THE GAME: The University of Colorado continues its season-long six-game home stand by hosting the University of Denver on Thursday, Dec. 8, at 7 p.m. at the Coors Events Center.

BROADCAST: Thursday's game will be televised by ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain. Tom Helmer will have the call with legendary CU head coach Ceal Barry providing the color commentary and Alanna Rizzo reporting from the sidelines. Thursday's game will air on KKZN AM 760 with Mike Rice handling the play-by-play and Carol Callan of USA Basketball with the color commentary. Live internet audio is available on CUBuffs.com, through the BuffsRadio free subscription.

OPENING TIP: Reigning Pac-12 Conference Player of the Week **Chucky Jeffery** has double-doubles in three straight games, a first by a CU player since the 2006-07 season.

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 7-0 and off to its best start since matching that mark to begin the 1993-94 season. Colorado will play game five of a six-game home stand at the Coors Events Center where the Buffaloes are a perfect 5-0 and outscoring their opponents by nearly 18 points per game (70.8 to 53.0).

Colorado has shown early balance with four players averaging between nine and 18 points per game and seven averaging at least

five per contest. The Buffaloes are averaging 71.0 points per game and shooting 44 percent from the field. CU's defense has held its opponents to 53.7 points per game, ranking third best in the Pac-12. The Buffaloes lead the Pac-12 in free-throw percentage (.719) and rank third in rebounding defense (32.4 rpg) and scoring margin (+17.3) and fourth field-goal percentage defense (.335).

After a slow start the Buffaloes are steadily improving on the glass and from the free-throw line. After shooting just 61.5 percent from the free-throw line over the first two games (24-of-39) CU is 77.3 percent over the last five (58-of-75). After being out-rebounded in the season-opening win over Northern Arizona, Colorado has won the battle of the boards the last six games, including an impressive plus-33 margin against San Francisco (53-20).

Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** is on a tear. She received Pac-12 Player of the Week honors on Dec. 4 after averaging 28 points, 11 rebounds and shooting 64.5 percent from the field in wins over San Francisco and Idaho. Overall she leads the Buffaloes at 18.3 points, 9.4 rebounds and 4.3 assists per game. She is fourth in the Pac-12 in scoring and ranks third in defensive rebounds (7.4 drpg), sixth in rebounding, assists and blocked shots (1.4 bpg), seventh in 3-point field-goal percentage (.438), eighth in minutes (33.0 mpg), ninth in free-throw percentage (.793), 10th in field-goal percentage (.538), 14th in steals (1.7 spg) and 15th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.2).

Jeffery is coming off a career-best and team season-high 30 points in the win over Idaho. With 10 rebounds, it was also her fourth double-double of the season (third-straight) and 14th of her career. She was named MVP of the Omni Hotels Classic after averaging 14 points, 10 rebounds and four assists in the two games, including 14 points and 11 rebounds in the championship game win over Wisconsin.

Freshman guard **Lexy Kresl** is second on the team in scoring at 12.1 points per game and leads the Buffaloes in both 3-point field goals (15) and free-throw percentage at 94.1 percent. She has made 15-straight free throws dating back to the Colorado State game and her percentage leads the Pac-12. She also ranks fourth in 3-pointers made (2.1 3mpg), 13 in 3-point percentage (.375) and 18th in scoring. She averaged 13 points and four rebounds during the Omni Hotels Classic, en route to All-Tournament Team honors.

Sophomore guard **Brittany Wilson** is third on the team in scoring at 11.0 points per game and is second on the team with 10 steals. She tied a career-high with 22 points against Northern Arizona in the season opener, a team-season high. On the Pac-12 charts, Wilson ranks 12th in 3-pointers (1.6 3mpg) and 23rd in scoring.

Brittany's twin sister **Ashley Wilson** was her starting back court mate for the season's first two games, the first two starts of her career. She has made eight of her first 18 field goal attempts and is averaging three points and 3.1 rebounds. She had a career-best seven rebounds in the Omni Classic first round win over Valparaiso to go along with seven points. Additionally, she is averaging 4.3 rebounds over the last four games.

Junior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** has played well defensively, averaging five rebounds and just under one blocked shot per game. She is one of three Buffaloes with a team-best 14 offensive rebounds so far and her 2.3 per game average ranks 13th in the Pac-12.

Colorado's front court duo of senior **Julie Seabrook** and sophomore **Rachel Hargis** are the only two players to start all seven games. Seabrook leads Colorado in field-goal percentage at 59 percent (19-of-32) and has averaged 12.5 points and 9.0 rebounds over the past two games. She recorded a personal-best 18 points on 8-of-13 from the field in the win over San Francisco. Hargis played a career-

best 33 minutes in the Omni Classic championship game win over Wisconsin, recording eight points and seven rebounds. She matched a career-high with four field-goals made against the Badgers and also had a personal-best nine field-goal attempts.

