Forward • 6-3 • Senior • 3L • North Vancouver, B.C. (St. Mary's/NEDA)

Julie Seabrook will be Colorado's lone senior in 2011-12, and has been touted for her leadership and chemistry with her teammates. She possesses good post moves off the block, but has also extended her game to the 3-point line, making her a difficult guard for post players. Combined with her experience with the Canadian Junior National Team, playing against some of the best young players in the world, Seabrook fits as a well traveled, experienced leader for the Buffaloes as they enter Pac-12 Conference play for the first time.

2010-11 (Junior): Seabrook was one of two Buffaloes (joining Brittany Spears) to start all 34 games. She averaged 5.3 points and 5.4 rebounds per game while shooting a team best 48.3 percent from the field (71-of-147). She shot 60 percent or better in 16 games, and 50 percent or better in 20 outings. Her rebounding average was third-best on the team and she had the second-most overall offensive rebounds with 72. Her 2.1 offensive rebounds per game in Big 12 games ranked 15th on the conference charts. Seabrook was clutch at Nebraska (3/2) when she made 3-of-4 from the field, including the go-ahead bucket with 15 seconds remaining. She scored a career-high 15 points during nonconference play against Illinois (12/4) making 5-of-6 from the field while adding 5-of-6 from the free throw line. She grabbed a season high 11 rebounds against Missouri (1/22) marking her career high in a conference game. Just three games into the season, she tallied the second double-double of her career against Santa Clara (11/19) with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Her game moved to the perimeter this season. She was successful on her first career 3-point field goal attempt against Colorado State (12/8) and proceeded to shoot 40.7 percent (11-of-27) from behind the three-point arc on the season.

2009-10 (Sophomore): Saw action in all but three contests, averaging just under one point

and two rebounds per game. She got the starting nod in the season opener against UC Irvine (11/15) and came off the bench for the final 26 games she played in. Scored a Big 12 personal best six points at Kansas (1/27) while grabbing four rebounds in 15 minutes. She had a team-best seven rebounds in the win over Southern Utah (12/19), the second-best single-game total of her career. Seabrook logged two or more rebounds in 13 games, 11 of those coming in the final 19 contests. Made 52 percent of her field-goal attempts (11-of-21) while also recording five assists, two steals and one blocked shot.

2008-09 (Freshman): Played in 24 games and averaged 1.8 points and 2.6 rebounds as a first year Buffalo. She hit 48 percent from the field, connecting on 14 of 29 field goal attempts. Seabrook made her collegiate debut in the season-opening win over UCF (11/16), scoring five points and grabbing four rebounds in 16 minutes. Had a strong night against Idaho State (12/30), logging her first career double-double with 12 points and 13 rebounds. Her 12 points off the bench against the Bengals were the most by a CU player this season. Eight of her 13 rebounds came on the offensive end, the most by a Buffalo since Jackie McFarland also had eight against Oklahoma in 2007. She ranked fifth in field-goal percentage and ninth in rebounding among freshman in the Big 12.

Canada National Team: A veteran of several international competitions. Seabrook helped Team Canada to a sixth place finish at the 2011 World University Games in Shenzhen, China. Seabrook helped the Canadian Junior National Team to a fourth place finish at the 2009 FIBA U19 World Championship for Women in Thailand, the country's best championship finish in that age group. She also helped Canada qualify for the 2009 Worlds, with a second place finish at the 2008 FIBA Americas U18 Championship for Women in Buenos Aires, Argentina. In 2007 she participated with Team Canada at the 2007 FIBA U19 World Championships Slovakia. She saw action in six of eight games, scoring a high of five points in a win over Brazil, as Canada placed ninth with a record of 3-5.

High School: Seabrook is a 2008 graduate of St. Mary's Catholic School in Hamilton, Ont. A native of North Vancouver, B.C., Seabrook spent her senior season playing with Canada Basketball's National Elite Development Academy (NEDA), a national training center program in Hamilton. Prior to joining the NEDA program, she played for St. Mary's High School in North Vancouver where she was the Provincial MVP in 2006 and the Lower Mainlands MVP in 2007. She is a three-year member of the British Columbia Provincial team, highlighted by a gold-medal perform-

My favorite class at CU is: International Marketing.

