Colorado Seniors

The University of Colorado soccer team will feature a decidedly different look this season, as CU head coach Bill Hempen moves forward after graduating two seniors and losing 11 letterwinners total from last year. Despite the losses, the cupboard was not left completely bare for Hempen and his staff; six veteran seniors and a host of solid underclassmen will anchor CU this season.

WHAT RETURNS

Colorado returns 13 letterwinners from a year ago and nine starters from last year's squad. There will be an experienced player in every level of the lineup for Hempen, with all of his minutes at goalkeeper returning and seven other starters back in Boulder.

The majority of offense returns as 84.6 percent of the goals scored (22-26), 70.8 percent of its assists (17-24) and 77.7 percent of its shot takers (213-274) will resume competition this fall. Individually, CU's leading scorer, All-Big 12 First Team selection, and U-20 national team player **Nikki Marshall** will be back (20 points) along with **Gianna DeSaverio** (12 points), **Alex Cousins** (8 points), and five other Buffs with goals a year ago.

Also returning from regular appearances in the starting lineup a year ago are First Team All-Big 12 and First Team NSCAA All-Region defender **Michelle Wenino**, Big 12 All-Newcomer **Kym Lowry**, and the two-header monster in goal of **Kirstin Radlinski** and **Kara Linder**. Wenino started every game in 2007 and led the Buffs in minutes played with 2,018, while Lowry started and played in all but one game, which she was forced to miss due to a concussion. Radlinski and Linder saw action in 16 and 12 games, respectively, and the two helped CU record 10 shutouts on the season.

WHAT DOESN'T

The Buffs lose 11 letterwinners from 2007 but just one regular starter in Michaela DeJesus. Two seniors graduated in Brittany Dornseif and Allison Kidd, both of which were seasoned veterans and part-time starters during their respective tenures. Also leaving the team were 12 non-starters; freshmen Kaylee Boryla, Julia Burnett, Jaclyn Cardarelli, Cortney Charlesworth, Heidi Daugherty, Brooke Hickerson, Maddie Kawa, Amanda Raley, Lauren Sandford, and Natalie Weeks, sophomore Jess Quador and junior Genna Gorman.

WHAT'S NEW

Hempen will welcome 9 new faces this season in the form of eight freshmen and one transfer. A former All-PAC 10 performer, junior midfielder **Kelly Menachof**, returns home to Colorado after playing at California for two years. CU has had great success with homebound transfers as current seniors **Amber Bettenhausen** and DeSaverio

transferred from Wake Forest and Arizona, respectively, and former Colorado prep standouts Kathryn Grandinetti and Jessica Keller were immediate impact players upon their returns to Boulder in the fall of 2003 after stints at Kentucky and Miami, respectively.

The nine remaining newcomers are all freshmen and hail from seven different states. The group includes: **Kelly Butler** (Naperville, Ill.), **Caroline Danneberg** (Englewood, Colo.), **Kassidy Fitzpatrick** (Pleasanton, Calif.), **Hannah Marsala** (Alamo, Calif.), **Heidi Mayer** (Ft. Collins, Colo.), **Kelci Newlin** (Aurora, Colo.), **Kate Russell** (Longmont, Colo.) and **Maggi Steury** (Aurora, Colo.).


THE FORWARDS

The Buffs' front line will sport a somewhat new look in 2008 after losing CU's second-leading scorer Michaela DeJesus and part-time starter Allison Kidd. The Buffs' leading scorer in 2007, forward turned defender Nikki Marshall will be exclusively part of CU's attack this year, as opposed to playing primarily in the defense as she did for the majority of the 2007 season. She will be partnered with senior Gianna DeSaverio, who was CU's second leading scorer in '07 with five goals and two assists, for 12 points. Also figuring into the mix at forward will be sophomores **Mel Hicks** and **Amanda Foulk**. Foulk will be moved from her spot in the midfield to a role up top in order to utilize her speed, while Hicks looks to use her size and experience to build on her one goal and three assist effort from a year ago.


THE MIDFIELD

CU will bring back all of its primary midfielders who saw action a year ago as seniors Amber Bettenhausen, Alex Cousins and **Nikki Keller** return to hold down the fort in the center. Both Cousins and Keller started all 22 games last season, while Bettenhausen saw action in all 22, but did not become a regular in the starting lineup until the last third of the season. The remaining returning midfielder is junior **Ally Goodman** who saw action in just 12 contests last season, but after a successful and productive spring, she will have the opportunity to become one of CU's central midfielders in 2008. Junior transfer Kelly Menachof is a new face to this year's roster, but after enrolling in CU last winter, she was able to play with the Buffs in the spring season where she saw significant playing time as a regular starter, adding stability to the attacking midfielder position, which will help her maintain a starting role throughout the 2008 season.

Joining the veterans in the midfield will be freshmen Kelly Butler, Caroline Danneberg, Kassidy Fitzpatrick, and Kate Russell, each with the opportunity and ability to challenge the returners for positions in Hempen's starting lineup.

THE DEFENSE

The heart of the defense returns from last season in the form of All-Big 12 First Team and NSCAA All-Central Region Second Team selection, senior Michelle Wenino. Arguably the best player during the 2007 season, Wenino led the Buffs in 10 shutouts on the year, while logging a team-high 2,018 minutes, only coming out of the game due to brief injuries.

Wenino is joined by sophomore Kym Lowry, who returns as the only other defender from last season to have started all 21 games that she played in, only missing one due to a concussion. Lowry stepped up for the Buffaloes as a freshman last season, earning a spot on the All-Big 12 Newcomer team for her efforts in the backfield. Veterans **Tobie Rippy**, **Taryn Vitacca** and **Mary White** all saw action in the lineup for Hempen on defense last season, while **Kelly Ross** returns after redshirting her sophomore year due to a knee injury that she suffered in preseason.

Newcomers Hannah Marsala, Heidi Mayer, Kelci Newlin and Maggi Steury will also try to crack the code and battle for playing time in the deepest area of CU's roster.

THE KEEPERS

Senior Kirstin Radlinski and junior Kara Linder will continue to battle it out for the starting job this season. Last year, Radlinski got the initial nod to start the season, but Linder worked her way back into the lineup towards the end of the year and solidified her spot for the rest of '07. Radlinski posted a record of 5-5-3, including five shutouts and a goals against average of 1.51, while Linder finished with 12 appearances, a record of 5-3-1, a Big 12 leading .036 GAA average, and four shutouts.

Last season is over, and the duo will each start training camp this fall with a clean slate and a shot at the starting job. One of them will have to win the job in 2008, and it will not be based on their performances in 2007.

THE SCHEDULE

The 2008 schedule for the Buffaloes will feature eight teams that participated in the 2007 NCAA Tournament (Denver, Florida, Memphis, James Madison, Texas A&M, Texas, Oklahoma State, and Missouri).


The Buffs season will kick off on Saturday, August 16 with an exhibition match at Air Force. The regular season opener will be Friday, August 22 as CU plays host to Florida, who advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the 2007 NCAA Tournament. The Buffs will then face in-state rivals Denver on Sunday, Aug. 24.

