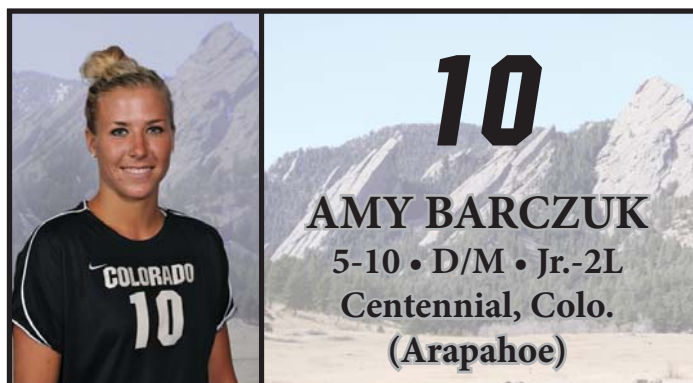

HEMPEN ON BARCZUK: “Amy is just a stud. I don’t know how else to say it. She practices so hard and strives for perfection that there’s no way we can’t have her on the field. I think she is probably going to see a good amount of time at center-back because when we lost Kelly Ross, we didn’t know what we lost. Kelly anchored it a lot for us last year and it might be Amy’s job this year, but she’s going to have a lot of freedom in the attack for us.”

SOPHOMORE (2010): Found her role as one of CU’s leaders on the field during her second season in Boulder. She played in all 20 of Colorado’s matches logging 18 starts playing a whopping 1,822 minutes, Kate Russell was the only other Buff to see more minutes in 2010. Barczuk finished the season with five points off two goals and an assist while tying Russell with the most shots attempted (41). Her two goals of the season came in



consecutive home wins against Kansas (2-1) and Nebraska (2-1). Barczuk’s assist was on CU’s lone goal in the 2-1 loss at Oklahoma, a Russell score 2:44 into the contest. Her 41 shots rank 10th on CU’s offensive class list for sophomores.

FRESHMAN (2009): Barczuk was the only freshman to start all 19 of CU’s games. She logged the second most minutes played with 1,607, and she scored one goal while attempting 16 shots on the season. She contributed one of the eight CU goals against St. Mary’s when she was on the receiving end of a corner kick for the seventh goal in the 8-1 win over the Gaels. Barczuk’s

stellar freshman season performance was rewarded with spots on the 2009 All-Big 12 Conference second team and the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.

HIGH SCHOOL: Barczuk lettered three years in soccer at Arapahoe High School. She led her team to the state semifinals as a sophomore and senior, and to the quarterfinals as a junior. Barczuk was named second-team All-League as a sophomore, and earned first-team All-league, 5A All-State and All-Colorado selections as a senior.

On the club side, Barczuk played for the Riverside Renegades and helped them to three State Cup Championships in 2003, '04 and '08, and they went on to the regional semifinals in 2004 and quarterfinals in 2009. Despite her team dropping the State Cup final match in 2009, Barczuk was still crowned the State Cup MVP for the tournament. From 2001-08, Barczuk and the Renegades compiled an impressive 210-45-41 record and were league champions (Premier I, Elite) nine out of 12 seasons. Barczuk was also a member of the 2007 Colorado Olympic Development team, and she was selected for the 2007 Region IV pool and eventually landed a spot on the regional team. Her Region IV team competed against three other regions at the 2008 Inter-Regional Camp, where she saw action on both the U-17 and U-19 teams. A dual-sport athlete, Barczuk also excelled on the basketball court, lettering four years and wrapped up her prep career as a McDonald’s All-American Finalist. She was a three-time all-state honorable mention and first-team all-league selection, and was all-league second team as a freshman. A heavily recruited athlete in both sports, Barczuk was recognized with the 2008 Sportswomen of Colorado “All-Around” Award. She was a member of the National Honor Society and was a first-team Academic All-State selection at AHS.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Barczuk is a business major at CU.

PERSONAL: Amy Barczuk was born on October 28, 1990 and is the daughter of Mark and Lynn Barczuk of Centennial, Colo. She has one sister, Sarah. Her grandpa played basketball for the University of Detroit and her great uncle was a member of the Brooklyn Dodgers baseball team. When she’s not playing soccer, Barczuk enjoys traveling and playing basketball.

