2010-11 OUTLOOK



Since **Linda Lappe** returned to the University of Colorado as head women's basketball coach this past April, she's been preaching fundamentals, discipline and communication to her new team. After all those were traits instilled in her as a player for the Buffaloes from 1998-2003, an impressive ride that culminated with three NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2002 Elite Eight.

Lappe has been able to work with her new team in bits and pieces since her hiring, guiding the Buffaloes through an offseason program which included strengthening academics and on the floor individual workouts, focusing on fundamentals.

Now, eight years removed from wearing a CU uniform, Lappe pulls her team together as a whole for the first time in preparation for the 2010-11 season.

"We want to get started off on the right foot," Lappe said. "With the new coaching staff, we'll be implementing a lot of new things and we're going to be expecting our players to catch on quickly...work hard and have a great attitude so we don't have to coach those two things."

Lappe, who amassed a 50-36 record in three seasons as head coach at Metro State (Colo.) before returning to her alma mater, welcomes in eight returnees, including three starters from the 2009-10 season, and four newcomers.

Senior forward **Brittany Spears**, who has started all 93 career games, has led Colorado in scoring and rebounding the last two seasons. She is coming off a junior campaign in which she averaged 17.7 points and 7.8 rebounds, earning honorable mention to the 2010 All-Big 12 Conference team. One of only six players in CU history to record 1,500 points and 700 career rebounds, Spears is sixth in 3-point field-goals made (156) and attempted (464), seventh in blocked shots (116), ninth in scoring (1,533), rebounds (720) and steals (176), 10th in field-goals made (557) and 16th in free-throws made (260) on CU's all-time charts.

A pair of sophomores who had solid first-year campaigns return in guard **Chucky Jeffery** and forward **Meagan Malcolm-Peck**. Jeffery topped the Buffaloes in assists as a true freshman in 2009-10 while averaging 9.3 points and 5.2 rebounds per game. Jeffery also played solid defense, leading all Big 12 freshman in steals with two per outing, and ranking fourth overall on the league charts. Malcolm-Peck pitched in 5.3 points and 3.7 rebounds per game and was CU's top shot blocker with 34 in her initial season.

Colorado lost a lot of scoring from its backcourt, most notably with the graduation of Bianca Smith, who averaged nearly 13 points per game in 2009-10 and is CU's all-time leader in 3-point field goals. The Buffaloes will look to a balance of upperclassmen with minimal playing experience and newcomers to fill that void.

The senior back-court duo of **Britney Blythe** and **Chelsea Dale** have worked limited minutes for much of their three years, but have shown

glimpses of what they can do between the lines. Dale, a sharp-shooting off guard, played in a career-best 23 games in 2009-10, hitting on 50 percent from the field, including 6-of-10 from downtown. Blythe, a natural point guard, appeared in only 10 games last year, but has starting experience, getting the opening call in 15 of 27 games as a sophomore in 2008-09, most of those starts logged during Big 12 play.

Newcomers in the back court will include 5-foot-8 twin sisters **Ashley** and **Brittany Wilson** whose prep resumes rank up with some of the best in the nation. The Wilson's teamed up for national prep powerhouse Long Beach Poly High School, compiling a four-year record of 131-9 which included three-straight California Division I-AA state titles and a runner up finish in 2010.

Spears will play a prominent role on the front line, but expects to get help from a pair of local products, one new and one returning. Freshman forward **Shae Kelley** hopes to continue her own personal Coors Events Center magic. Kelley was the *Denver Post's* 2010 Ms. Colorado Basketball after leading Denver East to its first state title, on CU's home floor last March. **Brenna Malcolm-Peck**, Meagan's twin sister, will hope to return from an injury plagued freshman season to contribute minutes. Malcolm-Peck, at 6-2, can stretch the floor with her outside shot and also help out on the boards.

Down on the block, junior **Julie Seabrook** has the most playing experience, seeing action in 51 games over her first two seasons. The 6-3 forward averaged just over six minutes a game in 2010, connecting on 52 percent of her field goal attempts (11-of-21). The tallest player in Colorado women's basketball history, 6-7 center **Melissa MacFarlane** returns for her sophomore season, after playing in 18 games in 2010 against some of the best post players in the country.

Freshman **Rachel Hargis**, who is Lappe's first recruit as she signed this past May, will join the mix down low. A 6-4 center from Robinson, Texas, she led Robinson High School to the 2009 Texas Class 3A state title as was the tournament MVP.