Colorado's bench has been outstanding, accounting for 177 of 497 points or 36 percent of the team's scoring through seven games. Although Kresl cracked the starting lineup for three of those games, she and inside classmate **Jen Reese** have accounted for the bulk of that bench production. Reese, who had a personal-best 13 points at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, is averaging just under 10 points per contest and shooting 47 percent from the field (23-of-49). Against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi the Buffaloes had a season-high 43 bench points (Jeffery 19, Reese 13, Kresl 11). Reese has also been hitting the boards, ranking second on the team at 6.2 per game.

HISTORIC START: Colorado is 7-0 for the first time since 1993-94, looking for its third start of 8-0 or better in team history. The only two teams in school history to start better were the 1992-93 squad at 15-0 and a 12-0 run by the 1980-81 Buffaloes. Here is a break down of CU's best starts:

ABOUT THE PIONEERS: Denver is 6-2 overall, but 2-2 after a fast 4-0 start. The Pioneers are coming off a 53-52 win over Montana at home. Three of DU's wins are against the other Colorado NCAA Division I schools, Colorado State at home and Air Force and Northern Colorado on the road. Denver is averaging 60.9 points per game while giving up just slightly less at 60.4. In fact three of DU's wins (Air Force, CSU, Montana) have been by three points or less. The Pioneers were picked to win the Western Division of the Sun Belt Conference this season by the league's coaches.

All-Sun Belt Conference forward, and 2011-12 SBC Co-Preseason Player of the Year Kaetlyn Murdoch leads Denver with 17 points and 5.9 rebounds per game while shooting 55 percent from the field. Sophomore guard Quincey Noonan is second on the team in scoring at 10.3 and has a team-leading 17 steals. Junior guard Emiko Smith tops the Pioneers in assists at 5.8 per game while scoring at 8.5 points per contest. Sophomore forward Maiya Michel is Denver's top rebounder at 7.4 per game.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be just the seventh meeting between the two schools that reside only 33 miles apart from one another. For the first time in series history, the two teams will meet for three consecutive seasons. The Buffaloes hold a 4-2 overall edge in the series, but the Pioneers won last year's battle, edging CU 70-69 at Magness Arena. Colorado has won the three previous games played in Boulder, including a 84-57 decision on Dec. 2, 2009.

Colorado is 7-2 all-time against teams currently in the Sun Belt Conference, both losses coming against the Pioneers.

Colorado head coach Linda Lappe is 0-1 as a head coach against Denver. Pioneer head coach Erik Johnson is 1-0 against Colorado.

DENVER - University of Denver's Britteni Rice scored nine of her team-high 19 points from the free-throw line, including six in the closing seconds as the Pioneers edged the University of Colorado 70-69 Tuesday night at Magness Arena.

Brittany Spears led Colorado (1-1) with 24 points and 10 rebounds, her 23rd career double-double. **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** had 14 points, five rebounds and three blocks.

DU (1-1) and Colorado went back-and-forth, 10 ties, 15 lead changes and just six points - two possessions - was the largest margin for either team. But a few costly CU mistakes down the stretch and Denver's ability to capitalize was the difference.

Colorado made six of its first eight shots from the field and Spears' third 3-pointer in the first nine minutes gave Colorado a 17-12 lead.

But turnovers hurt the Buffaloes. Denver pressed, giving CU's back court some problems which turned into easy buckets. The Pioneers scored 14 points of 14 first half CU turnovers and led 32-29 at the break.

The Buffaloes continued to keep the Pioneers within reach early in the second half and momentum began to swing when CU amped up the defensive effort and began to return the favor.

"We pressured them," CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "We became the aggressors on defense, which is how we need to play the entire game, but it really spurred our run and we were able to get some easy baskets."

After DU held its largest lead of the game at 52-46, CU's defense sparked a 9-0 run. Spears scored first on a put back and after a stop Malcolm-Peck drilled a 3-pointer to pull CU to within one at 52-51. Spears then recorded steals on back-to-back possessions, the first resulting in a coast-to-coast layup and the second ending in a Malcolm-Peck bucket as CU led 55-52 with 5:31 left.

But shortly after, momentum took a swift shift back to Denver. The Buffaloes played 29 seconds of solid defense on the other end and had DU needing to get a shot on rim off an inbounds play with just one second left on the shot clock. DU found its leading scorer Kaetlyn Murdoch, but she missed a shot from the elbow. Pioneer Brianna Culberson won a struggle for the rebound with Malcolm-Peck. The CU sophomore was called for a foul, but the setback was compounded by a technical foul call on Spears who batted the ball away in frustration.

