

2014 COLORADO BUFFALOES



In 2013, the University of Colorado women's soccer team matched a program-best finish with a trip to the NCAA Sweet 16. The Buffaloes will look for continued success in their fourth season in the ultra-competitive Pac-12 Conference and their third under head coach Danny Sanchez. Nine newcomers will join 18 returning letterwinners to compete in three tournaments, including the fourth annual Colorado Cup, and face five opponents who received votes or ranked in the top 25 of the NSCAA Final Post-Season poll.

WHO'S RETURNING: The Buffs return 18 letterwinners, including seven starters. Four of the team's top five scorers return, led by sophomore Brie Hooks, who recorded 18 points off eight goals and two assists in her debut season. All but two goal scorers will be returning to the Buff attack, while defenders Alex Huynh and Heather Ward will help protect the net for a new goalkeeper. Six seniors will provide leadership on and off the pitch.

WHO'S GONE: The team bids farewell to six players, including four senior starters. Forward Anne Stuller had one of the best senior campaigns in program history, setting single season records with 93 shots attempted and 53 shots on goal, while scoring nine goals and contributing eight assists. The defense also takes a hit, with shot blocker Lizzy Herzl and 2013 co-captains Hayley Hughes and Annie Brunner all graduating from CU. In her final season, Brunner grabbed 87 saves, recorded a 1.11 goals-against average and helped the Buffs to nine shutouts. Taylor Thurmond and Sydney Carlson, who played a combined 35 minutes last season, will not be returning in 2014.

WHO'S NEW: CU welcomes eight newcomers - six freshmen and three transfers. West Coasters Courtney Fedor, Joss Orejel and Jenna Reeves look to make an early impact in the defensive unit, while Arizona's Nancy Best and Broomfield, Colo.'s Brittney Stark will add a scoring presence in the midfield and on the attack, respectively. The Buffs also add goalkeeper Scout Watson from Overland Park, Kan. Three players will continue their collegiate careers at Colorado. Aussie Kahlia Hogg (Florida State) and Colorado native Morgan Stanton (Santa Clara) help add depth to the midfield, and goalkeeper Kate Scheele (Colorado College) will support a young backline.

FORWARDS: Following a freshman season for the record books, Brie Hooks will continue to be a dominant force on the attack. Juniors Madison Krauser and Emily Paxton also have success in finding the back of the net, combining for 10 goals and nine assists in their first two seasons. Tori Cooper and Ashley Love both transition to the attack, while Hannah Dearborn, Storie Ledger, Nikki Machalek and newcomer Brittney Stark all look to make a scoring impact.

MIDFIELDERS: Seniors Darcy Jerman and Carly Bolyard will be key to the CU midfield. The duo combined for four goals and two assists in 2013. Olivia Pappalardo also adds experience, starting 13 of 16 games in her second season, while adding a goal and two assists. Alyssa Herwatt and Mikaela Kraus look to further contribute in their sophomore seasons. In her debut, Herwatt score a goal and played in 22 games. Joining the midfield are transfers Kahlia Hogg and Morgan Stanton and freshman Nancy Best. Hogg played in 18 games, including four NCAA Tournament games, in two seasons



at Florida State and was a member of the U-17 and U-20 Australian Women's National Team. Stanton played in seven games as a freshman at Santa Clara and has been a member of the U-14 to U-20 USWNT Player Pools.

DEFENDERS: Veteran back Bianca Jones will serve as a leader for the Buffs' defense. The senior has played in 61 games, and in addition to her defensive presence, has also contributed two goals and two assists. Junior Heather Ward played in 20 games and scored her first goal in 2013. Alex Huynh was the only CU freshman to start all 23 games and contributed three assists in her debut season. Brooke Rice saw action in 16 games in her first season at CU and will transition to defense in her senior season. Freshmen Courtney Fedor, Joss Orejel and Jenna Reeves will all look to help fill the void left by Lizzy Herzl and Hayley Hughes.

KEEPERS: In her senior season, Annie Brunner solidified herself as one of the best goalkeepers in CU history. Three Buffs will look to fill Brunner's cleats in 2014. Sophomore Kenzie Tillitt is the only keeper with experience in CU's net, playing 25 minutes in two games last fall and minding the net in every spring outing. Colorado College transfer Kate Scheele comes to CU with two years of Division I experience. Scheele started 32 games at CC, posting a 19-6-7 record. As a sophomore, she recorded an impressive 0.77 goals-against average. Freshman Scout Watson of Overland Park, Kan. will also compete for the job. Watson had a strong prep career, helping her team to the 2013 state and regional championships.

THE SEASON: The 2014 schedule will feature 13 home games and three tournaments. The Buffs will face five opponents who received votes or ranked in the top 25 of the NSCAA Final Post-Season poll. In its third year, the Pac-12 Networks will air 69 women's soccer games, including nine of the Buffaloes' match-ups.

The Buffs kick off their season with the fourth annual Colorado Cup. This year's Cup will see a few changes, with the inclusion of Colorado State, who added women's soccer last season. CU will play all three of its Cup matches at Prentup Field. Colorado will open the tournament against CSU on Friday, August 22 and continue play against UNC on Sunday, August 24. Both games will be broadcast on the Pac-12 Networks.

CU next makes a trip to Las Vegas for the UNLV Invitational. The Buffs begin the trip against host team UNLV, whom the Buffs defeated 3-1 in the 2013 Omni Hotels Colorado Women's Soccer Classic. The Buffs will then face a brand new opponent in Kent State on Friday, August 29.

The Buffs next return to Prentup for a six-game home stand. The Buffs begin the home streak on Friday, September 5

against former Big 12 rival Kansas. The two teams have not met since CU left in the Big 12 Conference after the 2010 season. The Buffs hold a 9-6-1 series advantage over the Jayhawks, winning in their last three meetings.

CU then takes on Detroit on Sunday, September 7. The teams have met just once prior, a resounding 3-0 home win for CU in 2005.

The Colorado Cup concludes on Friday, September 12, as the Buffs host last year's tournament champion, Denver. The in-state rivals met twice last season, with the Buffs earning their first win over the Pioneers since 2010 with a 1-0 win in the first round of the NCAA Championship.

The Buffs conclude non-conference play against two fairly fresh faces in the Omni Classic. On Friday, September 19, CU will face another new opponent: Bryant. CU will take on San Francisco for the first time since 2008 (and just the fourth time overall) on Sunday, September 21.

CU ends its home stand as it opens Pac-12 Conference play, with a match-up against California on Saturday, September 27.

The Buffs then head west for five conference games. The trip begins in Los Angeles, with CU taking on USC on Friday, October 3 and reigning NCAA Champions UCLA on Sunday, October 5. The Buffs then head to the Northwest for games against Oregon State and Oregon on October 10 and 12, respectively. CU takes its final trip of the season on Thursday, October 16 to face perennial Pac-12 threat Stanford.

The Buffs return to Boulder to conclude the regular season with five home games. First up, CU hosts Washington State on Friday, October 24 and Washington on Sunday, October 26. After travelling to Arizona for two consecutive seasons, Arizona State and Arizona will return to Prentup for the first time since 2011, the Buffs' inaugural season in the Pac-12. The Buffs face the Sun Devils on Friday, October 31 and the Wildcats on Sunday, November 2.

Colorado concludes the regular season against conference rival Utah. The teams take the pitch on Friday, November 7.



HEAD COACH DANNY SANCHEZ



Danny Sanchez enters his third season as the head coach of the University of Colorado women's soccer team. He was named the third head coach in the history of the program on December 19, 2011.

In two seasons with the Buffaloes, Sanchez has led the team to a 22-15-6 overall record and several program firsts. In his first season, the Buffs opened the season with a record-

setting three straight shutouts on their way to a 3-0-2 start, marking the first time CU began the season on a five-game unbeaten streak. The team shattered those new records the following year, beginning the season with five straight shutouts and six wins.

It took Sanchez just eight games to record five wins with the program, faster than either of his predecessors. Sanchez has helped the Buffs to an astounding 16-3-2 non-conference record. In 2013, he gave the Buffs a strong home field advantage with an 8-2 record at Prentup Field, with their only two losses coming at the hands of teams ranked No. 2 in the nation.

The Buffs have also improved in conference play under Sanchez. In 2012, CU earned its first back-to-back Pac-12 road victories with shutouts over USC and Arizona. Last season, the Buffs continued their success, doubling their conference wins, and earning their first Pac-12 home victories with back-to-back wins over Oregon State and Oregon.

From September 6 all the way through to the post-season, Colorado received votes in the weekly NSCAA/Continental Tire poll. CU capped a stellar 2013 campaign with its first 14 win season and NCAA appearance since 2008. The Buffs matched their best post-season finish, defeating No. 15 Denver and No. 19 BYU on their way to the Sweet 16.