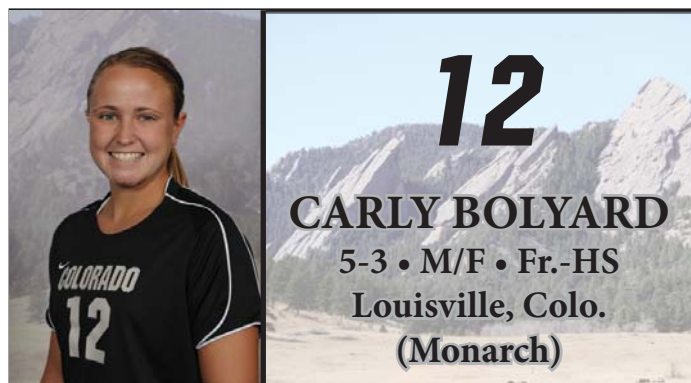
HIGH SCHOOL: At Eagle River High School, Boggs was a two-time captain. In 2009, she set the record at her high school for most goals scored in a single game with four. Boggs was selected to participate in the 2009 U17/U19 Interregional Camp. For three years she has been an active member of the Alaska ODP team. She was a volunteer coach in 2009 and participated in ODP camps in 2007, '08 and '09. Boggs played for the Cook Inlet Club Soccer program in Anchorage, Alaska. She helped her team win the State Cup in 2009. Her team was Ina K Soccer Tournament Champions in 2007, '08 and '09, and she was selected as the tournament's MVP in '09. Her team was also a Las Vegas Mayor's Cup finalist (2009), Coaches Classic Las Vegas semifinalist (2007), Far North Soccer Tournament champs (2007), and a State Cup finalist (2007). She earned several individual awards as well. During her freshman year she was named the Freshman Player of the Year. She was a candidate for the Gatorade award her junior year and managed to make the honor roll all three seasons. During high school, Boggs also lettered in basketball and cross country.

HEMPEN ON BOLYARD: "When we brought Carly on, I knew she had a big engine. By that, I mean she'll run and run and run and run and run. Obviously, that's what we need in this sport which I think allows us to play her in several different spots, whether as a forward or as a midfielder because she's just going to give us an incredible energy."

HIGH SCHOOL: Bolyard was a four-year All-Front Range Conference selection for Monarch High School, earning first team honors as a sophomore (2009) and three second team awards (2008, '10 and '11). As a sophomore she was also second team all-region. During her junior year she was the team's offensive MVP. Bolyard earned all-academic accolades all four years of high school as well. She played midfield/forward under coach Gianna DeSaverio, a former CU soccer player (2007-08). She played for the Arsenal and Pride Predators Club teams. In 2006, her Arsenal team won the Schwan's USA Cup Tournament. In 2007 and '08, her team made it to the Colorado State Cup semi-finals. While she played with the Predators, her team won the league title. She also has ODP experience as a member of the state team (2008-10). She was in the Region IV pool in 2008 and '09. Her team was Region IV champions in 2010 after making the finals the two previous years (2008, and '09). She was a national ODP champion in 2010 as she made the Colorado Girls first team. She also lettered in basketball at MHS for two seasons and earned all-academic awards her freshman and sophomore years.

HEMPEN ON BRICKER: “She’s struggling with a little bit of injury right now, but we’re hoping that Erin can find the goal-scoring touch that she had when we brought her in here. Not a great year for her last year, but we’re hoping for the best for Erin.”

SOPHOMORE (2010): Bricker played in every game her sophomore year making 12 starts. She logged a total of 1,133 minutes scoring one goal for two points. She attempted 21 shots on the season with 14 on goal. Her only goal of the season was the game-winner against Nebraska lifting the Buffs over the Cornhuskers 2-1 at home.

FRESHMAN (2009): Bricker played in 18 games and started 14 of them at forward for the Buffs. She led CU in assists with four on the season. She made her collegiate debut during the home opener against Oklahoma State on Aug. 22 and notched her first career start against Illinois. Bricker recorded her first assist on the third goal against St. Mary’s. Bricker was one of two CU freshmen to be named to the 2009 Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.

HIGH SCHOOL: Bricker was a three-year letter-winner at Campolindo High School under head coach Ernesto Silva. As Campolindo’s leading scorer her freshman, sophomore and junior seasons with over 70 goals scored, Bricker led the Cougars to back-to-back NCS Championships in 2006 and 2007. Bricker was a three-time first-team all-league selection, a three-time team MVP, and named the league’s Most Valuable Offensive Player as a junior. Bricker was forced to sit out of her senior season due to a hip injury. She played club ball for the Mustang Maverick’s out of Danville, Calif. Bricker and the Maverick’s won back-to-back state championships in 2007 and 2008 and they fell in the championship game to the Pleasanton Rage in 2009. Bricker and the Mavericks also won the Surf Cup and Las Vegas Showcase in 2008, and she was a participant in the Nike Premiere 50 camp in 2007.