Colorado will host an exhibition game on Friday, Nov. 5, against Western State (Colo.) College and open the regular season by hosting Regis (Colo.) University on week later on Nov. 12. The Buffaloes will play 10 of 13 nonconference games at home, including match-ups with Illinois (Dec. 4) and Colorado State (Dec. 8). For the 24th straight year, CU will host a tournament over Thanksgiving weekend as Evansville, Loyola-Chicago and Eastern Washington come to Boulder for the Omni Hotels Classic, Nov. 26-27.

CU will begin its final season as a member of the Big 12 on Saturday, Jan. 8, at Texas A&M and its home conference opener will be Wednesday, Jan. 12, against Kansas. The Buffaloes will join the Pac-10 Conference for the 2011-12 season, and will get an early taste of their new digs, traveling to play at USC's Tournament, Dec. 18-19.

Brittany Spears is one of the most decorated players in CU women's basketball history, one of the most exciting and dynamic players in the Big 12 Conference and will certainly be a candidate for a variety of in-season and postseason honors. Her all-around game allows the Buffaloes to be creative in their match ups with opponents. She can handle the ball, has great range, can create her own shot and is CU's best defensive player. Just the sixth player in team history to record 1,500 points and 700 rebounds, her rankings on CU's all-time career lists include fourth in double-doubles (22), sixth in 3-point field-goals made (156) and attempted (464), seventh in blocked shots (116), ninth in scoring (1,533), rebounds (720) and steals (176), 10th in field-goals made (557) and 16th in free-throws made (260).

2009-10 (Junior): Topped Colorado for the second-straight season in scoring (17.7 ppg) and rebounding (7.8 rpg) and for the third year in a row in steals (64). Earned honorable mention to the 2010 All-Big 12 Conference team as she ranked third in steals (2.1 spg), fourth in scoring, fifth in rebounding, defensive rebounds (5.5 drpg) and free-throw percentage (.837), eighth in 3-point field-goal percentage (.357), 10th in 3-point field-goals made (1.8 3mpg), 12th in blocked shots (1.0 bpg) and 14th in offensive rebounds (2.3 orgp). Scored double digits in 25 of 30 games and notched 20 or more points in 12 contests. She has recorded double-digits in scoring in 56 of her last 63 games and 79 of 93 career outings. Her 531 points in 2009-10 was the ninth-best total in team history, and fourth-best by a junior. With her 530 points from 2008-09, she becomes just the fourth player in team history to score 500 or more points in back-to-back seasons, joining Lisa Van Goor (1980-82), Tera Bjorklund (2002-04)

and Jackie McFarland (2005-08). Spears had her most accurate season behind the arc and from the free-throw line, connecting on 55-of-154 3-point attempts (.357) and 108-of-129 free-throw attempts (.837). She scored a team-season high 34 points in the overtime win at Missouri (2/23), just two

of her career best (36 vs. UMass on Nov. 28, 2008). Her 34 points tie for the seventh-best single-game performance in team history and joins Jasmina Ilic as the only players to score 34 or more points twice during their careers. Spears was the Big 12 Women's Basketball Co-Player of the Week on Nov. 23, her fifth career Big 12 weekly honor, and first as Player of the Week. She earned that honor after averaging 23 points and 10 rebounds in the two-game Minnesota Subway Classic, where she was also selected to the All-Tournament team. Spears was also MVP of CU's Omni Hotels Classic as she averaged 15.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in wins over Georgia Southern (11/27) and Harvard (11/28). She had seven double-digit rebounding games, which corresponded to her team-high seven double-doubles, including a career-high tying 14 in the season opening win over UC Irvine (11/15).

