PRENTUP FIELD INFORMATION

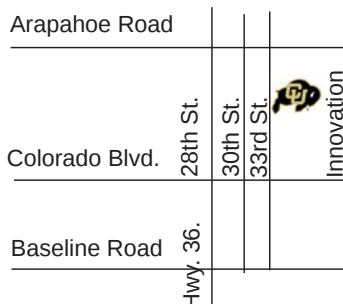
- There is bleacher seating available for approximately 750 people.

PRENTUP FIELD

All home games will be played on campus at Prentup Field, located on CU's East Campus at 33rd and Colorado. Admission, and parking in the adjacent lot, are free.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

Interview requests should be made directly through the CU Sports Information Department. Please contact Ashley Braun to request access to athletes. Both athletes and staff will be on the field and available to the media following a brief cooling off period at the conclusion of all games. Practices are held on Prentup Field, beginning at 7:30 a.m., with weight training or tape viewing immediately following at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Practice times may vary. Please contact Ashley if you would like to conduct post- or pre-practice interviews. The coaching staff is generally available in their offices weekdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and after practices. Please feel free to call any member of the coaching staff during the day at 303-492-0632, however to contact a student-athlete, we ask that you go through the sports information office.

2015 COLORADO BUFFALOES



In 2014, the University of Colorado women's soccer team earned a program-best third place finish in the Pac-12 Conference en route to a second consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament where the Buffs advanced to the second round. The Buffaloes will look for continued success in their fifth season in the ultra-competitive Pac-12 Conference and their fourth under head coach Danny Sanchez. Eight newcomers will join 18 returning letterwinners to compete in 20 regular season matches, including the fifth annual Colorado Cup.

WHO'S RETURNING: The Buffs return 18 letterwinners, including five starters and four student-athletes with starting experience. Four of the team's top six scorers return, led by junior Brie Hooks, who recorded 23 points off eight goals and seven assists in her sophomore season. All but four goal scorers will be returning to the Buff attack, while defenders Kahlia Hogg, Alex Huynh and Heather Ward will help anchor the back line. Seven seniors will provide leadership on and off the pitch.

WHO'S GONE: The team bids farewell to seven players, including five senior starters. Forward, co-captain Darcy Jerman along with midfielder Carly Bolyard have graduated. They played pivotal roles on the attack, combining for eight goals, six assists and 64 shots. The defense also loses a few key pieces, with shot blockers Tori Cooper, Brooke Rice and 2014 co-captain Bianca

Jones all graduating from CU. The three defenders supported a back line that helped shutout a record-tying 12 opponents and only allowed 17 goals over 22 matches. Forward Storie Ledger also graduated and Hannah Dearborn will not be returning in 2015.

WHO'S NEW: CU welcomes eight newcomers- seven freshmen and one transfer. West Coasters Erin Greening, Brooklyn Varnadore and Stephanie Zuniga-Herrera look to make an early impact on the attack, while Canadian Sarah Kinzner and Colorado natives Amy Alexander and Alex Vidger will add a strong presence in the midfield. The Buffs also add goalkeeper Jalen Tompkins from Phoenix, Ariz. Danica Evans, a transfer from Portland and Lakewood, Colo. native will continue her collegiate career with the Buffaloes, adding depth to the offense.

THE SEASON: The 2015 schedule features 11 home matches and nine contests will be televised on the Pac-12 Networks. CU will face eight opponents ranked or receiving votes in the 2015 NSCAA Preseason Poll.

The Buffaloes open their season with the fifth annual Colorado Cup on Friday, August 21 in Fort Collins. CU faces Colorado State and then plays its first match at home on Sunday, August 23 against Colorado College, one of three matches CU will host as part of Colorado Cup Sunday at Prentup Field. The Buffs own a combined 8-2-1 record

against the Rams and Tigers as CU begins its quest to defend its 2014 tournament title.

After their opening weekend, the Buffs travel to Provo, Utah on Friday, August 28 for a rematch of last year's NCAA Tournament contest against BYU, in which the Buffs defeated the Cougars 2-0 to advance to the round of 32 for a second consecutive season. BYU TV will broadcast the match.

CU returns to Boulder for a three-match home stand, beginning Sunday, August 30, when the Buffs host New Mexico at Prentup Field. This will mark only the third time CU has met New Mexico on the pitch and first time the Lobos will travel to Boulder. Colorado continues with its non-conference schedule the following weekend as the team welcomes Cincinnati to Prentup on Friday, September 4 and former Big-12 opponent, Iowa State on Sunday, September 6, which will be the first meeting between the two schools since CU joined the Pac-12 Conference in 2011.

The Colorado Cup concludes on Friday, September 11 as the Buffs take a short trip to Denver for an evening match against the Pioneers. CU rounds out the weekend with its first of another three-match home stand on Sunday, September 13, facing the Northwestern Wildcats for only the second time in program history. The match will be broadcast on the Pac-12 Networks.

Colorado competes in its final non-conference match a week later on Sunday, September 20 when first-time opponent Villanova comes to town.

At the midway point in the season, the Buffs open Pac-12 Conference play, hosting California on Sunday, September 27 in their final match of the home stand.

The Buffs then take a trip to the Pacific Northwest for two matches in Oregon. First up is a stop in Eugene to battle the Oregon Ducks on Friday, October 2 before traveling to Corvallis to face Oregon State on Sunday, October 4.

CU has a date with the Washington schools in Boulder the following weekend for a second straight year. Washington arrives on Friday, October 9 and two days later, Washington State visits for a matinee on Sunday, October 11 to close out the weekend.

The team embarks on its longest road trip of the season next, playing three straight in California. Colorado will face Stanford in Palo Alto on Friday, October 16 and then travels down the coast the following weekend for two matches in Los Angeles. The defending Pac-12 Conference Champions UCLA Bruins host the Buffs on Friday, October 23 for an evening contest under the lights and Southern California welcomes CU on Sunday, October 25 for the Buffs final match of the road trip.

The Buffaloes play their final two home matches of the regular season over Halloween weekend. The Arizona Wildcats are in Boulder on Friday, October 30 and Arizona State faces CU on Sunday, November 1.

Colorado closes out its 2015 regular season campaign on the road, visiting conference rival Utah. The match is set for Friday, November 6 in Salt Lake City.

HEAD COACH DANNY SANCHEZ



Danny Sanchez enters his fourth season as the head coach of the University of Colorado women's soccer team. He was named the third head coach in the history of the program on December 19, 2011.

In three seasons with the Buffaloes, Sanchez has led the team to a 36-22-7 overall record and several program firsts. In his first season, the Buffs opened the season with a record-setting three straight shutouts on their way to a

3-0-2 start, marking the first time CU began the season on a five-game unbeaten streak. The team shattered those new records the following year, beginning the season with five straight shutouts and six wins.

It took Sanchez just eight games to record five wins with the program, faster than either of his predecessors. Sanchez has helped the Buffs to an astounding 24-6-2 non-conference record. Over the past two seasons, he gave the Buffs a strong home field advantage with an 18-5-1 record at Prentup Field, and last season coached a CU defense that only surrendered 10 goals at home in 14 matches.

The Buffs have also improved in conference play under Sanchez each year, highlighted by a program best third place finish in the Pac-12 last season. CU finished 2014 with a 6-4-1 conference mark, the program's first winning record since it joined the Pac-12 four years ago. In 2012, CU earned its first back-to-back Pac-12 road victories with shutouts over USC and Arizona. In 2013, the Buffs continued their success, doubling their conference wins, and earning their first Pac-12 home victories with back-to-back wins over Oregon State and Oregon.

From September 6, 2013 all the way through to the postseason, Colorado received votes in the weekly NSCAA/Continental Tire poll. CU capped a stellar 2013 campaign with its first 14 win season and NCAA appearance since 2008. The Buffs matched their best post-season finish, defeating No. 15 Denver and No. 19 BYU on their way to the Sweet 16. In 2014, Sanchez led the Buffs to their second straight postseason appearance as CU advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after defeating 15th-ranked BYU, 2-0, in snowy, frigid conditions at Prentup Field, giving Sanchez his 200th win at the Division I level.

Sanchez also earned his 300th career victory earlier last season, when the Buffs defeated Arizona State at home.

Sanchez has continued to help the Buffs to academic excellence, with 22 players earning Pac-12 All-Academic honors and the team earning back-to-back-to-back NSCAA Team Academic Awards for averaging a 3.0 grade-point average. Additionally, Hayley Hughes has earned academic honors from both CoSIDA and the NSCAA, while Lizzy Herzl became the first Buff to receive NSCAA Scholar All-America honors.

He has coached two players to professional careers. In 2012, Amy Barczuk became just the second Buff to be drafted by a professional team, getting chosen by the Western New York Flash in the second round of the inaugural National Women's Soccer League Draft. In her rookie season, Barczuk and the Flash went all the way to the championship game. Barczuk became a member of the Boston Breakers in 2014 and is also a volunteer assistant coach under Sanchez. After graduating in 2013, Annie Brunner signed a professional contract with FC Neunkrich of the Switzerland Nationaliga A. Brunner returned to her alma mater in 2015 and serves as the coordinator of performance analysis and camp operations on Sanchez's staff.

Sanchez's career spans 21 years with Wyoming, Metro State and Mesa Community College, where he coached both men's and women's programs. He has amassed a 303-82-30 record, including a pair of NCAA Division II National Championships while at Metro State.

In his time away from the Centennial State, Sanchez spent four seasons with the University of Wyoming, compiling a 36-34-11 record. In his final season with the Cowgirls, the team posted a 12-6-4 record, its best in school history, including a 3-1-2 record in Mountain West Conference play for a third-place regular season finish. That season, Sanchez was named the MWC Coach of the Year.

After a 0-3 start, Wyoming allowed just 12 goals in its final 19 games, with one of its wins including a 1-0 decision against Colorado in Boulder. In the MWC tournament, the Cowgirls defeated TCU and San Diego State before falling to New Mexico in the championship.

Sanchez gave the Cowgirls their first winning record in four years, going 9-8-3 in his second season with the team. He coached eight All-Mountain West Conference performers and all four of his teams were recognized with the NSCAA Team Academic Award.