Sanchez has continued to help the Buffs to academic excellence, with 13 players earning Pac-12 All-Academic honors and the team earning back-to-back NSCAA Team Academic Awards for averaging a 3.0 grade-point average. Additionally, Hayley Hughes has earned academic honors from both CoSIDA and the NSCAA, while Lizzy Herzl became the first Buff to receive NSCAA Scholar All-America honors.

He has coached two players to professional careers. In 2012, Amy Barczuk became just the second Buff to be drafted by a professional team, getting chosen by the Western New York Flash in the second round of the inaugural National Women's Soccer League Draft. In her rookie season, Barczuk and the Flash went all the way to the championship game. After graduating in 2013, Annie Brunner signed a professional contract with FC Neunkrich of the Switzerland Nationaliga A.

Sanchez's career spans 20 years with Wyoming, Metro State and Mesa Community College, where he coached both men's and women's programs. He has amassed a 289-75-29 record, including a pair of NCAA Division II National Championships while at Metro State.

In his time away from the Centennial State, Sanchez spent four seasons with the University of Wyoming, compiling a 36-34-11 record. In his final season with the Cowgirls, the team posted a 12-6-4 record, its best in school history, including a 3-1-2 record in Mountain West Conference play for a third-place regular season finish. That season, Sanchez was named the MWC Coach of the Year.

After a 0-3 start, Wyoming allowed just 12 goals in its final 19 games, with one of its wins including a 1-0 decision against Colorado in Boulder. In the MWC tournament, the Cowgirls defeated TCU and San Diego State before falling to New Mexico in the championship.

Sanchez gave the Cowgirls their first winning record in four years, going 9-8-3 in his second season with the team. He

> coached eight All-Mountain West Conference performers and all four of his teams were recognized with the NSCAA Team Academic Award.

Before joining the Cowgirls, Sanchez spent six seasons as the head women's coach at Denver's Metro State College. He posted an impressive 128-11-7 record (a .901 winning percentage) with the Roadrunners, where he won Division II national titles in 2004 and 2006 and reached the Final Four in 2002 and the Elite Eight five times. Sanchez and the Roadrunners also claimed five Midwest Region Championships.

At Metro State, the Roadrunners won the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (RMAC) championship, and advanced to the NCAA Division II Tournament all six seasons he was at the helm. He was also named the RMAC's Coach of the Year all six years. Sanchez was the 2004 NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year, a four-time NSCAA Midwest Region Coach of the Year and was named the RMAC's All-Time Top Coach.

In his time at Metro State, the Roadrunners established two of the most impressive records in Division II history: a 59-game unbeaten streak (58-0-1) and 61 consecutive home wins. MSCD produced two Division II National Players of the Year and 14 NSCAA All-Americans in his tenure.

Prior to taking over at Metro, Sanchez served as the head men's and women's soccer coach at Mesa (Ariz.) Community College from 1995-2002. In eight seasons, he led the women's

team to a 103-15-5 (.858) overall record and the men to a 96-36-7 (.716) mark, producing 12 All-Americans in that span between the two. The women won four National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Region I Championships and five Arizona Community College Athletic Conference (ACCAC) Championships. In 2001, he was the ACCAC and NJCAA Region I Men's and Women's Coach of the Year, as well as the NSCAA Junior College Central Region Coach of the Year. He also won the NJCAA Region I Women's Coach of the Year award in 1996 and 1999.

Sanchez has also been very active in coaching around the Rocky Mountain region. He has served as a staff coach and licensing instructor for the Colorado State Youth Soccer Association and has worked as a coach for U.S. Youth Soccer Region IV staff. Sanchez holds a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) «A» License, a USSF National Youth License, an NSCAA Advanced National Diploma and a KNVB Dutch Advanced Certificate.

After graduating from Scottsdale's (Ariz.) Coronado High School, where he lettered in soccer, football and baseball, he began his collegiate career at nearby Mesa CC. Later, he transferred to the University of Connecticut and led the Huskies to the 1989 Big East Conference Championship and an NCAA Tournament berth, ranking in the New England Region's top 10 in scoring that season. Following his collegiate career, he played in the Western Soccer League for the Arizona Condors and in the U.S.I.S.L. for the Arizona Cotton.

Sanchez earned a bachelor's degree in economics from Connecticut in 1991. He and wife Beth, a physical education teacher, have two sons, Cole (14) and Drew (11).

Jason Green enters his third year as an assistant soccer coach at the University of Colorado. He serves as the Buffaloes' goalkeeper director.

In his first two seasons with the Buffs, he helped the team to a 22-15-6 combined record and its best defensive starts in program history. In 2012, the Buffs set a record with three shutouts at the start of the season. In the next, the Buffs shattered that record by shutting out their way to nine total clean

their way to nine total clean

In just his second season with the team, Green helped the Buffs to their first 14 win season and NCAA Tournament appearance since 2008. The Buffs eventually matched their best post-season finish, defeating back-to-back ranked opponents on their way to the Sweet 16.

As the goalkeeper director, Green has helped the net minders to a combined goals-against average of 1.10 or better. Green's work has solidified Annie Brunner as one of the program's best keepers. In his two seasons working with Brunner, her stats drastically improved in every category. Her GAA went from 1.69 in 2011 to 1.11 in 2013 and her save percentage increased from .635 in '11 to .770 in '13. Brunner also more than doubled her total saves from 40 in 2011 to 87 in 2013. With Green's assistance, Brunner claimed two Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week honors and earned a spot in the top five of every career goalkeeping statistical category at CU.

"Because of Jason's complete understanding of the game, he brings a refreshing perspective to goalkeeping," Brunner said. "Too many coaches these days focus on just the technique of our position and end up losing sight of the bigger picture – keeping the ball out of the net. While those coaches end up criticizing your every move, Jason uniquely understands that with repetition and feedback I'll make the most progress. He offers advice based off his knowledge of field player behavior combined with goal-keeper technique, which together elevate my understanding of the position and help me to perform my best on game day."

Prior to joining the Buffs, he was an assistant for Danny Sanchez at the University of Wyoming. In Green's four year tenure at Wyoming, the Cowgirls were 36-34-11. He helped coach 18 Academic All-Mountain West Conference and nine Conference Scholars. In 2011, he helped coach the Cowgirls to a school record 12 wins and the program's first ever spot in the MWC Tournament championship game.

At Wyoming, Green brought the goalkeeping position to a new level, as almost every record was broken while he was training the goalkeepers. Under Green's tutelage, Courtney Merkle ended her collegiate career ranked at the top of school season and career record books for GAA and minutes played. Merkle also ranks second all-time in saves.

Green was also on Sanchez's staff at Mesa Community College and the duo has worked together on a number of club teams and summer camps.

He has held two high school head coaching jobs, the first at Skyline High School in Mesa, Ariz., and the second at Chandler (Ariz.) High School. Green was named Region Coach of the Year at both posts and at Chandler his teams won three straight NSCAA National Academic Awards.

In his 16 year coaching career in college, high school and club soccer, Green has coached five state championship teams, six region champions, four district champions and five conference titlists.

He was mentored by Aidan Davison, a former goalkeeper in the English Premier League and the first team coach in the English Premier League.

"Having worked with Jason I have seen firsthand the quality he brings to the program, he has an added dimension of understanding the goalkeeping role and the requirements of the position," Davison said. "Jason is a bright young coach with a big future." Green holds a United States Soccer Federation "A" License and a USSF National Goalkeeping License. He also has attended the Manchester United Coaches Symposium.



Green started his collegiate playing career at Mesa C.C. under Sanchez where they were ranked as high as second in the nation. He continued his career at Grand Canyon (Ariz.) University, where he helped lead the team to a No. 2 national ranking and to the championship game of the California Collegiate Athletic Association Tournament.

He earned his bachelor's in physical education from Ottawa (Ariz.) University in 2003 and completed his master's in physical education from Arizona State University in 2008.



ASSISTANT COACHES



Don Trentham enters his third season as an assistant soccer coach at the University of Colorado. Trentham also serves as the Buffs' recruiting coordinator.

In two seasons, Trentham has helped lead the Buffaloes to a 22-15-6 overall record. Tallying just three shutouts and a goals-against average of 1.95 in 2011, the Buffs' defense has shown vast improvement under Trentham's tutelage the past two

seasons, recording 17 shutouts and GAAs under 1.10.

It took just two seasons under the new coaching staff for the Buffs to return to the NCAA Tournament (their first appearance since 2008), matching their best post-season performance with a trip to the Sweet 16. By season's end, CU recorded nine clean sheets, tying for fifth best in program history.

Prior to joining the Buffs, he spent the 2011 season on Danny Sanchez's staff at the University of Wyoming, helping the Cowgirls to a 12-5-4 record and the program's first ever spot in the Mountain West Conference Tournament Championship game.

Trentham joined Sanchez's staff after spending nine successful seasons as the head coach at Montana State University Billings (2002-10). He coached the Yellowjackets to an overall record of 85-75-10 and finished his career at MSUB as the winningest coach in the program's history.

