ever posted by a freshman; he led the team for the fall with a 72.5 mark, which tied for the 12th lowest fall average in school history and was also the third lowest fall average by a freshman (true or redshirt; the last freshman to lead the Buffs in fall scoring at the break was Kane Webber in the 1999-2000 season). He had 12 subpar rounds and 15 of par or better. His best finish, a tie for second in UTEP's Give 'Em Five Invitational to end the fall (9-under, 66-72-69—207, three shots out of the lead), was the best in school history by a freshman for a 54-hole tournament on any course layout (and tied for the seventh best overall on a par-72 configuration); though his brother matched it in the spring. He twice recorded a 6-under par 66 for his collegiate best, in the UTEP meet and in the first round at the Wyoming Desert Intercollegiate, where he tied for fifth (210, -6). He tied for 16th in his first collegiate tourney, carding a 1-over 217 (75-71-71) scorecard at the Air Force Miranda Invitational. He placed in the top 50 in eight of his 11 tournaments, seven in the top 31, including tying for 31st at the Pac-12 Championships (300, +12) where his third round score (69, -3) was the only score in the 60s in the field (and was a 13-stroke improvement over his second round score); he followed that with a final round 71. In the NCAA Southeast Regional he opened strong with a 2-under 70, which had him tied for

second one shot out of the lead, but he eventually finished at 23-over 239 and 69th. He had only four scores worse than a double bogey on a hole (612 holes), none in the fall, and he had the only bogey free round on the team all season (his final round

70 at the Amer Ari Invitational, where he had 16 pars, also a team-high, and two birdies). For the year, he ranked in the nation's top 100 in five categories: greens-in-regulation (1st, 75.3 percent), "ham-&egg" (ninth, 12/2), sand saves (16th, 53.3 percent), putting par (67th, 0.92), fairways hit (80th, 68.9 percent),

Along with his brother, he helped his prep school, Albertus-Magnus Schule, to second-place finishes in Germany's National School Team Championships in both 2011 and 2012. Other—2014: He won the German International Amateur Championship, as he entered the final round as the co-leader and posted a two-stroke win (70-67-66-67—270, -18); he recorded two eagles, 27 birdies and 35 pars on his way to the title, opening and closing all four rounds with a birdie or better. **2013**: He finished eighth in the German International Amateur Championship (72-67-75-70—284). He was the second low amateur (to his brother) in the Pro Golf Tour tournament at Glashofen Neusass, as he finished 15th overall with a 73-73-72—218. He was 29th in the Luxembourg International Amateur (75-74-76—225). **2012**: A member of the German National Junior Team, he reached the round of 32 at the British Boys Amateur Championship. He placed seventh in the German International Men's Amateur, where his third round 68 was the low score in the entire field for all rounds (80-75-68-72—295). **2011**: He was the Hessen State

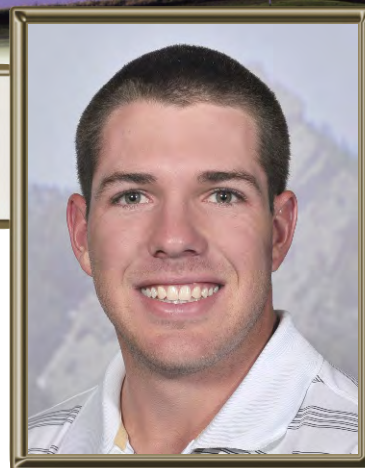

5-10, 175, Jr., 2L, Montrose, Colo. (Montrose)



College—This Season (Jr.)—He played in four fall tournaments, three as an individual, posting a 75.64 stroke average for 11 rounds of competition. His best finish was a tie for 50th in the Air Force Falcon Invitational (224, +8), also where he recorded his best single round of the fall, a 1-under 71. He had a subpar/par percentage of 74.2, fourth best on the team, as he occasionally has some solid rounds undone by a big number here or there. He had a solid second round average of 73.33.

2013-14 (Soph.): He competed in six tournaments, four in the fall and two in the spring. He had played just once after the semester break, as an individual in the Wyoming Desert Intercollegiate, scoring three straight 72s for a 216 to tie for 36th. He was then pressed into action for the Pac-12 Championships after CU's roster thinned due to defections, and he shot a 23-over par 311 to tie for 56th; but his second and third round scores of 76 and 74 were important for CU's eventual fourth place finish in the meet, in which he played the par-3 holes 13th-best in the field at 2-over. In the fall, he opened with his best career finish when it counted toward team scoring, a tie for 16th at the Air Force Miranda Invitational (+1, 69-77-71—217). Later in the semester, he recorded his first 54-hole tournament under par, tying for 22nd at the Alister Mackenzie Invitational (-1, 73-70-72—215). He owned a 75.17 strokes average for his 12 rounds in the fall.

2012-13 (Fr.-RS): He worked his way into the regular travel squad rotation during the spring, participating in seven of the nine tournaments after winter break. His best finish was in the Wyoming Cowboy Classic, tying for 11th in the individual format event (+1, 217 which included a final round 69). His other top finish came in the Cal-Irvine Anteater Invitational, where he tied for 24th (+13, 229). He was one of CU's six scorers for the Pac-12 Championships, placing 63rd overall with an 81-74-78-75—308 (+28) scorecard. He played in two fall tournaments, tying for 14th in the Ballyneal Challenge, an individual tournament, and 35th in the CU-Mark Simpson Invitational

(71-72-75—218, where his rounds did not count toward CU's team scoring). For the year, he scored 58 birdies and 260 pars in his 468 holes.