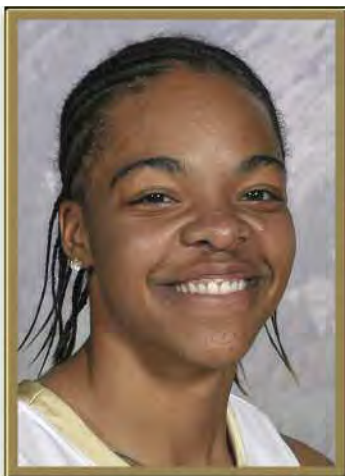
My plans after graduation are: Play some more basketball.

Chucky Jeffery

Guard • 5-10 • Junior • 2L • Colorado Springs, Colo. (Sierra)

Chucky Jeffery is one of Colorado's most dynamic players, with the ability to do just about anything on the floor. She can score, rebound and defend while running the team from the point position. She has the mental toughness and physical tools to become one of the elite guards in the Pac-12 Conference.

2010-11 (Sophomore): Led Colorado in assists (4.3 apg) and steals (2.5 spg) while ranking second in scoring (13.5 ppg) and rebounding (7.9). She was second in the Big 12 in defensive rebounds (6.0 drpg) while ranking third in steals, fifth in overall rebounding, seventh in assists, 10th in field-goal percentage (.471), 15th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.1), and 16th in scoring. Jeffery teamed with Brittany Spears (8.1 rpg) to give the Buffaloes the best 1-2 rebounding combo in the Big 12 in 2011 at 16 per game. Jeffery totaled 128 assists and 76 steals, marking only the seventh time in team history a player has had at least 125 assists and 75 steals in the same season. She is the sixth different player to achieve that feat and the first since Shelley Sheetz in 1993-94. Her 128 assists were the most by a CU player since Mandy Nightingale had 161 in 2001-02 and 14th overall on CU's single-season list. Her 76 steals ranked seventh on CU's single-season charts. She had six or more steals in four games (Regis, Evansville, Colgate and Kansas) and at least three steals in 14 of 30 games. She had a career and team season-high seven steals in the win over Colgate (12/30). It was the 21st time a Buff has registered seven or more steals in a game, but the first since Damietta Velicica had seven vs. Tulane on December 6, 1997. Jeffery put together one of the season's most memorable individual performances in the championship game of the Omni Hotels Classic against Loyola Chicago (11/27) when she recorded the second

triple-double in team history with 10 points, 13 rebounds and 10 assists during CU's 65-34 win. She nearly had another with 12 points, 10 rebounds and eight assists in CU's 73-68 win over No. 16/15 Oklahoma (2/23). In all, Jeffery logged nine double-doubles, tying for fourth on the Big 12 charts. Jeffery scored in double-digits in 24 of 30 games played, including a career high 25 against UT-Martin (11/21). She had 10 games of double-digit rebounds, including a season and career high of 13, which she achieved three times in a four game stretch during the nonconference schedule

2009-10 (Freshman): Averaged 9.3 points, 5.2 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.0 steals as a first-year Buffalo. She led the Buffaloes in assists, ranked second in rebounding and steals and third in scoring. Her numbers stayed even throughout the year as she averaged 9.3 points, 4.8 rebounds and 3.4 assists during Big 12 games. Jeffery's two steals an outing tied for fourth in the Big 12 and also matched the best among league freshmen. She was also 10th in overall assists on the league charts and ranked 13th in assist-to-turnover ratio (0.8). Among freshmen in the Big 12, she ranked fourth in assists and fifth in scoring. Jeffery earned Big 12 Freshman of the Week honors on Jan. 11 after averaging 15.5 points, 7.5 rebounds, 6.5 assists and 5.0 steals in wins over Yale (1/4) and Missouri (1/9). She dished out a team season-high nine assists against Yale and also recorded one of her three personal-best 19-point performances, hitting all seven shot attempts from the field. She was named to the Omni Hotels Classic All-Tournament team as she averaged 12.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 2.5 steals and shot 61 percent (11-of-16) in the two game set. She scored 14 points in the championship game of the Omni Hotels Classic against Harvard, including the decisive basket on a driving layup with five seconds remaining in the contest. She came off the bench in her collegiate debut, but started in the final 28 games she played in, missing only one contest (Grambling State, 12/30) with a sprained ankle. Logged her first career double-double against No. 6 (AP)/4 (WBCA) Nebraska (1/30) with 14 points and a then career-best 11 rebounds.