2008-09 (Sophomore): Spears led Colorado by averaging 18.3 points, 7.8 rebounds, 1.9 steals and 1.1 blocked shots per game as she was named to the 2009 All-Big 12 Conference second team. There was no sophomore slump for Spears as she ranked among the Big 12's best in most statistical categories. She ranked second in minutes (35.4 mpg), third in scoring, fourth in defensive rebounds (6.0 drpg), seventh in overall rebounding, eighth in steals and 3-point percentage (.328), ninth in blocks, 10th in field-goal percentage (.434), 12th in 3-pointers made (1.5 3pg), and 14th in free-throw percentage (.721). Her numbers in conference only contests were equally as impressive as she ranked third in scoring (17.5 ppg), steals (2.3 spg) and defensive rebounds (6.4 drpg), seventh in overall rebounding (7.8 rpg) and ninth in blocks (1.1 bpg). Spears' 18.3 point average stands as the sixth-best single-season mark in team history and her 530 points ranked as the ninth. Her 199 field goals rank 12th on CU's single-season chart. Spears became just the second player in team history – joining CU Athletic Hall of Famer Lisa Van Goor – to reach 1,000 career points by the end of her sophomore season. Overall she was the 22nd Buff to reach 1,000, and the second fastest (63 games). She is the fifth player in CU history to score 400 points in her first two seasons in Boulder and the fourth to do it in freshman-sophomore campaigns (Debbie Descano scored 400 as a junior and senior after transferring to CU after her sophomore year). Spears had 12 games with 20 or more points and logged eight double-doubles, five of which came during Big 12 play. She had the highest individual scoring output in the Big 12 in 2008-09, notching 36 against UMass in the first round of the Coors Classic, a Classic record and tying for the third best total in team history (Jasmina Ilic also had 36 against Nebraska on Jan. 4, 2006). She was named the MVP of the Paradise Classic averaging 16 points, seven rebounds and three blocks over the two game tournament. She averaged 26 points in the two games of the Coors Classic, earning All-Tournament honors. Spears was a true "Iron Woman" as her 35.4 minutes per game were the sixth most in one season for the Buffaloes. She played all 40 minutes in a three-game stretch starting with the game at Missouri (1/24), becoming the first player to play 40 or more in three straight since Mandy Nightingale in 2000. In all she played 172 consecutive minutes over five games (Oklahoma on 1/21 to Kansas on 2/4). She played all 40 minutes in six games and at least 37 minutes in nine others. She was named the team's Offensive Player of the Year and Lisa Van Goor Rebounding Award winner.

2007-08 (Freshman): Spears had one of the greatest freshman seasons in team history, starting in all 34 games, ranking second on the team in scoring at 13.9 points per game and rebounding at 7.6 per contest behind All-Big 12 forward Jackie McFarland. She was named to the All-Big 12 Rookie team – a first for a CU player in the three year existence of the team which is voted on by league coaches – and earned honorable mention to the All-Big 12 squad. Spears was named Big 12 Rookie of the Week four times in the regular season,

She comes from a great basketball background and has a high basketball I.Q. as far as understanding offensive and defensive philosophy. She's a floor leader who gives the Buffaloes good depth at the point guard position.

Chelsea Dale is a pure shooter who has great range. She also has a knack for taking care of other players on the floor. Dale will be looking to finish her career with a bang. She has played sparingly her first three seasons, but with the Buffaloes losing three outside threats from a year ago, she will be looked on to step up and provide scoring from the outside and to also play strong defense on the other side of the court.

2009-10 (Junior): Played in 23 of 30 games, doubling virtually every personal statistic from her first two seasons combined. Logged 29 points, 18 rebounds and three assists and recorded her first career blocked shot at No. 13 (AP & WBCA) Iowa State. She made 50 percent of her field-goal attempts on the season (10-of-20) and 60 percent from 3-point range (6-of-10). Dale had never made more than one field goal in a game during her CU career until hitting 4-of-4 against Grambling State (12/30), including two from 3-point range as she logged a personal-best 11 points. She had another 2-of-2 performance from downtown against No. 14 (AP)/19 (WBCA) Texas (2/10), which also gave her a Big 12 Conference personal best six points. She scored five points against No. 12/15 Texas A&M, tying a career high with 15 minutes played.

2008-09 (Sophomore): Contributed the majority of her minutes during the last quarter of the season playing in seven of the final eight games. She missed the first seven games of the season recovering from a September surgery to stabilize the ligaments in her right ankle. Dale, who played in a total of 11 games, saw her most extended time by playing a career-high 14 minutes at No. 12 (AP)/8 (WBCA) Texas A&M (2/14), pulling down a personal-best three rebounds. She scored her lone field goal of the season with a scooping layup as she drove through the lane against Missouri (2/28).

2007-08 (Freshman): Saw action in 12 games as a true freshman, totaling 12 points, two rebounds and one assist on the season. Made her collegiate debut in the season-opening win at San Francisco (11/16) and scored her first collegiate points with a 3-point field goal against Texas Southern (12/14). In fact, she made both 3-point field goals she attempted as a freshman, also drilling a long-range jumper against Southern Utah (12/28). She also made both free throw shots she attempted this season, hitting both in the Postseason WNIT semifinal against Marquette (4/2).