Rice made one of two shots, and on the ensuing possession, Murdoch was fouled and made the subsequent free throws to tie the game up at 55 with 4:56 remaining.

The Buffaloes fought to claim a 62-61 with just 2:13 remaining and had the ball but couldn't extend their lead despite having three chances on the same possession. Spears missed two short range jumpers and Malcolm-Peck couldn't quite stick the put back as Rice finally corralled the rebound and was fouled.

She made both foul shots to give DU a 63-62 lead with 1:09 left. Colorado once again had three chances at regaining the lead, but couldn't connect. Rice, once again corralled the rebound, this time off a Malcolm-Peck 3-point attempt, was fouled and sank another pair of free throws with 39 seconds on the clock to put the Pioneers up 65-62.

The Buffaloes were unable to get a quality shot off on the other end. Murdoch, who survived early foul trouble to score 17 points, followed Rice's lead with a pair of free throws to give DU a two-possession lead at 67-62.

"We fought hard," Lappe said. "We could have folded a few times in this game, down five a couple different times, and really fought back. I thought we had a lot of momentum down the stretch, then a couple possessions where things didn't quite go our way and we weren't quite able to bounce back from that."

CU freshman **Brittany Wilson** made a pair of driving layups to extend the game, but it was not enough. Denver was clutch at the line making 22-of-25 free throws, including 9-of-10 in the final 1:09.

Chucky Jeffery had 10 points and four rebounds. Wilson had nine points and three rebounds.

member Shelley Sheetz is in her fourth year as a DU assistant coach. Current CU Director of Basketball of Operations Tracy Tripp, who played for Colorado from 1985-89, spent 13 seasons as a Pioneer assistant coach (1995-08) before coming back to Boulder.

REBOUNDING WOVES: Colorado has outrebounded its opponent in six straight games and overall by a margin of plus-11.1 on the season, ranking third in the Pac-12 and 16th in the nation (through games of Dec. 4). CU had a big night on the glass against San Francisco, ending with a margin of plus-33 (53-20). That plus-33 margin overall is tied for the ninth best margin in team history and tied for the fourth best since the NCAA/Big Eight Conference era began with the 1982-83 season. It's also the widest margin since the Buffaloes put up a similar plus-33 margin against Bowling Green (59-26) on Nov. 23, 2001. Those two games are the best since CU outrebounded Northern Arizona by 34 (56-22) on Dec. 18, 1993.

Additionally, CU's 20 rebounds allowed to San Francisco tied for the second-lowest in team history. The Buffaloes held a team at 20 on three other occasions, most recently against Loyola Chicago in a 65-34 win on Nov. 27, 2010. The record low is 19, set against Northern Arizona on Feb. 7, 1981.

CHUCKY DOUBLES: Chucky Jeffery has four double-doubles on the season, ranking third in the Pac-12, including three-straight. It's the first time a CU player has had double-doubles in three-straight games since Jackie McFarland had two separate strings of three during the 2006-07 season. She joins Bridget Turner as the only other guard in team history with three-straight double-doubles. Turner pulled the trifecta during the 1988-89 season, with one of her doubles the points-assists variety.

Overall she is the seventh player to achieve three straight double-doubles. CU Athletic Hall of Famer Lisa Van Goor holds the consecutive mark of six during the 1980-81 season. A fourth by Jeffery would be the most since Van Goor ran off a string of five in a row late in the 1982-83 season.

LEXY AMONG ELITE COMPANY: Freshman guard Lexy Kresl scored in double-digits in the first six games of her career, tying CU Athletic Hall of Fame member and All-American Shelley Sheetz for the second-most in team history. Current CU Director of Basketball Operations Tracy Tripp holds the mark of 10, set during the 1985-86 season.

rebounds in the win over the Islanders. Her total surpassed her previous personal best of 13, which she had achieved three other times, most recently in the win over CSU last year in Boulder. Her 16 rebounds were the most by a CU player since Jackie McFarland recorded 18 at Kansas on Feb. 6, 2007.

LEXY'S RECORD NIGHT: Freshman guard Lexy Kresl had a memorable collegiate debut making 5-of-6 3-point attempts in the first half of CU's 84-60 win over Northern Arizona. She tied a school record for 3-pointers made in one half, a feat that had happened five previous times by three players. Bianca Smith, who was the last person to hit five in one half (vs. Nebraska on Jan. 31, 2009), did it three times. Kate Fagan and CU Athletic Hall of Famer and All-American Shelly Sheetz are the other two.

What sets Kresl's achievement apart is the others were well into their respective collegiate careers when they reached that one-half mark:

STEALING THE SHOW: Colorado recorded 16 steals against Northern Arizona in the season opener, its most in a single game since swiping 18 against Texas Southern on Dec. 14, 2007. It's just the third time since the 2003-04 season that the Buffaloes have had 16 or more steals in one contest (16 vs. Pacific on Dec. 8, 2005).

