THE GAME: No. 23 (AP) ranked University of Colorado will play its final nonconference game of 2012-13 by hosting the University of New Mexico on Saturday, Dec. 29, at 2:30 p.m. at the Coors Events Center. Saturday's game is the second of a doubleheader as the CU men host the University of Hartford at 12 p.m.

BROADCAST: Saturday's game will be broadcast live on KKZN AM 760. Mike Rice will have the play-by-play with Carol Callan of USA Basketball providing the color commentary. A live video stream will be available on the Pac-12 Digital platform at Pac-12.com. All CU women's basketball home games, and select road Pac-12 games, that are not televised will be available through Pac-12.com at this link: <http://pac-12.com/live/cubuffs.aspx>. The live stream is free to the public and not tied to a Pac-12 Network carrier.

OPENING TIP: Colorado head coach **Linda Lappe** will be looking for her 100th collegiate head coaching victory, and 50th at Colorado.

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is off to a 10-0 start for the fourth time in team history, and a second straight year after defeating Utah Valley 81-45 on Dec. 22. Colorado is vying for its second-straight unbeaten nonconference regular season record and just the third in team history. The Buffaloes ended non-league play at 11-0 last season, joining the 1992-93 squad which entered the conference

slate at 12-0. Colorado has won its last 23 nonconference regular season contests and 30 of 34 under head coach **Linda Lappe**.

Colorado's offense has played well, averaging 73 points per game; four times hitting 75 and twice hitting 80. The Buffaloes are shooting 44 percent from the field, and 48 percent inside the 3-point arc. Colorado has shared the ball well averaging 14.8 assists per game, and it has come from a multitude of players. Seven Buffaloes are already in double-figures for assists through 10 games. Colorado also has held a sizeable advantage in rebounds (+14.6 rpg), and ranked eighth in NCAA Division I through games of Dec. 16.

Defensively, the Buffaloes are holding teams to 56 points per game on 35 percent from the field. Colorado ranks in the top five of the Pac-12 in 16 of 21 statistical categories, including second in rebounding defense (30.7 rpg) and rebounding margin and third in scoring offense, defense and margin (+17.1), turnover margin (+2.5) and offensive rebounds (18.1 orgp).

Redshirt freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** leads Colorado and ranks seventh in the Pac-12 in scoring at 15.5 points per game. A three-time Pac-12 Freshman of the Week, Roberson scored a career and team-season high 25 points in the win at Illinois, hitting 7-of-8 from the field and a team-season best 10 free-throws made on 14 attempts. She also ranks second on the team in rebounding (6.0 rpg) and is third in field-goal percentage (.519). Along with her scoring success, Roberson ranks ninth in offensive rebounds (3.2 orgp), 10th in field-goal percentage and 19th in overall rebounding on the Pac-12 leaderboard.

All-Pac-12 guard **Chucky Jeffery** leads the team in assists (4.3 apg), rebounds (8.2 rpg) and steals (2.3 spg), while ranking second in scoring (12.3 ppg). She dished out a team season-high seven assists in the win over Utah Valley, nearly recording her third career triple-double (12 points, 9 rebounds). Jeffery ranks fourth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.6), fifth in assists, seventh in steals and overall rebounding, ninth in defensive rebounds (5.8 drpg) and free-throw percentage (.808), 15th in offensive rebounds (2.4 orgp) and 16th in scoring on the Pac-12 charts.

Junior guard **Brittany Wilson** has started all 10 games and ranks second on the team in steals (1.7 spg) and assists (2.7 apg) while coming in at fourth in scoring at 9.8 points per contest. She has led Colorado in scoring over the last four games (13.5 ppg), including a

season-high 19 points at Denver. Over that same span she has shot 46 percent from the floor (19-of-41), including 9-of-22 from 3-point range (.409). Wilson ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in free-throw shooting at 87 percent. She made her first 19 attempts of the season and has missed just three this year. She also ranks ninth in 3-point field goals (1.4 3mpg), 11th in 3-point percentage (.350) and 14th in steals on the Pac-12 leaderboard.