Before joining the Cowgirls, Sanchez spent six seasons as the head women's coach at Denver's Metro State College. He posted an impressive 128-11-7 record (a .901 winning percentage) with the Roadrunners, where he won Division II national

titles in 2004 and 2006 and reached the Final Four in 2002 and the Elite Eight five times. Sanchez and the Roadrunners also claimed five Midwest Region Championships.

At Metro State, the Roadrunners won the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (RMAC) championship, and advanced to the NCAA Division II Tournament all six seasons he was at the helm. He was also named the RMAC's Coach of the Year all six years. Sanchez was the 2004 NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year, a four-time NSCAA Midwest Region Coach of the Year and was named the RMAC's All-Time Top Coach.

In his time at Metro State, the Roadrunners established two of the most impressive records in Division II history: a 59-game unbeaten streak (58-0-1) and 61 consecutive home wins. MSCD produced two Division II National Players of the Year and 14

NSCAA All-Americans in his tenure.

Prior to taking over at Metro, Sanchez served as the head men's and women's soccer coach at Mesa (Ariz.) Community College from 1995-2001. In eight seasons, he led the women's team to a 103-15-5 (.858) overall record and the men to a 96-36-7 (.716) mark, producing 12 All-Americans in that span between the two. The women won four National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Region I Championships and five Arizona Community College Athletic Conference (ACCAC) Championships. In 2001, he was the ACCAC and NJCAA Region I Men's and Women's Coach of the Year, as well as the NSCAA Junior College Central Region Coach of the Year. He also won the NJCAA Region I Women's Coach of the Year award in 1996 and 1999.

Sanchez has also been very active in coaching around the Rocky Mountain region. He has served as a staff coach and licensing instructor for the Colorado State Youth Soccer Association and has worked as a coach for U.S. Youth Soccer Region IV staff. Sanchez holds a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) «A» License, a USSF National Youth License, an NSCAA Advanced National Diploma and a KNVB Dutch Advanced Certificate.

After graduating from Scottsdale's (Ariz.) Coronado High School, where he lettered in soccer, football and baseball, he began his collegiate career at nearby Mesa CC. Later, he transferred to the University of Connecticut and led the Huskies to the 1989 Big East Conference Championship and an NCAA Tournament berth, ranking in the New England Region's top 10 in scoring that season. Following his collegiate career, he played in the Western Soccer League for the Arizona Condors and in the U.S.I.S.L. for the Arizona Cotton.

Sanchez earned a bachelor's degree in economics from Connecticut in 1991. He and wife Beth, a physical education teacher, have two sons, Cole (16) and Drew (12).

ASSISTANT COACHES



Jason Green enters his fourth year as an assistant with the University of Colorado soccer team. He was promoted to associate head coach in August 2015. Green serves as the Buffaloes' goalkeeper director.

In his first three seasons with the Buffs, he helped the team to a 36-22-7 combined record and its best defensive starts in program history. In 2012, the Buffs set a record with three shutouts at the start of the season. In 2013, the Buffs shattered that record by shutting out their first five opponents,

on their way to nine total clean sheets (tying for fifth best all-time). Last season, CU's defense was clutch once again, tying a program record with 12 shutouts.

Green has helped the Buffs to back-to-back 14 win seasons and two straight NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2013, the Buffs matched their best postseason finish, defeating back-to-back ranked opponents on their way to the Sweet 16 and last season, CU advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after defeating 15th-ranked BYU, 2-0, in cold, snowy conditions at Prentup Field.

As the goalkeeper director, Green has helped the net minders to a combined goals-against average of 1.10 or better. Last season, CU's goalies combined for a stellar 0.76 average. Green's work has solidified Annie Brunner as one of the program's best keepers. In his two seasons working with Brunner, her stats drastically improved in every category. Her GAA went from 1.69 in 2011 to 1.11 in 2013 and her save percentage increased from .635 in '11 to .770 in '13. Brunner also more than doubled her total saves from 40 in 2011 to 87 in 2013. With Green's assistance, Brunner claimed two Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week honors and earned a spot in the top five of every career goalkeeping statistical category at CU. Last year, Green helped develop Kate Scheele into one of the top goalkeepers in the Pac-12 during the 2014 season. Scheele shutout 11 opponents, third-best in the conference and ranked in the Pac-12's top six in save percentage (.821), saves (22), and goals-against average (0.76).

"Because of Jason's complete understanding of the game, he brings a refreshing perspective to goalkeeping," Brunner said. "Too many coaches these days focus on just the technique of our position and end up losing sight of the bigger picture – keeping the ball out of the net. While those coaches end up criticizing your every move, Jason uniquely understands that with repetition and feedback I'll make the most progress. He offers advice based off his knowledge of field player behavior combined with goalkeeper technique, which together elevate my understanding of the position and help me to perform my best on game day."

Prior to joining the Buffs, he was an assistant for Danny Sanchez at the University of Wyoming. In Green's four year tenure at Wyoming, the Cowgirls were 36-34-11. He helped coach 18 Academic All-Mountain

West Conference and nine Conference Scholars. In 2011, he helped coach the Cowgirls to a school record 12 wins and the program's first ever spot in the MWC Tournament championship game.

At Wyoming, Green brought the goalkeeping position to a new level, as almost every record was broken while he was training the goalkeepers. Under Green's tutelage, Courtney Merkle ended her collegiate career ranked at the top of school season and career record books for GAA and minutes played. Merkle also ranks second all-time in saves.

Green was also on Sanchez's staff at Mesa Community College and the duo has worked together on a number of club teams and summer camps.

He has held two high school head coaching jobs, the first at Skyline High School in Mesa, Ariz., and the second at Chandler (Ariz.) High School. Green was named Region Coach of the Year at both posts and at Chandler his teams won three straight NSCAA National Academic Awards.

In his 17 year coaching career in college, high school and club soccer, Green has coached five state championship teams, six region champions, four district champions and five conference titlists.

He was mentored by Aidan Davison, a former goalkeeper in the English Premier League and the first team coach in the English Premier League.

"Having worked with Jason I have seen firsthand the quality he brings to the program, he has an added dimension of understanding the goalkeeping role and the requirements of the position," Davison said. "Jason is a bright young coach with a big future."

Green holds a United States Soccer Federation "A" License and a USSF National Goalkeeping License. He also has attended the Manchester United Coaches Symposium.



Green started his collegiate playing career at Mesa C.C. under Sanchez where they were ranked as high as second in the nation. He continued his career at Grand Canyon (Ariz.) University, where he helped lead the team to a No. 2 national ranking and to the championship game of the California Collegiate Athletic Association Tournament.

He earned his bachelor's in physical education from Ottawa (Ariz.) University in 2003 and completed his master's in physical education from Arizona State University in 2008.

ASSISTANT COACHES



Dave Morgan enters his first season as an assistant soccer coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Colorado.

Morgan joined the Buffaloes' staff after spending 13 seasons as an assistant with the Metro State Roadrunners women's soccer team and is reunited with CU head coach Danny Sanchez after the duo spent six seasons together at Metro.

During Morgan's tenure with the Roadrunners, he helped the program win two national championships and eight Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (RMAC) regular season championships. He also helped guide Metro State to an impressive 12 Division II NCAA Tournament appearances in 12 years.

In 2011, Morgan was inducted into the Metro State Athletics Hall of Fame with the 2004 National Championship team.

In addition to coaching collegiately, the Colorado native has extensive experience at the club level, where he has served as the College Advisory Program Director and ECNL Director for the Colorado Storm Soccer Association, and has been the Director of Coaching U15-U18 girls since 2006.

Prior to joining the Storm, Morgan coached for the Colorado Xtreme Soccer Club where he won five state championships. He also served as a head Olympic Development Program state coach for ten years and a U.S. Soccer Federation's Region IV Olympic Development Program staff coach for 12 years.

From 1988-94, Morgan was the head coach for the men and women's varsity team at Wheat Ridge High School where he guided the program to a Jefferson County League Championship in 1991 and qualified for the State playoffs multiple years. During his tenure he earned multiple awards including Jeffco 5A Women's Soccer Coach of Year, Jeffco 5A Men's Soccer Coach of the Year and State 5A Men's Soccer Coach of the Year.

Before his days in coaching got underway, Morgan earned multiple honors playing at the high school and collegiate levels, and played on several club teams. He was a member of the Northglenn High School varsity soccer team from 1980-83 and was a 1983 All American High School selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

After high school, he continued his playing career at Metro State from 1983-87. As a student-athlete for the Roadrunners, Morgan was named a two-time NCAA/NAIA All-Star Selection in 1986-87 and a NAIA All-American in 1986. He won three straight State Championships from 1987-89 with the Colorado Comets U23 Men's team before spending two seasons with the Colorado Comets Amateur Soccer Club. Beginning in 1988, he played semi-professionally with SISL/USISL Colorado Comets Soccer Club where he earned a spot on the USISL All-Star Team twice.

Morgan is a Metro State graduate with a degree in sports club administration. He has also earned an Advanced National Diploma, National Diploma and Premier Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association (NSCAA) and holds a USSF "C" license as well as an ACEP Leader Level Certificate.

ASSISTANT COACHES



University of Colorado alumna and former soccer Buff, Amy Barczuk enters her second season as a volunteer assistant coach.

During her time at Colorado, Barczuk recorded 23 points off 10 goals and three assists. She is one of only eight players in program history to start at least 76 of 78 games played, and one of four Buffs to have played in every one of the team's

games in her four-year collegiate tenure. Barczuk ranks in the all-time top 12 in games played and started and shots attempted.

Barczuk received multiple honors at CU. As a freshman, she earned a spot on the Big 12 All-Newcomer team. The following season, she was an All-Big 12 Second Team selection. Her junior season, the Buffs' first in the Pac-12 Conference, she was an all-conference honorable mention. She had a stellar senior season, serving as the team captain and earning spots on the All-Pac-12 Second Team and the NSCAA All-Pacific Region team. She was also a USWNT U-23 Training Camp selection and a member of the U-23 player pool.

She shined in the classroom, graduating from CU in 2013 with a business degree. She was selected to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll in back-to-back seasons and was an Academic All-Big 12 First Team selection in 2010 and an Academic All-Pac-12 honorable mention in '11 and '12.