Seven different Buffaloes registered steals against Northern Arizona, led by sophomore **Brittany Wilson** who had a career high with five. Freshmen **Jasmine Sborov** and **Jen Reese** each had three in their collegiate debuts.

MALCOLM-PECK AMONG BEST FROM 3-POINT RANGE: Junior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** connected on a 3-pointer against Idaho to move into a tie with Veronica Johns-Richardson (2001-05) for 13th on CU's all-time list with 65. Her career .320 average (65-of-203) would rank 18th in school history.

JEFFERY MOVING UP IN STEALS, ASSISTS: Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** registered three steals against Idaho, moving into sole possession of 14th on CU's all-time list at 146, passing Erin Scholz (1993-97) and La Shena Graham. Jeffery is 20th on CU's all-time list for assists at 255. She needs four to catch Diane Hiemstra (1981-84) for 19th.

ROAD WARRIORS: After dropping its first eight on the road last season, and nine away from home overall, Colorado won its last three games in 2010-11 and upped that streak to five with its two road wins early this year. The current streak of five is the team's best since CU's last NCAA Tournament team won six in a row on the road in 2003-04.

OMNI HOTELS CLASSIC CHAMPIONS: Colorado claimed its 15th holiday tournament title and has won all three since the old Coors Classic was changed to the Omni Hotels Classic in 2009. Colorado improved to 40-10 all-time in its home holiday classic.

YOUNG BUFFS: Colorado sports its youngest team in recent memory with just three upperclassmen. Forward **Julie Seabrook** is the lone senior with **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** and **Chucky Jeffery** the two juniors. **Brenna Malcolm-Peck** is part of the junior class, but redshirted in 2010-11 with an injury and is a sophomore in eligibility.

Current CU head coach **Linda Lappe** was part of the last Colorado teams to feature a roster this young. Colorado's 1999-2000 squad had only one upperclassman - junior Kami Carmann - on an 11-player roster which featured seven sophomores (including Lappe) and three freshmen. That next season, 2000-01, Carmann was the lone senior

on the team, marking the last single-senior instance prior to this year.

INTERMOUNTAIN REUNION: CU will play several games this season against old Intermountain Conference rivals.

The Buffaloes played in the Intermountain Conference from 1975-82, prior to the Big 8 Conference holding a championship for women's basketball (the Big 8 began regular league play in 1982-83). Colorado won outright or shared three straight Intermountain titles from 1980-82.

With Colorado's move to the Pac-12 Conference for this season, the Buffaloes renew rivalries with old Intermountain mates Utah, Arizona and Arizona State. In addition, CU has nonconference games scheduled with Weber State along with Colorado State and Northern Arizona.

RULES CHANGES: Three notable NCAA women's basketball rules changes were made in the offseason and are effective immediately.

The women's 3-point line has been moved from 19-feet, 9-inches back to 20' 9", equal to the NCAA men's line. The Coors Events Center will keep the old 19' 9" line on the floor, because it remains the 3-point distance for the high school level. Coors hosts numerous prep games throughout the season, including the Colorado Class 5A and 4A State Championships.

Underneath the basket there is a new restricted arc area that spans out 3-feet. The arc, familiar to those who follow the NBA, marks the area under the basket where a secondary defender is not permitted to establish a legal guarding position. Specifically, a defender must be outside this arc in order to have the ability to draw an offensive charging foul.

Lastly, after the second horn of a timeout, if a team is not ready to play, officials will warn that team on the first offense. On the second and subsequent offenses, the official will make the ball ready for play,

BUFFS IN OPENERS: With the win over Northern Arizona, Colorado improved to 33-5 (.868) all-time in season openers as the Buffaloes started the season with a home game for the 26th time in 38 seasons. Colorado moved to an outstanding 36-2 (.947) all-time in home openers. Colorado has never lost its overall season opener when played at home (26-0).

BUFFS SIGN THREE TO NLI's FOR 2012-13: Lauren Huggins, Jamee Swan and Kyleesha Weston have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2012-13, head coach Linda Lappe announced on Wednesday.

This highly touted class features two Top 100 players in Swan and Huggins and an up-and-coming point guard of the future in Weston. Lappe's second full recruiting class is ranked the 20th best in the nation by ESPN.com's *HoopGurlz*.

Huggins, a 6-foot-1 wing from Littleton, Colo., averaged 12 points and nearly eight rebounds per game as a junior, guiding the Heritage High School to the Colorado Class 5A Sweet 16. *HoopGurlz* lists Huggins as the 63rd best player in the nation and the 11th at the small forward position

Swan is a 6-2 forward from Tucson, Ariz., and is a four-star *HoopGurlz* prospect from Marana High School. She is rated as the eighth best forward in the nation and the 38th best player overall. Swan averaged 19.6 points, 13.4 rebounds, 4.1 blocked shots and 4.1 steals for the Tigers as a junior, earning Southern Class 4A All-State first team honors.