CU will open Big 12 play prematurely this season, traveling to Lubbock, Texas to face the Texas Tech Red Raiders on Aug. 29. The Buffs will return home and face San Francisco and James Madison on Aug. 31 and Sep. 7, respectively. Following that weekend the Buffaloes will take their first bona fide road trip, traveling to Mississippi and Memphis on Sept. 12 and 14.

CU will return home to host the Colorado Soccer Classic, hosting Denver, Gonzaga, and Fresno State. CU will face Gonzaga and Fresno State on Sept. 19 and 21 to close out non-conference play.


The Buffs will then dive into the 2008 Big 12 season, hosting Oklahoma on Friday, Sept. 26 and will be followed by a match against Oklahoma State on Sept. 28. CU then travels to face Missouri and Kansas on Oct. 3 and 5, with the hopes of two victories as both teams beat the Buffs a year ago. On Oct. 10 and 12, Colorado will host Texas and Baylor. The Buffs last faced Texas in the first round of the Big 12 Tournament, where they played to a 0-0 tie, but the Longhorns advanced to the semifinals by way of penalty kicks.

After a three-game road trip against Nebraska, Iowa State, and Drake, the Buffs will close out the regular season on Senior Day, playing host to Texas A&M on Sunday, Oct. 26. That will be followed by the Big 12 Tournament, which will be played Nov. 5, 7, and 9 at Blossom Athletic Complex in San Antonio, Texas.

HEAD COACH BILL HEMPEN



After seven seasons in Boulder, head coach Bill Hempen has produced a team that battles for the Big 12 Conference championship year in and year out.

When he arrived in Boulder in the summer of 2001, he found himself inheriting a team that though close, had yet to put together a winning Big 12 season. He started to put the pieces in place that would make Colorado Soccer a success.

It then took just two seasons to orchestrate the biggest single-season turnaround in CU and Big 12 history, and one of the best in the nation when his 2002 squad went 10-8-2 and finished fifth in the league just a year after his first team struggled at 3-11-1 to finish 10th.

It would take just one more year to turn naysayers into believers as the Buffs went from 10th to first with the program's first conference title, a 15-4-1 record, nine shutouts, a 14-match unbeaten streak, the school's first national ranking in the sport, a Big 12 Coach of the Year title for Hempen and the program's first NCAA Tournament bid in 2003.

While Hempen took a leap of faith to leave a Duke program that he started in 1988, he credits others that leapt along with him for bringing Colorado its first conference crown in 2003.

Along with the efforts of his assistant coaches, he credits 2003 Big 12 Player of the Year Fran Munnelly's commitment to come to CU during that 3-11-1 season, "She must have seen my passion and commitment to make it work here. My track record, the locale and University was good enough for her to come here."

Since his arrival in Boulder during the summer of 2001, Colorado soccer has reinvented itself.

He won his 50th game at CU when the Buffs topped UNC 3-0 on Oct. 10, 2005, and coached his milestone 350th game on Oct. 17, 2004 and the record breaking 7-0 shutout against Texas Tech gave the 17-year veteran his milestone 200th career victory.

He is among the all-time winningest coaches in NCAA Division I women's soccer history, with 241 career wins, good for 19th on the active list.

"What this means is that I've been doing this a long time," said Hempen after the match. "It's really an honor and a tribute to all the kids that have put up with me over the years and to my first team at Duke (1988) who also contributed to this."


As the program enters its 13th season, one need only look at Hempen's leadership when charting its future. Since his arrival, the Buffs have gone 79-51-19 (.608) overall and 35-27-8 (.565) in Big 12 Conference play. Included in five top-five league finishes is the 2003 Big 12 Championship and that season's player, rookie and coach of the year in addition to 20 player appearances on All-Big 12 teams. Colorado has claimed 11 spots on all-region teams, and boasts a three time All-American in Fran Munnelly, who was also named to the Big 12 10th Anniversary team in 2005. Hempen has coached the Buffaloes to five-straight NCAA appearances, including a program-best appearance in the NCAA Sweet Sixteen in 2006.

In the classroom, 54 players have been named to Academic All-Big 12 teams while the 2003 squad won the athletic department's most improved honor for a team as its aggregate grade point average rose .44 from the previous academic year. In 2005, senior goalkeeper Jessie Keller was named a CoSIDA District VII Academic All-Region Soccer Team member, the first in CU history.

When hired on June 5, 2001, Bill Hempen came to Boulder with eight NCAA Tournament Appearances, three ACC Coach of the Year honors, 1992 National Soccer Coaches Association of America National Coach of the Year recognition, and one of the winningest programs during the last decade under his belt.

He came to Colorado from Duke, where he had been the Blue Devils' head coach since the program's inception in 1988.

He led the Blue Devils to eight appearances in the NCAA Tournament and had a career record of 162-100-16 (.676) in Durham. He was the NSCAA National Coach of the Year in

1992, and was also named Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year three times (1992, 1994 and 1997) while directing Duke to the 16th most wins in the country (124) in the 1990s.

Hempen's Duke teams finished the season ranked in the national polls nine times with their highest finish coming in 1994, a No. 4 ranking following Duke's first ACC regular season title and a win over 13-time national champion North Carolina to snap the Tar Heels' 101-game unbeaten streak.

The 1992 season was among Hempen's finest, as he led his team to a school-record 17 wins and a berth in the national championship game in its first trip to the NCAA tournament. Since then, Duke teams have advanced to the NCAA tournament every season sans 1998.

In his 13 seasons at Duke, he coached nine All-Americans, 34 All-ACC players, seven Academic All-ACC selections and three players that played professionally in the WUSA.

He also has significant experience with the United States Soccer Federation's Olympic Development Program, specifically in Region III and as the head coach of Colorado's state ODP Program.

Born June 6, 1958 in St. Louis, Hempen graduated from Bishop DeBourg High School before attending Meramec Community College in St. Louis where he split time in goal for Meramec's 1976 Junior College National Championship and 1977 Runner-Up teams.

He continued his collegiate career as a two-year letterwinner in goal at the University of Evansville for the 1978 and '79 seasons compiling a 22-11-6 mark in that span. He graduated from Evansville in 1981 with a degree in Health/Physical Education. The New Jersey Americans of the American Soccer League drafted Hempen in 1980.

Hempen got his start in the coaching profession as a graduate assistant at Northeast Louisiana before assuming full-time assistant duties at Centenary College in Shreveport, La., where he served three years prior to his start at Duke.

He was an assistant coach on the Blue Devil men's team from 1986-1991, compiling a 78-36-7 overall record and 16-16-4 ACC slate. In those six seasons Duke advanced to three NCAA Tournaments, winning the NCAA Championship in '86 with a 1-0 victory over Akron in Seattle.

He married then-Duke assistant coach and 1990 Colorado graduate Stephanie Poncher in 1999. The couple has an 8-year-old daughter, Emma, and a 6-year-old son, Lucas.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH PAUL HOGAN



The constant of Bill Hempen's tenure at Colorado has been the presence of associate head coach Paul Hogan. Hogan has been Hempen's right hand man since his arrival prior to the 2001 season.

Paul Hogan is in his eighth season at Colorado, his third as associate head coach as he was promoted August 22, 2006.

During his time in Boulder, Colorado has won the 2003 Big 12 Championship, appeared in four NCAA tournaments and have earned five top-five league finishes.

In addition to his duties as assistant coach on the Boulder campus, Hogan is also in his sixth season coaching the Colorado ODP teams.