Barczuk, a midfielder on the Boston Breakers began her professional career in 2013 when she was selected by the Western New York Flash in the second round (the 14th overall pick) of the National Women's Soccer League draft. In her rookie season, she saw action in seven regular season games. The Flash claimed the regular season title and ended its season with a runner-up finish at

the inaugural NWSL championship game, where Barczuk made her fourth professional start. The Breakers acquired Barczuk via trade prior to the 2014 season. She went on to play in 19 matches, making nine starts and logged 886 minutes.

Before joining the Buffs, Barczuk had a successful prep career at Arapahoe High School. She led her team to the state semi-finals as a sophomore and senior, and to the quarterfinals as a junior. Barczuk was named second-team All-League as a sophomore, and earned first-team All-league, 5A All-State and All-Colorado selections as a senior. On the club side, Barczuk played for the Riverside Renegades and helped them to three State Cup Championships, one regional semifinal and one quarterfinal. Despite her team dropping the State Cup final match in 2009, Barczuk was still crowned the State Cup MVP for the tournament.

Barczuk also excelled on the basketball court, lettering four years and wrapping up her prep career as a McDonald's All-American Finalist. She was a three-time all-state honorable mention and first-team all-league selection, and was all-league second team as a freshman. A heavily recruited athlete in both sports, Barczuk was recognized with the 2008 Sportswomen of Colorado "All-Around" Award.

Born on October 28, 1990, Barczuk is the daughter of Mark and Lynn Barczuk of Centennial, Colo.

Annie Brunner enters her first season as coordinator of performance analysis and camp operations at the University of Colorado, returning to her alma mater as a member of the soccer staff on June 15, 2015.

Brunner will be responsible for managing camp logistics and collaborating with the coaching staff to organize and edit video while also monitoring and analyzing player performance.

A standout goalkeeper for the Buffaloes from 2010-13, Brunner most recently served as a back-up goalkeeper for the Western New York Flash and a Graduate Assistant Coach at Troy University.

Brunner worked as the graduate assistant goalkeeper coach from 2014-2015 for Troy's women's soccer team, while pursuing a Master's degree in international business administration, which she will complete next summer. During her tenure, she created curriculum and trained the goalkeepers. In addition to coaching, she helped with recruiting and the team's residential, ID and summer day camps.

Prior to her time spent at Troy, Brunner also played on an international stage when she signed a professional contract with FC Neunkirch of the Swiss Women's National League A at the beginning of 2014.

She was also an assistant goalkeeper coach with the Goalkeepers Union for four years, assisting in the development of youth keepers (U7-U18) in the Denver metro area.

The Arvada, Colo. native proved herself as one of the program's greatest goalkeepers of all-time during her career at CU. Brunner played two years under Sanchez from 2012-13 and as a co-captain during the 2013 season, she helped lead the Buffs to the NCAA Sweet 16 – matching the best finish in program history as she concluded her senior year ranked in the nation's top 100 in saves and shutout percentage.

Brunner is only one of only two Buffs in school history to have at least nine shutouts in a single season and record at least seven in back-to-back seasons. She ranks second all-time in saves, wins, ties and shutouts. Her stellar 1.22 goals-against average and 6,956 minutes played rank fifth, while her 75 starts and 77 games played also rank in CU's all-time top 15.

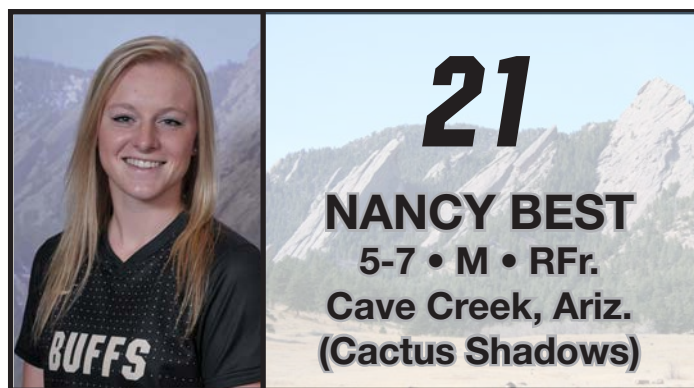

SOPHOMORE (2014 at PORTLAND): Evans started 18 matches, totaling 1,439 minutes. She tallied a team-best 17 points for a second straight season with a career-high seven goals and three assists. She also led the team with 42 shots and 21 shots on goal. Evans recorded four game-winners, both team and career-highs, and was a perfect 1-1 on penalty kick opportunities.

FRESHMAN (2013 at PORTLAND): Evans started all 21 matches and played a total of 1,494 minutes. She recorded five goals and tied a team-high with seven assists, which ranked second in the West Coast Conference. She had 40 shots, second most on the team and put 14 on frame. Evans tallied her first career game-winner in a 2-0 victory over Seattle in the first round of the NCAA Tournament and she followed with one goal and one assist during the second round when the Pilots faced Illinois. Evans was named an All-WCC Honorable Mention.

HIGH SCHOOL: Evans played for the Colorado Edge and Colorado Rush club teams where she helped the Rush win the state cup in 2008 and 2010. From 2009-2012, she competed in the Elite Clubs National League (ECNL) with the Rush and was the national scoring leader in 2012-13, registering 40 goals. Her stellar performance helped her U-18 Rush team finish second in the nation in 2013 and was named the State Cup MVP in 2012. In the summer of 2014, she scored 13 goals and 29 points in only 12 matches for the Rush en route to the W-League's Scoring Champion and Golden Boot titles. Evans was also invited to compete at the U-17 Women's National Team Camp in 2012 and U-18 Women's National Team Camp in 2013. Evans was a two-time letterwinner in high school. She led her team in scoring her freshman year and was also named second team All-Conference the same season. As a junior, she was again the team's leading goal scorer and earned first team All-Conference honors as well as being named team MVP. In addition to soccer, Evans competed one year in gymnastics as a freshman, where she earned a place on the All-Conference first team and 11th place finish at the state meet. In total, she was a gymnast for 14 years and won 3v3 nationals three times.

Fedor also saw action in three other non-conference matches.

HIGH SCHOOL: A three-year letter-winner at Interlake, Fedor helped lead the team to the 2011 2a Washington State Championship, where she and the Saint Bernard defense allowed zero goals throughout the entire state tournament. a member of the Washington ODP team, earning an invitation to the 2011 Regional Camp and a spot on the Phoenix All-Tournament Team in 2011.

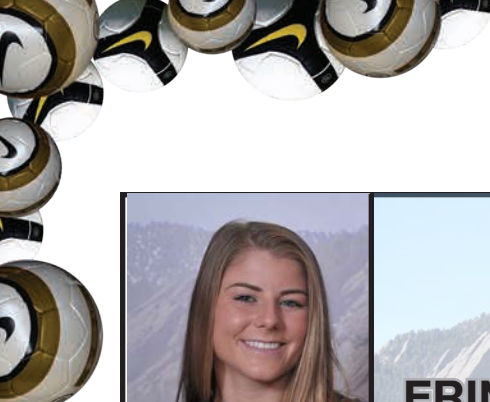

SOPHOMORE (2014): Herwatt competed in five matches during her sophomore campaign, including two non-conference battles and three Pac-12 Conference games against Stanford, Washington and Arizona State. She played a season-high 22 minutes at UNLV in the UNLV Nike Invitational. Herwatt was sidelined with an injury for the remaining four matches of the season.

FRESHMAN (2013): Herwatt saw action in 22 games, the second most of any freshman on the team. She took nine shots, sending five on goal. Herwatt needed just 16 minutes of field time against USC to net her first collegiate goal. She chipped one in over the keeper from 25 yards out to net the game-winner in the 72nd minute and help CU to a 2-1 home victory. Herwatt also had a strong performance against UT-Martin in the DU Invitational, taking three shots in a season-high 48 minutes played.

HIGH SCHOOL: One of the top players in the country, Herwatt has helped her teams to multiple championships. She has been ranked as high as No. 87 in the nation by Top Drawer Soccer, ranking fourth in her region. She is also No. 126 on the ESPNHS Class of 2013 Top 150 College Prospects list. IN THE CLASSROOM: Herwatt is a psychology major.

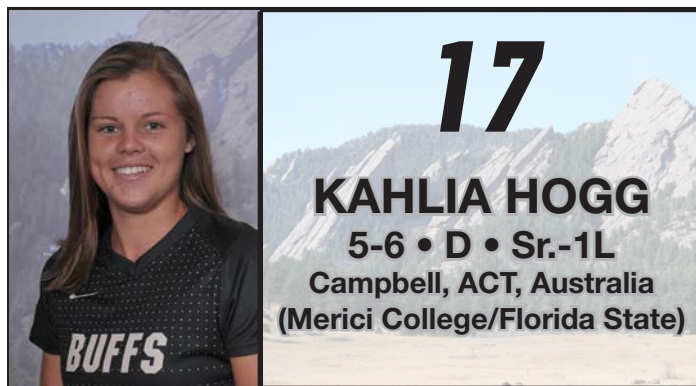

JUNIOR (2014): In her debut season for the Buffs, Hogg was third on the team in scoring, netting four total, two of which were game-winners and tied for third with four assists. She played in 22 matches, making 21 starts, totaling 1,690 minutes. Hogg also put 9 of her 18 shots on goal. She tallied her first point for the black in gold against Northern Colorado, an assist on the game-winning score and then went on to record her first goal at CU at UNLV in the UNLV Nike Invitational, helping CU go on to win 3-0. One of her biggest moments in her young Colorado career came against Oregon when she scored two goals in the final 15 minutes to lift the Buffs past the Ducks after CU had been trailing 1-0 up to that point. It was Hogg's first multi-goal game of her career. Her performance earned her CU Athlete of the Week honors.

SOPHOMORE (2013 at FLORIDA STATE): Hogg appeared in eight games, playing double digit minutes in five. She saw action in three of FSU's six NCAA Tournament games, playing against South Alabama, Colorado and Boston College.

