

2009 IN REVIEW



The 2009 season for the Buffs couldn't have started off in any better way than a 1-0 win over Big 12 competitor and nationally ranked No. 11 Oklahoma State on Aug. 22. After a scoreless first half, sophomore Kelly Butler netted Colorado's loan goal during the 62nd minute of play to give CU its first win of the season as well as its first conference win.

The following weekend, Colorado traveled to Denver to take on No. 13 Illinois and St. Mary's College in the Denver Invitational Tournament. The Buffs struggled in their game against the Fighting Illini but Cassidy Fitzpatrick managed to sneak in a goal with less than a minute to play in the game, but CU fell 2-1.

Colorado's scoring drought that was present in their previous game was nonexistent against St. Mary's when they managed eight goals while holding the Gaels to just one. Colorado's scoring drive started just 00:23 into the game when Nikki Marshall

scored an unassisted goal. Just under two minutes later, Nikki Marshall scored again with an assist from fellow senior Ally Goodman. Kelly Butler followed Colorado's scoring pattern by scoring the Buffs' third goal another two minutes later off an assist from Erin Bricker. CU's offense stayed in control as Fitzpatrick and Butler contributed the next two goals. St. Mary's helped CU put in its sixth goal when Nikki Marshall shot the ball which ricocheted off a SMC defender and into the net to make the score 6-0 going into halftime. Amy Barczuk showed the Gaels that CU wasn't finished scoring as she rebounded her own shot and put it right back into the goal only five minutes

into the second half. Colorado's eighth and final goal of the game was scored by Quinn Krier and assisted by Kelly Menachof. St. Mary's showed up on the scoreboard in the 83rd minute of the game when Jessica Menzhuber passed the ball to Alex Ciliento who scored to make the final score 8-1 with the Buffaloes on top. At the conclusion of the tournament, Nikki Marshall was named to the DU Invitational All-Tournament team.

The Buffs returned home to host the eighth annual Colorado Soccer Classic on Sept. 4-6. They welcomed Denver, Oregon and Colgate to Prentup Field. During their first game of the tournament against DU, the Buffs were nationally ranked at No. 15 which was their highest rank of the 2009 season. An impressive 2,711 fans showed up, which was the second largest crowd Prentup Field has ever seen. In a 109-minute battle, the two teams played to a 0-0 tie until senior Nikki Marshall scored the only goal of the game at 108:57 to end it in the favor of the Buffs, 1-0.

Just two days later, No. 15 Colorado played Oregon in its second matchup of the tournament. Colorado struggled to score as the Ducks managed two by the time the Buffs got onto the scorebaord in the 66th minute of the game. Shaye Marshall logged her first collegiate goal with an assist by Butler. With the 2-1 loss, Colorado's record fell to 3-2.

Following the tournament, the Buffs stayed in Boulder to take on the University of Utah on Sept. 11. CU continued to be nationally ranked at No. 20. Just seven minutes into the game, Kelly Ross put the Buffs on the board while logging her first goal of the season with assists from teammates Fitzpatrick and Bricker. The Utes eventually tied the game 1-1 at 54:24 with a goal by Erin Dalley and assist by Lauren Hair, but the Buffs battled in order to win the game in the 87th minute with a game-winning goal by Kym Lowry and assist by Mary White.

The Buffaloes traveled south to Gainesville, Fla. to take on the 14th-ranked Gators on Sept. 13. The Buffs struggled as Florida put up three goals, but CU had no intention of being shutout. Kate Russell put the Buffs on the scoreboard while netting her first goal of the '09 season. Despite losing to the Gators, Colorado held its own and was only outshot 10 to nine throughout the game.

CU still owned the title of being a nationally ranked team at No. 23 regardless of their loss the previous weekend. The Buffs traveled west to California to compete in the Stanford/NIKE Classic with Stanford and Santa Clara. The Buffs suffered their first shutout loss against undefeated Stanford, 4-0. The Buffs managed to hold off the Cardinal offense from scoring their first goal until the 17th minute, which was an impressive feat considering Stanford averaged 29.5

shots per game in 2009.

Colorado's struggle to score continued as CU suffered its second shutout loss in a row to Santa Clara in overtime, 1-0. The first and only goal of the game was by Santa Clara's Kiki Bosio. She headed the ball into the back of the net off of a corner kick at 98:09. After the loss, Colorado was 1-4 against top 25 teams and 4-5 overall.