Weston is a 5-7 point guard from Park Hill High School in Kansas City, Mo. As a junior last winter, she averaged 15.4 points, 4.5 rebounds, 4.5 steals and 2.5 assists per game. Weston earned first team All-Kansas City Suburban Big 6 Conference and all-district honors as a junior.

EXHIBITION WIN: Four Colorado players scored in double-digits as the Buffaloes ran to a 78-40 women's basketball exhibition win over Regis on Nov. 6 at the Coors Events Center.

Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** and freshman **Lexy Kresl** each had 14 points. Sophomore **Brittany Wilson** had 12 off the bench and her twin sister **Ashley Wilson** had 10.

BUFFS PICKED 11TH/12TH: Despite coming off an eighth place finish and 18-16 record in its final year in the Big 12 Conference, Colorado was picked to finish 11th in its first season in Pac-12, according to the league's annual Preseason Coaches Poll.

2011 NCAA Women's Final Four participant Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12, compiling the maximum amount of points (121) and first place votes (11) possible. 2011 Postseason WNIT runnerup USC claimed the other first place vote and was second in the poll (111). California was third with 98 points followed by UCLA (83), Arizona State (68), Utah (61), Washington State (59), Oregon (51), Arizona (48), Washington (38), Colorado (36) and Oregon State (18).

Colorado was picked to finish 12th in the Preseason Pac-12 Media Poll. Stanford was picked to repeat its title, and the top six mirror that of the coaches poll released earlier. Oregon jumped to seventh in the media poll followed by Arizona, Washington State, Washington, Oregon State and Colorado.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with

Coach Lappe on CU joining the Pac-12 Conference:

"We're looking at (the conference change) as a very intriguing time for women's basketball. It's going to be a season of unknowns in the Pac-12, with all the new coaches (changes at UCLA, Washington, California and Arizona State) and two new schools (CU, Utah) coming in. But the unknowns make it exciting. I like it because it doesn't put us at much of a disadvantage.

The teams at the top last year were Stanford and UCLA. Stanford has been good for a long, long time; teams in the Pac-10 have had a tough time competing with them for a lot of years. But we're hoping to come in with a lot of confidence as a team that's had a year under its new coaches

It's tough to compare the Big 12 and the Pac-12. We know the Pac-12 is going to be very quick; there's going to be a lot of full-court basketball played. Stanford is probably the most physical team in the Pac-12, but that could change with all the new coaches. Overall, it's just a very tough league that, in my opinion, doesn't get the national respect that it should. But I think we'll make headway pretty fast in getting that changed. The move is going to help our recruiting in the Northwest and West, but we'll still go into the Midwest and into Texas. The big thing, though, will be to win on the road – particularly out West. People there already know about CU, and they know we're coming their way. It's all very exciting."

BOULDER – If there were any opening-night nerves, **Linda Lappe's** Colorado women's basketball team quickly disposed of them. After that, Northern Arizona was disposed of just as easily as CU rolled into the 2011-12 season with an impressive 84-60 win Friday night at the Coors Events Center.

The Buffs had three players in double figures, led by sophomore **Brittany Wilson** with 22 points. Freshman **Lexy Kresl** tied a school record with five three-pointers in the first half, finishing with 15, and sophomore **Chucky Jeffery** came off the bench to add 11 points.

CU finished its first game with a 57.1 percentage from the field (32-of-56) and was at 66.7 percent from the free throw line (12-of-18). NAU, also opening its season Friday night, was held to 37.5 percent shooting (21-of-56). The Lumberjacks' leading scorer was Amanda Frost with 18.

"I'm pleased with how our team did tonight," Lappe said. "I thought we got a lot better from our game against Regis in a lot of different areas. I thought offensively we moved the ball well and were very balanced in our scoring attack."

Hoping to experiment with her new players and rotations, Lappe couldn't have scripted a better start – and it wasn't just the Buffs racing to a 29-9 advantage midway through the opening half.

Northern Arizona's moment (actually, several seconds) of glory was controlling the opening tip. From there, the Buffs took control. After sophomore **Rachel Hargis** took a charge on NAU's first possession, she scored on a put-back and CU was off, running and shooting.

Much of that was done by the supremely confident Kresl, who buried five of her six three-point attempts for 15 first-half points. The 5-11 guard from Paradise Valley, Ariz., missed on two second-half treys, but her five rebounds were a team best.

"I was definitely feeling my shot," Kresl said. "I feel really good in the offense. It's also about playing defense though. If you play good defense then you will get the shots you want. If you are patient, then you'll get your shot."