Prior to his arrival in Boulder, Hogan spent three seasons at Allegheny College where he guided the Gators to a 35-16-7 (.686) overall record and 17-6-2 (.739) North Coast Athletic Conference mark while producing 16 All-NCAC players.

His three Gator teams finished no lower than third in the final NCAC standings and his 1999 squad won a school record six conference games, matched by

the 2000 team, earning Hogan conference coach of the year accolades and Allegheny NCAC Newcomer and Offensive Player of the Year postseason honors.


Hogan made the leap to head coach in April 1998 from Duke where he was an assistant for the 1996 and '97 seasons. He assisted the Blue Devils to a two-year record of 28-11. In 1997, Duke finished 15-5-0, 4-2-0 in Atlantic Coast Conference action and won the ACC tournament championship. Over his two seasons, Hogan helped coach three All-Americans and 11 All-ACC selections.

Previously, Hogan spent one season contributing at his alma mater as a volunteer, the University of Charleston (W.V.). He helped Charleston to a 17-3 record and an NCAA Division II playoff berth in 1995.

Hogan graduated from Charleston in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in sports science. There, he was a three-time All-West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference selection at goalkeeper. He earned All-South Region honors from the National Soccer Coaches Association in both 1993 and 1994, and led the Golden Eagles to WVIAC championships in 1992 and 1994.

Born August 22, 1972, the Monroe, N.Y. native is a 1990 graduate of Washingtonville High School. He is the oldest of two and his younger sister Nancy also played soccer at Elon College in North Carolina. In what little free time he has, Hogan likes to golf.

He married former Colorado assistant coach Alli Hunt this past May.







Tracy Chao will begin her first season as assistant coach for the Buffaloes. Chao comes to CU from Northern Colorado where she was an assistant coach for three years under head coach Tim Barrera.

Chao was a standout player at Wake Forest University under head coach Tony DaLuz, and helped lead the nationally ranked Demon Deacons to a 49-31-6 record and four-straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1999-2002.

The defender turned goalkeeper earned MVP honors as a sophomore and became the first ACC goalkeeper to ever shutout the eventual 2000 National Champions, North Carolina. For her efforts in the 1-0 win over UNC, Chao was named to Soccer America's Team of the Week and was also crowned ACC Player of the Week on Oct. 30, 2000. Chao returned to back to the defense as a junior to wrap up her playing tenure with Wake Forest.

Chao was a member of the W-League's Carolina Dynamo from 2000-02 and once residing in Colorado, she served as the team captain for both the Mile High Edge in 2006 and the Ft. Collins Force in 2007.

A Raleigh, N.C. native, Tracy Chao was born on Aug. 10,

1981 in Raleigh. Prior to playing at Wake Forest, she captained her club team, the '81 CASL Raleigh Spartan Spirit, which she led to the 1993 and 1996 state championships.

A starter on the North Carolina State Select team, Chao participated in the Olympic Development Program from 1995-98 and was a member of the Region III Pool team in 1997. In prep play, the all-state defender was named Region 6 Player of the Year, Tri-Seven Conference Player of the Year, and was a three-time all-region and all-conference selection at Wake Forest Rolesville High School.

A 2003 recipient of the Brian Surette Soccer Writer's Award, Chao graduated from Wake Forest University with a bachelor's degree in sociology and holds a master's degree in sport administration from the University of Northern Colorado.

Her hobbies include playing golf and snowboarding.





HEMPEN ON BETTENHAUSEN: We expect amber to build on what she did last fall. She proved to be a very good player late in the season and we will look to her to carry that into this year.

JUNIOR (2007): After redshirting her first year at Colorado to rehabilitate from a knee injury that she suffered prior to the 2006 season, she quickly became an important part of the midfield, seeing significant action in all of CU's 22 games. Bettenhausen earned eight starts in her first season as a Buffalo, becoming a regular in the starting lineup late in the season during Big 12 play and finished the year starting in six-straight games at midfield. She recorded a game-high three points in the 3-2 win over Baylor as she scored the first goal and dished out an assist on the gametying goal. Bettenhausen was one of three Buffs to be named to the 2007 Academic All-Big 12 First Team.

AT WAKE FOREST: Played in 14 games and earned one start, scoring one goal for two points. Closed the season with four shots, and knocked in her first career goal against Davidson. Took one shot against Florida State and made her first start against Maryland. Tore her ACL in the

spring of her freshman year and did not play as a sophomore. As a freshman, Bettenhausen was a teammate of former CU assistant coach Alli Hunt, who was a senior.

IN THE CLASSROOM:

A two-time Dean's List selection at Wake Forest, Bettenhausen is a business major with an emphasis in finance and real estate at Colorado and a three-time Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll member. Bettenhausen received an award from the Multicultural Affairs department at CU for academic achievement and she was also one of three Buffaloes to be named to the 2007 Academic All-Big 12 First Team.





HIGH SCHOOL: Bettenhausen was a four-year letterwinner for Northwood H.S., and also earned three letters in track. She earned All-Pacific Coast League first team honors as a junior, helping her Timberwolves team to the PCL Championship. She played club soccer for the Southern California Blues, West Coast FC, Southern California United and Irvine Strikers. A multi-sport athlete at Northwood, Bettenhausen also lettered track her senior year, running in the CIF championships as a member of the 4x100 team.

HEMPEN ON COUSINS: We expect big things from Alex this year. She just loves to play soccer and since this is her last year, we might just see the best that Alex has to offer.


JUNIOR (2007): Cousins proved to be an integral part of the midfield, finishing the season as the third-leading scorer with three goals and two assists, for eight points. She was crowned Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week and named to the Soccer Buzz Team of the Week after scoring the equalizer in the overtime win against Oklahoma (2-1) and recording the game-winning goal two days later to defeat then-No. 25 Oklahoma State, 1-0. Cousins started every game for the Buffs and logged the third-highest number of minutes on the season with 1,921. Her eight points moved her to 11th on CU's all-time career points list and her two assists moved her into sixth overall in career assists.

SOPHOMORE (2006): Was the second-leading scorer for the Buffs with five goals and seven assists on the year. Cousins was also a First Team Academic All-Big 12 selection, one of four Buffs to earn academic accolades. She scored the game-tying goal against Texas on Nov. 5 in CU's 1-1 tie with the Longhorns in the championship game. She saw action in all 24 games and started all but one, playing 2,078 minutes on the season. Cousins

led Colorado in assists with seven, the second-highest single season total in school history. Her 17 total points were the 13th highest single season total in CU history, and her five goals were good for 16th all time.

FRESHMAN (2005):

Cousins started 12 of 24 games as a freshman, playing mostly in the midfield but also seeing time up top. She managed 30 shots on the season, including eight on goal in 1,169 minutes of play. She scored her first career goal in the Big 12 Championship game against Texas A&M, tying the game off a cross from Laura Munnelly at the 63:40 mark.