High School: Chucky Jeffery is a 2009 graduate of Sierra High School. Jeffery averaged 22.1 points, 12.9 rebounds, 4.9 steals, 4.6 assists and 3.0 blocks as a senior leading the Stallions to a 22-3 record and their third consecutive Colorado Springs Metro League title and Class 4A State quarterfinal appearance. She was named to the *Denver Post* Class 4A All-

2010-11 (Sophomore): Averaged 7.0 points and 4.6 rebounds per game, ranking fourth on the team in both categories. She topped CU in 3-point accuracy (minimum 50 attempts) at 35.8 percent (38-of-106) and was second on the team in 3-point field-goals made (38) and third in blocked shots (16). Her 3-point percentage ranked 13th overall on the Big 12 charts, and improved once the league season started. Malcolm-Peck made 40.8 percent (20-of-49) from downtown during the Big 12 schedule, the fifth best mark among conference combatants. She made two or more 3-point field goals in 12 games and hit 50 or percent better in 11 of those contests. Overall, she shot 50 percent or better from behind the arc in 13 outings. Malcolm-Peck played a big role in CU's 66-60 overtime upset win over No. 17/16 Iowa State (1/15). Hobbled by a sore ankle, she scored 10 points on 3-of-4 from the field in an efficient 14 minutes and hit a pair of clutch free throws late in overtime to help seal the win. Malcolm-Peck had three double-doubles, two of



which came off the bench. She scored a season-best 16 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in a hard-fought loss to No. 3 Baylor (3/5). Her other double-double off the bench was an 11-point, 10-rebound effort against North Dakota (1/4). She had 10 games of scoring in double-digits.

2009-10 (Freshman): Averaged 5.3 points, 3.7 rebounds, 1.1 blocked shots per game. She led the Buffaloes with 34 blocks, the fifth-best single-season mark by a freshman in team history. Malcolm-Peck ranked third among

freshmen in the Big 12 in blocks and ninth overall on the league charts. She started 26 of 30 games, playing nearly 25 minutes per contest. She had a memorable collegiate debut, grabbing a personal-best 11 rebounds against UC Irvine, six of which came on the defensive end. Her 11 boards were the third most in team history by a freshman in her CU debut and the most in 27 years. Malcolm-Peck was named Big 12 Freshman of the Week on Dec. 28 after recording 10 rebounds, four points, four steals, three assists and three blocks against San Jose State (12/22). She was a perfect 4-of-4 from the 3-point arc against Yale (1/4), just one off the school record for 3-pointers without a miss in one game. Registered a career-best 19 points against Yale. She delivered one of the clutch performances of the season at Kansas State (1/20). After making just 7-of-16 free-throw attempts to begin her collegiate career, she sank two attempts with 17 seconds remaining to give CU a four-point lead and eventually a 63-57 road win. Her road magic continued a month later at Missouri (2/23) as she hit the game-winning shot in overtime, a layup with 55 seconds remaining.

High School: Meagan Malcolm-Peck was home schooled, graduating in May 2009. She had an outstanding four-year high school athletic career playing basketball for Horizon High School in Thornton as a junior and senior and ThunderRidge High School in Highlands Ranch as a freshman and sophomore. A 2009 *Denver Post* Colorado Class 5A All-State first team selection, Malcolm-Peck averaged 18 points and 8.4 rebounds guiding Horizon to a 25-2 record and a spot in the state semifinals. Playing alongside her twin sister and CU teammate Brenna Malcolm-Peck, the Hawks were the No. 1 ranked team in Colorado's largest classification for most of 2009 winning the Front Range League title and the Black Division crown at the Nike Tournament of Champions in Phoenix, where she was named MVP. Malcolm-Peck was a Street & Smith

The sky is the limit for Rachel Hargis, who steadily improved throughout her freshman season where a short bench gave her an opportunity to see a lot of minutes and gain a lot of experience. The first signee of the Linda Lappe coaching era, Hargis is a good defender, who understands defensive concepts very well and has the ability to get her hands on the ball. She was also able to develop her offensive game, improving her post moves and shot selection around the basket.