"I thought she came out with a lot of confidence," Lappe added. "I somehow knew she was going to play well against Northern Arizona, she knows a lot of those players. She had a little bit more of a challenge in coming out and making sure her team was successful."

In the first half, Lappe played nine of her 10 players suited up for the opener, with walk-on **Esther Lee** entering the game in the final minute. Eight of the 10 Buffs scored.

Behind Kresl's shooting, which boosted her team's 59.3 percent field goal accuracy (16-of-27) in the first 20 minutes, the Buffs led 44-20 at the half. Their big lead was 31 points (44-13) on a pair of Brittany Wilson free throws at 3:04 before intermission.

"A good start is important," Brittany Wilson said. We knew that if we didn't bury [Northern Arizona] quick, they have the weapons to come back. When we had the chance to put them away, we did."

The Lumberjacks managed to hit just 29.6 percent (8-of-27) from the field in the first half and didn't score for the game's first 21 1/2 minutes. From there, the night steadily eroded for the Big Sky Conference member.

After falling behind 26-9, NAU suffered an almost 7 minute drought and found itself looking at a 39-11 deficit after Kresl canned her fourth trey of the half with 4:03 left before halftime.

When Kresl followed immediately with her fifth three-pointer, the Buffs were cruising 42-13 – and Lappe might have been wondering if her team could maintain interest in the final 20 minutes.

No problem...the Buffs outscored the Lumberjacks 10-5 in the second half's first 3 1/2 minutes and maintained at least a 21-point advantage for the remainder of the night.

CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas – Chucky Jeffery notched her 11th career double-double and a late spur allowed Colorado to pull away for a 71-58 road win against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi Wednesday night at the American Bank Center.

Jeffery scored 16 of her team-best 19 points in the second half and pulled down a career-high 16 rebounds.

"We went in at the half and said we need to take care of business on the boards, they were getting a lot of offensive rebounds. Coach (Linda) Lappe told me to rebound, so that's what I did," said Jeffery.

The Buffaloes also had 13 points off the bench from freshman **Jen Reese** on 6-of-9 shooting.

"Whether she is going to score or not, she makes a difference out there. That's how Jen can play every single game; she brings it when we need it," said Colorado head coach **Linda Lappe**.

The win moves Colorado to 2-0 on the season and also provides the Buffaloes with their fourth straight win on the road dating back to the end of the 2010-11 season.

"It takes a lot of toughness and team chemistry to win on the road. You don't do it by having everybody on their own page," said Lappe.

Jessica Jammer had a game-high 22 points to lead the Islanders who fall to 0-2 overall.

CU's **Ashley** and **Brittany Wilson** both scored early layups as the Buffaloes were pushing well in transition to build an 8-2 lead.

Texas A&M-Corpus Christi would cut the lead to 9-8 on a Jammer jumper. The Buffs front court, sporting a considerable size advantage, fell to early foul trouble. **Rachel Hargis** and **Julie Seabrook** each picked up two fouls in a two minute span, and sat the majority of the rest of the period on the bench.

After a media timeout, freshman **Lexy Kresl** scored on a layup which sparked an 11-4 Buffs run. **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** drilled a 3-pointer at the top of the key, Reese scored on a conventional 3-point play and Kresl scored from deep to put CU up 20-12. Off an A&M-Corpus Christi miss, Jeffery nabbed one of her eight first half rebounds and found Brittany Wilson in the clear for an easy layup, giving CU its largest lead to that point at 22-12.

Jammer kept the Islanders close scoring nine points in the first period including 5-of-7 from the free-throw line. Jammer was Texas A&M-Corpus Christi's best offense as the Islanders were held to 24 percent shooting.

Jeffery hit her lone field goal of the first half with a runner in the key as the Buffaloes led 33-26 at the break.

CU made just one of its first six field goals in the second half and A&M took advantage. Jammer scored six points and an arching baseline jumper gave A&M-CC its first lead at 39-38.

But CU responded well with a 7-0 run. Kresl pushed the tempo enough to get to the free throw line. After trying the score at 39, she missed the second attempt, Jeffery grabbed the initial board and missed her put-back chance, but Seabrook cleaned it up to put the Buffs back up 41-38.

Colorado pushed its lead to eight at 55-47, but the Islanders cut it down to five with 6:29 off 3-point play by Jammer.

That is as close as A&M-Corpus Christi would get as the Buffaloes ended the game with a 17-5 run. Jeffery scored four straight points and after a pair of Trish Amboree free throws, Kresl drilled a 3-pointer to put CU up double-digits for good at 63-52 with 3:43 left.

Brittany Wilson had 10 points and four rebounds. Malcolm-Peck finished with seven points and six rebounds. The Buffaloes, which trailed on the boards for most of the game, finished on the positive end at 53-48.