In 2010 he was named the Great Northwest Athletic Conference Coach of the Year after guiding MSUB to its first-ever NCAA tournament bid, where the Yellowjackets defeated Cal State-Los Angeles in the first round. In 2006 he led his team to a No. 1 ranking in the NSCAA/Adidas Regional Poll and No. 8 in the NSCAA/Adidas National Poll.

During his tenure with the Yellowjackets, he coached 31 All-Conference selections, three Academic All-Americans, two GNAC Freshmen of the Year and one NCAA Woman of the Year.

From 2004-08, Trentham also served as the Director of Soccer Programs at MSUB. His duties included supervising both men's and women's programs as well as chairing a steering committee responsible for planning \$1.25 million in facility improvements to Yellowjacket Soccer Field and securing over \$470,000 in pledges toward those improvements.

Prior to his time with the Yellowjackets, Trentham served as a graduate assistant women's soccer coach at East Stroudsburg (Pa.) University in (2001-02). He also served as an assistant men's soccer coach at Embry-Riddle (Fla.) University (1999-2001).

In addition to his collegiate coaching experience, Trentham also has excellent experience coaching youth soccer. Most recently, he served as an assistant coach for the WAFC U-23 team out of Westminster, CO, helping the squad capture the 2014 Colorado Youth Soccer State Championship. He also served as the head girls' coach of the Magic City Soccer Club in Billings from 2006-2010, leading the team to six Montana Youth Soccer State Championships. He was also heavily involved with Montana ODP (2003-2005) and served as a Region IV ODP staff coach (2004-2005).

Trentham holds a USSF National Goalkeeping license, a NSCAA Advanced National Diploma and a USSF "A" license.

He played soccer at Columbia (Mo.) College where he earned his bachelor's degree in education in 1999. Trentham earned his master's degree in education in health and physical education from East Stroudsburg in 2007. Trentham is married to the former Jennifer Lawler. They have three-year-old son, Landon, and are expecting a baby girl in October.





ASSISTANT COACHES



After wrapping up a stellar collegiate career at the University of Colorado, Amy Barczuk has returned to her alma mater to serve as a volunteer assistant coach for the 2014 soccer season.

"We are very excited to add Amy to our staff," CU head coach Danny Sanchez said. "Her experiences as a Buff and being a current professional player in the best league in the world have

numerous advantages for us. We want players in our program that strive to play at the highest levels and Amy can show them the roadmap to get it done."

During her time at Colorado, Barczuk recorded 23 points off 10 goals and three assists. She is one of only eight players in program history to start at least 76 of 78 games played, and one of four Buffs to have played in every one of the team's games in her four-year collegiate tenure. Barczuk ranks in the all-time top 12 in games played and started and shots attempted.

Barczuk received multiple honors at CU. As a freshman, she earned a spot on the Big 12 All-Newcomer team. The following season, she was an All-Big 12 Second Team selection. Her junior season, the Buffs' first in the Pac-12 Conference, she was an all-conference honorable mention. She had a stellar senior season, serving as the team captain and earning spots on the All-Pac-12 Second Team and the NSCAA All-Pacific Region team. She was also a USWNT U-23 Training Camp selection and a member of the U-23 player pool.

She shined in the classroom, graduating from CU in 2013 with a business degree. She was selected to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll in back-to-back seasons and was an Academic All-Big 12 First Team selection in 2010 and an Academic All-Pac-12 honorable mention in '11 and '12.

Barczuk was selected by the Western New York Flash in the second round (the 14th overall pick) of the 2013 National Women's Soccer League draft. In her rookie season, she saw action in seven regular season games. The Flash claimed the regular season title and ended its season with a runner-up finish at the inaugural NWSL championship game, where Barczuk made her fourth professional start. Now in her second season in the NWSL, Barczuk has played in 16 of the Flash's 22 games.

"My time with the Flash these past two years has been a great experience," Barczuk said. "It is awesome to be able to play with some of the best players in the world. I am also incredibly humbled to be able to represent the University of Colorado in the NWSL."

Before joining the Buffs, Barczuk had a successful prep career at Arapahoe High School. She led her team to the state semi-finals as a sophomore and senior, and to the quarterfinals as a junior. Barczuk was named second-team All-League as a sophomore, and earned first-team All-league, 5A All-State and All-Colorado selections as a senior. On the club side, Barczuk played for the Riverside Renegades and helped them to three State Cup Championships, one regional semifinal and one quarterfinal. Despite her team dropping the State Cup final match in 2009, Barczuk was still crowned the State Cup MVP for the tournament.



Barczuk also excelled on the basketball court, lettering four years and wrapping up her prep career as a McDonald's All-American Finalist. She was a three-time all-state honorable mention and first-team all-league selection, and was all-league second team as a freshman. A heavily recruited athlete in both sports, Barczuk was recognized with the 2008 Sportswomen of Colorado "All-Around" Award.

Born on October 28, 1990, Barczuk is the daughter of Mark and Lynn Barczuk of Centennial, Colo.

Rebekah Patrick is in her second season as the University of Colorado soccer Coordinator of Performance Analysis and Camp Operations. Previously, she worked as a volunteer assistant coach at CU.

Patrick has a wealth of international playing and girls' coaching experience. Since 2011, she has been an assistant coach for the Sant Gabriel U-14 girls' team. She travelled to Spain and Sweden for the team's competitions in Sant Gabriel, the Donosti Cup and the Gothia Cup. Before suffering a season-ending ACL injury, Patrick was a key contributor for Sant Gabriel's Superliga team. Patrick also worked as an assistant coach for the Colorado Rapids Women's League and Super 20's.

She has worked as a coach during CU's youth soccer camps since 2011. She also has experience with futbol academy camps at her alma mater, California State University, Fullerton.

Patrick has worked as an assistant coach for many girls' teams including the Orange Junior Soccer Club U-15 and U-17 teams during the 2006-07 season.

Patrick has an amazing playing resume, spanning collegiate, international and Women's Premier Soccer League/USL W-League play.

In international play from 2007-10, Patrick started and played all games for both Euromat L'estartit and Prainsa Zaragoza of the Superliga. She led the latter to the third round of Copa Del Reina and helped coach the team's U-12 girls' team.

Patrick has played for five different WPSL or USL W-League teams. She was a first-team All-Conference selection twice and was named to the W-League team of the week four times during her time with the San Diego Sunwaves, where she made the playoffs, and the Colorado Force.

In 2009, she helped lead the Pali Blues to W-League division and national championships. Previously, she was the team captain of San Diego United where she was an All-Pacific team selection and also helped coach the club's U-11 team. From 2004-06, she was seventh overall in points (15) with the Las Vegas Tabagators, earning two offensive MVP awards and becoming an All-Stars and first-team Western Division selection.

She began her collegiate career in 2002 at the University of Portland, where she helped the Pilots to a 20-4-2 record, a West Coast Conference championship and a Division I national championship.

Next season, she helped Lassen College (Calif.) to a 23-1 record and a spot in the national championship. She led the state with 83 points (33 goals, 17 assists) and was a NSCAA All-Region and first-team All-American selection.

She finished her collegiate career at California State University, Fullerton. With the Titans, Patrick won back-to-back Big West Conference regular season championships and made an NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2005. That year she was also a Big West honorable mention selection.

Patrick holds a USSF "C" license and is fluent in Spanish. She earned her bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Cal State Fullerton in 2006.





2013 Pac-12 All-Academic Honorable Mention

JUNIOR (2013): Bolyard was an important part of the Buffs' strong Pac-12 Conference and post-season performances. She played in all 23 games, making 15 starts, starting all of the Buffs' final 10 games. Bolyard recorded three points off nine shots and four shots on goal. She came off the bench to assist CU's third goal in their 4-0 stomping of St. Mary's. She was the difference maker in Colorado's 2-1 upset of No. 19 BYU in the NCAA Round of 32. Bolyard netted the game-winner in the 34th minute, helping the Buffs to an early 2-0 lead and an eventual spot in the Sweet 16 for just the second time in the history of the program. For her post-season heroics, she was named a CU Athlete of the Week.

SOPHOMORE (2012): Bolyard played in 15 games, making three starts. She took three shots, all in consecutive games against Northwestern, Denver and Cincinnati. She played a season-high 68 minutes against Oregon State (0-2) before a knee injury sidelined her for the remainder of the season.

FRESHMAN (2011): Bolyard was the only freshman to start 18 of her 19 games played. In 1,158 total minutes, she made 22 shots, nine of which were on goal. The highlight of her season came in the very first game, a 5-0 shutout against Colorado College in the Colorado Cup. She helped the Buffs to the win with one assist and the game-winning goal. She was the only freshman to hit a game-winner in the 2011 season. Bolyard played a season-high 110 minutes in the Buffs' 2-2 match against Auburn on September 16.