FRESHMAN (2012 at FLORIDA STATE): Hogg saw minutes in 10 games and made two starts. She made her collegiate debut in FSU's 1-0 victory over then-No. 22 Florida. She made her first start in the next game, taking three shots against the College of Charleston. Hogg played a season-high 66 minutes against Jackson State, hitting a shot on goal as FSU won 5-0. Against Clemson, Hogg added an assist in the 86th minute, helping the Seminoles to a 7-0 victory. Hogg made her second start in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament, and saw action in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Hogg earned a spot on the ACC Academic Honor Roll, the fall 2012 Dean's List and the spring 2013 President's List.

HIGH SCHOOL: Hogg garnered national attention as a standout in her homeland of Australia. She played three seasons with Canberra United in the Westfield W-League, earning the Rising Star award following the 2009-10 season. She also was a member of the Chelsea U-14 Centre of Excellence team in England from 2006-08 and participated in the ACT Academy of Sport from 2008-11. Hogg was a member of the U-17 and U-20 Australian National Teams and was presented with the Pierre de Coubertin Award by the Australian Olympic Committee.

SOPHOMORE (2014): Hooks followed up her stellar debut season with another impressive year in black and gold. During her sophomore campaign, she started all 22 matches, tied her career-high with eight goals while setting a new personal best with six assists, 23 points and 58 shots. In Colorado's sophomore offensive record book, she ranks first in points, tied for second in goals, second in shots and tied for second in assists. She tallied the game-winning assist for the Buffs in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament against BYU, helping CU advance to the Round of 32 for a second straight year. She finished the year ranked in the top 15 in the Pac-12 in assists, goals, points and shots, and also led the Buffs in the same respective categories. Her outstanding performance on the pitch earned her a handful of honors including All-Pac-12 Second Team, Collegesportsmadness.com All-Pac-12 First Team, NSCAA/Continental All-Pacific Region Third Team, UNLV Nike Invitational All-Tournament Team and University of Colorado Female Athlete of the Year.

FRESHMAN (2013): Hooks had one of the strongest debuts in Colorado history. She became the first Buff to record multiple goals in her debut, scoring two in CU's 3-0 shutout of Northern Colorado. In her next game, she had her first game-winner, CU's lone score in a 1-0 win over Colorado College. Hooks next had game-winners in back-to-back victories over St. Mary's and Alabama. Just three games later, Hooks recorded her fourth game-winner (which ties for fourth best in a single season at CU), notching the first goal in a 4-0 stomping of Stony Brook. In the next, she contributed an assist in a 3-1 win over UNLV, helping her to a spot on the Omni Classic All-Tournament Team. Hooks missed the team's first four conference games due to an injury, but got back to her scoring ways against USC, netting a goal and contributing an assist in the 2-1 win over USC. An important part of the Buffs' attack throughout the season, Hooks was also key to their postseason run, drawing the foul that set up the game-winning goal over No. 15 Denver in the NCAA First Round. In CU's freshman offensive record books, Hooks concluded the season ranked third with eight goals and fourth with 18 points. Her 42 shots tied for eighth. Her eight goals also tie for eighth most in a single

season at CU. Hooks capped her freshman campaign with an invite to the U.S. Under-20 Women's National Team training camp and a spot on the All-Pac-12 Freshman Team. She was also named the team's Newcomer of the Year and the CU Female Freshman Athlete of the Year.

HIGH SCHOOL: Hooks was truly a leader for the Tahoma Bears. She has scored 36 goals in her career, and her 79 assists became a school record. At Tahoma she won three South Puget Sound League North Championships and back-to-back league championships. Hooks continued to improve, from a 19 point, 14-3-2 freshman season to a 58 point, 21-1 senior campaign. That season, she also set the record for most assists with 28. The Bears placed second at the state championship when Hooks was a sophomore and finished third in her final two seasons. Hooks' accolades are nearly endless. She was selected as first-team SPSL North four times, Seattle Times All-Area three times, first-team Tacoma News Tribune All-Area and first-team All-State twice and was a WIAA Team Academic Award winner twice (for athletes with a grade-point average of 3.85 or higher). She was her team's offensive and overall MVP twice a piece, as well as a two-time 4A state MVP. As a senior, she was the SPSL North's Co-MVP and TNT's player of the year. She played two seasons of basketball and ran track, but she also excelled beyond Tahoma. Her cross-fire ECNL club team won the state championship in 2011. In ODP, she competed in numerous events and camps, including two Thanksgiving Interregional Events, where she was the leading scorer in 2011. She was named All-Tournament second team at the 2011 and '12 Region IV ODP Championships. She was also invited to the US Youth Soccer National Training Sessions in 2010 and '11.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Hooks majors in sociology.

PERSONAL: Brianna Hooks was born in Seattle on Feb. 10, 1995. Her family is no stranger to sports. Her father, Kim Hooks, played baseball at Edmonds Community College, and her mother, Kelly Wir-tala, played tennis at Shoreline Community College. SOPHOMORE (2014): Huynh took the pitch in 12 matches and made nine starts, playing a pivotal role on the CU backline. She played a season-high 102 minutes in CU's double-overtime contest against former Big 12 Conference rival Kansas. She also played the full 90 minutes in all three Colorado Cup matches— against Colorado State, Northern Colorado and Denver, helping CU win the 2014 trophy. Huynh put three of her four total shots on goal and had one assist, which came against Detroit in a 3-0 victory. Huynh was sidelined halfway through the season with an injury, but returned to play in the final match of the regular season and helped CU advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, shutting out BYU at home in the opening round and forcing overtime at No. 6 North Carolina in the round of 32.

FRESHMAN (2013): Huynh had a strong debut season with the Buffs. She was the only freshman to start all 23 games, totaling 1,814 minutes. Huynh is just the sixth freshman at CU to start 23 or more games in her debut season. In that time, she contributed three assists, which ranks in the top nine all-time among CU freshmen. As a mid-back, she also helped CU to its nine shutouts. She earned points in just her third collegiate game, assisting the insurance in CU's 2-1 win over Air Force. She was at it again versus Stony Brook in the Omni Classic, contributing an assist in the 19th minute to help CU to a 4-0 shutout. Huynh had her third assist against USC, finding the goal scorer in the 66nd minute in the 2-1 win.

HIGH SCHOOL: Huynh succeeded on the pitch with multiple teams. A talented player at Australia's first selective sports school, she helped her team to four consecutive state championships. She was selected for the Under-15 and U-17 New South Wales Teams on her way to U-17 and U-20 appearance with the Australian team. She was a member of the Australian Schoolgirls and NSW Combined High Schools teams from 2009-11, winning championships each season, and taking home national titles in 2009 and '10. As a senior, she was a team captain and was named the NSW CHS player of the final. She was also awarded NSW CHS Blue in addition to blue honors from Westfields Sporting and Sydney South West as a junior. Huynh also played club ball with Western Sydney.

SOPHOMORE (2014): Kraus played in a career-high 20 matches and made her first career start against Northern Colorado in the Buffs' second contest of the 2014 Colorado Cup. She saw at least 20 minutes of playing time in 11 contests and was on the pitch for a season-high 51 minutes in Colorado's 1-0 victory over the UNC Bears. Kraus registered her first career point with an assist in CU's season opener against Colorado State. She also had two shots during the season with one on goal.

FRESHMAN (2013): Kraus saw game time in 13 matches, including five conference and two post-season games. She played 10 or more minutes in seven games, playing a season-high 24 minutes at Washington State. Two of her three shots came in the post-season against ranked teams – No. 15 Denver and No. 19 BYU.

HIGH SCHOOL: Kraus was a four-year letter-winner and two-time Cathedral Catholic Scholar Athlete, Union Tribune All-Academic, first-team Western League and second-team All-San Diego CIF selection. Her freshman season she was named to the San Diego Hall of Champions Student Athlete Leadership Program. She scored her first goal as a sophomore and earned the Coaches Varsity Award. Kraus scored two goals, contributed three assists and was named second-team All-North County as the Dons went 18-7-5 and took home the 2012 San Diego CIF Championship her junior season. She stood out in her final season, scoring 10 goals and adding 10 assists to help

the Dons to an outstanding 26-3-4 record. In 2013, the Dons won the Western League, Division III, San Diego CIF and California Regional Championships. As a senior, Kraus was selected to the Butch Lee Tournament Team and was named the CCHS MVP of winter sports. Kraus also excelled with the San Diego Surf club. The club won the Surf College Cup in 2011 and was victorious in back-to-back Surf Thanksgiving Cups ('09 and '10) and won three straight Surf Cups (2008-10). 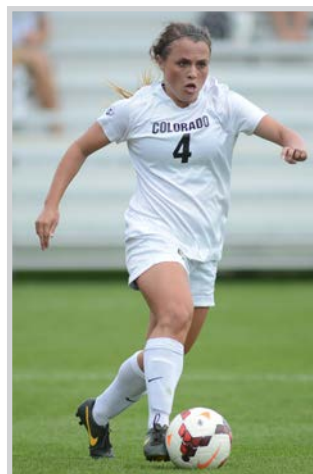

JUNIOR (2014): Krauser was a key contributor on offense during her junior year. She played in 15 matches and made 14 starts. In total, Krauser tallied three goals and four assists, which is tied for fifth most all-time among juniors in a single season. She also recorded an impressive .486 shots on goal percentage, forcing goalkeepers to make a save on 17 of her 35 shots. Krauser earned her first assist of the season in CU's season opener victory over Colorado State, 2-0. She then missed seven matches due to an injury and returned in the Pac-12 Conference opener against California. In her second match back, at USC, Krauser scored her first goal of the season, propelling the Buffs to a 1-0 victory. Her second tally came versus Arizona and then found the back of the net in the Buffaloes' first round match of the NCAA Tournament against BYU, putting CU up 2-0, eventually leading to a victory as the team advanced to the round of 32 for a second straight year. Krauser finished her junior year earning Pac-12 All-Academic Honorable Mention for a second straight season.