Sophomore forward **Jen Reese** has made a successful return from an eye injury that kept her out of the final nine games of 2011-12. She is third on the team in scoring (10.5 ppg) and rebounding (5.8 rpg) while hitting 50 percent from the field and 83 percent from the free-throw line. She set a career-high with 16 points in the win over Utah Valley. Reese has scored in double-figures in six of the last seven contests, averaging 12 points during that span. On the Pac-12 charts Reese is seventh in free-throw percentage, 13th in field-goal percentage and 25th in scoring.

Junior center **Rachel Hargis** joins Wilson as the only Buffs to start all 10 games. A career 33 percent shooter entering the season, Hargis has made the most of her opportunity hitting 53 percent (26-of-49) through 10 games. Hargis netted season-best totals with nine points and seven rebounds against Utah Valley. She also has 15 assists on the year, after registering just 17 in 35 games as a sophomore, and a team-best 12 blocked shots. Hargis had a career- and team-season high seven blocked shots against Louisville, just one off the school single-game record.

Colorado has seven players averaging between four and 12 points per game. The Buffaloes are enjoying their best depth in the Lappe era. Thirteen different CU players have already hit the hardwood, with 12 of them having registered points.

ABOUT THE LOBOS: New Mexico is 8-4 overall and playing its first game since a 60-45 loss at UTEP on Dec. 20. The Lobos are in the middle of a five-game road trip after playing nine of their first 10 at home. New Mexico is averaging 61 points per game on 41 percent shooting. On the defensive side the Lobos are allowing just 55 points per contest and opponents are shooting just 34 percent.

Senior guard Caroline Durbin is New Mexico's leading scorer at 12.9 points per game and is shooting an impressive 47 percent from 3-point range (23-of-49). Senior forward Jourdan Erskine tops the Lobos in rebounding at 6.3 per game and also has a team-best 11

blocked shots. Freshman guard Bryce Owens dishes out 4.3 assists per game while averaging 8.6 points per contest. Junior forward Deeva Vaughn is UNM's second-leading scorer at just under 10 per outing.

Yvonne Sanchez is in her second year as head coach at New Mexico with an overall record of 19-24.

THE SERIES: This will be the 13th meeting between Colorado and New Mexico, the first since 2001 and only the second in the last 20 years. The series is tied at 6-6 as the teams meet for the first time since a 78-63 Colorado win in Albuquerque on Nov. 11, 2001. New Mexico won the first six meetings between 1975-79 as the programs competed together in the Intermountain Conference (IAIW). The Buffaloes have won the last six, including the last meeting in Boulder, a 92-22 win on Dec. 31, 1991.

Linda Lappe has never faced New Mexico as a head coach. Yvonne Sanchez has never faced Colorado as a head coach.

CONNECTIONS: New Mexico assistant coach Anthony Turner is a 1999 graduate of Colorado and served as a male practice player and manager for then head coach Ceal Barry. **LaTonya Watson** was also on that staff and **Linda Lappe** was a player during Turner's time in Boulder. Lappe also played against New Mexico assistant Edwina Brown who was an All-American at Texas from 1996-2000. Lobos' assistant Joseph Anders was the interim head coach at Arizona State last year, leading the Sun Devils to a pair of wins over the Buffaloes.

NATIONALLY RANKED: Colorado moved up two spots to No. 23 in the *Associated Press* Women's Basketball Top 25 poll, released Dec. 24.

Colorado received 156 votes – up from 99 last week - to make its second-straight appearance and highest ranking since also reaching No. 23 on Jan. 7, 2008. The Buffaloes are 10-0 and one of only seven remaining unbeaten teams in NCAA Division I – all of which reside in the AP top 25.

The Buffaloes have a long history of rankings in the AP poll, dating back to the 1980-81 season. This week's ranking marks the 160th time Colorado has appeared in the AP poll, trailing only Stanford, USC and UCLA among Pac-12 Conference schools.

CU was just two spots out of the Dec. 25 *USA Today Sports* Coaches Top 25 poll, receiving 34 votes. The Buffaloes haven't been ranked in that poll since April 2004. CU received votes from the coaches poll during the squad's four-week AP run in 2007-08, but never reached the top 25.