HIGH SCHOOL: A three-year letter-winner at Interlake, Fedor helped lead the team to the 2011 2a Washington State Championship, where she and the Saint Bernard defense allowed zero goals throughout the entire state tournament. As a sophomore, Fedor contributed four assists, helped Interlake to a 17-3-1 record and earned second-team All-King County honors. 



FRESHMAN (2013): Hooks had one of the strongest debuts in Colorado history. She became the first Buff to record multiple goals in her debut, scoring two in CU's 3-0 shutout of Northern Colorado. In her next game, she had her first game-winner, CU's lone score in a 1-0 win over Colorado College. Hooks next had game-winners in back-to-back victories over St. Mary's and Alabama. Just three games later, Hooks recorded her fourth game-winner (which ties for fourth best in a single season at CU), notching the first goal in a 4-0 stomping of Stony Brook. In the next, she contributed an assist in a 3-1 win over UNLV, helping her to a spot on the Omni Classic All-Tournament Team. Hooks missed the team's first four conference games due to an injury, but got back to her scoring ways against USC, net-

ting a goal and contributing an assist in the 2-1 win over USC. An important part of the Buffs' attack throughout the season, Hooks was also key to their postseason run, drawing the foul that set up the game-winning goal over No. 15 Denver in the NCAA First Round. In CU's freshman offensive record books, Hooks concluded the season ranked third with eight goals and fourth with 18 points. Her 42 shots tied for eighth. Her eight goals also tie for eighth most in a single season at CU. Jerman joined CU's elite multi-goal club when she netted two goals against UNLV to help the Buffs to a 3-1 victory. Her two-goal performance garnered her a CU Athlete of the Week title and a spot on the Omni Classic All-Tournament Team. Jerman's third goal of the season was a big one. She scored off a PK in the 71st minute to force a 2-2 double overtime tie in a hotly contested battle against Arizona State.

SOPHOMORE (2012):

Jerman sat out the first four games of the season while recovering from a leg injury before playing in the remaining 16 games and making 15 starts. She headed in the game-winner in the 60th minute in the Buffs' 2-0 victory over Air Force. She played a season-high 96 minutes in back-to-back games to end the season against Arizona State and Utah.

FRESHMAN (2011): She led all freshmen on the team with two goals in her 16

games played, nine of which were starts. She scored both goals off of just three shots during the Colorado Cup, helping CU to wins against Colorado College (5-0) and Northern Colorado (3-0). Seven of her 17 shots were on goal, giving her a freshmen-best percentage of .412.

HIGH SCHOOL: She led her Cheyenne Mountain High School soccer team to the quarterfinals as a freshman and senior, and the semifinals her sophomore and junior years. Jerman led her team with 17 goals her senior season, and her outstanding play had her named to the All-Colorado girls' soccer team. She was also named the 4A Metro Player of the Year for 2011. Jerman was named 4A first-team all-conference each year while picking up an all-state second-team honor her freshman year and then two first-team all-state honors. Her junior year she was a first-team all-area selection

JUNIOR (2013): Jones started all 23 games of the season, totaling 1,990 minutes (the third most pitch time on the team). Jones played a key role in the Buffs' defense that shut out nine opponents and tallied a record-breaking five shutouts to begin the season. In addition to her strong defensive presence, Jones also found time on the attack, taking a career-high 10 shots while sending three on goal. She earned a point against Oregon State, contributing an assist to the gamewinning goal to help CU to its first ever home Pac-12 Conference win.

SOPHOMORE (2012): Jones started all 20 games, once again leading her class in minutes, totaling 1,838 on the season. She was an important part of the Buffs' backline, helping the Buffs to eight shutouts, including a record-setting three to start the season. Jones was also impressive at the net, scoring the first two goals of her career off just two shots. She put the Buffs on the board against then-ranked No. 3 UCLA (1-2) and scored the final goal in CU's 3-0 shutout of Arizona.

FRESHMAN (2011): She led freshman with 1,255 minutes played in 18 games (16 starts). Her one assist of the season was in her first collegiate game, a 5-0 win against Colorado College in the Colorado Cup.

HIGH SCHOOL: She had a standout senior year, both athletically and academically at Smoky Hill High School. Jones was named the Wendy's High School Heisman Winner, and made the Aurora All-City team and All-Conference first team for her play. In the classroom she was awarded the Faculty Award for Scholarly Accomplishments, named to the Academic All-State first team, and finished as an honor graduate (finishing in the top 5 percent) and honor roll student for 2011. Jones helped her Smoky Hill High School team to the Class 5A state quarterfinals her junior year. Following her junior season, she earned a firstteam all-conference mention, an academic all-state honor and was a first-team Aurora Sentinel All-City Girls Soccer selection. She was named second-team all-

The club won the Surf College Cup in 2011 and was victorious in back-to-back Surf Thanksgiving Cups ('09 and '10) and won three straight Surf Cups (2008-10). Kraus and the Surf were also Cal South National Cup semi-finalists in 2009 and '10.



SOPHOMORE (2013): Krauser followed up her strong debut with an impressive sophomore campaign. She played in all 23 games, starting all but two. Krauser tallied 14 points off four goals and six assists, while taking 39 shots and 19 shots on goal. Her assist total ranks fourth best by a CU sophomore, and her points and goals both rank in the top eight of that category. With eight assists in her career, Krauser already ranks in the all-time top 13 for assists. Krauser began her point-getting when she assisted the game-winner in CU's 1-0 overtime win over Alabama. In the Buffs' next game, she added three assists in a 4-1 victory over UT-Martin. Krauser joins Jen Thais (2004) as the only Buffs to record more than two assists in a single game. Just two matches later, Krauser netted a goal and added an assist in CU's 4-0 shutout of Stony Brook, earning a spot on the Omni Classic All-Tournament Team. Krauser's other points helped the Buffs to big wins and key ties. She scored first against Oregon State to help the Buffs to their first ever home Pac-12 Conference win, scored the Buffs' lone goal in a near-upset but eventual tie of then-No. 9 California and scored early to force a 2-2 tie against Arizona State. Her final assist came on the game-winner against No. 19 BYU in the NCAA Round of 32.



FRESHMAN (2012): Krauser proved to be a standout player in her first season. She was the only freshman to play in and start every game. She ranked second and third on the team in shots (35) and shots on goal (16). She also led all freshmen with six points. Her two assists came in the Buffs' home opener against LIU (2-0) and home closer against Utah (1-1). Krauser was also a force on the road, scoring twice in away games. Her first goal came at Northwestern, keeping the Buffs in the game that ended in a 2-2 tie and helping her to CU Athlete of the Week honors. Her second goal was the game winner at Wyoming, setting the pace for a 2-0 victory. Krauser's superb season also helped her to a spot on the Pac-12 Freshman Team.



In the Buffs' third match, she contributed two assists to help CU to a 2-0 shutout of Air Force. The two-assist performance was the first by a Buff since 2010. Just three games later, she scored her first collegiate goal, netting the game-winner in a 4-1 thrashing of UT-Martin. Pappalardo matched a season-high three shots against USC before a non-contact injury took her out of the game and ended her season.



FRESHMAN (2012):

Pappalardo showed versatility in her first season, playing a freshman-high 1,541 minutes. In 19 games, including 16 starts, Pappalardo took 16 shots, ranking second among freshmen. 

She scored her first goal of the season in the 78th minute of CU's 4-0 shutout of Stony Brook. In the next game, she took a season-high four shots in just 24 minutes playing time against UNLV. She was an important part of the Buffs' run to the Sweet 16, scoring the first goal against No. 19 BYU in the Round of 32 to help the Buffs to an eventual 2-1 victory.



FRESHMAN (2012): Paxton made an impressive debut, contributing an assist in the Buffs' season opener against Northern Colorado (3-0). Paxton played in 19 games, made three starts and tied for third on the team with two goals. She scored with just eight minutes remaining in regulation to send the Pac-12 home opener against Washington into overtime. In a tough 2-1 loss to defending NCAA Champions Stanford, Paxton gave the Buffs the upper hand right before the break.

HIGH SCHOOL: Paxton was a first-team all-state and all-division selection and earned Division 5a2 Player of the Year honors her senior year at Boulder Creek High School in Anthem, Ariz. That season she was the captain of the 16-4 Jaguars, and had 13 assists and a school season record of 33 goals. Paxton played club soccer with SC Del Sol out of Phoenix. The club won the 2012 state title and earned a bid to the Elite Club National League national championship. SC Del Sol also won a state title in 2010 and a Women's Premier Soccer League title in 2011. Prior to SC Del Sol, Paxton was a member of the Sereno Soccer Club, where she won six consecutive state titles. In 2009, the club won the Far West Regional League title and became a Region IV finalist.