HEMPEN ON BRUNNER: "Annie comes in as our number one goalkeeper. She had a great second half of her freshman year, and we're hoping that carries in to the rest of her career, because she was able to keep us in a lot of games and win some games for us."

FRESHMAN (2010):

She secured her spot as CU's starting goalkeeper playing all 20 games and starting 19. She recorded 61 saves allowing just 22 goals in 1,804 minutes giving her a 1.10 goals against average which ranks 10th on CU's single season list. Her 61 saves puts her in 10th on that list as well, and she is tied for sixth with five shutouts and eight wins in her debut season. She earned two player of the week awards (Big 12 Conference and College Soccer 360) after the Buffs beat No. 6 Texas A&M 2-1 in overtime and tied Texas 0-0 in double overtime.



HIGH SCHOOL:

She arrived early at CU after graduating from Arvada West High School in December of 2009 and enrolled into CU for the spring 2010 semester. She was a member of her high school's soccer team for two years at left back and then focused on playing club ball for the Colorado Storm Soccer Club under coach Scott Dedycker. She led the Storm to the state championship in 2007, '08, '09 and '10. She also has significant experience at the Olympic Development level and was a member of the ODP State team for four years (2004-07). She was recognized as an academic letterman for four years and received the Masonic Award her junior year.

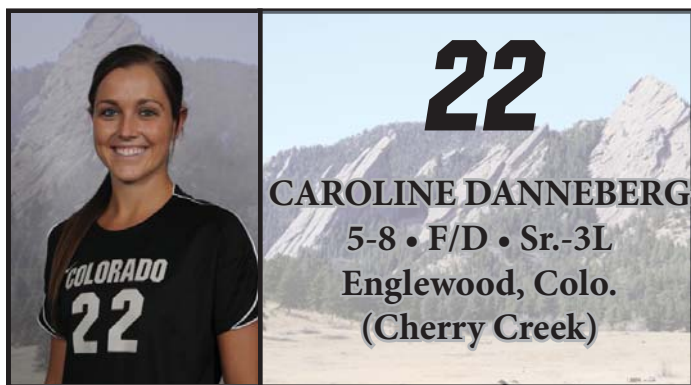
IN THE CLASSROOM: Brunner is majoring in business at Colorado and hopes to work in business after graduation.

HEMPEN ON DANNEBERG: “Wow, what do you say? Caroline is making a run at playing center-back. She came in as a forward, played outside back and now she’s moving into yet another position. But that says a ton for her to be able, willing and have the ability to play different positions. I think



her freshman year was by far her best year—she struggled with injuries the last two—but we’re hoping she can fight her way through her senior year and really have a monster senior year as a center-back for us.”

JUNIOR (2010):

Danneberg started her junior year off on the right foot as she dished out an assist in CU’s first two matches of the season. She finished the season with three points on three assists. Danneberg started 15 of Colorado’s 20 contests in 2010, and she attempted 18 shots with 12 of them on

goal giving her an impressive .667 shot on goal percentage, tying her for the second best on the team in that category.

SOPHOMORE (2009): Danneberg earned her first preseason honor when she was named to the 2009 Preseason All-Big 12

Conference Team. She split time at defender and forward for Colorado, and she saw action in all 19 regular season games while starting six.

FRESHMAN (2008): Danneberg was one of three freshmen to start all 23 games for the Buffaloes and she led that group in minutes played with 1,942. She dished out three assists from the defensive position, including the crucial one on the game-tying goal against Oklahoma State in the semifinals of the Big 12 Championship. Danneberg’s performance as a freshman landed her a spot on the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.

HEMPEN ON DOHM: "At this point, it looks like Alex is going to miss the entire season due to an ACL injury that happened in the spring match. We're fighting for her. If there's any chance of her playing later on this season, we hope she can do it, because she has incredible athleticism, speed and everything you need at this level. We're going to miss her if she's unable to play."

FRESHMAN (2010): Hempen used Dohm's speed all over the field as she played in 18 games and logged 11 starts in her freshman campaign. She played a whopping 1,140 minutes and recorded a goal and an assist on the season. She was one of CU's most decorated players in 2010 as she was named to the All-Big 12 Conference second team and the 2010 Big 12 All-Newcomer squad. She was also Colorado's MVP at the Denver Invitational and a College Soccer 360 Primetime Performer of the Week (Sept. 21) after her exceptional defense in CU's 1-0 double overtime win over No. 10 ranked UCLA.