LAPPE AND COLORADO IN THE POLLS: Head coach **Linda Lappe** joined some elite company when the Buffaloes received their first AP ranking in five years. She is only one of eight NCAA Division I women's head coaches to have played for an AP ranked team, and then return to lead that same program into the AP poll. Overall she is the 31st person to play for and coach an AP ranked program.

The Buffaloes were ranked for 29 weeks during Lappe's playing career (1998-03) including 27 straight from Jan. 22, 2001 through the end of her junior year (March 11, 2002). CU's highest AP ranking during that span was No. 10, on March 4, 2002.

STRONG FINISHES: Colorado has benefitted from strong second half finishes, averaging 40 points per game while shooting 46 percent from the field. In first half action during that same stretch Colorado is averaging 34 points on 42 percent shooting. The Buffaloes are

outscored their opponent by 8.3 points per game in the second 20 minutes.

Colorado has scored at least 34 points in all nine second periods this season and have hit 40 four times with a high of 46 at UMKC. The Buffaloes have scored 30 or more second half points in their last 15 games dating back to the 2012 Pac-12 Tournament.

SUCCESS ON THE ROAD: Colorado is 3-0 away from Boulder this season and is 12-7 in its last 19 true road contests since the tail end of the 2010-11 campaign. Prior to the start of this run, The Buffaloes had just five wins in their previous 37 road games dating back to the 2008 Big 12 Conference schedule.

The Buffaloes are averaging 76.7 points on 45 percent shooting in those three road contests. CU has also held its opponent to 60 points per game and enjoys a plus-14 rebound margin.

Colorado scored an overall season-high 83 points at Denver, the most in a true road contest since scoring 83 in a 3-point loss at Colorado State on Nov. 30, 2005. CU's 10-point halftime lead was its largest on the road since leading Colorado State 38-22 on Nov. 20, 2011

Colorado's win at Illinois was its first road win against a major conference opponent in a nonconference regular season game since defeating No. 20/17 ranked Vanderbilt, 62-51, on Dec. 9, 2007. The Buffaloes trailed by six at halftime against the Illini, allowing Colorado to claim its largest halftime deficit overcome to win on the road since defeating Missouri 80-79 in overtime on Feb. 23, 2010 after trailing by seven at the break (43-36).

Colorado's 23-point win at UMKC, was its biggest on the road since an 82-47 win at Colorado State on Dec. 1, 2007.

ROBERSON AMONG ELITE COMPANY: Freshman guard **Arielle Roberson** has scored in double-digits in the first 10 games of her career matching Tracy Tripp's school record, set during the 1985-86 season.

BENCH PRODUCTION: Colorado is getting good production from its bench to the tune of 25.5 points (35 percent) and 21.6 rebounds (48 percent) per game. Sophomore forward **Jen Reese** has headed the bench effort averaging 10.5 points and 5.8 rebounds, ranking third overall on the team in both categories.

Colorado scored a season-high 42 bench points in the win over UMKC. The bulk of those came from freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** who scored 23 points in 19 minutes on 9-of-12 from the field in her lone game off the bench this season. Her 23 bench points are tied for the second most in the past 10 years and her nine field goals are the most. Only Bianca Smith, with 25 points off the bench against San Jose State on Dec. 22, 1999, had a bigger bench game in the last 10 years.

ROBERSON DOMINATES PAC-12 HONORS: Forward **Arielle Roberson** has won the Pac-12 Freshman of the Week award three times this season. The Pac-12 has added Freshman of the Week

to its weekly honors for the first time this season.

In her most recent award on Dec. 2, Roberson averaged 19.5 points on 72 percent from the field (13-of-18) and 71 percent from the foul line (12-of-17) in wins over Wyoming and Illinois. She scored a career and team season-high 25 points, including a critical, late, 3-point basket, to lead Colorado to a 69-62 road win at Illinois as the Buffaloes claimed their 19th straight regular season nonconference victory.

She hit 7-of-8 from the field against the Illini and sank a team season-high 10 free throws on 14 attempts. Roberson also had five rebounds, three steals and an assist against Illinois. Earlier in the week, Roberson netted 14 points on 6-of-10 from the field in the home win over Wyoming.