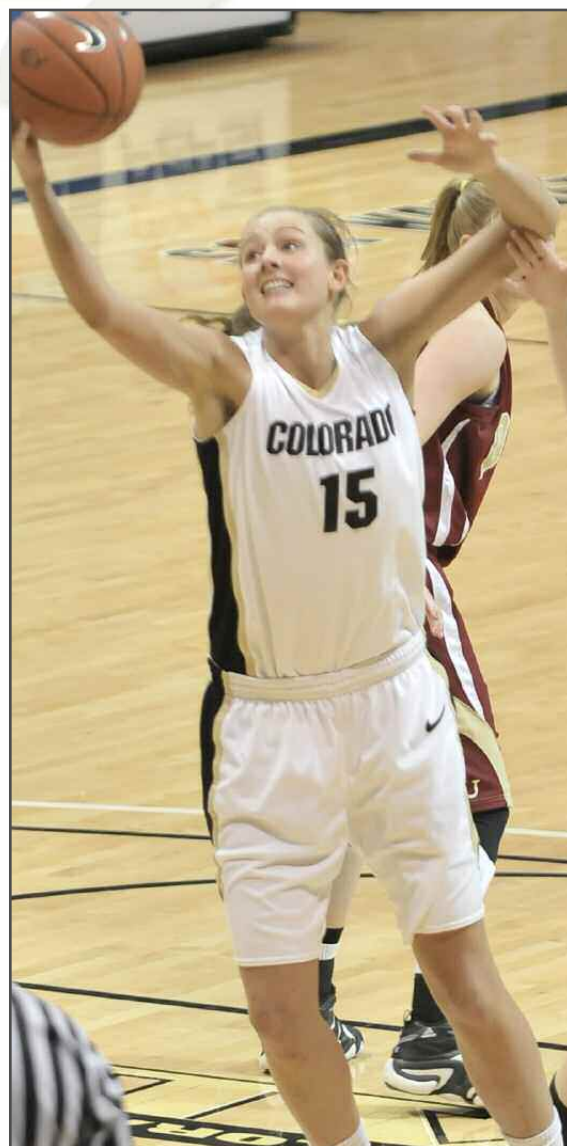

Julie Seabrook is touted for her energy and has good chemistry with her teammates. She has a good knack for the ball. She possesses good post moves off the block, but can also shoot from 10-15 feet away from the basket. Combined with her experience with the Canadian Junior National Team, playing against some of the best young players in the world, Seabrook looks to challenge for a prominent role in the Buffaloes' rotation.

2009-10 (Sophomore): Saw action in all but three contests, averaging just under one point and two rebounds per game. She got the starting nod in the season opener against UC Irvine (11/15) and came off the bench for the final 26 games she played in. Scored a Big 12 Conference personal best six points at Kansas (1/27) while grabbing four rebounds in 15 minutes. She had a team-best seven rebounds in the win over Southern Utah (12/19), the second-best single-game total of her career. Seabrook logged two or more rebounds in 13 games, 11 of those coming in the final 19 contests. Made 52 percent of her field-goal attempts (11-of-21) while also recording five assists, two steals and one blocked shot.

2008-09 (Freshman): Played in 24 games and averaged 1.8 points and 2.6 rebounds as a first year Buffalo. She hit 48 percent from the field, connecting on 14 of 29 field goal attempts. Seabrook made her collegiate debut in the season-opening win over UCF (11/16), scoring five points and grabbing four rebounds in 16 minutes. Had a strong night against Idaho State (12/30), logging her first career double-double with 12 points and 13 rebounds. Her 12 points off the bench against the Bengals were the most by a CU player this season. Eight of her 13 rebounds came on

Chucky Jeffery had a solid first year in a Colorado uniform and will be looked upon to increase her role as a floor leader. She is a versatile and skilled guard who has a great understanding of the game. She has the mental toughness and physical tools to become one of the elite guards in the Big 12 Conference.

2009-10 (Freshman): Averaged 9.3 points, 5.2 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.0 steals as a first-year Buffalo. One of Colorado's better all-around players in 2009-10, she led the Buffaloes in assists, ranked second in rebounding and steals and third in scoring. Her numbers stayed even throughout the year as she averaged 9.3 points, 4.8 rebounds and 3.4 assists during Big 12 games. Jeffery's two steals an outing tied for fourth in the Big 12 and also matched the best among league freshmen. She was also 10th in overall assists on the league charts and ranked 13th in assist-to-turnover ratio (0.8). Among freshmen in the Big 12, she ranked fourth in assists and fifth in scoring. Jeffery earned Big 12 Freshman of the Week honors on Jan. 11 after averaging 15.5 points, 7.5 rebounds, 6.5 assists and 5.0 steals in wins over Yale (1/4) and Missouri (1/9). She dished out a team season-high nine assists against Yale and also recorded one of her three personal-best 19-point performances, hitting all seven shot attempts from the field. She was named to the Omni Hotels Classic All-Tournament team as she averaged 12.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 2.5 steals and shot 61 percent (11-of-16) in the two game set. She scored 14 points in the championship game of the Omni Hotels Classic against Harvard, including the decisive basket on a driving layup with five seconds remaining in the contest. She came off the bench in her collegiate debut, but started in the final 28 games she played in, missing only one contest (Grambling State, 12/30) with a sprained ankle. Logged her first career double-double against No. 6 (AP)/4 (WBCA) Nebraska (1/30) with 14 points and a career-best 11 rebounds.

