# 2011 IN REVIEW



CU started its season strong with shutouts in both games of the inaugural Colorado Cup. The Buffs blanked Colorado College 5-0 on Aug. 19, with the first goal coming in the second minute from freshman Carly Bolyard, assisted by junior Amy Barczuk. Later in the half, Bolyard assisted Hayley Hughes to give the Buffs a 2-0 lead. CU sealed the deal in the second half with goals from Anne Stuller (Caroline Danneberg), Lauren Shaner and Darcy Jerman (Bianca Jones). Colorado once again found its offense groove winning 3-0 against Northern Colorado on Aug. 21. Freshman Clare Madden

connected with senior Kate Russell to put the Buffs on the board right before the break. CU's next goal was a team effort, scored by Hughes and assisted by Stuller and Danneberg. Jerman, assisted by Shaye Marshall, sealed the win for the Buffs at the 80:54 mark.

The Buffs' home opener on Aug. 28 against Wyoming was a close one. The first half was scoreless, but the Cowgirls found the net in the 53rd minute. The Buffs were unable to answer and fell 1-0.

Once again the Buffs fell in a close, late-scoring match-up, this time at Purdue on Sept. 2. The Boilermakers scored in the 63rd minute, and Colorado dropped the game, 1-0.

Russell gave the Buffs an early lead against No. 17 Illinois in their Sept. 4 meeting. Illinois tied the game at the 50:25 mark, but a successful penalty kick by Barczuk helped the Buffs reclaim the lead. Unfortunately for the Buffs, it didn't last long, with the Fighting Illini scoring two goals in less than three minutes to give them a 3-2 win.

Colorado saw its final instate competitor Denver on Sept. 11. The Buffs were dealt their fourth straight one goal loss, coming up short, 1-0. Denver scored in the seventh

minute, and neither team was able to score for the remainder, leading to a win for the Pioneers.

The Buffs got another taste of victory at the DU Invitational from Sept. 16-18. Colorado gave a strong effort against No. 22 Auburn. After two overtimes, the teams tied 2-2. Barczuk earned the first goal for the Buffs in the 29th minute. After Auburn tied things up at 1-1, Danneberg put CU back on top. In the 66th minute, Auburn found the net once more, but neither team was able to take the lead in extra time. Colorado got its third win of the season in a 2-1 decision against California State University Bakersfield. Both teams only scored in the first half, but Colorado's two early goals would be all the Buffs needed. Barczuk hit her second penalty kick of the season to give the Buffs the early lead. Marshall, assisted by Russell, hit the gamewinner in the final nonconference game of the season.

Colorado entered new territory as they began play in a new conference. Their first opponent in the Pac-12 was Oregon State, a team they had never faced before. The Buffs got a taste of the physicality of the Conference of Champions on Sept. 23 in a hard-fought 2-0 loss. CU couldn't control Chelsea Buckland, who scored both of the Beavers' goals.

Next up for the Buffs was a trip from the Arizona schools. It took two overtimes to call the game a 2-2 draw against the Wildcats on Sept. 30. Colorado came from behind to take a 2-1 lead behind Anne Stuller's unassisted goals. In the 85th minute, Arizona tied the game, which could not be broken in extra minutes. Two days later, the Buffs fell 1-0 to Arizona State. Annie Brunner had two saves and Kate Russell saw time in the net, but team couldn't find its offensive stride.

The Buffs then took their first trip to the Pacific Coast to face opponents in Washington. On Oct. 7, the Buffs got on the

board against the Huskies, but once again lost by a single goal, 2-1. Stuller found the net for the Buffs in the 22nd minute, but a second half surge by Washington gave the Huskies the win in the teams' first meeting. Against Washington, Brunner tied a season-high six saves, and Kayla Millar had one of her own. But foul issues got the best of the Buffs, and the team fell 4-0.

CU went on a scoring streak in its next three games. Oregon held onto an early lead in their Oct. 16 visit. Kate Russell, assisted by freshman Storie Ledger, scored at the 75:26 mark. The Buffs couldn't erase the deficit in the closing minutes, and lost 3-1.

Oct. 21 went down as one of the biggest days in Colorado history. A road trip to No. 15-ranked California marked not only the first win for the CU soccer team in the Pac-12, but also the first conference win for any CU Division I team in 2011. Cal outshot the Buffs 20-10, but CU hit the shot that mattered most in the 62nd minute, as an unassisted Hayley Hughes hit the game winner in the 1-0 decision. Kayla Millar had six saves in her first start of the season.

The Buffs had another big test on the road on Oct. 23 against No. 1 Stanford. The Buffs put one in the net via a penalty kick by Kate Russell, but came up short 4-1 against the eventual NCAA Champions.

CU was blanked in its final homestand of the season against UCLA and Southern California. On Oct. 28 the Bruins were on fire, lighting up CU 8-0. The game was scoreless for the first half on Oct. 30 against USC. The Trojans scored their sole goal in the 59th minute, and the Buffs were never able to answer.

Colorado ended its season on the road against Utah, whom they held a 6-1 record against. For the eighth time in 19 games, the Buffs lost by one goal, this time a 2-1 loss on Nov. 4.

The Buffs finished their first season in the Pac-12 tied for 11th in the conference with a 4-13-2 overall record and an impressive 2-0-1 record on neutral ground.

# **CHANGES FOR COLORADO SOCCER**

2011 marked the first season for Colorado in the Pac-12 Conference. Previously, Colorado was a charter member of the Big 12 Conference, which was formed in 1996. CU soccer holds a 69-66-14 all-time record within the Big 12. Twenty-six Buffaloes have earned All-Big 12 awards and 56 have been named to the league's all-academic team. 2011 was also Bill Hempen's last year as Colorado soccer's head coach. In his 11 years with the Buffaloes, Hempen posted a 114-88-28 overall record, including six NCAA appearances and the 2003 Big 12 regular season championship.