Roberson earned the inaugural Pac-12 Freshman of the Week award on Nov. 12 after scoring 16 points on 7-of-13 shooting with six rebounds, five steals, two assists and two blocks in her collegiate debut - a 70-65 win over Idaho on Nov. 11. Her second citation came on Nov. 26 after averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds en route to Omni Hotels Classic MVP honors.

Her three weekly conference awards in one season are the most since Brittany Spears won four Big 12 Conference Rookie of the Week honors in 2007-08.

ARIELLE & ANDRE: The Roberson's are the only brother/sister tandem on the 2012-13 basketball rosters from the same school in the Pac-12 Conference. They're one of five brother/sister tandems on 2012-13 basketball rosters in Division I. The Big Ten has two tandems, followed by one each in the ACC, Mountain West and the Pac-12 Conferences. CU has another brother/sister pair on the ski team with freshmen Maria and Gustav Nordstrom from Sweden.

SEEING DOUBLE: Colorado is used to getting double takes from fans and opponents, as the Buffaloes once again sport two pairs of identical twins on its roster.

Brenna and Meagan Malcolm-Peck are senior wing players while **Ashley and Brittany Wilson** are junior guards. Brenna is the older of the two Malcolm-Pecks by 27 minutes. Ashley is the older of the Wilson twins, by only five minutes.

BUFFS EXPERIENCED FROM DEEP: While Colorado looks to continue an inside-outside balance on its 2012-13 squad, there is no questioning its experience from shooting from the perimeter. The Buffaloes have four players with at least 50 career 3-point field goals, and all four rank among CU's career Top 20. Senior **Meagan Malcolm-Peck** tops current Buffs with 85 and ranks 11th on CU's all-time list. Junior **Brittany Wilson** is right behind Malcolm-Peck in 12th with 84. **Lexy Kresl**, who set CU's freshman record in 2011-12 is 15th with 73. Senior **Chucky Jeffery** rounds out the current Buffs at 17th with 56.

JEFFERY MOVING UP CAREER LADDERS: Junior guard **Chucky Jeffery** needs just three points to pass Jeannie Raikes (1976-80) for 14th (1,331) on CU's career scoring list. She also needs one steal to break a tie with former teammate Brittany Spears (2007-11) for seventh all-time.

On CU's career charts Jeffery also ranks sixth in assists (397), seventh in rebounds (741), 14th in free-throws made (275), 16th in field-goals made (499) and blocks (59) and 17th in 3-point field

In other miscellaneous categories Jeffery is also tied with Sandy Bean (1978-82) for fifth in double-doubles (22), is seventh in double-figure rebounding games (24) and 14th in double-figure scoring games (72).

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado picked up its 14th all-time win over a top-10 ranked opponent with its 70-66 win over No. 8 Louisville on Dec. 14. The win marked the Buffaloes' first over a top-10 opponent since defeating No. 5 Stanford in the 2002 NCAA Sweet 16. It was the first top-10 win as an unranked team since knocking off No. 7 Texas Tech 63-49 on Jan. 11, 1997.

The win snapped a three-game slide against ranked teams as the Buffaloes improved to 3-5 against ranked opponents under Linda Lappe. CU improved to 62-142 all-time against ranked opponents, including a 38-45 mark at home.

The Buffaloes played just two games against ranked teams in 2011-12, both against Stanford. Colorado is on track to at least triple that number this year as Pac-12 rivals California, UCLA and Stanford have solid footing in both polls.

COLORADO BASKETBALL'S SOLID START: Colorado's men's and women's basketball teams each began the 2012-13 season at 6-0, before the men suffered their first loss of the season on Dec. 1 at Wyoming. It is the first time the men's and women's programs have both started with six or more wins since 1982-83 when both teams started 7-0.