SOPHOMORE (2013): Krauser followed up her strong debut with an impressive sophomore campaign. She played in all 23 games, starting all but two. Krauser tallied 14 points off four goals and six assists, while taking 39 shots and 19 shots on goal. Her assist total ranks fourth best by a CU sophomore, and her points and goals both rank in the top eight of that category. With eight assists in her career, Krauser already ranks in the all-time top 13 for assists. Krauser began her point-getting when she assisted the game-winner in CU's 1-0 overtime win over Alabama. In the Buffs' next game, she added three assists in a 4-1 victory over UT-Martin. Krauser joins Jen Thais (2004) as the only Buffs to record more than two assists in a single game. Just two matches later, Krauser netted a goal and added an assist in CU's 4-0 shutout of Stony Brook, earning a spot on the Omni Classic All-Tournament Team. Krauser's other points helped the Buffs to big wins and key ties. She scored first against Oregon State to help the Buffs to their first ever home Pac-12 Conference win, scored the Buffs' lone goal in a near-upset but eventual tie of then-No. 9 California and scored early to force a 2-2 tie against Arizona State. Her final assist came on the game-winner against No. 19 BYU in the NCAA Round of 32.

FRESHMAN (2012): Krauser proved to be a standout player in her first season. She was the only freshman to play in and start every game. She ranked second and third on the team in shots (35) and shots on goal (16). She also led all freshmen with six points. Her two assists came in the Buffs' home opener against LIU (2-0) and home closer against Utah (1-1). Krauser was also a force on the road, scoring twice in away games. Her first goal came at Northwestern, keeping the Buffs in the game that ended in a 2-2 tie and helping her to CU Athlete of the Week honors. Her second goal was the game winner at Wyoming, setting the pace for a 2-0 victory.



Krauser's superb season also helped her to a spot on the Pac-12 Freshman Team.

HIGH SCHOOL: Krauser was a three-time first-team All-Sea View League selection and three-time team most valuable player at Woodbridge High School. She helped the Warriors to the CIF State Tournament for the first time in 10 years in 2011. She had a high school career total of 32 goals and 31 assists. With the So Cal Blues club team, she won multiple championships including the 2011 USYSA Region IV (in which she scored the first goal in the 2-0 win against the favorite Oregon Rush), 2010 Coast Soccer Premier League

and 2009 National League Far West Regional titles. She was a National Cup semi-finalist in 2008 and earned championships in both the U-15 and U-16 Coast Soccer Premier Leagues. She was named a Girls' Soccer Player to Watch for 2009-10 by OCVarsity.com. She was also part of the Warriors' 2009 and 2011 league champion track teams and still has her name in the books as a member of the group that holds the school's 4x100 record.

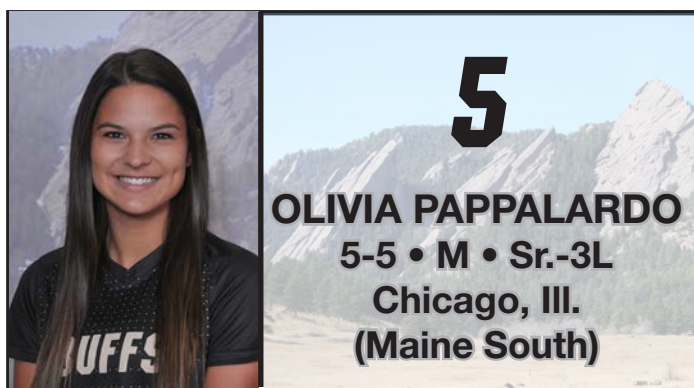

She played a season-high 87 minutes during a double-overtime tie against Washington, which contributed to her 847 total minutes on the pitch. Pappalardo tallied a pair of goals in 2014 to go along with a pair of assists. Her two assists came in back-to-back matches against Pac-12 opponents, Oregon State and Oregon as CU won 1-0 and 2-1, respectively. Both of Pappalardo's goals were game-winners, her first was at home versus Arizona State, helping CU claim the 2-0 victory. She

also scored the game-winner against 15th-ranked BYU in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, lifting CU to a 1-0 lead, eventually going on to win, 2-0, to advance to the round of 32 for a second straight season. Her success in the classroom also earned her Pac-12 All-Academic Honorable Mention.



SOPHOMORE (2013): Pappalardo was an important part of the Buffs' midfield, playing in 16

games and making 13 starts, until an injury sidelined her for the final seven games of the season. In the Buffs' third match, she contributed two assists to help CU to a 2-0 shutout of Air Force. The two-assist performance was the first by a Buff since 2010. Just three games later, she scored her first collegiate goal, netting the game-winner in a 4-1 thrashing of UT-Martin. Pappalardo matched a season-high three shots against USC before a non-contact injury took her out of the game and ended her season.

FRESHMAN (2012): Pappalardo showed versatility in her first season, playing a freshman-high 1,541 minutes. In 19 games, including 16 starts, Pappalardo took 16 shots, ranking second among freshmen. Her two assists came in back-to-back victories against Cincinnati (2-1) and Wyoming (2-0). She played a season-high 110 minutes in the Pac-12 opener at Oregon (0-0).

JUNIOR (2014): Paxton played an important role off the bench, contributing to the Buffs' offense with two goals and two assists. She competed in all 22 matches, accruing 980 minutes and made three starts, two against non-conference opponents, UNLV and Kent State in the UNLV Nike Invitational and one versus Pac-12 foe, Stanford. She also took the pitch in both NCAA Tournament matches. Paxton was tied for fifth on the team with 18 shots and put 10 one frame. She tallied her two goals against Detroit and San Francisco and recorded assists in back-to-back matches at home versus Arizona and Utah.



SOPHOMORE (2013): Paxton was an important substitute as a sophomore, playing in all 23 games, totally 1,006 minutes. She made seven starts, including all of the Buffs' NCAA Tournament games. She took 28 shots, sending 17 on goal. Paxton shined during the Omni Hotels Colorado Women's Soccer Classic. She scored her first goal of the season in the 78th minute of CU's 4-0 shutout of Stony Brook. In the next game, she took a season-high four shots in just 24 minutes playing time against UNLV. She was an important part of the Buffs' run to the Sweet 16, scoring the first goal against No. 19 BYU in the Round of 32 to help the Buffs to an eventual 2-1 victory.

FRESHMAN (2012): Paxton made an impressive debut, contributing an assist in the Buffs' season opener against Northern Colorado (3-0). Paxton played in 19 games, made three starts and tied for third on the team with two goals. She scored with just eight minutes remaining in regulation to send the Pac-12 home opener against Washington into overtime. In a tough 2-1 loss to defending NCAA Champions Stanford, Paxton gave the Buffs the upper hand right before the break.

The team quickly turned things around, more than tripling their win total in Reeves' sophomore season. That year, the Spartans went 17-6-4, and Reeves netted two goals and added seven assists. Her junior season, she had three goals and eight assists, helping Villa Park to a 19-6-5 record, while earning an AP Scholar Award. Reeves earned first-team All-Orange County honors and served as team captain during her junior and senior seasons. Reeves capped her high school heroics with first-team All-CIF honors. As a senior she was also named her team MVP and Villa Park's Female Athlete of the Year. In the IMG Academy 2014 Top 150 Rankings, Reeves was No. 101 overall, ranking No. 19 in Region IV and sitting as the 16th ranked defender. Reeves helped the So Cal Blues to Blues Cup Championships in 2011 and '13 and LV Players Showcase and Schwan's USA Cup V Elite Puma Showcase Championships in 2012. In 2014, the club competed at the ECNL National Championship. Reeves also has extensive ODP experience, as a member of the Cal South ODP 1995 summer/winter pool from 2009-12 and the Region IV pool from 2009-11 (she received an invite in 2012). With the ODP team, Reeves won Region IV Championships three straight years, from 2010-12, and the National Championship in 2012. She was also invited to the National Development Camp in 2010 and '11 and was named Region IV All-Tournament Second Team in 2010 and First Team in 2011.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Reeves intends to major in marketing.

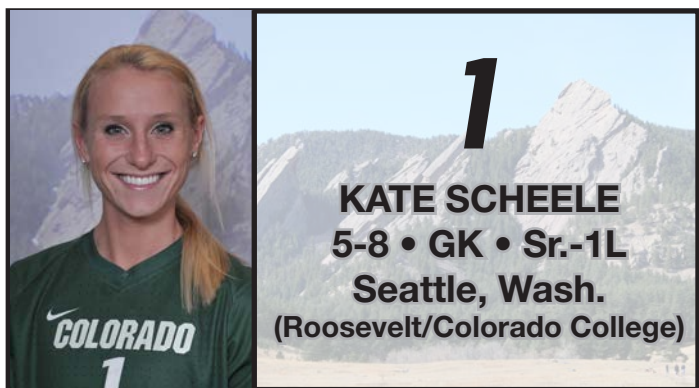

JUNIOR (2014): Scheele turned in a stellar performance between the posts in her debut season for the Buffaloes. She logged 2,001 minutes in goal and shutout 11 opponents, which was third-most in the Pac-12, second most all-time in a single season in school history and already ranks fifth in the CU individual career record book. Six of her shutouts came against non-conference competition and she started her 2014 campaign holding the first three teams scoreless as the Buffs outscored their opponents 6-0 and five shutouts came against conference foes. She finished the season with 78 saves, and a 0.76 goals against average, fourth lowest mark in program history during one season. Scheele also was the goalkeeper of record in all 22 matches. Her 14 wins ties for second most all-time in a single season at the goalie position.

SOPHOMORE (2013 at COLORADO COLLEGE): Scheele had a standout season as a sophomore at CC. She helped the squad to Conference USA regular season and tournament championships. She was named to the C-USA First Team and earned conference defensive player of the week and C-USA Tournament Most Valuable Defensive Player honors. Scheele started all 22 of CC's games, spending just under 2,000 minutes in the net and posting a 15-4-3 record. The Tigers dropped three of their first five games (two of which were against ranked opponents), but didn't lose again until the end of conference play, helping them advance to the NCAA Tournament, where they fell in the first round to Duke in a shootout. Scheele improved in every area of play in her second year, allowing just 17 goals, for a goals-against average of 0.77, while grabbing 74 saves (and posting an .813 save percentage) and helping shut out a total of 13 opponents.

