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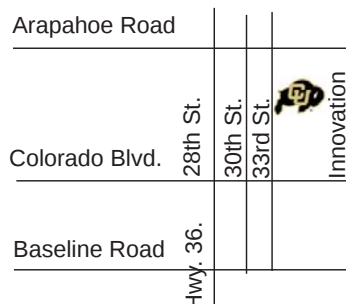
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MAP AND DIRECTIONS TO PRENTUP FIELD The Home of Colorado Soccer

To reach Prentup Field **from campus**, take Colorado Blvd. east through the intersections of 28th and 30th Streets. Take your first left (unmarked) on to 33rd Street. After several speed bumps and the University's Day Care Center, take a right into a dirt parking lot. Prentup Field is on the left. **From Foothills Parkway**, travel west on Colorado, take a right on Innovation Drive and follow that into a dirt parking lot. The field is on the right just past the track complex and ski building.

PRENTUP FIELD INFORMATION

- There is bleacher seating available for approximately 750 people.
- Lawnchairs and outside food and drinks are welcome.
- Alcohol is prohibited within the confines of Prentup Field and nearby Potts Field (track).
- Animals, other than service dogs, are prohibited.
- Admission and parking for regular season games is free of charge.

PRENTUP FIELD

All home games will be played on campus at Prentup Field, located on CU's East Campus at 33rd and Colorado. Admission, and parking in the adjacent lot, are free.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

Interview requests should be made directly through the CU Sports Information Department. Please contact **Taylor Temby** to request access to athletes. Both athletes and staff will be on the field and available to the media following a brief cooling off period at the conclusion of all games. Buff practices are held on Prentup Field, from 7:30 a.m. to approximately 9:00 a.m. Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Players and coaches may speak with the media after practice. The coaching staff is generally available in their offices weekdays from 9 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and after practices. Practice times may vary. Please feel free to call any member of the coaching staff during the day at 303-492-0632, however to contact a student-athlete, we ask that you go through the sports information office.

DURING THE GAME

Statistics are available at halftime and at the end of the game. There are currently no phone lines available at Prentup, but wireless internet access is available for the 2010 season. Please see Cydney Ricker at the game for login information.

2011 COLORADO BUFFALOES



The University of Colorado women's soccer team will face a new conference with new competition for its 16th season of play. Sixteen returning players will be joined by five newcomers as they kick off the season in the inaugural Colorado Cup. Here they will battle against the other top soccer programs in the state before heading west to take on their new Pac-12 opponents. Colorado head coach Bill Hempen and assistant coach Tracy Chao also welcome new Assistant Coach, Chris Gnehm to a proud Buffalo organization.

WHO'S RETURNING: The Buffs will return 16 players (nine starters) from the 2010 roster, and will be led by a core group of seniors (Caroline Danneberg, Hannah Perry, Kate Russell, Amy Steiner and Maggi Steury). Colorado will have plenty of experience on the pitch, as six players saw action in all 20 games in 2010 (Amy Barczuk, Erin Bricker, Annie Brunner, Danneberg, Hayley Hughes and Russell), and six players saw action in at least 15 out of the 20 games.

WHO'S GONE: The Buffs said goodbye to eight players from the 2010 season. Colorado's defense will need to fill the void of power defender Kym Lowry who contributed three goals, four assists and 28 shots to the offense last season. Lowry also tied for 10th overall in CU history for game-winning goals, two of which came in 2010. CU will also lose midfielder Cassidy Fitzpatrick. Fitzpatrick earned two goals and three assists last year. Kelly Butler, Amanda Foulk, Mel Hicks, Kelly Moore, Kelly Ross and Taryn Vitacca will also not return.

WHO'S NEW: Colorado will welcome six freshmen to the team for the 2011 campaign. Carly Bolyard, Darcy Jerman and Bianca Jones all played high school soccer in Colorado, while Clare Madden joins the team from La Grange, Ill. Storie Ledger enters the season from Mill Valley, Calif., and Rebecca Boggs will become the first player in the history of CU soccer to hail from Alaska (Eagle River).

FORWARDS: Last season, four players tied for most goals scored with three (of those, Russell, Shaye Marshall and Hughes return). For the 2010 term, the Buffs put away 24 goals on 296 shots, proving the chances were there. Because of that, this season the Buffs are looking for the offense to finish. Head coach Bill Hempen has acknowledged his team had opportunities to score more last year, but couldn't find the back of the net. For the 2011 campaign, Hempen hopes to "see a couple bounce in for us this year that maybe bounced away last year." Danneberg is one player the Buffs will look to put balls on net. The versatile forward/defender contributed three assists and 18 shots for the season and tied with Bricker with the second highest shots-on-goal percentage for 2010. Danneberg saw action in all 20 games and started in 15.

MIDFIELDERS: Russell returns for her senior year after coming off a strong performance last season. Russell led the Buffs in points (11) and assists (5), and she tied for most goals (3), shots (41) and shots on goal (20) in 2010. Russell is currently tied for third on CU's career list for assists with 14, and her ability to

set up goals at crucial moments has benefited her team greatly. Russell will have plenty of support in the midfield with Barczuk returning. Barczuk started in 18 of the 20 games she played last season, and logged 1,822 minutes (only Russell played more). She finished the season with two goals and one assist for five points, and tied Russell in shots (41). Sophomore Hayley Hughes also returns after a strong freshman season where she started every game. Hughes was the third leading scorer with three goals and one assist for seven points.

DEFENDERS: Senior Amy Steiner will return to the Buffs' backfield after a solid performance in 2010. Steiner started in all 19 games she saw action, and will have the opportunity to face her old team, the University of Arizona, this season after transferring to CU her junior year. Sophomore Lizzy Herzel will also return to defense this year after coming off of an exciting freshman campaign. Herzel scored two game-winning goals against UCLA and Texas A&M after being moved up to forward during overtime play. Senior Maggi Steury and freshman Bianca Jones will also add depth to the defense.

KEEPERS: Goalkeeper Annie Brunner returns for her sophomore season with a year of collegiate experience behind her. After playing in all 20 games in 2010 (she started 19 of them), Brunner impressed with her 1.10 goals against average. Her standout performances earned her the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week and the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week honors during the season. Kayla Millar will enter her second season with the Buffs after serving as a reserve keeper for the 2010 season. She saw action in two games and started in CU's 2-1 victory over Washington State. Senior keeper Hannah Perry will also have the opportunity to compete for time this year.

THE SEASON: The University of Colorado women's soccer team will face a slate of new teams as they leave the Big 12 behind for western competition. CU will play 11 Pac-12 conference matches, eight non-conference games and one exhibition against the United States Air Force Academy for the 2011 campaign.

The Buffs will officially open the 2011 season when they co-host the inaugural Colorado Cup. In addition to CU, the tournament will include the University of Denver, Colorado College and the University of Northern Colorado. CU will kick off the season against CC in Denver on August 19 before returning to Prentup for the home opener against UNC on August 21. To finish off the month, regional foe Wyoming will make the trip south to face CU on August 28.