HIGH SCHOOL: A four-year letterwinner, following her junior and senior seasons Cousins was named the team's most valuable player, first-team all-Northern Conference in '04, and first-team all-Front Range in '05. Rocky Mountain News All-Colorado, first-team all-state and the Denver Post's 5A Player of the Year after leading the state in assists as a junior. She was all-Colorado and first-team all state both seasons. The Lambkins were the 2003 and 2004 Northern Conference Champions and the 2004 and 2005 5A state runners-up. Cousins played club ball for the Colorado Girls Soccer Academy which was the State Cup runners-up in 2004.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Cousins graduated with a 3.9 gpa and was FCHS's Student of the Year in '05. She was Colorado High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Academic Team Champion and first-team Academic All-State performer from 2003-05 and was Fort Collins' CU Junior of the Year. An environmental science major at Colorado, Cousins has earned recognition on both the Fall and Spring Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll since she arrived at CU and was able to maintain a GPA between 3.00-3.49 as a freshman during the Fall soccer season.

PERSONAL: Alexis Kayn Cousins was born May 16, 1987 in Fort Collins, Colo. She is the youngest of Marc and Sherry Cousins' three children. She has two older brothers, Zack (25) and Jake (23). HEMPEN ON DeSAVERIO: Gianna was a fantastic addition to the program last fall. Her determination is what sets her apart from many of her teammates and we hope that they follow her lead as she enters her senior year.

JUNIOR (2007): DeSaverio made an immediate impact the minute she stepped on the field for the Buffaloes, seeing action in all 22 games, earning 16 starts. She was the second-leading scorer with five goals and two assists for 12 points. She scored her first goal in a Colorado uniform against Utah and got on the board again with the final goal in the 2-0 win over Wyoming. She recorded two game-winning goals, one of which coming in the 3-2 win over Baylor and the second coming in the NCAA First Round win against Hawaii. HEMPEN ON HICKS: Mel could be a force in our attack and a target player upfront if she chooses to be this season. Our hope is that she makes the right choice.




HEMPEN ON KELLER: Nikki was outstanding as a junior and if she keeps that up, she will only get better as a senior. Her game has become more complete as she has progressed through the program and we are looking forward to good things from her, maybe not statistically, but certainly in consistency.

JUNIOR (2007): Keller started all 22 games for the Buffaloes on the season and finished the year with one goal and two assists in a career-high 1,901 minutes of action. Keller's lone goal in her junior campaign proved to be the gamewinner in CU's 4-0 win over Nebraska. After seeing occasional action as a forward during her first two years as a Buff, Keller made the permanent move to midfield where she remains as an integral part of CU's everyday lineup. Keller's two assists on the season bumped her up to a tie for seventh on Colorado's all-time career assists chart with nine. Her presence and consistency in the midfield allowed her to pick up her second career All-Big 12 honor as she was named to the All-Big 12 second team.

SOPHOMORE (2006): Saw action in all 24 games, starting 23, playing mostly at outside midfield but occasionally seeing spot duty at forward. Keller scored three goals on the season, the first in CU's second game of the year against Alabama. She also scored against Wyoming after coming off the bench in that game following CU's double overtime draw at Nebraska, and scored CU's lone goal against Kansas in the Big 12 Tournament. Keller dished out a trio of assists, with two against Clemson and also the gametying assist in CU's come-from-behind win over A&M in the Big 12 Tournament. She saw 1,882 minutes of action, with 36 shots, 11 on goal.

FRESHMAN (2005): Keller started 20 of CU's 24 games in her first year, scoring four goals and notching four assists, good for 12 points and tied with Allison Kidd as CU's third leading scorer. She notched two game winning goals, against Pittsburgh and Iowa State. Her goal vs. Pitt was the first of her career, and came at the 83:11 mark. She managed a career high four shots on four different occasions and posted 42 on the year, 22 of which were on goal.

SOPHOMORE (2007): Saw action in 12 of CU's 22 games and picked up nine starts on the year, including a four-game stretch early in the season where she didn't let in a single goal. Linder led all Big 12 goalkeepers with a conference-low 0.36 goals against average and the conference-high .900 save percentage on the season, allowing only three goals all year. Her 2007 stats moved her to the top of the CU career charts for goals against average, with a program-low 0.72.

FRESHMAN (2006): Linder started her freshman year off in style, dueling NSCAA All-Region goalkeeper Tyler Griffin to a scoreless shutout in the first game of the season, posting five saves in 110 minutes of action. She then backed that up with 57 minutes of scoreless action against Alabama, feat that earned her Big 12 Newcomer of the Week honors. Linder started the first eight games of the season and saw action in 12 total games, positing a goals against average of 1.08 and grabbing 26 saves in the process. She owned a record of 6-2-1, earning two solo shutouts and another three shared with Kirstin Radlinski.

HIGH SCHOOL: Linder helped her Lincoln East Spartans dominate Nebraska Class A prep soccer during her four year career. With 11 shutouts as a senior, Linder holds LEHS record for career shutouts with 39 and finished her high school campaign with a 51-7 record, allowing only 27 goals, with a 0.46 goals against average. A senior captain for the Spartans, she was named to the All-Nebraska Team, Super State first team, Class A All-State first team, All-Heartland Conference first team and the All-City first team. As a junior she captained the Spartans to the Class A State Championship with a record of 14-3, earning Academic All-State, Academic All-Heartland Conference, All-Nebraska Team, Super State first-team, Class A All-State first-team, All-Heartland Conference first-team and All-City first-team honors. Her sophomore year LEHS went 17-0 en route to the state championship, a season which saw her set the school record for shutouts with 13. Thanks to those efforts in net, she was named to the All-City first-team, the Super State second-team and the Class A first-team All-State. As a freshman, the Spartans went 16-3, were state finalists and won the Lincoln City Championship. On the club and Olympic Development side, Linder has been a member of the Nebraska State ODP team the last four years (2002-05) and the 2005 Nebraska/ lowa team. She was a member of the club team Sparta Velocity that has won five consecutive Nebraska State Championships (2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006) under coach Lindsey Ingram, and Linder was a guest player for the Colorado Girls Soccer Academy in 2005.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Linder is Integrative Physiology major at Colorado.

PERSONAL: Kara Lena Linder was born April 12, 1988 in Lincoln, Neb. She is the daughter of Mike and Denise Linder. She has a younger brother, Luke, who is 17 years old.

HEMPEN ON LOWRY: After a great freshman year, hopefully Kym won't wake up and realize where she is, but rather keep playing the way she knows how to, with the confidence of a veteran.

FRESHMAN (2007): Lowry started all 21 games that she played in, missing only one game due to a concussion. She led all freshmen in minutes played with 1,834 and finished the season with one goal and two assists. She dished out both of her assists in the 3-2 win over Baylor, tying her for first in the Big 12 for the most assists in one game with fellow teammate Mel Hicks, a record they went on to hold for the remainder of the season. Lowry's solid

defensive efforts landed her a spot on the Big 12 All-Newcomer team.

HIGH SCHOOL: Lowry was a fouryear letterwinner at Evergreen High School for coach Keenan Burris. The Plainsmen were the district champions in 2006 and were the first team in school history to get to the state quarterfinals. She earned First Team All-Greater St. Helen's League honors all four years and was named the defensive player of the year as a senior. Lowry was also a First Team All-Region choice, the team captain and MVP and First Team All-State as a senior. She was a four-time All-Region selection team captain from her sophomore through senior years. She was a two-time Washington ODP state team and regional camp participant, and also played a year on



the Oregon state team and advanced to regional camp that year as well. Her club team, the Washington Premiere FC, made the state finals two times and were also Harvest Cup champions.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Lowry plans on a career in physical therapy and will likely major in integrative physiology at CU and is also interested in athletic training. She was a three year Scholar Athlete selection her sophomore through senior years.