HIGH SCHOOL: She was a four-year letter winner at Liberty High School in Colorado Springs, Colo., where she holds the record for most points scored by a sophomore with 21. As a senior, she was the first female from Liberty to make the high school scholar All-American team and all-region team. She was named first team All-Area by *ESPN Rise*. Her junior year, she joined the Liberty Wall of Fame for soccer and was named the team's most valuable player on both offense and defense. She earned first-team All-5A

Colorado Springs League honors. As a sophomore, she won the power goals and power assists awards for Liberty and was named second-team all-state and first-team All-4A Colorado Springs League. As a freshman, she was named Liberty's defensive most valuable player and earned honorable mention All-State by the *Rocky Mountain News*, honorable mention All-Area by the *Colorado*

HEMPEN ON HERZL: “Lizzy’s introduction to college soccer was scoring two of the biggest goals anybody would ever want, and she scored them on the first two times on the field for us last year. She is not a goal scorer. She’s shown she can score goals, but we’re hoping she can develop into that ‘Amy Barczuk,’ the ‘Kelly Ross’ as a central defender, a real presence physically, a real presence from a soccer standpoint, and a person who really commands the back line for us. We’re hoping she can eventually take over that role.”

FRESHMAN (2010): After making the spur-of-the-moment switch from defense, where she’s played all of her soccer career, to offense, Herzl’s freshman campaign got a lot more interesting. Hempen switched her position during the game against UCLA, and soon after Herzl became a hero when she scored the game-winner to lift the Buffs over No. 10 UCLA 1-0 in double overtime. For a fitting encore, Herzl did the exact same thing in the following game against No. 6 Texas A&M when she scored the game-winner in overtime giving the Buffs their first ever win (2-1) in College Station, Texas.

HIGH SCHOOL: She earned seven total letters at Heritage High School, three in soccer and four in track & field. Heritage won its league championship all three years and finished second in state in 2008. Her junior season she earned first-team All-Continental League honors and as a freshman and senior was Heritage’s defensive MVP. She has been a member of the Colorado Storm Soccer Academy since 2005 and won the Colorado

State Cup four straight years from 2007-10 and were runners-up in 2005 and ‘06. She was named the MVP of the State Cup in 2010. In track & field, she ran the 800-meter relay with a personal best time of 2:24.

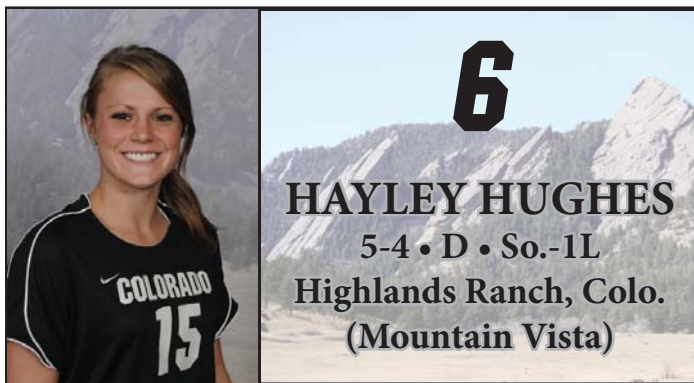

HEMPEN ON HUGHES: “Hayley is the absolute quickest kid I’ve ever seen. Nikki [Marshall] was fast; Hayley is quick, lightning quick. She’s going to be a major contributor as an outside back, and we’re probably going to play her a good bit at forward this year because she can get behind some people and cause some problems.”

FRESHMAN (2010): She was one of three Buffs and the only freshman to start every game in 2010. Hughes finished her first season at Colorado as the team’s third leading scorer with three goals and an assist for seven points in 1,760 minutes. Her three goals tied her for ninth on CU’s offensive class records for freshmen. She played exceptionally well in the DU Invitational at the beginning of the season and earned herself a spot on the all-tournament team.

HIGH SCHOOL: She earned six letters for Mountain Vista High School, four in soccer and two in track & field. She was a three time all-league selection and once an all-state selection for Mountain Vista. Hughes led REAL Colorado to a state championship in 2006. REAL Colorado was also regional champions and state finalists during the 2009-10 season and was a national finalist in 2011. In track & field, she earned all-state honors as a freshman and sophomore and holds three school records in the 400-meter relay, the 800-meter relay and the 800 medley. She qualified for the United States Track & Field Association Junior Olympics in 2007 despite jumping off what she later learned was a broken foot.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Hughes is a quantitative finance major in the business school at Colorado.

HEMPEN ON PERRY: "We brought Hannah in to challenge for the starting position coming off the early part of her career. She's battling a little bit of injury right now, but we hope she's able to compete in goal for us."

JUNIOR (2010-REDSHIRT): Perry was one of three transfers to join the team in 2010. She served as a reserve goalkeeper and did not see action in any matches for the Buffs, thus using her redshirt year and maintaining two years of eligibility remaining.