Myeisha Myles had 10 points and nine rebounds for the Islanders, who shot just 29 percent on the evening.

BOULDER - Colorado had its strongest defensive effort of the season, limiting Valparaiso to 32 points in a 60-32 Buffaloes win in the first round of the 25th Annual Omni Hotels Classic Friday evening at the Coors Events Center.

Colorado at 4-0 and matching its best start since 2000-01, will face Wisconsin in Saturday's championship game at 7:30 p.m. Wisconsin (2-4) held off Montana State 71-61 in Friday's first game. Valparaiso (0-4) will play MSU (3-2) in the consolation game at 5 p.m. on Saturday.

"I thought it was a good win," CU head coach **Linda Lappe** said. "Our defense was outstanding."

Chucky Jeffery led the Buffaloes with another complete stat line. The junior guard had 14 points on 6-of-10 shooting, 9 rebounds, five assists, one block and one steal.

The Buffaloes had a good start for the fourth straight game to open the season, pushing out to an early 17-8 lead. Valparaiso's Ashley Varnier kept the Crusaders close early with a pair of 3-pointers. Shaquira Scott hit a jumper at 7:30 to pull Valparaiso to within six at 19-13.

From there the Buffaloes began to run away. Colorado ended the half on a 16-0 run. Jeffery scored the last nine of those points including a long 3-pointer at the first half buzzer to give CU a 35-13 lead at the break.

"We know that every time we come out we have to throw the first punch, we have to be aggressive, we have to play defense hard," Jeffery said. "That's just what we are taught, so we have to emulate that on the floor."

Lexy Kresl scored five straight to open the second half to give CU a 40-13 lead. Scott finally broke Valpo's 10:03 drought with a short jumper with 17:27 remaining. That began a 7-0 Valpo run as CU cooled off over the next three minutes. VU's Tabitha Gerardot converted a conventional 3-point play to bring the Crusaders to within 20 at 40-20 with 14:28 left.

Julie Seabrook ended the Crusader run with a short jumper in the paint. Soon after, Jeffery reentered the game and reenergized the Buffaloes.

CU answered Valpo's 7-0 run with one of its own. Jeffery ignited a fast break that ended in a layup by Jasmine Sborov, her first career points. Jeffery blocked a shot on the other end and the ensuing possession ended in an Ashley Wilson layup. Kresl then put CU up 49-23 with a long 3-pointer with 10 minutes remaining.

All active players contributed in the scoring column. Walk-on freshman guard **Esther Lee** scored her first five career points, including a late 3-pointer.

"Ashley is an extremely hard worker," Lappe said. "Offensive rebounding is all heart and effort. Every time a shot went up, Ashley was rushing the glass."

Kresl and **Brittany Wilson** each had 10 points. Rachel Hargis had six points, four rebounds and a career-high three assists.

Varnier led Valparaiso with 10 points and seven rebounds. Scott ended with nine points, adding a block and a steal to her line.

BOULDER - **Chucky Jeffery** recorded her 12th career double-double and **Lexy Kresl** scored a career-high 16 points to lead the CU women's basketball team to a 58-48 win against Wisconsin in the championship game of CU's Omni Hotels Classic.

The victory pushed the Buffs to 5-0 for the first time since the 2000-01 season and earned them their third consecutive Omni Classic title. Jeffery was named the tournament MVP for the second consecutive year while Kresl, a 5-11 freshman guard, also was selected to the all-tournament team.

Kresl scored 26 points in the two tournament games and has hit at least one three-pointer in every game this season. She was two-of-three from beyond the arc Saturday night and hit all eight of her free throw attempts.

Jeffery, meanwhile, contributed 28 points and collected 20 rebounds in the two Omni games, helping the Buffs dispose of Valparaiso 60-32 on Friday.

Just as they did in the tournament opener, Kresl and Jeffery got help Saturday from sophomore guard **Brittany Wilson**, who scored 10 points each night and was key coming off the bench in a first-half surge against UW.

The Buffs expected a physical game from the Badgers, and they got it. But CU coach **Linda Lappe** was pleased with how her team responded in that regard and how it played defense.

"Our defense was key," Lappe said. "We did a great job in the first half of limiting them to 23...and even those shots were rushed; they were not shots they wanted. It helped us win the game."

The Buffs trailed only once against the Badgers (2-0) and held a double-digit lead for the game's final 15:34 in sending the visitors home with a 2-5 record.

CU led 31-23 at the half, but it took a healthy run in the final 4:31 for the Buffs to create some separation. CU led by as many as nine before UW ratcheted up its defense and closed to 19-17 on a pair of free throws by Wurtz at the 6:11 mark.