Colorado will then venture to the Midwest to play Purdue (Sept. 2) and Illinois (Sept. 4) where they hope to even their overall records against the two teams, 1-1. The Buffs will return

to Colorado for the next three games when they take on DU at Prentup on Sept. 11 for the Omni Hotels Colorado Challenge, and Auburn and CSU Bakersfield in Denver (Sept. 16 and 18, respectively) for the Denver Invitational Tournament.

CU will begin its first season in the Pac-12 on Sept. 23 against Oregon State in Corvallis, Ore. Prior to this season, Colorado has faced their new Pac-12 opponents only 16 times combined since 1996. The Buffs first Pac-12 home games are Arizona (Sept. 30) and Arizona State (Oct. 2).

October brings two trips to the West Coast. CU will first head to the northwestern-most state to play Washington (Oct. 7) and Washington State (Oct. 9). The Buffs will return home for a quick match Oct. 16 against Oregon before leaving again, this time to California. In the "Sunshine State," CU will first play California on Oct. 21. This game will mark the first meeting between the two teams since September 1996 when women's soccer became a varsity sport at CU. Next, it's a trip to Palo Alto when CU kicks off against Stanford Oct. 23. CU will hope to bring the sunshine back to Colorado when the team returns home to play UCLA on Oct. 28 and USC on Oct. 30 for the final home games of the season.

The Buffs will wrap up a busy regular-season with a matchup against Utah on Nov. 4. Colorado women's soccer has faced Utah the most times any of the Pac-12 teams, and is 6-1 against the Utes overall.

HEAD COACH BILL HEMPEN



After 10 seasons in Boulder, head coach Bill Hempen has produced a team that battles for the Big 12 Conference championship year in and year out, and that's exactly what he strives to do moving into the Pac-12 Conference in 2011.

When he arrived in Boulder in the summer of 2001, he found himself inheriting a team that, though close, had yet to put together a winning Big 12 season. He started to put the pieces in place that would make Colorado Soccer

a success.

It then took just two seasons to orchestrate the biggest single-season turnaround in CU and Big 12 history, and one of the best in the nation when his 2002 squad went 10-8-2 and finished fifth in the league just a year after his first team struggled at 3-11-1 to finish 10th.

It would take just one more year to turn naysayers into believers as the Buffs went from 10th in 2001 to first with the program's first conference title, a 15-4-1 record, nine shutouts, a 11-match unbeaten streak, the school's first national ranking in the sport, a Big 12 Coach of the Year title for Hempen and the program's first NCAA Tournament bid in 2003.

While Hempen took a leap of faith to leave a Duke program that he started in 1988, he credits others that leapt along with him for bringing Colorado its first conference crown in 2003.

Along with the efforts of his assistant coaches, he credits 2003 Big 12 Player of the Year Fran Munnelly's commitment to come to CU during that 3-11-1 season, "She must have seen my passion and commitment to make it work here," said Hempen. "My track record, the locale and University was good enough for her to come here."

Since his arrival in Boulder during the summer of 2001, Colorado soccer has reinvented itself.

He won his 50th game at CU when the Buffs topped UNC 3-0 on Oct. 10, 2005, and coached his milestone 350th game on Oct. 17, 2004. The 2-0 shutout win over Kansas in 2008 gave Hempen his milestone 250th career win in his 21st season as a head coach. Hempen became just one of 16 active Division I head coaches to eclipse the 250 win plateau and he is among the all-time winningest coaches in NCAA Division I women's soccer history. Entering the 2011 season he sits at the 15th spot on the list with 272 career wins.

"What this means is that I've been doing this a long time," said Hempen after the match. "It's really an honor and a tribute to all the kids that have put up with me over the years and to my first team at Duke (1988) who also contributed to this."

As the program enters its 15th season, one need only look at Hempen's leadership when charting its future. Since his arrival, the Buffs have gone 110-75-26 (.583) overall and 51-38-11 (.565) in Big 12 Conference play. They have earned seven top-five league finishes including being named the Big 12 Conference Champions in 2003. CU's success in 2003 also included Hempen's achievement of being named Big 12 Coach of the Year, as well as the league's player of the year Fran Munnelly and rookie of the year Katie Griffin.

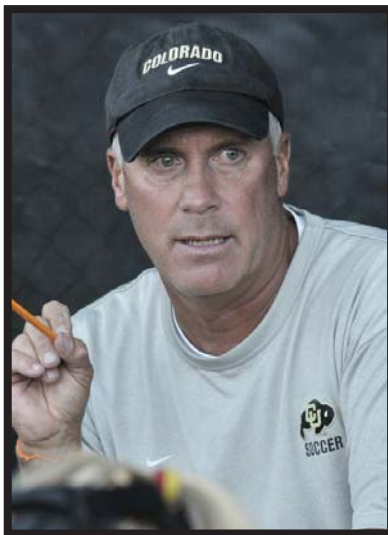
Under Hempen's reign Colorado has had 25 player appearances on All-Big 12 teams, nine on all-region teams, and boasts a three time All-American in Fran Munnelly, who was also named to the Big 12 10th Anniversary team in 2005. Hempen has coached the Buffaloes to six-straight NCAA appearances (2003-08), including a program-best appearance in the NCAA Sweet Sixteen in 2006. He also coached standout player Nikki Marshall from 2006-09. Marshall holds the top spot on CU's all-time leading scorers list with 93 points (42 goals, 9 assists). She was drafted in the first round of the WPS draft and will play defense for the Washington Freedom in 2010.

In the classroom, 39 players have been named to Academic All-Big 12 teams under Hempen while the 2003 squad won the athletic department's most improved honor for a team as its aggregate grade point average rose .44 from the previous academic year. In 2005, senior goalkeeper Jessie Keller was named a CoSIDA District VII Academic All-Region Soccer Team member, the first in CU history.

When hired on June 5, 2001, Bill Hempen came to Boulder with eight NCAA Tournament appearances, three ACC Coach of the Year honors, 1992 National Soccer Coaches Association of America National Coach of the Year recognition, and one of the winningest programs during the last decade under his belt.

He came to Colorado from Duke, where he had been the Blue Devils' head coach since the program's inception in 1988.

He led the Blue Devils to eight appearances in the NCAA Tournament and had a career record of 162-100-16 (.676) in Durham. He was the NSCAA National Coach of the Year in 1992, and was also named Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year three times (1992, 1994 and 1997) while directing Duke to the 16th most wins in the country (124) in the 1990s.



Hempen's Duke teams finished the season ranked in the national polls nine times with their highest finish coming in 1994, a No. 4 ranking following Duke's first ACC regular season title and a win over 13-time national champion North Carolina to snap the Tar Heels' 101-game unbeaten streak.