OMNI HOTELS CLASSIC CHAMPS: Colorado improved to 42-10

all-time in its home holiday classic and has won four straight and 16 of the 25 tournament titles contested. The Buffaloes won this year's classic by defeating Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and San Diego State. Freshman forward **Arielle Roberson** was named the MVP after averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds over the two-game tournament. She is the first CU freshman to win that honor in the 26-year history of the tournament. Senior guard **Chucky Jeffery** was named to the Omni Classic All-Tournament team after averaging 13 points, 7.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals over the two games. She is the first four-time Omni All-Tournament team honoree, earning MVP honors in 2010 and '11.

BUFFS SIGN FOUR TO NLI's: Zoe Beard-Fails, Desiree Harris, Haley Smith and Briana Watts have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball and continue their education at the University of Colorado in 2013-14 head coach Linda Lappe announced on Wednesday, the first day of the NCAA's early signing period.

Beard-Fails is a 6-2 forward from Herndon, Va., and attends Georgetown Day School in Washington D.C. She missed all but five games of her junior year with an ACL and meniscus tear, but is nearing full strength as her senior season commences. The 51st rated forward in the nation according to ESPN.com's HoopGurlz, Beard-Fails averaged 27 points and nearly 18 rebounds as a sophomore for Georgetown Day in 2010-11, earning fourth team All-Met honors from the Washington Post.

Harris is a 5-8 guard from Oakland, Calif., who attends St. Joseph Notre Dame High school in Alameda. She averaged 23.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.9 steals and 2.7 assists as a junior, helping the Pilots to the North Coast Section championship. Harris was a CIF All-State Division V second team selection as well as a Bay Shore Athletic League second team pick.

Smith, a 6-0 wing from Sammamish, Wash., is getting ready for her senior season at Skyline High School. A do-it-all player for the Spartans, she averaged around seven points, five rebounds and just under two assists and steals per game as a junior. Smith is in her fourth varsity season with the Spartans and also has had a successful club career playing with the Tree of Hope program. ESPN.com's HoopGurlz has her as the top prospect in the state of Washington and the 20th ranked wing in the nation.

Watts, a 6-4 center from Fresno, Calif., will make her debut with Clovis West High School this winter after playing her first three years at rival Buchanan. She was the first commit of the 2013 class. Watts averaged nearly six points and just over six rebounds per game for Buchanan as a junior, contributing to the Bears' 18-9 record and a spot in the CIF Central Section Division I semifinals.

BUFFS IN OPENERS: With its win over Idaho, Colorado improved to 34-5 (.872) all-time in season openers and 37-2 (.949) in all-time home openers. The Buffs opened the season with a home game for the 27th time in 39 seasons, and moved to a perfect 27-0 in those instances.

BUFFS IN EXHIBITION: Colorado improved to a perfect 23-0 in exhibition games with its 87-38 win over Western State University Colorado. The Buffaloes have outscored their exhibition opponents by just over 31 points per game (86.0 to 54.7).

Colorado's 38 points allowed against WSCU were its fewest in an exhibition since the Buffaloes beat Colorado Mines 58-31 in 2007. The 49-point margin was the most in an exhibition since the Buffaloes defeated Spartak Moscow 115-55 in 2002.

The Buffaloes have played at least one exhibition game in all but one year (2009) since 1997. CU's exhibition games have featured a mix of NCAA II schools, foreign teams and traveling all-star teams.

BUFFS PICKED NINTH: Coming off its first 20-win season in eight years, Colorado was picked to finish ninth in the Pac-12 in 2013, according to the league's annual Preseason Coaches Poll and Media Poll.

In the Coaches Poll, 2012 NCAA Women's Final Four participant Stanford was picked to win the Pac-12, compiling the maximum amount of points (121) and first place votes (11) possible. 2012 Pac-12 runner-up and NCAA participant California claimed the other first place vote and was second in the poll (109). UCLA was third with 100 points followed by USC (91), Arizona State and Oregon State (67), Utah (56), Washington (54), Colorado (49), Washington State (40), Oregon (20) and Arizona (18).

Colorado's ninth place preseason rating is its highest in the last nine years since Buffaloes were picked to finish seventh in the 2004-05 Big 12 Coaches Poll.

The Media Poll was nearly identical in order. Stanford was picked to win with 12 first place votes and 166 total. California was second with 155 points and two first place votes. UCLA was third (136) followed by USC (123), Oregon State (106), Arizona State (100), Washington (80), Utah (72), Colorado (57), Washington State (47), Oregon (25) and Arizona (22).