A three-time Defensive Player of the Year, Scholar Athlete, first-team All-Century League selection and Principle's Honor Roll recipient, Reeves was key to Villa Park's transformation and steady growth. As a freshman, she scored two goals and contributed five assists as the Spartans posted a 4-15-3 record. The team quickly turned things around, more than tripling their win total in Reeves' sophomore season. That year, the Spartans went 17-6-4, and Reeves netted two goals and added seven assists. Her junior season, she had three goals and eight assists, helping Villa Park to a 19-6-5 record, while earning an AP Scholar Award. Reeves earned first-team All-Orange County honors and served as team captain during her junior and senior seasons. Reeves capped her high school heroics with first-team All-CIF honors. As a senior she was also named her team MVP and Villa Park's Female Athlete of the Year. In the IMG Academy 2014 Top 150 Rankings, Reeves was No. 101 overall, ranking No. 19 in Region IV and sitting as the 16th ranked defender. Reeves helped the So Cal Blues to Blues Cup Championships in 2011 and '13 and LV Players Showcase and Schwan's USA Cup V Elite Puma Showcase Championships in 2012. In 2014, the club competed at the ECNL National Championship. Reeves also has extensive ODP experience, as a member of the Cal South ODP 1995 summer/winter pool from 2009-12 and the Region IV pool from 2009-11 (she received an invite in 2012). With the ODP team, Reeves won Region IV Championships three straight years, from 2010-12, and the National Championship in 2012. She was also invited to the National Development Camp in 2010 and '11 and was named Region IV All-Tournament Second Team in 2010 and First Team in 2011.



Rice fell back into a stride late in the season, seeing game time in

all of CU's conference and post-season matches – tallying a shot against then-No. 9 California, USC and No. 19 BYU. In total, Rice played 850 minutes in 16 games and seven starts. She played a season-high 81 minutes in CU's 2-2 tie at Arizona State.

SOPHOMORE (2012 at SANTA CLARA): Rice played in 20 games and made four starts as Santa Clara advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament and earned a 12-4-6 record. Rice took 16 shots, half of which were on goal. Her first collegiate goal was the game-winner in the Broncos' 4-2 victory over the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.



FRESHMAN (2011 at SANTA CLARA): Appeared in six games as a freshman, taking two shots and sending one on goal.

HIGH SCHOOL: Rice had an active prep career. Her Utah Avalanche soccer club won the state championship three years in a row from 2008-10. They were also Surf Cup champions in 2009. SOPHOMORE (2013 at COLORADO COLLLEGE): Scheele had a standout season as a sophomore at CC. She helped the squad to Conference USA regular season and tournament championships. She was named to the C-USA First Team and earned conference defensive player of the week and C-USA Tournament Most Valuable Defensive Player honors. Scheele started all 22 of CC's games, spending just under 2,000 minutes in the net and posting a 15-4-3 record. The Tigers dropped three of their first five games (two of which were against ranked opponents), but didn't lose again until the end of conference play, helping them advance to the NCAA Tournament, where they fell in the first round to Duke in a shootout. Scheele improved in every area of play in her second year, allowing just 17 goals, for a goals-against average of 0.77, while grabbing 74 saves (and posting an .813 save percentage) and helping shut out a total of 13 opponents.

FRESHMAN (2012 at COLORADO COLLEGE): As a freshman, Scheele started 10 of her 12 games played, including the first five games of the season. She recorded four shutouts in 2012 and became the first CC freshman since 2005 to record back-to-back shutouts (against in-state rivals Denver and Colorado) to begin her career. She posted a 4-2-4 record, including a 2-2-1 mark in Conference USA play, helping the Tigers to the regular season title. Scheele made a season-high 10 saves at No. 5 BYU. At season's end, she ranked in C-USA's top 10 with four shutouts, a .333 shutouts per game average, a .790 save percentage and a 4.08 saves per game average.

During each of those four years, she also attended the Region IV camp. She was invited to the U.S. U-18 National Team training camp in 2012. Scheele was also a member of the W-League player pools for both the Seattle Sounders in 2012 and the Colorado Rapids in 2013.

PERSONAL: Kathryn Scheele was born on August 6, 1994 in Walla Walla, Washington. Her parents Leonard and Suzanne Scheele are both retired doctors of medicine. Her mother, who played water polo at Harvard, also works as a biomedical researcher. Scheele's father was a professional cyclist. Her brother Steve wrestled for Stanford and currently attends the University of Michigan Law School. When not playing soccer, she enjoys baking, reading, drawing and hiking. FRESHMAN (2013): Tillitt saw action in two games as CU's back-up keeper, totaling 24:36, allowing zero goals in that span. She helped hold CU's 4-1 victory over UT-Martin in the DU Invitational, and played a season-high 19:05 in CU's 3-0 loss at Washington State.

HIGH SCHOOL: A four-year letter-winner at Carson, Tillit excelled at every position on the pitch. The Cougars were back-to-back champions in both the Sierra League (2009 and '10) and the Northern Nevada Region ('11 and '12), while becoming state finalists for three consecutive seasons (2010-12). As a sophomore forward, the Cougars went 14-1-4 as Tillitt was named second-team All-State and won her team's golden boot award. Next season, Tillitt led the Cougars in assists in the midfield, helping her to first-team All-State honors and her team to an undefeated 16-0-4 record. In her senior season, Tillitt was her team's leading scorer with 20 goals. She was named the Cougars' MVP and the league's offensive player of the year. With five goals in a single match, Tillitt holds the CHS record. A two-time All-State Academic, Tillitt also proved herself with club and ODP teams. 

2013 IN REVIEW

The 2013 University of Colorado soccer season began as head coach Danny Sanchez's second and the Bufs' third in the Pac-12, but would end as something much bigger. The season would become record-breaking for the team and for its individual players. It would boast big wins and match a program-best finish.

The Buffaloes would win 10 total non-conference games (including two in the NCAA Tournament), lose just twice at Prentup Field (both times to teams ranked No. 2 in the nation), and post a 14-7-2 overall, 4-5-2 Pac-12 record, proving the surging Buffs were ready to make a statement amongst the nation's elite.

CU began what would be a historic season with statement wins over in-state rivals. The Buffs opened the 2013 campaign with the third annual Colorado Cup and their third straight 3-0 shutout of Northern Colorado in as many Cups. Two weather delays didn't damper CU's play as the Buffs held the Bears to just five shots and extended their perfect record against UNC, never losing a game or allowing a goal in seven meetings. The Buffs took the lead in the 21st minute off an own goal. In her debut in a Colorado kit, freshman Brie Hooks scored the final two goals to help the squad to victory.

Next up in Cup play was Colorado College. Hooks continued to shine, scoring off an Anne Stuller assist in the 53rd minute, leading the Buffs to a 1-0 shutout. Through six games in the three years of the Cup, CU has remained undefeated. Despite defeating their opponents a combined 4-0, Denver became the first team to take the trophy away from the Buffs, winning on a goals scored differential.

The Buffs continued play against Colorado competition with a home match-up against Air Force. Defense was the name of the game for 72 minutes, before Stuller took over on the attack, netting two goals in less than five minutes to give the Buffs a 2-0 win. With the shutout, CU tied the record it set in 2012 with three straight shutouts to start the season – a record that was about to be shattered.

CU kept up its strong play on both ends of the ball against St. Mary's College, defeating the Gaels 2-0. In just her fourth game at CU, Hooks had already raised her goal total to five on the season. She and Stuller continued to shine on the Buffalo attack, with Hooks scoring both her goals off Stuller assists. With her success in the midfield, Stuller became the first player since Kate Russell in 2010 to record at least two assists in a single game.

In an intense overtime battle against Alabama in the DU Invitational, the Buffs broke two records in one fell swoop. In the 85th minute, the Buffs broke the single-game program record with their 33rd shot of the game – edging out a record that dated back to 1996, the program's first season. It was the record-shattering 39th shot that was the game-changer, as Hooks connected with a long pass from Madison Krauser to give the Buffs the 1-0 win in the 97th minute. The game also marked the team's record-breaking fifth shutout to start the season.

Discontent with stopping at just two records, the Buffs made another big statement against UT Martin, defeating the Skyhawks 4-1 in the DU Invitational behind a Stuller hat trick. The Buffs didn't slow their attack, taking 30 shots, including 20 in the first half alone, good enough for third most in a single game in program history. Annie Brunner allowed her first goal of the season at the 21 minute mark, but the Buffs responded with a vengeance. First, Stuller rebounded her own penalty kick to tie the game in the 24th minute. Less than two minutes later, sophomore Olivia Pappalardo scored her first collegiate goal, assisted by Stuller and Krauser. Stuller put the game away in the second half, scoring two more goals in less than three minutes, both off Krauser assists. Stuller is just the second Buff to score a hat trick and just the third to score three or more goals in a single game. Krauser also became the second Buff to have three assists in a game. Though their shutout streak was put to an end, they extended their winning streak to a program best 6-0 – the best start in program history and the fifth longest unbeaten streak.