PERSONAL: Kymberly Cristina Lowry was born May 4, 1989 in Vancouver, Wash., and is the daughter of Brad Lowry and Cristina Taylor. She has an older brother, Matthew (19) who wrestles at University of Wyoming, and a younger brother Nathan (15) who is also a wrestler. Her hobbies include snowboarding, water sports and hanging out with friends, and she has spent time volunteering with the Special Olympics.



HEMPEN ON MARSHALL: Nikki will be exclusively part of our attack this year as she continues to develop her overall game while simultaneously completing with the U.S. National Team. We are going to get everything that we can out of Nikki Marshall and she will be more than willing to give it.

SOPHOMORE (2007): Marshall led the Buffs in scoring for the secondstraight year as she finished the season with nine goals and two assists for 20 points. She ranked second in the Big 12 in points (13) and goals (six) tallied in conference games. Marshall opened the Buffs' season with both goals in the 2-0 win against Denver and then the gamewinner against Utah in CU's home-opener. After being shutout for eight-straight games, Marshall rebounded with another multi-goal effort against Nebraska and the gamewinner against Iowa State two days later, earning her Soccer Buzz Team of the Week, Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week and CU Athlete of the Week honors. She followed up that weekend with goals in the next three games, giving her a season-high four-game scoring streak. Marshall's final goal proved to be the gamewinner in the 2-1 overtime win against Oklahoma to keep the Buffs in contention for the Big 12 Tournament. She finished the season at the top of six statistical categories for the Buffaloes: points (20), goals (nine), game winning goals (four), shots (45), shot percentage (.200), and shots on goal (26). A pre-season All-Big 12 and Soccer America All-America selection, Marshall was named to the All-Big 12 First Team for the second year in a row and earned NSCAA First Team All-Central Region honors for the first time in her career. Marshall's 20 points on the season moved her into fourth overall on the career points chart (57) and her nine goals tied her for third in career goals (26).



U.S. SOCCER (2008): Spent the month of June with the U-20 National Team at the CONCACAF qualifying tournament in Puebla, Mexico. Despite dropping the championship game to Canada, Marshall and the U.S. earned a berth to the 2008 FIFA Under-20 Women's World Cup after a 4-0 victory over Costa Rica in the semifinals. In February, Marshall and Team USA won three straight matches and the championship of the Four Nations Tournament in La Serena, Chile, with victories over England, Norway and Chile. She has played every minute for the U.S. team as a defender and wore No. 4.

U.S. SOCCER (2007): Following her amazing freshman year, Marshall was invited to training camp in January of 2007 with the U-21 National Team on Jan. 6-13, and followed that up with an invite to the U-20 National Team camp Feb. 4-11. In June, Marshall made the U-20 WNT squad that traveled to Rio De Janeiro, Brazil for the 2007 Pan American Games. Team USA opened the tournament with three straight victories against Paraguay, Panama, and Argentina before falling to Mexico. They faced Canada in the semifinal match and picked up the 2-1 victory to send them to the finals against Brazil. Their tremendous run ended in the gold medal match as the young Americans fell to the full Brazilian Women's National Team, 5-0, in front of a massive crowd of almost 70,000 fans.

FRESHMAN (2006): Marshall posted the most prolific offensive season in CU history in her first year in Boulder, scoring a school record 17 goals and three assists for 37 points, two of her 17 school records. She was the Big 12's leading scorer, becoming just the second freshman to lead the Big 12 in goals scored in conference history. She was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, the third Buffalo to do so, joining Fran Munnelly (2002) and Katie Griffin (2003). Among her 17 goals were a school record seven gamewinners. She opened her freshman season with two scoreless games at Vanderbilt, but her debut at Prentup Field was historic. She netted four goals in the first 49 minutes of the game against Clemson, setting a school record for goals and points in a game. She added another two days later against Mississippi, and then netted goals at BYU and Utah to give her a school record four straight games with a goal. She added assists against Denver and Oklahoma to give her six games in a row with a point, another CU record. She scored her next goal on the road at Nebraska, followed by one at home against Texas, and then posted a repeat of her school record with goals against Iowa State, Texas Tech and Baylor and a pair of them at Kansas to close out the regular season. She was shutout in the Big 12 rematch with KU, but bounced back with the gametying and gamewinning goals in CU's thrilling double-overtime upset of No. 9 Texas A&M in the Big 12 semifinals. She wrapped up her season of scoring with the gamewinner in the second round of the NCAA Tournament against Denver. Marshall also set school records with two 10-shot games (at Nebraska, vs. Texas A&M) and averaged 1.54 points per game in her first season of college soccer. Her year was the most decorated in CU soccer history, as she was named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week five times, to a media team of the week three times, she was named National Player of the Week by Soccer Times, a first in school history, as well as being the only freshman named First Team All-Big 12 in 2006. Marshall earned Newcomer of the Year from the Big 12 and Soccer Buzz Central Region, and was also a First Team All-Region selection by Soccer Buzz. The NSCAA named her Second Team All-Region, while Soccer Buzz named her a Fourth Team All-American and a First Team Freshman All-American.

HIGH SCHOOL: Marshall had a highly-decorated prep career as a soccer, track and softball athlete. She graduated as the leading goal scorer in Skyline High School history, as she led the team in scoring all four years. After scoring an impressive 23 goals and dishing out 10 assists as a senior, Marshall wrapped up her prep career with 100 goals and 38 assists in high school play. While leading the Falcons to a 10-3-4 record, Marshall was named the 2006 Northern Conference player of the year, the all-region soccer player of the year for 2006, and the Skyline Falcon of the Year. She was a member of the 2005 Colorado State Cup Championship team. Marshall received an academic letter and was a three-time selection to the All-Northern Conference. She was named All-State her sophomore, junior and senior year as well as being named the Longmont Times-Call Soccer player of the year all three years. She also earned All-State honors in track (100m, 400m relay and long jump) as a junior, and was a state champion in the 800 medley her senior year.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Marshall is a sociology major at CU.

PERSONAL: Nicole Sue Marshall was born June 2, 1988 in Thornton, Colo. She is the daughter of Mike and Kelly Marshall and has a younger sister, Shaye (16). She is a passionate snowboarder and enjoys working at church camps and helping run soccer clinics for elementary school children.

HEMPEN ON RADLINSKI: We are hoping that Kirstin returns to the form that made her a starter early in the 2007 season, with the hopes of making our goalkeeper situation more solid than it is. Expect to see her in the goal throughout the season.

JUNIOR (2007): Saw action in 16 of the Buffs' 22 games and posted 11 starts. She recorded a career-high five solo shutouts and picked up 53 saves in 1,313 minutes of play. Her five shutouts ranked her fifth overall in the Big 12. Radlinski now sits at No. 2 in the CU career charts in both wins (17) and shutouts (12).

SOPHOMORE (2006): Radlinski started her second year at Colorado backing up freshman Kara Linder in net, but by the middle of the Big 12 campaign she had won the starting job. She saw action in 20 games, starting 14, and posted three solo shutouts on the season, sharing another three with Linder. Radlinski owned a 1.09 goals against average and posted 68 saves in 1,483 minutes of play.