After three road losses in a row, the longest losing streak of the season, Colorado turned around to beat Nebraska, Iowa State, and Oklahoma at home. The Buffs shut out the Cornhuskers 1-0 on Sept. 25 after Fitzpatrick scored the only goal of the game with an assist from teammate Amanda Foulk in the 68th minute. The goal marked Fitzpatrick's third goal of the season, and the win gave Colorado a 2-0 record in the Big 12 Conference.

Just two days later, a similar scenario played out with Colorado blanking Iowa State, 1-0. Kelly Menachof teamed up with Bricker to put away the lone goal early in the game at 4:17, and CU's victory allowed them to stay undefeated (3-0) in conference play.

Oklahoma visited CU on Oct. 2. Senior stud Nikki Marshall led the Buffs to a 5-1 victory after scoring an impressive four goals. The first goal of the game was by Nikki Marshall and assisted by Butler at 21:16. The Sooners answered back with a goal only four minutes later to tie the game at 1-1, but the Buffs fought back when Butler started a four goal scoring drive at the 35th minute mark. Nikki Marshall assisted the Butler goal before scoring three in a row, two unassisted goals and one assisted by Menachof. Nikki Marshall's four-goal effort tied her own school record which she set as a freshman in a 5-1 victory over Clemson on Sept. 1 2006. Her four goals and one assist for nine points broke her previous career-high point total of eight points in one game which she set in that same 2006 match-up against.

Colorado traveled to Baylor on Oct. 4 with a 4-0 record in the Big 12 while the Bears were 0-2-1 in conference competition. Baylor challenged the Buffs by putting up the first goal of the game at 69:46, but CU retaliated and tied the game 1-1 with an unassisted goal by Fitzpatrick ten minutes later. The Bears surprised the Buffs late in the game when Christine Clark scored the game-winning goal for Baylor with an assist by Bethany Johnson. The 2-1 loss to Baylor gave the Buffs their first conference loss of the season.

On Oct. 9, the Buffs traveled to Missouri to battle the Tigers but fell in overtime, 1-0. Missouri stayed undefeated in conference play while giving CU its second conference loss of the season. The Buffs battled and nearly made it onto the scoreboard when the Marshall sister-act teamed up to send the ball towards the goal which unfortunately did not make it in.

CU continued its road-game stretch when they traveled to Kansas to shut out the Jayhawks on Oct. 11. This marked the first on-the-road conference win for the Buffs and improved their overall record to 8-7 and 5-2 in the Big 12. The Buffs held the Jayhawks scoreless which marked the fifth shutout victory in 2009 for goalkeeper Kara Linder. Bricker scored the lone goal of the game at 15:38, and the Colorado defense held back the Kansas offence to keep the score 1-0 for the remainder of the game.

The Buffs took a 12-day mini-vacation from games before they traveled to College Station, Texas to take on No. 20 Texas A&M on Oct. 23. Texas A&M defeated Colorado for the 17th time in 19 tries. The Aggies beat the Buffs 2-0.

Colorado stayed in Texas to take on the Longhorns just two days later. The Buffaloes battled the Longhorns to a scoreless tie until the 90-minute buzzer sounded to send the game into overtime. The two teams battled to another scoreless tie after the first ten minutes of overtime. At the beginning of the second overtime period, Texas was awarded a free kick in the 101st minute, and Leah Payne stepped up to take the kick. Payne sent a high-ball into the middle of the Colorado goal box. The ball bounced once and Sophie Campise one-



touch volleyed the ball into the back of the net, ending the game and giving Texas the 1-0 overtime victory.

After five road-games in a row, CU was happy to welcome Texas Tech to Prentup Field for their final game of the season as well as their Senior Day on Oct. 30. In true Nikki Marshall fashion, she scored the first goal of the night at 52:58 with an assist by Bricker. Soon after the first Colorado goal, Bricker teamed up with Russell to put one in the back of the TTU net to put the Buffs up 2-0, which was the score for the remainder of the game.

The Buffs 6-4 record was good enough for third overall in the Big 12 Conference. Nikki Marshall was named first-team All-Big 12 while Barczuk was earned second-team and newcomer team All-Big 12 honors. Bricker also earned an All-Big 12 newcomer team spot.

The Buffs entered the Big 12 Tournament as the No. 3 seed and took on the No. 6 seed, Texas, in the first round. CU fell to Texas 1-0 in a double-overtime battle which ended their '09 season. The first goal of the game was scored in the 106th minute by Longhorn Hannah Higgins and assisted by Courtney Goodsen.

At the conclusion of the season, senior Nikki Marshall earned a first-team All-Central Region honor. Throughout her four years as a Buffalo she had scored 42 goals and nine assists for 93 points which puts her at the top of CU's all-time leading scorers list.