FRESHMAN (2012 at COLORADO COLLEGE): As a freshman, Scheele started 10 of her 12 games played, including the first five games of the season. She recorded four shutouts in 2012 and became the first CC freshman since 2005 to record back-to-back shutouts (against in-state rivals Denver and Colorado) to begin her career. She posted a 4-2-4 record, including a 2-2-1 mark in Conference USA play, helping the Tigers to the regular season title. Scheele made a season-high 10 saves at No. 5 BYU. At season's end, she ranked in C-USA's top 10 with four shutouts, a .333 shutouts per game average, a .790 save percentage and a 4.08 saves per game average.

HIGH SCHOOL: During her prep career, Scheele stood out both athletically and academically. At Roosevelt, Scheele was on honor roll for three years and earned an AP Scholar Award in 2012. With Crossfire Premier ECNL, Scheele helped her club to the regional finals in 2009 and semifinals in 2010. In 2011, she led Crossfire to the Washington State Championship and the ECNL finals, helping her to a spot on the ECNL National Showcase Event Series All-Event Team in San Antonio. The following year, she earned a spot on the All-Event Team in San Diego. Scheele also shined as a member of the Washington State ODP team from 2007-10. During each of those four years, she also attended the Region IV camp. She was invited to the U.S. U-18 National Team training camp in 2012. Scheele was also a member of the W-League player pools for both the Seattle Sounders in 2012 and the Colorado Rapids in 2013.

IN THE CLASSROOM: Scheele is a history major.

PERSONAL: Kathryn Scheele was born on August 6, 1994 in Walla Walla, Washington. Her parents Leonard and Suzanne Scheele are both retired doctors of medicine. Her mother, who played water polo at Harvard, also works as a biomedical researcher. Scheele's father was a professional cyclist. Her brother Steve wrestled for Stanford and currently attends the University of Michigan Law School. When not playing soccer, she enjoys baking, reading, drawing and hiking. SOPHOMORE (2014): Stanton had an impressive debut season for the Buffs. She started all 22 matches and accumulated 1,773 minutes, fourth most on the team while playing a pivotal role in the midfield. She also was on the pitch for the entire time in eight contests during her sophomore campaign. She recorded her first point as a Buffalo in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, tallying the assist on CU's second goal of the match as the Buffs went on to win, 2-0, and advance to the second round of the tournament. She also had three total shots and helped Colorado shutout 12 opponents, tying a single-season program record. Her performance in the Buffs' regular season finale against Utah earned her Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week honors when she led CU to its 11th shutout at the time and held the Utes to only 11 total shots.

FRESHMAN (2013 at SANTA CLARA): Stanton saw action in seven of the Broncos' games. Her one shot, taken in Santa Clara's 1-0 overtime victory over Fresno State, was on goal.

HIGH SCHOOL: Stanton played one year of soccer at Bear Creek, earning first-team All-Conference honors as a sophomore, but chose to focus her attention primarily on her club team, Colorado Rush. The captain of her U-11 to U-18 teams, Stanton helped the club to a U-18 ECNL finalist spot. She was also a W-League member from U-14 through U-18. She was named an NSCAA Youth All-American in 2012 and '13. Stanton was a member of the U-13-U-15 State and Regional ODP teams. In the U.S. National Team Pool from U-14 to U-20, Stanton was a member of the U-17 World Cup team, scoring a goal against Gambia. Stanton ranked 23rd in the Top Drawer Soccer IMG Academy 150, also ranking fifth in the Rocky Mountain and Southwest Region and eighth amongst midfielders.

SOPHOMORE (2014): Tillitt served as the back-up goalkeeper where she played in one match for 14:41 against Detroit. She made two saves and earned a combined shutout, helping CU record one of its 12 shutouts of the season.

FRESHMAN (2013): Tillitt saw action in two games as CU's back-up keeper, totaling 24:36, allowing zero goals in that span. She helped hold CU's 4-1 victory over UT-Martin in the DU Invitational, and played a season-high 19:05 in CU's 3-0 loss at Washington State.

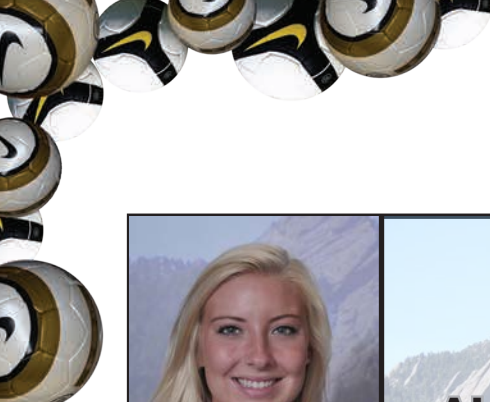

1998 Milestones

- Colorado opened the season with a 2-0 loss to 1997 national champion North Carolina in front of a school record 3,000 fans.
- With 36 saves in one weekend, including a school record 19 against BYU on Sept. 11, Sloane Cox became Colorado's career saves leader with 189 (passing Nina Bjornstad who had 158).
- Shawn Kenyon became the first Buff to record 100 shots with No. 100 coming against Utah on Sept. 13.
- CU earned their first ever win in a Big 12 Conference opener with a 3-0 win over Oklahoma on Oct. 2.
- Cox notched the first ever point for a CU goalkeeper with her assist of Jessica Wollow's second goal on Oct. 2 vs. Oklahoma.
- CU ran into its program-worst losing streak with the fifth consecutive loss to Denver 1-0 on Oct. 18.
- With a 6-0 loss to Missouri, the final game of the season, Cox finished her career as the holder of every Colorado goalkeeping record. In addition to her 200th save of the season, Cox also recorded the 333rd save of her career, and had six shutouts.
- Sloane Cox was named to the All-Big 12 second team, the first player in CU soccer history to be named All-Conference.
- Cox was also named Big 12 Athlete of the Week for September 2 (first player in program history to earn the honor) and CU Athlete of the Week for November 1.
- Teri Fildey was named TCI Student Athlete of the Week for September 5.
- Five players were named to the Academic All-Big 12 first team: Fildey, Cartmell, Matassa, Kenyon, Pascoe.
- Melissa Cartmell led the Buffs offense with 50 shots, six goals, two assists and 14 points.
- Assistant coach Kim LeMere was inducted into the University of Hartford's Alumni Hall of Fame on April 17.

- CU received back-to-back Athlete of the Week honors in Melissa Cartmell and Lindsey Galas for the weeks ending Aug. 29 and Sept. 5.
- Cartmell ended a five game scoring streak, the longest in school history, against Wyoming on Sept. 5.
- Head coach Austin Daniels recorded his 20th win at Colorado against Wyoming.

2001 Milestones

- Bill Hempen was named head coach of the Colorado Soccer team in June, replacing Austin Daniels.
- Hempen earned his first win at Colorado with the 2-1 decision over Wyoming on Sept. 2.
- Hempen coached his milestone 300th career game vs. Missouri, however the Buffs fell 2-0 in the match.
- Colorado bounced back from a 10 game winless streak with a win over Colorado College 1-0 on Oct. 21. The win also ended a four-game scoreless streak that dated back to Oct. 7 at Oklahoma.
- When Hempen cleared his bench and substituted the entire field late in the first half vs. Kansas, he set a program mark for most players in a game as the Buffs played 24 by the final buzzer.

- CU's eight freshmen made more than an immediate impression on the coaching staff as five freshmen scored seven of Colorado's 17 goals on the season and have dished off six of the team's 17 assists.
- Colorado's 2-2 tie against No. 9 Texas A&M was the programs best result vs. a ranked team since a 3-2 win over then-No. 22 Baylor in 1997.
- The Buffs scored 17 goals by 12 different players, the most players to get in the goal column in the program's history.

- For the first time in program history, Colorado was ranked in a pair of preseason polls at No. 17 in the nation in the *Soccer America* poll and No. 23 in the *NSCAA/adidas* list.

2007 Milestones

- Fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament bid and second straight year playing host to the first and second rounds in Boulder.
- Colorado recorded 10 wins on the season for the sixth straight year.
- Five Buffaloes were named to All-Big 12 Teams.
- Colorado played No. 1 ranked Stanford on Friday, Sept. 21 and the Buffs welcomed a school record 3,128 fans. Head football coach Dan Hawkins and the football team were also in attendance. The record-breaking crowd topped the previous record at Prentup Field by 1,239 people, set last year in the first round of the NCAA Tournament against Colorado College. The all-time record, before the Stanford game, was set in 1998 when the Buffs played No. 1 North Carolina in front of an even 3,000 fans at Pleasant View Soccer Complex.
- CU shut out its opponents on 10 different occasions, marking the fourth time in the history of the program that they have recorded nine or more shut-outs in a single season.
- Nikki Marshall's goal against Oklahoma, just 27 seconds into overtime, was the quickest overtime goal in program history, besting the previous mark of 91:06, set by former Buff Melissa Cartmell in 1998, by 39 seconds. Michaela DeJesus' goal in the Utah game came just 52 seconds into the match, going down as the quickest goal in the 11 year history of the program, shattering the previous record of 1:33 set by Jen Almquist vs. Hawai'i in 1996 by 41 seconds.

• As the third seed, Colorado made its eighth-straight appearance in the Big 12 Championship.

• Nikki Marshall owns CU's all-time top scoring spot with 93 points off 42 goals and 9 assists in her four years as a Buff-falo.

• Marshall tied her previously set CU record of scoring our goals in one match against Oklahoma on Oct. 2.

• The Buffs' eight goals against St. Mary's is the most scored by a CU offense in program history.

• Marshall scored CU's first goal against St. Mary's in just 23 seconds, which is a school record for the quickest goal made. Just one game later, Marshall set another school record after scoring the gamewinner in the 109th minute against Denver to secure a 1-0 double-overtime win for the Buffs. This is the latest goal scored by a Buff since extra time was shortened to 10 minutes a period in 1998.