Melissa MacFarlane, standing at 6-7 is the tallest player in CU women's basketball history and the type of low-post player CU needs to compete in the Big 12. She provides the Buffaloes a great presence in the lane and has been working on her footwork and offensive post moves.

2009-10 (Freshman): Played in 18 games as a first-year Buffalo, seeing most of that time during the Big 12 season which featured some of the nation's best post players. She had four points, hitting 2-of-3 from the field, and a career-high three rebounds in a personal best 22 minutes against No. 14 (AP)/19 (WBCA) Texas. Netted a total 13 points on the season, scoring seven from the line (on 10 attempts). Scored a career-best five points against Southern Utah, all from the free-throw line, hitting on 5-of-6 attempts. She made her collegiate debut by playing five minutes against Illinois-Chicago (11/20), recording three rebounds, one blocked shot and hitting 1-of-2 free throws.

High School: Melissa MacFarlane is a 2009 graduate of Millard North High School. As a junior she averaged 10.9 points and 7.4 rebounds as a junior for the Mustangs who finished 21-5 and placed third in the 2008 state tournament, the team's first appearance since 2001. Meagan Malcolm-Peck is a versatile player that can play several positions and was asked to do just that numerous times during her freshman campaign. She has great range and can also put the ball on the floor. She is a very smart player with an excellent skill set and hopes with a year of Big 12 Conference play under her belt, she will be able to improve her game even more.

2009-10 (Freshman): Averaged 5.3 points, 3.7 rebounds, 1.1 blocked shots per game as a true freshman. She led the Buffaloes with 34 blocks on the season, the fifth-best single-season mark by a freshman in team history. Malcolm-Peck ranked third among freshmen in the Big 12 in blocks and ninth overall on the league charts. She started 26 of 30 games, playing nearly 25 minutes per contest. She had a memorable collegiate debut, grabbing a personal-best 11 rebounds against UC Irvine, six of which came on the defensive end. Malcolm-Peck was named Big 12 Freshman of the Week on Dec. 28 after recording 10 rebounds, four points, four steals, three assists and three blocks against San Jose State (12/22). She was a perfect 4-of-4 from the 3-point arc against Yale (1/4), just one off the school record for 3-pointers without a miss in one game. Registered a career-best 19 points against Yale. She delivered one of the clutch performances of the season at Kansas State (1/20). After making just 7-of-16 free-throw attempts to begin her collegiate career, she sank two attempts with 17 seconds remaining to give CU a four-point lead and eventually a 63-57 road win. Her road magic continued a month later at Missouri (2/23) as she hit the game-winning shot in overtime, a layup with 55 seconds remaining.



High School: Meagan Malcolm-Peck was home schooled, graduating in May 2009. She had an outstanding four-year high school athletic career playing basketball for Horizon High School in Thornton as a junior and senior and ThunderRidge High School in Highlands Ranch as a freshman and sophomore. A 2009 *Denver Post* Colorado Class 5A All-State first team selection, Malcolm-Peck averaged 18 points and 8.4 rebounds guiding Horizon

to a 25-2 record and a spot in the state semifinals. Playing alongside her twin sister and CU teammate Brenna Malcolm-Peck, the Hawks were the No. 1 ranked team in Colorado's largest classification for most of 2009 winning the Front Range League title and the Black Division crown at the Nike Tournament of Champions in Phoenix, where she was named MVP. Malcolm-Peck was a Street & Smith honorable mention All-American, All-Front Range League, All-Metro North Region Player of the Year, ESPN All-Area All-Colorado first team and was a Denver Nuggets All-Star playing in "The Show" with her sister and classmate Chucky Jeffery. Malcolm-Peck averaged 13 points and 8 rebounds as a junior helping the Hawks to a 17-7 record, the Front Range League title and the Class 5A "Sweet 16." She earned honorable mention to the *Rocky*