The 1992 season was among Hempen's finest, as he led his team to a school-record 17 wins and a berth in the national championship game in its first trip to the NCAA tournament. Since then, Duke teams have advanced to the NCAA tournament every season since 1998.

In his 13 seasons at Duke, he coached nine All-Americans, 34 All-ACC players, seven Academic All-ACC selections and three players that played professionally in the WUSA.

He also has significant experience with the United States Soccer Federation's Olympic Development Program, specifically in Region III and as the head coach of Colorado's state ODP Program.

Born June 6, 1958 in St. Louis, Hempen graduated from Bishop DeBourg High school before attending Meramec Community

College in St. Louis where he split time in goal for Meramec's 1976 Junior College National Championship and 1977 Runner-Up teams.

He continued his collegiate career as a two-year letterwinner in goal at the University of Evansville for the 1978 and '79 seasons compiling a 22-11-6 mark in that span. He graduated from Evansville in 1981 with a degree in Health/Physical Education. The New Jersey Americans of the American Soccer League drafted Hempen in 1980.

Hempen got his start in the coaching profession as a graduate assistant at Northeast Louisiana before assuming full-time assistant duties at Centenary College in Shreveport, La., where he served three years prior to his start at Duke.

He was an assistant coach on the Blue Devil men's team from 1986-1991, compiling a 78-36-7 overall record and 16-16-4 ACC slate. In those six seasons Duke advanced to three NCAA Tournaments, winning the NCAA Championship in '86 with a 1-0 victory over Akron in Seattle.

He married then-Duke assistant coach and 1990 Colorado graduate Stephanie Poncher in 1999. The couple has an 11-year-old daughter, Emma, and a 9-year-old son, Lucas.

ASSISTANT COACH CHRIS GNEHM

University of Colorado head women's soccer coach Bill Hempen added Chris Gnehm (Geh-nem) to his coaching staff on Monday, May 9, 2011, as the top assistant for the program.

Gnehm comes to Colorado after nine successful seasons as an assistant women's soccer coach at Florida Atlantic University, a member of the Sun Belt Conference. He was the Owls top assistant the last three seasons and served as the goalkeeper coach from 2002-07.

In Gnehm's past position, he played a key role in directing an excellent FAU defense. In 2006, the Owls led all NCAA Division I teams in shutout percentage (.762), holding opponents scoreless in 16 of 21 matches. A year later, FAU's second year in the Sun Belt, the team posted nine shutouts and allowed just 15 goals.

His collegiate coaching career started at his alma mater, Averett (Va.) University, where he was an assistant coach from 1996-98. He then became the assistant coach for the men's soccer program at Monmouth (N.J.) University from 1998-99 before heading to Ferrum (Va.) College to be the head men's soccer coach as well as a women's tennis coach from 1999-2001. In addition to his coaching credentials, he led the Soccer Plus Goalkeeping School (Wethersfield, Conn.) during the summer of 1995. He is a member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America

Gnehm earned a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1997 from Averett, where he was a four-year starter at goalkeeper and team captain from 1993-96. He still holds Averett's school record for most saves in a single season (1996) and career saves (1992-96).



Gnehm is originally from Bayville, N.J., graduating from Central Regional High School where he earned first-team all-state soccer honors as a senior in 1992. During his free time, Gnehm participated in nearly 60 commercials as an actor/model from 1979-1988. He helped promote products such as Cracker Jacks, Nike, Colleco Vision, Cheetos, Life Cereal and Jell-O Pudding. He also appeared in print ads for Wrangler Kid, Gravy Train and FAO Schwartz.

ASSISTANT COACH TRACY CHAO



Tracy Chao will begin her fourth season as assistant coach for the Buffaloes. Chao came to CU from Northern Colorado where she was an assistant coach for three years under head coach Tim Barrera.

During Chao's time at UNC, the Bears were undergoing a reclassification from Division II to Division I. Her first season as assistant coach was in 2005 when the Bears were Division I independent. In her second season (2006) the Bears joined the Big Sky Conference but were not able to participate in post-season competition.

Chao's third season at UNC was a very successful one for the Bears as it was the first time they were eligible for post-season play. Chao helped her team to third in the regular season giving the Bears their first appearance in the Big Sky Tournament, and becoming the first team in school history, in any

sport, to reach the Big Sky Tournament Championship.

In 2007, five members of the squad were named to the All-Big Sky Team and three were selected to the Big Sky All-Tournament Team. The Bears also earned recognition for their achievements in the classroom earning the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Academic Award by sporting the highest grade point average of any team in the league.

At the collegiate level, Chao was a standout player at Wake Forest University under head coach Tony DaLuz, and helped lead the nationally ranked Demon Deacons to a 49-31-6 record and four-straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1999-2002.

The defender turned goalkeeper earned MVP honors as a sophomore and became the first ACC goalkeeper to ever shutout the eventual 2000 National Champions, North Carolina. For her efforts in the 1-0 win over UNC, Chao was named to Soccer America's Team of the Week and was also crowned ACC Player of the Week on Oct. 30, 2000. Chao returned back to the defense as a junior to wrap up her playing tenure with Wake Forest.

Chao was a member of the W-League's Carolina Dynamo from 2000-02 and once residing in Colorado, she served as the team captain for both the Mile High Edge in 2006 and the Ft. Collins Force in 2007.



A Raleigh, N.C. native, Tracy Chao was born on Aug. 10, 1981 in Raleigh. Prior to playing at Wake Forest, she captained her club team, the '81 CASL Raleigh Spartan Spirit, which she led to the 1993 and 1996 state championships.

A starter on the North Carolina State Select team, Chao participated in the Olympic Development Program from 1995-98 and was a member of the Region III Pool team in 1997. In prep play, the all-state defender was named Region 6 Player of the Year, Tri-Seven Conference Player of the Year, and was a three-time all-region and all-conference selection at Wake Forest Rolesville High school.

A 2003 recipient of the Brian Surette Soccer Writer's Award, Chao graduated from Wake Forest University with a bachelor's degree in sociology and holds a master's degree in sport administration from the University of Northern Colorado.

Her hobbies include playing golf and snowboarding as well as hanging out with her Golden Retriever Chaco.

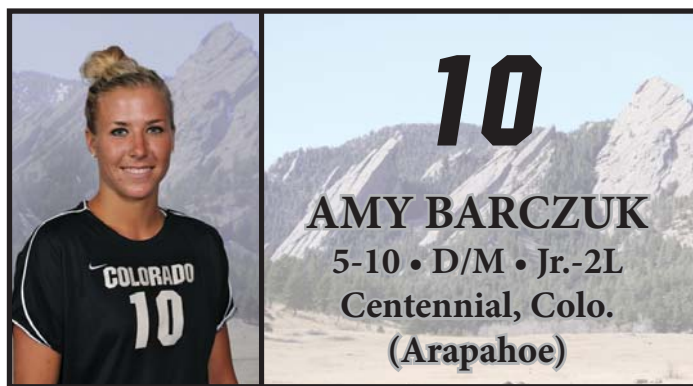

HEMPEN ON BARCZUK: "Amy is just a stud. I don't know how else to say it. She practices so hard and strives for perfection that there's no way we can't have her on the field. I think she is probably going to see a good amount of time at center-back because when we lost Kelly Ross, we didn't know what we lost. Kelly anchored it a lot for us last year and it might be Amy's job this year, but she's going to have a lot of freedom in the attack for us."