MEDIA TABS JEFFERY: Along with picking the order of Pac-12 finish, the media selected a preseason All-Pac-12 team. Senior guard Chucky Jeffery was one of six individuals selected, along with California's Layshia Clarendon, Washington's Jazmine Davis, Stanford's Chiney Ogumike, UCLA's Markel Walker and Arizona's Davellyn Whyte.

HOME AT THE CECC: Colorado is traditionally tough at home with a 374-126 all-time record at the Coors Events Center (.748). The Buffaloes have won 10 or more games in a season at the CEC in 23 of the previous 34 years. The Buffaloes have enjoyed five undefeated seasons (1980-83, 1992-94) at the CEC.

BUFFS ON TV: Colorado's regular season schedule will feature at least 11 regionally or nationally televised games in 2012-13. Colorado will play nine regular season games on the Pac-12 Networks, and a guaranteed one, and potentially more, during the Pac-12 Tournament, March 7-10, in Seattle.

A program-best six regular season games will be televised nationally while three more will be on one of the regional networks. CU's first Pac-12 Tournament game will also be televised nationally, as would any ensuing round through the championship game, which will air Sunday, March 10, on ESPN2.

CU made its first television appearance on Dec. 11 at Denver on ROOT Sports Rocky Mountain. The Buffaloes make their Pac-12 Network debut on Friday, Jan. 4 against defending league champion Stanford; their first of four straight televised games on the network. Colorado will have five straight road games televised beginning with Utah on Jan. 13, through a Super Bowl Sunday matchup at USC on Feb. 3. CU's final regular season televised game will be Feb. 8 at home against Oregon State.

Entering the 2012-13 season, CU has appeared on 99 regional or national telecasts over the previous 11 seasons.

BOULDER - What started as a bit of a struggle ended in an impressive stroll Saturday night for the University of Colorado women's basketball team.

The unbeaten Buffaloes (4-0) found their groove midway through the first half and stayed with it the rest of the way, overrunning San Diego State 67-53 to win the Omni Classic at the Coors Events Center.

CU has won 16 of its 26 in-season tournaments, which for 22 years was called the Coors Classic.

Three CU players reached double figures, topped by redshirt freshman **Arielle Roberson's** 17 points. Sophomore **Jen Reese** added 14 and senior Chucky Jeffery 12. Reese also grabbed a game-best nine rebounds, while Roberson added seven.

Roberson was named the tournament's MVP, an award Jeffery had claimed the past two years. Joining both on the all-tournament team were Auburn's Tyrese Tanner, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi's Janae Blount and San Diego State's Courtney Clements, who led her team Saturday night with 19 points.

Defeating the talented Aztecs, an NCAA Tournament last season, was a benchmark November win for the Buffs and third-year coach **Linda Lappe**. She acknowledged that it was her best non-conference win at CU, primarily because her team dealt with and overcame adversity against a physical opponent.

Said Lappe: "It was a great game throughout, two good teams and lot of great players on that court. What we were able to do in the second half...it was not for the faint of heart. I enjoyed seeing our team step up to that level to win."

As Lappe has done after the Buffs' previous three wins, she pointed to her team's balance and depth in the post as keys in overtaking the Aztecs, who led by nine points in the early going. Along with the frontline productivity of Roberson and Reese, CU got eight points and three rebounds from Rachel Hargis and five points and three rebounds from **Meagan Malcolm-Peck**.

Lappe said she and her staff had challenged her frontline players to match San Diego State's physical play. "We challenged them before the game and they took it on...they were the difference makers."

The Buffs led 28-23 at halftime, but getting that five-point lead was difficult. When the Aztecs raced ahead 6-0, it doubled the largest deficit the Buffs had faced in their three previous games. And San Diego State wasn't content with that.

Over the next 5 minutes, the Aztecs built a 14-5 advantage and were limiting the Buffs' looks at the basket. But at the 13:19 mark, CU began to click - mainly because it thumbed up its defensive intensity and matched San Diego State's physicality.