With the city of Boulder and the state of Colorado both in a state of disarray due to severe flooding, the Buffs' in-state rivalry game against No. 16 Denver was moved from Prentup Field to DU's CIBER Field. Both teams were off to program best 6-0 starts entering the game, but something had to give. Unfortunately for the Buffs, the game didn't go in their favor, as CU fell 3-0. DU just edged CU in shots (22 to 18) and shots on goal (eight to seven).

The Buffs quickly bounced back as they hosted the Omni Hotels Colorado Women's Soccer Classic to conclude non-conference play. CU continued to prove its strengths in both offense and defense, defeating Stony Brook 4-0 to open the tournament. The Buffs outshot the Seawolves 20-4, including eight to zero on goal. Hooks notched the first goal at 2:15 off a Krauser assist. Krauser was at it again, scoring off an assist from Alex Huynh to give the Buffs a 2-0 lead. The Buffs continued to spread the offense, with Emily Paxton and Stuller putting the game away in the second half.

Colorado concluded non-conference play by breaking another record. CU earned its program-best eighth regular season non-conference win with a 3-1 victory over UNLV. It was just the third time the Buffs won at least eight of their first nine games. CU held UNLV to just six shots, all coming in the second half. Darcy Jerman put the Buffs up 1-0 in the third minute, and Heather Ward, scoring her first career goal, added the insurance before the break. UNLV got on the board in the 77th minute, but in the 82nd minute, Jerman put the game away on a PK and became the third Buff to have a multi-goal performance in 2013.

Pac-12 Conference play began with a big challenge – the No. 2 ranked Stanford Cardinal. CU held Stanford scoreless for 56 minutes, but two second half goals gave the Cardinals the 2-0 win. A crowd of 1,504 fans helped keep the Buffs in the game, but the Buffs (missing Hooks due to injury) could only get two shots on goal against the well-rounded Cardinal.

CU rebounded with two big home wins – their first conference victories at Prentup since joining the Pac-12 in 2011. Against Oregon State, the teams combined for three goals in the first 14 minutes, but second half defense was key as the Buffs won 2-1. Offensive all-stars Krauser and Stuller both notched goals early for the 2-0 lead. OSU responded with a goal of their own less than a minute after the Buffs grabbed the two goal lead, but they could never find the extra gear to grab the tie or the lead.

Though she moved to defense in her senior season, Hayley Hughes was the one who lit an offensive spark for the Buffs against Oregon. Having defended one of Oregon's best players the majority of the game, Hughes also led the team with four shots, all on goal. In the 63rd minute, Hughes got the ball from 40 yards out and blasted it toward the net and into the corner to give the Buffs the 1-0 win – their 10th victory of the season.



A trip to Washington served as the Buffs' first true road test of the season. Their second away game of the year also marked just their third loss of the season. Though the Buffs led the conference in shots and corners, Washington State held CU to just nine shots and a season-low one corner kick. WSU's Cara Wegner scored in the fourth and 52nd minutes and the Cougars added insurance in the 58th to shut out Colorado 3-0.

The Buffs were hungry for a road win, and got it in their next match. Though Washington held CU to just one shot in the first half, the Buffs dominated the Huskies in the second, outshooting UW 12-5. Despite CU's increased pressure on both sides of the pitch, the game headed into overtime in a scoreless tie. In the 96th minute, Stuller booted a free kick from 20 yards out to the near post to give CU the 1-0 victory over the Huskies, putting UW's unbeaten conference run to an end.

The Colorado heroics continued into the Buffs' next road trip. Against No. 9 California, Krauser scored in the 67th minute. As the final minute of regulation

ticked down, the Buffs looked primed for the upset. Following a CU foul, the Golden Bears tied things up with just four seconds remaining in regulation. In overtime play, Cal outshot CU 6-1, but Brunner grabbed three more saves to add to her four from regulation to hold the 1-1 tie.

October concluded with the Buffs' final home games of the season. First up was Southern California. In a game that saw 34 total fouls and five yellow cards, the Buffs came out the victor behind goals by two freshmen. In just her third game back after being sideline by injury, Hooks was at it again, netting her eighth goal of the season in the 66th minute. Hooks continued to press the net, assisting Alyssa Herwatt to her first career goal in the 72nd. The Women of Troy attempted a comeback, but their lone goal with less than three minutes remaining wouldn't be enough.

CU faced stiff competition on Senior Day, forcing No. 2 UCLA into a defensive battle. Though the Buffs pushed a scoreless first half, the Bruins gained the upper-hand in the 56th minute, a lead that would hold through regulation. In front of the eighth largest crowd in the history of Prentup Field, CU ended its home season with an 8-2 record – its only losses to teams ranked second in the nation.

The Buffs concluded the regular season with a tough three-game road trip. First up was Arizona State, where in 2012, the Sun Devils edged the Buffs in the final 22 seconds of double overtime. In 2013, the Buffs held their composure against an aggressive attack (ASU was called for 15 fouls and earned five yellow cards) and discourteous crowd (the Sun Devil student section was thrown out of the game). CU got an early lead in the 15th minute when Krauser struck one past the keeper. ASU would even the score before the break and grab the lead in the 53rd. The Buffs got their equalizer in the 71st minute, when Jerman scored off a penalty kick and helped the squad force a tie.

Next up, Arizona turned the tables on Colorado. After a 3-0 blanking of the Wildcats last season, Arizona had a thirst for redemption. Despite the game being stuck in a scoreless draw at halftime, Arizona stacked up three late goals to stomp the Buffs. The Wildcats outshot the Buffs 24-12 and held CU to just five corner kicks in their victory.

In rivalry week, CU looked to end their regular season on a high note. The Buffs found a worthy opponent in Utah, heading into halftime in a scoreless tie for the 12th time in the regular season and their second in a row. For over 70 minutes, the game remained scoreless, but that changed in a surprising fashion at 70:44. As Tori Cooper faced a defender one-on-one, she slid the ball towards the net. Utah keeper Lindsey Luke and one of her defenders both came out to meet the ball, with the defender inadvertently causing an own goal to give the Buffs the lead. CU looked a bit reenergized after the goal, but Utah evened the score. A controversial call helped set up a Utah corner kick, a shot that would set up a goal and tie things at 1-1 with 13 minutes remaining in regulation. The teams fought through two overtimes, and the Utes gave the Buffs their only overtime loss of the season with a strike in the 104th minute.

Winless through their final four games, the Buffs seemed unsure about their Tournament fate. On November 11, the team's preseason hopes for a postseason berth became reality as their name was called in the final quadrant of the NCAA Tournament bracket. Their trip to the Women's Soccer Championship would be the program's first since 2008, when they fell in the first round to South Dakota State. Coming off tough conference competition, the Buffs faced an imposing opponent standing in their way out of the first round – in-state rival and fourth seeded Denver.

Putting the past behind them (though using the fact that no current players had ever tasted victory over the Pioneers as an inspirational tool), the Buffs looked to make a statement against No. 15 Denver. And what a statement they made. CU just edged Denver in nearly every category, outshooting DU 15 to 13 and getting three more corner kicks, but took the shot that counted most the game-winner. In the 84th minute, Hooks was fouled just outside the left corner of the penalty box, setting up a free kick for super striker Stuller. Stuller bent her shot over the wall of defenders, getting the ball to deflect and reach the far post to give DU just its second defeat of the season. On the defensive end, the Buffs also held DU's record-breaking seniors and leading scorers Kristen Hamilton and Nicholette DiGiacommo to just three shots combined, with none on goal.

With one great upset under their belt, the Buffs headed to Tallahassee, Fla., where more challenges awaited. In an already record-breaking season, the Buffs kept with the theme against No. 19 BYU in the Round of 32. First, Paxton's shot off a corner kick snuck off a deflection in the 21st minute. Just over 10 minutes later, Carly Bolyard extended the lead with a beautiful strike. Though BYU got on the board in the 59th minute, CU's even play was too much to overcome, as the Buffs extended their two-goal game unbeaten streak to 10. The Buffs had now upset back-to-back ranked opponents for the first time since 2010.

David had beaten Goliath twice, but now, the Buffs were up against a much, much bigger Goliath in the Sweet 16. No. 1 seeded and No. 3 ranked Florida State had fallen just once in 2013, had not lost in its last 33 home games and held the nation's longest active streak of trips to the NCAA quarterfinals. The Seminole attack came early and often, as FSU grabbed a 2-0 lead in the first seven minutes and scored three goals in the first 15. The Noles put the game away at 4-0 in the 70th minute. CU was only able to take four shots, with just one forcing a save out of FSU All-American keeper Kelsey Wys. Though the eventual NCAA runner-up ended Colorado's tournament run, the Buffs had already put their names in the record books, matching their best post-season run with just the program's second trip to the Sweet 16.

- Head coach Austin Daniels recorded his 20th win at Colorado against Wyoming.