2010 Milestones

- Head coach Bill Hempen completed his 10th year as head coach at CU, where he has registered a 110-75-26 record.
- Eighth-seeded Colorado entered the Big 12 postseason tournament for the ninth consecutive year. It was the 12th time in program history that the Buffaloes continued play past the regular season.
- On Sept. 24, The Buffs beat then No. 6-ranked Texas A&M 2-1 in overtime. It was the first time CU beat the Aggies during the regular season.
- Kate Russell contributed the assists in Colorado's 2-1 overtime victory over Washington State. Her two assists in one game tied her in second place on CU's single game record list. Russell's five overall assists put her in a seven-way tie for ninth place on the individual season records list.
- Alex Dohm became only the fourth Buffalo to earn both All-Big 12 Newcomer team and All-Big 12 Second Team honors in the same season.
- 2010 marked the final season for CU in the Big 12 Conference before moving to the Pac-12 in the 2011 season. Colorado was a charter member of the Big 12, which began in 1996, the same year the CU soccer program was formed. CU soccer holds a 60-66-14 all-time record within the conference.

2011 Milestones

- With a 5-0 routing Colorado College and a 3-0 shutout of Northern Colorado to begin the season, the Buffs won the inaugural Colorado Cup.
- 2011 marked the first season for CU in the Pac-12 Conference. Prior to joining the newly formed conference, the Buffs spent 15 years in the Big 12. In their first season in the Pac-12, the Buffs concluded conference play with a 1-9-1 record.
- The Buffs defeated California 1-0 on October 21. It marked the first victory in the Pac-12 for any Colorado team.
- Junior Amy Barczuk was an All-Pac-12 honorable mention and a U.S. Under-23 national training camp and national team selection.
- Bill Hempen stepped down as the head coach of the Colorado women's soccer team at the conclusion of the 2011 season. Under Hempen's tutelage, the Buffs racked up a 114-88-27 record through 11 seasons and made six NCAA appearances. In 2003, (Hempen's third year in the position), he led the Buffs to the Big 12 regular season title and was named the Big 12 Coach of the Year. Hempen coached three All-Americans at CU and helped the program to the biggest single-season turnaround in Big 12 history in just his second season.
- Four wins was the second fewest wins in program history. The fewest was three in Hempen's first season in 2001. Eleven losses also marked the most in a single season for the program.

2012 Milestones

- Danny Sanchez became just the third head soccer coach in Colorado history on Dec. 19, 2011.
- It took Sanchez just eight games to lead the Buffs to five wins, faster than either of his predecessors.
- For the second straight season, the Buffs won the Colorado Cup, picking up wins over Northern Colorado and Colorado College.
- The Buffs began the season with three shutouts and a five-game unbeaten streak (3-0-2) - both program firsts.
- Colorado scored off own goals in back-to-back games during the DU Invitational, marking just the third and fourth own goals in school history.
- CU had its best non-conference season since 2008, going 6-1-2. It marked just the sixth time that the Buffs won at least six non-conference matches.
- The Buffs picked up back-to-back Pac-12 road matches for the first time since joining the conference in 2011, defeating USC 1-0 in double overtime and shutting out Arizona 3-0.
- The Buff defense tallied eight shutouts (ranking fourth in the conference and tying for sixth all-time at CU).
- Captain Amy Barczuk became one of only eight players in CU soccer history to have started at least 76 of 78 games played and only the fourth to have played in every one of the team's games during her four year tenure at CU. She was selected by the Western New York Flash in the second round of the inaugural NWSL draft.

2013 Milestones

- The Buffs won a school record 10 non-conference matches (including two in the NCAA Tournament).
- Colorado earned its first ever conference victories (also its first Pac-12 home wins at Prentup Field) since joining the conference against Oregon State and Oregon.
- Finished a school-best sixth place in the Pac-12 Conference.
- Earned a berth to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2008 and along with UCLA and Stanford, became one of three Pac-12 teams to make it to the second round of play.
- Knocked off the 15th-ranked overall and fourth-seed Denver Pioneers 1-0 to advance to the second round.
- Eliminated No. 19 Brigham Young by a final 2-1 score to advance to the Sweet 16 for just the second time in program history.
- CU shut out a program-record five straight opponents to open the season
- The Buffs set a school record by notching victories in their first six matches.
- The Buffs won 14 games, marking just the fifth season a team has reached that mark (also done in 2003, '04, '06 and '08- all years CU made a trip to the NCAAs).

PRENTUP FIELD

Prentup Field, located on the East Campus of the University of Colorado at Boulder, has been the home of Colorado Soccer since 2003. The field had been the home of the now-obsolete Colorado baseball team before the women's soccer team took over.

Prentup combines the very best of what Boulder has to offer, with beautiful Colorado mountain views and a lush pitch courtesy of CU's turf management team.

The Buffaloes have always enjoyed great home advantages in Boulder. CU formerly played its matches at Pleasant View Soccer Complex in North Boulder. This facility had an award-winning field for CU to play on and nine surrounding fields for training.

During that time, the Buffaloes compiled a home record of 50-28-5, a win percentage of .633. The Buffs also played host to over 3,000 fans on Sept. 2, 1998, when they hosted then-defending national champion North Carolina.



THE SCOREBOARD AT PRENTUP FIELD WAS ERECTED IN THE FALL OF 2005.

Upon the arrival of coach Bill Hempen, the Buffs started training at Prentup in the spring of 2002 while it was still a baseball field.

In the spring of 2003, the soccer team was granted exclusive use of Prentup, and work began to re-landscape the field. All remnants of the baseball field except for the outfield fence were razed, and the turf began a major makeover.

Prentup Field is now a 160,000 square foot facility that contains a 120x75 yard game field along with a practice area. It is a native soil field and is equipped with an automated irrigation system. When the irrigation was installed and the field was graded in July of 2003, the turf management team produced a playable soccer facility from seed in just 33 days.

Each week, the field is painted and mowed 3-4 times in preparation for matches and practices under the supervision of Ryan Newman, along with a collection of other maintenance practices.

The Buffs trained at Prentup from 2002-04, and finally in the fall of 2004, they played their first-ever match there, defeating Northern Colorado by a score of 3-0 on October 1, 2004. In 2005, Prentup became CU's full time home, with the Buffaloes posting a record of 7-1-0 in their first full season and an all-time mark of 55-26-7.

Capital improvements to the facility are ongoing. An athletic department fund-raising campaign in the summer of 2005 helped raise funds to put in bleachers for 1,200 people, a new scoreboard, nets behind the goals and iron entrance gates adorned with the CU logo into the venue. Additional funds in advance of the 2006 NCAA Tournament added more bleachers, bringing the seating capacity of Prentup Field to 2,000 people.

While there are bleachers for 2,000, fans of CU soccer bring lawn chairs and blankets to sit on as well in the open areas, continuing some of the community feel of Pleasant View at the current home.

In the fall of 2007, Prentup and the Buffs welcomed top-ranked Stanford to Boulder and dropped a 1-0 heartbreaker to the Cardinal in front of a facility record 3,128 fans, shattering the previous record by 1,257 people. Colorado has also had the privilege of hosting back-to-back NCAA Tournament first and second rounds in 2006 and 2007, welcoming 1,871 fans against Colorado College in '06 and 1,843 against No. 2 Portland in '07. In 2014., the Buffs hosted a first round match against No. 15 Brigham Young.

PRENTUP FIELD

Prentup Field has been home to University of Colorado athletics for almost 40 years, as the venue is named after former CU baseball coach Frank "Chief" Prentup. The field, formerly known as Varsity Field, was renamed after the former coach in 1978. The complex remained a popular venue until the varsity baseball team was removed in 1980.

The field was used by several different entities within Colorado athletics after 1980. The club baseball team played there, and CU's mascot Ralphie was even known to have taken practice runs there.

The complex is located just west of CU's Potts Field track & field complex and ski building. Amenities for Buffalo soccer fans include concessions, rest rooms and free parking and game programs.

PAC-12 CONFERENCE

Built on a firm foundation of academic excellence and superior athletic performance, the Conference ushered in a new era on July 1, 2011, officially becoming the Pac-12 Conference with the additions of the University of Colorado and University of Utah.

Just 27 days after the Conference officially changed its name, Commissioner Larry Scott announced the creation of the Pac-12 Networks on July 27, 2011, solidifying a landmark television deal and putting the Conference on the forefront of collegiate athletics. The Networks, including one national network, six regional networks, and a robust digital network marked the first-ever integrated media company owned by a college conference. In addition, the "TV Everywhere" rights allow fans to access Pac-12 Networks outside the home on any digital device, including smartphones and tablet computers.

That same year, the Pac-12 also launched its Globalization Initiative to proactively promote the Conference and member institutions through student-athlete exchanges and sport. In the first four years, Pac-12 student-athletes have enjoyed unique cultural and athletic experiences in China, fielding full university and Pac-12 all-star teams in women's volleyball and men's basketball, with the first-ever men's basketball regular season game schedule to be played in China between WASHINGTON and Texas to tip off the 2015-16 campaign. The Conference and its member schools have gained significant brand exposure for the future and set a foundation for growth.

On the field, the Pac-12 rises above the rest, upholding its tradition as the "Conference of Champions®," claiming an incredible 140 NCAA team titles since 1999-2000, including nine in 2014-15, an average of nearly nine championships per academic year. Even more impressive has been the breadth of the Pac-12's success, with championships coming in 28 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-12 has led or tied the nation in NCAA Championships in 49 of the last 55 years, the only exceptions being in 1980-81, 1988-89, 1990-91 and 1995-96 when the Conference finished second, and only twice finished third in 1998-99 and 2004-05.

For the 10th-consecutive year, the Pac-12 had the most or tied for the most NCAA titles of any conference in the country, winning at least six every year since 2000-01. No other conference has won double-digit NCAA crowns in a single year, the Pac-12 doing so seven times, including a record 14 in 1996-97.

Spanning nearly a century of outstanding athletics achievements, the Pac-12 was the first conference to reach 400 championships in 2010-11. With the inclusion of Colorado and Utah, the Conference surpassed another major milestone, with league teams capturing 450 titles, outdistancing the next conference by nearly 200. In all, Conference teams have won 478 NCAA Championships (291 men's, 158 women's, 29 combined).

Pac-12 members have won 291 NCAA team championships on the men's side, 77 more than the next closest conference. Men's NCAA crowns have come at a phenomenal rate for the Pac-12 - 16 basketball titles by six schools (more than any other conference), 54 tennis titles, 47 outdoor track & field crowns, and 28 baseball titles. Pac-12 members have won 25 of 46 NCAA titles in volleyball, 41 of 46 in water polo, 29 in skiing, and 24 in swimming & diving national championships.