FRESHMAN (2005): Radlinski entered the season as backup to incumbent goalkeeper Jessie Keller, but was soon thrust into the fray when Keller broke her ankle against Kansas on Senior Day, Colorado's final home game of the season. The freshman responded with four shutouts and a goals against average of 0.92, the best in the Big 12. She had a .816 save percentage, grabbing 40 saves in her 11 appearances. She also shared three shutouts with Keller in her 880:21 minutes of play.

HIGH SCHOOL: As a freshman Radlinski set nine El Dorado school records, including shutouts (15) in guiding the Golden Hawks to the Empire League title that year and Century League crown as a sophomore and junior. With Radlinski in goal, El Dorado had a 52-22-6 record, advancing to the second round of CIF play in 2002, the quarterfinals in '03 and semifinals in '04. She





also holds prep marks for single season (177) and career (345) saves and had a 1.06 goals against average as a junior as well as El Dorado's Female Athlete of the Year as a senior. She was a first-team all-league player for four years and all-CIF for three. Radlinski played her club ball for Irvine's ISC Strikers premier team, the 2003 Pleasanton and 2004 Score-By-The-Shore tournament winners. She was the club's only keeper for six years. A two-sport athlete, she played on El Dorado's girls varsity tennis team as a member of the No. 1 doubles tandem since her sophomore year, and was named all-Century League as a sophomore, junior and senior and made the CIF tournament her sophomore and senior years.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Radlinski was a league scholar-athlete and a member of the honor roll in high school and has continued to excel at CU. An English major and philosophy minor, Radlinski maintained a 3.00-3.49 as a freshman in-season during the Fall of 2005 and has been recognized for her hard work since she arrived at CU, being named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll every semester. Radlinski will serve as president for the Student Athletic Advisory Committee (SAAC) for 2008-09.





THIS SEASON: Wenino was arguably the best player during the 2007 season and she is ready to be recognized as one of the top players in the Big 12 Conference no matter where she plays on the field in her senior campaign.

JUNIOR (2007): Wenino's junior campaign proved to be her most prolific season to date as she was the rock of the defense, leading the Buffs in 10 shutouts on the year. Wenino's lone goal on the season snapped a four-game scoreless and winless streak as the Buffaloes held off Drake for the 1-0 win. She logged a team-high 2,018 minutes on the season, only coming out of the game due to brief injuries. Wenino's solid performance in the backfield landed her a spot on the All-Big 12 First Team and NSCAA All-Central Region Second Team for the first time in her career.

SOPHOMORE (2006): Got her second season at CU off to a great start, scoring goals in two of CU's first three games. She posted two against Alabama in the second game of the season and also scored the first goal against Clemson on Sept. 1. Wenino saw action in just 16 games due to a knee injury suffered against Wyoming that kept her either out of action or in a limited role until the Nov. 8 NCAA contest against Colorado College. She started 13 games, and played 1,113 minutes on the season.

FRESHMAN (2005): Wenino stepped in as a freshman and made an immediate impact on the defense, starting 23 of CU's 24 games at defender. She had a goal and an assist on the season for three points. She had seven shots on the season, four of which were on goal. Wenino logged 11 complete

games on the year, and played over 45 minutes in all but the overtime loss at Oklahoma.

HIGH SCHOOL: Wenino played four seasons at Smoky Hill for coaches Randy Freeman and Betsy Sprafka. The Buffaloes were the 2003 Centennial League Champions. She is a Colorado Girls Soccer Academy teammate of CU classmate Alex Cousins who were members of the 2004 State Cup runners-up team. Wenino was a Tulsa (Okla.) All-Tournament team member in 2004 and





received the Fair Play Award in '00 State Cup play. She was first-team Centennial league as a senior and second-team as a junior and was named MVP for Smoky Hill as a senior. A four-sport, and 15-time letterwinner, she received the SHHS Athlete of the Year with Honors award in 2005. Wenino also ran track (200-800m distances) and cross country as a member of the 2002, '03 and '04 5A state championship teams that finished second at nationals in 2004 in Portland, Ore. She was also a point guard on the Buffaloes' basketball team (for former CU assistant coach Ron Burgin) that won the 2002 Centennial League Championship. Off the pitch she was second-team all-league in basketball as a junior and senior, and first-team all-city and all-region in cross country her sophomore through senior seasons.

IN THE CLASSROOM: An academic honor roll student all four years at Smoky Hill, she also received the all-school grade point average award the past eight semesters for carrying a better than 3.75 grade point average.

PERSONAL: Born May 3, 1987 in Aurora, Colo., Michelle Lynn Wenino is the daughter of Pat and Sherri Wenino. She has two older brothers, Brian (27) and Brad (25).






HEMPEN ON NEWLIN: Kelci is another local product from the Rush soccer club that will compete for a spot as a starter on defense.

2007 IN REVIEW



Coming off one of the best seasons in program history, the University of Colorado soccer team wrapped up the 2007 season with a 10-8-4 overall record and a 5-5 Big 12 mark after battling some of the toughest teams in the country. The Buffs finished the regular season in seventh place in the highly competitive Big 12 Conference, and they nearly advanced to the semifinals of the Big 12 Tournament after playing Texas to a 0-0 tie at the end of regulation and two overtime periods. The Buffs eventually fell to the Longhorns in a shootout, but given the strong history of the Colorado program, CU received their fifth straight NCAA Tournament bid where they played host for the second year in a row at Prentup Field.

CU opened the 2007 season just down the road at the DU Invitational where they faced in-state rival, Denver. Ranked No. 14 to start the year, the Buffs got off to a solid start taking a 2-0 win over Denver, with both goals coming from 2006 Big 12 Freshman of the Year and 2007 Pre-Season All-Big 12 selection, forward Nikki Marshall. The Buffs faced Fairfield two days later, but they were unable to capitalize on a number of opportunities against the Stags and the two teams played to a 1-1 tie. Marshall and defender Michelle Wenino were All-Tournament selections after their respective performances on the weekend.

Colorado opened their home slate in record fashion, topping Utah by a score of 4-2, thanks to a plethora of first half goals. Buff freshman Michaela DeJesus got things started early, scoring the quickest goal in program history just 52 seconds into the match, shattering the previous record by 41 seconds. Junior Gianna DeSaverio, Marshall, and senior Allison Kidd all added goals in the first half, helping lead CU to the win. The Buffs wrapped up the weekend with their second tie of the season against Brigham Young, as the two teams lacked their normal offensive production and played to a scoreless draw.

With a four-game unbeaten streak under their belts, the Buffs traveled to Charlottesville, Va. for the Nike Virginia Soccer Classic

where they faced No. 10 Virginia and unranked New Mexico. Unable to find the back of the net for the second straight game, CU dropped a 4-0 decision to Virginia and recorded their first loss of the season. The Buffaloes tried to regroup and rebound against New Mexico, but they were once again unable to score and played the Lobos to a 0-0 draw after two overtime periods. The scoreless tie marked the third-straight game the Buffs went without a goal and the first time in program history that CU had tied three of the first five games of the season.