2011-12 (Fr.) —The coaching staff decided to redshirt him in his true freshman season, though he still competed in all team practices and tournament qualifiers.

High School—He lettered three times in golf under coach Angelo DeJulio, placing 10th in the state meet as a senior after claiming runner-up honors as a junior (with a 6-under 138 total that included a 66 in the first round). As a senior, he captured regional champion honors ahead of the state meet. He earned first-team All-Southwestern Conference honors his sophomore through senior years, and was a first-team All-State and All-Colorado performer as a junior (honorable mention as a senior). He owns the Montrose record for individual wins (four) as well as the number of consecutive tournaments using his score (32). He placed in the top 10 in every tournament he appeared in as junior and senior and had 30-plus career top 10 efforts as a prep. He also lettered twice in baseball (catcher/designated hitter) as a freshman and sophomore.

NEW BUFFALOES

Roy Edwards added four new golfers to the program last November in the 2014-15 early signing period; three signed letters-of-intent and the fourth a financial aid agreement to join the Buffaloes, who ended the fall season ranked No. 39 in the nation.

The group included three of the state's top prep players, **Pierce Aichinger** and **Ross MacDonald**, both from two-time 4A state champion Valor Christian in Highlands Ranch, and **Wilson Belk** from Cheyenne Mountain in Colorado Springs. A fourth addition, **Ben Bradley**, signed a financial aid agreement to attend CU, as he has been competing on the German National Team and will enroll in January; he will be eligible to compete in the spring semester.

All three Colorado prep products finished in the top eight of this year's state championship and were first-team All-State performers.

"We are very excited about this class," Edwards said. "Ben, Ross, Wilson, and Pierce all bring a lot of talent and energy to our golf program and we are very excited to have them join us. It is one of our primary goals in recruiting to attract the best players from Colorado and we were fortunate to get a great group once again in this recruiting cycle. We continue our strong relationship in Germany with the addition of Ben Bradley. All four are high-quality people as well as players.

"With a lot of hard work, determination, and belief in themselves, we feel all of them have a chance to be very good players individually and help our team be successful. We can't wait to get started with them."

Aichinger, who resides in Cherry Hills Village, is an All-State and All-Colorado team member, tying for sixth in the state meet as a senior (72-75—147) at Walking Stick Golf Club in Pueblo. He was the Colorado Junior PGA champion with a 64-65—129 effort (11-under par at Indian Tree Golf Club in Arvada), and claimed the titles at the CJGA Estes Park (68-70—138) and the RMJGT at Walking Stick (70-73—143). He was also second in the Bass Pro Shop/Payne Stewart AJGA Championship (71-69-72—212).

Edwards on Aichinger: "Pierce has shot some very low scores. He is someone who is really developing into a strong player. When he plays well he gets on a roll and is very hard for anyone to beat. He comes from a very structured and successful program at Valor."

MacDonald, a Castle Rock resident, was the Colorado Junior Stroke Play champion in both 2013 and 2014, represented Colorado in the Junior Americas Cups in 2012 and 2013 and was the recipient of the Hale Irwin Elite Player Program Award this past summer. He finished third in last month's 4A state championships with a 70-72—142 scorecard, and was seventh in the event as a junior and 10th as a sophomore. He was All-State as a junior and senior.

Edwards on MacDonald: "Ross has had one of the more decorated careers in Colorado junior golf history. Along with Pierce, he comes from Valor, who has had one of the best high school golf teams in the country the last few seasons."

Belk was a four-year letterman at Cheyenne Mountain, with every one of his scores counting toward his team's score. An All-State performer his sophomore through senior years, he tied for eighth as a senior in the 4A state meet (72-76—148) after finishing as the runner-up his junior year (71-74—145), one shot out of the lead (he was 12th as a sophomore). He was the 4A Southern Regional champion (shot even-par at Walking Stick in Pueblo), and was the 2013 and 2014 Pikes Peak Athletic Conference champion, earning player-of-the-year accolades for the conference both years. He also had an impressive list of accomplishments nationally, which included a third place finish at the AJGA Junior at Cattail Creek last May and qualifying and playing in the Western Junior.

Edwards on Belk: "Wilson is fundamentally very sound with a great short game. He is extremely well-liked by his peers. He is a talented player who we feel strongly will work hard to develop at the collegiate level."

Bradley, from Frankfurt, Germany, reached the match play of this year's British Boys Amateur; he advanced with an 83-73—156 scorecard, tying for 53rd with his second round score tied for the 13th best in the field (he lost 2 and 1 in the first round of match play). Competing on the German National Team for the past two years, he finished 22nd in the German Championships in September among an impressive list of amateur accomplishments around Europe. He will be a freshman in eligibility.

Edwards on Bradley: "We are very fortunate to add Ben to our roster for the spring, and he will add immediate depth to the team. He has been competing on the German National Team and his dad is PGA professional, so he has the lineage. Ben is also very well-liked by his teammates and is a nice addition for us."