"We were trying to force things," Roberson said. "I don't know if it was nerves or whatever, but we needed to get on the same page." Once that happened and the season's first test of adversity was passed, "It showed us who we really are . . . we're a tough team, they're a tough team."

At about the 6 minute mark, the Aztecs were 5-of-17 from the field - and that made field goal number included San Diego State hitting its first two baskets of the game.

The Buffs began creeping back into it and fashioned a 13-2 run. They finally caught the Aztecs at 16-16 on a Roberson follow of her own miss, then passed the visitors at 18-16 on a short Reese jumper.

In the half's final 2:15, CU outscored San Diego State 7-1 to take its five-point lead to the locker room. During that span, CU got its only two treys of the first 20 minutes, courtesy of Roberson and Malcolm-Peck.

A 5-0 run to open the second half gave the Buffs their largest lead of the game (33-23) - and they kept the pedal down. After the Aztecs closed to within six, a 7-2 CU spurt opened an 11-point advantage (42-31) with 13:02 to play. Reese was responsible for four of those points, with Jeffery converting a conventional three-point play for the others.

In the final 7 minutes, the Buffs led by as many as 15 - 67-52 in the final half minute - and the Aztecs never got closer than eight points.

BOULDER - Non-conference basketball schedules are all about preparing for the real thing - conference play. If a team can improve game-by-game, that's good. If it can remain unbeaten while improving, all the better.

The University of Colorado women's basketball team is doing both. The Buffs used a 9-0 run midway through the second half to pull away from Wyoming and win 68-59 on Wednesday night at the Coors Events Center.

"When you're not in your conference schedule, you want as many different scenarios as you can get," said CU coach **Linda Lappe**, whose team went to 5-0 and 3-0 at home this season. "We're starting to get that with this year's schedule. ... I feel we'll be prepared for whatever we see down the road."

What the Buffs saw from the previously unbeaten Cowgirls (4-1) was an opponent that runs its offense efficiently, was strong on the boards, goes to the rim often and still was shooting just over 40 percent from beyond the arc.

"We've seen a lot of good things from good teams," said CU senior guard **Chucky Jeffery**. "It's good because in the Pac-12 we'll be seeing a lot of different things from different things... (Wyoming) has some good three-point shooters. They ran a lot of pick-and-pops, which we haven't seen a lot, but we adjusted."

Jeffery's contributions were major; she recorded her 21st career double-double with 21 points and 10 rebounds in what Lappe called "kind of her breakout game so far...she's eased her way back in. It was good to see her play and get into her flow. She was more aggressive and we needed her to be."

The Buffs also got double-figure scoring performances from **Arielle Roberson** (14) and **Jen Reese** (10), with **Lexy Kresl** adding eight.

With the exception of a 39-39 draw on the boards, CU held a statistical advantage in every other category. The Buffs outscored the Cowgirls 34-20 in the paint, 27-9 off of turnovers, 13-6 in second-chance points, 8-0 on fast breaks and 22-12 in bench productivity.

Lappe was particularly pleased with her team committing just 12 turnovers and converting the visitors' 18 errors into 27 points. "We made their turnovers count," Lappe said, adding that her team regained its composure in the second half and turned the ball over only five times.

Although far from perfect, the Buffs led most of the first half and were up 31-26 at intermission. They didn't shoot exceptionally well (40.6 percent) from the field, but their defense on the Cowgirls compensated for that.

"We came out a little slow," Jeffery said. "We were just not hitting our shots, not recognizing to get the ball inside. After we figured it out, we got it going."

Wyoming went almost 5 minutes between field goals to open the game and at the 5-minute mark, the Cowgirls had hit only two field goals and trailed 10-4. But the Buffs encountered their own cold spell shortly thereafter and the visitors quickly caught up.

The Cowgirls tied the score at 15-15 on a three-pointer by Kaitlyn Mileto, who scored a team-high 16 points, then went up 18-15 - their first lead since 2-0 - on another trey by Ashley Sickles. But a 9-4 run to close out the half gave the Buffs their five-point advantage at intermission.