SOPHOMORE (2010): Found her role as one of CU's leaders on the field during her second season in Boulder. She played in all 20 of Colorado's matches logging 18 starts playing a whopping 1,822 minutes, Kate Russell was the only other Buff to see more minutes in 2010. Barczuk finished the season with five points off two goals and an assist while tying Russell with the most shots attempted (41). Her two goals of the season came in



consecutive home wins against Kansas (2-1) and Nebraska (2-1). Barczuk's assist was on CU's lone goal in the 2-1 loss at Oklahoma, a Russell score 2:44 into the contest. Her 41 shots rank 10th on CU's offensive class list for sophomores.

FRESHMAN (2009): Barczuk was the only freshman to start all 19 of CU's games. She logged the second most minutes played with 1,607, and she scored one goal while attempting 16 shots on the season. She contributed one of the eight CU goals against St. Mary's when she was on the receiving end of a corner kick for the seventh goal in the 8-1 win over the Gaels. Barczuk's

stellar freshman season performance was rewarded with spots on the 2009 All-Big 12 Conference second team and the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.

HIGH SCHOOL: Barczuk lettered three years in soccer at Arapahoe High School. She led her team to the state semifinals as a sophomore and senior, and to the quarterfinals as a junior. Barczuk was named second-team All-League as a sophomore, and earned first-team All-league, 5A All-State and All-Colorado selections as a senior.

On the club side, Barczuk played for the Riverside Renegades and helped them to three State Cup Championships in 2003, '04 and '08, and they went on to the regional semifinals in 2004 and quarterfinals in 2009. Despite her team dropping the State Cup final match in 2009, Barczuk was still crowned the State Cup MVP for the tournament. From 2001-08, Barczuk and the Renegades compiled an impressive 210-45-41 record and were league champions (Premier I, Elite) nine out of 12 seasons. Barczuk was also a member of the 2007 Colorado Olympic Development team, and she was selected for the 2007 Region IV pool and eventually landed a spot on the regional team. Her Region IV team competed against three other regions at the 2008 Inter-Regional Camp, where she saw action on both the U-17 and U-19 teams. A dual-sport athlete, Barczuk also excelled on the basketball court, lettering four years and wrapped up her prep career as a McDonald's All-American Finalist. She was a three-time all-state honorable mention and first-team all-league selection, and was all-league second team as a freshman. A heavily recruited athlete in both sports, Barczuk was recognized with the 2008 Sportswomen of Colorado "All-Around" Award. She was a member of the National Honor Society and was a first-team Academic All-State selection at AHS.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Barczuk is a business major at CU.

PERSONAL: Amy Barczuk was born on October 28, 1990 and is the daughter of Mark and Lynn Barczuk of Centennial, Colo. She has one sister, Sarah. Her grandpa played basketball for the University of Detroit and her great uncle was a member of the Brooklyn Dodgers baseball team. When she's not playing soccer, Barczuk enjoys traveling and playing basketball.

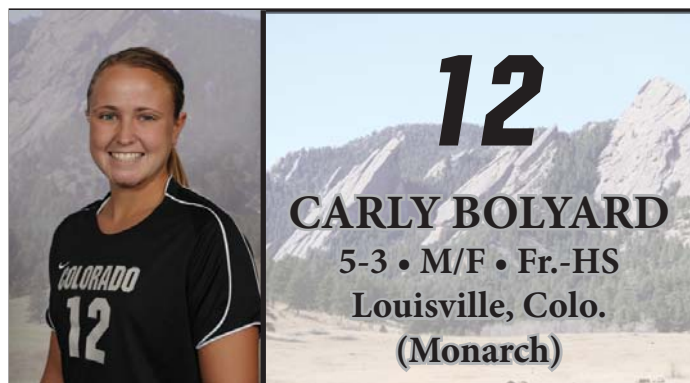

SOPHOMORE (2010): Bricker played in every game her sophomore year making 12 starts. She logged a total of 1,133 minutes scoring one goal for two points. She attempted 21 shots on the season with 14 on goal. Her only goal of the season was the game-winner against Nebraska lifting the Buffs over the Cornhuskers 2-1 at home.

FRESHMAN (2009): Bricker played in 18 games and started 14 of them at forward for the Buffs. She led CU in assists with four on the season. She made her collegiate debut during the home opener against Oklahoma State on Aug. 22 and notched her first career start against Illinois. Bricker recorded her first assist on the third goal against St. Mary’s. Bricker was one of two CU freshmen to be named to the 2009 Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.

JUNIOR (2010-REDSHIRT): Perry was one of three transfers to join the team in 2010. She served as a reserve goalkeeper and did not see action in any matches for the Buffs, thus using her redshirt year and maintaining two years of eligibility remaining.

AT ST. LOUIS UNIVERSITY (2008-09/Fr., Soph.): Perry started every game during her freshman and sophomore seasons at St. Louis University. She recorded 121 career saves and 18 shutouts while holding an 18-14-7 record during her two seasons. Russell scored two goals right off the bat, notching the team's first goal of the season in the 1-1 tie against No. 20 Florida and then netting the game-winner in the 3-2 come-from-behind victory over Texas Tech in the Big 12 Conference opener. Russell led all Buffs in assists with seven on the season, ranking her at No. 7 in the Big 12. Her seven assists are also good for the second-most in a season in the history of the Colorado soccer program, becoming the only freshman ever to do so. With just one season under her belt, Russell is only one assist away from cracking the top-10 career records list.