Just under a minute before that, Wurtz hit another pair of free throws after the Buffs' bench was whistled for a technical foul, apparently after complaining about what appeared to be a shot clock violation by the Badgers.

Lappe said if her lost its composure "for about two minutes...we regained it and never lost our lead. We stayed up by a decent margin, we responded and ended the half strong."

But the Buffs opened frigidly, hitting just one of their first seven field goal attempts. Less than 5 minutes into the half, Lappe brought **Brittany Wilson** off the bench for a spark and "B-Wiii!" furnished it.

Over the next 4 minutes, she contributed a pair of three-pointers and a put back to give CU a 13-4 lead - its biggest before UW responded with an 8-2 run and closed to 15-12 on a three-pointer by Wurtz.

From there, neither team hit a field goal, but the Badgers outscored the Buffs 5-4 at the free throw line - including the two for the 'T' - and pulled to 19-17. But CU fashioned a 12-4 run and took its biggest lead of the half (31-21) with 1:27 before intermission.

The Buffs finished the game shooting 33.9 percent from the field (19-of-56), while the Badgers were at 33.3 percent (16-of-48). Both teams scored 20 points off of turnovers, but CU's 24-12 point advantage in the paint was critical.

The Badgers opened the second half with a trey by freshman guard Lindsay Smith, but it would be their only points for the next 3 minutes. In the meantime, the Buffs got baskets from Julie Seabrook, Kresl and Brittany Wilson to take their biggest lead to that point, 37-26.

From there, CU began to pull away, opening a 44-30 advantage on a follow in the lane by freshman post Jen Reese with 12:50 to play. The Buffs led by as many as 16 points before the final whistle.

BOULDER – The University of Colorado women’s basketball team moved to 7-0 for the first time since the 1993-94 season, but Sunday afternoon’s seventh win might have been more difficult than the Buffaloes expected.

CU finally disposed of Idaho 68-59 at the Coors Events Center, but it took a late spark by junior point guard **Chucky Jeffery** to keep the Buffs unbeaten.

Jeffery scored seven of her career-best 30 points in the final 2:14 as CU overcame a 59-58 Idaho lead and dropped the Vandals to 2-6. Jeffery, who also collected 10 rebounds Sunday, had registered a then-career-high 26 points Wednesday against San Francisco.

The only other CU player in double figures was freshman post **Jen Reese** with 10. Idaho got 13 points from Keri Arendse and 12 each from Stacey Barr and Alyssa Charlston.

CU waited until the first half’s final 2:43 to begin pulling away, outscoring Idaho 13-4 from that point until intermission to take its biggest lead, 42-33.

The Buffs’ run came courtesy of four three-pointers by **Meagan Malcolm-Peck**, **Brittany Wilson** and a pair by Jeffery, who finished the half with 18 of her total. Her field goal shooting (7-of-10) carried CU, which with 11:36 before the break had hit just three of 16 from the field (18.8 percent).

And the Vandals, whose most recent loss before coming to Boulder was at home against Pac-12 member Washington (66-49), took advantage. Down by five (7-2) in the first 4 minutes, Idaho rallied to take its first lead (10-9) on a trey by Barr with 11:07 left in the half.

Less than 2 minutes later, CU reclaimed the advantage on a three-point play by Jeffery and held it until Arendse hit a field goal and one of two free throws on the next Vandals possession to go up 24-22. But that was Idaho’s last of the half – but not the game.

The Vandals managed a pair of ties at 27-27 and 29-29 before the Buffs launched their three-point barrage to close out the half and take control.

After its frigid start, CU finished the first 20 minutes shooting 16-of-36 (44.4 percent), while holding Idaho to 13-of-35 (37.1 percent). The Buffs also committed eight first-half turnovers, which the Vandals converted into 13 points.

CU opened the second half with a quick pair of turnovers, allowed Arendse a three-pointer and Charlston a pair of free throws. Suddenly, that nine-point halftime lead was cut to 42-38.

Over the next 6:11, the Buffs got treys from Malcolm-Peck and Jeffery and went ahead 50-42. But the Vandals didn’t roll over, closing to 53-50 on a three-pointer by Charlston, who then tied the score at 53-53 with a conventional three-point play with 7:46 remaining.

Arendse canned a pair of free throws to push Idaho ahead 55-53 – only CU’s second second-half deficit of the season – but Brittany Wilson’s three-pointer 30 seconds later pushed the Buffs back in front, 56-55, with 6:04 remaining.

The lead changed hands four times until Jeffery hit both ends of a one-and-one and followed with a jumper, giving CU a five-point cushion (64-59) with 1:23 to play.

An intentional foul sent Brittany Wilson to the free throw line with 58.8 seconds left, and after she hit one of two (65-59) Jeffery hit two of three in the next 15 seconds to put CU up 68-59 and out of danger with 32.3 seconds showing.