Colorado returned home to host the sixth annual Colorado Soccer Classic where they welcomed Denver, Drake and No. 1 Stanford University to Prentup Field. Looking to break their three-game scoreless streak, the Buffs dropped a 1-0 heartbreaker to the top-ranked Cardinal in front of an all-time school record crowd of 3,110 people. Winless in their last five games, CU finally broke their four-game scoreless streak with a 1-0 win over Drake two days later on a Wenino golden goal seven minutes into overtime to close out the tournament.

The Buffs hit the road after a two-game home stand to face the Wyoming Cowgirls in their last nonconference game of the year. Thanks to goals from juniors Alex Cousins and DeSaverio, CU claimed the 2-0 road victory, recording their fifth shutout on the season, before heading into Big 12 Conference play.

CU would open the conference season at home, playing host to the Texas Tech Red Raiders. Despite statistically dominating against TTU, Colorado dropped 1-0 to the Red Raiders and fell to 3-9 in Big 12 Conference openers since the program's inception in 1996.

The Buffaloes rebounded from the loss with another stellar offensive first half performance against Nebraska, as they blanked the Huskers 4-0 and claimed their sixth shutout of the season. Junior midfielder Nikki Keller and freshman defender Kym Lowry both scored their first goals of the year, while Marshall recorded her second two-goal game of the season. Freshmen DeJesus and Mel Hicks both dished out two assists in the win, putting them atop the Big 12 Conference stats for most assists in a single game, a record which they went on to hold the entire season.

CU wrapped up the home stand against Iowa State, who came into the game riding a six game unbeaten streak. Marshall scored her sixth goal of the season and third in the last two games, picking up her third gamewinner as the Buffs held off the Cyclones for the 1-0 win. Due to her offensive efforts over the weekend, Marshall was named the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week, CU Athlete of the Week, and was selected to the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week.

After two home shutout wins, Colorado headed to Texas to face Baylor and No. 5 Texas A&M. CU took the early 1-0 lead against Baylor on junior transfer Amber Bettenhausen's first career goal, but the Bears were quick to respond with one of their own just two minutes later to tie the game. BU came out at half time with high intensity and they took the lead in the 78th minute on a one-on-one with CU keeper Kara Linder, who, coming into the match, had not yet given up a goal all season. Baylor's lead was short-lived,



however, as Marshall scored the gametying goal, marking the third game in a row that the reigning Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week had scored at least one goal. CU's persistent effort continued from the gametying momentum as DeSaverio delivered the gamewinner less than four minutes later for her third goal of the season as CU went on to beat Baylor in come-from-behind fashion, 3-2.

The Buffs continued south to College Station to take on No. 5 Texas A&M. With only one win against the Aggies in program history, CU came into the match fired up and determined for an upset. The Buffs took a two-goal lead into halftime on conversions from Kidd and Marshall in the 28th and 43rd minute, respectively. Marshall's goal marked her eighth score on the season and her fourth consecutive game with a goal, tying her own school record in that category. A&M came out very aggressive in the second half, looking to get back on track and they managed to respond with four second half goals, putting the final score at 4-2, handing the Buffs their third conference loss.

The Buffs returned to Boulder for their final regular season home stand, playing host to Kansas and No. 16 Missouri. In another scoreless effort from CU, the Buffaloes dropped their second straight conference match 2-0 to Kansas, despite dominating the final statistics. Just two days later, looking to celebrate Senior Day on a high note, the Buffs were unable to get on the board again in the physical battle against Missouri, as they dropped a 2-0 decision to the Tigers.

With three straight conference losses in a row, the pressure was on the Buffs to win their remaining games in order to have a chance to advance to the Big 12 Conference Tournament. CU hit the road to face Oklahoma and No. 25 Oklahoma State, desperate for a pair of wins. In the match against Oklahoma, the Sooners took the 1-0 lead early in the second half, but the Buffs responded late in the game with Cousins' second goal of the season, sending the match into overtime. Colorado came out fired up in extra time and proved their determination to win as Marshall would need just 27 seconds to net her fourth gamewinning goal of the season to give CU the 2-1 victory, marking the quickest overtime goal in school history.

Fresh off the grueling overtime win against Oklahoma, Colorado did what they had to do against No. 25 Oklahoma State as Cousins netted her second goal in as many games to give Colorado the 1-0 win over the Cowgirls. In response to her performance, Cousins was named to the Soccer Buzz Team of the Week and was crowned Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week for the first time in her career.

CU packed their bags and headed back to Texas to wrap up the regular season against No. 12 Texas. Despite an early first half lead, thanks to a DeSaverio goal two minutes into the game, the Longhorns would respond with four goals and take the 4-1 win to close out the season.

Despite the loss against Texas, Colorado took seventh in the Big 12 Conference and advanced to the first round of the Big 12 Tournament in San Antonio where they faced Texas for the second-straight game. Colorado and Texas were seeded No. 7 and No. 2 in the tournament, respectively, and the Buffs were not going to repeat what had happened to them just a week before. CU and UT played to a 0-0 tie at the end of regulation, with Colorado dominating the offensive statistics. While both teams had close opportunities to end the game in extra time, the match was eventually forced into a shootout. The Longhorns won the shootout 4-2 and advanced to the semifinals of the Big 12 Tournament. With the shutout tie, Colorado picked up its eighth shutout of the year and Linder recorded her third shutout of the season. The tie also marked the fourth straight overtime game for CU in the Big 12 Tournament, with three of them ending in penalty kicks.

Following the completion of the Big 12 season, Colorado had five players recognized on the All-Big 12 Conference soccer teams. For the second time in school history, CU had two players recognized on the All-Big 12 first team in Marshall and Wenino, while Keller was named to the second team. Freshmen Lowry and DeJesus were named to the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.

The Buffs earned their sixth-straight appearance in the 2007 NCAA Soccer Tournament, and were also selected as one of 16 hosts for the first and second round games. Playing host to local rival Denver, as well as Hawai'i and No. 2 Portland, Colorado was matched up with Hawai'i in the first round.

Excited and ready to be playing at home, Colorado shutout Hawai'l 2-0 on goals from DeSaverio and Hicks, advancing the Buffs to the second round



for the third-straight season. With the shutout win, the Buffs finished with nine shutouts on the year, just the fourth time in program history that CU has recorded nine or more shutouts in a single season.

Their second round match up against No. 2 Portland was, unlike the first round, a wire-to-wire battle and the Buffs saw their season come to an end as the Pilots advanced to the Sweet Sixteen after claiming the 1-0 win. Portland got on the board in the 61st minute and CU was unable to respond with a goal of their own, as their offense was greatly limited due to the solid Pilot defense.

At the conclusion of the season, two Buffs earned regional honors for their outstanding play. Marshall earned first team National Soccer Coaches Association of America All-Central Region honors, while Wenino was named to the second team.

PRENTUP FIELD

Prentup Field, located on the East Campus of the University of Colorado at Boulder, has been the home of Colorado Soccer since 2003. The field had been the home of the now-defunct Colorado baseball team before the women's soccer team took over.

Prentup combines the very best of what Boulder has to offer, with beautiful Colorado mountain views and a lush pitch courtesy of CU's turf management team.

The Buffaloes have always enjoyed great home advantages in Boulder. CU formerly played its matches at Pleasant View Soccer Complex in North Boulder. This facility had an award-winning match field for CU to play on and nine surrounding fields for training.