HIGH SCHOOL: Russell was a four-year letter-winner at Silver Creek High School under coach Sara Friend. As a team captain in her senior campaign, Russell led her prep team to the state championships in 2008. She was named first-team all-conference all four years and is a three-time first-team all-state selection. 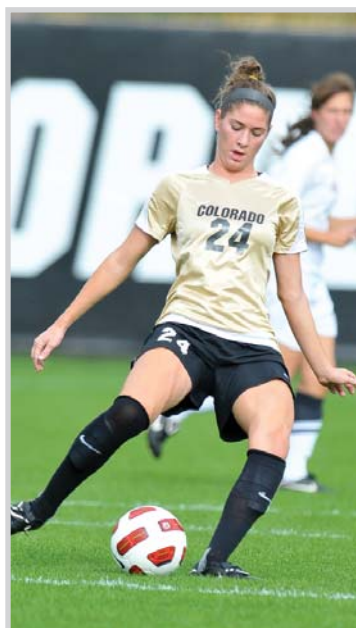

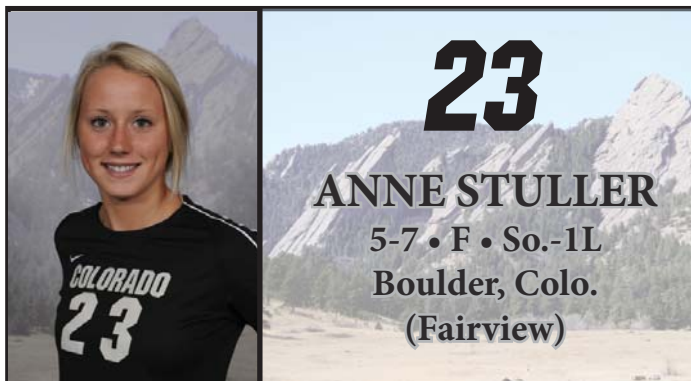

2010 IN REVIEW



The Buffs kicked off their 2010 season shutting out the first two opponents 2-0. On Aug. 22, CU welcomed the Wyoming Cowgirls to Prentup Field for its home opener. Freshman Annie Brunner found her spot as CU's starting goalkeeper, a position she held for the entire season. Senior Kym Lowry led the team scoring the first goal of the game off an assist from Caroline Danneberg. Lowry later assisted the Buffs' second goal that was scored by Shaye Marshall. Just two days later, the Buffs strung together an almost identical performance beating the University of Northern Colorado 2-0.

Lowry scored the first goal of the game off an assist by Danneberg, and senior Amanda Foulk stepped up to score the second goal as Lowry was credited with the assist.

The Buffs traveled to Denver to take on their in-state rival in the Denver University Invitational. The Pioneers scored early before Hayley Hughes evened the score on an unassisted goal in the 38th minute. DU scored its game-

winner in the 90th minute off a penalty kick giving the Pioneers a 2-1 advantage and the Buffs their first loss of the season. CU dropped its second game of the DU Invitational, falling to UNLV 4-2. Colorado took the lead early at just 6:17 into the first half as Lowry and Kassidy Fitzpatrick worked together to assist Alex Dohm's first goal of the season. UNLV scored its four goals before Taryn Vitacca secured her first career goal on a penalty kick with just two minutes remaining.

Colorado traveled to Spokane, Wash. to compete in the Gonzaga University Tournament Sept 10 & 12. The Buffs suffered its first shutout (2-0) to host Gonzaga. CU regained its confidence and beat Washington State 2-1 in overtime in its second match of the tournament. Hughes scored for CU off an assist from Russell, but the Cougars evened the score just under a minute after the Buffs first goal. The score remained tied 1-1 after 90 minutes of regulation sending the game into overtime. Russell tallied her second assist of the night after setting up Fitzpatrick who scored the game-winner in the 91st minute of play.

CU returned to Boulder with a 3-3 record to host its home tournament, the Omni Hotels Colorado Soccer Classic. The Buffs fell to Purdue 3-1 in their first contest. Foulk scored the first goal of the game early, but the Boilermakers managed three more. The Buffs continued to struggle to score in the next match against No. 10 UCLA, but they came out ahead 1-0 after 108 minutes of action. Freshman Lizzy Herzl stepped into a new position at forward and scored the lone-goal of the game to lift the Buffs over the Bruins. Russell and Lowry assisted on the goal.

CU traveled to College Station, Texas to take on No. 6 Texas A&M in its first Big 12 Conference matchup of 2010. Just over three minutes into the game, Russell scored for CU off an assist

by Hughes. The Aggies evened the score at 1-1 where it remained for the rest of regulation. Identical to the previous win for CU, Herzl took control and blasted the ball into the goal at 98:28 to give the Buffs their first ever win in College Station, Texas and their second win of the season over a top 10 competitor. Fitzpatrick was credited with the assist on Herzl's goal.

Despite the two consecutive upsets the Buffs recorded, CU fell into a scoreless drought for the next four matches. Colorado played Texas to a scoreless tie at home on Sept. 26 after 110 minutes of play. The Buffs then traveled to Texas Tech

and Baylor but fell 1-0 on both occasions. Missouri visited Prentup Field on Oct. 8, and the Buffaloes continued to struggle on the offensive end of the field as they fell 1-0 to the Tigers.

After 425 minutes of being held scoreless, Marshall found the goal off an assist by Russell to tie the game 1-1 against Iowa State, but Colorado's offense wasn't finished. Russell scored the game-winner and Lowry tapped in another goal to cushion a 3-1 win with assists from Fitzpatrick and Dohm.

On Oct. 14, CU traveled to Oklahoma State to play on a national stage with Fox Soccer Channel televising the contest. OSU scored two goals before the Buffs found the back of the net just after halftime on a Fitzpatrick goal assisted by Russell. CU tied the game as Danneberg assisted a Marshall goal in the 58th minute. The Cowgirls struck again just over a minute later to secure a 3-2 win. The Buffs finished their trip to Oklahoma in Norman, where they fell 2-1 to the Sooners. Russell scored the first goal of the game just 2:44 into the contest. OU responded with two goals of its own, and the Buffs failed to score again.

A last minute addition to the schedule gave the Buffs a chance to improve their record as Seattle visited Prentup Field on Oct. 23. Hughes kicked off the scoring and Seattle evened the score at 1-1 where

it stood through two 10 minute overtime periods giving the Buffs their second tie of the season.

As KU scored its first goal just 18 seconds into the contest on Oct. 25 at Prentup Field, the Buffs knew they had to do something to get the win they needed to make it to the postseason. Amy Barczuk tied the game for CU at 74:20 sending the game into overtime. Anne Stuller scored first in the overtime period off an assist by Foulk giving CU a 2-1 win.

Colorado beat Nebraska 2-1 in the final regular season Big 12 matchup at Prentup Field. Barczuk and Erin Bricker scored the first two goals giving the Buffs a 2-0 lead over the Cornhuskers. Vitacca assisted on the first goal. NU managed to score but the Buffs secured the win.

Only the top eight teams in the Big 12 get to move on to the postseason Big 12 Championships in San Antonio, Texas, and CU's win over Nebraska made them eligible for the tournament as the eighth seed. The Buffs were paired with Texas A&M in the first round. Both teams were held scoreless through 110 minutes of play sending both teams into a shootout with five attempts each in order to decide who moved on. The Aggies beat CU 5-4 eliminating the Buffs from the tournament. CU ended its roller coaster of a season with an 8-9-3 record overall

COLORADO SOCCER IN THE BIG 12 CONFERENCE

The 2010 season wraps up Big 12 Conference play as Colorado moves to the Pac-12 Conference starting prior to the 2011 season. Colorado was a charter member of the Big 12 Conference which began in 1996. CU soccer holds a 69-66-14 all-time record within the conference. The Buffaloes won the 2003 Big 12 regular season championship, and have made a total of six NCAA Tournament appearances. Twenty-six Buffaloes have earned All-Big 12 awards and 56 have been named to the league's all-academic team.