Individually, the Conference has produced an impressive number of NCAA individual champions. Over 2,000 (2,208) individual crowns have been won by Pac-12 student-athletes over the years with 1,333 by male student-athletes. Student-athletes have also captured 174 individual titles at combined championships (ie., skiing and fencing).

On the women's side, the story is much the same. Since the NCAA began conducting women's championships 34 years ago, Pac-12 members have claimed at least four national titles in a single season on 25 occasions, including 15-consecutive years from 2000-2015. Overall, the Pac-12 has captured 158 NCAA women's titles, easily outdistancing the SEC, which is second with 97. Pac-12 members have dominated a number of sports, winning 23 softball titles, 21 tennis crowns, 14 volleyball titles, 16 of the last 26 trophies in golf, and 14 in swimming & diving.

Pac-12 women student-athletes shine nationally on an individual basis, as well, having captured an unmatched 701 NCAA individual crowns, an average of nearly 21 championships per season.

The roots of the Pac-12 Conference date back nearly 100 years to December 2, 1915, when the Pacific Coast Conference (PCC) was founded at a meeting at the Imperial Hotel in Portland, Ore. The original membership consisted of four schools - the University of California at Berkeley, the University of Washington, the University of Oregon, and Oregon Agricultural College (now Oregon State University). All still are charter members of the Conference.

Pacific Coast Conference play began in 1916 and, one year later, Washington State College (now Washington State University) was accepted into the league, with Stanford University following in 1918.

In 1922, the PCC expanded to eight teams with the admission of the University of Southern California (USC) and the University of Idaho. In 1924, the University of Montana joined the league roster and in 1928, the PCC grew to 10 members with the addition of UCLA.

The Pacific Coast Conference competed as a 10-member league until 1950, with the exception of 1943-45 when World War II curtailed intercollegiate athletic competition to a minimum. During that time, the league's first commissioner was named. Edwin N. Atherton was Commissioner in 1940 and was succeeded by Victor O. Schmidt in 1944. In 1950, Montana resigned from the Conference and the PCC continued as a nine-team Conference through 1958.



In 1959, the PCC was dissolved and the Athletic Association of Western Universities (AAWU) was formed with Thomas J. Hamilton was appointed Commissioner of the new league. The original AAWU membership included California, Stanford, USC, UCLA and Washington. Washington State joined the membership in 1962, while Oregon and Oregon State joined in 1964. Under Hamilton's watch, the name Pacific-8 Conference was adopted in 1968. In 1971, Wiles Hallock took over as Commissioner of the Pac-8.

Ten years later, on July 1, 1978, the University of Arizona and Arizona State University were admitted to the league and the Pacific-10 Conference became a reality. In 1986-87, the league took on a new look, expanding to include 10 women's sports. Since then, the Conference has been considered the premiere league in women's athletics, securing the most NCAA titles in women's sports of any conference nearly every year.

Thomas C. Hansen was named the Commissioner of the Pac-10 in 1983, a role he would hold for 26 years until 2009, and was succeeded by current Commissioner Larry Scott, who took on the new role in July 2009.

During the 2010-11 academic year, the University of Colorado accepted its invitation to join the Pac-12 on June 11, 2010, and on June 17, 2010, the University of Utah agreed to join the Conference. The Buffaloes and Utes officially became the 11th and 12th members of the Conference on July 1, 2011, the first additions to the league since 1978.

It was during that 2010-11 academic year that Scott helped deliver monumental changes that transformed the Conference into a modern 12-team league. In addition to expanding to 12 teams, member institutions agreed to equal revenue sharing for the first time in the Conference's history, created two divisions - the North and the South, for football only and established a Football Championship Game for the first time ever. He also secured a landmark media rights deal that dramatically increased national exposure and revenue for each school, establishing the Pac-12 Networks and Pac-12 Digital Network that guaranteed enhanced exposure across all sports.

Currently, the Pac-12 sponsors 11 men's sports and 12 women's sports, with beach volleyball added in 2015-16. Additionally, the Conference is a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) in four other men's sports and three women's sports.

The Pac-12 Conference offices are located in the heart of San Francisco in the SOMA district.

BIG 12 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS

In 2003, when Jen Thais said in a preseason press conference that her season goal was, "to make the NCAA Tournament and to be nationally recognized. What I'm hoping... what I'm expecting, is to surprise people," little did she know what kind of impact that prediction would have on the eighth team in Colorado soccer history... and the nation for that matter.

A record breaking season was approached in four phases. Phase I were the preseason exhibition games where the Buffs shutout Northern Colorado 4-0 and Air Force 3-0.

Phase II consisted of CU's non-conference schedule where the Buffs came out virtually unscathed at 7-1. In the season opener, they held defending national champion and then-No. 2 Portland scoreless for 87 minutes before suffering a 1-0 defeat. The Buffs would regroup and close out the remainder of the non-conference season 7-0, beating teams by a 17-2 scoring margin. It was during Phase II that CU picked up its first-ever win against a top-10 ranked opponent when it handed then-No. 9 Denver a 3-0 blanking, just days after the Pioneers had upended Portland.

Enter Phase III... the Big 12 Conference season. The Buffs came away from the '03 season 8-1-1, the crescendo of the season being a 3-1 win over nemesis Nebraska in the season finale for both teams in below freezing temperatures on a pitch covered in ice. Colorado's 25 season points was the fourth highest in league standings history. At the conclusion of the regular season, the Buffs came away with the coach, player and rookie of the year, a first-team All-Big 12 pick, three second-teamers and five of their nine newcomers named to the All-Newcomer team.

With 25 school single-season, class and career records shattered, Colorado entered the final phase of the season, Phase IV... the postseason. They went into the eighth Big 12 Conference Tournament as the No. 1 seed for the first time in program history, and a week later the Buffs entered their first NCAA Tournament as just one of 16 seeded teams.

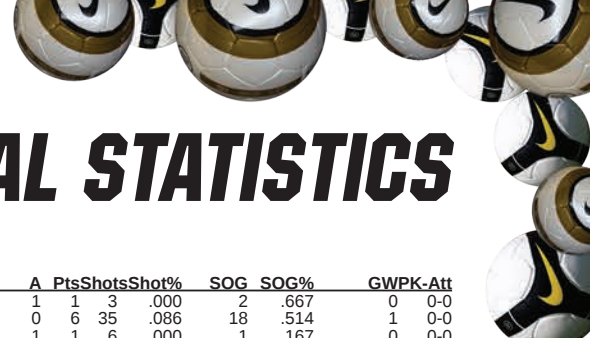

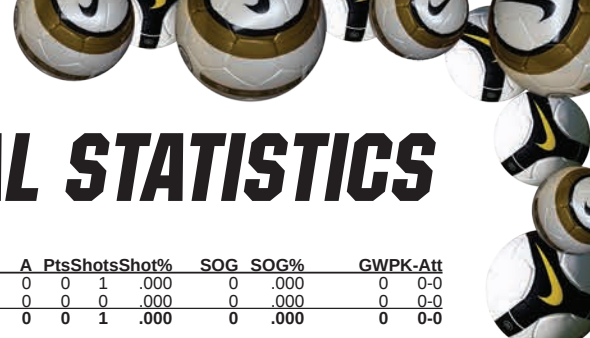

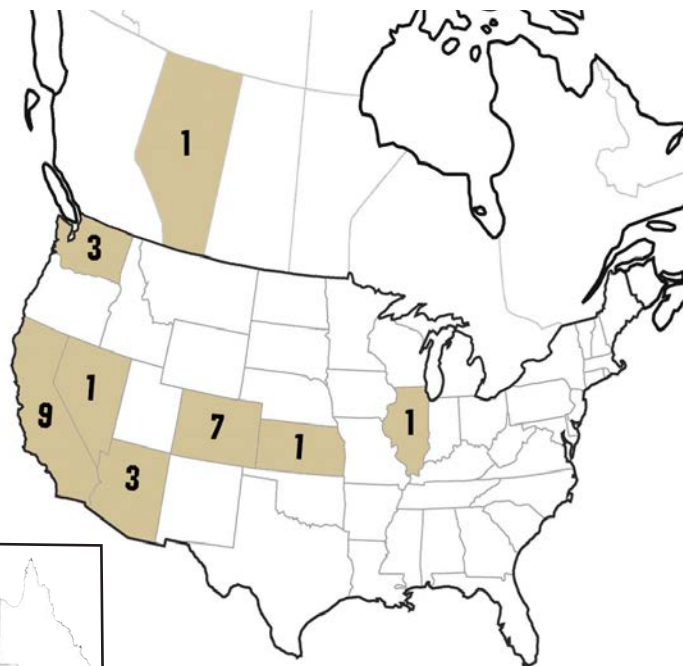

BUFFS IN THE LEAGUE

The National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) is a nine-team Division-I women's professional soccer league featuring national team players from Canada, Mexico and the U.S. The nine clubs are the Boston Breakers, Chicago Red Stars, Houston Dash, FC Kansas City, Portland Thorns FC, Seattle Reign FC, Sky Blue FC, the Washington Spirit and the Western New York Flash. Based in Chicago, the NWSL is supported by the Canadian Soccer Association, Federation of Mexican Football and the United States Soccer Federation. Each of the league's nine clubs will play a total of 20 games during a 21-week span, with a schedule consisting of 10 matches at home and 10 away. The 2015 NWSL regular season will begin on Friday, April 10 and conclude the weekend of Sept. 5-6 with eight clubs in action during the final three days of the campaign. The top four teams will qualify for the NWSL playoffs and compete in the semifinals on Sunday, Sept. 13. The NWSL will crown its champion on Thursday, Oct. 1.

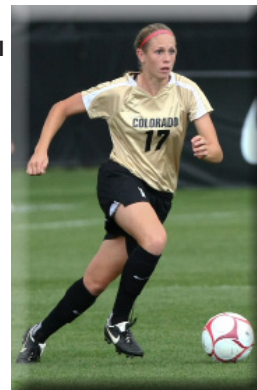