During that time, the Buffaloes compiled a home record of 49-28-4, a winning percentage of .646. The Buffs also played

host to over 3,000 fans on Sept. 2, 1998 when they hosted then-defending national champion North Carolina.

Upon the arrival of coach Bill Hempen, the Buffs started training at Prentup in the spring of 2002 while it was still a baseball field.

In the spring of 2003, the soccer team was granted exclusive use of Prentup, and work began to re-landscape the field. All remnants of the baseball field except for the outfield fence were razed, and the turf began a major makeover.

Prentup Field is now a 160,000 square foot facility that contains a 120x75 yard game field along with a practice area. It is a native soil field and is equipped with an automated irrigation system. When the irrigation was installed and the field was graded in July of 2003, the turf management team produced a playable soccer facility from seed in just 33 days.

Each week, the field is painted and mowed 3-4 times in preparation for matches and practices under the supervision of Ryan Newman, along with a collection of other maintenance practices.

The Buffs trained at Prentup from 2002-04, and finally in the fall of 2004, they played their first-ever match there, defeating Northern Colorado by a score of 3-0 on October 1, 2004. In 2005, Prentup became CU's full time home, with the Buffaloes posting a record of 7-1-0 in their first full season and an all-time mark of 23-7-1.

Capital improvements to the facility are ongoing. An athletic department fund-raising campaign in the summer of 2005 helped raise funds to put in bleachers for 1,200 people, a new scoreboard, nets behind the goals and iron entrance gates adorned with the CU logo into the venue. Additional funds in advance of the 2006 NCAA Tournament added more bleachers, bringing the seating capacity of Prentup Field to 2,000 people.

While there are bleachers for 2,000, fans of CU soccer bring lawn chairs and blankets to sit on as well in the open areas, continuing some of the community feel of Pleasant View at the current home.

In the fall of 2007, Prentup and the Buffs welcomed top-ranked Stanford to Boulder and dropped a 1-0 heartbreaker to the Cardinal in front of a facility record 3,128 fans, shattering the previous record by 1,257 people. Colorado has also had the privelege of hosting back-to-back NCAA Tournament first and second rounds in 2006 and 2007, welcoming 1,871 fans against Colorado College in '06 and 1,843 against No. 2 Portland in '07.

Prentup Field has been home to University of Colorado athletics for almost 40 years, as the venue is named after former CU baseball coach Frank "Chief" Prentup. The field, formerly known as Varsity Field, was renamed after the former coach in 1978. The complex remained a popular venue until the varsity baseball team was removed in 1980.

The field was used by several different entities within Colorado athletics after 1980. The club baseball team played there, and CU's mascot Ralphie was even known to have taken practice runs there.

The complex is located just west of CU's Potts Field track & field complex and ski building. Amenities for Buffalo soccer fans include concessions, rest rooms and free parking and game programs.

- Colorado opened the season with a 2-0 loss to 1997 national champion North Carolina in front of a school record 3,000 fans.
- With 36 saves in one weekend, including a school record 19 against BYU on Sept. 11, Sloane Cox became Colorado's career saves leader with 189 (passing Nina Bjornstad who had 158).
- Shawn Kenyon became the first Buff to record 100 shots with No. 100 coming against Utah on Sept. 13.
- CU earned their first ever win in a Big 12 Conference opener with a 3-0 win over Oklahoma on Oct. 2.
- Cox notched the first ever point for a CU goalkeeper with her assist of Jessica Wollow's second goal on Oct. 2 vs. Oklahoma.
- CU ran into its program-worst losing streak with the fifth consecutive loss to Denver 1-0 on Oct. 18.
- With a 6-0 loss to Missouri, the final game of the season, Cox finished her career as the holder of every Colorado goalkeeping record. In addition to her 200th save of the season, Cox also recorded the 333rd save of her career, and had six shutouts.
- Sloane Cox was named to the All-Big 12 second team, the first player in CU soccer history to be named All-Conference.
- Cox was also named Big 12 Athlete of the Week for September 2 (first player in program history to earn the honor) and CU Athlete of the Week for November 1.
- Teri Fildey was named TCI Student Athlete of the Week for September 5.
- Five players were named to the Academic All-Big 12 first team: Fildey, Cartmell, Matassa, Kenyon, Pascoe.
- Melissa Cartmell led the Buffs offense with 50 shots, six goals, two assists and 14 points.
- Assistant coach Kim LeMere was inducted into the University of Hartford's Alumni Hall of Fame on April 17.

- · Colorado recorded 10 wins on the season for the sixth straight year.
- Five Buffaloes were named to All-Big 12 Teams.
- Colorado played No. 1 ranked Stanford on Friday, Sept. 21 and the Buffs welcomed a school record 3,128 fans. Head football coach Dan Hawkins and the football team were also in attendance. The record-breaking crowd topped the previous record at Prentup Field by 1,239 people, set last year in the first round of the NCAA Tournament against Colorado College. The all-time record, before the Stanford game, was set in 1998 when the Buffs played No. 1 North Carolina in front of an even 3,000 fans at Pleasant View Soccer Complex.
- CU shut out its opponents on 10 different occasions, marking the fourth time in the history of the program that they have recorded nine or more shutouts in a single season.
- Nikki Marshall's goal against Oklahoma, just 27 seconds into overtime, was the quickest overtime goal in program history, besting the previous mark of 91:06, set by former Buff Melissa Cartmell in 1998, by 39 seconds. Michaela DeJesus' goal in the Utah game came just 52 seconds into the match, going down as the quickest goal in the 11 year history of the program, shattering the previous record of 1:33 set by Jen Almquist vs. Hawai'i in 1996 by 41 seconds.



BIG 12 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS

In 2003, when Jen Thais said in a preseason press conference that her season goal was, "to make the NCAA Tournament and to be nationally recognized. What I'm hoping... what I'm expecting, is to surprise people," little did she know what kind of impact that prediction would have on the eighth team in Colorado soccer history... and the nation for that matter.

A record breaking season was approached in four phases. Phase I were the preseason exhibition games where the Buffs shutout Northern Colorado 4-0 and Air Force 3-0.

Phase II consisted of CU's non-conference schedule where the Buffs came out virtually unscathed at 7-1. In the season opener, they held defending national champion and then-No. 2 Portland scoreless for 87 minutes before suffering a 1-0 defeat. The Buffs would regroup and close out the remainder of the non-conference season 7-0, beating teams by a 17-2 scoring margin. It was during Phase II that CU picked up its first-ever win against a top-10 ranked opponent when it handed then-No. 9 Denver a 3-0 blanking, just days after the Pioneers had upended Portland.

Enter Phase III... the Big 12 Conference season. The Buffs came away from the '03 season 8-1-1, the crescendo of the season being a 3-1 win over nemesis Nebraska in the season finale for both teams in below freezing temperatures on a pitch covered in ice. Colorado's 25 season points was the fourth highest in league standings history. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Buffs came away with the coach, player and rookie of the year, a first-team All-Big 12 pick, three second-teamers and five of their nine newcomers named to the All-Newcomer team.

With 25 school single-season, class and career records shattered, Colorado entered the final phase of the season, Phase IV... the postseason. They went into the eighth Big 12 Conference Tournament as the No. 1 seed for the first time in program history, and a week later the Buffs entered their first NCAA Tournament as just one of 16 seeded teams.