PRENTUP FIELD

Prentup Field, located on the East Campus of the University of Colorado at Boulder, has been the home of Colorado Soccer since 2003. The field had been the home of the now-obsolete Colorado baseball team before the women's soccer team took over.

Prentup combines the very best of what Boulder has to offer, with beautiful Colorado mountain views and a lush pitch courtesy of CU's turf management team.

The Buffaloes have always enjoyed great home advantages in Boulder. CU formerly played its matches at Pleasant View Soccer Complex in North Boulder. This facility had an award-winning field for CU to play on and nine surrounding fields for training.

During that time, the Buffaloes compiled a home record of 50-28-5, a winning percentage of .633. The Buffs also played host to over 3,000 fans on Sept. 2, 1998, when they hosted then-defending national champion North Carolina.

Upon the arrival of coach Bill Hempen, the Buffs started training at Prentup in the spring of 2002 while it was still a baseball field.

In the spring of 2003, the soccer team was granted exclusive use of Prentup, and work began to re-landscape the field. All remnants of the baseball field except for the outfield fence were razed, and the turf began a major makeover.

Prentup Field is now a 160,000 square foot facility that contains a 120x75 yard game field along with a practice area. It is a native soil field and is equipped with an automated irrigation system. When the irrigation was installed and the field was graded in July of 2003, the turf management team produced a playable soccer facility from seed in just 33 days.

Each week, the field is painted and mowed 3-4 times in preparation for matches and practices under the supervision of Ryan Newman, along with a collection of other maintenance practices.

The Buffs trained at Prentup from 2002-04, and finally in the fall of 2004, they played their first-ever match there, defeating Northern Colorado by a score of 3-0 on October 1, 2004. In 2005, Prentup became CU's full time home, with the Buffaloes posting a record of 7-1-0 in their first full season and an all-time mark of 43-13-5.

Capital improvements to the facility are ongoing. An athletic department fund-raising campaign in the summer of 2005 helped raise funds to put in bleachers for 1,200 people, a new scoreboard, nets behind the goals and iron entrance gates adorned with the CU logo into the venue. Additional funds in advance of the 2006 NCAA Tournament added more bleachers, bringing the seating capacity of Prentup Field to 2,000 people.

While there are bleachers for 2,000, fans of CU soccer bring lawn chairs and blankets to sit on as well in the open areas, continuing some of the community feel of Pleasant View at the current home.

In the fall of 2007, Prentup and the Buffs welcomed top-ranked Stanford to Boulder and dropped a 1-0 heartbreaker to the Cardinal in front of a facility record 3,128 fans, shattering the previous record by 1,257 people. Colorado has also had the privilege of hosting back-to-back NCAA Tournament first and second rounds in 2006 and 2007, welcoming 1,871 fans against Colorado College in '06 and 1,843 against No. 2 Portland in '07.

Prentup Field has been home to University of Colorado athletics for almost 40 years, as the venue is named after former CU baseball coach Frank "Chief" Prentup. The field, formerly known as Varsity Field, was renamed

after the former coach in 1978. The complex remained a popular venue until the varsity baseball team was removed in 1980.

The field was used by several different entities within Colorado athletics after 1980. The club baseball team played there, and CU's mascot Ralphie was even known to have taken practice runs there.

The complex is located just west of CU's Potts Field track & field complex and ski building. Amenities for Buffalo soccer fans include concessions, rest rooms and free parking and game programs.

- Donna Holyman led the Buffs with six goals, four assists and a total of 16 points on the season.
- Keeper Sloane Cox recorded 133 saves, one shutout and six wins during her first season for Colorado in the net.

1998 Milestones

- Colorado opened the season with a 2-0 loss to 1997 national champion North Carolina in front of a school record 3,000 fans.
- With 36 saves in one weekend, including a school record 19 against BYU on Sept. 11, Sloane Cox became Colorado's career saves leader with 189 (passing Nina Bjornstad who had 158).
- Shawn Kenyon became the first Buff to record 100 shots with No. 100 coming against Utah on Sept. 13.
- CU earned their first ever win in a Big 12 Conference opener with a 3-0 win over Oklahoma on Oct. 2.
- Cox notched the first ever point for a CU goalkeeper with her assist of Jessica Wollow's second goal on Oct. 2 vs. Oklahoma.
- CU ran into its program-worst losing streak with the fifth consecutive loss to Denver 1-0 on Oct. 18.
- With a 6-0 loss to Missouri, the final game of the season, Cox finished her career as the holder of every Colorado goalkeeping record. In addition to her 200th save of the season, Cox also recorded the 333rd save of her career, and had six shutouts.
- Sloane Cox was named to the All-Big 12 second team, the first player in CU soccer history to be named All-Conference.
- Cox was also named Big 12 Athlete of the Week for September 2 (first player in program history to earn the honor) and CU Athlete of the Week for November 1.
- Teri Fildey was named TCI Student Athlete of the Week for September 5.
- Five players were named to the Academic All-Big 12 first team: Fildey, Cartmell, Matassa, Kenyon, Pascoe.
- Melissa Cartmell led the Buffs offense with 50 shots, six goals, two assists and 14 points.
- Assistant coach Kim LeMere was inducted into the University of Hartford's Alumni Hall of Fame on April 17.

- Hempen earned his first win at Colorado with the 2-1 decision over Wyoming on Sept. 2.
- Hempen coached his milestone 300th career game vs. Missouri, however the Buffs fell 2-0 in the match.
- Colorado bounced back from a 10 game winless streak with a win over Colorado College 1-0 on Oct. 21. The win also ended a four-game scoreless streak that dated back to Oct. 7 at Oklahoma.
- When Hempen cleared his bench and substituted the entire field late in the first half vs. Kansas, he set a program mark for most players in a game as the Buffs played 24 by the final buzzer.

- The Buffs scored 17 goals by 12 different players, the most players to get in the goal column in the program's history.

- Fran Munnely was named to the Big 12 Soccer 10th Anniversary Team.
- Five Buffs earned All-Big 12 Honors. Fran Munnely was named to the First Team for the fourth consecutive year. Katie Griffin, Laura Munnely and Allison Kidd were all named to the second team. Nikki Keller was a Big 12 All-Newcomer selection.
- Going into the Big 12 Tournament, Colorado was tops in the conference in defense, leading the league in league play in goals allowed (eight), goals against average (0.78), and shutouts (six).
- CU advanced to the NCAA Division I Soccer Tournament and moved past the first round with a shootout win over UC Riverside on Nov. 12. The Buffs dropped their second round game 3-0 to UCLA, who went on to the finals.

- Fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament bid and second straight year playing host to the first and second rounds in Boulder.
- Colorado recorded 10 wins on the season for the sixth straight year.
- Five Buffaloes were named to All-Big 12 Teams.
- Colorado played No. 1 ranked Stanford on Friday, Sept. 21 and the Buffs welcomed a school record 3,128 fans. Head football coach Dan Hawkins and the football team were also in attendance. The record-breaking crowd topped the previous record at Prentup Field by 1,239 people, set last year in the first round of the NCAA Tournament against Colorado College. The all-time record, before the Buffs played No. 1 North Carolina in front of an even 3,000 fans at Pleasant View Soccer Complex.
- CU shut out its opponents on 10 different occasions, marking the fourth time in the history of the program that they have recorded nine or more shutouts in a single season.
- Nikki Marshall's goal against Oklahoma, just 27 seconds into overtime, was the quickest overtime goal in program history, besting the previous mark of 91:06, set by former Buff Melissa Cartmell in 1998, by 39 seconds. Michaela DeJesus' goal in the Utah game came just 52 seconds into the match, going down as the quickest goal in the 11 year history of the program, shattering the previous record of 1:33 set by Jen Almquist vs. Hawai'i in 1996 by 41 seconds.

- CU earned its sixth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance as a No. 4 seed.
- Colorado recorded 14 wins on the season for just the third time in program history.
- A record high eight Buffaloes were named to All-Big 12 Teams.
- Off the field, six Buffs were named to the All-Big 12 Academic teams.
- On Aug. 29, CU beat Texas Tech 3-2 which started the second longest winning streak in program history with eight consecutive games.
- The Buffs recorded the most on-the-road-wins with six for only the second time in school history since the 2003 season.
- CU shut out its opponents on 15 different occasions, marking the most shutouts in a single season in the history of the program.

2009 Milestones

- As the third seed, Colorado made it's eighth-straight appearance in the Big 12 Championship.
- Nikki Marshall owns CU's all-time top scoring spot with 93 points off 42 goals and 9 assists in her four years as a Buffalo.
- Marshall tied her previously set CU record of scoring our goals in one match against Oklahoma on Oct. 2.
- The Buffs' eight goals against St. Mary's is the most scored by a CU offense in program history.
- Marshall scored CU's first goal against St. Mary's in just 23 seconds, which is a school record for the quickest goal made. Just one game later, Marshall set another school record after scoring the gamewinner in the 109th minute against Denver to secure a 1-0 double-overtime win for the Buffs. This is the latest goal scored by a Buff since extra time was shortened to 10 minutes a period in 1998.
- Head Coach Bill Hempen tallied his 100th program victory with the 5-1 win over Oklahoma.

PAC-12 CONFERENCE

Conference History

The roots of the Pac-12 Conference date back over 95 years to December 2, 1915, when the Pacific Coast Conference (PCC) was founded at a meeting at the Oregon Hotel in Portland, Ore. The original membership consisted of four schools - the University of California at Berkeley, the University of Washington, the University of Oregon, and Oregon State College (now Oregon State University). All still are charter members of the Conference.

Pacific Coast Conference play began in 1916 and, one year later, Washington State College (now Washington State University) was accepted into the league, with Stanford University following in 1918.

In 1922, the PCC expanded to eight teams with the admission of the University of Southern California (USC) and the University of Idaho. In 1924, the University of Montana joined the league roster, and in 1928, the PCC grew to 10 members with the addition of UCLA.

The Pacific Coast Conference competed as a 10-member league until 1950, with the exception of 1943-45 when World War II curtailed intercollegiate athletic competition to a minimum. During that time, the league's first commissioner was named. Edwin N. Atherton was commissioner in 1940 and was succeeded by Victor O. Schmidt in 1944. In 1950, Montana resigned from the Conference and joined the Mountain States Conference, essentially replacing Colorado, which left for the Big 7 two years earlier. The PCC continued as a nine-team conference through 1958.

In 1959, the PCC was dissolved and the Athletic Association of Western Universities was formed and Thomas J. Hamilton was appointed commissioner of the new league. The original AAWU membership included California, Stanford, Southern California, UCLA and Washington. Washington State joined the membership in 1962, while Oregon and Oregon State joined in 1964. Under Hamilton's watch, the name Pacific-8 Conference was adopted in 1968. In 1971, Wiles Hallock took over as commissioner of the Pac-8.

On July 1, 1978, the University of Arizona and Arizona State University were admitted to the league and the Pacific-10 Conference became a reality. In 1986-87, the league took on a new look, expanding to include 10 women's sports. Thomas C. Hansen was named the commissioner of the Pac-10 in 1983, a role he would hold for 26 years until 2009. Hansen was succeeded by current commissioner Larry Scott, who took on the new role in July 2009.

During the 2010-11 academic year, Scott helped deliver monumental changes that transformed the conference into a modern 12-team league by adding the University of Colorado and the University of Utah. The addition of CU and Utah led to an agreement to equal revenue sharing for the first time in conference history, created two divisions (North and South) for football only, established a football championship game for the first time ever, secured a landmark media rights deal that dramatically increased national exposure and revenue for each school and established the Pac-12 Network and Pac-12 Digital Network that guaranteed enhanced exposure across all sports.

Colorado accepted its invitation to join the Pac-12 on June 11, 2010, as the Buffaloes were the first domino to fall in a change of the national landscape which saw Nebraska also leave the Big 12 and join the Big 12, Boise State leaving the WAC for the Mountain West, TCU leaving the MWC for the Big East, and then on June 17, Utah agreed to join CU to make it an even dozen in the Pac-12. Big-time rivals for the first half of the last century, the Buffaloes and Utes officially became the 11th and 12th members of the Conference on July 1, 2011, the first additions to the league since 1978. During the 33 years between expansions, Pac-10 teams claimed 258 NCAA titles (130 women's, 128 men's).

At present, the Pac-12 sponsors 11 men's sports and 11 women's sports. Additionally, the conference schools are members of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) in four other men's sports and three women's sports. CU will participate in the MPSF in men's and women's indoor track, and already competes in the Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association (RMISA) in skiing, which is a coed sport.

The Pac-12 Conference offices are located 25 miles east of San Francisco in Walnut Creek, Calif.



Conference of Champions

Built on a firm foundation of academic excellence and superior athletic performance, the Conference ushers in a new era with the additions of the University of Colorado and University of Utah, officially becoming the Pac-12 Conference on July 1, 2011.

The Pac-12 rises above the rest, upholding its tradition as the "Conference of Champions", claiming an incredible 180 NCAA team titles over the past two decades, including nine in 2010-11, averaging nearly nine championships per academic year. Even more impressive has been the breadth of the Pac-12's success, with championships coming in 27 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-12 has led the nation in NCAA Championships in 45 of the last 51 years and finished second five times.

Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletics achievements, the Pac-12 was the first conference to reach 400 championships in 2010-11. With the inclusion of CU and UU, league teams have captured 442 NCAA titles (302 men's, 140 women's), outdistancing the next closest conference by nearly 200.