- Tiffany Booth netted her first career goal to secure CU's first Big 12 Conference victory of the season, a 2-1 win over Texas Tech.
- CU's eight freshmen made more than an immediate impression on the coaching staff as five freshmen scored seven of Colorado's 17 goals on the season and have dished off six of the team's 17 assists.
- Colorado's 2-2 tie against No. 9 Texas A&M was the programs best result vs. a ranked team since a 3-2 win over then-No. 22 Baylor in 1997.
- The Buffs scored 17 goals by 12 different players, the most players to get in the goal column in the program's history.

- For the first time in program history, Colorado was ranked in a pair of preseason polls at No. 17 in the nation in the *Soccer America* poll and No. 23 in the *NSCAA/adidas* list.

- Fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament bid and second straight year playing host to the first and second rounds in Boulder.
- Colorado recorded 10 wins on the season for the sixth straight year.
- Five Buffaloes were named to All-Big 12 Teams.
- Colorado played No. 1 ranked Stanford on Friday, Sept. 21 and the Buffs welcomed a school record 3,128 fans. Head football coach Dan Hawkins and the football team were also in attendance. The record-breaking crowd topped the previous record at Prentup Field by 1,239 people, set last year in the first round of the NCAA Tournament against Colorado College. The all-time record, before the Stanford game, was set in 1998 when the Buffs played No. 1 North Carolina in front of an even 3,000 fans at Pleasant View Soccer Complex.
- CU shut out its opponents on 10 different occasions, marking the fourth time in the history of the program that they have recorded nine or more shutouts in a single season.
- Nikki Marshall's goal against Oklahoma, just 27 seconds into overtime, was the quickest overtime goal in program history, besting the previous mark of 91:06, set by former Buff Melissa Cartmell in 1998, by 39 seconds. Michaela DeJesus' goal in the Utah game came just 52 seconds into the match, going down as the quickest goal in the 11 year history of the program, shattering the previous record of 1:33 set by Jen Almquist vs. Hawai'i in 1996 by 41 seconds.

- Colorado recorded 14 wins on the season for just the third time in program history.
- A record high eight Buffaloes were named to All-Big 12 Teams.
- Off the field, six Buffs were named to the All-Big 12 Academic teams.
- On Aug. 29, CU beat Texas Tech 3-2 which started the second longest winning streak in program history with eight consecutive games.
- •The Buffs recorded the most on-theroad-wins with six for only the second time in school history since the 2003 season.
- CU shut out its opponents on 15 different occasions, marking the most shutouts in a single season in the history of the program.
- •CU attempted a record high 472 shots on the season.
- •Colorado tied its previous record most shots in a single game with 37 when they played lowa State on Oct. 19.
- •The Buffs' tallied a record high 191 shots on goal while scoring 43 goals which is the second most goals scored in a season.
- Colorado's impressive 3-2 overtime come-from-behind win at Mississippi on Sept. 12 marks the biggest deficit that CU has recovered from. They were down 2-0 for the first 75 minutes of the game.

- Head coach Bill Hempen completed his 10th year as head coach at CU, where he has registered a 110-75-26 record.
- Eighth-seeded Colorado entered the Big 12 postseason tournament for the ninth consecutive year. It was the 12th time in program history that the Buffaloes continued play past the regular season.
- On Sept. 24, The Buffs beat then No. 6-ranked Texas A&M 2-1 in overtime. It was the first time CU beat the Aggies during the regular season.
- Kate Russell contributed the assists in Colorado's 2-1 overtime victory over Washington State. Her two assists in one game tied her in second place on CU's single game record list. Russell's five overall assists put her in a sevenway tie for ninth place on the individual season records list.
- Alex Dohm became only the fourth Buffalo to earn both All-Big 12 Newcomer team and All-Big 12 Second Team honors in the same season.
- 2010 marked the final season for CU in the Big 12 Conference before moving to the Pac-12 in the 2011 season. Colorado was a charter member of the Big 12, which began in 1996, the same year the CU soccer program was formed. CU soccer holds a 60-66-14 all-time record within the conference.

- With a 5-0 routing Colorado College and a 3-0 shutout of Northern Colorado to begin the season, the Buffs won the inaugural Colorado Cup.
- 2011 marked the first season for CU in the Pac-12 Conference. Prior to joining the newly formed conference, the Buffs spent 15 years in the Big 12. In their first season in the Pac-12, the Buffs concluded conference play with a 1-9-1 record.
- The Buffs defeated California 1-0 on October 21. It marked the first victory in the Pac-12 for any Colorado team.
- Junior Amy Barczuk was an All-Pac-12 honorable mention and a U.S. Under-23 national training camp and national team selection.
- Bill Hempen stepped down as the head coach of the Colorado women's soccer team at the conclusion of the 2011 season. Under Hempen's tutelage, the Buffs racked up a 114-88-27 record through 11 seasons and made six NCAA appearances. In 2003, (Hempen's third year in the position), he led the Buffs to the Big 12 regular season title and was named the Big 12 Coach of the Year. Hempen coached three All-Americans at CU and helped the program to the biggest single-season turnaround in Big 12 history in just his second season.
- Four wins was the second fewest wins in program history. The fewest was three in Hempen's first season in 2001. Eleven losses also marked the most in a single season for the program.

- · Danny Sanchez became just the third head soccer coach in Colorado history on Dec. 19, 2011.
- It took Sanchez just eight games to lead the Buffs to five wins, faster than either of his predecessors.
- For the second straight season, the Buffs won the Colorado Cup, picking up wins over Northern Colorado and Colorado College.
- The Buffs began the season with three shutouts and a five-game unbeaten streak (3-0-2) - both program firsts.
- · Colorado scored off own goals in backto-back games during the DU Invitational, marking just the third and fourth own goals in school history.
- CU had its best non-conference season since 2008, going 6-1-2. It marked just the sixth time that the Buffs won at least six non-conference matches.
- The Buffs picked up back-to-back Pac-12 road matches for the first time since joining the conference in 2011, defeating USC 1-0 in double overtime and shutting out Arizona 3-0.
- The Buff defense tallied eight shutouts (ranking fourth in the conference and tying for sixth all-time at CU).
- · Captain Amy Barczuk became one of only eight players in CU soccer history to have started at least 76 of 78 games played and only the fourth to have played in every one of the team's games during her four year tenure at CU. She was selected by the Western New York Flash in the second round of the inaugural NWSL draft.



PRENTUP FIELD

Prentup Field, located on the East Campus of the University of Colorado at Boulder, has been the home of Colorado Soccer since 2003. The field had been the home of the now-obsolete Colorado baseball team before the women's soccer team took over.

Prentup combines the very best of what Boulder has to offer, with beautiful Colorado mountain views and a lush pitch courtesy of CU's turf management team.

The Buffaloes have always enjoyed great home advantages in Boulder. CU formerly played its matches at Pleasant View Soccer Complex in North Boulder. This facility had an award-winning field for CU to play on and nine surrounding fields for training.

During that time, the Buffaloes compiled a home record of 50-28-5, a win percentage of .633. The Buffs also played host to over 3,000 fans on Sept. 2, 1998, when they hosted then-defending national champion North Carolina.



THE SCOREBOARD AT PRENTUP FIELD WAS ERECTED IN THE FALL of 2005.

Upon the arrival of coach Bill Hempen, the Buffs started training at Prentup in the spring of 2002 while it was still a baseball field.

In the spring of 2003, the soccer team was granted exclusive use of Prentup, and work began to re-landscape the field. All remnants of the baseball field except for the outfield fence were razed, and the turf began a major makeover.

Prentup Field is now a 160,000 square foot facility that contains a 120x75 yard game field along with a practice area. It is a native soil field and is equipped with an automated irrigation system. When the irrigation was installed and the field was graded in July of 2003, the turf management team produced a playable soccer facility from seed in just 33 days.

Each week, the field is painted and mowed 3-4 times in preparation for matches and practices under the supervision of Ryan Newman, along with a collection of other maintenance practices.

The Buffs trained at Prentup from 2002-04, and finally in the fall of 2004, they played their first-ever match there, defeating Northern Colorado by a score of 3-0 on October 1, 2004. In 2005, Prentup became CU's full time home, with the Buffaloes posting a record of 7-1-0 in their first full season and an all-time mark of 55-26-7.

Capital improvements to the facility are ongoing. An athletic department fund-raising campaign in the summer of 2005 helped raise funds to put in bleachers for 1,200 people, a new scoreboard, nets behind the goals and iron entrance gates adorned with the CU logo into the venue. Additional funds in advance of the 2006 NCAA Tournament added more bleachers, bringing the seating capacity of Prentup Field to 2,000 people.

While there are bleachers for 2,000, fans of CU soccer bring lawn chairs and blankets to sit on as well in the open areas, continuing some of the community feel of Pleasant View at the current home.