AT ST. LOUIS UNIVERSITY (2008-09/Fr., Soph.): Perry started every game during her freshman and sophomore seasons at St. Louis University. She recorded 121 career saves and 18 shutouts while holding an 18-14-7 record during her two seasons. During the 2009 season she posted a 7-8-3 record and a 0.82 goals against average while recording eight shutouts and 49 saves which earned her the sixth spot on SLU's single-season shutout list, seventh spot for GAA and ninth spot for minutes played (1,651). Perry inched her way to the top of the sophomore single-season list where she secured the second spot for shutouts, third for minutes, tied for third in wins, fourth in GAA and fifth in saves. In 2009, ranked second in the Atlantic 10 Conference for shutouts and third for GAA. For conference games only, she was third in GAA (0.58), tied for third in shutouts (three) and fourth in save percentage (0.821). As a freshman she played every minute of the 2008 season in the goal. HEMPEN ON RUSSELL: "You go through your career as a coach and every once in a while you have a 'Kate Russell.' We had that in a Nikki Marshall, we had that in a Fran Munnelly. We're at that point in Kate's career. It used to be 'Find Fran, find Nikki.' It's now 'Find Kate,' because she just takes the game to a whole other level for us."

CAREER: Russell enters her senior season tied with Katie Griffin (2003-06) for third place on CU's career list for assists with 14. Her 121 career shot attempts rank 10th on the Buffaloes' all-time list while her 4,966 minutes rank 11th.

JUNIOR (2010): A 2010 All-Big 12 second team selection, Russell led Colorado in points with 11 recording three goals and five assists. She tied Amy Barczuk with most shots attempted (41) while leading the team with 20 shots on goal. Russell experienced many highlights throughout the season, but one game she played exceptionally well was against Washington State when she contributed both assists to lift the Buffs over the Cougars 2-1 in overtime. She logged points in three consecutive contests in the middle of the season as she dished out an assists during the Buffs' 3-1 win over Iowa State and 3-2 loss to Oklahoma State and scored the only

CU goal in the 2-1 loss to Oklahoma. She made it into the record book in all four categories on CU's offensive class record list for juniors. Her 11 points tied her for eighth. Her three goals were good enough for a four-way tie in 10th place, and her five assists tied two other Buffs in second place. She sits alone in seventh place with 41 shots.

SOPHOMORE (2009): Russell started all 15 games that she played in during the season, while missing four games due to a rib injury. She totaled four points, coming on one goal and two assists. Her goal was the only CU score in a loss against Florida.

all 23 games and logged the Buffs' third-most minutes played with 1,905. Russell scored two goals right off the bat, notching the team's first goal of the season in the 1-1 tie against No. 20 Florida and then netting the game-winner in the 3-2 come-from-behind victory over Texas Tech in the Big 12 Conference opener. Russell led all Buffs in assists with seven on the season, ranking her at No. 7 in the Big 12. Her seven assists are also good for the second-most in a season in the history of the Colorado soccer program, becoming the only freshman ever to do so. With just one season under her belt, Russell is only one assist away from cracking the top-10 career records list.

HIGH SCHOOL: Russell was a four-year letter-winner at Silver Creek High School under coach Sara Friend. As a team captain in her senior campaign, Russell led her prep team to the state championships in 2008. She was named first-team all-conference all four years and is a three-time first-team all-state selection. Russell played club ball for the Colorado Rush and helped lead her team to seven state championships (2001-08). She was named Colorado State Cup MVP in 2002. Russell, along with former Buff Kelci Newlin, led the Rush to the 2008 regional and national championships. Russell was a member of the Colorado State ODP team from 2003-06 and made the Region IV pool in 2006. A multi-sport athlete, Russell also lettered two years in basketball and one year in track.

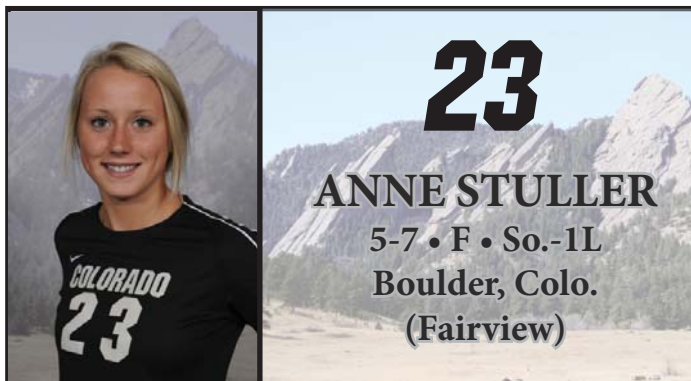