The Cowgirls took a pair of three-point leads early in the second half before the Buffs settled down and took control with their 9-0 run. Trailing 43-42, CU got a three-pointer from Kresl, a conventional three-point play from Roberson and a three-ball from Brittany Wilson to go up 51-43 with 11:55 to play.

When that 9-0 spurt extended to 15-4, the Buffs were in command. Wyoming pulled as close as four points a couple of minutes later, but never threatened again. CU increased its lead to as many as 14 points in the final 7 minutes.

Teams' identities change yearly, and Lappe said this CU team's second-half focus is much better than last: "We've come out with the right focus in the second half and we have some confidence in us. I think that is where your experience comes into play. We have experienced players on the floor that have been in those situations, and they've been able to provide whatever the needs, at whatever point. I think you definitely saw that tonight."

BOULDER – Competing as a member of the Top 25 is a relatively new experience for the Colorado women's basketball team – and that inexperience might have showed early on Saturday afternoon.

But by the end of the first half, the No. 25 Buffaloes had settled in and were playing the part of a nationally ranked team. Using a 23-3 run to close the first 20 minutes, CU took full control and crushed Utah Valley 81-45 at the Coors Events Center.

The win was the 700th in the women's program's history and kept the Buffs unbeaten (10-0) this season. It was their 23rd straight victory in regular-season non-conference games and gave them a 30-4 non-conference record under third-year coach **Linda Lappe**.

"It's exciting to know where we are at this point," Lappe said. "It's good to go into a break without a loss...there have been a lot of upsets in the last week or so; we wanted to make sure that wasn't us."

The Buffs, she said, finally "got a feel for the game" after their shaky start and eventually "did nice things in spurts" – such as hitting the open player on offense and showing intensity on defense.

The gnarly defense was particularly apparent in the first half; Sammie Jensen, Utah Valley's leading scorer (17.7 average) and the Great West Conference player of the year in 2011-12, was held scoreless in the first 20 minutes and finished the game with nine points.

Benefiting from finding open spots and getting crisp passes from her teammates, CU's **Jen Reese** led all scorers with a career-high 16 points. She got help from **Chucky Jeffery** (12), **Brittany Wilson** (11) and **Arielle Roberson** (10).

The Buffs never trailed, but despite jumping to a 7-0 lead they didn't open like a Top 25 team. Jeffery said the Buffs were so intent on not letting their first national ranking since 2008 affect their play that it probably did to start the game.

"We have little distractions here and there and we were able to pull through," she said. "So that was a good thing."

The Wolverines caused some difficulties with their matchup zone defense and switching man-to-man. "Going in, we were ready but we were a little frantic in the beginning," said Reese, who hit six of her 10 field goal attempts and was four-of-five from the free throw line. "We just had to calm down. We knew they would switch (defensively), so it was more of us just hurting ourselves."

But the Buffs' defense also presented big problems for the Wolverines. Lappe said her team's 'D' "kept us in the game...we were very solid. We wanted to hold them to 45 points and we did that. It just took a little time for our offense to catch fire and we did that with transition baskets."

Four consecutive free throws by Reese with 8:03 left before intermission opened a seven-point lead (18-11). And with that, the Buffs were off and running. Finishing the half with its 23-3 run, CU led 37-14 at intermission.

The Buffs didn't ease off in the second half, going up by 31 (59-28) on a three-pointer by Wilson with 12:55 remaining, then getting a layup by **Rachel Hargis** (nine points, seven rebounds) to extend the lead to 33 (61-28) about 40 seconds later. They led by as many as 36 twice in the final 4:30.

Tina Doughty led Utah Valley (4-10) with 13 points and was the only Wolverines player in double figures. Utah Valley shot only 16.7 percent (4-for-24) from the field in the first half and finished the game at 30.6 percent (15-of-49).

Meanwhile, once the Buffs got untracked, they hit 15 of their 34 first-half field goal attempts (44.1 percent) and were at 47.9 percent (34-of-71) for the afternoon. CU outscored Utah Valley 48-20 in the paint and 16-4 on fast breaks. The Buffs converted 16 Wolverines turnovers into 20 points, committed a season-low six turnovers themselves, and outrebounded the visitors 47-30.