2010-11 (Freshman): Hargis played in all 34 games averaging 2.6 points, 2.9 rebounds and 0.7 blocks per game. Hargis, who played double-digit minutes in 30 of her 34 games, became a solid player off the bench, especially on the defensive end. She ranked second on the team in blocked shots with 24, which was also the third best total among freshmen in the Big 12. She stepped it up in that category during league play as 16 of those 24 blocks came during the conference schedule ranking 11th on the overall league charts. Hargis was a sub .500 free-throw shooter on the season (.489), but she made 14 of her last 18 attempts (.778). Hargis ranked fourth on the team with 17 steals. She had a career night against Nebraska netting personal bests with six points and eight rebounds in 26 minutes. Hargis had seven games with five or more rebounds. She recorded a career and team-season high four blocked shots at No. 20/23 Iowa State (2/19).

High School: Hargis is a 2010 graduate of Robinson High School, located just southeast of Waco, Texas. She averaged 14.4 points, 7.1 rebounds and 3.5 blocks per game while shooting 52 percent from the field as a senior, guiding the Rockets to an overall record of 20-12, a second place finish in District 19-3A and a spot in the 3A Region Quarterfinals. Hargis had a story book junior season in 2009 as Robinson went 34-5 and won the Texas 3A state championship. She was named the championship game MVP, scoring 20 points and recording 13 rebounds in the Rockets' 49-33 win over Argyle High

As a junior, she averaged 7.9 points and 3.5 steals, was named to the All-California Interscholastic Federation (CIF)-Southern Section first team and the All-Moore League first team as the Jackrabbits won their fourth-straight California Division I title. *ESPN RISE FAB 50* had Long Beach Poly ranked No. 1 in the nation early in the 2008-09 season, ending at No. 30 while *USA Today's* final Super 25 rankings had the Jackrabbits at No. 23. She was a two-time All-CIF Southern Section selection and three-time All-Moore League first team pick. As a sophomore, Wilson averaged 4.1 points and 2.3 steals per game, assisting Poly to a No. 2 final national ranking by *USA Today's Super 25*. She was voted the team co-Newcomer of the Year, along with her sister, as a freshman in 2007 averaging 4.5 points and 1.7 rebounds. Wilson is ranked as the No. 32 shooting guard in the country, according to *ESPN.com HoopGurlz*.

Lexy Kresl will give a much needed scoring reload to the Colorado back court, after leading the state of Arizona in scoring the past two seasons. She is a proven winner that loves competition and has high expectations of herself and her new team. Kresl is just the second Arizona prep to play for the Buffaloes, joining Tuscon's Lynda Gehrke who played for CU in 1977-78.

She is a physical power forward who can post up against bigger players as well as knock down the outside shot. She is Colorado's fourth player from the state of Oregon, and first since Sabrina Scott (2000-03) who was a classmate of head coach Linda Lappe at CU.

HIGH SCHOOL: Jen Reese is a 2011 graduate of Clackamas (Ore.) High School. A 2011 *Parade Magazine* All-American, Reese averaged 25 points, 20 rebounds, six assists and five blocks as a senior guiding the Cavaliers to a 27-2 record and a second place state finish, the program's best ever state placing. She became the first player to be named Oregon's Gatorade Girls Basketball Player of the Year on two occasions (2010, '11). Reese led the Three Rivers League in scoring as a senior, helping Clackamas to an undefeated (15-0) conference championship season, and a 25-game win streak along the way. She is a three-time Class 6A first team all-state selection and Three Rivers MVP and a four-time first team all-league selection. A 2011 McDonald's All-American nominee, Reese was the MVP of the state of Oregon and the school's Athlete of the Year. She was Oregon's second leading scorer her junior year (21 ppg) and its third leading scorer her sophomore year (20 ppg). As a freshman, Reese earned second-team all-state honors, averaging 12 points and five rebounds. Reese's teams compiled an overall four-year record of 70-17. She

earned a spot in the CHS Hall of Fame before graduation. Reese played club ball with Team Concept from seventh through 12th grades, traveling all over the greater west. Her team took first place in tournaments in Las Vegas, San Diego, Seattle and Memphis.