In the fall of 2007, Prentup and the Buffs welcomed top-ranked Stanford to Boulder and dropped a 1-0 heartbreaker to the Cardinal in front of a facility record 3,128 fans, shattering the previous record by 1,257 people. Colorado has also had the privilege of hosting back-to-back NCAA Tournament first and second rounds in 2006 and 2007, welcoming 1,871 fans against Colorado College in '06 and 1,843 against No. 2 Portland in '07.

PRENTUP FIELD

Prentup Field has been home to University of Colorado athletics for almost 40 years, as the venue is named after former CU baseball coach Frank "Chief" Prentup. The field, formerly known as Varsity Field, was renamed after the former coach in 1978. The complex remained a popular venue until the varsity baseball team was removed in 1980.

The field was used by several different entities within Colorado athletics after 1980. The club baseball team played there, and CU's mascot Ralphie was even known to have taken practice runs there.

The complex is located just west of CU's Potts Field track & field complex and ski building. Amenities for Buffalo soccer fans include concessions, rest rooms and free parking and game programs.



PAC-12 CONFERENCE

PAC-12 CONFERENCE, THE CONFERENCE OF CHAMPIONS

Built on a firm foundation of academic excellence and superior athletic performance, the Conference ushered in a new era on July 1, 2011, officially becoming the Pac-12 Conference with the additions of the University of Colorado and University of Utah.

Just 27 days after the Conference officially changed its name, Commissioner Larry Scott announced the creation of the Pac-12 Networks on July 27, 2011, solidifying a landmark television deal and putting the Conference on the forefront of collegiate athletics. The Networks, including one national network, six regional networks, and a robust digital network marked the first-ever integrated media company owned by a college conference. In addition, the "TV Everywhere" rights allow fans to access Pac-12 Networks outside the home on any digital device, including smartphones and tablet computers.

On the field, the Pac-12 rises above the rest, upholding its tradition as the "Conference of Champions," claiming an incredible 131 NCAA team titles since 1999-2000, including 10 in 2013-14. That is an average of nearly nine championships per academic year. Even more impressive has been the breadth of the Pac-12's success, with championships coming in 28 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-12 has led or tied the nation in NCAA Championships in 48 of the last 54 years, the only exceptions being in 1980-81, 1988-89, 1990-91 and 1995-96 when the Conference finished second, and only twice finished third in 1998-99 and 2004-05.

For the ninth-consecutive year, the Pac-12 had the most NCAA titles or tied for the most of any conference in the country, winning at least six every year since 2000-01. No other conference has won double-digit NCAA crowns in a single year, the Pac-12 doing so seven times, including a record 14 in 1996-97.

Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletics achievements, the Pac-12 was the first conference to reach 400 championships in 2010-11. With the inclusion of Colorado and Utah, the Conference surpassed another major milestone, with league teams capturing 450 titles, outdistancing the next conference by nearly 200. In all, Conference teams have won 469 NCAA Championships (287 men's, 154 women's, 28 combined).

Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships 33 years ago, Pac-12 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season on 24 occasions, including 14-consecutive years from 2000-2014. Overall, the Pac-12 has captured 154 NCAA women's titles, easily outdistancing the SEC, which is second with 93. Pac-12 women student-athletes shine nationally on an individual basis, as well, having captured an unmatched 682 NCAA individual crowns, an average of nearly 21 championships per season.

PAC-12 CONFERENCE HISTORY

The roots of the Pac-12 Conference date back 99 years to December 2, 1915, when the Pacific Coast Conference (PCC) was founded at a meeting at the Oregon Hotel in Portland, Ore. The original membership consisted of four schools - the University of California at Berkeley, the University of Washington, the University of Oregon, and Oregon State College (now Oregon State University). All still are charter members of the Conference.

Pacific Coast Conference play began in 1916 and, one year later, Washington State College (now Washington State University) was accepted into the league, with Stanford University following in 1918.

In 1922, the PCC expanded to eight teams with the admission of the University of Southern California (USC) and the University of Idaho. In

1924, the University of Montana joined the league roster, and in 1928, the PCC grew to 10 members with the addition of UCLA.

The Pacific Coast Conference competed as a 10-member league until 1950, with the exception of 1943-45 when World War II curtailed intercollegiate athletic competition to a minimum. During that time, the league's first commissioner was named. Edwin N. Atherton was Commissioner in 1940 and was succeeded by Victor O. Schmidt in 1944. In 1950, Montana resigned from the Conference and the PCC continued as a nine-team Conference through 1958.

In 1959, the PCC was dissolved and the Athletic Association of Western Universities (AAWU) was formed with Thomas J. Hamilton was appointed Commissioner of the new league. The original AAWU membership included California, Stanford, USC, UCLA and Washington. Washington State joined the membership in 1962, while Oregon and Oregon State joined in 1964. Under Hamilton's watch, the name Pacific-8 Conference was adopted in 1968. In 1971, Wiles Hallock took over as Commissioner of the Pac-8.

Ten years later, on July 1, 1978, the University of Arizona and Arizona State University were admitted to the league and the Pacific-10 Conference became a reality. In 1986-87, the league took on a new look, expanding to include 10 women's sports. Since then, the Conference has been considered the premiere league in women's athletics, securing the most NCAA titles in women's sports of any conference nearly every year.



Thomas C. Hansen was named the Commissioner of the Pac-10 in 1983, a role he would hold for 26 years until 2009, and was succeeded by current Commissioner Larry Scott, who took on the new role in July 2009.

During the 2010-11 academic year, the University of Colorado accepted its invitation to join the Pac-12 on June 11, 2010, and on June 17, 2010, the University of Utah agreed to join the Conference. The Buffaloes and Utes officially became the 11th and 12th members of the Conference on July 1, 2011, the first additions to the league since 1978.

It was during that 2010-11 academic year that Scott helped deliver monumental changes that transformed the Conference into a modern 12-team league. In addition to expanding to 12 teams, member institutions agreed to equal revenue sharing for the first time in the Conference's history, created two divisions - the North and the South, for football only and established a Football Championship Game for the first time ever. He also secured a landmark media rights deal that dramatically increased national exposure and revenue for each school, establishing the Pac-12 Networks and Pac-12 Digital Network that guaranteed enhanced exposure across all sports.

Currently, the Pac-12 sponsors 11 men's sports and 11 women's sports. Additionally, the Conference is a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) in four other men's sports and three women's sports.

BIG 12 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS

In 2003, when Jen Thais said in a preseason press conference that her season goal was, "to make the NCAA Tournament and to be nationally recognized. What I'm hoping... what I'm expecting, is to surprise people," little did she know what kind of impact that prediction would have on the eighth team in Colorado soccer history... and the nation for that matter.

A record breaking season was approached in four phases. Phase I were the preseason exhibition games where the Buffs shutout Northern Colorado 4-0 and Air Force 3-0.

Phase II consisted of CU's non-conference schedule where the Buffs came out virtually unscathed at 7-1. In the season opener, they held defending national champion and then-No. 2 Portland scoreless for 87 minutes before suffering a 1-0 defeat. The Buffs would regroup and close out the remainder of the non-conference season 7-0, beating teams by a 17-2 scoring margin. It was during Phase II that CU picked up its first-ever win against a top-10 ranked opponent when it handed then-No. 9 Denver a 3-0 blanking, just days after the Pioneers had upended Portland.

Enter Phase III... the Big 12 Conference season. The Buffs came away from the '03 season 8-1-1, the crescendo of the season being a 3-1 win over nemesis Nebraska in the season finale for both teams in below freezing temperatures on a pitch covered in ice. Colorado's 25 season points was the fourth highest in league standings history. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Buffs came away with the coach, player and rookie of the year, a first-team All-Big 12 pick, three second-teamers and five of their nine newcomers named to the All-Newcomer team.

With 25 school single-season, class and career records shattered, Colorado entered the final phase of the season, Phase IV... the postseason. They went into the eighth Big 12 Conference Tournament as the No. 1 seed for the first time in program history, and a week later the Buffs entered their first NCAA Tournament as just one of 16 seeded teams.

BUFFS IN THE LEAGUE

The National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) is the top level professional women's soccer league in the United States. It began play in spring 2013 with eight teams: Boston Breakers, Chicago Red Stars, FC Kansas City, Portland Thorns FC, Seattle Reign FC, Sky Blue FC, the Washington Spirit and the Western New York Flash. The Houston Dash joined the league in 2014. Based in Chicago, the NWSL is supported by the United States Soccer Federation, Canadian Soccer Association and Federation of Mexican Football. Each of the league's nine clubs will play a total of 24 games during a 19-week span, with the schedule beginning the weekend of April 12-13 and concluding the weekend of Aug. 16-17. The top four teams will qualify for the NWSL playoffs and compete in the semifinals on Aug. 23-24. The NWSL will crown its inaugural champion after the final on Sunday, Aug. 31.