In 2010-11, the then-Pac-10 led the country with nine NCAA titles, with men's and women's programs sharing the wealth as the Conference claimed five NCAA women's titles and four men's crowns.

Including titles previously won by Colorado and Utah, Pac-12 members have won 302 NCAA team championships on the men's side, 89 more than the next closest conference. Men's NCAA crowns have come at a phenomenal rate for the Pac-12: 16 basketball titles by six schools (more than any other conference), 52 tennis titles, 44 outdoor track & field crowns, and 26 baseball titles. Pac-12 members have won 25 of 42 NCAA titles in volleyball, 37 of 42 in water polo, and 22 in swimming & diving national championships.

Individually, the conference has produced an impressive number of NCAA men's individual champions, as well, boasting 2,019 individual crowns.

On the women's side, the story is much the same. Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships 30 years ago, Pac-12 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season on 22 occasions, including 2010-11. Overall, the Pac-12 has captured 140 NCAA women's titles, easily outdistancing the SEC (second with 77). Pac-10 members have dominated a number of sports, winning 23 softball titles, 19 tennis crowns, 13 of the last 21 volleyball titles, 14 of the last 22 trophies in golf, and 12 in swimming and diving.

Pac-12 women student-athletes shine nationally on an individual basis, as well, having captured an unmatched 616 NCAA individual crowns, an average of nearly 21 championships per season.

Colorado and Utah have combined to win 15 coed skiing titles, one of three NCAA sports to score championships based on men's and women's results along with fencing and rifle. Combined, the newest Pac-12 entrants have 27 NCAA crowns and 148 individual champions in the sport.

BIG 12 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS

In 2003, when Jen Thais said in a preseason press conference that her season goal was, "to make the NCAA Tournament and to be nationally recognized. What I'm hoping... what I'm expecting, is to surprise people," little did she know what kind of impact that prediction would have on the eighth team in Colorado soccer history... and the nation for that matter.

A record breaking season was approached in four phases. Phase I were the preseason exhibition games where the Buffs shutout Northern Colorado 4-0 and Air Force 3-0.

Phase II consisted of CU's non-conference schedule where the Buffs came out virtually unscathed at 7-1. In the season opener, they held defending national champion and then-No. 2 Portland scoreless for 87 minutes before suffering a 1-0 defeat. The Buffs would regroup and close out the remainder of the non-conference season 7-0, beating teams by a 17-2 scoring margin. It was during Phase II that CU picked up its first-ever win against a top-10 ranked opponent when it handed then-No. 9 Denver a 3-0 blanking, just days after the Pioneers had upended Portland.

Enter Phase III... the Big 12 Conference season. The Buffs came away from the '03 season 8-1-1, the crescendo of the season being a 3-1 win over nemesis Nebraska in the season finale for both teams in below freezing temperatures on a pitch covered in ice. Colorado's 25 season points was the fourth highest in league standings history. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Buffs came away with the coach, player and rookie of the year, a first-team All-Big 12 pick, three second-teamers and five of their nine newcomers named to the All-Newcomer team.

With 25 school single-season, class and career records shattered, Colorado entered the final phase of the season, Phase IV... the postseason. They went into the eighth Big 12 Conference Tournament as the No. 1 seed for the first time in program history, and a week later the Buffs entered their first NCAA Tournament as just one of 16 seeded teams.

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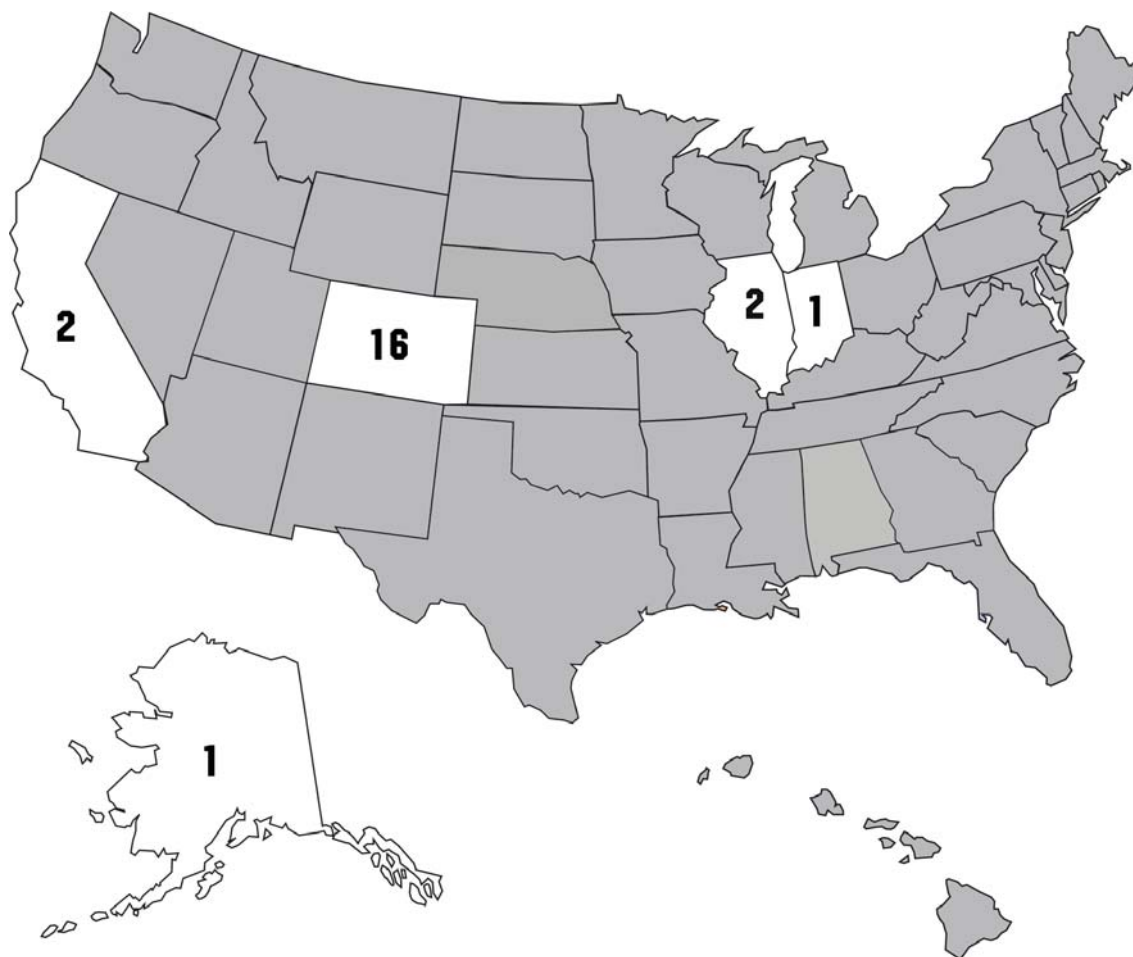
